Their accommodations at Little Rock, Arkansas for the night of July 10, 1961 were to be arranged by

The group was scheduled to leave Little Rock on July 11, 1961, time unknown, via Trailways Bus destination New Orleans, Louisiana with a stop at Shreveport, Louisiana.

On August 17, 1961, a racially mixed group of about forty individuals picketed the Federal Court House, Ninth and Chestnut Streets, Philadelphia, Pa. This picket line was sponsored by the Philadelphia Chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality (C.O.R.E.)

A flyer was distributed which is set out in full below:

"WE PLEDGE OUR SUPPORT TO

#### THE FREEDOM RIDERS

"This past Monday in the Hinds County, Mississippi Courthouse, more than 150 Freedom Riders appeared before a judge of the Mississippi court. They are on trial as a result of their attempt to use the American right to travel freely on the Nation's highways.

"We feel that the trial of these Freedom Riders represents the decision of Americans of North and South, Negro and white, to end the shame of segregation in this nation.

"We appear here to express our sympathy with the fight for freedom being carried on by the Freedom Riders and to carry on this fight in our own City of Philadelphia, working to see that all men and women, regardless of race, religion or color, are given an equal opportunity in their pursuit of happiness.

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# EAST HOLLYWOOD INTERRACIAL COUNCIL (EHIC)

The "Daily People's World" (a West Coast Communist newspaper) on February 23, 1951, page 2, carried an article announcing the formation of the East Hollywood Interracial Council. This article stated the council would "operate to unite Americans of different racial backgrounds...emphasis on the new council will be on developing Negro-white unity as a safeguard for democracy."

# FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FPCC)

A source advised on April 17, 1961 that the FPCC was formed in New York City in the Spring of 1960 under the sponsorship of well-known Pro-Communists and "liberals" for the announced purpose of defending the "truth" about Cuba from distortion by Cuba's enemies. A "Greater Los Angeles Chapter" of the FPCC was formed in Los Angeles in December, 1960 under the stimulus of the Los Angeles Local-Socialist Workers Party (LAL-SWP). The Los Angeles Chapter is under complete control and domination of the LAL-SWP.

Another source advised on February 28, 1961 that DOROTHY HEALEY, chairman, Southern California District Communist Party (SCDCP), had instructed that all Party sections should assign at least one person to work in the FPCC. HEALEY stated that CP members must work with this committee regardless of the fact that the SWP is in control.

Both the CP and the SWP have been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

LOS ANGELES PREPARATORY COMMITTEE FOR THE 7th WORLD YOUTH FESTIVAL, aka., The Los Angeles Festival Committee

On May 3, 1961, a source advised that the Los Angeles Preparatory Committee for the 7th World Youth Festival, also known as the Los Angeles Festival Committee, was created early in 1958 by a group of youth who had attended the 6th World Youth Festival held in Moscow, Russia, in 1957. The Committee was established for the purpose of supporting and urging attendance at the 7th World Youth Festival which was held in Vienna, Austria, in July and August, 1959.

The original officers of the Los Angeles Festival Committee were all members of the Labor Youth League (LYL) and in effect the Committee, since its inception, was dominated by individuals who were members of the LYL. The chairman of the Committee, ROBERT KAUFMAN, was a member of the LYL prior to its dissolution in February, 1957.

Meetings of the Organization, however, were open to all individuals interested in attending the Festival, and attendance at meetings of the Committee does not necessarily indicate a sympathy for the Communist movement. The Committee attempted to gain broad support for the Festival on the various high school and college campuses in the Los Angeles area.

Following the holding of the Festival and the return of the Los Angeles Delegates, the Committee continued in the form of a propaganda bureau providing speakers and films depicting the Festival. It also had as its purpose the publicizing of future youth festivals and to promote the theme "peace and friendship". This activity gradually decreased during the year 1960 and the committee has now ceased to exist.

The LYL has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

## MAY DAY COMMITTEE, aka., United May Day Committee

A source advised on May 9, 1961 that the May Day celebration in Los Angeles, California, in recent years (excepting 1958) has been handled by a special committee known as the May Day Committee, United May Day Committee, or variations thereof. Communist Party (CP) members are assigned to work on this committee by the CP to assure the success of the May Day celebration.

The 1958 May Day celebration was sponsored openly in the name of the CP, instead of the May Day Committee and the 1961 May Day celebration was held under the name "Committee for '75 Years of May Day'".

On February 9, 1961, a source advised that the Progressive Youth Organizing Committee (PYOC) was established at a national socialist-oriented youth conference held in Chicago, Illinois, December 30, 1960, through January 1, 1961. This conference was the result of a mandate issued by the National Executive Committee, Communist Party, USA, calling for a youth conference to establish an organizing committee whose objective would be to set up a national socialist-oriented youth organization. The conference scheduled a convention to be held within a year to found a new national socialist-oriented youth organization.

The June 29, 1961, issue of the "San Francisco Examiner," newspaper, San Francisco, California, in an article captioned "Cells Jammed -- Secret Report by Bay Rider, stated in part as follows:

"Thirty-two girl freedom riders in the Jackson, Los Braggers, Mississippi, County Jail have been jammed into cells designed for eight, the Examiner learned vesterday.

"A letter smuggled out by Rita Carter, a 16-year- Belkley old Negro member of the Bay Area group arrested last week, said that the girls have responded to the crowded conditions well and keep their jailers busy by singing all night.

"'In our cell there are 14 Negro girls,' Miss Carter wrote. 'In the white cell next door there are 18..... We are scheduled to get out the 27th of December. I have not been allowed to make my phone calls or receive any of my clothes.'"

The July 15, 1961, issue of the "San Francisco Examiner," San Francisco, California, in an article captioned "Pastor Tells of a New Type Negro who Lives Without Fear in South -- Bay Rider Aide Here," contained a photograph of RITA CARTER and stated that Miss CARTER had described her 22 days in Jackson's County Jail and In the Mississippi Penitentiary maximum security unit. She charged that the five Bay Area girls there were "bruised all over" from sleeping on steel bunks, that she saw "a wrist breaker" used on one girl to force her out of her cell, and that the cells were aleaned up and excess prisoners hidden away when three "investigating" delegations visited Parchman (State Penitentiary).

The "Houston Post" for August 31, 1961, reported that the trial of the eleven California "Freedom Riders" and the seven Houston Progressive Youth Association members was started on August 30, 1961. The local court encountered a technical flaw in the original complaint which did not properly name the Union Station Coffee Shop as the location of the unlawful assembly. By agreement between the District Attorney and the defense counsel, all the defendants were freed by an instructed verdict of not guilty, but will be brought to trial on September 5, 1961, after new complaints are filed. Judge George E. Miller announced that a speedy trial would be held since part of the defendants are college students planning to re-enter fall classes.

The "Houston Chronicle" for September 6, 1961, reported that the eleven California "Freedom Riders" and the seven Houstonians were found guilty of unlawful assembly in the Union Station Coffee Shop, Houston, Texas, and fined \$100.00 each. The verdict was returned on September 5, 1961, by a jury of six men in the County Court of Law under Judge George E. Miller. The attorneys for the defense immediately gave notice of appeal to the Court of Criminal Appeals.

"A third wave of local Freedom Riders is being readied for a trip to Inssissippi... Meanwhile, two more Berkeleyans arrived in Jackson Sunday and were given the usual reception -- a warrant charging them with disturbance of the peace and a fourmonth jail sentence.

"'When it's all boiled down, the way human ty treats humanity down here is a little sickening, 'MARIAN A. KENDAIL of Berkeley, spokesman for the latest arrivals, said. The 35-year-old social worker and JOHN DOLAN, 20, a University of California senior, were among the 14 Californians arrested in the white waiting room of Jackson's railway terminal.

"In all, 20 white and Negro riders were jailed Sunda ... Within 10 minutes after arrival of the 20, they were on their way to the police station and jail. As spokesman for the group, Miss KENDALL responded 'We cant't' when Police Captain J. L. RAY ordered them to move out of the station..."

Fifteen Episcopal ministers were arrested at Jackson, Mississippi, on September 13, 1961, by the Jackson, Mississippi, Police Department for breach of the peace when they attempted to test the facilities of the bus terminal. The ministers were members of a group of twenty-eight Episcopal ministers en route from Louisiana to Michigan. Information had previously been received that in their stopover in Jackson, Mississippi, the group would not attempt to test facilities.

The group of fifteen ministers arrested consisted of twelve whites and three Negroes. Among those arrested was the New York City Governor Nelson Rockefeller of New York State.

The group is presently confined to Jackson Municipal Jail and trial of the individuals has been postponed fin Sptember 14, 1961, until 3:00 p.m., September 15, 1961, at the request of the ministers so that they may obtain funds to post bond after the trial.

An Sorly morning broadcast on September 14, 1961, indicated that Governor Rockefeller was contacted at Rochester, New York, for his comments. He is reported to have stated That he would not interfere in any way in this matter and that he admired the ministers.





On August 15, 1961, at 4:10 p.m. seven persons appeared at the Dearborn Street entrance of the Old Post Office Building. The Old Post Office Building is located at Dearborn Street between Jackson and Adams Streets, loop, Chicago, Illinois.

The seven persons consisting of three Negroes and four whites picketed on the sidewalk until 6:00 p.m. in an orderly manner in front of the Dearborn Street entrance to the Old Post Office Building. Five of these persons carried signs and the remaining two persons handed out leaflets. The signs and leaflets stated the picketing was sponsored by the Chicago Chapter of the Congress of Racial Equality. The messages in effect urged the Interstate Commerce Commission to rule favorably in connection with banning of segregation in interstate transportation terminal and terminal related facilities.

One of the signs stated "Take down the WHITE-COLORED Sign in ALL AMERICAN TERMINALS."

No incidents occurred.

The August 30, 1961, issue of "The Detroit Free Press", (Metro Final), a Detroit daily newspaper of general circulation, page one, column two, carried an article reflecting that the following Episcopal ministers plan to join freedom riders on a "prayer pilgramage" on a bus departing New Orleans, Louisiana, on September 11, 1961, and arriving Dearborn, Michigan, September 16, 1961:

Reverend Malcolm Boyd; Chaplain, Wayne State University, Detroit, Michigan

Reverend Joseph S. Dickson, Rector, St. Joseph's

Church, Detroit, Michigan,

Reverend James B. Guinan, Rector, Trinity Church,

Farmington, Michigan.

According to that article, the prayer pilgramage is being sponsored by the Episcopal Society for Cultural and Racial Unity, an Episcopal church group with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia. "The tour is primarily to alert the church and General Convention to the situation within our own structure and to recognize that we are all involved" (quotes in article from unnamed spokesman).

This article further stated that the Society hopes to gather 37 priests from across the nation for a briefing and prayer session in New Orleans on September 11, 1961, and then go to Jackson, Mississippi, the next day. The tour will include a half dozen Episcopal related colleges in the south, some integrated, some not. The men on the tour are warned



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



FREEDOM RIDERS, 1961

On September 6, 1961,	
Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), Jackson,	
Mississippi, advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau	of
Investigation that CORE is continuing its efforts to recrui	t
new Freedom Riders to Jackson, Mississippi.	

New recruits will be accepted only if they agree to spend six months in jail as CORE does not intend to follow past procedure of bonding the Freedom Rider out after spending a short time in jail. He acknowledged that the Freedom Rider movement into Jackson is temporarily "bogged down" because of pending litigation involving Freedom Riders convicted in past, making their bonds, returning them to Jackson for trial and the like.

The Freedom Riders who are returning to stand trial in Hinds County Court after appealing from conviction in Jackson Municipal Court are being given a free choice of action that they can pursue. If they want to stand trial and are convicted CORE will put up money for their appeal bond if they desire or they can serve out sentence imposed. If they wish to pay their fines previously imposed and withdraw their appeal CORE will put up the money for the fine although CORE is opposed to paying the fine.

CORE has contacted about sixty convicted Freedom Riders who received fines and suspended jail sentences and who are presently out on appeal bond from Municipal Court. About 25 of these persons have indicated they are willing to return, withdraw their appeal, and serve out their fines.

About 60 convicted Freedom Riders are scheduled to return to Jackson for arraignment in Hinds County Court on September 11, 1961. These are Freedom Riders released on appeal bond subsequent to August 14, 1961. They are coming by various means of transportation, no charter buses will be used. CORE does not



anticipate any testing of facilities by these persons. They will be housed in private homes and arrangements have been made to have them leave Jackson on first available transportation after their arraignment.
