II. AFFILIATION WITH COMMUNIST FRONT AND ALLEGED COMMUNIST INFILTRATED ORGANIZATIONS

Artists Front to Win the War

The House of Representatives Committee on Un-American Activities for the 78th Congress lists the name of Gene Kelly as a sponsor for the organization known as Artists! Front to Win the War. The House Committee report stated that the Artists! Front to Win the War was a Communist front organization formed in New York City on October 16, 1942. It reportedly included representatives of the theater, literature, science and education who have long and active records in Communist front organizations, such as Canada Ise and Paul Robeson, Negro actors (4) (61-7582-1293 (pg. 574,576)

A report submitted by Military Intelligence dated January 10, 1947, also states that Gene Kelly had been a sponsor of the Artists' Front to Win the War. (100-7660-4252, pg. 4)

Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee

A highly confidential and delicate source advised Agents of the Los Angeles Office on April 29, 1945, that it had access to certain personal papers of Iaslo Benedek, who is a member of the Executive Committee of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee and known to associate with various Communists in the Los Angeles Hollywood area. Among the above-mentioned papers was reportedly a folder labeled "Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee." This folder contained records which in turn were captioned "Monthly Pledges for Committee," which apparently had reference to the JAFRC. The name "Kelly" and the sum of \$10 were indicated on these records, which appeared to be the amount pledged by Kelly to be contributed monthly to the JAFRC. It is believed that the Kelly listed in these records is probably Gene Kelly in view of the fact that the above-mentioned source also made available a copy of a letter dated May 9, 1944, directed to Mr. Gene Kelly, 506 North Alta Drive, Beverly Hills, California, from L. Benedek. This letter was a reminder to Relly of his pledge to the Joint Anti-Fasciat Refugee Committee. The same source advised that Gene Kelly's name and telephone number CR-5-1720 appeared in Laslo Benedek's address book. It is interesting to note that Benedek is employed by M.G.M. Studios as an Assistant Producer. (100-339317-2; -5)

The Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, it should be noted, is under the influence of individuals known to be in close association with functionaries of the Communist Party. The activities of the JAFRC have been promulgated by the Communist Party and supported by the Communist press.

Musicians Congress

The "People's World" newspaper for May 22, 1944, contained an advertisement announcing a symposium entitled "Culture and Democracy" to be sponsored by the Musicians' Congress on May 24 at the Women's Club of Hollywood. Among the speakers listed appeared the name Gene Kelly.

Informants have advised that the Musicians' Congress was instigated by members of the Communist Party and was completely controlled by the Communists. The alleged purpose of this organization as announced in the "People's World' newspaper was to mobilize music and musicians in the war against Fascism, to improve the musician's function in society, and to discuss and act upon the common problems of musicians (u) (100-343688-1)

Hollywood Democratic Committee

Reliable active paid informant of the Los . Angeles Office advised that an election of officers of the Hollywood Democratic Committee took place on July 26, 1944, and that Gene Kelly was elected Vice Chairman. The informant stated that Kelly is considered an ardent follower of the Communist Party line. (100-344437-4; 61-7582-1298)

The House of Representatives Committee on Un-American Activities in its report on the Hollywood Democratic Committee set out a copy of the ballot used in the HDC election of July 26, 1944. Gene Kelly's name appeared on this ballot as one of the individuals running for the office of Vice Chairman and as one of the individuals running for a position on the Executive Board of the HDG. The House Committee report points out that the Hollywood Democratic Committee disclaims any direct affiliation with the Democratic Party. The report further indicates that the HDC is a Communist front organization which has members of the Communist Party on its Executive Com-

The "People's World" newspaper for July 29, 1944, sets out the results of the Hollywood Democratic Committee's elections and states that Gene Kelly had been elected as one of the "Vice Presidents." A similar announcement concerning Kelly's election was contained in the Eaily Worker newspaper for August 7, 1944.(4) ("People's World," July 29, 1944)

It should be noted that in June, 1945, the Hollywood Democratic Committee changed its name to the Hollywood Independent Citizens: Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions and merged with the national organization known as the Independent Citizens: Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions. The latter organization had its headquarters in New York City. Gene Kelly's affiliation with the ICCASP is set out below in this memorandum.



Young Voters for Roosevelt Committee

A technical surveillance on the American Youth for Democracy offices in Los Angeles, California, reflected on July 27, 1944, that Elaine. Rose, Field Secretary of the Los Angeles County American Youth for Democracy, stated that Gene Kelly was one of the persons who had been obtained to serve in an organization known as the Young Voters for Roosevelt Committee. Rose further stated that the individuals who started the YVFRG were Howard Fast, Norman Corwin and Canada Lec. Howard Fest is an author who has written articles for the Daily Worker and for New Masses, both of which are Communist publications. Norman Corwin is a newspaper reporter and feature writer who has been connected with many Communist front organizations and has associated with known Communists. Canada Lee, the Negro actor, is known to be a member of the Communist Party. Elaine Rose further stated, according to the above source of information, that Fast, Corwin and Lee had asked the American Youth for Democracy to help them in organizing the Young Voters for Roosevelt Cormittee. (161-777-26-81; 64-319-83-5; 100-327116-9)

National Council for American Soviet Friendship

The Daily Worker for November 21, 1944, reported that Gene Kelly was one of a group of screen stars who had wired greetings to the National Gouncil for American Soviet Friendship meeting at Madison Square Garden, New York City, held on November 16, 1944. The purpose of this meeting was to commemorate the eleventh anniversary of resumption of diplomatic relations between the United States and the Soviet Union./41

It should be noted that the NCASF is an organization engaged in activities that propagate the Soviet cause in the United States. The national leaders of the NCASF are known to be in close contact with Soviet diplomatic officials and with national functionaries of the Communist Party, USA. (100-146964-572, pg. 64)

National Citizens: Political Action Committee

The Los Angeles Office obtained an undated circular issued by the National Citizens' Political Action Committee, which circular was believed to have been issued about July, 1945, by the Los Angeles Office of the NCPAC. This circular set out the names of individuals serving on the National Executive Board, the Los Angeles Executive Board, as well as the names of Los Angeles charter members of the NCPAC. The names of Mr. and Mrs. Gene Kelly appeared on the list of Los Angeles charter members. (100-33049-26-34, pgs. 14 & 15)

It should be noted that the NCPAC was an organization which was infiltrated by Communists and Communist sympathizers. The policies of the NCPAC parallel the Communist Party line in many instances. The NCPAC subsequently merged into an organization known as the Progressive Citizens of America. Gene Kelly's affiliation with the last mentioned organization is set out below in this memorandum. (4)

American Youth for Democracy

A technical surveillance on the offices of the American Youth for Democracy in Los Angeles revealed that on June 2, 1944, Elaine Mendelsohn Rose, a member of the Communist Party and a Field Representative for the Los Angeles County, American Youth for Democracy, contacted Gene Kelly, the movie star, for the purpose of soliciting Kelly's help in obtaining movie starlets to help the AYD's "Sweethearts of Servicemen" program. Rose said that she had contacted Kelly at the suggestion of John Garfield, the motion picture actor, who is known to be active in many Communist front organizations.

The Daily Worker newspaper for Pecember 11, 1945, reported that "Lt. Gene Kelly" would take part in the "Welcome home, Joe" dinner arranged by the American Youth for Democracy on the occasion of that organization's second anniversary. The dinner was to be held at the Hotel Roosevelt in New York City on December 12, 1945. The article further stated that Kelly was to present an award to Jane Froman for the latter's courage and inspiration to wounded soldiers. Jane Froman is a singer and is physically crippled.

The Military Intelligence Service in its report of the abovementioned dinner verified the fact that Gene Kelly was one of the speakers
listed to participate at that function. This report also indicated that
among the other speakers was Benjamin Davis, a New York City Councilman and
a well known Communist leader. (100-7660-3608, pg. 5)

Reliable unpaid active informant also paid active informant also verified the fact that Gene Kelly was among those who participated at the above-mentioned dinner. (6) (0) (61-777-34-182, pgs. 4 & 5)

Isidore Zack of the New England Regional Office of the Anti-Defamation League of the B'Nai Brith on October 28, 1946, submitted a report to the Boston Office which stated that Gene Kelly was one of the prominent backers of the American Youth for Democracy. (61-777-5, pg. 6)

It should be noted that the American Youth for Democracy is a national Communist youth organization controlled by the Communist Party and is the successor to the Young Communist League.

Independent Citizens' Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions

A technical surveillance on Julius Heiman, a member of the Communist Party and an alleged Soviet espionage agent, reported that Dr. Elizabeth Kalish had conferred with Mrs. Julius Heiman and that Dr. Kalish had stated that she was an Organizational Director for the Independent Citizens' Committee

(of the Arts, Sciences and Professions). Kalish stated that she had arranged a meeting on March 10, 1946, and that Gene Kelly, the actor, had contributed one hundred dollars for this meeting. Kalish stated that Canada Lee (the Negro actor and a known member of the Communist Party) had furnished entertainment. The purpose of the meeting, according to Kalish, was apparently to organize the doctors in New York City under the auspices of the ICCASP. Gene Kelly, according to Dr. Kalish, had flown to the meeting from Washington at the request of Dr. Kalish. She said that she had told Kelly that the meeting was to be attended by about four hundred doctors who were organizing to form a national group, and that on her request, Kelly agreed to come to the meeting. (100-338892-45, pgs. 22 & 23; 61-10540-50, pg. 10, and Serial 45)

The Daily Worker for May 9, 1946, carried an article which stated that the Veterans Council of the Independent Citizens' Committee held a press conference at the Hotel Astor in New York City and that Gene Kelly, the dancer, was one of those present. The article further stated that Kelly would speak at a rally to be held by the ICCASP at Madison Square Garden, New York City, on May 16, 1946.(u) (100-338892-A)

Reliable paid active informant

advised that he had attended a meeting held at Madison Square Garden on

May 16, 1946, under the auspices of the Veterans Council of the TCCASP and
that Gene Kelly had presided at this function. The informant further advised
that Senator Claude Pepper of Florida was one of the speakers at the rally.

Reliable paid active informant

advised that Gene Kelly, the actor, was a member of the Executive Council of the Hollywood Independent Citizens' Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions. This was the Hollywood branch of the ICCASP. The informant further stated that the Hollywood branch had become the main political and propaganda pressure group of the Communist Party in California and was carrying out the Communist Party line. (100-338892-79)

It should be noted that the ICCASP is known to have been subjected to considerable infiltration by Communists and Communist sympathizers. It is known that Lionel Berman, reportedly the head of the Cultural Section of the Communist Party, participated in the formation of the ICCASP. The ICCASP in Tebruary, 1947, merged with the National Citizens' Political Action Committee and became known as the Progressive Citizens of America. (4)

American Crusade to End Lynching

The Daily Worker in its issue for September 8, 1946, announced a "national pilgrimage" to Washington, D. C., to protest a wave of lynchings in the South and to demand action against the "killings". It is said that

this pilgrimage was planned for September 23, 1946, and would be known as The American Crusade to End Lynching. The article stated that Paul Robeson had been designated as Chairman of this "Crusade." The article further listed Cene Kelly as one of the individuals supporting this movement.

It has been reported that the American Crusade to End Lynching was under the nominal sponsorship of the National Negro Congress, a well known Communist front organization, but that the American Crusade to End Lynching actually was originated by the Communist Party in New York City. (4) (100-346255-18, pg. 2)

The Baltimore Office obtained a pamphlet entitled "American Crusade to End Lynching, " which was published by the organization of the same name. The pamphlet stated that the organization's headquarters were at 1015 M Street, N. W., Washington 1, D. C., and 23 West 26th Street, New York 10, New York. The pamphlet contained the name of Gene Kelly as one of the signers of a statement set out in the pamphlot. This statement called on the American people to join in the pilgrimage to Washington, D. C., on September 23, 1946 (ul 100-135-3) 100-7060-324

Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade

The Daily Worker for September 20, 1946, listed the name of Cone Kelly among those who were sending congratulatory messages to the National Convention of the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade. This convention, it was stated, was to be held in New York City on September 21 and 22, 1946. The Daily Worker for September 21, 1946, quoted movie actor Gene Kelly's greeting to the above-mentioned convention as follows: "Please allow me to join in paying tribute to the men who fought Fascism before it was popular to do so. Let us keep insisting that their, lives be not given in vain. D. W.7/21/468-100-7060-324

The "Volunteer for Liberty," which is the official publication of the VAIB, in its issue for November, 1946, also set out the greeting sent by Gene Kelly to the above-mentioned convention. (100-7060-352, pg. 15)

Reliable paid active informant has reported that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade had arranged a theatrical program to be held on January 19, 1947, at the Belasco Theater, New York City. This program was entitled "Stars Entertain for Republican Spain." The playbill for this program listed Gene Kelly as one of the sponsors (2) (100-7060-348; -352, pg. 30)

It should be noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade consists of individuals who for the most part are either members of the Communist Party or are active Communist sympathizers. The national officers of the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade are known to be in close contact with national functionaries of the Communist Party. /U



Progressive Citizens of America

The Progressive Citizens of America was founded on December 29, 1946, at a joint national convention of the National Citizens' Political Action Committee and the Independent Citizens' Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions. It should be noted that the organization of the Progressive Citizens of America was dominated by members of the Communist. Party. The Progressive Citizens of America was originally headed by Jo Davidson, the noted sculptor, whom Louis Budenz reported to be a Communist. The policies and activities of the PCA have been supported by the Communist press.

According to the Daily Worker for December 30, 1946, Gene Kelly was nominated at the joint national convention of the NCPAC and the ICCASP for the position of Vice Chairman of the Progressive Citizens of America. (4)

(100-338892-105, pg. 21 & 22)

The "Hollywood Press Times" newspaper, Hollywood, California, on February 1, 1947, reported that the Progressive Citizens of America would hold its first public meeting at the Embassy Auditorium on the evening of February 11, 1947, with Jo Davidson, its co-Chairman, as a speaker. It was indicated that Gene Kelly would be one of those participating in the program. (4)

A letterhead of the Progressive Citizens of America dated April 17, 1947, under a column captioned "National Officers," carries the name of Gene Kelly as one of the Vice Chairmen. (U)

On May 9, 1947, the Hollywood Progressive Citizens of America, which is a branch of the National PCA, issued a statement printed in "Daily Variety," a Hollywood trade publication, protesting the investigation of alleged Communist activities and propaganda in the motion picture industry, which investigation was to be conducted by the House of Representatives Committee on Un-American Activities. This statement defended the rights of the Communist Party of the USA. In addition the statement protested any censure of the following persons, saying that such a censure would be a "gag" on free speech: Henry Wallace, William Shirer (reportedly a pro-Communist radio commentator), Paul Robeson, Norman Corwin, and Dr. Harlow Shapley. It should be noted that the last three named are known to be very active in Communist front activities. Gene Kelly's name appeared on a list of signers of the above statement. It was indicated that Kelly was a Vice Chairman of the Hollywood PCA.(4) (100-138754-155, pg. 5; Serial 150)

The Office of Naval Intelligence reported that the Young Progressive Citizens of America had initiated a two-day national youth lobby which was scheduled to be held in Washington, D. C. on June 16, 1947. The purpose of the lobby was to secure Senators and Representatives to support Federal aid in education, the 18-year old vote, increased subsistence for veterans, the

name and telephone number were in the personal effects of Julia Born Wood. It should be noted that Wood was known to be a close contact of reported Soviet espionage agents. Wood is the daughter of Julius Heiman, reported to have been the contact between the Communist Party, USA, and the Soviet Union. (cl)/1) (100-337793-8, -5)

The magazine "Salute" in its issue for November, 1946, dedicated its "Salute of the Month" to Gene Kelly. The magazine stated that it was awarding Kelly this designation for his participation in the fight for a square deal for veterans since he was discharged from the Navy. The article pointed out that Kelly had served as Chairman of both the Independent Citizens' Committee rally at Madison Square Gordon, Now York City, and the American Legion's "Operation Housing" rally. It should be noted that the magazine "Salute" has been under the control of individuals sympathetic to the Communist Party. (100-344008-11, pg. 20)

In connection with the "Operation Housing" mentioned in the "Salute" magazine, the following information was obtained from reliable active paid informant

The informant stated that the "Operation Housing" rally was sponsored by the New York County Department of the American Legion and was held at the 69th Regiment Armory in New York City. The announced purpose of this rally was to secure housing facilities for veterans. Gene Kelly was the presiding official at the rally. According to the informant, the plans for the rally were initiated by the "left wing" Duncan-Paris Post and it was reported the rally was given full support by the Veterans Commission of the Communist Party, and that because of the severe housing shortage facing the veterans, top officials of the American Legion were forced to go along with the rally. (100-3-73-103)

On November 22, 1946, an anonymbus undated letter prepared on the letterhead of Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Pictures was received by the Bureau. The writer of this letter listed Gene Kelly, the actor, as one of the individuals who was "proven Communist." No facts substantiating this allegation were given. (100-3-1649)

The 1947 Anniversary issue of the "People's Songs" publication reflected that Gene Kelly was one of the individuals who had sent greatings to "People's Songs" on that organization's first anniversary. It should be noted that the organization known as "People's Songs of California, Incorporated," is controlled by Mario Casetta, a member of the Communist Party. The organization conducts group gatherings at which time songs of a Communist nature are composed and sung on a group basis. Entertainers representing "People's Songs" perform at Communist meetings, on strike picket lines, and at gatherings of various Communist front organizations. (100-346689-5)





Reliable active but unpaid informant Louis F. Budenz was interviewed by Agents of the New York Office on July 18 and July 21, 1947, in regard to Communist infiltration of the motion picture industry. At this time the informant stated that he had heard Gene Kelly's name mentioned favorably at Communist Party headquarters. However, the informant did not know if Kelly was a member of the Communist Party. (100-138754-174)

IV. HISCELLANEOUS

was a member of the Hollywood Victory Committee. This organization was active during World War II in supplying entertainers for men in the Armed Forces. Information received concerning this organization indicates that it did not enter into propaganda activities or become dominated by any Communist sympathizers. (4) (100-171501)

The Daily Worker in its issue of September 27, 1944, lists Gene Kelly as one of the directors of the American Federation of Labor's Screen Actors Guild. (100-138754-A).

According to the 1948 issue of the INTERNATIONAL MOTION PICTURE ALMANAC, data for which is generally furnished by the various individuals themselves whose names appear therein, actor GENE KELLY was born at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, educated at Pennsylvania State University and the University of Pittsburgh. Prior to his entering on his acting career, he had been employed as a brick layer, concrete mixer, soda clerk, and dance instructor before going on the stage. Prior to becoming a motion picture actor, he appeared in stage productions in New York ("IEAVE IT TO ME", "ONE FOR THE MONEY", "THE TIME OF YOUR LIFE", and "PAL JOEY"). He appeared on the motion picture screen in 1942 in "FOR ME AND MY GAL", then "PILOT #5", and "DU BARRY WAS A LADY". In 1943—1944, he appeared in such screen productions as "THOUSANDS CHEER", "ANCHORS AWEIGH", and "ZIEGFIELD FOLLIES".

Subject is married to screen actress BETSY BLAIR who has appeared in various motion picture productions.

Activities:

The Fourth Report on Communist Front Organizations issued by the California Legislative Committee on Un-American Activities (TENNEY COMMITTEE) in 1948, refers to subject GENE KELLY as having been a member, sponsor, or otherwise active in various organizations designated by the Committee as Communist fronts or dominated groups. According to this report, KELLY has been among the audience sponsors of the Actors Lyong of Hollywood, which claims to be a non-profit corporation composed

Theater Wing and a Workshop Training Program—founded in 1941. (4)

(MCACcording to Los Angeles T-28, the Actors Lab, as it is generally called, is an organization completely dominated by individuals who are members of the Communist Party.

According to the TENNEY REPORT GENE KELLY, along with a great many other motion picture people, was one of the signers in October, 1947, of a full page advertisement in the "Hollywood Reporter", a trade publication, which advertisement was issued by the organization known as COMMITTEE FOR THE DEFENSE OF THE 1ST AMENDMENT. The immediate purpose of this group was to create favorable public opinion for the various Hollywood film personalities who had been subpoenaed in the fall of 1947 to testify before the House Committee on Un-American Activities in Washington in connection with that Committee's investigation into the Communist penetration of the motion picture industry. This advertisement states, "We are arranging for radio broadcasts and other steps to protest the conduct of the Washington hearings".

In 1947, according to the TENNEY REPORT, GENE KELLY was an officer of the Scuthern California Chapter of Progressive Citizens of America. Prior to that he had held an office in the Hollywood Democratic Committee. The report also credits KELLY with having been National Chatrman of the Young Progressive Citizens of America in 1947, which had been set up by P. C. A. as a sort of junior subsidiary organization.

Contact has been had with available Los Angeles confidential informants considered to be in the best position to furnish information regarding Communist Party membership matters in this area over a period of the past seven or eight years (Specifically Los Angeles T-3, T-4, T-5, T-6, T-7, T-8, and T-9 have been contacted but none was able furnish information to indicate that subject GENE KELLY is or had actually a member of the local Communist Party, at least under he correct name.

Los Angeles T-5 advised that GENE and BETSY KELLY we apparently considered as possible recruit material for the Comparty in 1944. According to this source's information, it was dicated that the KELLYS had been suggested as potential recruit this informant had no information to indicate that they had expoined the Communist Party or to what extent the Party had according to them.

In July, 1942, Los Angeles T-29 reported that HERBERT RIBERTAN had thought up an idea of getting certain people to back full page advertisements in trade papers demanding the opening of a second front in Europe BIBERMAN by way of identification has been identified by Los Angeles T-5 as a Communist Party member for many years. He is a motion picture writer and director who later became one of the so-called "Hollywood 10", cited for Contempt as result of his refusal to answer questions of the House Committee on Un-American Activities in the fall of 1947.

With respect to BIBERMAN's idea of working up sentiment for a second front in Europe, CNDI LA 100 learned that his plan called for getting people to support the full page advertisements whose names carried weight and who could be depended upon for donations. Informant quoted BIBERMAN in discussing the matter as saying, "The time has come to run ads, send telegrams, letters, and so forth, demanding a second front".

BIBERMAN wanted these advertisements to be put out every day or so. According to the informant the plan never did work out successfully. BIBERMAN told informant that a number of motion picture people did contribute, but that they also objected to having their names appear on an advertisement with labor groups.

A partial list of the subscribers to the second front advertisement included a great many motion picture people of whom GENE KELLY of METRO-GOLDWYN-MAYER was one. KELLY's name was one of about six or seven people who, according to BIBERMAN, would be the ones to appear as sponsoring the ad as "Representatives of the Movie Industry".

This plan to list only a few names was the result of the failure to obtain a list of representative names from downtown Los Angeles and labor unions as a whole. The ones chosen were well known public figures such as, in addition to GENE KELLY, motion picture stars VIRGINIA BRUCE, ALAN LADD, JOHN GARFIELD, and writer ERSKINE CALDWELL.

According to the February, 1944 issue of the publication "Target for Today", the official bulletin of the Hollywood Democratic Committee, a pageant sponsored by United Citizens Committee was to be staged at the Shrine Auditorium on February 4, 1944.

The pageant included a political skit produced by Holly- wood Democratic Committee and written by writer BEN HECHT. The title of this skit was "The Common Man", and was to be put on at the rally for Vice President HENRY WALLACE who was the main speaker at the rally.

Los Angeles T-10 was active in connection with the rehearsals of the skit and furnished considerable information regarding the identities of the individuals who actually had charge of preparing it. According to this informant, the stage director was DAVE HEILWEL and the writer was BEN HECHT as already stated. In charge of artists was RALPH EXITH. EVERETT WEIL was the stage assistant and the orchestration was handled by MISCHA LIMAN. Informant advised that GENE KELLY was also active in the production. GEORGE PEPPER of the Hollywood Democratic Committee seemed to the informant to be "the power behind the throne" in connection with the rehearsals, and PEPPER watched, all rehearsals closely and told the informant that his, PEPPER's, job was to see that there were "no political mistakes made in the script".

Of the above individuals, it may be noted that RALPH SMITH has been identified as a Communist Party member by Los Angeles T-4 While MISCHA ALTMAN and GEORGE PEPPER were both known to Los Angeles T-5 as members of the Communist Party in Hollywood during the period 1944 1945.

The "People's World" for May 22, 1944, advertised a symposium entitled "CULTURE LND DEMOCRACY" which would be held at the Hollywood Women's Club on May 24, 1944. Speakers were to be screen writer DALTON TRUMBO, actress LENY, HORNE, actor GENE KELLY, writer GEORGE ANTHEIL, and Dr. WALTER RUBSAMEN.

Los Angeles T-5 identified screen writer DALTON TRUMBO as a member of the Communist Party's cultural groups in Hollywood during this period.(4)

In June, 1944, information was received from LosAngeles T-11 that WILLIAM (BILL) YOUNG, Communist Farty functionary of the so-called Bay City Club, 16th Congressional District Section, had told the informant that he, YOUNG, had an appointment to see GENE KELLY, the movie star, in regard to getting financial support for the new Communist book store to be opened in Santa Monica, California. KELLY was characterized by YOUNG as a very favorable person.

In the summer of 1944, the American Youth for Democracy at Los Angeles was active in organizing a "Young Voters for Roosevelt Committee". Los Angeles T-30 advised that ELAINE ROSE, American Youth for Democracy functionary, had told the informant that A.Y.D. already had on the committee for the new group HOWARD FAST, OLIVIA DEHAVILAND, CANADA LEE, NORMAN CORWIN and GENE KELLY. The idea for the new committee had, according to ROSE, originated with FAST, LEE, and CORWIN, who had requested American Youth for Democracy to undertake its organization inasmuch as it was a national organization.



By way of identification, HOWARD FAST is the well known writer who was cited for contempt by the House Committee on Un-American activities in 1947 for refusal to answer questions regarding the organization known as the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

OLIVIA DeHAVILAND is a Hollywood motion picture actress and NORMAN CORWIN is a well known radio writer. CANADA LEE is a Negro motion picture actor.

In connection with American Youth for Democracy's efforts in behalf of the new committee, Los Angeles T-31 reported that MEYER FREIDEN, head of the American Youth for Democracy in Los Angeles, had called on screen writer JOHN HOWARD LAWSON for help in getting/various Hollywood people to lend their names for the committee.

Los angeles T-31 further advised in June, 1944 that AYD expected to get financial contributions from Hollywood actors JOHN GARFIELD, PAUL HENREID, and GENE KELLY, that efforts were also being made to contact CHARLES CHAPLIN, ORSON VELLES, JAMES CAGNEY, and DANNY KAYE, all Hollywood screen personalities, for contributions. Informant advised that AMERICAN YOUTH FOR DEMOCRACY was badly in need of funds, at that time being about \$650 in debt.

According to Los Angeles T-32 the HOLLYWOOD DEMOCRATIC COMMITTEE (H.D.C.) held a meeting on July 26, 1944 at the Hollywood Women's Club to hear a report on what took place at the National Democratic Convention on that year and also to receive the results of the balloting for H.D.C. officers and Board of Directors.

The H.D.C. election ballots had been previously issued and the results were announced by screen actor REX INGRAM. INGRAM, it may be noted, has been identified as a Communist Party member in Hollywood by Los Angeles T-5.

As result of the balloting, GENE KELLY was elected Vice Chairman of H.D.C. as well as a member of an Executive Board of 87 individuals. Among the board members so elected, who have been identified by Los Angeles, T.-5 as Communist Party members, were HENRY BLANKFORT, writer; SIDNEY BUCHMAN, producer, NORVAL CRUTCHER, labor organizer; EDWARD DMYTRYK, director; LOUIS HARRIS, writer; REX INGRAM, actor; JOHN HOWARD LAWSON, writer; ROBERT MOSSEN, writer-director; and FRANK TUTTLE, director.





The "Los Angeles Daily News" for August 26, 1944, carried GENE KELLY'S photograph as one of "The large group of picture personalities and entertainers who will appear at the Democratic fund raising garden party sponsored by the Beverly-Yestwood Democratic Committee".

It may be noted that the Beverly-Westwood Democratic Committee, according to Los angeles T-ll was later called the Beverly-Westwood Citizens Committee and still later became a chapter of the Progressive Citizens of America in 1947. According to this informant, the Beverly-Westwood Citizens Committee was heavily infiltrated by Communist Party members

In September, 1944, NEYER FREIDEN of the American Youth for Democracy, was working on an American Youth for Democracy activity called "Young American's for Roosevelt". According to Los Angeles T-30, FREIDEN conferred with screen writer HENRY BLANKFORT in regard to the matter. FREIDEN wanted someone who could get to the stars in Hollywood. He wanted some screen star to release an article entitled "WHY I AM FOR ROOSEVELT".

BLANKFORT told FREIDEN he would get in touch with GEORGE PEPPER at the Hollywood Democratic Committee with reference to getting the desired stars. BLANKFORT later told FREIDEN he thought he could get GENE KELLY as Chairman for "Young American's for Roosevelt".

In regard to the above article on "VHY I AM FOR RCOSEVELT", or "WHY YOUTH SHOULD VOTE FOR F.D.R.", informant stated there was some indication that GEORGE PEPPER of H.D.C. had agreed to have some Hollywood writer draft the article, and would get some well-known person to sign it.

BLANKFORT and PEPPER have already been identified as Communist Party members of that period. $\cline{}$

In October, 1944, Los Angeles T-30 reported that he had overheard someone at AYD Headquarters remark that GENE KELLY was going to be drafted into the Armed Service. The same information was furnished at about this same time by Los Angeles T-33, who advised that it was his understanding that GENE KELLY had been called up in the draft.

A letterhead of the Beverly Westwood Democratic Committee (BWDC), heretofore mentioned, which was furnished Los Angeles (T-3/) reflects that CENE KLLLY was a member of the Executive Board of this organization.

The particular letter in question was one put out by the Committee in 1945 containing suggestions on "How to keep active".

One such suggestion revealed by the letter was to "Wire Congressman ELLIS E. PATTELSON in "ashington to see that all California Congressmen joined the non-partisan committee now being formed to call on President ROOSEVELT to propose dismissal of charges against HARRY BRIDGES".

An article in "Political Reporter" of January 20, 1945, which was a news sheet published monthly by the Beverly Westwood Democratic Committee, noted that a new BWDC Executive Board rule had established a special category for board members called to the Armed Services. This ruling permitted the retention of GENE KELLY's name on the board as an inactive member, according to this article.

Charter Members of the organization called National Citizens Political Action Committee (NCPAC) according to a circular put out by this organization in September, 1945. It may be noted that NCPAC was one of several organizations which merged to form the Progressive Citizens of America (PCA) in December, 1946, as referred to subsequently hereafter.

Information received from Los Angeles T-12 and T-13 of the New York Office, advised that the NATIONAL AMERICAN YOUTH FOR DEMOCRACY held its second "Salute To Young America" dinner at the Roosevelt Hotel, New York, on December 12, 1945. The attendance was about 725 and the purpose of the rally was to "Welcome Home Joe", that is, the returning Service Veterans on occasion of AYD's second anniversary. An added purpose for the dinner was to "dramatize post-war problems of youth" A number of awards were given out during the dinner and among the presenting the awards were GENE KELLY and DANNY KAYE, Hollywood sactors.

The national organization called INDERENDENT CITIZENS COMMITTEE OF ARTS, SCIENCES, AND PROFESSIONS (ICCASP) was formed in New York in December of 1944 as a non-partisan organization of artistic scientists, and professionsals for the purpose of supporting the economic and social policies of FRANKLIN DELANC RCOSEVELT.

At the annual of ICCASP held in New York on Februar, the officers and Board of Directors of the organization were expected that as a result of this election, GA MELLY became a member of the Board of Directors of ICCASP.

Informant reports that GEORGE PEPPER, already mentioned and identified heretofore, was elected to a committee of nine to "re-draft the by-laws and Constitution to meet the new needs consequent upon our rapid organizational expansion".

A circular issued by ICCASP in May, 1946, announced that this organization would sponsor a "Call for Action" on jobs, housing, price control, peace, and discrimination. This rally was to be held at Madison Square Gardens in New York on May 16, 1946, and according to the circular, the speakers would be Senator CLAUDE DEAPEPPER, GENE KELLY, FRANK SINATRA, OLIVA DEHAVILIAND, MARION HARGROVE, and FRANKLIN D. RCOSEVELT, JR.

According to Los Angeles T-32 GENE KELLY was also added to the Executive Council of the Hollywood Chapter of ICCASP at Los Angeles in 1946.

In August, 1946, Los Angeles T-31 reported that screen writers DALTON TRUMBO and JOHN HOWARD LAWSON of the Hollywood ICCASP conferred regarding suggested names for the nominating committee meeting which was to be held on August 9, 1946. TRUMBO suggested ROBERT KENNY, ANNEXEVERE, GENE KELLY, and NORVAL CRUTCHER.

By way of identification, RCBERT KENNY was the former Attorney General of the State of California, former State Legislator, and an officer in ICCASP. More recently KENNY has been the chief defense counsel for the so-called "Hollywood 10" film writers cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities for Contempt.

ANNE REVERE is a Hollywood screen actress who has been identified by Los angeles T-jas a member of the Communist Party's cultural groups in Hollywood.

NORVAL CRUTCHER in the past has been a labor union organizer in Hollywood and also a Communist Party member according to Los Angeles T-5

DALTON TRUMBO and JOHN HOWARD LAWSON are both motion picture writers, members of the "Hollywood 10", and also Communist Party members according to Los Angeles T-5.16.14)

In 1946 the Hollywood motion picture industry was torn by a motion picture strike situation which flared at intervals over a period of about two years and involved considerable violence and the necessity for police action.

During the motion picture strike situation in October, 1946, Los Angeles T-35 reported that LOUISE TOCEY, a member of the Strike Strategy Committee, had told informant that they were getting up a delegation to protest alleged police brutality and that this committee was to consist of Mrs. GENE KELLY, Mrs. ALEXANDER KNOX, who is the wife of screen actor ALEXANDER KNOX; and Mrs. JOHN GARFIELD, wife of the actor. It appeared also that actor HOWARD Da SILVA was also working on the matter.

By way of identification, LOUISE LCCEY is the wife of JOE LOCEY, motion picture director. Both the LOCEYS are strongly suspected by Los Angeles T-April being members of the Communist Party's cultural groups, although this informant does not have positive information as to their Party membership.

Actor HOWARD Da SILVA, however, has been identified by Los Angeles T-5 as a member of the Communist Party who came to Hollywood from New York a few years ago. (4)

In October, 1946, a rally at the Olympic Auditorium in Los Angeles was sponsored jointly by the Hollywood ICCASP, the Los Angeles CIO Political Action Committee, the National Citizens Political Action Committee, and several other organizations. This rally was to hear HENRY WALLACE speak at the auditorium on October 24, 1946. Circulars put out to advertise the affair called attention to the fact that motion picture actor EDWARD G. ROBINSON would be present as Chairman and that an added attraction would be GENE KELLY and other Hollywood stars in a presentation called "Living Newspaper".

Information was furnished by CNDI LA RD-28 in December, 1946 that the organization known as AMERICAN RUSSIAN INSTITUTE (ARI) was sponsoring the showing of a Russian film entitled TURNING POINT" which had been obtained by ARTKINO, an agency in the United States for the distribution of Russian made films. (According to informant, ARI was trying to get a number of Hollywood film figures to attend the West Coar premiere of the film showing (A)

Screen writer ALVAHASESSIE was working with ARI in this effort and he suggested that they contact such people as GENE KELLY, EDWARD G. RCBINSON, DORE SCHARY, ADRIAN SCOTT, GREGORY PECK, ANNE REVERE, ALBERT WALTZ, EDWARD DMYTRYK, and ROBERT ROSSEN. It may be noted that of the above individuals, BESSIE, DMYTRYK, ROSSEN, SCC TT, REVERE, and MALTZ were all members of the Communist Party in Hollywood, according to Los Angeles T-5.

Los Angeles T-36 reported that SHIRLEY KOPLOY of the ARI Office felt that the premiere of the picture would stand much more chance of success if various motion picture people attended it, and considerable time was spent in working out this matter:

On December 29, 1946, the organizations heretofore identified as ICCASP and NCPAC, held a joint convention in New York City in which it was decided to merge these two organizations and form the PRCCRESSIVE CITIZENS OF AMERICA (PCA).

Confidential informant Los Angeles T-15 of the New York Office furnished considerable information concerning this merger and the origin of PCA.

The "Daily Worker", Communist news organ for the East Coast on December 30, 1946, announced the officers of the newly formed PCA. GENE KELLY from ICCASP was listed as having been elected one of the Vice Chairmen of PCA.

In February, 1947, Los Angeles T-16, whose reliability and accuracy are not known, volunteered the information that on February 10, 1947, she was present at the home of Mrs. MILTON SPERLING, wife of the motion picture producer at 667 Ledo Way, Beverly Hills, where a party for about fifty motion picture people was taking place. Informant said that the invitations read "Communist Rally", and informant was of the opinion that most of those who were present were either members of the Communist Party or Communist sympathizers. She recalled that actor GENE KELLY was among those present; however, informant had no evidence other than her suspicions that these people were Communists or Communist sympathizers.

A benefit to raise money for the strikers during the Holly-wood motion picture strike situation, mentioned previously, was held at the Philharmonic Auditorium, Los Angeles, on February 6, 1947 Los Angeles T-32 described a number of those entertainers appearing or sponsoring the benefit as being suspected Communist Party members or sympathizers.

Special Agent JAMES G. FINDLAY, who attended the benefit, reported that the program consisted of songs, dances, dialogue, jokes, and skits of various sorts. Interspersed in the program were several strike scenes where the police were shown beating up strikers. In the





skits the police, usually several in number, would arrive on the scene and charge the pickets with conspiracy and proceed to "beat up the pickets". At no time would the pickets resist but meekly submitted to the pretended beatings.

Among the entertainers appearing or sponsoring the benefit the following were identified: ABE BURROWS, radio writer - actor; actor HOWARD Da SILVA; and actor STANLEY PRAGER, all of whom have been identified by Los Angeles To 3 as members of the Communist Party in Hollywood. GENE KELLY was also present among the motion picture figures who took part in the benefit.

Los Angeles T-32 reported that about \$6,000 was raised at the benefit for the motion picture strikers.

In further connection with the Hollywood strike situation, on February 2, 1947, a mass meeting of the CONFERENCE OF STUDIO UNIONS, (CSU) which largely made up the striking elements, was held at the Legion Stadium in Hollywood. According to Los Angeles T-37, leaflets were distributed in advance of this mass meeting, advertising an "All Star Hollywood Welfare Show" at the Philharmonic Auditorium on February 6, 1947. This was the benefit for the strikers already mentioned. Listed in the leaflet as scheduled to participate in the benefit at the Philharmonic were GENE KELLY, HOLARD Da SILVA, JOHN GARFIELD, ABE BURKOWS, and about twenty others.

The organization known as the TOINT ANTI-FASCIST REFUGEE COMMITTEE (MATRIC) was particularly active in the Los Angeles area during 1946 and 1947. This organization has since been designated by the Attorney General of the United States as coming withing the purview of Executive Order 9835, as a Communist organization.

The first major meeting of JAFRC in 1947 at Los Angeles was one for the purpose of raising funds in the form of a dinner at the Biltmore Hotel on February 21, 1947. According to Los Angeles T-38, O. JOHN RCGGE, former Special Assistant to the Attorney General was scheduled to speak at the Biltmore meeting. ROGGE did not arrive in Los Angeles in time, however, but he forwarded his speech which, according to informant, was to be read at the dinner by GENE KELLY. As it turned out, however, KELLY himself was sick and unable to appear and RCGGE's speech was eventually read at the dinner by Mrs. GENE KELLY.

PCA at a rally at the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles, March 28, 1947, reflected that GENE KELLY was a Vice Chairman of the National PCA Organization. These pamphlets contain an article by HENRY A. WALLACE entitled "Must we have a century of fear?" and consisted of an attack upon the United States policy of affording material help to Greece and Turkey.

Youth for Democracy was planning a function at the Fremont School in Los Angeles. Informant advised that VICKINIANDISH, AYD functionary, was one of those responsible for making arrangements for the function and she conferred with screen writer HENRY BLANKFORT regarding some Hollywood people who might appear at the function as speakers.

Informant advised that LANDISH had already sent telegrams in this regard to JOHN GARFIELD, GENE KELLY, and GREGORY PECK, but had not heard from them up to that time. Informant subsequently advised, however, that the Fremont School meeting did not materialize and AYD finally called it off because of adverse publicity in the press. In-1 formant did not know whether GENE KELLY had ever actually accepted the speakers invitation for the affair.

ACTORS GUILD, was discussing with Special Agent FRED G. DUPUIS and RICHARD AUERBACH the extent of Communist infiltration into the SCREEN ACTORS GUILD. Informant commented that two cliques or groups had developed within the GUILD, one headed by ANNE REVERE and the other by actress KARENTAORLEY, both of which groups, in informant's opinion, followed the Communist Party line on all matters of GUILD policy. Whenever a case arose to appoint a committee or to fill a vacancy in one of the offices, both of these groups seemed to support or nominate the same individual. Both MORELY and REVERE appeared to informant to be merely repeating someone else's orders in their maneuvers within the GUILD.

Informant pointed out, for instance, that both MORELY and REVERE wanted to put the SCREEN ACTORS GUILD on record as sympathizing with the side of the strikers in the motion picture strike situation of that period. Informant indicated that actor GENE KELLY always seemed to support the REVERE group in these matters. It may be noted that Los Angeles T-5 has identified both ANNE REVERE and KAREN MORELY as members of the Communist Party's Hollywood Section.

Los Angeles T-28, who was in close touch with the CSU strike situation during 1946 and 1947, has identified it as Communist supported and Communist led throughout.

Los angeles T-9, a meeting was held on February 11, 1947 at the Embassy Auditorium in Los Angeles, the purpose of which was to "form a Southern California Chapter of Progressive Citizens of America" (PCA). Speakers were to be 10,004VIDSON, National Co-Chairman of PCA, RCBERT KENNY; Dr. LINUS PAULING of California Institute of Technology; GENE KELLY, Hollywood actor; and BARTLEY CRUM, Chairman.

The Third Report of the Joint Fact-Finding Committee investigating un-American Activities in California, contains a report on the original PCA meeting wherein it is reflected that EDWARD COSK, Chairman for the evening, introduced GENE KELLY who delivered a short harangue on the reasons why people should join PCA. KELLY thereafter presented EDWARD COSK and JOHN CROWELL with a scroll in appreciation of the work they had accomplished for their respective organizations, NCPAC and the Hollywood ICCASP, both of which were then merging into PCA.

On May 8, 1947, the "California Sentinel", local Negro newspaper, published a list of 100 persons which purported to be the official list of officers and directors of the newly formed PCA. Actor GENE KELLY was listed as a board member as well as a vice chairman.

The California Eagle, a Negro newspaper in Los Angeles, in its issue of May 15, 1947, reported that six hundred prominent Los Angeles citizens had sent joint telegrams to California Senators in Washington urging them to "vote against taking America along the Fascist path", by opposing the TAFT - HARTLEY Labor Bill in Congress. GENE KELLY was listed as one such signer along with screen actor HOWARD Da SILVA, screen writer RINGALARDNER JR., actress KAREN JORELY, film director JOHN CROMWELL, and writer HOWARD KOCH.

According to information furnished by Los Angeles T-18 in December, 1946, when PCA was formed by a merger of ICCASP, and NCPAC in New York, PCA also set up Young Progressive Citizens of America (YPCA) which began recruiting large numbers of students in colleges and universities throughout the country. As of May, 1947, YPCA was reported to have some 40 chapters. GENE KELLY was Honorary Chairman of the newly formed YPCA.

In the "Hollywood Citizens News" for September 6, 1947, there was an account of a JOINT ANTI-FASCIST REFUGEE CO-THITTEE meeting held at the Shrine Auditorium in Los Angeles on September 5, 1947. PAUL

ROBESON was the featured speaker at the rally. It was announced that a reception honoring ROBESON would be held on the evening of September 6, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. JULIAN STEROTY in Beverly Hills. The announcement of the reception listed Mr. and Mrs. GENE KELLY on the Sponsoring Committee among a long list of Hollywood personalities

A mass meeting sponsored by PCA was held at the South Gate Arena, South Gate California, in October, 1947. According to a circular put out by that organization, among the featured speakers at the rally were GENE KELLY, actress KAREN MORELY, and EARLY HOBINSON from Hollywood. It is noted that KAREN MORELY has already been identified heretofore as a a Communist Party member and Los Angeles T-5 has also furnished reliable information that EARL ROBINSON was a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood during 1944 and 1945.

In September, 1947, nineteen Hollywood motion picture writers, actors, and directors, were served with subpoenaes issued by the House Un-American Activities in Washington in connection with the investigation by the Committee to the extent of Communist penetration into the motion picture industry. A number of organizations in the Los Angeles area as well as elsewhere began to be active in defense of the subpoenaed witnesses in an effort to work up popular support in their behalf and against the inquiry by the Congressional Committee.

Information furnished by Los Angeles T-17 and T-20 instance revealed that a representative of the PCA organization in Washington D.C. suggested organizing a super mass meeting in Washington about the time of the so-called Hollywood hearings before the House Committee which wer'e scheduled to start on October 20, 1947. It was suggested that CHARLES CHAPLIN and other Hollywood célebrities be invited to rally around and that such people as CHARLES CHARLIN and GEME KILLY could make a special appearance at the rally and make a colossal thing out of it. Lox

Meanwhile in Hollywood, screen writer TALDO SALT and GEORGE PEPPER of the ARTS, SCIENCES, AND PROFESSIONS COUNCIL, division of the PCA, held a number of meetings and discussions in regard to the House Committee hearings. PEPPER has already been identified as a Communist Party member, while SALT has likewise been identified by Los Angeles (I-5) as an active Communist Party member in Hollywood during 1944 - 1945.

According to Los Angeles T-41, PEPPER in particular was active in rallying available sources in defense of the subpoena, d personalities. Informant advised that PEPPER had arranged for a preliminary meeting and discussion on October 2, 1947, at the Mome of screen actor EDNALD G. ROBINSON, and PEPPER had already contacted GENE KELLY. CHARLES CH. PLIN, and KA THERINE NEPBULN and thought it possible that they all might attend.

In working up popular support for the "Unfriendly 19", as the subpoenaed witnesses were subsequently known, the ARTS, SCIENCES, AND PROFESSIONS division of PCA was particularly active, according to Los Angeles T-41.

This informant reported on October 6, 1947 that W.LDO SALT was scheduled to attend an executive meeting on the following day at GENE KELLY'S place, 725 North Rodeo Drive in Beverly Hills. Informant indicated that KELLY was probably on the Executive Board of the ASP division of PCA at that time.

Informant subsequently furnished information that HERBERT BIBERMAN also attended a meeting at GENE KELLY's home on October 9, 1947, at which some discussion was had regarding various activities in behalf of the subpcensed witnesses. Apparently it was desired, if possible, to arrange for a mass meeting in Chicago for the "Unfriendly 19" on their way to Washington. However, it appeared that the Chicago mass meeting could not be worked up in time for lack of a suitable place to hold it. However, Chicago had advised that a reception of from five to six hundred important people would be held for the "Unfriendly 19" and that they would try to make a big event of it.

At Los Angeles, prior to the departure of the "Unfriendly 19" for Washington, plans were made by PCA to hold a gigantic rally at the Shrine Auditorium. From information furnished by Los Angeles T-41 and T-31, plans for this rally were the subject of discussion between GEORGE PEPPER, JOHN HOWALD LAWSON, and others. PEPPER announced that GENE KELLY would chair the big rally at the Shrine Auditorium and that in addition to KELLY, speakers would be radio writer NORMAN CORKIN and screen actress MARSHAHUNT.

On October 15, 1947, the testimonial rally for the "Unfriendly 19" was held at the Shrine Auditorium just prior to their leaving for Washington, Circulars put out by PCA who sponsored the rally announced that the purposes of the rally were:

- 1. To honor the screen personalities subpoensed by the House Un-American Activities Committee.
 - 2. Defend the film industry,
 - 3. Abolish the Un-American Activities Committee.

Special Agents LESLIE WARREN and ELMETT McGAUGHEY, who attended the rally, identified GENE KELLY as Chairman of the meeting. He also served as Master of Ceremonies. KELLY, in introducing actor LARRY RARKS, one of the subpoenaed witnesses, placed considerable emphasis on the fact that out of thousands of members of the SCREEN ACTORS GUILD, only one actor had been subpoenaed, and after emphasizing this statement again, KELLY asked the audience why. "Can it be", he said, "that they feel he is afraid or can be intimidated because he is on the threshold of his career; if so, I believe they are in for a surprise, and you will agree with me after listening to LARRY PARKS".

It may be noted that Los Angeles T-5 has identified both LARKY PARKS and his actress wife BETTY GARLETT as members of the Communist Party in Hollywood.

The "Los Angeles Examiner" on October 25, 1947, featured an article which gave an account of a group of Hollywood actors who would fly to Washington by way of chartered plane on October 26, 1947, among whom were HUNPHREY BOGALT and his wife LAUREN BACALL, film director JOHN HUSTON, actress EVELYN KEYES, actress AVA GARDNER, actor GENE KELLY, and others.

The article quoted HUNPLIKEY EXCLART as saying in connection with the purpose of this trip, "We are against Communism but we feel the present investigation is a screen to obtain consorship in motion pictures and in newspapers".

The Philadelphia Office reported that on November 3, 1947, after the hearings by the House Un-American Activities Committee, actor HUMPHREY BOGART and party of about twenty-five, made a temporary stop at the Philadelphia Airport en route back to Hollywood. BOGART's group called themselves "The Committee for the Defense of the 1st Amendment".

Los angeles T-21 advised that BOGART had previously notified the INTERNATIONAL WOLKERS OLDER contacts in Philadelphia of the plane's arrival there and his desire for an opportunity to explain what he and his party were striving for on the plane's arrival at Philadelphia.

A local radio station interviewed a number of the "Committee" including BOGART, Lauren BACALL, GENE KELLY, DANNY KAYE, and others. KELLY during his interview was quoted as stating, "Like another song and dance man, a much greater song and dance man years ago said, 'I worder what all the shootin's fer'. As Mr. KAYE has remarked, it's prett, hard



to find any propaganda in pictures, mainly because the motion picture industry is such a large one and the needs to make pictures which . are box office successes. You can't make a picture for entertainment that the American public will accept and inject propaganda into it. So far I think we are pretty safe". (A)

(In November, 1947, Los Angeles T-22 advised that the Wilshire Fairfax Chapter of PCA had mailed out invitations to attend a meeting to hear (by transcription) GENE KELLY, JUDY CARLAND, LAUREN BACALL, HUMPHREY BOGART, ANNE REVERE, and MARSHA HUNT, and others denounce the threats to our fundamental rights. The title of this program was "Hollywood Fights Back". This meeting apparently was part of the activity by PCA to work up popular support in defense of the "Hollywood 10", the film writers and directors, who as result of the "ashington hearings and their refusal to answer Committee questions, had been cited for Contempt.

In March, 1948, Los Angeles T-43 reported that the AMERICAN RUSSIAN INSTITUTE (ARL) at Los Angeles was planning a reception to be held the following month for ANNA LOUISE STRONG. STRONG was to be in Los Angeles to speak on "World Peace and the Russians". Informant said that ARI was trying to obtain someone's home for the reception and that among those considered to be contacted for the purpose were radio writer SANNIORE, and screen actor GENE KELLY. It was subsequently learned, however, that the reception was held at the KELLY residence.

North Rodeo Drive, Beverly Hills, was one of a long list of names of individuals maintained by the PEOPLE'S EDUCATIONAL CENTER at Los Angeles under the caption "Theater School Sponsors List".

Informant noted that among others on the list were JOHN HO ARD LAWSON, GORDON KAHN, GUY ENDORE, EDWARD DAY RYK, MICHARD COLLINS, LESTER COLE, HUGO BUTTER, HERBERT BIBERIAN, and ALVAH BESSIE. All of these individuals are writers or directors in the motion picture industry and all have been identified by Los Angeles T-5 as having been affiliated with the Communist Party in Hellywood. LAWSON, DMYTRYK, COLLINS, COLE, BIBERMAN, and BESSIE are among the so-called "Hollywood 10". 11)

KELLY'S name was among a large number of names of Hollywood personalities recorded at AYD Headquarters in Los angeles, including a number of people apparently considered by AYD as contacts, sponsors, or sustainers. Informant was unable to learn specifically in which category KELLY was considered to be

furnished the information that Dr. HOLLAND ROBERTS of the AMERICAN RUSSIAN INSTITUTE in San Francisco was scheduled to be in Los Angeles area in September of that year and the Los Angeles Chapter of AMERICAN RUSSIAN INSTITUTE was working up a schedule for him while he was here. An ARI representative told the informant she intended to take Dr. ROBERTS out to see GENE KELLY and that afterward they were going to have lunch with JOHN HOLARD LANSON, the motion picture film writer. Informant indicat that it was the ARI representative and Dr. ROBERTS who were to limit JOHN HOLARD LANSON, and that this did not necessarily is GENE KELLY.

In September, 1948, Los Angeles T-41 learne wife of screen writer WALDO SALT, intended to attend so or other function at the home of GENE KELLY, 725 North Beverly Hills, on September 13, 1948. Both MARY SALT

WALDO SALT, have been identified by Los Angeles T-5 as Communist Party members in Hollywood.

MARY SALT has been connected with the Actors Laboratory in Hollywood while her husband, in addition to being active in the Communist Party, has been one of the main stays in the ARTS, SCIENCES, AND PROFESSIONS COUNCIL in Hollywood.

In the latter part of September, 1948, the local office of the AMERICAN RUSSIAN INSTITUTE was planning for the visit to Los Angeles of the Rev. HEWLITT JOHNSON, the Dean of Canterbury, from England, whose scheduled visit to Los Angeles on December 9, 1948, was sponsored by ARI Maccording to Los Angeles T-43, ARI was at that particular time somewhat short of funds and REVAN JUCHA of the ARI Office had consulted with Mrs. GENE KELLY in regard to the matter. According to informant, Mrs. KELLY told MUCHA that she would contribute something and would also try to raise \$100 or so from her friends

In early October, 1948, Los Angeles T-24 advised that GENE KELLY had indicated he was trying to raise a little money for the candidacy of HENRY A. WALLACE and the Third Party Ticket; that he was doing this "off the record" in such a way that no "pitch" for funds would be necessary. It was KELLY's idea that he would get about twenty people to contribute \$100 each at a comparitively small affair to be held at his, KELLY's home, although not on an officially political basis.

According to informant, EDWARD G. ROBINSON, the well-known screen actor, had let it be known that he could be counted in on the KELLY party.

In 1948, GORDON KAHN, the Hollywood screen writer and one of the "Unfriendly 19" witnesses subpoensed before the House Un-American Activities hearings in Washington in the fall of 1947, authored a book called MHOLLYWOOD ON TRIAL", which purported to be "The story of the ten who were indicted". It may be noted that in addition to being a Hollywood screen writer, KAHN has also been a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood, according to Los Angeles T-5. The last ten pages or so of KAHN'S book quotes statements contributed by various individuals, one of whom was GENE KELLY, who said, "The House Un-American Activities". Committee has called on the carpet some of the people who have been making your favorite movies. Did you happen to see 'THE BEST YEARS OF OUR LIVES', the picture that won seven academy awards? Did you like it?

Were you subverted by it? Did it make you un-American? Did you come out of the movie with the desire to over-throw the Government?"

According to information furnished by Los Angeles T-32 Act an organization called Hollywood Motion Picture Film Council was set up during 1948 after the House Un-American Activities Committee hearings in Washington, the purpose of which was to create better public relations for the Hollywood motion picture industry. The council was made up of various individuals and executives representing the producers, writers, directors, and unions. Mr. DORE SCHARY of METRO-GOLDWYN-MAYER was the original Chairman of the council. Informant reports that at a meeting of the organization on January 25, 1949, the entire meeting was given over to the subject on Communism in Hollywood. SCHARY presented the question at some length stating that FRANK FAY, stage actor and member of ACTORS EQUITY in New York, had attacked Communism in the motion picture industry at a recent public meeting in Boston and at which FAY had specifically named actors GENE KELLY and FRANK SINATRA as being Communists or Communist fellow travellers.

In commenting on FAY's remarks, SCHARY characterized FAY as a drunken bum, a crack-pot, and so forth, and SHARY told the Council that all such things are hurting the industry, and that the Council should come to the defense of KELLY and SINATRA. Others present at the Council meeting took issue with SCHARY, one important motion picture studio executive saying, that everyone knew that Hollywood was badly infiltrated with Communism and that it did not make any difference whether certain persons were actual members of the Communist Party or not—one was just as dangerous and subversive as the other and should be cleaned out of the industry. This executive said he was opposed to the Council's defending them as SCHARY had suggested. Informants report that others at the meeting likewise opposed SCHARY's suggestion and no action was taken on it.

In February, 1949, Los Angeles T-25 learned that BETSY KELLY, wife of GENE KELLY, was scheduled to attend some sort of meeting or function at the home of PAUL JARRICO on February 7. Informant was not present at the meeting itself, however, and had no information as to the nature of it.

PAUL JARRICO, by way of identification, is a Hollywood writer within the film industry who is very active in the ARTS, SCIENCES, AND PROFESSIONS COUNCIL, and according to Los Angeles T-5, was a member of the cultural groups of the Communist Party in Hollywood in 1945.

Los Angeles T-25 also reported in February, 1949, that ALBERT MALTZ, one of the "Hollywood 10", had drafted a letter in behalf of "the 10" which was to be sent out to various people seeking funds with which to finance the appeal of the conviction of "the 10" for contempt of Congress. Certain people were suggested by the ASP Council in Hollywood, in which AIBERT MALTZ and "the 10" are active, who it was believed should receive the MALTZ letter appeal for funds. These suggested names were GENE KEILY, PAUL HENREID, JOHN GARFIELD, and others.

In each case it was suggested that the salutation of the letter be set out as "Dear GENE", "Dear PAUL", "Dear JOHN", and so forth.

In April, 1949, a farewell dinner for PHILIP MACONNELLY of the C.I.O. by the LOS ANGELES INDUSTRIAL UNION COUNCIL was held. CONNELLY, it may be noted, has been identified by Los Angeles T-26 as an important Communist Party member within the labor circles for a number of years. CONNELLY had been ousted from his post as Secretary of the Los Angeles Industrial Union Council which he had held for ten years. For this farewell dinner, it was desired to obtain the attendance of representatives from Hollywood and the ASP Council in Hollywood furnished the names of suggested Hollywood people to the CIO representative handling the arrangements. Among those suggested were the names of the "Hollywood 10" along with names of BETSY BLATR (Mrs. GENE KELLY): ABE BURROUS, radio actor; J. ALLEN TRANKEL, labor attorney, and others. Both BURROWS and FRANKEL are known to Los angeles T-5 Cu

In January, 1949, Los Angeles T-27, considered a very reliable source, stated that he had noted that the name Mr. and Mrs. GENE KELLY of Beverly Hills, California, were among a long list of several hundred names in the possession of one SIDNEY BENSON who claims to be some sort of writer in Hollywood and who apparently has something to do with the ACTORS LABORATORY.

Informant did not know the exact nature of this list of names but believed it to be some sort of mailing list; otherwise he could attach no particular significance to it.

Concerning the above-mentioned SIDNEY BENSON, however, it may be noted that investigation by the Los Angeles and New York Offices have identified him as SIDNEY BERNSTEIN, alias SIDNEY BENSON, who came to Los Angeles from New York in the spring of 1948. BERNSTEIN,

or BENSON, which is the name he generally uses, has been a Communist Party member with some fifteen years activity in various Communist posts as teacher, organizer, and writer.

In June, 1949, the latest report by the California Un-American Activities Committée (TENNEY COMMITTEE) was issued in which a number of Hollywood personalities were referred to as pro-Communist. or pro-Russian in varying degrees. A number of these people, of whom GENE KELLY was one, immediately issued denials to the press

GENE KELLY is quoted in the "Los Angeles Daily News" of June 9, 1949 as stating:

"I don't know what Mr. Tenny's talking about. I am not a Communist, never was, and have no sympathy with Communist activities. The only line I know how to follow is the American line".

Attached is a blind memorandum dictated by LOUIS F. BUDENZ and containing all the pertinent information concerning the subject which BUDENZ could presently recollect.

The original of each memo has been reviewed by Mr. BUDENZ and he has made any necessary corrections and he has signed the original. The signed original of each memo is being retained in the confidential informant file of LOUIS F. BUDENZ, NY file 62-8988.

Since the individuals such as the subject of this case are, according to BUDENZ, concealed Communists and since they are, in most instances, persons of some prominence, it is suggested that if the information appearing in the attached blind memo is reported, then Mr. BUDENZ should be given a temporary confidential informant symbol.

For the information of the Bureau the subject is one of the 400 concealed Communists whom BUDENZ stated he knew. The names of these concealed Communists were sent to the Bureau in the case captioned Communist Party, USA, Internal Security - C".

Specifically, Mr. BUDENZ advised SA WILLIAM J. McCARTHY, JR., of the New York Office that KELLY was a motion picture actor and dancer, that in the early forties V. J. JEROME had told BUDENZ that GENE KELLY was a member of the CP; that this information had been repeated to BUDENZ by JEROME, ALEXANDER BERG and eventually by JACK STACHEL in 1944 or 1945. Mr. BUDENZ also stated that KELLY had been a member of a number of Communist fronts.

1948, has advised that GENE KELLY was never a member of the Hollywood CP prior to knowledge and experience of this informant; that KELLY's wife, screen actress BETSY BIAIR, may have been what informant called "a little closer" to the Party, but informant knows nothing positive which would link either KELLY or his wife to the Party as actual members.

T-3, for a number of years a member of the local CP in a functionary capacity, prior to 1946, has advised that he never knew GENE/KELLY to be a member of the Party; that there was a period a few years ago when KELLY was regarded as one who would "go along" with the Party program, such as taking part in a public meeting or sponsoring a function of an organization in which the Party may have been interested. Whether or not KELLY was aware of the Party's interest in such functions during this period, informant could not say. T-3 added that it was his understanding that KELLY's actress wife was probably much closer to Party activity than was her husband; however, neither KELLY nor his wife was ever personally known to informant and he had no information to indicate that either was ever actually affiliated with the Party.

T-4, a former member of a professional branch of the CP for several years prior to 1942 and who still maintains a number of contacts with the local CP, advises that he never knew GENE KELLY except by reputation as a motion picture personality. This informant had no information that KELLY has ever actually been affiliated with the CP.

of the CP in Hollywood, prior to 1948; advises that he has never been personally acquainted with GENE KELLY; that while KELLY in the past has had the reputation of being a very liberal individual, he was never known to be a member of the CP within the knowledge or experience of this informant.

membership of the Communist Party of Tos Angeles, which includes Hollywood, between the years 1943 and 1946, advised that GENE KELLY has never been a member of the CP in this area as far as these informants are aware.

In regard to Subject's wife, actress BETSY BLAIR, it is noted that T-8 has advised that in November, 1950, BETSY BLAIR took part as one of

the speakers in a public meeting sponsored by the organization known as the Hollywood Arts, Sciences and Professions Council. This meeting took place at the New Globe Theater, 7165 Beverly Boulevard, Ios Angeles, on November 10, 1950, and had been announced by the Hollywood ASP organization as a "protest rally" against the recent publication of "Red Channels," which was compiled and issued by the organization known as "Counterattack" in New York City. This publication purports to be a compilation of the affiliations on the part of a long list of radio and television artists with alleged past or present Communist front activities and organizations. The Hollywood ASP Council attacked "Red Channels" as a scheme to blacklist professionals and intellectuals.

The Hollywood ASP Council has been characterized by T-8 as a Communist-dominated organization for professionals and intellectuals, the principal policy-making offices of which have been consistently held by individuals affiliated with the CP, although, as informant points out, membership in the Hollywood ASP does not of itself connote affiliation with the CP on the part of an individual.

At the ASP-sponsored protest rally on November 10, 1950, BETSY BLAIR was one of the speakers, along with screen writer WALDO SALT and actress GALE SONDERGAARD, among others:

Both SAIT and SONDERGARD have been identified by T-2 as having been members of the CP in Hollywood within this informant's own knowledge and experience as a Party member (4)

BLAIR directed her talk on this occasion chiefly against the adoption of a proposed loyalty oath for the motion picture industry. In discussing a loyalty oath that had been advanced by an organization identified with the motion picture industry, Miss BLAIR made reference to that part of the proposed oath which contained a reference to the proposition that the war in Korea had been engineered by JOSEF STALIN. At this point, Miss BLAIR burst into laughter and was joined by a majority of the audience. She characterized any such proposed loyalty oath for the motion picture industry as the first step of a disease that would plague the entire industry, and she added that the Hollywood ASP would take a definite stand against such a loyalty oath.

According to this informant, Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer Studios at this time is considerably concerned and anxious that they do not hire any members of the CP or Communist sympathizers in connection with any MGM film production. He related that recently BETSY BLAIR had been selected by MGM for a small part in a picture currently being produced. Prior to this selection, GENE KELLY had personally assured Mr. DORE SCHARY, the Managing Director of MGM, that his wife, BETSY BLAIR, entertained no Communist sympathies whatever. After the studio had chosen her for the part, however, information came to the studio that she had participated in a meeting sponsored by the ASP Council in Hollywood to protest the publication, "Red Channels."

According to informant's information, BETSY BLAIR was promptly notified by the studio that she was being released from her motion picture commitment. Shortly thereafter, GEWE KELLY came to see DORE SCHARY at MGM and protested concerning the studio's action. At that time, KELLY told the studio executive that his wife had not realized the political nature of the ASP meeting at which she had spoken and that she was willing to sign an oath concerning her loyalty. After making certain inquiry of its own and taking a loyalty affidavit from BETSY BLAIR, the studio reinstated her in the production.

It should be noted that T-10, a current member of Hollywood ASP Council, has advised that while BETSY BLAIR is considered friendly to the Hollywood ASP, her husband, GENE KELLY, is not so considered by that organization.



BUDENZ that GENE KELLY has in the past been a member of a number of Communist fronts, reference is made to reference report of the Los Angeles Office dated 7/27/49 which sets forth the past activity on the part of GENE KELLY in connection with a number of organizations reportedly controlled, influenced or infiltrated by CP elements. It will be noted from that report that in past years he has taken part in various functions in which he has been associated with prominent CP members in Hollywood, and that he has in the past supported causes either knowingly or unknowingly which were backed and often inspired by CP elements.

As noted on page 3 of reference report, GENE KELLY and his wife were apparently considered as possible recruit material for the CP in 1944. However, the informant had no information to indicate that they had ever actually joined the CP or to what extent the Party had actually made efforts to recruit them.

Available local informants on CP matters in Hollywood and Los Angeles have to date been unable to furnish any information of a reliable nature to show actual membership in the CP on the part of either KELLY or his wife.

Inasmuch as there has been no admissible evidence adduced to date to show that GEWE KELLY has ever been an actual member of the CP, and inasmuch as he is not currently connected with an industry vital to the national defense, no recommendation is being made that a Security Index card be issued on him at this time.

Confidential Informant T-1, of known reliability, advised that the subject presently resides at 725 North Rodeo Drive, Beverly Hills, California, and is about to start on a film produced by Metro-Goldwyn-Mayer, entitled "Ghost of a Chance."


Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that in the early 1940's he was informed that the subject, a motion picture actor and dancer, was a member of the Communist Party. Informant stated he was again informed in 1944 or 1945 by JACK STACHEL that the subject was a Communist Party member. Informant also advised that KELLY was a member of a number of Communist front organizations and that his name had been mentioned at Communist Party Headquarters, 35 East 12th Street, New York City.

Informant further advised and made available a letter dated December 6, 1946, which requested support for the National Committee to oust BILBO. Informant stated that the Committee was sponsored by the Civil Rights Congress and that GENE KELLY's name appeared on the letterhead as a member of the Committee.

It is to be noted that JACK STACHEL was one of the eleven Communist Party leaders who was convicted in 1949 at New York for violation of the Smith Act. It is also to be noted that the Civil Rights Congress has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of the Executive Order 9835.

The "Daily Worker, an East Coast Communist newspaper, of November 21, 1944, reported that GENE KELLY was one of approximately nineteen screen stars who had wired greetings to the National Council of American Soviet Friendship meeting, held at Madison Square Garden on November 16, 1944.

It is to be noted that the National Council of American Soviet Friendship was designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835. (4)

Confidential Informant T-3 and Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, advised that the American Youth For Democracy held its Second Annual Salute to Young Americans at a dinner to "Welcome Home Joe" on the occasion of the second anniversary of the American Youth For Democracy. This dinner was held on December 12, 1945 at the Hotel Roosevelt, New York City.

American Youth For Democracy awards were given to several people and GENE KELLY, movie actor, was among those presenting the American Youth For Democracy awards.

It is to be noted that the American Youth For Democracy has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of the Executive Order 9835.

Confidential Informant T-5, of known reliability, advised on May 16, 1946 that the Veterans Council of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions, sponsored a rally at Madison Square Garden, New York City. GENE KELLY, actor, presided. The informant did not report any comments made by KELLY, but stated that the rally had to do with veterans housing, retention of price and rent controls, and the steps that should be taken to prevent the outbreak of World War III.

It is to be noted that the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions has been cited as a Communist front by the Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, House Report number 1954, April 26, 1950.

The "New York Herald Tribune," a daily New York newspaper, published March 19, 1946, contained an article concerning a rally which was sponsored by the National Council of American Soviet Friendship. This rally was held on March 18, 1946, and accused WINSTON CHURCHILL of warmongering, and called upon President TRUMAN to keep peace.

Mrs. GENE KELLY, the wife of the subject, was one of the speakers at this rally.

Confidential Informant T-6, of known reliability, advised on May 3, 1946, that GENE KELLY, movie actor, as well as PAUL ROBESON and ADAMJACKSON were speakers at a meeting of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions.

Confidential Informant T-2, advised in June of 1950, that PAUL ROBESON was known to him to be a Communist in the years prior to 1945.

Confidential Informants T-18 and T-19, of known reliability, advised that ADA JACKSON has been a Communist Party candidate for political office from Brooklyn, New York.

The "Hollywood Citizens News," published September 6, 1947, page 1, announced that GENE KELLY was one of the sponsors of a rally held under the auspices of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee, at the Shriners Auditorium in Hollywood, California, on September 5, 1947.

It is to be noted that the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

A news release issued by the Progressive Citizens of America, 205 East 42nd Street, New York City, dated May 16, 1947, announced the National Youth Lobby was to be held in Washington, D.C., on June 15 and 16, 1947. One of the sponsors of the Lobby was actor GENE KELLY, Honorary Chairman, Young Progressive Citizens of America.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities
Report 1947, Page 369, and Report 1948, Page 354, cited the
Progressive Citizens of America as a "new and broader Communist
front for the entire United States."

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, advised that a fund-raising meeting was held for the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee on February 21, 1947, at the Biltmore Hotel, Los Angeles. Mr. O. JOHN ROGGE,

who was formerly connected with the United States Department of Justice, was scheduled to give the main speech. ROGGE cancelled his appearance at the last minute due to other commitments, and GENE KELLY was then scheduled to read ROGGE'S speech. Informant stated that KELLY was unable to attend because of illness and that his wife read the speech.

According to Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, on September 25, 1947 LUKE WILSON, Washington representative of the Progressive Citizens of America, suggested a "super duper mass meeting" to be held in Washington, D.C. at Turners Arena.

In connection with the investigation of individuals from Hollywood, which had been conducted by the House Un-American Activities Committee, it was suggested that GENE KELLY might appear at this mass meeting.

On January 3, 1947 Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade had arranged for a theatrical program to be held January 19, 1947 at the Belasco Theatre, New York City. This program was to be titled "Stars Entertain For Republic Spain" and GENE KELLY was listed as a sponsor. (C)

It is to be noted that the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of the Executive Order 9835.

The "New York Journal American," a New York daily newspaper, published an article by HOWARD RUSHMORE on September 20, 1946, which commented on greetings received by the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade from GENE KELLY and others.

The "Volunteer For Liberty", efficial publication of the Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade issue of November 1947, listed greetings received from several persons including GENE KELLY, who sent the following greeting:

"Please allow me to join in paying tribute to the men who fought Fascism before it was popular to do so. Let us keep insisting that their lives be not given in vain."

SA LESUIE F. WARREN attended a rally held at the Shriners Auditorium, Los Angeles, California, on October 15, 1949. This rally was sponsored by the Progressive Citizens of America to protest the fact that a number of screen personalities had been subpoensed to appear before the House Un-American Activities Committee in Washington, D. C. Agent WARREN advised that GENE KELLY introduced the guest speakers.

The New York "Daily Compass," a New York daily newspaper, on May 18, 1949 carried an article which listed 128 prominent writers, lecturers, musicians, actors, playwrights, artists, and educators, who were labeled by the American Legion, Americanism Division, as persons "whose past activities make them unsuitable or in-appropriate for Legion sponsorship." Among the 120 names was listed GENE KELLY. (11)

(M) Confidential Informant T-10. of unknown reliability, but who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on February 23, 1949 that GENE KELLY was connected with the Civil Rights Congress and a number of other front organizations. (4)

Confidential Informants T-11, T-12, T-14, T-15, and T-16, all of known reliability, advised that they had no information concerning the activities of the subject in the New York area.

Confidential Informant T-17, of known reliability, advised that GENE KELLY acted as Chairman at a Veterans. Emergency Rally, held at Madison Square Garden, New York City, on May 16, 1946, under the auspices of the Veterans Council, the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions. Informant also advised that KELLY was elected Vice Chairman of the Progressive Citizens of America in 1947.



Romylet February 21 last captioned JOHN GARFIELD. was. SECURITY MATTER - C. PERJURY (Bufile 100-335703), a copy of which was designated for the Bureau's file on MAX WATHAN BENOTF. Referenced letter sets out the results of an interview with BENOFF regarding CARFIELD, as well as BUNOFF's own Communist Party connections which he denied.

On February 28, 1952, Dr. C. RUSSELL ANDERSON. 416 North Bodford Brivo, Beverly Hills, Celifornia, was interviews pursuant to information received that he had some information which he desired to furnish the Bureau pertaining to Communist matters.

One of several unassociated matters which Dr. ANDERSON mentioned was the fact that about 1945 MAX NATHAN BENOFF was a patient of his. BENOFF had some t of skin rash which appeared to be caused by nervousness. AMDERSON oventually sent BENOFF to Dr. JOHN B. DOYLE, psychiatrist, inasmuch as BENOFF's nervousness appeared to be caused by mental stross.

While BENOFF was a patient of ANDERSON, however, we he admitted to AMDERSON that he was a member of the Communist Party. BENOFF at that time was the writer of the popular Party. BENUT AT THAT HE admitted that his membership radio show "Beby Snooks." He admitted that his membership in the Communist Party took a great deal of his time; that he had to attend Party meetings regularly and frequently which, in addition to his writing work for radio, continually overworked him.

Approximately six months ago in 1951 BEHOFF was again in contact with Dr. ANDERSON, although not professionally. He told ANDENSON then that he had quit the Communist Party a few months prior thereto. ANDERSON suggested that if he had dis# associated himself from the Party, BEMONE should seek an interview with the FBI and make his position known to the Bureau. However, while BEMOFF indicated he would like to talk to Euresu representatives about himself, he had decided not to do so because he felt he would be obliged to name others he know to be connected with flip promunist Party. BENOFF told AMDERSON that while he

thinks that basically Communism is all right, he did not like the conspiracy angle of it, which was one of the reasons he had withdrawn from it.

According to ANDERSON, the only person that BENOFF named as a Communist, other than himself, was the film actor, GENE KELLY, whom BENOFF greatly admires. It was ANDERSON'S recollection that BENOFF named KELLY as a Party member when he first admitted his own membership to ANDERSON in 1945.

ANDERSON says that it has been generally believed around Beverly Hills that NELLY is or has been a Communist, although no one has any proof other than KELLY's associations, past and present. ANDERSON also remarked that KELLY apparently has not been named by any of the witnesses before the House Committee on Un-American Activities to date.

ANDERSON stated that when BENOFF went into the armed services sometime in 1945 he, ANDERSON, recommended BENOFF as a radio writer to the Commander of the Navy's Armed Service Radio Unit at Santa Monica, and BENOFF was transferred to that unit from basic training. It appears the Unit Commander had been a patient of ANDERSON and was known to him personally.

ANDERSON was asked if at the time of this recommendation he was aware of BENOFF's affiliation with the Communist Party. ANDERSON said he was aware of it at the time; but that if he had known then what he knows now about Communism and the Communist Party, he would never have recommended BENOFF.

Because of the matter of medical ethics ANDERSON was not asked why he had not reported his information regarding BENOFF until now, and ANDERSON did not raise the point. ANDERSON indicated that he rather likes BENOFF as an individual, although he in no way approves of his past connections with the Communist Party. Although he did not say so directly. ANDERSON indicated that should BENOFF be subposned and his Communist Party affiliations disclosed publicly, his career as a top radio writer would be seriously jeopardized; and apparently BENOFF himself foars this too.

In this connection, it should be noted that at no time was ANDERSON advised that BENOFF had been contacted previously by agents of this office as set out in mylet of February 21st last in the JOHN GARFIELD, SECURITY MATTER - C, PERJURY case.

There is a possibility that BENOFF may have been in touch with Dr. ANDERSON since BENOFF was interviewed by Bureau agents last February 18th. Although through certain questions Dr. ANDERSON was given an opportunity to confirm this, he did not do so, and he indicated that he had not had any contact with BENOFF for some months either professionally or socially.

It was made clear to Dr. ANDERSON that the Bureau would afford Mr. EENOFF an interview at any time he may care to contact the Los Angeles office; that, however, the FBI has nothing to do with the procedure or policy of the House Committee on Un-American Activities and has no information relative to whom HCUA may or may not subpoens.

For the Bureau's information, nothing of a derogatory nature concerning Dr. C. RUSSELL ANDERSON appears in the Los Angeles indices. In addition to the information concerning BENOFF, Dr. ANDERSON furnished information of a hearsay nature which may prove pertinent in other matters.

In regard to film actor GENE KELLY (Bufile 100-352566,) whom BENOFF named to Dr. ANDERSON as a member of the Communist Party, you will note that BENOFF's identification, if true, is the first concrete indication that KELLY was or is actually a member of the Communist Party. Past investigation of KELLY has not established actual membership on his part, although he was apparently very close to and well regarded by the Party in the past.

Committee on Un-American Activities investigator, WILLIAM WHEELER, subsequent to the interview with BENOFF on February 18 last, that HCUA is considering issuing a subpoena for BENOFF's appearance at the forthcoming hearings in Los Angeles to be held probably about May next. It is not known exactly who HCUA's sources are or who may have named BENOFF. The fact that someone did name him is indicated by the fact that HCUA is considering a subpoena for him, probably subsequent to an interview with him by an HCUA representative. WHEELER, of course, is not aware that BENOFF has been interviewed by the Eureau.

Los Angeles feels that if BENOFF can put GENE KELLY in the Communist Party, he might also put JOHN GARFIELD in,

if in fact GARFIELD was a Party member. KELLY and GARFIELD, if they were actual members, would normally be afforded the utmost protection by the Communist Party reserved for film stars of their stature. BENOFF apparently was close to both.

For this reason the Bureau is requested to review the information set out in referenced letter of February 21, 1952, in the GARFIELD case, and advise whether it is not considered worthwhile to recontact BENOFF and give him another opportunity to cooperate by furnishing information to the Eureau.

A review of this file reflects that Kally was identified by Louis F. Budens as a member of the Communist Farty in the early 1940's and another informant of unknown reliability adviced that Kelly attended classes in Loninium in 1946. These classes were described as primarily intended for new contacts and potential Communist Party recruit material.

Your extensive investigation and contacts with security informants havehor verified Zelly's Communist Party membership. In addition, the numerous so-called "friendly witnesses" who testified before the MCVA investigating Communist infiltration into the Hollywood Motion Picture Industry did not identify Hally as a Communist Party member.

In view of the above, the Sureau does not consider an interview varranted and no authorization is granted.

NOTE ON YELLOW ONLY:

Subject is commonly known as Gene Kelty, actor and dancer. He is not included in the Security Index. No CP membership reported other than above. During 1940's Kelly was affiliated in various degrees with approximately a dozen organizations which were reportedly controlled, influenced, or infiltrated by Communist Party elements. Kelly has several times publicly denied being pro-Communist and no concrete evidence of CP membership is known. In view of this, it is not felt an interview would be productive.

Although no Security Index Card is recommended for this subject at this time, you will note from the information furnished by T-4 as set out in referenced report that GENE KELLY, in 1946, attended classes in Leninism in New York at the apartment of actor LLOYD GOUGH, the latter being characterized by the informant as a high level recruiter for the Party; further, that these classes were primarily intended for new contacts and potential recruits into the Communist Party. Although T-4 did not know if KELLY was ever actually recruited, he does recall that GOUGH was a good friend of GENE KELLY.

It is suggested that the Bureau may desire to authorize an interview with GENE KELLY for information concerning such classes and those associated with them, as well as KELLY's own reported connection with various organizations and functions in which the Communist Party was interested in Hollywood in subsequent years.

personal or direct information that either GENE KELLY or his wife, actress BETSY BLAIR, was ever actually affiliated with the Communist Party. The informant recalls that about two years ago she made a nominal donation to the Harry Bridges Defense Fund and that this donation was given to an individual, not now recalled but who was from San Francisco, California, soliciting such funds. The solicitor told T-1 that the informant's name had been suggested to her by actress BETSY BLAIR (Mrs. GENE MELLY). With respect to BETSY BLAIR, T-1 states that based on her knowledge and association with her, she would characterize her as "radical," but the informant has never known her to be an actual Party member nor has she heard of her spoken of as such by anyone in the Communist Party.

T-2, a member of the Communist Party in Hollywood from 1937 to 1943 and who has had personal knowledge of a great many people in the Hollywood motion picture industry who were also members of the Party during that period, advises that he never had any personal or direct knowledge that GENE KELLY was affiliated with the Party either in Hollywood or in New York.

T-3, a member of the Cultural Section of the Los Angeles County Communist Party in Hollywood from 1937 to 1948, advises that GENE KELLY was never in the Party so far as she knows. T-3 states that, as a matter of fact, KELLY was considered somewhat of a problem by the Party and actually was probably more anti-Party than he was pro. KELLY has disapproved, particularly in recent years since the war, of what little activity his wife, BETSY, did in appearing or taking part in public functions and organizations in which the Communist Party was interested. Although KELLY and his wife may have at one time been favorably considered by the Party, T-3 states she has no information whatever that either of them ever actually became affiliated with it.

T-4, of unknown reliability, was a member of the Communist Party in New York City between 1938 or 1939 and 1947, during which period he was personally acquainted and associated with a number of prominent theatrical people who were affiliated with the Party in one way or another. T-4 recalls GENE KELLY as the well-known stage and screen dancer. The informant states that in 1946, KELLY, together with his wife, BETSY BLAIR, attended classes in Leninism, which were conducted one night a week at the apartment of actor LLOYD GOUGH in New York City. T-4 recalls that these classes were primarily intended for new contacts and potential recruit material into the Communist Party. T-4 does not know, however, if KELLY was ever actually recruited into the Communist Party.

T-4 identifies LLOYD GOUGH as an actor who is now in the motion picture industry in Hollywood. Prior to going to Hollywood, GOUGH had been an established stage actor in New York. He was a member of the Party and close to persons on the section and division level, as well as being considered a high level recruiter for the Party. In 1946, GOUGH resided in

an apartment at the Wentworth Hotel in New York where the above-mentioned classes in Leninism were held once a week. T-4 recalls that GOUGH was a good friend of GENE KELLY.

During the year 1951, the House Committee on Un-American Activities held hearings in both Washington, D. C., and New York on the question of the extent of Communist infiltration into the Hollywood motion picture industry. It is noted that at these hearings, some seventeen so-called friendly witnesses testified before the committee and named approximately three hundred individuals as having been identified or affiliated with the Communist Party. The big majority of these individuals were connected with the motion picture industry; however, GENE KELLY was not named by any of the witnesses who co-operated with the committee.

I, Louis F. Budenz, furnish the following voluntary statement to Robert 5. Plantz, who has identified himself to me as a special agent of the Federal Dureau of Investigation. I give this statement of my own free will.

I was a member of the Communist: Party from 1935 to 1945. I became president of the Freedom of the Press Company, Inc., in 1940 and managing editor of the Daily Worker in 1941. The Freedom of the Press Corporation, Inc., was established by the Communist Party in 1940 to control and conduct the Daily Worker.

In order to carry on my duties, I was from time to time advised officially by leaders of the Communist Party as to who were or were not concealed Communists. In the early 1940's, V.J. Jerome, editor of the official theoretical organ of the Communist Party, then called the Communist, and a leading member of the Cultural Commission of the Communist Party, told me that Gene Kelly, a motion picture actor and dancer, was a concealed member of the Communist Party. In 1944 or 1945, this same information was repeated to me by Jerome, Alexander Trachtenberg, who was charged with supervision of all cultural activities of the Party, and eventually by Jack Stachel, the leading member of the Politburo of the American Communist Party. At that time, Stachel was the liaison man between the Politburo and the Daily Worker.

These statements concerning Kelly's concealed membership in the Party were made partially as the result of discussions connected with his association with a number of Communist fronts. I am not able at this time to recall the identity of these fronts.

I have read the foregoing typewritten statement consisting of approximately one-half page and I declare it to be true to the best of my knowledge and belief.

are-really a military force since they can swing a nation towards, or away from, a preparedness psychology. And to have our continental friends believe the time has come for all good men to minimize the menace of the Communist Party could be militarily disastrous some day.

SO THE FIRST move in the pro-U.S. group's counteroffensive will be a big Parisian demonstration featuring John Huston, Gene Kelly (who has been taking to the air with assaults on Soviet anti-Semitism) and Humphrey Bogart among others. To this rally will be invited French movie stars and writers who have innocently been caught up in covert Communist maneuvers just as some of our Hollywood artists were snared in the 30's.

to which virtually the entire continental cultural world wilf be asked.

THE POINT is to show that we Americans aren't the vacuous idiots the Russian propagandists try to paint us—and to establish a personal relationship with the hitherto doubting Europeans.

At the same time there is parallel activity here. All U.S. unions having anything to do with the movies of the theatre are being approached by labor men who want to start an International Alliance of Film Labor. These will include the teamsters, the musicians, the movie projectionists and all other studio talent and craft unions. Then, when ready, they will organize an international conference—out of which may come, along with other strategems, a world boycott of Communist films.

Once the European artists and intellectuals are convinced the Communist movie unions abroad can no longer terrorize them by keeping them from working, the back of one of the Soviet's most costly and valuable propaganda machines will be broken.

WITHOUT its glamor, the sickle will have no hammer with which to beat our allies into intellectual submission. And that's worthy 50 army divisions to America in this war of nerves.

KELLY, who is better known under his professional name of GENE KELLY, is a motion picture film actor and dancer. In recent years he has also been an independent producer. He is a U. S. citizen, born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania on August 23, 1912. He has resided at 725 Rodeo Drive, Beverly Hills, California for a number of years. He became prominent as a Hollywood film actor about 1942 after a career on the New York stage.

He was issued U. S. Passport No. 2375800 on August 29, 1960 at Los Angeles for contemplated travel to England and France. His application indicated the purpose of the trip as business for a duration of about three months. He expected to depart via Pan American Airways from New York City in September, 1960.

In the early 1940's, LOUIS BUDENZ, former Communist Party member and onetime Managing Editor of the "Daily Worker", a Communist Party newspaper, New York, was told by V. J. ALEROME. and JACK STACHEL, national functionaries of the Communist Party; that GENE KELLY was a member of the Communist Party; however, BUDENZ had no first-hand knowledge of such membership himself, and no reliable evidence of actual membership in the Communist Party on KELLY'S part has been developed from available informants in a position to have known of it.

BETSY SELLY **MRS. EUGENE CURBAN**

In 1944, both KELLY and his then wife, actress BETSVIBLAIR, from whom he is reportedly now divorced, were both considered by the Communist Party as possible recruit material, and KELLY was once described by a Communist Party functionary at Los Angeles as a very favorable person.
