Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs (ELF) ceremonies at the Statue of Liberty, Liberty Island, New York City, from 1:40 PM to 2:35 PM in celebration of the 112th anniversary of the birth of Emma Lazarus, author of the sonnet "New Colessus" which is inscribed on a bronze plaque within the pedestal of the statue. Approximately 110 women and 10 men were in attendance.

Mollie Ilson, ELF, President, introduced Mark Lane, guest speaker, as the New York State assemblyman from Yorkville and Harlem areas of New York City, and as a modern abolitionist and a Freedom Rider. Lane stated that he has been criticized by many people, including President John F. Kennedy, for his actions in traveling to the southern states, being referred to as a "meddler from the north".

New York T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 16, 1959, that the Kings County Communist Party (CP) Convention was held on November 13-14, 1959, at 3200 Coney Island Avenue, Brooklyn, New York. On November 14, 1959, delegates to the State Convention of the CP were woted upon. Mollie Ilson was elected as an alternate delegate.

Tane stated that he fought with the Army in World War II with one purpose in mind, which was for the whole country. He does not feel that he was an outsider in going to Montgomery, Alabama, and feels that the President should take an affirmative stand supporting the action of those people who wish to see that the Negro and the white can travel together.

On April 26, 1961, New York T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that the New York Council to Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee sponsored a rally at Saint Nicholas Arena, 67 West 66th Street, New York City, on April 22, 1961; with Mark Lane included among the speakers.

EMMA LAZARUS FEDERATION OF JEWISH WOMEN'S CLUBS

"The Jewish Fraternalist" dated October, 1947, self identified as the official publication of the Jewish People's Fraternal Order (JPFO) of the International Workers Order (IWO), on page 6, contained an article which reflected that the Emma Lazarus Division (ELD) of the JPFO was to hold its first national convention in New York City on November 15 and 16, 1947, after having been first established at a National Women's Conference called three years previously by the JPFO.

The "Morning Freiheit" on January 25, 1951, contained a report on the National Convention of the ELD of the JPFO which took place in New York City on January 20 and 21, 1951. At this convention it was noted that the ELD changed its name to Emma Lazarus Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs (ELF) and adopted a new constitution.

On May 11, 1961, a source advised that the ELF is one of several mass organizations comprising the Jewish cultural progressive movement. who is a member of the New York State Communist Party (CP) Board and Committee, is the leading force in the organization, whose leadership is largely made up of Communists.

The source stated that the ELF claims to be for peace and interested in protecting the rights of the foreign born. It is against the BEN GURION Government of Israel, bomb testing, anti-Semitism, Negro discrimination, and the rearmament of West Germany.

The source related that the ELF renders support to and receives support from the "Morning Freiheit" and any other Jewish progressive organizations.

The source also stated that the ELF is recognized by the CP, USA as an important progressive national organization of women.

THE NEW YORK COUNCIL TO ABOLISH THE UN-AMERICAN ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

On March 9, 1961, a source advised that the New York Council To Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NYCAUAC), 150 West 34th Street, New York City, New York, was formed at a meeting held in New York City on November 17, 1960. This organization was founded principally through the efforts of ______ Field Representative of the National Committee To Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee (NCAUAC).

A second source advised on September 17, 1952, that was a Communist Party member as of September, 1952.

The "National Guardian" in January 16, 1961, issue, page 7, column 1, contained an article which states that the NYCAUAC has only one objective: "to help the National Committee as vigorously as possible in its endeavors to mobilize the American people in a campaign to abolish the House Committee on Un-American Activities."

A third source furnished on March 9, 1961, a prospectus of the NCAUAC prepared principally by which in reference to "local abolition committees" stated that these committees may identify and coordinate their efforts as closely as they desire with NCAUAC, still maintaining their autonomy for as flexible and independent program as possible. The prospectus also stated that the NYCAUAC was responsible for coordinating abolition activities on the Atlantic coast.

Various sources have advised in April, 1961, that Communist Party members in the New York City area have been solicited to support activities of the NYCAUAC during attendance at Communist Party club meetings.

"The Elmira Star - Gazette," a daily newspaper published in Elmira, New York, in its issue of Wednesday, September 20, 1961, contained an article headlined "Elmira 'Rider' Fined \$200, Term Suspended." The article read as follows:

"Elmira's convicted 'Freedom Rider, Miss Patricia Bryant of 706 Baldwin St., had her four-month jail sentence suspended Tuesday in Jackson, Miss.

"However, she was ordered to pay a \$200 fine after she declined to appeal a breach of the peace conviction before Hinds County Judge Russel Moore.

"Her father, Isaac; said the fine may be paid by the Congress of Racial Equality (CORE), a group that is working for integration through peaceful means.

"Bryant said his daughter will now return to Central Ohio State College in Dayton, Ohio to finish her education.

"The 20-year-old student, who will be a junior this year, agreed to interrupt her education early in June when she decided to challenge Jackson's segregation policies.

"Miss Bryant, a Negro, and four white girls left Ohio June 7 and were arrested June 9 when they refused to leave the white waiting room of a railroad station there.



The "Cincinnati Enquirer", a daily morning newspaper published at Cincinnati, Ohio, in its issue of August 25, 1961, on page 21, had a photograph of "Judye Scroggins", and an accompanying article captioned "Local Girl, 19, Back From Freedom Ride . According to the article, Judye Scroggins, 603 Rockdale Avenue, Cincinnati, Ohio, "returned home by train last night from serving 20 days in the Mississippi State Penitentiary". It stated she had been arrested with seven white "freedom riders" July 29th, in Jackson, Mississippi, when the riders attempted to desegregate the Negro waiting room of the Greyhound Bus Station in that town. Because the arresting officers did not recognize her race she had been placed in the same part of the jail as were the white "riders". The article contained the following remarks of Scroggins: **We were given the maximum. A \$200 fine and four mounths in jail. First they took us to the city jail, then to the county jail and finally to the state penitentiary at Parchman. Our cells in the state penitentiary were no more than 13 steps away from Death Row. Incidentally, I integrated all the Mississippi jails. strongly believe in what we riders are doing. We have now aroused the Jackson Negroes to a sense of responsibility. are now starting to have sit-ins. I want to go on working with CORE, and I want to study at Xavier. I had told CORE before I took that ride that I wanted to be released between August 21 and 25 so that I could get everything in order to go to school. **

On August 8, 1961, Chief Robert Killeen, Xenia. Ohio Police Department, advised that there was no record of in the files of his department.

Chief Killeen advised that the only picketing of a restaurant which occurred in Xenia, Ohio, took place in January, 1960, when Geyer's Restaurant, 15 West Main Street, Xenia, was the scene of a student demonstration and picketing. He stated that the restaurant was picketed for approximately one week during January, 1960, by white and Negro students from Central State College, Wilberforce, Ohio, and from Antioch College, Yellow Springs, Ohio.

Chief Killeen advised that it was his belief that the college students were members of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) on the respective college campuses and that they were joined in their picketing by very few NAACP members in the Xenia area. He stated that it had been the policy of Geyer's Restaurant to serve only white patrons and that rather than cater to Negro students the restaurant closed its business temporarily for repairs. He advised that the restaurant re-opened after approximately one month and changed its policy of service and that Negroes are now permitted to patronize it.



The June 12, 1961, Final Edition of the ™Detroit News™, a daily Detroit, Michigan, newspaper, on page 10A, column 4, carried an article which reflected that eight Detroit Negro students, one a **Freedom Rider**, and the others participants in recent "sit-in" demonstrations in southern cities. were presented scrolls recognizing their ™leadership in the cause of democracy, courage in the face of violence, and dedication to the cause of freedom and equality by the Michigan Friends of the South on June 11, 1961. Isaac Reynolds, Jr., 5049 Vermont, Detroit, Michigan, a former Wayne State University student, who took part in one of the "Freedom Rides" in Alabama was among those honored. Scrolls were presented by State Supreme Court Justice Theodore Souris, who, according to this article, stated he attended the affair as a personal representative of Governor Swainson.


Michigan Friends of the South (MFS)

as "left influenced".

Third source on July 31, 1961, stated that the MFS is currently in existence and is not now being mass influenced by known members of the Michigan District, Communist Party, due to its small membership.

The June 3, 1961, edition of The New Crusader, a weekly newspaper published in Chicago, Illinois, on page 1, column 5, carried an article which reflected that Isaac Reynolds, Jr., a veteran, a junior majoring in Business Administration, was among a group of six other Freedom Riders who had arrived in Chicago on May 31, 1961, to speak and raise funds for further assaults and segregation in the Deep South.

Records of the Detroit Police Department and the Wayne County Sheriff's Office, Detroit, were checked on August 30, 1961, by Investigation Clerk and no information identifiable with was located.
