DEMONSTRATION AT SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE HEADQUARTERS, HAUPPAUGE,  
NEW YORK BY MEMBER OF GAY ACTIVIST ALLIANCE DECEMBER FOURTEEN PRESENT

ON DECEMBER FOURTEEN, PRESENT, A SPECIAL AGENT OF THE  
FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION (FBI) OBSERVED APPROXIMATELY  
FORTY INDIVIDUALS DEMONSTRATE AT SUFFOLK COUNTY POLICE  
HEADQUARTERS, HAUPPAUGE, NEW YORK. DEMONSTRATION STARTED AT  
APPROXIMATELY TWELVE NOON AND WAS SPONSORED BY THE GAY  
ACTIVIST ALLIANCE. DURING COURSE OF DEMONSTRATION THREE  
DEMONSTRATORS WERE ARRESTED FOR ASSAULT.

SOURCE WHO HAS PROVIDED RELIABLE INFORMATION IN THE PAST,  
ADVISED IDENTITIES OF THOSE ARRESTED WERE NOT KNOWN AT THIS TIME,  
HOWEVER, PERSONS ARRESTED WERE TWO MALES AND ONE FEMALE. SOURCE  
ADVISED THOSE ARRESTED ARE BEING CHARGED WITH ASSAULT IN

Examination of records of the Dade County Public Safety Department reflect a record dated September 8, 1970, on [REDACTED] who was arrested on October 29, 1970, on charges of sale and possession of marijuana, sentenced to 90 days in jail, and placed on three years probation. His occupation was listed as "teacher" and his residence as [REDACTED] Miami. U

On March 6, 1972, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] advised that he is personally acquainted with [REDACTED] an acknowledged homosexual who is a member of the GAA. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] frequented by homosexuals and that he himself is active in attempting, through legal channels, to obtain greater equality and rights for homosexuals. He said that approximately a week previously he had a conversation with [REDACTED] who inquired as to whether or not [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said that it had come to his attention that several members of the GAA from New York had recently been in Miami to assist in organizing a local branch of the GAA. U

[REDACTED] said that during the course of his talks with [REDACTED] as well as with the visitors from New York, and other members of the GAA, he had seen no evidence whatsoever that any form of violence is planned by the GAA for the convention. He expressed the opinion that any form of violence would be in direct conflict with the very nature of most homosexuals, who are peaceable by nature and avoid violence. [REDACTED] offered to make further inquiry in order to obtain more specific information concerning plans of the GAA for the convention. U

Uh, from 50 states there will be approximately 24,000 people together in this association so they can be striving for their point for homosexual votes." U

He described [REDACTED] as being a clever but devious character who has furnished "reliable information" to [REDACTED] but who is also a "kook and nut". He expressed the opinion that [REDACTED] smokes marijuana but is not on narcotics. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said that despite these characteristics, [REDACTED] has furnished him with some reliable information which he then modified by stating that at least a portion of the information furnished by [REDACTED] would prove to be true. U

He stated that his son has been in constant trouble, is usually unemployed and has been the despair of his parents. He said that his son had never mentioned the GAA nor had he disclosed that any group of individuals planned violence for the Democratic National Convention. U

[redacted] who is a friend of [redacted] At the outset of the interview [redacted] was informed by the interviewing Agents that it is a violation of Federal law to furnish false information knowingly to the Federal Government in an official investigation. U

[redacted] stated that he had been released from the Dade County Jail [redacted]

[redacted] said that he [redacted] whom he described as a [redacted] until the time he was dismissed after being arrested for the sale and possession of marijuana. About four or five weeks ago, according to [redacted] he attended a meeting at the apartment of [redacted] This meeting was held by the Gay Activist Alliance (GAA) which [redacted] said is composed of homosexuals. About 40 to 65 men were present. [redacted] was in the apartment for no more than five minutes. He claimed that during this time he observed a collection of weapons on a table. These weapons included ten or twelve handguns, two rifles and four cans of mace, which he said had been placed there by some of those in attendance at the meeting. While standing outside the apartment he overheard a man inside the apartment whom he described as being the President of the GAA from New York City, talk about sending representatives of the GAA to various colleges in order to determine their attitude toward the GAA. U

[redacted] said that he saw a copy of the constitution of the GAA and that the Ninth Amendment to this constitution advocated violence. U

He said that he also overheard various members present make references to the Democratic National Convention scheduled

for Miami Beach in the Summer of 1972. Someone stated that approximately 2,500 GAA members from New York were expected to come to Miami. He said that the GAA members from New York City are promoting attendance at the convention. U

[REDACTED] was unable to relate that any specific remarks had been made during this meeting where violence was advocated by the GAA during the convention but he assumed that this could have been so due to the presence of weapons and due to the violence advocated in the Ninth Amendment of the GAA constitution. U

He also claimed that he went past 5024 NE 2nd Avenue on subsequent occasions when meetings were being held there and saw a great many cars parked there which lead him to believe that the size of the meetings had been increasing, however, he did not attend any subsequent meetings. U

[REDACTED] was again interviewed. [REDACTED] said that subsequent to the first interview of March 6, 1972, he had had a long talk with [REDACTED] concerning the GAA and the forthcoming Democratic National Convention. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] emphatically denied that the GAA or any individuals that he himself is associated with have any intention whatsoever of engaging in any form of violence at the convention. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that he, as a member of the GAA, is interested in developing only a service type organization and believes the GAA should obtain its goals by legal means. U

[REDACTED] said that he himself has reliable contacts who are associated with the GAA and that he feels positive that the GAA intends no form of violence at the convention. He asserted that he himself would be the first to publically denounce the GAA if he found out that it did have any plans for violence. He reiterated that violence is abhorrent to the very nature of homosexuals, but that [REDACTED] and other organizations with which homosexuals are affiliated are attempting, through peaceful and legal means, to obtain greater rights and recognition for homosexuals as individuals and citizens. U

[redacted] was interviewed at his residence. At the outset of the interview he was given a "Waiver of Rights" form which he read and immediately signed, stating that he had no opposition whatsoever to being interviewed by the FBI. U

[redacted] stated that he is [redacted] but was terminated after he was arrested for possession of marijuana. At the present time he is earning a living by restoring antique paintings. He resides alone in his apartment. U

During this meeting discussions related to what the GAA is, its purposes and aims, and that the primary cause for its existence is "Gay Rights". Those in attendance were primarily of the college student category. U

[redacted] stated that at no time at this or any other meeting held in his apartment were any weapons in evidence or exhibited by any of those present. He asserted that at no time was the use of weapons discussed and that to do so would have been completely out of the question since neither he nor other members of the GAA have any intention whatsoever of engaging in any form of violence or to use weapons for any purpose. U

He asserted that at no time was any form of violence advocated or suggested by any of those present at the February 4, 1972, meeting or at any meeting of the GAA. U

He said that there were three consecutive meetings held and that approximately 20 was the greatest number that had attended any of these meetings. The GAA in Miami now has approximately 13 members. At no time were more than that ever present. U

[REDACTED] stated that the GAA is deeply concerned about obtaining "Gay" rights through legal channels. He asserted that it is absolutely untrue that any form of violence is advocated or intended by the GAA with which he is associated

[REDACTED] produced a copy of the "Constitution and Bylaws of the Gay Activists Alliance", the pertinent portions of which are set forth below: U

"PREAMBLE"

"WE AS LIBERATED HOMOSEXUAL ACTIVISTS demand the freedom for expression of our dignity and value as human beings through confrontation with and disarmament of all mechanisms which unjustly inhibit us: economic, social, and political. Before the public conscience, we demand an immediate end to all oppression of homosexuals and the immediate unconditional recognition of these basic rights: U

"THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN FEELINGS. This is the right to feel attracted to the beauty of members of our own sex and to embrace those feelings as truly our own, free from any question or challenge whatsoever by any other person, institution, or 'moral authority.' U

"THE RIGHT TO LOVE. This is the right to express out feelings in action, the right to make love with anyone, anyway, anytime, provided only that such action be freely chosen by the individuals concerned. U

"THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN BODIES. This is the right to treat and express our bodies as we will, to nurture. U

display, and embellish them solely in the manner we ourselves determine independent of any external control whatsoever. U

"THE RIGHT TO BE PERSONS. This is the right freely express our own individuality under the governance of laws justly made and executed, and to be the bearers of social and political rights which are guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, enjoined upon all legislative bodies and courts, and grounded in the fact of our common humanity. U

"To secure these rights, we hereby institute the GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE, which shall be completely and solely dedicated to their implementation and maintenance, repudiating, at the same time, violence (Except for the right of self-defense) as unworthy of social protest, disdaining all ideologies whether political or social, and forbearing alliance with any group except for those whose concrete actions are likewise so specifically dedicated. U

"It is finally to the imagination of oppressed homosexuals themselves that we commend the consideration of these rights, upon whose actions also depends all hope for the prospect of their lasting procurement.-----U

#### "BY-LAWS

"Article I. The Gay Activists Alliance will not endorse, ally with, or otherwise support any political party, candidate for public office, and/or any organization not directly related to the homosexual cause. The Gay Activists Alliance will not align itself with any organization that advocates the use of violence (except in self-defense). U

NEW YORK HILTON HOTEL, 4/15/72

On Saturday evening, 4/15/72, I attended the captioned dinner in the Grand Ballroom of the New York Hilton Hotel. It was a black-tie affair, at which there were approximately 1600 in attendance. This affair is similar to the Gridiron Dinner which is held annually in Washington, D. C. *u*

During the third intermission of the evening, a group of approximately twenty-five young, crudely dressed individuals, who identified themselves as members of the GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE (GAA), invaded the ballroom and began distributing handbills setting forth protests and complaints about the handling of homosexual stories by the media. The GAA is a group of homosexuals. The members of the GAA distributed the leaflets and one tried to talk into the microphone on the stage. The curtain was drawn for the intermission and the individual trying to seize the microphone could not be seen from the main part of the ballroom where I was seated. Men in dinner jackets, who appeared to be part of the hotel management ordered the GAA group to leave, which they did. *u*

B. APPROX 1951

The next day the newspapers carried a story indicating that two of the members of the GAA had been beaten, one on the escalator outside the ballroom and the other behind the curtain when he attempted to talk over the microphone. The members of the GAA who had been beaten had not been able to identify their alleged assailants. However, one MORTY MANFORD, age 21, head of the "Gay People at Columbia University", and one of the two allegedly beaten, believes that MICHAEL MAYE, President of the Uniformed Fire Fighters Association, was the individual who attacked him on the escalator. MANFORD has sworn out a warrant for the arrest of MAYE. A spokesman for the NYCPD stated that allegations concerning the incident are being investigated.

On the late afternoon of 4/19/72, MANFORD called the NYO and asked to speak with me. I was out of the office at the time. He advised the person with whom he spoke that he wanted to talk to me and ask me some questions about anything I may have seen at the Inner Circle Dinner. He asked that I call him back. I have no intention of returning his call. U

What I actually saw is set forth above. I did not see either of the alleged assaults, nor did anyone seated in the ballroom. According to the newspaper, three witnesses say MAYE beat MANFORD on the escalator but there appear to be no witnesses to what went on behind the stage concerning the individual who tried to take over the microphone. U

On April 19, 1972, a Miami source who is well informed concerning some New Left activities in the Miami area reported the following information: U

The Gay Activist Alliance (GAA) in Miami meets each Tuesday at the Center for Dialogue, St. John's Lutheran Church. At a recent meeting, plans were discussed for a series of "zaps" in the Miami area during the Democratic National Convention, designed to draw attention to, and sympathy for, the GAA cause. Possibilities discussed for these "zaps" were a "wedding" between two homosexuals and a dance for persons of the same sex. Both of these actions are believed to be illegal, and the official action taken against the GAA by the authorities would hopefully bring about a situation which would create sympathy for their struggle. Plans for these "zaps" are still in the formative stage and have not been finalized. (U)

Said file and record searches and police contacts also failed to develop any information concerning a GAA Chicago chapter, a National Coalition of Gay Organizations (NCGO), or the Rainbow Tribe, an alleged violence-prone element of the Purple Star Tribe, an alleged Gay Liberation organization. U

It is noted Chicago previously advised by nitel to the Bureau (copy to Miami) dated 4/7/72 under Gay Liberation Front and MIDEM captions, that investigation, including indices search, failed to identify or develop any information concerning the Purple Star Tribe in the Chicago area. U

Investigation to date at Chicago, including contacts with sources listed above, as well as with logical informants, has failed to develop any information to indicate any actual organizational activity has been undertaken by any element of the street movement, including Gay Liberation, for mass, group or organizational appearance for demonstration or any other activity at the Democratic or Republican national political conventions during the summer of 1972 at Miami Beach, Florida. Unquestionably, individuals and possibly even organized groups from Chicago will be present at Miami Beach. There is just no indication, at this time, that such activity is being seriously considered or organized by any element and no specific assertions by individuals or groups have been made that they will be in Miami Beach. U

Chicago will continue to remain alert for such information. If developed, it will be immediately furnished to the Bureau, Miami and interested Offices by the most expeditious means followed in form suitable for dissemination with appropriate recommendations by Chicago. U

On June 21, 1972, a source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that there would be a demonstration held at the Federal Court House, Miami, Florida, at 8:30 AM, Thursday, June 22, 1972. The source also advised that the American Civil Liberties Union would also be present. U

On June 22, 1972, Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation went to the Federal Court House, Miami, Florida, to observe the proposed demonstration. Agents determined that no demonstration was being conducted. Further inquiries by agents determined that there was to be a court hearing concerning the Gay Activists bringing a complaint before the Federal Court against the Miami Beach Police Department concerning Ordinance 25-50 and Ordinance 25-52. U

The main purpose of their complaint was concerning the wearing apparel of individuals stating that it is a violation of their First Amendment rights. u

It was observed that 20 to 25 individuals, men and women, from the local Gay Activists Alliance were in attendance. One individual was overheard to say that there would be 500 sisters in for the convention, referring to the upcoming two political conventions. u

RE: GAY ACTIVISTS ALLIANCE; ET AL

The complaint was filed by the Gay Activists Alliance under the names of ROBERT BARRY and CHARLES LAMONT. A Miami Beach attorney attempted to get the complaint dismissed, stating that the ordinances do not violate First Amendment rights. Motion to dismiss was denied by Federal Judge EMMETT C. CHOATE. A hearing followed where ROBERT BARRY was called as a witness and advised that he is a homosexual and that the Gay Activists Alliance is a non-violent civil rights organization. He further stated that their plans are for their organization to attend the convention in order to demonstrate for gay civil rights. He advised that there are approximately 584 gay organizations in the United States and that there is an expected six thousand individuals from these organizations coming to Miami. U

CHARLES A. LAMONT was next called to the stand and advised that he is the community organizer for the National Coalition of Gay Organizations and that their main purpose is for gay civil rights. He advised that the purpose for coming to the convention is to talk with delegates in an attempt to have them understand their rights. U

Judge WILLIAM O. MEHRTE stated that, in his opinion, the ordinances are vague and overbreath and give a chilling effect on the First Amendment rights. He placed a permanent injunction on Ordinances 25-50 and 25-52, stating that these individuals may dress in any manner which they want and are not to be arrested by the Miami Beach Police Department. U

A confidential source advised on May 23, 1972, that at a rally at Columbus, Ohio, on May 21, 1972, sponsored by the GAA, a recognized student group on the campus of Ohio State University, an announcement was made urging everyone to go to the national political conventions in Miami and stating if they could not be at both conventions, they should plan to be at the Democratic National Convention. The announcement stated arrangements should be made through the GAA office in Miami. U

A second confidential source advised on May 31, 1972, that CHUCK LAMONT of the Chicago chapter of GAA and a spokesman for the NCGO has recently been in Miami organizing for protest activity by these organizations at the Democratic National Convention. U ILL. FLA. SUBJECT ORIGIN

The May 31, 1972, issue of the "Miami Herald", a daily Miami newspaper, contained an article stating that CHUCK LAMONT, spokesman for the NCGO, had advised that his group has requested the City of Miami Beach furnish a camp site on the 21st Street Beach, Miami Beach, for use of the gay demonstrators. LAMONT said this beach is already known as a "gay beach" and he added that a separate gay camp site is needed from camp sites utilized by other demonstrators because of possible animosities of these other demonstrators who may harbor "anti-gay feelings". U

On June 1, 1972, on the program "The Informer", a daily talk show on Miami Beach radio station WKAT, talkmaster LYNN RUSSELL talked by telephone with BOB BARRY, who identified himself as President of the Miami chapter of GAA. He related as follows: U FLA. SUBJECT ORIGIN 2A

The GAA has made plans for peaceful demonstrations at the site of the Democratic National Convention in support of the delegates within the convention committed to the support of "gay rights". Some 50 such delegates are already committed. U

The expected number of gay demonstrators was estimated at over 6,000 based upon the number who attended a recent national convention in Chicago sponsored by the NCGO. GAA considers this a political action and the demonstrations will be in support of full civil rights for all homosexuals in every field. U

work as a pioneer and trail-blazer, but trails are necessarily blazed with lack of knowledge of the whole terrain and seldom follow what ultimately turns out to be the optimum route. It is time to realize that much of the psychiatric approach to homosexuality must be recognized for what it is: A misinterpretation of cultural artifacts of the narrowly distorted, warped, perverted sexual attitude of the Victorian era, in which Freud got up, and shortly following which the most modern "authorities" on this subject were trained.

We must recognize that one of the glories of humankind is its endless diversity and pluralism in all things; that we are not faceless robots all turned out of the same mold, but that we follow different courses of equal value to different goals of equal value in psychosexual development as in all other areas; that there is no one, single healthy course in psychosexual development.

Finally, we must realize that among the glories of humankind is its brain, which has liberated us from the degrading, demeaning, dehumanizing (and inapplicable in this context) "anatomy is destiny" theory. Our genital organs are our appendages; we are not appendages of our genital organs.

We take the position that in our pluralistic society, the homosexual has a moral right to be a homosexual, and being a homosexual, has a moral right not only to live his or her homosexuality fully, freely, openly, and with pride, but also has a right to do so free of arrogant and insolent pressures to convert to the prevailing heterosexuality, and in the absence of the active, affirmative, positive assistance and encouragement of all the official and unofficial arms and agents of society, including psychiatry, in his so living.

Not only do we insist that homosexuals, as people, are in no way inferior to heterosexuals as people (a precept to which we are sure that most psychiatrists will make no exception) but we insist, equally uncompromisingly, that homosexuality—as a condition of being, a way of life or life-style, an expression of love and affection—is fully on par with and in no slightest way inferior to heterosexuality.

We are working to create a sense of community among our people to create, in turn, a sense of unity, solidarity, militancy, and activism, in order to assist us achieve our full rights and status in a society which is ours as much as it is that of the heterosexuals. We are working with success to create among our people a sense of pride in their homosexuality and a sense of the rightness of what they are and the goodness of what they do.

In order to do this, it is necessary to extract homosexuality from the medical context in which it has long and persistently been placed, and to place it in a sociological context of minority group relationships involving prejudice, discrimination, and bigotry. This is the only context in which the real problems of real homosexuals in our society today can be constructively and productively addressed. It has been well and truly said that in our society there is no Black problem, there is a white problem. We say that there is no homosexual problem, there is a heterosexual problem. Psychiatry, as it presently deals with homosexuality, is a major part of that problem.

A psychiatric profession which persists in approaching homosexuality as a medical problem and homosexuals, *per se*, as patients, while homosexuals themselves as homosexuals are busy entering politics and running for public office, is singularly out of touch with reality—psychotically so!

We are trying to open dialog with the psychiatric profession on these questions. In past years, it has been necessary, on occasion, to resort to strong measures against a resisting profession in order to achieve such discussion of our problems with us instead of merely about us. We sincerely hope that productive, constructive discussion and dialog, spurred by meaningful reform of psychiatry, will now proceed actively.

Psychiatry, in the past—and continuingly—has been the major obstacle in our society to the advancement of homosexuals and to the achievement of our rights, our full happiness, and our basic human dignity. Psychiatry can become our major ally.

Will you assist us?

#### WHAT YOU CAN DO:

1. Both individually and collectively as a profession and an association, re-examine your past positions on homosexuality. Discard the negative attitudes and the biases which have afflicted you in the past.
2. Work for a public renunciation, by psychiatry, of the "sickness theory" of homosexuality in ANY semantic guise.
3. Undertake an active, vigorous campaign to ameliorate and ultimately to eliminate popular prejudice on this question, both through work to change attitudes in such specific areas as law reform, equal opportunity legislation, etc.
4. Consult on an on-going basis with representatives of the bisexual community.

Our themes are: **GAY, PROUD AND HEALTHY** and **GAY GOOD**. With or without you, we will work vigorously toward the acceptance of those premises and will fight those who oppose us. We would much prefer to work with you than against you. Will you join us, to our mutual benefit?

C O N S T I T U T I O N A L A N D B Y L A W S  
O F T H E

**PREAMBLE:**

WE AS LIBERATED HOMOSEXUAL ACTIVISTS demand the freedom for expression of our dignity and value as human beings through confrontation with and disarmament of all mechanisms which unjustly inhibit us: economic, social, and political. Before the public conscience, we demand an immediate end to all oppression of the homosexuals and that immediate unconditional recognition of these basic rights:

**THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN FEELINGS.** This is the right to feel attracted to the beauty of members of our own sex and to embrace those feelings as truly our own, free from any question or challenge whatsoever by any other person, institution, or "moral authority."

**THE RIGHT TO SEX.** This is the right to express our feelings in action, the right to make love with anyone, anyway, anytime, provided only that such action be freely chosen by the individuals concerned.

**THE RIGHT TO OUR OWN BODIES.** This is the right to treat and express our bodies as we will, to nurture, display, and embellish them solely in the manner we ourselves determine independent of any external control whatsoever.

**THE RIGHT TO BE PERSONS.** This is the right freely express our own individuality under the governance of laws justly made and executed, and not be the bearers of social and political rights which are guaranteed by the Constitution of the United States and the Bill of Rights, enjoined upon legislative bodies and courts, and grounded in the fact of our common humanity.

To secure these rights, we hereby institute the GAY ACTIVISTS Alliance, which shall be completely and solely dedicated to their implementation and maintenance, repudiating, at the same time, violence (except for the right of self-defense) as unworthy of social protest, disdaining all ideologies, whether political or social, and forbearing alliance with any group except for those whose concrete actions are likewise specifically dedicated.

It is finally to the imagination of oppressed homosexuals themselves that we commend the consideration of these rights, upon whose actions alone depends all hope for the prospect of their lasting procurement.

## 1972 GAY RIGHTS PLATFORM IN THE UNITED STATES

(adopted by the National Coalition of GAY Organizations meeting in Chicago, Illinois, February 13, 1972)

Millions of Gay women and men in this country are subject to severe social, economic and psychological and legal oppression because of their sexual orientation.

We affirm the right of all persons to define and express their own sensibility, emotionality and sexuality, and to choose their own lifestyle, so long as they do not infringe upon the rights of others. We pledge an end to all social, economic and legal oppression of Gay women and men.

We demand the repeal of all laws forbidding voluntary sex acts involving consenting persons in private.

Laws prohibiting loitering for the purpose of soliciting for a homosexual liaison are vague and unconstitutional. Nevertheless, they are frequently used as the legal cover for police entrapment of Gay women and men.

We demand the repeal of all laws prohibiting solicitation for a voluntary private sexual liaison.

Prejudice and myth have led to widespread discrimination against Gay women and men.

We demand the enactment of civil rights legislation which will prohibit discrimination because of sexual orientation in employment, housing, public accommodations and public services.

DEMANDS:

FEDERAL:

1. Amend all federal Civil Rights Acts, other legislation and government controls to prohibit discrimination in employment, housing, public accommodations and public services, because of one's sexual orientation.
2. Issuance by the President of an executive order prohibiting the military from excluding for reasons of their sexual orientation, persons who of their own volition desire entrance into the Armed Services; and from issuing less-than-fully-honorable discharges for homosexuality; and the upgrading to fully honorable all such discharges previously issued, with retroactive benefits.
3. Issuance by the President of an executive order prohibiting discrimination in the federal civil service because of sexual orientation, in hiring and promoting; and prohibiting discriminations against Gay women and men.
4. Elimination of tax inequities victimizing single persons and same-sex couples.
5. Elimination of bars to the entry, immigration and naturalization of Gay aliens.
6. Federal encouragement and support for sex education courses, prepared and taught by qualified Gay women and men, presenting homosexuality as a valid, healthy preference, lifestyle, and as a viable alternative to heterosexuality.
7. Appropriate executive orders, regulations and legislation banning the compiling, maintenance and dissemination of information on an individual's sexual preferences, behavior, and social and political activities for dossiers and data banks, and ordering the immediate destruction of such data.
8. Federal funding of aid projects for social and political activities of Gay women's and men's organizations designed to alleviate the problems encountered by Gay women and men which are engendered by an oppressive sexist society.

9. Immediate release of all Gay women and men now incarcerated in detention centers, prisons and mental institutions because of sexual offense charges relating to victimless crimes or sexual orientation; and that adequate compensation be made for the physical and mental duress encountered; and that all existing records relating to the incarceration be immediately expunged.

STATE:

1. All federal legislation and programs enumerated in Demands 1, 4, 7, 8, and 9 above should be implemented at the State level where applicable.
2. Repeal of all state laws prohibiting private sexual acts involving consenting persons; equalization for homosexuals and heterosexuals for the enforcement of all laws.
3. Repeal all state laws prohibiting solicitation for private voluntary sexual intercourse, and laws prohibiting prostitution, both male and female.
4. Enactment of legislation prohibiting insurance companies and any other state-regulated enterprises from discriminating because of sexual orientation, in insurance and in bonding or and other prerequisite to employment or control of one's personal demesne.
5. Enactment of legislation so that child custody, adoption, visitation rights, foster parenthood, and the like shall not be denied because of sexual orientation or marital status.
6. Repeal of all laws prohibiting transvestitism and cross dressing.
7. Repeal of all laws governing the age of sexual consent.
8. Repeal of all legislative provisions that restrict the sex or number of persons entering into a marriage unit; and the extension of legal benefits of marriage to all persons who cohabit regardless of sex or numbers.

On 12/19/72, [redacted] advised captioned organization exerted almost no influence during the Republican National Convention in Miami, Florida, 8/21-24/72. The source advised GAA as a group advocated non-violence and were concerned primarily in demonstrating in favor of equal rights for homosexuals. The source further advised that GAA in NYC, although opposed to the "establishment," has not been active in the current revolutionary movement in NYC. (u)

In December, 1972, [redacted] advised that GAA, which maintains an office at 99 Wooster Street, NYC, is actively involved in obtaining complete equal rights for homosexuals. The source advised GAA has not participated in any recent radical-oriented demonstrations in NYC. (u)

On 2/28/73, [redacted] advised GAA as a group is not concerned with the revolutionary movement in NYC except for the purpose of expressing equal rights for homosexuals. (u)

Various sources in NYC were contacted during November and December, 1972, and all advised they could furnish no information to indicate that GAA has been involved in revolutionary activities. During February, 1973, the following sources were contacted with negative results: (u)

In view of the fact there are no outstanding leads, and there is no indication GAA is involved in activities inimical to the security of the US, NYO has placed this case in a closed status. (u)
