

The Republican National Convention (REC) is scheduled to be held at Niami Beach, Florida, August 21 - 24, 1972.

I. ORGANIZATIONS PLANNING PROTEST DEMONSTRATIONS

A. MIAMI CONVENTIONS COALITION (MCC);
PROPLE'S COALITION YOR PEACE AND JUSTICE (PCPJ)

The MCC was formed at a national meeting in Washington, D. C., during May, 1972, as a coalition of groups planning protest activities at the Democratic National Convention (DNC) and RNC, including the Florida People's Coalition (FPC) and the San Diego Convention Coalition (SDCC).

The FPC is a state-wide organization established as a pressure group to demonstrate at the DNC, Miami Beach, Florida, July, 1972.

The PCPJ is self-described as a coalition of over 100 organizations which are using massive civil disobedience to combat racism, poverty, repression and war.

The SDCC was formed to organize demonstrations at the RNC at San Diego, California. This organization was dissolved when the site of the RNC was changed from San Diego to Miami Beach, Florida.





AFRO-AM

The Afro-Am was officially recognized as an organization at Ohio State University (OSU) during March, 1970, after black students participated in a demonstration and presented demands to the Vice President of OSU. U

The organization's stated purpose is to govern all black organizations on the OSU campus, and to act as an information center for all black students.

On March 13, 1970, OSU obtained a common pleas injunction prohibiting any further discuption by the students who engaged in campus disruptive tactics by that date. This injunction included the Afro-Am.

On November 17, 1971, an article appeared in the "Ohio State Lantern", a newspaper published Monday through Friday on the campus of Ohio State University (OSU) Columbus, Ohio, entitled, "Blacks Refuse To Testify". The article stated that on November 16, 1971, A. Donald Bourgeois. Ir., Coordinator of Afro-Am, and other members of Afro-Am, appeared at the meeting of the Centennial Commissions Task Force on hearing ideas for future goals. Bourgeois, Jr., was scheduled to present Afro-Am's views as to future role of blacks on the campus of OSU. Bourgeois, Jr., and other members of Afro-Am present, objected to the presence of news media and after a 45 minute delay, finally left the meeting room after their demands for the ousting for news media was not met.

The April 24 United Women's Contingent organized thousands of women as an independent force to demand an immediate end to the war which denies the right of the Vietnamese to self-determination at the same time it robs us of resources that could provide us with child care centers, abortion services, equal pay, decent jobs, and education.

Last April Nixon attacked our right to abortion because he believed in the "sanctity of human life." This from a man who forgot his belief at Mylai; who forgets it daily while he presides over the heaviest saturation bombing in the history of warfare; who forgets it while defoliation spraying causes hundreds of still births and deformities; who forgets it while many thousands of American women die each year at the hands of back street abortionists!

Our job as women is clear: mobilize hundrens and incusands of our sisters as women united against the war November 6 to demand an end to the war . . . NO?!!

W YORK RADICAL FEMINISTS

New York Radical Feminists recognizes the oppression of women as a fundamental political oppression wherein women are categorized as an inferior class based upon their sex. It is the aim of radical feminism to organize politically to destroy this sex class system.

We believe that the purpose of male chauvinism is primarily to obtain psychological ego satisfaction, and that only secondarily does this manifest itself in economic relationships. We do not believe that capitalism, or any other economic system, is the cause of female oppression, nor do we believe that female oppression will disappear as a result of purely economic revolution. The political oppression of women has its own class dynamic, namely, the politics of the ego.

As women we are living in a male power structure, and our roles become necessarily a function of men. The services we supply are services to the male ego. We must begin to destroy the notion that we are only servants to the male ego; we must construct alternate selves that are independent and self assertive. It remains for us as women to develop a new dialectic of sex class -- an analysis of the way in which sexual identity and institutions reinforce one another.

From this awareness women develop a feminist political philosophy and do actions with their group or with members of other NYRF groups.

o Arrested In Protest At Monumen

Six men were taken into custody by U.S. Park Police at the U.S. Marine Corps Memorial in Artington yesterday evening after a demonstration by 25 members of the GayActivists Alliance protesting a spilice crackdown on homoextual offenses in the monument area.

Fourteen uniformed park police officers moved in after a park police lieutenant told the demonstrators they could not demonstrate an federal property without a permit. The police detained air men carrying signs and let the rest of the group leave the moniment grounds.

The Gay Activists Alliance, described by its leaders as a militant formosexual civil rights group, called the demonstration after the press reported that about 50 men had been arrested near the montiment on homosexual-related charges in the past four months.

The 60 arrests that led to yesferday's protest wer made by park police undercover officers wearing long hair, moustaches, colorful shirts and tight bellbottom pants, pottorner's effice win Alexandria ordered the crackfows fiter two webberies in a small woods near the monument, appular meeting place for monosexuals.

Most of those arrested have ileaded guilty to committing shecene and indecent acts and been fined \$50 each, police said.
