


team was playing the University of Oregon in a post-season game on the West Coast, and that both he and KUHN were listening to this game on the radio. He concluded that this accident, therefore, probably occurred on a Saturday. It will be observed, as later pointed out, that records indicate examination made of KUHN and the woman was made on November 28, 1936, which date would have fallen on a Saturday. further recalled that KUHN stated he had just come from the West Coast, where he had made several speeches and that he was on his way to St. Louis, Missouri to make a speech the following night. A conversation was had between KUHN and the woman accompanying him, in the sales room of the Brodahl Motor Company, and at that time it was tentatively agreed that upon purchasing the new automobile from the Brodehl Motor Company, KUHN and this woman would drive to Omaha, Nebraska, where they would stay at the Hotel Fontenelle, and KUHN would take a plane for St. Louis, Missouri, in order to make his speech. also a member of the Brodahl Motor Company and the person who took the most active part in the sale, when later contacted had no information of value to furnish in addition to that set out above, as ascertained from above, as ascertained from He did state, however, that the Universal Credit Company, of Detroit, Michigan, in response to a telegram from the Brodehl Motor Company, had advised that the automobile which had been wrecked, was satisfactory in title for an exchange; thus, this would seem to indicate to that the wrecked automobile was carried in the name of FRITZ KUHN. He could not recall that any papers of ownership were exhibited by KUHN but did state that either he or must have been satisfied in some way as to the ownership of the wrecked automobile turned in by KUHN. He also said that the new automobile purchased by KUHN at that time bore motor number 18-3,207,600 and was not registered in the State of Nebraska by KUHN because the deal was not completed until 9:30 at night and that both KUHN and his woman companion took off in the direction of Omeha. It would seem, therefore, that KUHN, at this time, placed the plates which he had on the wrecked automobile, on the car which he had just purchased and then drove eastward in it. recollection that KUHN took a set of Michigan It was license tags from the wrecked car and placed them on the newly purchased car; also, that the money KUHN received came via Postal Telegraph to Lincoln, Nebraska, and that he, was thereafter notified by was thereafter notified by the Telephone Company at Wahoo, Nebraska, that KUHN'S automobile was covered by insurance by the Universal Credit Company of Detroit. He recalls having gone to the telephone company with KUHN and his woman companion at this time for this purpose.

advised that this automobile was purchased on July 1, 1937 and N ebraska. These records failed to show ру had purchased the instant car and no previous record of from whom this car having been registered in Nebraska is contained in those files. stated that the BRODAHL MOTOR COMPANY, as first class dealers under the laws of Nebraska, would be able to sell this car to adequate bill of sale, and that could thereafter without tracing its title back to either FRITZ KUHN give sell the same to or the person to whom the automobile was originally registered. In this manner, no complete chain of title would be established at the Bureau of Roads and Irrigation, and since the automobile was registered for the first time in the State of Nebraska during July of 1937, the original ownership of the automobile would not be apparent as of record.

Inasmuch as the records disclose that the wrecked automobile is at present in the State of Nebraska, but fail to reflect the original ownership of this automobile, and further because an appropriate lead has already been set out for the DETROIT OFFICE to ascertain the person to whom the wrecked automobile was originally sold in order to determine whether or not it was KUHN, no lead is being set out for this purpose, but rather a lead is being set out only to ascertain the nature of the records maintained by the Universal Credit Company of Detroit, Michigan.

Division was organized, this information would be obtainable inasmuch as the name of any person involved in an accident is placed in their file and they are also filed according to the district in which the accident occurred.

Motor Vehicle Registration Division, advised that their records are filed in three ways, by motor number, license number, and owner's name. He stated therefore if an individual came into the state of Washington and sold an automobile they would have no record of such a transaction and that the only names they have are the persons who register automobiles in the state of Washington.

The Los Angeles Examiner Newspaper on Friday, May 26, 1939, in reporting the arrest of Subject in Pennsylvania on the charges brought by District Attorney THOMAS E. DEWEY of New York, carried a photograph of MRS. FLORENCE CAMP. The article in conjunction therewith stated that FLORENCE CAMP met FRITZ KUHN on shipboard several months before her divorce from CHARLES W. CAMP. The newspaper article recorded that on counts five and six of the New York State indictment, FRITZ KUHN was charged with the theft of \$565.76 of funds of the Bund, which were alleged to have been used for the transportation of furniture for MRS. FLORENCE CAMP from Los Angeles to New York; further of using \$151.26 for bringing the furniture from Cleveland to New York.

Two copies of the newspaper article containing photographs of both MRS. FLORENCE T. CAMP and of Subject, were obtained and are being placed in the Los Angeles Division Office file. They will be furnished to any interested office in the event pictures are needed for identification purposes.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE FILE

While discussing various matters with of the State Department on July 19th, he informed me that the State Department has not as yet received any official communication from the American Embassy in Germany concerning the alleged criminal record of Fritz Kuhn in Munich. A personal letter has, however, been received from a member of the Embassy staff in which he advised that the Embassy was still following the German Government on this letter but that the Government to date had not furnished the Embassy with any information. was indicated by this letter that the member of the Embassy Staff believed the German Government was giving the Embassy the run-around but that they would ultimately have to take some official action in connection with this request. According to the letter, a careful check was made of all of the newspapers published at the time that Kuhn was supposed to have been arrested but no record was found of this arrest or prosecution. It was further indicated that the Embassy was following/the German Government very closely on this matter and would advise in due course as to any information obtained.



KUHN states further that SPITZ seemingly claims an intimate acquaintanceship with the KUHN family; yet, during the period which SPITZ refers to, KUHN'S family - his father, mother, and the children, including himself, were residing for a period of two years in England where KUHN'S father was then employed.

SPITZ, however, makes no reference to this which, according to KUHN, would indicate a total lack of knowledge on the part of SPITZ as to the activities of the KUHN family.

has been contacted and according to his own statement has, in turn, been in touch with the man who is supposed to know something about KUHN'S record at Detroit but has been unable to produce the man at this office, stating that he was in touch with the man but the latter was reluctant to appear. Inasmuch as the story which this man professes to tell has to do with the incident of the automobile it does not appear that it will be of any great value in the light of the information which has since been obtained.

Information has been obtained from FRITZ KUHN to the effect that the automobile wreck occurred about 15 miles west of Wahoo, Nebraska on the road to Lincoln, Nebraska, on or about November 4 or 5, 1936 at which time he was driving his own personally owned Ford sedan purchased by him while still an employee of the Ford motor company at Detroit, Michigan; that after the wreck he traded in the wrecked car, the insurance, and a \$75 cash balance, and purchased a new 1936 Ford sedan from the Ford dealer at Wahoo, Nebraska.

conviction of KUHN in Germany; that, however, the Bureau is very interested in obtaining the names and addresses of such persons in New York and that if these names are ultimately furnished these people will be interviewed discreetly and the information obtained from them will be transmitted to the Attorney General so that he can give the facts as furnished consideration as to whether they are of sufficient definiteness and importance to warrant a recommendation that visas be issued as he suggested. It was explained that these people would necessarily have to be interviewed before the facts could be presented to the Attorney General. In view of the fact that the informant of has proceeded to himself is not in possession of the information desired, this matter will have to remain in its present status until the return of informant in September. was advised that he would again be contacted in September so that his informant's attitude could then be sounded out with respect to the present inquiry. 

#### THE GERMAN-AMERICAN BUND

#### ITS STRUGGLE FOR THE UNIFICATION

of

#### AMERICA'S GERMANDOM

Since the year 1933 the movement of America's Germandom has been warning and calling, then under the name of the organization "Friends of the New Germany," and today as the "German-American Bund".

Its warning calls have not subsided unheard. There were, to be sure, at a time when this movement did not yet exist, just as there are today, societies and associations enough which were and are still carrying on in this country the fight for the cultural individuality of Germandom; but it was not a fight in the truest sense of the word. This 'struggle' meant more or less the maintenance of the position simply as it seemed to present itself at the mo-

ment. Then, too, the significance of cultural greatness and striking power in successfully asserting itself was being crowded more and more into the background by similar endeavors of non-German nationality groups in America.

What is the reason for this regrettable circumstance? Primarily the cause is to be found in the fact that the German element did not give serious enough consideration to political power and in that way finally fell into a position in the realm of politics which can be characterized simply as negative.

Since the founding of our movement the leadership of the Bund had very clearly recognized this drawback and has now been striving for approximately four years to remedy it most thoroughly and most emphatically, letting itself be guided by the understanding and recognition of the fact that political power means at the same time also cultural strengthening.

The German-American Bund is completely conscious of the extent of its undertaking. Nowhere in the world does there reign a greater disjointedness of the German element than is the case right here in our new homeland, the United States of America. To fuse this German element together into a great and unified community of work means a task

such as only an organization was able to undertake which, inwardly strong and young, is and will continue striving to utilize the rich experiences of our forebears, i. e., of those people of German descent who in difficult years of the past have proven that they were capable of rendering positive services in the cause of Germandom. and their experiences alone, however, would not be sufficient for the German-American Bund. Above all it became necessary to call upon younger and more energetic people who, in addition to their willingness to act, not only bring with them new ideas for the fertilization of our spiritual struggle, but who also, beyond that, are capable as a result of their youthful elasticity of making known to great numbers within the nation the greatness of a Weltanschauung, in order finally to transmit to the Germandom of America, on this healthy basis, a certain deeper meaning of truly positive and constructive work.

It is precisely in the recognition of the mighty

Weltanschauung which the Fuehrer of the Third Reich so nobly represents and which in the shaping of the Third Reich
he proves in practice so strongly and so much to the happiness of his people, - it is just in this exemplary fact
that the fact also lies anchored that the

IDEA FOR THE UNIFICATION OF AMERICA'S GERMANDOM

is now finally beginning to strike deeper roots.

What does the historic deed of the unification of all Germans through Adolf Hitler, as it was carried out in the old homeland in a manner without parallel, teach us? Precisely this unification of the Germans, who for centuries had gone on living split up into principalities, senseless Federal Unions, and party politics, determined finally that German culture and German essential characteristics, and lastly also political influence both within and without Germany were torn farther and farther away from the abyss toward which they were tumbling. This tremendous accomplishment of the Fuehrer naturally met with the greatest and most extensive approbation among the people of German extraction living abroad. In many of these racial comrades a powerful desire made itself felt to emulate this great example in order to realize the rise to exquisite reality, in the new homeland as well, of a final unification of all people of German descent regardless of the country to which they may belong as citizens. The German-American Bund, under its former name and also under its present one, knew the greatness of this aspiration of so many racial comrades; and it set about to accomplish, in the spirit of youth, a task which is a difficult one, though it contains the promise of success, - a task which required for its realization only a powerful will. And this will as the first prerequisite was there, has increased during the course of the years of our struggle and was strengthened in the same measure as the opponents of a united Germandom have resisted such an undertaking.

element among America's Germandom, then everyone who observes objectively must attain to the conviction that precisely in these younger forces a mighty striving for unity has, in the course of the years, moved visibly into the foreground of the life of all people of German descent. The fact that the person of German origin in a new homeland no longer is regarded by the old homeland as a 'prodigal son', as was the case formerly in the era of the Kaiser, has cast bonds of the spirit about the whole of Germandom in all the world, bonds which find their most beautiful characterization and confirmation in the words of Adolf Hitler when he said that blood is thicker than water.

The first success of our movement -- and one which must not be overlooked -- was achieved in the fact that a close contact rose up again between those people of German descent who, as always, still held their old homeland

in honor and, on the other hand, those up-rooted ones who in the struggle of the times had become spiritually and materially de-Germanized in surroundings that were foreign The fruits of this contact are slowly and hesitantly, but for that reason all the more certainly, beginning to manifest themselves. It becomes noticeable first in the life of the German societies, i. e., within organized Germandom. As a small example of the inward effects of the Bund's striving for unification and of its incipient successes we would mention here the felicitous circumstance that during the past year the wish bestirred itself more and more in very extensive circles, precisely of the rather up-rooted Germans, to visit the old homeland once more after so many decades away from it. went back to the old homeland and returned from their journey, as could not have been expected otherwise, as racial comrades joyously affirming their Germandom.

Once having returned to their new homeland affirming the idea of Germandom the next and logical step for them was to become more closely acquainted with the aims of the German-American Bund, becoming in this way finally either members or at least valuable supporters of the movement which has taken for its motto the idea of unification as

its highest and principal duty. With these racial comrades, who formerly would have had to be regarded as uprooted and who are surely good and upright citizens of
the United States, the German-American Bund was favored
with aid in the form of practical advice based on the experience of many decades.

In addition, further substantial aid in the great work of unification which has been so energetically begun within the Germandom of this country accrues from agitation against the New Germany and against Germandom as such, - agitation which drips with hatred and which today shrinks back from almost no methods. whatever has in any way come to the fore in defense of the great Weltanschauung or the idea of Germandom of the New Germany was and is being denounced simply as 'Nazi' and attacked as such. The result has finally been that the name which in Germany was elevated from a term of invective to a mark of honor has transferred this feeling of honor even to those, too, who were not yet completely convinced bearers of the noble Weltanschauung which, virtually as a gift from on High, was bestowed upon the Germans by Adolf Hitler.

More than all the agitation against us, this characterization of 'Nazi' has transformed people of German descent who once had gone on living outside our ranks into fighters for our cause.

It is self-evident that the great majority of America's Germandom cannot understand the events in the old homeland as quickly as the racial comrade who himself lives in the old homeland.

For that there are still too many barriers in the path; and the German-American Bund regards as its next duty the removal of these barriers. The Weltanschauung of the Third Reich, with its high ideals and ideas, forms, in the first place, a sharp contrast to the liberalisticcapitalistic philosophy under which we are living in this Over and beyond that, however, a hostile press country. and inimical propaganda has been raging continuously, with its pernicious agitation, over public opinion in Germany, the Government of Germany and its Weltanschauung as well as the ideas of this Weltanschauung, so that in the final analysis a hostile, or at least neutral attitude awaiting further developments was not only to be observed, but could also be understood as it manifest itself among numerous

German racial comrades in the U.S.A. as a result of the loss of direct contact with Germany (sic).

Hence the German-American Bund took as its task the dissemination by all the ways and means at its disposal of enlightenment with regard to the New Germany, its <u>Welt-anschauung</u>, and above all the carrying out of all tasks and ideas within the Third Reich. In the long run hostile agitation could not pursue this enlightenment with former successes. More and more, agitation against Germany and Germandom is being recognized as such in all the world and is correspondingly being rejected to a very great extent.

Now that we have been successful, through continual and uninterrupted enlightenment, in making incontestably clear to the American and above all to the individual of German stock that Germany has given its people bread and work again, and that in contrast to many "democracies" (sic) is successfully continuing along this way even up to the present time while in other countries the misery of unemployment has been further increasing, - now that we have been successful in this, the individual of German stock is coming decisively to the recognition that the German Welt-anschauung does after all mean something more than dictatorship or serfdom of the workers, about which a hostile

agitation manages to report so infinitely much from "well informed sources".

#### FROM RECOGNIZING TO PROFESSING

With the increasing recognition of the real situation in Germany and of the greatness of the German Weltanschauung the time is drawing nigh for America's Germandom to decide:

either as a person of German descent to fight for the rightness of the interests of our Germandom in the U. S. A., and along with that to take an active part in the work of unification as the German-American Bund is striving for it;

or to continue burying one's head in the sand and thereby pay homage to an ostrich-policy to the injury of our Germandom, - a policy that would of necessity eventually bring about the total destruction of the cultural and political significance of America's Germandom.

#### THE FORMULA TODAY IS:

where enlightenment has penetrated there can be no neutrality. To continue to remain neutral under those circumstances means: to assume an attitude against us, against the upright preservation of the interests of our Germandom in the U.S.A.

In the struggle for existence and honor; for significance,

prestige and freedom; for strength and well-being; for unity, consciousness of self, and peace; there can be today for America's Germandom no longer any 'neutral'. The time of fighting is rapidly nearing the crisis. The watch-word must ensue in a clear decision of FOR or AGAINST.

Lastly, whoever wishes, as an individual of German descent, to lay claim to being regarded as an upright citizen of his new homeland must finally understand the fight which the German-American Bund as the single militant organization of an upright American Germandom in the U. S. A. is carrying on also in the interests of the country of our choice. Rejecting the false Marxist doctrine of class struggle; fighting regardlessly against Bolshevist collectivism with its obstinate dogma that is inimical to state, religion and culture, and with its destructions, hostile to capital, of the oldest orders of society and humanity; rejecting the terrorist dictatorial measures which Bolshevism is attempting to carry through in all the world according to the example of Soviet Russia; and finally rejecting a highly capitalistic free-bootery, - the person of German descent in the United States must in the end attain to the conviction that we are carrying on a clean and honorable fight not only in the interests of our old homeland, but also in absolute affirmation of and in the interests of this our new one. In this recognition there is then nothing left for him, as an American citizen, but to join the fight, which in the last analysis is being carried on for the sake of the existence of his and our homeland, as an active fighter or at least as a supporting follower of our movement.

Through our carrying on this fight regardlessly, yet always within the laws of the land, the day is gradually dawning where the German-American will cease to be oddjobber for a hostile and pernicious agitation. same time the degrading necessity for the individual of German descent to earn his daily bread as an odd-jobber shall What is the situation today in this respect also cease. and how could so-called 'purely cultural endeavors' effectively meet this pitiable condition? They could not, and yet it is certainly no rarity for persons of German descent to be employed by negroes to perform menial and filthy tasks of one sort or another. It is not the work itself, in these instances, which is despised, but rather it is the condition that is despicable, in the fact that skilled Germans, artisans and white-collar workers, have to perform such tasks in spite of the fact that these people with splendid educations could do important work that lies within the range of the professions and callings they have learned. To obviate this condition with all the militancy at our disposal, - a condition which both inside and outside of the organized Germandom of America has been allowed to remain as it was because of a timid tendency to confine onself to the maintenance of so-called cultural work, - is finally the greater endeavor of the German-American Bund. The first, though as yet very modest, successes in this sphere, which has never before been entered upon, are beginning to manifest themselves.

The unification of America's Germandom is imperative; it is a holy undertaking that in no case will bring the fighter in any way into conflict with the oath he has taken to the country, as the hostile press has been daring to maintain.

In striving for the unification of our American Germandom we finally are serving our new homeland, which we desire to preserve and protect from a modern serfdom at the hands of a foreign power. To be German does not mean

to be a citizen of the old homeland, but rather it means to belong as a German, bound by the ties of our blood, to the solidarity of all the Germans on the earth. German is and remains our racial comrade, without regard to the citizenship papers which he may somewhere possess. term 'racial comrade' has nothing to do with the term 'German of the Reich', for the latter is not a citizen of another state, but a citizen of the German Reich. Hence when we approach every person of German descent with the demand, when we admonish him as a racial comrade to work with us in the great task of unification which is to embrace all racial comrades, we in no wise bring him into a conflict of conscience with reference to his duties as a On the contrary, we state and emphasize repeatcitizen. edly: the truly German person and racial comrade in the U. S. A. will at the same time be an upright and real citizen of his new homeland.

Thus the German-American Bund is working in concord with that which, since its establishment, it has held to be and has considered its duty and principal task; namely, to be brave fighters for the unification, for the political and at last truly cultural strengthening of our American Germandom. Four and a half years have passed since this

struggle began. Much has been achieved; but much more still confronts us, as a task which not only must be performed, but which also above all deserves to be striven for and achieved.

Since we have all learned once more, we German-Americans, that Germany is our mother, it is finally not difficult to devote to our bride, America, our new homeland, as well, that fealty which we maintain as people of German stock with re-In this work the German-American Bund spect of our mother. is proceeding straight along its way without compromise and without erring either to right or left. A united Germandom in the U. S. A. and a strong America must some day crown our undertaking through the successful shaking off of a foreign serfdom which menaces our country today politically, economically and culturally. A neutral attitude is no longer acceptable or valid, - FOR or AGAINST is decisive. America's Germandom has taken the first steps along this path, - steps that have brought successes. America's Germandom rises up with its unification; and without it Yet that is what we do not want. it will certainly fall. Because of that and only because of that we are struggling, drawing time and time again from the rich fountain-head which the old homeland gave us as we departed into foreign -- Weckruf; Nov. 11, 1937; p. 1, cols. 1 and 2; lands. p. 2, cols. 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, and 6.

In the article appearing in the <u>Weckruf</u> for November 11, 1937 and entitled "For or Against - But No Neutral", the original German as well as the English translation can in no way be fully comprehended without certain prerequisite information. The full and hidden significance particularly of one continually recurrent phrase is impossible to grasp without a knowledge of the sources out of which the article has been brought together and out of which springs a large part of the theory and practice of the German-American Bund. This one phrase is 'our new homeland'.

There is a wealth of incontestable evidence, with which the translator is acquainted, proving that this phrase, 'our new homeland', or its variants, signifies in reality a plan for the near future. It does not, on the other hand, refer to the present state of affairs in this country. 'Our new homeland' is not the United States of July, 1939, but rather this phrase has reference to a new political entity which is to be constructed under the leadership the German-American Bund and Fritz Kuhn, (cf., for example, Konrad Henlein and the Sudeten German Party in Czechoslovakia).

Thus 'our new homeland' is not the United States, but rather this country is the soil upon which 'our new homeland' is to be formed after the democratic constitution has been destroyed along with the other democratic institutions of the present United States. 'Our new homeland' is to be modelled after the pattern, the principles and the precepts of the "mighty Weltanschauung which the Fuehrer of the Third Reich so nobly represents and which in the shaping of the Third Reich he proves in practice so strongly and so much to the happiness of his people".

In this plan for 'our new homeland' there "also lies anchored the fact that the

IDEA FOR THE UNIFICATION OF AMERICA'S GERMANDOM is finally beginning to strike deeper roots."

As only one small example of the theories involved in this conspiracy the translator takes the liberty of calling attention to a book by Colin Ross entitled <u>Unser Amerika</u>, "Our America", in which the author, a German of Scottish descent and, as can be proven by irrefutable evidence, an active political and military agent of the <u>Deutsche Akademie</u> in Munich under the leadership of the Nazi military strategist Karl Haushofer, undertakes to

show how the word 'our' is a possessive pronoun referring to the German constituent of the population of the United States. In other words, the day is not yet here, but is near at hand, where the already well advanced plot against the 'Anglo-Saxon tyrants' shall be executed and where a German of Hitlerian stamp and training shall control this country as, shall we say, the 'Reich Protector for North America'! Then, and then only, will this country be 'our new homeland'!

Hence, from this point of view, it is only self-evident that the German-American Bund really is "carrying on a clean and honorable fight not only in the interests of our old homeland, but also in absolute affirmation of and in the interests of this our new one." It is likewise self-evident, from this point of view, that "whoever wishes, as an individual of German descent, to lay claim to being regarded as an upright citizen of his new homeland must finally understand the fight which the German-American Bund as the single militant organization of an upright American Germandom in the U.S.A. is...carrying on." "Unser Amerika," says the German-American Bund!

With respect to the remainder of the article, one hardly needs to call attention to the fact that it is in large measure a typical product of the Goebbels Propaganda

Factory, Inc., Berlin. All that is lacking is the identification tag, 'Made in Germany'.

Together the thoughts of millions of Germans are directed toward the fate of those who in foreign countries are having to defend their Germandom at the price of costly sacrifices. Blue Candle! - Greet all these Germans and make known unto them that their motherland is faithful to them and will never forget them! Make known unto them that on Christmas Eve the Blue Candle is brightly beaming on millions of Christmas trees!

Wherever in all the earth at the time of the Advent and on Christmas Day German families gather together around the Blue Candles and sing German songs, - wherever this is so, there is Germany. There we and they feel even more strongly than ever the solidarity of the racial The gleam of the Blue Candle will shine community! forth everywhere, - in lonely lowland farms of Schleswig-Holstein and in the huts of the Alpine valleys; in the dwellings of laborers in the cities and in the peasant homes of villages; in the camps of the Labor Service and far out on the high seas in ships' cabins, - everywhere within and beyond our borders. Let the Blue Candle with its silent gleam be present at every German

Christmas and let every German acknowledge and profess his loyalty to our German racial comrades who without the protecting hand of the Reich are having to struggle bitterly enough out there! In the glow of this flame we are mindful of our world-embracing racial community!!

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The purpose of this memorandum is to advise you of the present status of this case.

of the State Department reported as of July 24, 1939, that no word has been received from the American Embassy in Berlin concerning Kuhn's criminal record in Munich. The Embassy, however, has examined all newspapers as of the time of the alleged arrest without finding any news item concerning the said arrest.

The investigation of Kuhn as a possible violator of the NMVTA has now been completed and a memorandum submitted showing that the automobile which he wrecked was his own personal property.

There remains in the Boston field division the contacting of who has promised to correspond with friends in Munich, Germany, for information concerning the arrest of Kuhn. This is being followed up.

Kuhn was subsequently interviewed by Special Agent other matters and advised that he did make a trip to various points in the United States but traveled in his personally owned Ford automobile, which he wrecked at Wahoo, Nebraska, in the fall of 1936; that he obtained a new car there and returned to Detroit. He alleged that the car which was wrecked by him was bought by him from the Ford Motor Company at Detroit, Michigan.

Investigation has disclosed that Fritz Kuhn did purchase a 1936 Ford 2-door sedan, motor number 3,106,228, from George Holzbaugh, Incorporated, Detroit, Michigan, on July 2, 1936. It is also shown that Fritz Kuhn registered this car under the Oregon nonresident permit on November 21, 1936. The car so registered bore the identical motor number as that mentioned above. Investigation in Nebraska has likewise shown that in the last part of November, 1936, Fritz Kuhn did have an accident with the above mentioned automobile, at which time it was wrecked and which car he turned in to the Brodahl Motor Company of Wahoo, Nebraska, receiving in exchange a new car. This new car was obtained by Kuhn on December 1, 1936, and was a Ford sedan. The car wrecked by Kuhn, bearing the identical motor number as that noted







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The second case involves Fritz Echn, in that he may have violated his cath when he received his American citizenship. This investigation appears to have been predicated upon information furnished originally by Reinhold Spitz to the effect that Fritz Kuhn had a criminal record in Monich, Germany, which he did not disclose at the time he received his citizenship in the United States. It appears that based upon this imformation the Department of Jastice undertook a consideration of the question of whether Esta was subject to deportation for having mental reservation in taking out his citisenship papers and having committed perjury in connection therewith. In pursuance thereof, the Bureau prepared a memorandum dated May 13, 1939, styled "Frits Julius Kuhn," This memorandum incorporated in toto all of the information in the Bureau's memorandum on the Corman-American Bund referred to above and dated warch 29, 1939. In addition thereto, the memorandum of May 13, 1939, contained information concerning the naturalization proceedings by which Kuhn obtained his American citimenship. A copy of this memorandum of

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

At this time I received your call advising that Fritz Kuhn was to be the first witness before the Dies Committee, together with on your suggestion that I notify appropriate persons in the State Department to this effect, so that they would be in a position to serve Fritz Kuhn with notice of the requirements of the Department of State for the registration of Agents of Foreign Principals. Accordingly, at 11:00 A. M. on the same date I called Branch 207, Division of Munitiens Control, who has been handling this matter at the Department of State. I gave him the information, advising it was for the purpose of informing him of the presence of Fritz Kuhn so that Kuhn could be served with appropriate notice. immediately countered with the argument RECORDED CORP. MALED IN U that an Agent should serve Kuhn this notice since the Agent can make a complete report, not only concerning this service but also the service of notice upon Earl Browder, William Z. Foster and All material concerning these persons has been collected in the Department of State and photostatic copies have been prepared for the Bureau's use. He also argued that the only person available to serve this notice would be a Department of State messenger and he did not feel that a messenger was competent to serve this notice because Kuhn was a "slick guy" and further that an Agent would be more experienced in handling such men as Fritz Kuhn. He also stated that if a messenger were to serve Kuhn it would probably be necessary to subpoena such messenger to the point of trial. I told that it would also be necessary to subpoena an Agent in such instance and that there was a great disparity between the salaries of an Agent and a messenger. I also told him with reference to his first argument that it would be of no concern in the making of a report that a messenger serve Kuhn RECORDED & INDEXED that the job of the State I finally suggested to Department is to furnish notice to possible registrants of the require ments of the law and the job of the FBI is to investigate if such persons

wilfully refuse to register. 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

Warsaw Next Big Objective of Nazi Steam Roller

Berlin, Sept. 6. (AP) - The capture by the German army of Krakow, a city often spoken of by the Poles as "Poland's Heart," was officially announced today.

The supreme high command said Krakow had been taken without resistance at noon. Bridges across the Vistula River, it was added, had not been destroyed, altho the Poles usually dynamite such approaches as they retreat.

WHEN the doors of the commercial world were first opened to women it seemed to them that they were entertaining a new heaven and a new earth. They rejoiced, for no longer need they eat the bitter bread of dependence. No longer were they doomed to the humiliation of being unwanted guests in the houses of their relatives and friends. No longer would they be maddened by the sense of frustration because their brains, their energies were denied all their energies were denied all talents. power of expression.

They were slaves whose shackles were stricken from them. For the first time in all history women were freed to use whatever powers of mind and body that God had given them, and to achieve such success as they could. For the first time they did not have to sell themselves in marriage. For the first time they stood on their own feet instead of being groveling parasites and could look the world in the face and tell it where to go. For the first time they knew the self-respect that comes to economic independence and the thrill that comes of earning your first dollar.



### MENORANDUM FOR THE DIRECTOR

On September 11 Mr. Holtzoff of the Department advised me that the Attorney General had instructed him to confer with me for the purpose of determining whether there was any basis for prosecution or restraint of Fritz Kuhn in his statements, activities and declarations. The Attorney General had previously in a telephonic convereation indicated to me his desire that you be informed he was most anxious to take any action against Luhn which legitimately could be taken.

On September 12 I conferred with Mr. Heltzoff and furnished him in detail the status of the Eureau's investigation of Fritz Kuhn activities with particular reference to the investigation entitled "German-American Bund; Registration - Agents of Foreign Principale;" Bureau file 61-7591, and the investigation entitled "Prits Kuhn; Perjury; Immigration; Naturalization;"
Bureau file 61-7594. I emphasized to Mr. Holtzoff the fact that all the information contained in the Bureau's files had been surviewed to the Criminal Division for a determination as to whether there was any basis for legal action, also pointing out the Bureau had conducted all investigation suggested or requested by the Criminal Division of the Department. It was concluded by Judge . Token Boltzoff that there was no action for the Bureau to take A. Description of the data contained in these records is as follows:

#### DECLARATION OF INTENTION:

This declaration was executed December 6, 1924 under the name of FRITZ KURN showing his age as 32 years, 6 feet, weight 175 pounds, occupation chemist, complexion fair, hair brown, eyes gray, scars none, born in Munich, Germany May 15, 1896, address 1445 Lakepointe Avenue, Detroit, Michigan; entered United States at Laredo, Texas over the International Bridge from Laredo, Mexico. #### MEMORANDUM FOR THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

Information has been received from the New York office of this Bureau to the effect that an investigation of Prits Kubm is being undertaken by the Office of the United States Attorney in New York City under the supervision of Honorable John T. Cahill. I thought you would went to be savised of the facts in this matter.

On September 29, 1939, Assistant United States Attorneys Bruno Schoolner and Same | Reis approached a Special agent attached to the New Yerk office of this Bureau, advising that they had received orders from the "front office" to undertake a thorough inquiry with reference to Fritz Euhn and to "let the chips fall where they may." They indicated that they are not "going to pull their punches" and that they are going to "get the dope." They suggested to the Agent that they had reviewed reports which had been submitted to their office in the case styled FRITZ KUNN; PERJURY; IMMIGRATION; NATURALIZATION, and that they had noted the alleged criminal record of Fritz Kuhn concerning a erime which is alleged to have been committed in Munich, Germany. They informed the Agent that they intended to branch out into all of the activities of Fritz Kuhn. They also indicated that a man attached to the Office of the United States Attorney at that point by the name of Correct is directly in charge of this investigation tion.
