



Last week, Gordon Cary of St. Louis, field dir ector of the Congress of Racial Equality, told newsmen he had thought u the idea of freedom rides last February.

Birdsong released information given by Miss Pleune concerning the Cuba Meeting.

He quoted her as sayin g she was part of a group of 202 persons who went to Havana to hear a lecture by Dictator Fidel Castro and his governmen t officials on his intentions concerning the United States.

Instead, she said, the meeting turned out to be a seminar conducted by nine officials of the Soviet Union. She said Castro also addressed the seminar.


Miss Pleune declined to disclose either the purpose of the seminar, the discussions or who else was present. She also retused to state whether she was a member of the Communist Party.

Miss Fleune said she was a native of Newark. Her rather is dead and her mother lives in South Orange, N. J.

One sister, Jean Fleune, a 22 year old University of California student, was arrested and Jailed on breach of peace charges in another desegregation arrempt.

Four Negroes sat at a lunch counter in a Walgreen drugstore at Jackson, Hississippi, on July 13, 1961, and were arrested when they refused to move upon being instructed to do so by the police. Advance information concerning this sit-in was furnished to the press by the Jackson Nonviolent Movement.

The four freedom riders who were arrested at Little Rock, Arkansas, on July 10, 1961, were released on July 12, 1961, with suspended sentences on the condition that they return home. They later rejected this condition and surrendered to the police on July 12, 1961. On July 13, 1961, they appeared in Municipal Court and were again released with the understanding that they would immediately leave Arkansas without further testing facilities in the state.

The four freedom riders who were arrested and released at Little Rock plan to continue their freedom ride and they expect to arrive at Shreveport, Louisiana, by Trailways bus at 11:20 a.m., July 14, 1961. ______ Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) tepresentative in Shreveport, advised that the freedom riders will kot test facilities upon their arrival in Shreveport.

Information has been received to the effect that ten Freedom riders plan to leave Santa Honica, California, on July 28, 1961. The destination of this group is not yet known.

Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), has advised that twentyseven SNCC delegates will hold a bimonthly board meeting in Baltimore from July 14 to July 16, 1961. The Civic Interest Group is acting as host. On July 13, 1961 said that he planned to come to Washington to contact the Interstate Commerce Commission (ICC) and perhaps the Civil Rights Division (CRD) because SNCC had received no reply to letters written to these agencies requesting audiences to discuss the rights of Negroes in the South. According to the freedom walk from Baltimore to
Washington, D. C. on July 16, 1961, has not been definitely
scheduled since such an activity would require the approval of
the Civic Interest Group as well as the SNCC delegates. SNCC
delegates do plan to contact Adam Clayton Powell, other Members
of Congress, the office of the Chairman of the ICC and the CRD
on July 17, 1961, to request civil rights action. If ICC and
the CRD refuse to see the delegates anticipates that some
action will be taken to dramatize injustices suffered by Negroes
in the South. He explained that this action might be in the
form of a sit-in, picketing or contacts with Congressmen and
Government officials.

Five freedom riders who originally intended to go to Chattanooga, Tennessee, left New York City on July 13, 1961, by bus and were accommodated without incident at the Thomas Jefferson Inn, Charlottesville, Virginia, on the evening of July 13, 1961, They have changed their plans and apparently they no longer intend to go to Chattanooga. It is anticipated that on July 14, 1961, details will be available concerning the further itinerary of these freedom riders.

Further developments will be reported to the Department promptly.

Two hundred twenty-seven freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, since 5-24-61. Eighty have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred forty-two remain in custody.

Two Negro males sixteen and eighteen years of age were arrested in Jackson 7-11-61 when they took seats at the lunch counter in a Walgreen's drug store and failed to move on when instructed to do so by the police.

Trial of the four freedom riders who were arrested at Little Rock of 7-10-61 was postponed until 7-12-61. The freedom riders were returned to jail in lieu of \$500 bond each.

advised in confidence that two deputy sheriffs from Shreveport were in Little Rock on the night of 7-10-61 to observe the arrival of the freedom riders and the manner in which the situation was handled by the Little Rock Police Department (LRPD). The deputy sheriffs did not even want the LRPD to be aware of their presence.

It has previously been reported that there have been discussions concerning a proposed freedom ride to terminate in Chattanooga. It has been reported in the press that seven freedom riders including three clergymen will leave Newark on the night of 7-12-61 for a trip to Chattanooga. It was stated that the trip is sponsored by thirteen New Jersey organizations including the State CIO Council and the Americans for Democratic Action. The Newark police have advised that the Committee for the Support of Freedom Riders has requested permission to hold a public rally at 8:00 p.m. 7-12-61. James Farmer, National Director, Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), is scheduled to speak. Chattanooga police are cognizant and Newark is developing details.

Hearing in U. S. District Court, Jackson, concerning petition for an order to protect freedom riders from arrest, was postponed from 7-10-61 to 8-17-61.

Five freedom riders left St. Louis 7-10-61 en route New Orleans. Four were arrested 7-10-61 upon entering bus station at Little Rock. The fifth one did not enter the bus station but remained outside to notify an attorney in the event arrests were made. Trial scheduled for 7-11-61.

St. Louis freedom riders anticipated possible trouble in Shreveport, Louisiana. Local authorities at Shreveport made detailed plans to escort the bus from the state line and to cover the bus station with police and Deputy Sheriffs. The Klan allegedly planned to have observers at the Shreveport bus station but did not intend to interfere if the police handled the situation.

Three hundred fifty Negroes returning to Chicago from Baptist convention at Nassau are scheduled to stop at Greyhound bus station, Ft. Pierce, Florida, 7-11-61. On their trip to Nassau they utilized the white cafeteria and restroom facilities at Ft. Pierce without incident.

Edward B. King, Jr., freedom ride leader, has been quoted in the press as stating he will lead a freedom walk from Baltimore to Washington, D. C. 7-16-61. King allegedly stated that there also would be a sit-in at some Government agency in Washington, D. C. No date was given for the sit-in. Details are being developed.

Since May 24, 1961, 227 freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson. Eighty have been released on bond, four have been released upon payment of fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred forty-two remain in custody.

In connection with the freedom ride scheduled from Los Angeles to Jackson July 12, 1961, information has been received that 16 individuals are firmly committed to make the trip and eight others have made tentative commitments to participate.

One of those who reportedly will make the freedom ride from Los Angeles is _______ In 1952 ______ admitted to Bureau Agents that he had been a member of the Communist Party in 1944 and 1945. He stated he had joined the party because of racial discrimination but had left the party when he realized that they were using Negroes to advance communism. He denied any contact with the Communist Party since 1945.

It was previously reported that a group of freedom riders might proceed to Nashville from the University of Minnesota. Information has now been received indicating that due to summer recess it has not been possible to organize students into a freedom ride.

The Washington Daily News reported on July 10, 1961, that Reverend Raymond Lee Lathan, a Baptist clergyman in Milwaukee, had announced plans for a 100-member freedom ride to Jackson to test bus terminal facilities. This will be closely followed and the Milwaukee Office has been instructed to develop full details.

At a recent meeting of Northwest Youth for Progressive Action in Seattle Northwest District, Communist Party, USA, reportedly stated that she wished to determine whether a freedom ride could be organized in Seattle which would be similar to the freedom ride scheduled from Los Angeles to Jackson.

On July 10, 1961, the Civil Rights Division advised that the Department has filed a petition with the Interstate Commerce Commission and that a hearing is scheduled for July 20, 1961. In this connection it was requested that interviews be conducted with the three freedom riders who were arrested in the Trailways bus terminal at Jackson, Mississippi, July 5, 1961, and the six freedom riders who were arrested at the Illinois Central Depot in Jackson on July 6, 1961. All of these individuals apparently are residents of the Jackson area. The New Orleans Office has been instructed to expedite the interviews.

On June 9, 1961, three Negroes filed suit in U. S. District Court, Jackson, Mississippi, petitioning for a court order to protect freedom riders from arrest. A hearing scheduled for July 10, 1961, was postponed until August 57, 1961, due to illness of a defense attorney.

Five freedom riders left St. Louis by Trailways bus at 10:30 a.m., Central Daylight Time, July 10, 1961. They planned to spend the night in Little Rock and to proceed to Shreveport, Louisiana, and New Orleans on July 11, 1961.

The St. Louis group arrived in Little Rock at 7:47 p.m., Central Standard Time, July 10, 1961, and four of them entered the bus station. Approximately 250 people had gathered and the Little Rock Police Department felt that a disturbance might occur if the freedom riders did not leave. After they had been asked to leave twice and failed to comply, the four freedom riders were arrested for causing a public disturbance. They were held in lieu of \$500 bond each and were scheduled to appear in Little Rock Municipal Court at 8:30 a.m., Central Standard Time, July 11, 1961.

Local authorities at Shreveport made detailed plans to handle their arrival. A sheriff's car was to meet the bus at the Louisiana State line and police, as well as Deputy Sheriff's, were to be at the bus station. Arrangements were made to take photographs of people in the area of the bus depot. An informant advised that the Klan planned to have observers in the area of the bus station but did not intend to interfere as long as the situation was handled by the police.

A group of 350 Negroes who are attending a Baptist convention in Nassau are scheduled to return to Chicago in four Greyhound buses July 11, 1961, and are to stop at the Greyhound bus station at Ft. Pierce, Florida. On their trip to Nassau they utilized the white cafeteria and restroom facilities at the Ft. Pierce bus station without incident. Local authorities are cognizant.

The "Roanoke Times" has quoted Edward B. King, Jr., who has been active in the freedom ride movement, as stating that he is to lead a freedom walk from Baltimore, Maryland, to Washington, D. C. on July 16, 1961. It was stated that the purpose of the freedom walk is to focus the attention of the President, Congress and Government leaders on the imprisonment of freedom riders at Jackson, Mississippi, and the continuing segregation of interstate facilities. King also was reported to have said that a sit-in is planned in the office of some Government agency in Washington. No date was mentioned for the sit-in and King allegedly declined to elaborate. Pertinent field Divisions have been instructed to obtain full details of the freedom walk and the proposed sit-in.

One white male freedom rider was arrested in Jackson, Mississippi, 7-8-61 when he refused to comply with instructions from the police that he move on from the Negro waiting room-at the railroad station. He gave a New York address.

Nine freedom riders, several of whom gave Los Angeles addresses, were arrested at Jackson on 7-9-61 upon their arrival by train from New Orleans. They failed to comply with police instructions that they move on.

Eight freedom riders who had previously gathered in Montgomery, Alabama, tested the facilities at the Trailways bus station in Montgomery on 7-9-61 and then proceeded to Jackson where they were arrested the same day.

Eleven freedom riders, apparently local residents, were arrested 7-9-61 when they entered the white waiting room at the Trailways bus terminal in Jackson and failed to move on when requested to do so by the police.

Two hundred twenty-seven freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since 5-24-61. Eighty have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred forty-two remain in custody.

On 6-26-61 the Resident Agent at Jackson received a letter from Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), Jackson, Mississippi. The letter alleged that the practice of placing freedom riders in the maximum security unit at the Mississippi State Penitentiary constituted "unnaturally harsh punishment" and requested that the Department make an official inquiry into conditions affecting the freedom riders confined in the penitentiary. A copy of this letter was furnished to the Attorney General on 6-27-61. On 7-9-61 contacted the Resident Agency at Jackson and stated that since the Department has not contacted him regarding his letter, he contemplates telephoning



The four freedom riders mentioned above surrendered themselves to the Little Rock Police Department on the evening of 7-12-61 and were confined to the city jail to appear in Municipal Court 7-13-61. Chief of Police R. E. Glassock confidentially advised that stated that news services throughout the country had reported that the freedom riders had agreed to return to their homes whereupon Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) officials telephoned to state that the action taken by the freedom riders defeated the purpose of CORE and instructed that the freedom riders were to remain in Little Rock.

The freedom riders who were originally scheduled to leave Newark 7-12-61 for Chattanooga are now scheduled to depart from New York City by Greyhound bus 7-13-61 to arrive at Charlottesville, Virginia, at 3:00 p.m., 7-13-61.

The above group is scheduled to leave Charlottesville on the morning of 7-14-61 to proceed to Chattanooga, Tennessee, by bus where they expect to arrive at 6:00 or 8:00 p.m. 7-14-61. Appropriate law enforcement agencies have been informed of this trip.

Between Roanoke, Virginia, and Chattanooga the bus is scheduled to make several rest stops where the group plans to test segregated rest rooms. Since the stops are not controlled by Interstate Commerce Commission regulations the group plans to observe local segregation laws if they are ordered to do so by police but they will ignore orders of proprietors that they use facilities on a segregated basis. Upon arrival in Chattangoga they intend to test the rest room and lunch counter in the bus terminal. If the police interfere with their efforts to test the facilities at Chattanooga the freedom riders will reportedly be joined by local members of CORE. If the police do not interfere the group of freedom riders will join a public rally planned by the Chattanooga chapter of CORE.

If the freedom riders are arrested at Chattanooga they plan to remain in jail for one or two months. Reverend C. T. Vivian, Chattanooga representative of CORE, is presently negotiating with local authorities in an attempt to end segregation at the bus terminal before the freedom riders arrive.

The so-called freedom train bearing delegates from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) convention at Philadelphia arrived in Washington at 9:40 a.m., 7-12-61. Twelve hundred seventy-six members of the NAACP proceeded from the train to the New Senate Office Building where a meeting was held. Seventeen members of the American Nazi Party picketed at Union Station from 9:30 a.m. until 11:35 a.m., 7/12/61. They wore khaki uniforms with swastika arm bands and carried signs such as "Down With NAACP," "Black Freedom Means Rape" and "God Bless Lincoln Rockwell." George Lincoln Rockwell, head of the American Nazi Party, reportedly was not in uniform and remained some distance away from the pickets.

Five members of the Fighting American Nationalists also picketed at Union Station during the time that the American Nazi Party was there. The Fighting American Nationalists reportedly was organized under the guidance of Rockwell but is not formally connected with the American Nazi Party.

In connection with the proposed freedom walk from Baltimore to Washington, D. C., 7-16-61, the "Afro American" in Baltimore has reported that the freedom walk is in connection with an annual board meeting of the Students Nonviolent Coordinating Committee to be held in Baltimore 7-14-61 to 7-16-61 with the Civic Interest group in Baltimore acting as host organization. More than one hundred student leaders from sixteen states allegedly will participate in the freedom walk to dramatize injustice in the South. Speakers at the annual board meeting reportedly will include Martin Luther King, National Advisor of the Students Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, and James Farmer. National Director of CORE.

"FREEDOM RIDERS" ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED (SECTION TWO, PROFESSIONAL GROUP HEREIN IS UNCLASSIFIED DATE 10-16-2009 BY 60324 UC BAW/SAB/STW who were among the group of "Freedom Riders" on the Second Section-Professional Group en route via Greyhound Bus from Jacksonville, Florida, to Tampa, Florida, on June 16, 1961, were arrested by the Marion County Sheriff's Office at the Greyhound Bus Station, Ocala, Florida, on that date and originally charged with the following: (1) Failure to obey the lawful order of an officer; (2) Attempting to incite a riot. charge was subsequently changed to unlawful assembly. On June 21, 1961, trial for the above three was set for July 5, 1961, and all were released on \$500 bond for each separate charge. On July 5, 1961, was tried beforé Judge Lewis O. Ayers, Marion County Court, Ocala, and a six-man jury on the charge of unlawful assembly. The jury returned a guilty verdict against on that charge on the same date. "Freedom Riders" (Section Two, Professional Group) were not tried on the other charge of failure to obey the lawful order of an officer and if they are tried on this charge, their cases will be taken up during a special August term of court. The case against not come before the Marion County Court from July 5-7, 1961, which dates constituted the July term of court. on July 7, 1961, County Prosecutor entered a motion before Judge Myers, Marion County Court, requesting a special August term of court that would convene sometime during the week of August 21, 1961, to consider the case against Callender. The above three freedom riders were represented by attorney, Jacksonville, Florida.

Two hundred forty-seven freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since May 24, 1961. Ninety-nine have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred forty-three remain in custody.

The freedom riders who started their trip in St. Louis, Missouri, and who were arrested and released at Little Rock, Arkansas, proceeded from Shreveport, Louisiana, to New Orleans on July 15, 1961, and then arranged to return to their homes. There were no incidents after they left Little Rock.

The freedom riders who left New York on July 13, 1961, en route to Chattanooga, Tennessee, traveled from Boanoke, Virginia, to Knoxville, Tennessee, by Trailways bus on July 15, 1961. No incidents were reported during the trip although they were refused service in a restaurant at Elizabethton, Tennessee. On July 16, 1961 they proceeded from Knoxville to Chattanooga where they are in the cafeteria at the Greyhound bus terminal and used other terminal facilities without incident. It has been indicated that they will remain in Chattanooga approximately two days. Their future itinerary is not yet known.

We have been informed that the Congress of Racial Equality office in Montgomery, Alabama, has been closed and in the future freedom rides going from Nashville, Tennessee, to Jackson will be routed through Memphis, Tennessee, instead of Montgomery.

The so-called freedom walk from Baltimore, Maryland, to Washington, D. C., which had been scheduled for July 16, 1961, was allegedly called off.

Further pertinent developments will be reported to the Department promptly.

FREEDOM RIDE 1961 RACIAL MATTERS; DESTRUCTION OF AIRCRAFT OR MOTOR VEHICLES; CIVIL RIGHTS

Two hundred twenty-seven freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, since May 24, 1961. Ninety have been released on bond, four have paid fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred thirty-two persons remain in custody.

James Luther Beyel, Field Secretary for the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), and a field worker for the Jackson Nonviolent Movement, were arrested by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department on July 14, 1961. They were charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Affidavits filed by the police department relate to Negro juveniles arrested in sit-ins in Jackson, Mississippi, on July 10 and 11, 1961. No trial date has been set.

Parents of the juveniles would not sign complaints for fear of repercussions from members of their own race. It has been reported that some of the juveniles had been given. \$2 apiece, their breakfast and then talked into participating in the sit-ins. The juveniles arrested gave signed statements to the Jackson Police Department that if they had to do it over again they would not participate in sit-ins and would not have done it in the first place if they had not been pushed into it by the Jackson Nonviolent Movement.

Affidavits have also been filed against three other. officers of the Jackson Nonviolent Movement who are out of the city at the present time.

A freedom riders' group starting in Newark, New Jersey, consisting of ten persons, stayed overnight at Roanoke, Virginia, and are departing today for either Chattanooga, Memphis or Little Rock. Information has been received that the Chattanooga

Police Department plans to have men dressed in plain clothes at bus stations and uniformed men out of sight but readily available if any disturbance develops. The police department has advised that arrests of Negroes and whites will be made only as a last resort.

Another freedom riders' group originating in Los Angeles, consisting of eleven persons, arrived in New Orleans on July 14, 1961, and will depart for Jackson, Mississippi, July 15, 1961, adding one additional Negro male at New Orleans.

Five other persons in a freedom riders' group which originated in St. Louis, Missouri, departed Shreveport, Louisians, in the early morning hours of July 15, 1961, by bus en route New Orleans. One of these riders joined the group of four at Shreveport.

A news release has been made that Mississippi Governor Ross Barnett has called a meeting of southern governors at Jackson, Mississippi, for July 19, 1961, to discuss segregation and other issues.

Further developments will be furnished to the Department promptly.

Mr. Murphy said he would forward a confirming memorandum but he desired to immediately initiate this investigation because he contemplated using the results in action filed by the Department before the Interstate Commerce Commission, to be heard 7/20/61. This action involves segregation in interstate transportation facilities. According to Mr. Murphy, the request was based on a 7/7/61 article in the "New York Times" which related the arrest of 3 freedom riders at the bus depot, Jackson, Mississippi, on 7/5/61. The article also stated that 6 freedom riders were arrested at the Illinois Central Railroad, Jackson, Mississippi, 7/6/61. It should be noted in the Bureau's memoranda to the Attorney General, 7/6 and 7/7/61, respectively, the afore-mentioned arrests were called to the attention of the Attorney General.

On 7/10/61 New Orleans was instructed by teletype to expeditiously conduct the investigation requested by Mr. Murphy.

The purpose of this memorandum is to record another cexpedite request made by the Civil Rights Division.



Jackson police plan to arrest leaders of the Jackson Nonviolent Movement on 7/14/61 based on charges that they have contributed to the delinquency of a juvenile.

Jackson Police Department has advised the New Orleans Office that juveniles who had been arrested for sit-ins in Jackson, Mississippi, stated that they would not have engaged in such activities had they not been coaxed into it by individuals operating the Jackson Nonviolent Movement. Parents of the juveniles have stated they were not advised of action contemplated regarding their children. These parents would not sign the complaints as they were afraid of repercussions from mebers of their own race.

Police reported that some of the juveniles had been given \$2 apiece, their breakfast and then talked into participating in the sit-ins.

Affidavits are being filed charging

of the Jackson

James Bevel and Nonviolent Movement with contributing to the delinquency of a juvenile. Charges will be filed before a Justice of the Peace. According to the Jackson police, the maximum sentence/under this charged is a \$500 fine and/or six months in jail (on each count.





It has been reported that klansmen have discussed S the possibility of shooting at the bus when the freedom riders from New York, who are presently in Chattanooga, Tennessee, continue their trip. It was indicated that this might occur at Monteagle Pass which is approximately forty miles west of Chattanooga. freedom riders, were arrested at Ocala, Florida, June 16, 1961, while en route from Washington, D. The Attorney General

Julius W. Hobson, President, Washington, D. C. Chapter, Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), advised that the 1961 CORE Interracial Action Institute will be held in Arlington, Virginia. A Unitarian church will be used, however the specific church has not been designated and there are several Unitarian churches in Arlington. Although the application blank for attendance at the institute states that it will be held from August 13, 1961, to September 3, 1961, Hobson said that the institute may actually begin during the last week of July, 1961, and that it will be a continuing affair which will not end on September 3, 1961.

Hobson related that those who attend the CORE institute in Arlington will test integration in Virginia, particularly in northern Virginia. They will engage in sit-ins, picketing and negotiations to end segregation in theaters, bowling alleys, restaurants and other business establishments. Two hundred people are expected to participate in the program which will consist of a series of two-week training courses.

The Department will be promptly advised of further pertinent developments.



In 1951 she attended two socials sponsored by the Western Division, Los Angeles County Communist Party (LACCP), and she attended a May Day rally at the Embassy Auditorium on May 1, 1951, sponsored by the LACCP.

MILTON S. TYRE testified before Public Session of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) at Washington, D.C., on January 25, 1952. 

It was learned, however, that in compliance with Interstate Commerce Commission, regulations based on the Supreme Court ruling Trailways now has no sign requiring segregation and is not attempting to enforce segregation.

The Associated Press reported that the group plans to leave New York at 8:15 a.m. EDT Thursday on a Greyhound bus scheduled to arrive in Chatta-

nooga at 4:55 a.m. EST Friday. Commissioner Dunlap said that the police department will do all in its power to keep law and order and asked for the full cooperation of the citizens toward that end.



At 10:25 p.m., Eastern Daylight Saving Time, ASAC Whaley of the Little Rock Office telephonically advised that the five Freedom Riders 17/64 enroute from St. Louis to New Orleans arrived at Little Rock by a Trailways bus about 7:45 p.m., (Little Rock time). These Riders alighted from the bus and entered the bus terminal. Approximately 250 people had gathered at the bus station. Inasmuch as the local police department felt that a possible disturbance would occur if the Freedom Riders did not leave the police asked them to leave. The Freedom Riders refused and they again asked them to leave. When they refused the local police took into custody all five of the Freedom Riders and at the time of the phone call from ASAC Whaley they were being booked on a charge of "causing a public disturbance."

ACTION BEING TAKEN:

ASAC Whaley advised that Agents of the Little Rock Office are closely following this matter and when further details are received they will be promptly furnished to the Bureau.

FREEDOM RIDE 1961 RACIAL MATTERS: DESTRUCTION OF ATRCRAFT OR MOTOR VEHICLES; CIVIL RIGHTS

No freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, since July 16, 1961. There has been no change in the status of those previously arrested except that Elmer Brown, a prisoner at Mississippi State Penitentiary, Parchman, Mississippi, allegedly fell from his bunk at approximately 11:00 p.m. on July 18, 1961. It was reportedly determined at a hospital in Greenwood, Mississippi, that Brown has a fractured skull but is not seriously injured. He was removed to the University of Mississippi hospital at Jackson, Mississippi, for observation and treatment.

James Luther Bevel and Jackson Nonviolent Movement were convicted in Jackson Municipal Court on July 18, 1961, on charges of contributing to the delinquency of a minor. Each was charged with one count and each was sentenced to serve six months in jail and was fined five hundred dollars. On July 19, 1961, Bevel is to be tried on three additional counts and be tried on two additional counts. The charges are based have caused minors upon allegations that Bevel and to engage in sit-ins at Jackson.

The five freedom riders who left New York on July 13, 1961, and arrived in Chattanooga, Tennessee, on July 16, 1961, entered a Howard Johnson restaurant in Chattanooga on July 17, 1961. They were refused service and were asked to leave. They departed after the police arrived and read them a loitering statute 116 REC 51 /51

The freedom riders at Chattanooga are scheduled to to depart by Greyhound bus at 10:00 alm. Eastern Standard Time, July 19, 1961, and will arrive in Memphis, Tennessee, at 6:30 p.m., Central Standard Time (CST), July 19,1961. says freedom walk from Baltimore to Washington, 7-16-61, is not definite since it would require approval of SNCC delegates and Civic Interest Group. SNCC delegates plan to contact Adam Clayton Powell and other Congressmen regarding civil rights, 7-17-61. Will also go to office of Chairman, ICC, and to CRD 7-17-61 to request civil rights action.

If SNCC is denied audience by ICC and CRD, some action will probably be taken to dramatize injustices suffered by Negoes in the South. This may be a sit-in, picketing or the contacting of Congressmen and Government officials.

Five freedom riders who originally intended to go to Chattanooga, left New York City 7-13-61 and were accommodated without incident at Thomas Jefferson Inn, Charlottesville, Virginia, on the evening of 7-13-61. They have changed their plans and apparently no longer intend to go to Chattanooga. After arriving in Charlottesville they made inquiry regarding bus schedules to Nashville, Tennessee.

from Madison, Wisconsin, was arrested as a freedom rider at Jackson 6-6-61 and was released on bond 6-24-61. In December, 1960, 204 individuals made arrangements to travel to Cuba on Cubana Airlines on a tour sponsored by the Fair Play for Cuba Committee. Listed among the 204 names was one of Madison, Wisconsin, who departed from Miami for Cuba 12-23-60.

Four Negroes were arrested in Jackson 7-13-61 when they sat at a lunch counter in a Walgreen drugstore and refused to move on when ordered to do so by the police. The Jackson Nonviolent Movement furnished advance information concerning this sitain to the press.

The four freedom riders who were arrested at Little Rock on 7-10-61 were released 7-12-61 with suspended sentences on the condition that they return home, but they later rejected this condition and surrendered to the police 7-12-61. On 7-13-61 they appeared in Municipal Court and were again released on the condition that they would immediately leave Arkansas and would make no further tests of facilities in Arkansas. Municipal Court Judge Quinn Glover urged them to return home but the freedom riders indicated that they would proceed with their proposed trip.

Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), and one of the four freedom riders arrested at Little Rock, advised that ________ a fifth freedom rider who accompanied the group from St. Louis to Little Rock but who was not arrested, has returned to St. Louis. _______ said that the four freedom riders who had been arrested and released would leave Little Rock at 4:00 a.m., 7-14-61, by Trailways bus to arrive at Shreveport, Louisiana, 11:20 a.m., 7-14-61. Affidavits filed by police department officers relate to the Negro juveniles arrested in sit-ins in Jackson, Mississippi. on 7/10 and 11/61. No trial date has been set. Affidavits were also filed against three other; These three persons are présently out of the city but will be arrested upon their return. In connection with the above arrests, it should be noted that the juveniles arrested for sit-ins gave signed statements to the Jackson Police Department that if they had to do it over again they would not participate in sit-ins and would not have done it in the first place if they had not been pushed into it by people from the Jackson Nonviolent Movement. these juveniles would not sign complaints for fear of repercussions from members of their own race. Police reported that some of the juveniles had been given \$20 apiece, their breakfast and then talked into participating in the sit-ins. A freedom riders' group originating from Newark consisting of five persons, three white males and two Negro males, arrived in Roanoke, Virginia, 7/14/61. They stayed overnight: at Roanoke and are leaving on 7/15/61 for either Chattanooga, Memphis or Little Rock. Contact is being maintained with sources to determine their destination. Information has been received that the Chattanooga Police Department plans to have several men dressed in plain clothes at bus stations and uniformed men out of sight but readily available if any disturbance develops. have no signs concerning integration and Negroes frequently use all facilities at the station. The Chattanooga Police Department has advised that arrest of Negroes and whites during a freedom riders' visit will be made only as a last resort and due to a disturbance or at the specific request of station managers for loitering if station managers agree to prosecute. Even this will only be done after efforts have been made to move the group from the station.

A freedom riders' group originating in Los Angeles consisting of eleven persons, four Negro males, four white males and three white females, arrived in New Orleans 7/14/61 and will depart for Jackson, Mississippi, 7/15/61, adding one additional Negro male at New Orleans. A meeting is being held at the St. James AME Church, New Orleans, prior to departure. Appropriate local authorities have been advised.

A freedom riders' group originating from St. Louis, Missouri, consisting of two males and two males, arrived in Shreveport, Louisiana, on 7/14/61 without incident. They did not attempt to test the facilities at Shreveport. This group departed Shreveport, Louisiana, approximately 2:00 a.m., 7/15/61, by Trailways Bus en route New Orleans. They were joined by one additional Negro male from Shreveport.

A United Press International news release indicates that Mississippi Governor Ross Barnett has called a meeting of southern governors at Jackson, Mississippi, 7/19/61, to discuss segregation and other issues.

Julius W. Hobson, President, Washington, D. C. Chapter, Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), advised that the 1961 CORE Interracial Action Institute will be held in Arlington, Virginia. A Unitarian church will be used although the specific church has not been designated and there are several Unitarian churches in Arlington. Although the application blank for attendance at the institute states that it will be held from 8-13-61 to 9-3-61, Hobson said that the institute may actually begin during the last week of July, 1961, and that it will be a continuous affair which will not end on 9-3-61.

Hobson related that those who attend the CORE institute in Arlington will test integration in Virginia, particularly in northern Virginia. They will engage in sit-ins, picketing and negotiations to end segregation in theaters, bowling alleys, restaurants and other business establishments. Two hundred people are expected to participate in the program which will consist of a series of two-week training courses. Local authorities advised.



DETAILS:

The 11 freedom riders from Los Angeles who were joined by one frædom rider in New Orleans traveled from New Orleans to Jackson, Mississippi, by Greyhound bus on 7-15-61. The 12 freedom riders were arrested when they entered the white waiting room in the Greyhound bus terminal and failed to comply with orders of the police that they move on.

Seven freedom riders who arrived in Nashville, Tennessee, from New York on 7-14-61 proceeded to Jackson by Greyhound bus arriving 7-16-61. They were arrested by the Jackson police after they entered the Negro waiting room in the Greyhound bus terminal and refused to move on.

One freedom rider proceeded from Los Angeles/to New Orleans on 7-15-61 and was arrested by the Jackson police in the white waiting room at the Jackson railroad station 7-16-61. His method of travel from New Orleans to Jackson is not known. The arrest was made when he declined to leave the white waiting room upon being instructed to do so by the police.

Two hundred forty-seven freedom riders have been arrested at Jackson since 5-24-61. Ninety-nine have been released on bond, four have been released upon the payment of fines and one has been released without the filing of charges. One hundred forty-three remain in custody.


The freedom riders who started their trip in St. Louis and who were arrested and released at Little Rock, Arkansas, proceeded from Shreveport, Louisiana, to New Orleans 7-15-61 and then arranged to return to their homes. There were no incidents after they left Little Rock.

The freedom riders who left New York 7-13-61 en route to Chattanooga traveled from Roanoke, Virginia, to Knoxville, Tennessee, by Trailways bus 7-15-61. No incidents were reported during the trip although the group was refused service in a restaurant at Elizabethton, Tennessee. The group proceeded to Chattanooga 7-16-61 via two Greyhound buses. The group ate at the Greyhound bus terminal cafeteria in Chattanooga and used other facilities without incident. In an interview on a Negro radio station in Chattanooga on the evening of 7-16-61, Henry Thomas, who acted as spokesman for the freedom riders, urged the Federal Government to end the segregation of transportation facilities. He said the purpose of the trip was to test transportation facilities and if they had been refused service, presumably at the Chattanooga bus station, they would have remained at the bus station and if arrested they would have refused bail and contested the case through legal procedures.

We have been informed that the freedom riders plan to stay in Chattanooga for approximately two days and that their future itinerary has not yet been determined.

Nashville, advised that the Congress of Racial Equality office in Montgomery, Alabama, has been closed and that in the future freedom riders going from Nashville, Tennessee, to Jackson, Mississippi, will pass through Memphis, Tennessee, instead of Montgomery.

An informant of the Baltimore Office advised on 7-16-61 that the freedom walk from Baltimore to Washington, D. C. which had been scheduled for 7-16-61 was called off.



The following observations were made at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Jackson, Mississippi, on June 16, 1961:

Greyhound Bus #4290 arrived at 1:13 p.m. Of the passengers getting off the bus, a group consisting of one Negro male, one white male, and three white females entered the white waiting room of the Greyhound Bus Terminal. They walked as a group to the lunch counter and took seats on the stools at the counter. Captain Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, was observed to approach the group and speak to them. Shortly thereafter, the group of five got off the stools and walked to the main entrance of the terminal, accompanied by police officers, and entered a police patrol wagon, which was parked at the front of the terminal.

The following observations made at the Greyhound Bus Depot, 219 North Lamar Street:

Greyhound Bus #4290 stopped briefly in front of the It then proceeded depot at 1:13 p.m. due to traffic conditions. around to the rear of the depot where the loading and unloading docks are located. At 1:14 p.m. a group of young white people and one Negro male entered the rear entrance to the White Waiting Room of the depot from the dock area. The group proceeded directly to the White Lunch Counter and sat down on the vacant stools. Jackson Police carried their baggage with them. Captain Department, accompanied by another uniformed officer, approached the group and spoke to them while the second officer took notes and apparently asked questions. The young folks rose and without incident walked to the front entrance to the White Waiting Room, accompanied by police officers, went out onto Lamar Street, and were escorted into the waiting police patrol wagon. First to enter the patrol wagon was a white female, followed by a white male Next, two white females climbed into the wagon, and they were finally followed by a colored male. All were inside the patrol wagon and the rear door was closed at 1:16 p.m. No incidents or trouble were noted at any time during the arrest. Prior to the arrival of this group activity in the nature of curious spectators was observed on Lamar Street. Police coverage, estimated at about a dozen uniformed officers kept the spectators circulating on both sides of Lamar Street and at the entrances to the White Waiting Room at the front of the bus depot.

Chief of Detectives M. B. PIERCE, Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that the Freedom Riders whose names are listed below were arrested at 1:15 p.m., June 16, 1931, at the Greyhound Bus Terminal, Jackson. All were charged with breach of the peace. All were arrested by Captain Jackson Police Department. All were transported to the Jackson City Jail. There were no incidents during the arrests. PIERCE stated that all Freedom Riders had entered the white waiting room of the bus terminal as a group, after alighting from the Greyhound Bus from Memphis, Tennessee. After entering the white waiting room, they all took seats at the lunch counter and when they failed to obey Captain orders to move on, he placed them under arrest. PIERCE stated that all would probably be tried in Jackson Municipal Court on June 16, 1961 at their request.
