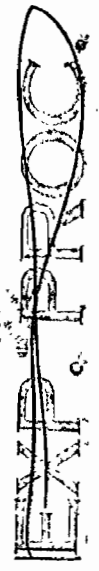

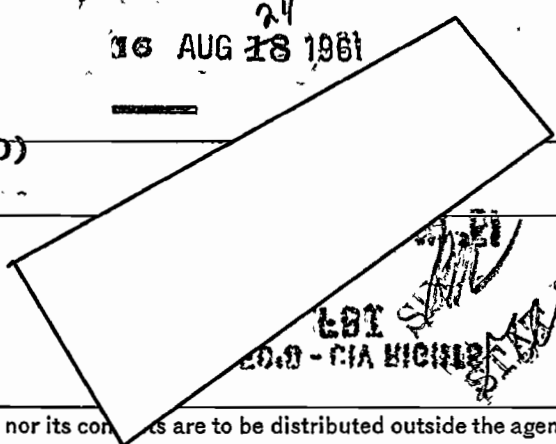

Twelve Freedom Riders, identified in details of report, arrived Jackson, Miss., via Greyhound Bus at 6:49 PM, 7/15/61. All arrested by Jackson PD at Greyhound Bus Terminal when they failed to obey the orders of Jackson PD Officer to move on. All charged with Breach of Peace. All tried in Jackson Municipal Court, 7/17/61, and after not guilty pleas, were convicted of violation of S. 2087.5, Mississippi Code. All sentenced to 4 months in jail and fined \$200. No incidents during trial. All Freedom Riders in this group transferred to MSP, Parchman, Miss. Two released on bond, 7/25/61.

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DETAILS:

Investigation in this case was predicated upon information furnished by the Los Angeles Office of the FBI. By communication dated July 12, 1961, Los Angeles Office advised that a group of Freedom Riders departed Los Angeles, July 12, 1961, via Greyhound Bus, en route to Jackson, Mississippi.

On July 15, 1961, [redacted]  
Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), Jackson, Mississippi, telephonically advised SA [redacted] that twelve Freedom Riders would leave New Orleans, Louisiana, at 12:45 PM, July 15, 1961, en route Jackson, Mississippi.

The following observations were made at the Greyhound Terminal, Jackson, Mississippi, on July 15, 1961:

At 6:49 PM, Greyhound Bus #4442 arrived at the terminal and the passengers on board began to leave the bus. Among the passengers was a group of twelve individuals who separated themselves from the others; this group was composed of five male Negroes, four white males and three white females. These twelve entered the terminal white waiting room in a group and proceeded toward the seating area. Some were observed to take seats immediately and the others remained standing immediately nearby. A number of Jackson Police Officers, other passengers, and members of the press were also in this area of the terminal, thus making close observation difficult.

Captain [redacted] Jackson Police Department, approached this group of twelve passengers and ordered them twice to move from the waiting room. He also asked if his orders had been heard. [redacted] then informed the members of the group they were under arrest and several uniformed police officers were then observed to question various individuals in the group. Also, at this time, two plain-clothes police officers were observed to separate a white male, who had been sitting in the area, from this area and begin to question him near the wall at the far side of the room. Subsequent inquiry of one of the uniformed officers revealed that this white male and one of the Negroes had possibly been involved in a slight scuffle in which the Negro had been shoved.

At 6:54 PM, these twelve individuals were escorted in a group from the terminal by uniformed officers and were observed to enter a patrol wagon parked in front of the terminal. With the exception of the possible shoving incident, no other unusual activity occurred during the arrest and no force, handcuffs or other restraining device was observed to be used or to have been necessary.

At 6:33 PM, SA SAMUEL E. VIRDEN, II, observed the white waiting room of the Greyhound Bus Station in Jackson, Mississippi. At this time, there were two uniformed officers of the Jackson Police Department on the loading platform of the station together with a uniformed Captain of the Department. Four detectives were also observed on this platform. Seven uniformed officers and Captain [redacted] of the Jackson Police Department, were in the white waiting room of the station. Several reporters, both newspaper and television, were noted, including [redacted] of The Clarion-Ledger; [redacted] Associated Press, and [redacted] WJTV Television Station.

At 6:49 PM, Greyhound Bus #4442 arrived from New Orleans, Louisiana, and upon the unloading of the passengers a group of white and Negro males and white females entered the white waiting room and some sat down and others grouped around them.

Captain [redacted] was noted speaking to the group several times and then he was heard to place them under arrest. This took place at 6:54 PM. At about this time, one of the Negro males appeared to move backwards from a row of seats, the end seat being occupied by a white male who was nearest to the Negro male. The Negro male then approached the seat next to the white male and sat down. At this time, uniformed officers of the Jackson Police Department approached the Negro male and were seen to talk to him a short distance away from where he had been sitting. At the same time, two plain-clothes officers were observed talking to the white male after he had accompanied them to a position away from where he had been sitting.

The white male then accompanied the officers questioning him to a police car and entered, after which the car departed.

At about the same time four white males, three white females and five Negro males, including the Negro male mentioned above, were loaded into the "paddy wagon" of the Jackson Police Department, after which the wagon departed.

Assistant Chief of Police M. B. PIERCE, Jackson Police Department, advised that shortly after the arrival of the Greyhound Bus from New Orleans at approximately 6:45 PM, on July 15, 1961, as the group of riders was gathered in the white waiting room, one of the Negro riders, [redacted] was shoved by a white man, [redacted] who was sitting in the station reading a magazine and apparently paying no attention to the proceedings up to that point. PIERCE said that Detectives [redacted] [redacted] questioned [redacted] about the incident and [redacted] told them that [redacted] had stomped on his foot as he was taking a seat next to [redacted]

Chief PIERCE said that [redacted] brought [redacted] to police headquarters, where he was interviewed about the matter and made out a report on the matter. Chief PIERCE said that [redacted] whom he thought was a teacher from Blytheville or some other city in Arkansas, had signed an affidavit against [redacted] charging him with assault. He said that he did not know when the assault case against [redacted] would be heard.

Chief PIERCE furnished the report of Detectives [redacted] in connection with the above incident and stated that it was unfortunate that even such a minor incident had taken place as he and his department were making every effort to prevent anything of this nature. The report of Detectives [redacted] as taken from the records of the Jackson Police Department is set out following:

"arrived at 6:45 PM. This group walked into the Bus Station white waiting room and proceeded to take seats. There was a fairly large crowd of other people in this waiting room.

Including a [redacted]

[redacted] was sitting in a seat by himself off to the corner of the waiting room. He was engaged in reading some kind of literature and was not paying any attention to the proceedings. While he was doing this someone stepped on his foot which caused him to withdraw his leg from its normal position and he saw that a negro man who was later identified as being

[redacted] had stepped on his foot.

[redacted] made the usual motions of a person in pain and shoved him forceably off of his foot. We were at the scene and [redacted] stated to us that he had stomped his foot and that he had to shove him off of it.

"With this complaint made by [redacted] we told him that he would have to sign an affidavant if he wanted him prosecuted and he wanted to do this. He was brought to this office where he signed an affidavant against [redacted] for Assault.

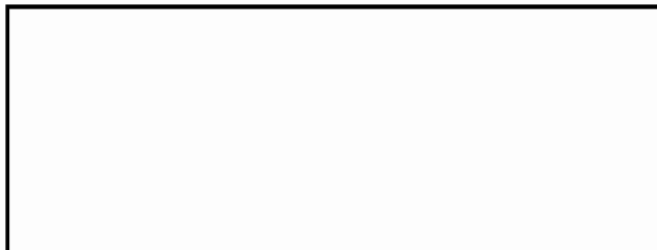

Chief of Detectives M. B. PIERCE, Police Department, Jackson, Mississippi, advised that the following individuals were tried in Jackson Municipal Court, Jackson, Mississippi, on July 17, 1961:



ROSE SCHORR ROSENBERG



PIERCE stated all of the above individuals were tried for violation of Section 2087.5, Mississippi Code. All entered pleas of not guilty through their attorney. All defendants were convicted and sentenced to four months in jail and fined \$200.

According to PIERCE, some of the defendants would be transferred to the Hinds County Jail to serve out their fines and sentences and some would be housed in the Jackson City Jail to assist the Sheriff in overcoming crowded conditions at the County Jail.

PIERCE advised there were no incidents during the course of the above trial.

PIERCE also advised that on the same date, immediately following the above trial, Freedom Rider [redacted] was tried on an assault charge stemming from the affidavit signed by [redacted] had been acquitted on the assault charge.

After picking up their baggage, one white male, one Negro female, and one Negro male walked back inside the terminal. Captain [redacted] approached them and spoke to them. Shortly thereafter, the white male, the Negro female and the Negro male were escorted from the terminal waiting room and were placed in a police department patrol wagon which was parked outside the main entrance.

At 3:32 PM, the oldest Negro male who had been with the original group of six walked into the terminal and Captain [redacted] was observed to speak to him. After speaking to him briefly, Captain [redacted] escorted the Negro male to a waiting police patrol car.

At 3:35 PM, two white teenage boys who had been with the original group of six were observed leaving the terminal in a taxi.

By letter dated November 13, 1950, [redacted] American Friends Service Committee (AFSC), 1830 Sutter Street, San Francisco, advised the Sixth Army, Presidio of San Francisco, to the effect that he would not respond to any questions of a Government investigator concerning the loyalty of friends or acquaintances, their political activities, organizational affiliations, thoughts, or vocal expressions but would freely answer such questions under subpoena in open court.

On June 21, 1957, [redacted] California, furnished a handbill in which certain individuals including RUSSELL JORGENSEN expressed opposition to testing the H-bomb.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

In order to accomplish further distribution of this statement, it was requested that contributions be sent to [redacted] Berkeley.

In a letter to the Editor appearing in the "Oakland Tribune" newspaper of May 13, 1960, RUSSELL JORGENSEN, Berkeley, wrote that at a meeting of the Berkeley Friends on May 8, he had been instructed to write expressing deep concern with the mandate given the House Un-American Activities Committee (HCUA). JORGENSEN went on to write that the legacy of HCUA has been and is persecution, not the drafting of legislation.

A source advised on November 10, 1954, that [redacted] Berkeley, California, had received the September - October issue of "China Reconstructs." (See appendix page.)

On April 11, 1961, Mr. DON MULFORD, California State Assemblyman, 364 - 14th Street, Oakland, California, furnished a photostat of a letter dated March 21, 1961, addressed to Mr. MULFORD and written on the letterhead of [redacted] Berkeley, California. The text of the letter follows:

"We too cherish and uphold free Speech every where in the United States but with no exceptions. The campuses are part of the United States, you know.

"It is behavior such as yours which turns students away from the American ideals of freedom since you make a mockery of it by wanting to deny it where it's exercise has some risk. Risk there may be. However, you increase it by your short-sighted un-American views and utterances.

Source who has provided reliable information in the past advised that [redacted] resides at [redacted] Berkeley, California, and is employed as [redacted] University of California, Department of History, Berkeley, California.

In the "Oakland Tribune", a daily newspaper of general circulation in Oakland, California, under date of May 26, 1960 in article captioned "66 at UC ask Probe of San Francisco Police", mention was made that 66 University of California faculty members requested an investigation of police handling of the May 13 riots at the San Francisco City Hall in connection with the House Committee on Un-American Activities hearings. They signed the letter sent to Attorney General STANLEY MOSK (California) for an impartial hearing stressing the request was made as individuals on behalf of the University of California. In their resolution they claimed that the San Francisco Police were technically incompetent in letting the disturbance grow to the extent it did in allowing it to become disorganized and by taking action by force before dealing with people to leave the building. Among one of the faculty members who signed the petition was CHARLES G. SELLERS, Jr.

A newspaper clipping from the "Daily Californian", a University of California student newspaper dated March 21, 1961, in an article captioned "12 Professors Co-Sign Petition to Ban HCUA", stated that 12 UC Professors were among the 250 signers of a petition demanding abolition of the House Committee on Un-American Activities (HCUA) released in New York by the American Civil Liberties Union.

This document contains neither recommendations nor conclusions of the FBI. It is the property of the FBI and is loaned to your agency; it and its contents are not to be distributed outside your agency.

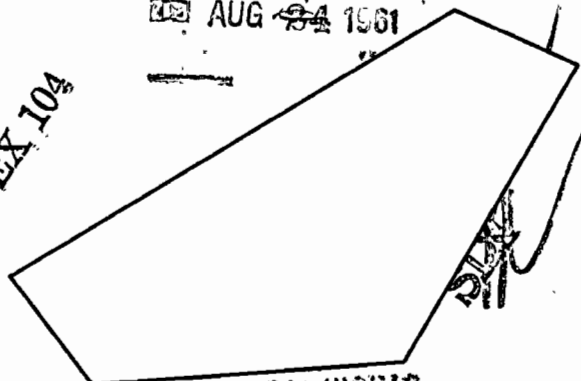

The Unitarian Fellowship for Social Justice in a leaflet announced a "Walk for the Human Race! - To End the Arms Race" on January 16, 1960. This leaflet informed that the participants would walk to the offices of the French Consulate to protest the Sahara Bombing tests. One of the scheduled speakers at this affair was the Rev. FRANCES GEDDES.

[redacted] was listed as a member of the [redacted] fund raising organization known as the Bay Area Students Legal Aid Fund, Post Office Box 5507, San Francisco, California to assist in raising funds to aid in defense of a student arrested in the riots accompanying the May 13, 1960 House Committee on Un-American Activities hearings held in San Francisco, California.

Another source who has furnished reliable information in the past made available records showing that the "San Francisco Examiner" and the "San Francisco Chronicle", daily newspapers of general circulation in the San Francisco area, both set forth a signed statement against nuclear bomb tests on April 5, 1958. Among those names signed was Rev. FRANCIS GEDDES of the Church of the Fellowship of All People, 2041 Larkin Street. This source also advised that on November 16, 1958, a signed petition appeared in the "San Francisco Chronicle" of the citizens group for inter-cultural development of Quemoy and Matsu Islands, which were sent to the United Nations asking it to take a poll of the above islands for use as an Asian educational and cultural centers.

The source also advised that GEDDES' name was on a circular that announced a House Committee on Un-American Activities Seminar under the auspices of the American Civil Liberties Union of Northern California, which was to be held in San Francisco on March 11, 1961. No arrest record was found for [redacted] at the San Francisco Police Department.

It lists under Internal Security Subcommittee of the Senate Judiciary Committee, Handbook for Americans, S.Doc. 117, April 23, 1956, page 91, the following:

PROGRESSIVE PARTY - 1. "Communist dissimulation extends into the field of political parties forming political front organizations such as the Progressive Party. \*\*\* The Communist are thus enabled to present their candidates for elective office under other than Communist label!"

On August 21, 1961, Freedom Rider [redacted] went on trial in Marion County Court, Ocala, Florida, Judge Lewis O. Myers presiding, on charge of "Unlawful Assembly." [redacted] was arrested in Ocala, Florida, on June 16, 1961, along with Freedom Riders [redacted] and [redacted] on charges of "Unlawful Assembly," and "Failure to Obey an Officer."

On August 22, 1961, the jury returned a verdict of "Guilty" against [redacted] and he was sentenced to flat six months and fined \$300.00. [redacted] is to be released on \$1,000.00 bond, pending the filing of an appeal.

On August 21, 1961, Judge Myers withheld a decision on a motion to quash charges of "Failure to Obey an Officer," pending against Freedom Riders [redacted]. A final decision will be made following final disposition of an appeal of conviction in County Court on "Unlawful Assembly" against [redacted]. If the appeal is granted on the basis there was no unlawful assembly, Judge Myers indicated he would not dismiss the "Failure to Obey" charges. However, if the appeal should be upheld on other grounds, then he would quash the charges as requested in a motion by Freedom Riders Attorney [redacted], Jacksonville, Florida.

In view of this the trials of [redacted] on charges of "Failure to Obey an Officer" will be postponed indefinitely.

The above information has been discussed with [redacted] Military Intelligence (CIC), Jacksonville, Florida, on a continuing basis.

deep South. This article described JOHNSON as a native Tucsonian, a Navy veteran and a former track and basketball letterman at Tucson High School. The article also reflected that he was the winner of the Navy's National Essay Contest on the Responsibilities of Democracy.

A news item appearing in the June 26, 1961, edition of the Arizona Daily Star, a daily publication, published at Tucson, Arizona, carried an article captioned "20 'Riders' Jailed in Jackson." Below this caption was a subheadline "U A Student Among Those Arrested." This article under the dateline Jackson, Mississippi, reflected that a group of eleven Negroes and nine white persons were arrested in Jackson on June 25, 1961. Among those arrested was FRANK JOHNSON, 20, 420 North Herbert, Tucson, University of Arizona student, Negro.

A news item appearing in the July 7, 1961, edition of the Tucson Daily Citizen captioned "Tucson Girl in Freedom Rider Group" indicated that FRANK JOHNSON, 21, was the first Freedom Rider from Tucson and that he was jailed approximately two weeks ago in Jackson, Mississippi.

A news item appearing in the Tucson Daily Citizen on July 26, 1961, captioned "Two Tucson Riders Free on Bond" under dateline Houston, Texas, reflected that FRANK JOHNSON, 21, of 420 North Herbert, Tucson, and PATRICIA D. BASKERVILLE, 18, of 2914 South Park Avenue, July 21, 1961, in an unsuccessful attempt to infiltrate the Union Train Station coffee shop. The article set forth that these two parties had been released on \$500.00 bond on charges of unsuccessful assembly. The article stated that JOHNSON and Miss BASKERVILLE said they intended to remain in Houston until the matter was resolved.

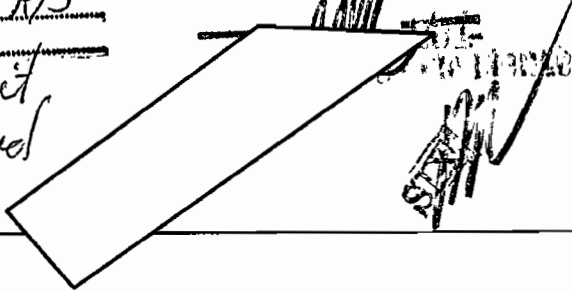

On August 22, 1961, Freedom Rider [redacted] was found "guilty" of "unlawful assembly" by six man jury in Marion County Court, Ocala, Florida. He had been arrested at the Greyhound Bus Station, Ocala, on June 16, 1961, along with Freedom Riders [redacted] on charges of "unlawful assembly" and "failure to obey an officer." [redacted] was sentenced to flat six months and \$300 fine or additional six months.

Immediately upon completion of sentencing, [redacted] attorney [redacted] Jacksonville, Florida, filed a motion for a new trial but this motion was denied. Jackson then filed notice of appeal and [redacted] was released on \$1,000 bond.

Freedom Riders [redacted] were previously found "guilty" of "unlawful assembly" in jury trials held in Marion County Court, Ocala, Florida, on July 7, 1961. On July 17, 1961, [redacted] was sentenced to pay fine of \$500 or six months in jail, plus 30 days jail sentence.

[redacted] was sentenced to 90 days in jail or \$250 fine. Both [redacted] are free on \$1,000 bonds each, pending appeals before next term of Circuit Court.

Cases against [redacted] for "failure to obey an officer" have been postponed indefinitely until the appeals are completed in Circuit Court.

On June 15, 1955, [redacted] voluntarily appeared at the Charlotte Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, at which time he denied ever being a member of the CP, but stated he had met individuals who were members, but declined to name them.

On February 29, 1956, a second source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on that date, [redacted] had contacted the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D.C., and requested that he be allowed to enter and live in the Soviet Union because as a Negro he could not expect to receive justice since racial prejudice was greater than social justice in the United States.

On February 2, 1959, a third source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, made available a piece of the letterhead stationery of the Committee to Combat Racial Injustice, which reflected that [redacted] of the Union County, North Carolina, NAACP, was [redacted] of the Committee to Combat Racial Injustice.

On December 19, 1958, a fourth source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the Committee to Combat Racial Injustice was being set up in order to concern itself mainly with the racial issue involving the conviction and incarceration of two Negro youths, ages 8 and 10 at Monroe, North Carolina, who were convicted of kissing a white girl. This source added that this committee would concern itself with other racial incidents and intends to become a prominent organization. This same source also stated that this committee was initiated through the efforts of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), which was the motivating force in the formation of this committee.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

The April 6, 1960 edition of "The New York Times" carried an article which maintained that the United States Press had made certain charges against Cuba which were not true and that the "Fair Play for Cuba Committee" was organized to tell the truth about Cuba in the interest of fair play. Among those listed as members of this committee was Williams.

On August 10, 1960, a fifth source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that on August 7, 1960, he attended a meeting at 116 University Place, New York City, at which time [redacted] was introduced as a noted Negro leader from Monroe, North Carolina, a sponsor of "Fair Play for Cuba Committee", and that [redacted] had just returned from an extended tour of Cuba, where he observed the revolution, first hand, and

participated in the July 26, 1960 celebration on the Sierra Maestra. [redacted] stated he visited Cuba to see the advancement of the Cuban Revolution and was very impressed by its success. [redacted] stated today in Cuba one does not see any racial discrimination and that the United States Government and the State Department are making a definite effort to keep Negroes out of Cuba. [redacted] stated "the progress of the revolution can be seen all over - - - If this is Communism, then I vote for Communism".

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960 issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS) page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA), was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of the YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A source advised on May 3, 1961, that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City, by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group were the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised that the YSA is dominated and controlled in its leadership and ranks by members of the SWP. The source added that the SWP considers the YSA as a training ground for hard-core SWP leadership activity and as its current and future hope for recruits and the promulgation of the SWP movement throughout the United States.

The headquarters of the YSA are located at 10 East 23rd Street, New York City.

The YS is a monthly publication, self-described in the May, 1961 issue as the official organ of the YSA.

The SWP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

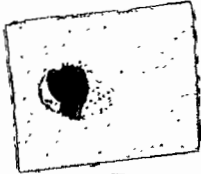

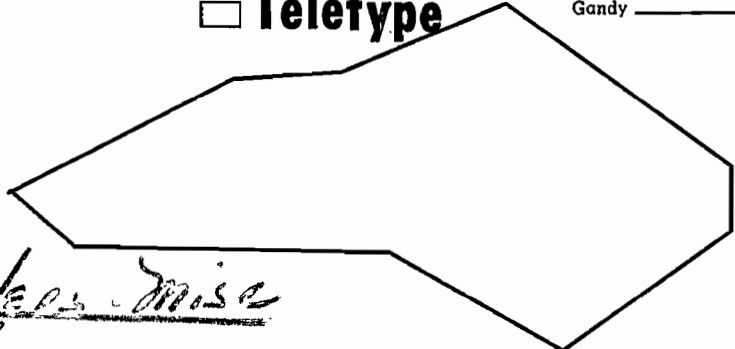

On August 18, 1961, Harris County Chief Deputy Sheriff B. E. Williams advised his office had received, within the past two days, six telegrams from California, which were couched in similar phraseology and appeared to possibly have resulted from some type of organized campaign. In general, these telegrams protested the arrest and incarceration of the "Freedom Riders" from California and demanded their immediate release. The telegrams asserted these arrests were in violation of democratic principals. Chief Williams furnished the following names and addresses appearing as the senders of these telegrams. On August 16, 1961, "The Houston Press" carried an article reporting District Attorney Frank Briscoe announced he would decide on August 18, 1961, whether or not to prosecute the unlawful assembly charges previously filed in connection with this matter against eighteen individuals. This article reported Briscoe had held lengthy conferences on August 15, 1961, with George Washington, Thomas Jefferson, Hamah King, and John Wildenthal, identified as attorneys for this group.

On August 18, 1961, at 2:05 PM, Assistant Chief Deputy Loyd Frazier, Harris County Sheriff's Office, advised that approximately ten Negroes identified as members of the Progressive Youth Association (PYA) had just appeared at the Harris County Courthouse and were engaged in picketing. Frazier stated members of this group were carrying signs to the general effect that District Attorney Frank Briscoe was not informed on the laws involved in the recent arrests at the Union Station Restaurant.

At 2:40 PM on August 18, 1961, Captain [redacted] Harris County Sheriff's Office, advised the above individuals only remained at the Courthouse for approximately twenty minutes and left without creating any disturbance. [redacted] stated uniformed officers of the Houston, Texas, Police Department had been stationed at each corner of the Courthouse Square to insure that traffic was not interfered with. [redacted] further stated that as the pickets left the Courthouse they received jeers and other calls from jail inmates who observed them from the windows of the Harris County Jail located on upper floors of the Courthouse building.

On August 18, 1961, "The Houston Chronicle" carried an article captioned "Eleven Riders Here to be Prosecuted." This article reported District Attorney Briscoe had announced his office would prosecute the eleven "Freedom Riders" and the seven Houston PYA members previously arrested when they sought service at the Union Station Restaurant at Houston. The article reported the "Freedom Riders", from California, claimed they were legitimate interstate travelers and, under Federal law, entitled to eat in the railroad station restaurant.

District Attorney Briscoe was quoted as follows: "After an objective study, we are convinced the defendants were not engaged in interstate commerce and that the coffee shop is not an integral part of interstate commerce facilities. Therefore, we are prosecuting." This article reported Briscoe then estimated the trials would begin in four to six weeks.

According to this article, the Californians involved held round-trip rail tickets from Los Angeles to Houston which were reportedly paid for by the Congress of Racial Equality. The article pointed out this was the first "Freedom Rider" invasion of Houston.

On August 19, 1961, "The Houston Chronicle" carried an article reporting members of the Progressive Youth Association, led by their president, John Hollie, picketed the Harris County Courthouse on August 18, 1961, in protest of the decision of District Attorney Briscoe to prosecute the unlawful assembly charges. According to this article, one of the seven Negro youths involved in the picketing carried a sign which said "The D. A. - Interprets law or expresses personal feelings?" In addition to Hollie, this article identified the six other pickets as the following students of Texas Southern University and (PYA) members:

This article reported the picketing was orderly and there was no demonstration until the picketing students walked past the jail section of the courthouse. It was reported that Negro prisoners in the jail cheered, while white prisoners jeered.

On August 19, 1961, "The Houston Press" carried a similar article concerning the picketing incident. This article reported that other signs carried by the picketing students were as follows:

"Jailed For a Cup of Coffee"

"How Were the Freedom Riders Treated in Jail?"

"Does Briscoe Know the Laws of the ICC?"

With respect to persons mentioned above, on July 1, 1961, "The Informer" newspaper, published at Houston, Texas, carried an article identifying John W. Hollie as the president of the (PYA) and Thomas J. Harris, Judy Ann Gibson, and Nancy Smith as PYA members. *John W. Hollie*

On July 1, 1961, the "Forward Times" newspaper, published at Houston, Texas, identified Nancy Smith as secretary of the PYA.

On July 7, 1961, "The Houston Press" carried an article identifying Nancy Smith as one of several young students who were charged with loitering on February 24, 1961, at the Union Station Restaurant in a previous sit-in demonstration. This article reported that Nancy Smith had been fined \$25.00 in Corporation Court and that this conviction had been upset by a decision in County Court which dismissed the original complaint.

On August 19, 1961, Assistant Chief Deputy Loyd Frazier, mentioned above, advised that all except two of the persons previously jailed in connection with the arrests at Union Station on August 11, 1961, were released from the Harris County Jail on that date. Frazier stated the two persons remaining in jail were Houston Negroes who were members of the PYA.

On August 20, 1961, "The Houston Post" carried an article reporting that the remaining seven California "Freedom Riders" and five Houston demonstrators had been released from Harris County Jail on the previous date on \$500.00 bonds. The two Houston (PYA) members who remained in jail were identified as John D. Hutchins, [redacted] and Herbert Hamilton, [redacted].

B. APPROX. [redacted]

In this article George Washington, Jr., one of the attorneys of this group, stated the defendants released from jail intended to remain in Harris County to await trial. Washington was also quoted as expressing the opinion that District Attorney Briscoe's decision to prosecute the "Freedom Riders" was "ridiculous." This article reported the eleven "Freedom Riders" would remain in private homes at Houston while they awaited trial and prior to their trials they would speak before as many civic and church groups as they could in an effort to explain the problem of desegregation and its effect on the nation's foreign affairs.

The above article also reported that District Attorney Briscoe hoped to have the cases brought to trial in County Court at Houston within two weeks.
