Dear Sir:

On September 28, 1939 Assistant United States Attorney Bruno Schachner discussed with Special Agent this office an inquiry which Mr. Schachner and another Assistant United States Attorney, Samuel Reis, proposed to make concerning Fritz Kuhn. These two assistants told Special Agent that they had been instructed by the "front office", meaning United States Attorney John T. Cahill, and his assistant Mathias Correa, to make a thorough inquiry into the Fritz Kuhn matter.

They stated that despite the fact that they were Jewish they intended to make a thorough inquiry into the matter, and had been instructed "to let the chips fall where they may". Schachner desired to discuss the investigation made by the Federal Bureau of Investigation in the case entitled "Fritz Kuhn, Perjury." In this particular case copies of all the reports had been furnished to the United States Attorney's office at the time the investigation was made, and these reports had been reviewed by Mr. Schachner.

Mr. Schachner stated that he did not think much of the perjury case, n<u>or of t</u>he allegations made by complaintant Spitz in that told Schachner that they had received copies of Agent all the reports in that case, and that the investigation had been completed, with the exception of one lead pending in the Boston Office, which was for the purpose of making a further contact with a person interviewed in that district who had offered to endeavor to secure some information from a contact in Germany concerning Kuhn's criminal record.

During the conference the Assistant United States Attorneys indicated that they would branch out into everything with which Kuhn had been connected. They also mentioned the Christian Mobilizers.

They further informed Agent that Assistant United States Attorney Mathias/Correa was directly in charge of the inquiry, and that it was their intention to call Fritz Kuhnto the office, as well as other associates of Kuhn, at which time they would question them, and if Kuhn and his associates refused to talk, it was then their intention to take them before the Grand Jury. It appeared that they had no definite violation in mind, but were making an inquiry to ascertain if they could discover anything, in other words, "a fishing expedition." The Assistants wanted to know if Agent could give them any suggestions as to their further investigation, or if the Federal Bureau of Investigation had any further information on Fritz Kuhn. Agent advised them that the Bureau had conducted an investigation on Kuhn in connection with a possible violation of the Registration Act, which investigation had been made at the request of the Department, and that the reports thereon had been furnished directly to the Department, and so far as the Bureau was concerned it was felt that since the investigation was made at the request of the Department, the Department itself would have to pass the information on to the Assistants. In talking with the Assistants, they suggested to Agent that I might want to talk with Assistant United States Attorney Correa concerning their inquiry, however, Mr. Correa has not communicated with this office, or made any request for investigation concerning this matter. I have tried unsuccessfully throughout the day to reach Assistant United States Attorney Mathias Correa. I did speak with United States Attorney John T. Cahill, and he told me frankly that he did not know what the complete story was, other than that there had been some charge of a violation of perjury made; that he did not know whether the allegation concerning that violation came from the State Department or elsewhere, and further, that he did not know just what the status of the inquiry being made by his assistants was at this time.

Dear Sir:

Assistant United States Attorney Bruno Schachner called me on the telephone yesterday/and stated that recently he had spoken to Special Agent which time he had requested whatever material the FBI might have concerning Fritz Kuhn of the German American Bund, etc., and that at that time Agent had promised to send the material to the United States Attorney's office, after first clearing Schachner's request with me.

I told Mr. Schachner that Agent had spoken to me about the matter, and that the only case which we had on Fritz Kuhn where the investigation had been conducted at the request of the United States Attorney was that entitled "Fritz Kuhn, Perjury", and in that case opies of all reports had been furnished to the United States Attorney's office.

I further advised Mr. Schachner that we had made certain other investigations which had been made at the request of officials of the Department, and it was a policy of long standing in the Bureau that when investigations were made upon the specific request of Department officials, -we did not release copies of the reports to the United States Attorneys unless Departmental authorization was given to do so. I told Mr. Schachner that it would be my suggestion that he communicate with the Department directly concerning the results of any investigation other than the perjury investigation which had been conducted. 

MEMORANDUM FOR MR. JOHN EDGAR HOOVER. DIRECTOR, FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

The Immigration and Naturalization Service of the Department of Labor has recently forwarded to this Division a set of facts concerning one Fritz Kuhn, requesting an opinion as to whether or not such facts would warrant the institution of an action to cancel Mr. Kuhn's certificate of naturalization.

The basis for such an action, if any is instituted, would probably be the alleged conviction of Kuhn of a crime involving moral turpitude, namely, larceny, in Munich, Germany, in 1920 or 1921. The only evidence apparently available to sustain this charge are affidavits executed by Reinhold Spitz of 475 Central Park West, Manhattan, New York City, and his wife, Mrs. Frieda Spitz, of the same address.

To aid this Division in considering this question, it is requested that you forward any information which you may have in your files regarding the reliability of Mr. and Mrs. Spitz.



NUMN and the German American Bund as revealed by the local press indicate that the answer filed by Warner Bros. Pictures, Inc. to the suit for damages filed against the corporation by FRITZ KUHN alleged that the German American Bund of which KUHN is President was conceived and originated by the Nazi Government and functioned under that Government's direction. This was published in the New York Times of September 6, 1939. The same paper on September 6, 1939, published a news item from Wichita, Kansas, to the effect that MAX and LOUIS LEWAND, publishers of The Wichita Beacon had telegraphed a plea to Secretary of Laber Frances Perkins asking that FRITZ KUHN and other Bund leaders be deported. A dispatch from Sellersville, Pa. published in the New York Sun of September 6, 1939, states that the authorities at that town were concerned over the ill feeling developing between the local residents and the members of the nearby German American Bund Camp. Buildings in the camp had been stormed and signs stolen. All of this happened after FRITZ KUHN had told a rally at the meeting place that ADOLF HITLER could lick the world.

On September 8, 1939, FRITZ KUHN is stated by the press to have issued a formal statement to the effect that the Bund is in agreement with the President's statement that the sympathies of an individual remain his right and expressed his sympathy for Germany and the present European conflict. He insisted, however, that the Bund is pledged to a position of strict United States neutrality and that it would fight for rigid enforcement of the Arms Embargo. The statement was made to the effect that the Roosevelt Administration had a pro-British bias; also that the Bund is satisfied that the Athenia was sunk on orders of the First Lord of the British Admiratry.

۶ ۱ On September 26, 1939, the New York Times carried an article to the effect that the House Committee investigating un-American activities had reached a unanimous decision to seek perjury and possibly contempt indictments against FRITZ KUHN, head of the Bund. This decision was reached after contradictory evidence was offered by CERHART H. YSECER, a former Social Democrat member of the Jerman Reichstag and how the publisher of the German American weekly, Neue Volksseitung at New York City.

With reference to the arrest of KUHN by the New York County authorities which has been previously reported, it was noted that \$0.000 cash bond was posted on Saturday. October 11, 1939.

The trial of FRITZ KUHN was scheduled for October 30, 1939, according to a news item published on October 7, 1939. On October 8, 1939, KUHN spoke at the German American Bund Camp at Andover, N.J. and is stated to have mentioned the Germans were being persecuted in this country.

He also thanked the members for their efforts in raising the fund to post the \$50,000 bond for him. Apparently as a result of this talk at Andover, KUHN was brought before Judge CORNALIUS F. COLLINS of General Sessions on October 10, 1939, and told that he must remain within New York State until the date of his trial which was then still scheduled for October 30, 1939. His attorneys at that time promised that he would remain within the State. On October 11, 1939, a special panel of 200 talesmen was selected from which the jury to try FRITZ KUHN would be picked. On October 13, 1939, KUHN made two motions in General Sessions Court in connection with his indictment, the first demanding that THOMAS E. DEMET'S Office be stayed from subpoening more witnesses against KUHN before the Grand Jury on the theft charges since KUHN already was under indictment; and the second was to quash subpoenas for three of KUEM'S lawyers, BAHAM KALENDARIAN, ANTHONY J. ARMORE and WILBUR V. KEEGAN. Both of these motions were promptly refused by Judge SAUL S. KEEGAN. Both of these

A Defense Fund is being raised by the Bund and a recent issue of the official publication of the Bund stated that contributions were to be sent to the City Hall Tavern Hall, a restaurant at 754 Palisades Avenue, Union City, N.J. On October 16, 1939, Judge STREIT ordered in General Sessions order three officers of the German

American Bund and one of the attorneys for KUHN to appear before the Additional October New York County Grand Jury and answer questions put to them about the Bund. This action was taken by Judge STREIT after these individuals had hesitated about answering questions.

On October 17, 1939, the German American Rund started circulating some 500,000 leaflets begging for funds for the defense of KUHN who, it was stated, had been arrested on September 30, 1939, and released on October 7, 1939, after his associates had posted a \$50,000 bail bond.

A Washington dispatch of October 18, 1939, stated that KUHN was to make another appearance before the Dies Committee on the following day at Washington. Judging from the press accounts it would appear that he came before the Dies Committee on October 19th, and at that time stated he was not a Nazi. He also stated that the Bund is still fighting the Communists in this country although it wholly approves the new Russo-German Pact.

On October 20, 1939, Supreme Court Justice JULIUS MILLER reserved decision on an application by KUHN for permission to inspect the official records relating to the jury drawn to try him. The New York Times of October 22, 1939, carries an article to the effect that KUHN had sent a letter of protest to Congressman DIES charging him with having broken faith with KUHN by making public the names and addresses of Bund Unit Leaders throughout the United States. On October 21, 1939, at Union City, N.J., of the Fastern Department of the Bund, stated that approximately one-half of the \$50,000 bail raised for the release of KUHN was an outright donation and would be used when cancelled as a nucleus of a National Defense Fund.

On October 25, 1939, the New York Times carried an article to the effect that Judge JAMES GARRITY WALLACE in General Sessions on the previous day had granted a motion of KUHN's attorney for a postponement of the opening of KUHN's grand larceny trial until November 9, 1939.

On October 25, 1939, the New York Sun carried an article from Seattle, Mashington, to the effect that the Seattle Unit of the German American Bund had dissolved, according to information given out by PAUL STOLL who had been named as a leader of that unit in testimony before the Dies Committee. The information set out briefly in the news item would indicate that it might be advisable for the Seattle Office to interview for information in connection with the Registration Act investigation and other information pertaining to the German American Bund and its activities, at least in that part of the country.

On October 30, 1939, the New York Sun carried an article to the effect that the German American Bund and its leader, KUHN, were under investigation by a Faderal Grand Jury on income taxes and other serious charges according to a statement given out by United States Attorney John T. Cahill.



while in this office about 0ne another matter on January 6, 1940, inquired of me as to whether or not it would be possible to declare FRITZ KUHN'S naturalization as void and illegal if it had been obtained upon affidavits of individuals who perjured themselves when they made the affidavits.

He stated it is his understanding that in connection with the naturalization, two witnesses must make affidavits that they have known the applicant for naturalization for at least five years. I inquired of this individual whether he had any information indicating that the two men who made the affidavits for KUHN had not in fact known him for five years. He stated he did not have such information but acted a little peculiar during the conversation and led me to believe that he might possibly have had such information but was reluctant to make a definite complaint or to furnish the information definitely.

Consequently, this matter is being called to the attention of the Bureau in the event it appears desirable to make some inquiry to learn how long affiants were acquainted with KUHN.

I am transmitting herewith for your information copies of a communication received by the Bureau from the State Department concerning this case, dated January 20, 1940. Inasmuch as the State Department does not desire any contact with or investigation conserning any member of the staff of the German Consulate General in New York City, it is believed that a detailed investigation of the matter becomes impractical.

However, the Bureau desires that additional inquiries be made of Assistant United States Attorney Dunnigan of the Southern District of New York for the purpose of ascertaining whether additional information has been received by his office in this regard. In the event such inquiry proves negative. It is suggested this case be discussed with with regard to any information the

latter may be able to furnish concerning it. If the latter inquiry also proves negative, the Bureau should be informed and this case should be placed in a pending inactive status to receive investigative attention when the burden of work in your office will permit.

Memorandum for the Director

Von Wimmersperg is forty years of age and resides at 5400 Fieldstone Road, Riverdale, New York City, where he pays a monthly rental of \$85.00 for an apartment. He is reported to be an accountant by profession and is said to have come to the United States about ten years ago. He was born in Lessenem, Germany, and remains a German citizen at this time. He has made frequent trips back to Germany during the past several years.

Since 1931, he, together with interested in "The/Yorkville Kanzlei" at 208 East 86th Street. b7C New York City. This firm conducts a foreign exchange and ticket office. It is engaged in the purchase and sale of German securities. On October 25, 1934, Von Wimmersperg and \_\_\_\_\_ were registered as joint partners in "The Yorkville Kanzlei." In 1935, this partnership opened a branch office in Rooms 1924 and 1925 at 17 Battery Place. New York City. It is to be noted that this is the same floor on which the German Consul General is located. In June. 1939 the firm moved to larger quarters on the eighteenth floor. occupying a suite of rooms designated as 1844-1848. The business undertaken at 17 Battery Place is identical with the business conducted by "The Yorkville Kanzlei." The office at 17 Battery Place. however, is known under the English trade name of International Commercial Service. It utilizes the German name of Deutscher Handels und Wirtochaftsdienst. More specifically the Deutscher Handels und Wirtochaftsdienst engages in the business as steamship agents, offering travel bureau service and also dealing in the purchase and sale of foreign exchange and securities. It deals principally in German securities. It is licensed by the Federal Securities and Exchange Commission. The Deutscher Handels und Wirtochaftsdienst also acts as agents in the purchase of food for foreign distribution.

It will be recalled that on June 20, 1940, a bomb explosion occurred in the hall outside of Rooms 1844-1848 at 17 Battery Place, New York City. It is to be noted that these are

the offices occupied by Von Wimmersperg. Special Agents conducting
a preliminary investigation of this bombing interviewedbriefly.
At that time he denied any connection with the German Consulate.
The Agents in making their investigation, however, observed that
the office of Von Wimmersperg contained two copies of the propa-
ganda book published by the German Library of Information styled,
"Polish Acts of Atrocity Against the German Minority." They
noted also that the office of Von Wimmersperg contained a large
picture of Adolf Hitler.
The Bureau has received information from
who has alleged that he was
in this country, to the effect that about seventy members of the
Nazi Party in the United States were compelled to report to

He disclosed that it was duty to detail these men

Investigations thus far conducted concerning Von Wimmersperg have failed to disclose any direct evidence that he is undertaking German espionage activities in this country. According to an Immigration file, however, a young German named reported, while under the influence of liquor, that all young Germans in the United States are required to report to Von Wimmersperg at 17 Battery Place, New York City, and that all must belong to an organization with headquarters maintained at that address. There is nothing to verify the accuracy of this information.

The files do not indicate any connection between Fritz Kuhn and Von Wimmersperg.

There appeared in the Deutscher Weckruf und Beobachter on February 4, 1937, an item to the effect that on January 29, 1937, members of the German-American Bund held a meeting in conjunction with the German Consul General in New York at the Yorkville Casino. The item pointed out that Draeger spoke demanding of German Americans -
"Your Eternal Faith: Germany - Eternally Faithful to the Fuehrer."

# TRANSLATION FROM THE GERMAN SPEECH OF FRITZ KUHN

#61-7594-133

SPEECH OF THE BUND LEADER ON TUESDAY, OCTOBER 8, 1935

German men and women!
Fellow-soldiers of the Bund, Friends of New Germany!
Comrades of the regular service!

We. as the destined organization of the German people in the United States, which has come together in the spirit of the National Socialist philosophy - the common possession of all upright men and women of German blood - are meeting together today to state our position with reference to the events which, because of lack of dignity, defy all description. Ten thousand fellow-Germans, who gathered last Saturday evening for a national demonstration, could not hold their meeting in the hall hired with peaceful intentions, because the Jewish-Communistic mob of New York succeeded, in league with some Germans, in having the hall closed. While each week the undermining forces of the country and its organizations can carry out undisturbed in various halls their activities toward the destruction of the state, it seems to those. who have the good of the state at heart that the German-American is refusing to make use of his constitutional rights. The largest city of the Land of Freedom is today subjected to the lash of the Communistic "Poepels" (probably an allusion to a tyrannical person who is like the priests of old Russia) to the disgrace of the whole nation, of the nation which was once built up by Christian people of Nordic blood. The Red Terror, with which we Germans of the time just before Hitler became acquainted in our native country to the extent that we should bow our heads, will never master us. While we could not expect anything else from the servants of Moscow and their Jewish string-pullers and while they forged their plans which resulted in the stopping of our meeting, German groups took pains in just as reprehensible a way to disturb this demonstration. The infamous acts of last week, for which we hold responsible not the general group, but its leaders, are probably the lowest sort of thing of which we consider the German people capable. An open but honorable enemy can always impress us forcibly, but not people who lack the courage to stand by their deeds, and I regret extremely to have to state here that the leaders of the United German Societies and of the German-American Conference, as well as the leaders of the Steuben Society, make use of these methods in an inexcusable way. The fine speeches which were delivered to thousands on Sunday do not do any good. We can no longer believe that your intentions with regard to the German cause in New York are honorable and upright.

Your actions in the past, and all the more at the present time, speak too clearly; henceforth we refuse conclusively to give our sanction to an arrangement which would bestow upon us only new disappointments.

If, in establishing further this attitude we have taken, I remind you of the past, the reference to the German-American Economic Alliance of New York is probably sufficient, for which we sacrificed our last penny and which as a last act of thanks to its trusted ones extended our hand in fellowship to a notorious traitor and perjured companion.

I must remind you of the fact that they prevented the delegates of the Bund, who had a legal right to do so, from participating in a meeting of the United German Societies by police force, while at the same time the non-members of the United German Societies were allowed to officiate in the capacity of bouncers. In the fall of 1933 after long heated debates the Jew was thrown out of the United German Societies, in the spring of 1935 German people threw out those with National Socialist tendencies.

For months the leaders of the United German Societies pursued the leaders of the Bund, slandered them, said degrading things about them and their honor, condemned the Bund and its members; they were the most zealous factor in the ring of our enemy. However, in order to bring an end to this fraternal discord the Bund made an untold number of attempts to make public peace because it did not wish to perform a German drama for the Jewish metropolis of New York. -- What was the answer? Scorn and ridicule, further pitiful harangue in the official publication of the United German Societies, the Observer, stolen from the Bund. The German Day approached, the Bund again made overtures which were to lead to a union, our District Leader Ost and I repeatedly even expressed the desire for union, District Leader Schuster personally made proposals, but they were refused on the basis that making money was more important to the United German Societies than the good of the entire German cause. It would take too long for me to make an attempt to give you a complete picture of the events. Let me turn briefly to the Steuben Society or, better still, to its honorable president. Mr. Hoffmann, who takes pleasure each year in shaking hands with the leaders of the German people and who extends, with just as great enthusiasm (I'll even dare to assume with even greater) his hand, still warm from the other handshake, to the enemies of all Germany, acts like a judge of our movement and its struggle. Should Mr. Hoffmann have come by his jurisprudence from the school of the greatest mind of the Steubenites, the Sing Sing Candidate David Maier, of varied ancestry, then we askhim to apply it where he belongs. We are friends of Germany, not because it is a propitious opportunity, but because it is innermost in our hearts. Mr. Hoffmann, who a few weeks ago allowed himself to be shown in the moving pictures in many cities of Germany as the big man, who represents an organization of 50,000 people, we ask you, where are these tens of thousands whom you claim to represent? Where were the 50,000 last Sunday; where, to enlarge a little further, were the 150,000 members of the German-American Conference and of the United German Societies, etc.? We decline to accept the illusion of false facts which appear to be law to other people, because we are of the opinion, that we will get along better with the truth.

I consider it my duty upon this occasion to speak how about the circulars of the German-American Conference for the collection of addresses for political purposes. We, too, believe that the German group must be schooled politically in order to regain its place, but we refuse to give our sanction that our fellow-soldiers be turned into an object of dispute of political scene-shifters. We also do not believe that it is the duty of the "DAV" (German Trade Union), that is, of the alleged German Workers' Front, to concern themselves with things which have nothing in common with the duties of the German Trade Union. Likewise we consider it as absolutely out of place when communications to comrades of the National Socialist Party, contrary to the regulations of the Main District Office, ask to attend a "German Day" which has just as little to do with the spirit of the National Socialist Party, as the representatives of a past epoch of German history still working hard here in New York.

Also the newspaper, which was our life-blood, the New York Times, founded by the deceased Jew Ochs, showed its tendency to be prejudicial to our National Day. Like a flash from a clear sky it brought the news that Germany designates the Bund as nonsense and hopes we would again - - - - -

Perhaps those who eternally belong to yesterday at Battery Place can give us the necessary information.

We are heart and soul for our Germany, yesterday, today and tomorrow. We stand for our National Socialist Germany because we obtain from it the powers which we need for our struggle for the maintenance of the true German cause in the U. S. A. No one can influence us and even if we have bitter resentment in our hearts because of the injustice which is inflicted upon us from the German side, we shall always intercede in favor of the country of our fathers and its leader. Germany is also our Germany and we intend to remain and be its most loyal sons.

Hail to you, dear co-workers in our common struggle and destiny.

The ways part, he who is not for us, is against us. We do not recognize neutrals. We do not intend to repay evil with evil, although we had ample reason to be angry with the tradesmen who supported a German Day by advertising in the program—for us this was an insult which we, having the great goal in mind, can pardon once again.

The paper, "Front Fighter", which indeed leads more than a modest existence screamed in its last edition: We do not want beggars and traitors at the German Day......I do not know whether it is the opinion of the entire membership of the German Legion and wish to make known as answer thereto that, at this time, an invitation is extended to our Front Fighters to apply for the founding of a Front Fighter Group in the Bund. We shall surely find a happy solution with our comrades of the Stahlhelm (Steel Helmet Guards). We do not need to waste words about the corpse of the German-American Economic Alliance which has already gone into a state of decomposition. Our economic organization is called the German-American Business League and will conduct a Christmas Bazaar the week before Christmas which, since it is not an undertaking for profit, offers free admission to everyone. Therefore save your Christmas shopping until the German-American Business League's Christmas Bazaar.

In competition with the Choral Societies which are still in the slumber of a Sleeping Beauty, and which still have no idea of a New Germany because their chairmen prohibit it, the Bund will set up a German Singers Club which will bear this name with honor. Accordingly herewith goes out the call to all to report so that the Singing Division of the Bund may be organized immediately. In the very near future an announcement will be made when the demonstration, which was forbidden on Saturday, will be held. The cards of the Folk (or National) Day, which took place, however, in another form, can be exchanged for cash. I should like to implore you, however, to turn this money over to us if at all possible so that we can cover at least a portion of our growing debts. This request may perhaps not be understood everywhere and I should like, therefore, to state that we had over \$1800 in expenses and we should like to pay immediately our tradesmen who do not have at their disposal too great resources.

Next Tuesday a person is speaking, who is extremely well known in American circles, a Mr. R. Edmundson, by name, the editor of a large number of publications which are all favorable to us. Everyone is to bring a guest. Mr. Edmundson will speak in our native tongue.

Who got up this Times article three days before the Folk (or National) Day? Why was this false announcement stamped as a more or less official document?

It is with great feeling that I read of the continuous ruthless destruction of the precious lives of our fellow Citizens and the much needed facilities for self defenge that see essential to us and to aid the last outpost of Democaracy- Great Britain, on which our well being to a great extent depends.

I feel derelict in having written sooner, but I had been in hopes with the F.B.I. on the job, we would get action, but things are getting worse; with yesterday; two explosions in New York and one in Pennsylvania and this is only a bagatelle to what is going to happen unless something radical is done to stop it and soon.

I say without equivocation, that most of this, if not all, could have been averted, by putting the screws to the one man in this country, who more than any other, is responsible for these catastrophes and I mean no other than G.Wilhelm Kunze, the socalled Fuebrer of the German-American Bund and his clique of about 30 to 40, who are working with and responsible to the German Consular offices through the Country.

G. Wilhelm Kunze is the so-called brains of this clique, alongside of whom Fitz Kuhn is a dull witted, thick headed ninkompoop. 




