I. ORGANIZATIONS PLANNING PROTEST DEMONSTRATIONS

A. ~~MIAMI CONVENTIONS COALITION (MCC);~~
~~PEOPLE'S COALITION FOR PEACE AND JUSTICE (PCPJ)~~

The MCC was formed at a national meeting in
Washington, D. C., during May, 1972, as a
coalition of groups planning protest activities
at the Democratic National Convention (DNC)
and RNC, including the Florida People's Coalition
(FPC) and the San Diego Convention Coalition
(SDCC).

The FPC is a state-wide organization established
as a pressure group to demonstrate at the DNC,
Miami Beach, Florida, July, 1972.

The PCPJ is self-described as a coalition of
over 100 organizations which are using massive
civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty,
repression and war.

The SDCC was formed to organize demonstrations
at the RNC at San Diego, California. This
organization was dissolved when the site of the
RNC was changed from San Diego to Miami Beach,
Florida.

AFRO-AM

The Afro-Am was officially recognized as an organization at Ohio State University (OSU) during March, 1970, after black students participated in a demonstration and presented demands to the Vice President of OSU. U

The organization's stated purpose is to govern all black organizations on the OSU campus, and to act as an information center for all black students. U

On March 13, 1970, OSU obtained a common pleas injunction prohibiting any further disruption by the students who engaged in campus disruptive tactics by that date. This injunction included the Afro-Am. U

On November 17, 1971, an article appeared in the "Ohio State Lantern", a newspaper published Monday through Friday on the campus of Ohio State University (OSU), Columbus, Ohio, entitled, "Blacks Refuse To Testify". The article stated that on November 16, 1971, A. Donald Bourgeois, Jr., Coordinator of Afro-Am, and other members of Afro-Am, appeared at the meeting of the Centennial Commissions Task Force on hearing ideas for future goals. Bourgeois, Jr., was scheduled to present Afro-Am's views as to future role of blacks on the campus of OSU. Bourgeois, Jr., and other members of Afro-Am present, objected to the presence of news media and after a 45 minute delay, finally left the meeting room after their demands for the ousting for news media was not met. U

NEW YORK RADICAL FEMINISTS

New York Radical Feminists recognizes the oppression of women as a fundamental political oppression wherein women are categorized as an inferior class based upon their sex. It is the aim of radical feminism to organize politically to destroy this sex class system.

We believe that the purpose of male chauvinism is primarily to obtain psychological ego satisfaction, and that only secondarily does this manifest itself in economic relationships. We do not believe that capitalism, or any other economic system, is the cause of female oppression, nor do we believe that female oppression will disappear as a result of purely economic revolution. The political oppression of women has its own class dynamic, namely, the politics of the ego.

As women we are living in a male power structure, and our roles become necessarily a function of men. The services we supply are services to the male ego. It remains for us as women to develop a new dialectic of sex class -- an analysis of the way in which sexual identity and institutions reinforce one another.

6 Arrested In Protest At Monument

Six men were taken into custody by U.S. Park Police at the U.S. Marine Corps Memorial in Arlington yesterday evening after a demonstration by 25 members of the Gay Activists Alliance protesting a police crackdown on homosexual offenses in the monument area.

Fourteen uniformed park police officers moved in after a park police lieutenant told the demonstrators they could not demonstrate on federal property without a permit. The police detained six men carrying signs and let the rest of the group leave the monument grounds.

The Gay Activists Alliance, described by its leaders as a militant homosexual civil rights group, called the demonstration after the press reported that about 80 men had been arrested near the monument on homosexual-related charges in the past four months.

The 80 arrests that led to yesterday's protest were made by park police undercover officers wearing long hair, moustaches, colorful shirts and tight bellbottom pants, po-

lice said. Police said the GAA attorney's office in Alexandria ordered the crackdown after 150 wobblers in a small woods near the monument, a popular meeting place for homosexuals. Most of those arrested have pleaded guilty to committing "obscene and indecent acts" and been fined \$50 each, police said.

"We recommend our brother homosexuals do not seek romantic partners in a public place," GAA president Bob Johnson told the demonstrators. "But we also assert that this activity is the unpermitted activity of consenting adults, that heterosexual men and women have sought privacy to make love in wooded areas since the days of Adam and Eve, and that the police could spend time and money to better advantage protecting us all from rapists, muggers, pushers and thieves."

Johnson, 28, who described himself as a local businessman, demanded that police use only uniformed officers to patrol the area and that all homosexuals arrested in the area be exonerated.

"Hundreds of thousands of homosexual American women and men served honorably throughout World War II," Johnson said. "What the hell are Americans now doing, subjecting their homosexual American brothers to the underhanded, undercover tactics of the police state?"

Gay Organizations Meet This Weekend

Leaders of the homosexual liberation movement from across the country were scheduled to address a "Gay Pride" rally today in Lafayette Park.

Cade Ware, one of the coordinators, said today's demonstration marks "the first time the gay movement has come back to Lafayette Park, where homosexuals were once considered criminals—back to the very steps of the White House to say what it has to say."

The rally is part of Gay Pride Week, which will continue in the District through Sunday. However, today's demonstration is the only scheduled event directed to the "straight" public, Ware said.

OTHER PLANNED festival activities include a student rap session this afternoon at the Community Bookstore in Georgetown; a gay poetry reading there tonight; free gay movies tonight at the Metropole Theater, 411 L St. NW, and workshops on gay subjects tomorrow afternoon at All Souls Unitarian Church, 16th and Harvard Streets NW.

A gay communion service in Rock Creek Park at 3 p.m.

Sunday will be followed by a "Gay-in Picnic" at 3 p.m. Buses will leave Rock Creek park at 5 p.m. for a gay vigil at Patuxent State Prison.

Another gay movement activity here this weekend will focus on political activity. The National Coalition of Gay Organizations expects between 150 and 200 delegates at a two-day strategy session to plan gay participation in this year's election politics. The meeting is being sponsored by the D.C. Gay Activists Alliance.

BILL BRICKER, a GAA spokesman, said the coalition first met two months ago in Chicago with about 150 delegates and formulated its primary objective: to get a gay plank included in the Democratic platform.

The coalition hopes to have a minimum of 5,000 gay lobbyists at the Democratic convention in July, Bricker said.

The coalition also has tentative plans for a demonstration tomorrow before the Republican National Committee's convention committee, which will be meeting at the Mayflower Hotel.

8 Killings Tied To 'Strip' Chill Homosexuals

The city of Ninth Street NW south of Vermont Square traditionally has been a "pick-up" spot for Washington area homosexuals. In the last year that strip has taken on a dangerous cast as eight homosexual men known to frequent the area have been found stabbed, shot or bludgeoned to death in their homes, cars or apartments.

In each of the murders, which are still unsolved, police believe the victim picked up his killer on the "pickup" trade there and invited the assailant to his home. Since September 1977, one victim was found strangled to death in his apartment, four were found beaten, two had been shot, and one man was found strangled in his car parked near the Chesapeake House, a restaurant on Ninth Street NW that is a gathering place for homosexuals.

The eight victims were all far older than the young men, often teen-agers, who openly attend homosexual-sponsored gatherings looking for partners. One victim was 55 years old, two were in their 50s, two were over 60 and two others were over 30.

Members of the homosexual community say it is not a coincidence that the victims were in an older age category. That fact, they say, underscores the older homosexual's uneasiness with the new, open "pick-up" attitude of younger gay men.

The men who frequent the Ninth Street area—and the homosexual haunts there such as the Chesapeake House and the Elbow Bar—are in many cases professionals: doctors, lawyers, teachers and government workers who feel that any open display of their homosexual feelings could lead to the loss of a job or the break-up of a marriage.

One victim, for example, was an administrator for the Office of Economic Development. While police are listing his death as the eighth homosexual murder, his family still refuses to believe he was a homosexual.

In another slaying, the victim's family refused to believe that the man was a homosexual, despite the fact that he was found strangled in his car parked behind the city's best-known gay bar.

That victim—a 30-year-old Virginia man with a wife and children—typifies the case of the homosexual who has still not come "out of the closet." The wife refuses to believe police detectives when they insist the man was homosexual.

It is the very fact that many of the victims chose

To hide the homosexuality that homicide investigators are having a difficult time finding leads in any of the cases.

In one case, a heterosexual friend of the slain homosexual manager of the Chesapeake House posted a \$5,000 reward for the slayer, a homosexual man, asking for any information to help solve his friend's murder. Despite the large sum offered as reward, homicide detectives say they received fewer than a dozen telephone calls, and none of the callers had any substantial information.

"Any time you are conducting a homicide investigation where there are no witnesses, you're starting at a disadvantage," said Captain Artt Moline of the homicide squad. "Very often in homosexual murders, we don't find the body until two or three days later because the murder usually takes place in private. Those two things make the investigation different than the routine murder."

Despite the similarities in the eight murders—and despite rumors in the homosexual community—that detectives do not believe a single killer is responsible for the slayings. There is no special homicide team assigned to the homosexual murders, and the eight open cases have been scattered among the homicide detectives like justice murders.

For the most part, investigators admit that they are up against a wall in trying to solve any of the slayings. They must piece together the last hours of men who did their best to conceal their movements and their identities from their families and their closest companions.

That same problem hampered investigators in the Cinema Follies fire of October last year. Nine persons were killed in the blaze that destroyed that homosexual club in Southeast Washington, but since most of the victims carried no identification and many concealed their homosexuality, it took investigators four days to identify all the victims.

Homicide detectives, asked to pinpoint the primary difficulties in solving homosexual murders, said many, if not most, homosexuals are still "in the closet," and it is hard to find anyone to admit knowing a homosexual murder victim; homosexuals tend to keep their companions secret, even from other homosexuals; homosexuals are now scattered all over Washington and not confined to the "gay strip."

Police also said that in homosexual "lover's quarrels" that end in murder, the perpetrator often feels justified. Police point out that not all homosexual murders are "lover's quarrels" but some are routine burglaries and robberies.

Still, in the homosexual community at least, the thought of eight unsolved murders—all where the victim picked up his killer as a "bustle"—conjures the immediate image of a "Bon of Evil" type killer taking out a bloody vengeance against homosexuals in Washington.

"I could be a bustle gone crazy or a straight person trying to get some kind of a vendetta," one homosexual man said.

community who do not subscribe to the "single killer theory" believe that there is a common "bustle" at work in the slayings—an angry, almost backhanded against the new visibility of gays and gay organizations, and an outgrowth of the Anti-Burns case and the Dago County, Ill., appeal of homosexual rights laws.

Washington has one of the country's strongest laws protecting homosexuals from discrimination in housing, employment and public accommodations. It also has pending a voter-approved referendum and recall against the possibility that this might be used, as in Dade County, to repeal homosexual rights laws that have chilled the homosexual community here.

Legislation to activate the referendum process is pending in the City Council's government operations committee. It contains no provision that would prevent a vote to repeal homosexual rights, or any other human rights. Homosexuals are pushing hard for such a provision, but it has run into legal problems, and the bill is stalled.

"People generally feel threatened by the visibility of homosexuality," said the Rev. Larry Uhrig of the Metropolitan Community Church. "The fear, the anger, the rage is being vented in violent acts."

Uhrig believes one of these "violent acts" was the Oct. 2, 1978, slaying of Ronald J. Pettina, whose name, battered body was found in the woods near the Iwo Jima memorial in Arlington, a widely known meeting place for homosexuals.

Michael G. Simpson, the 47-year-old who was convicted in June of Pettina's death, had testified in his own defense that the night of the murder he set out to "smack around a few queers."

While Uhrig said he "could not be surprised if one person were involved in more than one" of the recent homosexual murders, he believes "it's more of an anti-homosexual" feeling being fed rather than any individual attack on Washington-area homosexuals.

According to Robert D. Taylor, president of the Gay Action Alliance, changing that "bustle" to "crimes against gays" is "taking something a lot more straightforward than the eight recent murders."

For the short term, the Gay Alliance and the homosexual community are exploring ways to protect Washington area homosexuals from the spread of violent acts.

In their regular meeting two weeks ago, a special committee of the alliance proposed—and the alliance accepted—endorsement of a series of safety precautions to recommend to owners of bars where homosexuals are known to meet.

The proposals, borrowed from a similar list prepared by the B.C. Minister Alliance, include: increasing security escorts for homosexuals on busy nights; car patrols around parking lots; improved street lighting; outside bulletin boards advertising the bar's increased security measures to deter attackers in advance, and finally for bar owners to provide them and space for self-defense equipment for gay patrons.
