

The following brief survary of the investigation concerning the subject is noted:

Investigation concerning the subject has established that during 1942 he was employed with the Exven Electric Company, New York, New York

During 1905 he was employed in the health and physics Department of the Kanhattan Project, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, where he had access to reterial that could have varied from "unclassified" to "top secret." In 1968, thile allegedly employed by the Itlas Trading Corporation, New York City, es a "commissioned representative," he was issued a passport for travel to various European countries, which included Poland. On 10/6/43, he departed the United States aboard the "SS America" destined for Le Havre, France. His wheresbouts since that period are unknown. Available background data developed in Groux City, Ross, reflects that KOVAL as a native born United States citizen of Polish derivation, who departed the United States in 1932 with his parents and brothers. He possibly rasided in Russia, or outside the United States, from 1932 to 1939 or 1941. He was educated as an Electrical Engineer at the University of Iom during 1929 to 1932, and received a Bachelor or Electrical Engineering 7 Degree at the College of the City of New York.

Referenced Bureau letters reflect the results of a review of Bureau indices regarding the known relatives of the subject described on the last page of a report made in Omaha 3/23/55 in instant case. This information made available by the Bureau supplemented an indices review for the same individuals by Los Angeles, which is reflected in Los Angeles letter 5/3/55.

In an effort to determine the present whereabouts of the subject, Los Angeles is requested to conduct the following investigation, utilizing the information reflected in referenced Bulets and above-mentioned Omaha report, copies of which have been furnished Los Angeles.

Ascertain the present residence address of the subject's relatives who, with the possible exception of SAM GERTZ, an uncle, have been last reported residing in Los Angeles, California. Upon locating these individuals in Los Angeles, will request Bureau authorization to institute a 60 day mail cover on each of the relatives in consideration of the possibility that subject may be in contact with them. Will also institute appropriate toll call coverage for the relatives.

In addition, will conduct appropriate investigation to ascertain possibility of developing a highly confidential source of information on one or more of the relatives in an attempt to develop information which might assist in ascertaining the subject's whereabouts and past activities. If such investigation appears feasible, will request Bureau authority in accordance with present Bureau regulations.

pearl SILVER may possibly be identical with the with whom the subject reportedly resided at 3451 Giles Place, Bronx, New York, during 1941, the approximate time of the subject's suspected return to the United States from Bussia.

In consideration of the above, it is requested that PEARL SILVER and HARRY and GOLDIE GURSHTEL be the first of the subject's relatives interviewed and that they be interviewed simultaneously.

Bufiles reflect that Arnold Kramish was born 6-6-23 at Denver, Colorado, son of Polish-born parents who subsequently became U.S. citizens by naturalization. He obtained his B.S. degree from Denver University in 1945; attended City College of New York (ASTP) in 1943-44; and obtained an M.A. degree from Harvard in 1947. He served in U.S. Army from March, 1943, to February, 1946, during which period he performed research work in nuclear physics, and from September, 1944, to May, 1945, was loaned by the Army to the Fereoleve Corporation, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. In the Summer, 1946, he assisted in declassification of scientific documents at the Los Alamos project, Los Alamos, New Mexico.

Aramish was granted a Q clearance 6-27-47 at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, and was transferred to Washington, D. C., in February, 1949. From 2-7-49 to 10-1-51, Kramish was employed by Atomic Energy Commission as intelligence specialist, Washington, D. C. He was last reported (6-7-54) to be employed by Rand, Inc., Santa Monica, California, with which company he had entered on duty on 10-2-51 as a physical scientist in nuclear energy. Although employed by Rand, Inc., he also served as a classification consultant to the Atomic Energy Commission. Arnold Kramish was subject of AEA - Applicant investigation in 1947 and of an AEA - Employee investigation in 1954. Neither investigation disclosed information of a derogatory nature.

While employed as analyst in the office of the Director of Intelligence of ALA and while in Washington as an employee of Rand, Inc., Kramish served as a contact of the Washington Field office, furnishing information in a number of investigations on a confidential basis. He is said





Information was since developed that GEORGE KOVAL was employed at the Raven Electrical Company from 1939 to 1943, entered the United States Army, and was assigned to Manhattan Project at Oak Ridge. Tennessee. with access to highly classified material.

The Bureau has stated it is of extreme importance to determine (1) when and how he returned to the United States, and (2) the exact circumstances surrounding his assignment to the project at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. The Bureau has further instructed that every attempt should be made to determine his possible re-entry into the United States subsequent to his departure in 1948. Bureau instructed Los Angeles to conduct investigation to determine present whereabouts of KOVAL's relatives and to consider the advisability of interviewing those presently residing in the Los Angeles area.

For information of the Phoenix Office, HARRY GURSHTEL, GOLDIE GURSHTEL, and PEARL SILVER are all known to be affiliated with the Emma Lazarus Federation of Jewish Women's Clubs from early 1954 to the present date.

He was educated as an Electrical Engineer at the University of Iowa during 1929 to 1932, and received a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree at the College of the City of New York.



KRAMISH did not know the subject's specific duties on this project but stated that he worked at the Health Physics Laboratory. KRAMISH indicated that he was very close to the subject both at CCNY and at Oak Ridge. He described the subject as the oldest in the ASTP group and a person who was hard drinking, liked women, and who knew New York City better than any of their group.

KRAMISH had no recollection of the subject ever making any statements as to political beliefs and he was unable to recall any occasion arising in which KOVAL engaged in political discussion and he could recall nothing which would have made him question the subject's loyalty.

After getting out of the service KRAMISH advised that he and another member of the ASTP group, had met the subject in 1946 in New York, at a residence which he believed was on Valentine Street and since 1946, he has had no contact with the subject. KRAMISH knew nothing of subject's background prior to the time he attended CCNY in 1943, except that he had worked for some electrical supply company. KRAMISH advised that the following two persons were associates of the subject at Oak Ridge:



For many years, M. J. OLGIN was Editor of Freiheit. OLGIN was one of the outstanding leaders of the Communist Party in the United States for 20 years."

Available background data developed in Sioux City, Iowa, reflects that KOVAL is a native born US citizen of Polish derivation, who departed the US in 1932, with his parents and brothers. He possibly resided in Russia, or outside the US, from 1932 to 1939 or 1941. He was educated as an electrical engineer at the University of Iowa during 1929 to 1932, and received a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree at the College of the City of NY, on 2/1/48.

The subject was employed by a suspected Soviet agent in New York during the approximate period 1941-1943. He was subsequently, and while in the Army, assigned to

the Manhattan Engineer District, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, and to the Dayton, Ohio, area installation of the Manhattan Engineer District, at which places he reportedly had access to information up to and including "Top Secret." He was in the United States Army from February, 1943, until 1946. This Bureau has been attempting to determine the subject's present whereabouts. On March 15, 1948, Koval was issued present whereabouts. a passport for proposed travel to France, Belgium, Sweden,

Switzerland and Poland as a representative of the Atlas Trading Corporation of New York City. Investigation in New York City has failed to reflect a record of his employment with that company. Information furnished by an individual acquainted with Keval until the latter's departure from the United States during 1948 suggests the possibility that Koval may have traveled first to Paris,

France, and then to Bolond, for employment in connection with a hydroelegaric project in that country. Departure manifest records of the SS. "America" reflect that Kovall

departed from New York City on October 5, 1948, for Le Haure, France.



On 6/19/56 Mrs. GOLDIE GURSHTEL, subject's aunt, who resides at 14203 Hartsook, Sherman Oaks, California, telephonically contacted this office and advised she had received a letter from subject's father, ABRAHAM KOVAL, from Russia.

On 6/19/56 SAs reinterviewed Mrs. GURSHTEL and examined the letter described above. She advises the letter is written in the Russian language, was postmarked 5/22/56 in Russia, and she received it on Friday, 6/15/56. She recognizes the handwriting as that of her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL. She states the letter contained only news of ABRAHAM KOVAL's family as follows:

GABRIEL KOVAL, subject's youngest brother, had been killed while fighting the Nazi army during World War II in 1943; that subject's mother, ETHEL, had died in 1952 of cancer; that ISAIAH, the oldest brother, is married and has four children. ABRAHAM KOVAL now resides with ISAIAH and his wife; that GEORGE KOVAL is now in Moscow teaching in the chemical institute known as Mendelaiv. Subject lives with his wife, LUDMULA (? sp) but has no children.

This letter was furnished by Mrs. GURSHTEL to the FBI. However, she requested that it be returned to her when no longer of any use to the FBI.

Three photographs, one each of the front and back of the one-page letter written in the Russian language and one of the envelope in which the letter was contained, are enclosed herewith to the Bureau, Attention FBI Laboratory - Cryptanalysis Section, for examination. Three photographs as described above are being enclosed for the New York Office.

The Cryptanalysis Section, FRI Laboratory, is requested 35 to translate from the Russian language to English the contents of this letter and the return address appearing on the envelope written in the Russian language and furnish copies of this translation to New York and Los Angelias

On May 21, 1956, GOLDIE GURSHTEL, 15203 Hartsook Avenue, Sherman Oaks. California. was interviewed by Special Agents

She briefly advised that her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL and his entire family, including his wife, ETHEL KOVAL, and his three sons, ISAIAH, GEORGE, and GABRIEL, departed the United States in 1932 for Russia. She said she and her husband, HARRY GURSHTEL visited them in Russia during 1936 but she has not heard from them in over twenty years.

In the absence of her husband, HARRY GURSHTEL, she requested that this interview be deferred until he was present with her.

The GURSHTELs stated that ABRAHAM KOVAL had, for many years prior to 1932, been interested in returning to Russia to the settlement in Biro-Bidjan. They stated that the KOVAL family reached Russia safely and settled in Biro-Bidjan, Far Eastern Region of the "Jewish Autonomous State."





They stated that in 1936 they traveled to Europe during which time they visited HARRY GURSHTEL's parents, who were then in Poland, and later visited ABRAHAM KOVAL and his family in the Far Eastern Region of Biro-Bidjan. They said they spent about one week with the KOVAL family.

At that time, GEORGE and ISIAH KOVAL, the two oldest sons of ABRAHAM, were assisting their father on a collective farm. They stated the youngest son, GABRIEL, had finished school and was, during their visit, away from home on a vacation trip.

The GURSHTELs stated that upon their return, they corresponded with ABRAHAM KOVAL until around 1937, after which date no replies were received from letters written to him.

The California Legislature, Fourth Report of the Senate Fact-Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, 1948, page 196, reflects that "Biro-Bidjan is a Jewish Communist Colony in the Soviet Union."

The GURSHTELs both advised that to their knowledge, none of the KOVAL family have ever returned to the United States.

They were shown a photograph of GEORGE KOVAL taken in March 1948 but both stated they could not recognize this photograph as GEORGE KOVAL and doubted whether they would recognize this subject due to the length of time elapsed since they last saw him in 1936.

GOLDIE GURSHTEL advised she last attempted contact with ABRAHAM KOVAL by letter in early January 1956. GOLDIE GURSHTEL advised that during their trip to Europe in 1936, while visiting in Poland, she visited briefly with her sister, IDA ABORAMOVICH and her husband, AARON ABORAMOVICH, who were then residing at a village named Telechan near Pinsk, Poland. She said that IDA ABORAMOVICH is a sister of ABRAHAM KOVAL and an aunt of GEORGE KOVAL. She stated this was the last time she saw or heard from IDA ABORAMOVICH or her family and had heard rumors which came to them from survivors who escaped to Israel during the war, that the ABORAMOVICH family were among those massacred by the Nazis at Pinsk, Poland, during World War II. She stated she had no information that GEORGE KOVAL had ever attempted to locate or visit this aunt, IDA ABORAMOVICH, in Poland.

On June 19. 1956. GOLDIE GURSHTEL telephonically advised Special Agent that on Friday, June 15, 1956, she had received a letter in the mail from her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL, who lives in Russia. She said this letter contained news of GEORGE KOVAL.

Mrs. GURSHTEL was re-interviewed on June 19, 1956, by Special Agents She produced a letter addressed to GOLDIE GURSHTEL, 15203 Hartsook, Sherman Oaks, California, USA, in both English and the Russian languages. The letter bears a Russian postmark dated May 22, 1956, according to Mrs. GURSHTEL. The letter is written in the Russian language on both sides of one sheet of paper. The letter itself is dated May 20, 1956. Mrs. GURSHTEL advised she recognizes the handwriting of this letter as that of her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL.

She states that the letter contains news of the KOVAL family in Russia as follows:

"GABRIEL KOVAL, the youngest son, was killed by the Nazis in 1943 while serving with the Russian Army. ETHEL KOVAL, ABRAHAM's wife, died of cancer in 1952. ISAIAH KOVAL, the oldest brother, is married and has four children MR GEORGE KOVAL is now in Moscow teaching in the Chemical (?) Institute of Mendelaiv. He lives with his wife LUDMULA (? sp), but has no children."

Mrs. GURSHTEL advised this is the first letter she has received from her brother in about 20 years and is the first news she has learned of the KOVAL family in Russia.

Mrs. SILVER advised she is the sister of ABRAHAM KOVAL and aunt of GEORGE KOVAL. She stated that attempts by her to correspond with ABRAHAM KOVAL have met with no replies. She said she had heard a rumor some time during World War II that GABRIEL KOVAL, the youngest brother of GEORGE KOVAL, had been killed during the war but could not recall the source of this information. She stated specifically that she had no knowledge that GEORGE KOVAL was in the United States during World War II.

Mrs. SILVER said that she had corresponded with MOISCHE KOVAL, her brother who lives in Argentina, from time to time, but MOISCHE KOVAL had never indicated any knowledge of the ABRAHAM KOVAL family in Russia.

She advised that her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL, his wife ETHEL, and three sons, ISAIAH, GEORGE and GABRIEL, formerly lived in Sioux City, Iowa. The KOVAL family departed Sioux City in 1932 for Biro-Bidjan Settlement in Russia. She said they left Sioux City by train and thinks they went to New York City where they left by ship for Russia. She advised she personally has had no contact with the KOVAL family since their leaving in 1932.

She advised that her sister, Mrs. GOLDIE GURSHTEL visited Russia in 1936 and told them upon returning, that they had visited her brother ABRAHAM and his family who were then living on a farm in Biro-Bidjan. She stated that the GURSHTELs advised that GEORGE KOVAL and ISAIAH KOVAL were then on the farm with their father, but the younger brother, GABRIEL, was away at that time.

She advised that her brother, MOISCHE KOVAL, who lives in Argentina, has not advised her in correspondence of any contact with GEORGE KOVAL or any others of the KOVAL family in Russia.

Mrs. BEGUN advised that during a trip by the GURSHTELs to Europe in 1936, they also visited another sister of ABRAHAM KOVAL, IDA ABORAMOVICH and her husband AARON, who then lived at Telechan near Pinsk in Poland. She stated that rumor has come

to her during World War II, that the ABORAMOVICH Tamily were massacred by the Nazis in Poland in about 1940 or 1941. She states she has had no other report that the ABORAMOVICH family is living.

Mrs. BEGUN states she has no knowledge that GEORGE

KOVAL has ever returned to the United States. She stated she

In 1948, while allegedly employed by the Atlas Trading Corporation, New York City, as a "commissioned representative", he was issued a passport for travel to various European countries, which included Poland. On October 6, 1948, he departed the United States aboard the SS AMERICA destined for Le Havre, France. His whereabouts since that period are unknown. Available background data developed in Sioux City, Iowa, reflects that KOVAL is a native born United States citizen of Polish derivation, who departed the United States in 1932, with his parents and brothers. He possibly resided in Russia, or outside the United States, from 1932 to 1939 or 1941. He was educated as an electrical engineer at the University of Iowa, during 1929 to 1932, and received a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree



Regarding the Army Specialized Training Program, College of the City of New York

College of the City of New York (CCNY) was Interviewed on May 11, 1956, by SA and advised as follows:

The Army Specialized Training Program (ASTP) was instituted at CCNY by the United States Army during the spring of 1943. The unit was administered by a staff of United States Army officers under the command of Colonel RAYMOND P. COOKE who died shortly subsequent to World War II. The faculty at CCNY made certain suggestions as to the curriculum for the training unit but the training program was in its entirety designed and supervised by the United States Army. The training program was originally scheduled to afford one years training in various language, technical and mathematical subjects but it is recalled that the Army shortened the training period to a duration of approximately nine months.

The ASTP class members were selected at various United States Army basic training camps on the basis of Army aptitude tests.
Military assignments from CCNY for the various ASTP classes were made exclusively by the Army without consultation with faculty members of CCNY. The possibility of a class member having any information pertaining to his assignment prior to the completion of the

ASTP training was described as inconceivable and in all probability not known to the ASTP staff officers themselves until the actual assignments were made by the Department of the Army.

WALTER KNITTLE, former Director of the evening session, CCNY, deceased during 1947, was described as the "co-ordinator of related ASTP and CCNY matters," such as campus housing and student recreational activities and had considerable contact with the Army officers in that regard.

Other than KNITTLE the faculty at CCNY had little contact with the Army administrative staff because of which the identities of those officers are presently unrecalled.



DETAILS:

GOLDA GURSHTEL, subject's sunt, was previously interviewed by SAs on June 19, 1956. She furnished a letter postmarked May 22, 1956, in Russia, from her brother, ABRAHAMKOVAL, subject's father. She stated this letter contains news of the KOVAL family in Russia. 10 WA AGE A BOUT 75 IN 1956

The following is a translation of the above-described letter:

"Dear sister GOLDA:

"Your short letters were received. The one to me, on the first of May, the other one to MAYA, today. RUSS/A

"I have decided to answer your letters briefly and am writing in Russian, this is more convenient for me.

"Twenty years have passed since we have seen each other and during this time several changes have taken place in our family.

"Our dear GEYBI (GABRIEL?) died August 30, 1943, in a battle against the German fascists. ETL (ETHEL?) died August 28, 1952, from the dread disease, cancer. All the rest of us are alive and well. I am now about 75 and feel good, I am working. I live, as always, with SHAYA's family. We live and work at the same place, the collective farm.

"SHAYA and MUSYA have four children. The first one of the is 20 years old (she was born soon after your departure). She is finishing the Doctor's Assistant-Midwife School, she is married (we celebrated her wedding May first). The second one SOFIYA, is 15 years old. She is is attending school, she will finish the 8th RUSS/A Class. The third one GALINA, is attending school, she will finish the 6th Class, she is 12 years old. The fourth one GANNADI. a son,

RUSSIA

"is ? years old. He is attending school and will finish the 1st Class. They are sll good children.

GEORGE lives in Moscow he still works for the Mendeleev Chemical Institute. His title is: 'Candidate of Technical Sciences.' He is living with his wife LYUDHIIA (you saw them once in Moscow) but they have no children.

"Well, that is all for now.

"Much, much love from all of us to all of you, AGEABOUT 75 10 The letter was addressed to GOLDE GURENTEL 1520 Hartsook, Sherman Oaka, California, U.S.A. Feturn address WA "A. I. KOVAL, 2nd Volchaevska Station, Khaberovsky Territory, 118th Party Congress! Collective Parm." GOLDAGE URSHIE GOLDAGURSHTEL - NET GURSHTEL. It is noted that HARRY and Hartsook Avenue, Sherman Oaks, California. May 24, 1956. They advised at this time that in 1936 they travelled to Europe during which time they visited HARRY GURSHTEL's parents then in Poland and later visited ABRAHAM KOVAL and his family in the Far Eastern Region of Biro-Bidjan and spent about one wast with the KOVAL family. They advised that GEORGE and ISIAWKKOVAL, the two oldest sons of ABRAHAM, were assisting their father on a collective farm. Neither off USS/Athe GURSHTELS, during interview on May 24, 1956, mentioned IOWA travel to Moscow or having seen GRORGE KOVAL in Moscow.

On August 22, 1956, Mrs. GOLDA GURSHTEL and HARRY GURSHTEL, 15203 Hartsook Avenue. Sherman Oaks. were reinterviewed by SAs Mrs. GURSHTEL was questioned concerning a phrase in the letter, translation of which is set forth above, pertaining to the last paragraph in which the letter indicates that GEORGE KOVAL and LYUDMILA were seen by the GURSHTELS in Moscow.

Mrs. GURSHTEL advised she does not recall having omitted this phrase when reading this letter to Special Agents on May 24, 1956, but explained as follows:

IA 65-612h

During the GURSHTELS trip to Russia in 1936 she and her husband first visited his relatives in Poland. They then travelled to Moscow where they remained about ten days. During this ten-day stay in Moscow, they saw GEORGE KOVAL many times. GEORGE KOVAL at this time was a student at the Mendeleev Institute in Moscow. On one such meeting, KOVAL introduced to the GURSHTELS his girl friend LYUDMILA and stated that she was also known as "MILLIE." The GURSHTELS state that they only saw LYUDMILA once and recall nothing of her background except she was also a student at the Mendeleev Institute. The GURSHTELS described LYUDMILA as follows:

During this visit with KOVAL, the GURSHTELS advised that he stated after he came to Russia in 1932 he had great difficulty mastering the Russian language; therefore, for two years had remained on the collective farm with his father in order to study the Russian language. He stated in about 1934 he entered the Mendeleev Chemical Institute and was in 1936 working toward a degree. The GURSHTELS advised they departed Moscow and then travelled to visit her brother, ABRAHAM KOVAL, on the collective farm in the Far Eastern Region of Biro-Bidjan. A few days after their arrival, GEORGE KOVAL appeared and announced that he was on vacation from school for two months during which he intended to spend with his father working on the collective farm.

Mrs. GURSHTEL furnished a photograph of the entire KOVAL family, which according to her was taken in Sioux City, Iowa, only a short time prior to the KOVALs: departure to Russia in 1932. She identified those in the photograph as ABRAHAM KOVAL, ETHEL KOVAL, subject: s parents, GEORGE KOVAL in center wearing glasses, ISIAH KOVAL to left of subject, and GABRIEL KOVAL, right rear.

IA 65-6124 MRS. PAUXSILVER PEARLYGERTZ HARRY GURSHTEL advised on August 22, 1956, that MAS SANDERTZ was the first husband of his wife's sister, now known as FEAR SILVER. SAM and PEARL were divorced in Sioux City, lows, shortly after the birth of GRACE GERTZ in about 1924. GRATZ completely disappeared thereafter and none of the relatives have ever seen or heard of him since. GURSHTEL advised that GERTZ was a baker by occupation and was in the early 1920's employed at the Sioux City Bakery. HARRY GURSHTEL characterised GERTZ as a "drifter" who refused to settle down in Sioux City. He CARTZ was born in Russia and had previously lived in New York City, Chicago, ILC. Philadelphia, St. Paul and Minneapolis. MINK On August 22, 1956, was located at her residence, Van Nuys, California. and interviewed by SAS She advised that her maiden name was is the daughter of PEARL SILVER and SAM GERTZ and SAM of GEORGE KOVAL. She said she was living in Sioux City, RORN INIOWA, in 1932 when the KOVAL family departed for Russia; however, states that her recollection of the entire affair About is vague since she was only eight years old in 1932. She 1914 advised that most of her knowledge concerning the KOVAL family was learned from conversations between her mother and other relatives. advised she has neither heard from nor been in contact with any member of the KOVAL family since their departure in 1932, nor does she know of any relatives who have stated they have been in contact with any of the KOVALs with the exception of GOLDA and HARRY GURSHTEL, who visited the KOVAL family in Russia during 1936. advised that she and her mother moved from Sioux City, Iowa, in 1948 to Los Angeles where she has resided since. She states that SAM GERTZ, her father, and her mother were separated and later divorced about 1923 or 1924 shortly after her birth. She said that she nor any member of her family have never seen or

that she nor any member of her family have never seen or heard from her father since the divorce in the early 1920's.

Concerning a "clearance investigation," the file does not reflect that there was any active investigation of subject. The file does contain an undated personnel Security Questionnaire possibly executed at the time subject entered the Army. On the questionnaire and beside his listed education at the University of Iowa, his employment at the Raven Electric Company and references, Bronx, New York, and CONY, there appeared red check marks indicating that these sources had been contacted concerning subject. This is borns out by the fact that the file contains form letters dated 8/3/44, directed to the University of Iowa, by the District Intelligence Officer, Army Service Forces, U.S. Engineering Office, Manhattan District, Oak Ridge, Tennessee. These forms contain provisions on the reverse side for a reply.
The reply from the University of Iowa which was dated 8/10/44, and signed by confirmed subject's attendance at the University from September, 1929, - June, 1932, but stated he did not graduate. It was further stated "we regret that we have no personal knowledge of this student."
The reply from was dated 8/10/44, and in it she indicated she had known subject approximately three years, was "just a friend," and that she know nothing reflecting on his character or reputation. reply was dated 8/8/44, and in it he indicated he had known subject for 1½ years subject having been in several of his, "upper electrical engineering AST classes;" that subject had impressed him very favorably in all respects and that subjectts "personality and character are above reproach." No reply from the Raven Electric Company was noted in the file.

The file disclosed that on September 4, 1946, KOVAL applied for educational benefits to pursue an Electrical Engineering course at the School of Technology, College of the City of New York. He entered training on September 23, 1946, and terminated this training on February 29, 1948. KOVAL entered the United States Army on February 11, 1943, at Fort Dix, New Jersey, and received an honorable discharge on February 12, 1946, as Technician, 3rd Grado, at Camp Atterbury, Indiana. He attended the Army Specialized Training Program from August, 1943, to August, 1944, during which time he studied electrical engineering at the College of the City of New York.

NOVAL'S Army Separation qualification Record disclosed he completed two and one-half years of college at the State University of Iowa in electrical engineering and that he also spent one year studying organic chemistry at Columbia University, New York. New York.

He held a civilian job as purchasing agent with the flavon Electric Supply Company from 1939 to February, 1943. He was engaged in purchasing electrical supplies and equipment for a supply company from a manufacturer for wholesale trade. He made purchasing trips to various manufacturing concerns in New York and Pennsylvania.

In his military career, KOVAL was an Engineering Aido, having worked on the Manhattan Engineering Project at Oak Ridge, Tonnessee, and Dayton, Ohio. He assisted in performing technical work involving the development of appearatus, collection, and transposition of data incident to research in and the development of Army material.

The Veterans Administration file contained his signature and a photostat of fingerprints from his right hand and indicated he was awarded the American Theater Ribbon, the Good Conduct Model, and the Victory Model. He indicated his permanent residence as 3451 Giles Place, Bronx, New York, and he was discharged for reasons of demobilization.

A letter was addressed to GEORGE KOVAL by the Votorans Administration to the 2004 Valentine Avenue, Bronx, Now York, address dated February 26, 1952, for ever-payment of subsistence which was returned stamped "Not at address given." A previous letter dated September 15, 1949, had also been returned stamped "Romoved, left no address." (65-57859-291)

Education

The Manhattan Engineering District Security File at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, disclosed that the subject attended the Armstrong School, Sioux City, 1918-1925; Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, 1925-1926; and the State University of Iowa, Iowa City, September, 1929 - February, 1932.

Ho was in the United States Army from February 4, 1943, to February 12, 1946, and was an Army Specialized Training Program student at the College of the City of New York from August 9, 1943, to July 29, 1944. His record was clear and there was no unfavorable information contained therein.

Session, Registrar's Office, produced the records of Army Specialized Training Program students which disclosed the following information:

numerous occasions been mistaken for another GEORGE KOVAL,
however, in line with the following incidents:

He commented that he and the other GEORGE KOVAL apparently both studied at the College of the City of New York at different times, he having taken some economic courses there in 1935. He is the only GEORGE KOVAL listed in the Brenx Telephone Directory and particularly during 1949 numerous telephone calls came to his residence from females indicating they had met him in various cities around the United States. On the basis of the conversations held between these individuals and his wife, they both came to the conclusion that the other ROVAL must have been employed as a merchant seamen or in some form of service in that he was believed to have been wearing a Naval uniform of some type.

Mr. KOVAL stated that he vividly recalls one particular such incident in 1949, during which time two girls contacted his

wife mentioning they had met him when he was in Albuquerque. It so happened that he was on vacation himself at that time but he had not been in New Mexico.





The results of a review of Bureau file information concerning the Atlas Trading Corporation were forwarded to the New York office by memorandum of 11-19-54. the event New York files contain no information indicating the inadvisability of such a contact, it would seem a most legical lead, meriting prompt attention. This is particularly true in view of your statement that there appears to be no reason why the current owners would not cooperate.

employed by that concern in 1948, this would appear to be a complete misconception as to the pertinence of information to be set forth in an investigative report.

The current character of the Atlas Corporation and its operating personnel is exceedingly important to an administrative determination as to the advisability of making direct inquiry of them. However, the information that should properly be set forth in an investigative report concerning George Koval would be such pettinent portions as might characterise the company at such times as he may have served as an employee.

- 4. The word "physicist" in line 4 of the synopsis is misspelled.
- 5. Paragraph 5 on page 3 has little significance unless the informant is further identified as an employee of the Atlas Trading Corporation.
- 6. The accuracy of a statement appearing in the last paragraph on page 3 to the effect that "the company had been operated by --- who appears to be a senior officer in the firm," appears somewhat questionable especially in view of the later statement that he discontinued his association.
- 7. It is difficult, on the basis of information developed to date, to understand the pertinency to this investigation of information concerning even though reportedly "travelling in fast company."
- E. The word "at" in line 3 of the second paragraph, page 5, is misspelled. It would appear to be better form to use the words "in" or "during" rather than "on" as used in line 4 of that same paragraph. If living, a person "is a veteran -- having served ---" not "was a veteran" as set forth in paragraph 2 of page 5.
- 9. The fact that "the had a 1951 Plymouth, bearing a 1952 New York license plate number GE 7718" is of questionable materiality in this investigation.
- 10. The last paragraph on page 5 is most confusing, indicating either an error in reporting or a complete

miscenception of fact leading to a misdirected and fruitless inquiry. On the basis of information set forth in this investigation it does not annear that George Koval ever lived at even contemplated residence at that address whereas the following paragraph of the report indicates that such was a former address of

"A Sioux City law student, George Koval, 619 Virginia Street, was booked for investigation, at the county jail Friday, suspected of inciting a 'raid' on the office of Charles Lebeck, county overseer of the poor.

"Backed by 50 men who twice stormed the overseer's office late Thursday afternoon, Koval told Sheriff Davenport he would consider "withdrawing his forces from the office, after the sheriff had told him to stay away.

"Koval identified himself as 'legal counsel' for the Unemployed Council, a communist group with headquarters at 510 Fifth Street,

"The group entered Overseer Lebeck's office and demanded room and lodging for two middleaged women who, Koval said, had been ousted from a local hotel and had no place to go.

"Lebeck said he would take care of the two destitute women but saw no reason why the men should be there to enforce the demands. He then invited the group to leave his office, assuring them he would provide quarters for the women. Koval said they would return.

OM 65-609 "When they departed, the overseer called the hotel, he said, and found the women had not been turned out. About an hour later the group returned and Overseer Lebeck called Sheriff Davenport. "Asido from the demands of the two women, no requests were made for food or lodging the overseer reported. He said Koval and his followers were simply trying to make trouble. "Koval has been studying law in a Middle West university. formerly attended Central High School." Attached to this same card on the subject was a second newspaper clipping; taken from the Sioux City Journal and Tribune of Septomber 6, 1931, which is quoted verbatim below: "FREED YOUTH TELLS STORY Asserts He Threatened No One in Office of Poor Overseer "Another side of the story about the delegation of persons who went to the office of Charles Lebeck, county overseer of the poor Thursday afternoon to seek aid for two destitute women. was related by George Koval, 19 years old, upon his release from the county jail. "Koval was arrested by Sheriff John Davenport Thursday afternoon and accused of threatening violence in the office of the overseer. He was released Friday evening. Koval's account of the incident follows: "The committee of 50 filed into Lebeck's Office and demanded immediate aid for two destitute women whom Lebeck had refused to help on Tuesday, sending them to the police station for temporary relief only, when they needed support until they could get work. "It was not until confronted by a mass delegation from the unemployed council that Mr. Lebeck gave any promises of help. He did not ask for time to investigate these women. DENIES THREATS "Mr. Lebeck insisted that Mrs. Fairman was not a resident of Woodbury County and did not consent to look further into the - 4 -

matter although later investigation by the committee gave every indication that Mrs. Fairman was a citizen of this county.

Then Lebeck said that it would take some time for him to make arrangements for caring for the women, as spokesman. I asked if there would be any objection to waiting and the overseer did not refuse that request. However, at the further suggestion by the committee that they leave and later return he readily assured them that this would be all right. No one became abusive or uttered threats of violence on leaving or at any other time during the interview.

"'Upon its return, the committee was met by Sheriff Davenport and several deputies who drove the crowd from the courthouse and escorted me to Davenport's office, where the sheriff offered to let me go if I would promise to stay away from the courthouse, which I refused to do. I was then locked up and the next morning was taken downstairs and Davenport again offered to release me if I would promise to get out of the unemployed council. I again refused."

Deputy Sheriff JOHN ZECHMAN, Identification Office, Woodbury County Sheriff's Office, Sioux City, Iowa, on March 9, 1955 produced the arrest card for subject GEORGE KOVAL. This indicated the subject's address as 617 Virginia Street, sex male, race white, age 17 (In 1931), height 6', weight 175 pounds, brown hair, brown eyes, medium complexion, marital status single, occupation unemployed, nativity Sioux City, Iowa, criminal charge investigation, date of arrest September 3, 1931, committed by Sheriff DAVENPORT, released September 4, 1931. Mr. KAPLAN stated he could not recall the subject ever working at the Square Deal Clothing Company and he definitely knew the subject could not have been employed at this store during the 1933-1936 period.

March 8, 1955 advised subject KOVAL was a nephew of HARRY GURSHTI. who formerly operated the Square Deal Clothing Company, 928-4th Street, Sioux City, Iowa
Confidential Informant of known reliability, on March 8 and March 10, 1955, advised he is acquainted with the KOVAL family and knew the subject to be a nephew of HARRY GURSHTEL, who formerly operated the Square Deal Clothing Company, 928-4th Street, Sioux City stated the subject could have worked parttime at this store while attending high school, however, he knew definitely the subject was not employed at the Square Deal Clothin Company during the period 1933-1936.
On June 18, 1948, Confidential Informant of known reliability, advised that HARRY GURSHTEL had strong tendencies toward Communism.
On March 8, 1951, was again contacted and stated he felt GURSHTEL had been a Communist, particularly due to his interest in Icor, as in his opinion, anyone interested in returning to Russia as advocated by Icor must be a Communist.
In February, 1941, Confidential Informant of known re- b7C liability, advised HARRY GURSHTEL, 928-4th Street, proprietor of Harry's Square Deal Clothing Store at that address, was a Communist.
On June 21, 1940, Sioux City, Iowa, informed SA that the individual who operated a clothing establishment at 928-4th Street was disseminating Communist literature. The 1940 Sioux City City Directory listed HARRY GURSHTEL as the proprietor of the clothing store at 928-4th Street.
On December 16, 1940,
In November, 1941, Jewish Community Center, Sioux City, Towa, informed SA

that Icor was an organization which had allegedly been formed for the purpose of aiding and assisting Jewish colonization of the PeroBidjan Region of Russia, but had not been in active operation in Sioux City, Iowa for the past five years. She stated she did not have a complete list of the membership of Icor. Stated she did not several members of the Jewish Community Center had been strongly opposed to the Icor and had refused to permit the use of the Jewish Community Center as a meeting place for this group.

produced a letter from the Icor Committee to the Jewish Community Center, written in connection with the réfusal to permit the Icor to meet at the Jewish Community Center. One of the three signers of this letter was HARRY GURSHTEL.

The report of the Massachusetts House Committee on Un-American Activities, report 1938, pages 228, 229 and 568 relative to Icor, read as follows:

"Icor, with headquarters in New York City has as its purpose the colonization and support of Biro-Bidjan, one of the Soviet Socialist Republics within Soviet Russia. It has Communist support and in turn supports the Communist Party. It is b70 listed in the Cash-Receipt record of the Communist Party of Boston for 1937."

Residences

An examination of the Sioux City, Iowa, City Directories from 1929 through 1955, indicates the listing of "ABR. KOVAL, 619 Virginia" in the 1929, 1930, 1931 and 1932 Directories.

On March 9, 1055; Woodbury County Auditor's Office, Sioux City, Iowa, advised that 619 Virginia Street is described in the official records as Lot 5, Block 48, Middle Sioux City Addition, and that, according to their records, A. KOVAL acquired this property on December 30, 1922 by warranty deed from GURI HELENE JORGENSON, Et Al. This deed was filed on March 7, 1923. Mrs. HEITRITTER advised the records reflect that A. KOVAL and ETHEL KOVAL transferred this property to GOLDIE GURSHTEL by Warranty deed dated May 27, 1932, however, she pointed out this deed was not filed until September 29, 1936.

Office of the Woodbury County Recorder, Sioux City, Iowa, on March 9, 1955 advised the warranty

deed giving A. KOVAL title to this property is filed in Deed Record Lots No. 167, page 467, and is Docket No. 4139. advised that by warranty deed of May 27, 1932, A. KOVAL and wife, ETHEL, transferred their ownership in this property to GOLDIE GURSHTEL for \$1.00 and other consideration, with the stipulation that GOLDIE GURSHTEL was to assume the mortgage of record on this property. This is recorded in Deed Record Lots No. 222, page 135, and is Docket No. 21424. |pointod out that although this warranty deed is dated May 27, 1932, it was not filed until 3:00 P.M., September 29, 1936. stated that Docket No. 8097, recorded in Deed Record Lots No. 252, page 372, indicates GOLDIE GURSHTEL and husband, HARRY CURSHTEL, gave the warranty deed covering this property to IDA L. SEFF, which warranty deed is dated May 13, 1943. This warranty deed was filed in the Recorder's Office on May 13, 1943. on March 10, 1955, produced records pertaining to the mortgage given by A. KOVAL, which is recorded in Mortgage Records Lots No. 367, page 419. This mortgage was made on September 19, 1931 by A. KOVAL and wife, ETHEL KOVAL, to J. W. GRAY, in the amount of \$3,000, six per cent interest to October 1, 1936. The mortgago was given to J. W. GRAY on Lot 5, Block 48, Middle Sioux City Addition. This mortgage was filed September 21, 1931. advised this mortgage was assigned by J. W. GRAY on September 21, 1931 to ALLISON MORE KIECKHEFER, as reflected in Book 391, page 133. advised that Book 421, page 430, records an agreement for extension of this mortgage between GOLDIE GURSHTEL and her husband, HARRY, to ALLISON MORE KIECKHEFEN, dated September 28, 1936 In the agreement for extension is the statement that the GURSHTELs are the present owners of the mortgage property and there was still due on the note \$2,800. This was filed October 7, 1936. produced Book 403, page 39, which indicates that on September 5, 1939, ALLISON MORE KIECKHEFER sold this mortgage to SARAH BEGUN of Sioux City, Iowa, for \$2,050. produced Satisfaction Record Lots No. 463, and on page 246 thereof is recorded the satisfaction of the mortgage originall-

given by A. KOVAL. This Satisfaction was filed May 13, 1943 at 4:00 P.M. and recites that SARAH BEGUN of Los Angeles, California, acknowledges that mortgage dated September 19, 1931, made and executed by A. KOVAL and ETHEL KOVAL to J. W. GRAY, assigned to ALLISOW MORE KIECKHEFER, is redeemed, paid off, satisfied and discharged in full, dated this 10th day of May, 1943, signed SARAH BEGUN. Notary Public O. L. MONTCOMERY, Eureka, Los Angeles County, California.

It is to be noted from the above that the KOVAL family did not have title to this property subsequent to May 27, 1932. It is noted that the Security File of the Manhattan Engineering District discloses in 1936 the subject was residing at 619 Virginia Street, Sioux City, Iowa.

Relatives of GEORGE KOVAL

mentioned above, on March 7, 1955 produced the naturalization records for ABRAM BERKO KOVAL, on file in the office of the Clerk of District Court, Woodbury County, Sioux City, Iowa. This is recorded in Book 5, page 153.

Declaration of Intention No. 844, dated January 24, 1913, Woodbury County District Court, indicates ABRAHAM KOVAL, age 30, a laborer, race white, height 5'9", weight 170 pounds, dark brown hair, gray eyes, medium complexion, born January 3, 1883 in Pinsk, Russia, was at the time of this Declaration residing at 1209-10th Street, Sioux City, Iowa, The record indicated he immigrated to the United

States of America from Bremen, Germany on the vessel Hanovor. His last foreign address was Telichan. Russia. He demounced allegiance to Nicholas, II, Emperor of the Russians. He arrived at the port of Galveston, Texas, April 29, 1910. This Declaration was filed May 8, 1919 in Woodbury County, Iowa.

The Certificate of Arrival for Naturalization purposes pertaining to KOVAL bore Serial No. 1103 D-844, from the office of Inspector in Charge, Galveston, Texas, March 20, 1919. Name of the alien was listed as KOWAL, ABRAM BERKS, port of entry Galveston, Texas, date of arrival April 28, 1910, vessel Hanover, filed in Woodbury County District Court on May 8, 1919.

The Petition for Naturalization for KOVAL is No. 853 and was filed in Woodbury County District Court on May 8, 1919. The name of the petitioner was ABRAM BERKO KOVAL, address 1013 Virginia Street, occupation carpenter, born January 3, 1883; Pinsk, Russia, immigrated from Bremen, Germany April 10, 1910, arrival Galveston, Texas on April 28, 1910, vessel Hanover, Doclaration of Intention January 24, 1913, Woodbury County, Sioux City, Iowa, marital status married, wife ETHEL, wife s birth date August 16, 1890, Telichany, Pinsk; Russia. Three children are listed in this petition, ISAIAH KOVAL, born at 1013 Virginia Street, Sioux City; Iowa; GEORGE KOVAL, born becember 25, 191h at 1013 Virginia Street, Sioux City, Iowa; GABRIEL KOVAL, born at 1013 Virginia Street, Sioux City, Iowa; Greet, Sioux City, Iowa; In this petition ABRAM KOVAL stated he had resided in the United States since April 29, 1910 and had resided in Iowa since May 5, 1910. The signature on this petition is ABRAM BERKO KOVAL.

Under the section for affidavits of petitioner and witnesses are the two witnesses, ISIDOR MERLIN, occupation salesman, address 1001 Iowa Street, Sioux City, Iowa, and ABRAHAM STILLMAN, occupation jeweler, 718 Iowa Street, Sioux City, Iowa. Both affirmed they had known ABRAM KOVAL since February 1, 1912.

The Oath of Allegiance was signed September 18, 1919 and the signature under this oath is ABRAHAM KOVAL. The Order of Court admitting KOVAL to citizenship is dated September 8, 1919 and lists his name as ABRAM BERKO KOVAL. He was admitted to citizenship by District Court Judge JNO ANDERSON. Cortificate of Naturalization No. 1247809 was issued September 4, 1919.

mentioned above, on March 7, 1955 produced Birth Record Book F, page 138, which records the birth of one

LOUIS KAVAL in Sioux City, Iowa on January 22, 1912, the son of ABE KAVAL, 1214-10th Street, mother listed as ETHEL SHEWISKE, book parents born in Russia. On March 8, 1955, checked the death records of Woodbury County, Iowa for the period 1912-1915 and advised they had no death record for a LOUIS KAVAL or KOVAL. also checked the death records for the poriod 1930-June, 1935 and didnot find any record of anyone named KAVAL or KOVAL as having died in Sioux City, Woodbury County, Iowa. On March 7, 1955, Rogistrar's Office, Sioux City Board of Education, produced the permanent scholastic record of ISAIAH KOVAL. He was listed as having been born in Sioux City, Iowa. His father was listed as ABRAHAM KOVAL, born Russia, occupation carpenter. Birth place of his mother was listed as Russia, however, her name was not listed. He entered the Armstrong Grade School in September, 1917, his address was listed as 619 Virginia Street, which was the only address listed on this card, which continued until ISATAH KOVAL b7C graduated from Contral High School on January 24, 1930. Central High School, Sioux City, Iowa, on March 7, 1955 produced their card on ISAIAH KOVAL, which listed his date of birth as He entored Central High School in January, 1927 and graduated on January 24, 1930. mentioned above, on March 7, 1955 produced a permanent card retained by the Sioux City Board of Education on GABRIEL KOVAL was born b7C at Sioux City, Iowa. His father's name was not listed, nowever, the name ETHEL KOVAL was listed. Place of birth of parent was listed as Russia, occupation of parent carpenter; birth place of mother listed as Russia. According to this card, GABRIEL KOVAL entered Armstrong Grade School in January, 1924 as a kindergarten student. He entered Woodrow Wilson Junior High School in January, 1930 and, according to their records, he was in school until the semester ended in June, 1932, at which time he had completed the first half of the ninth grade. stated there is nothing in their files reflecting GABRIEL KOVAL ever re-entered the Sioux City Public Schools, nor was there any notation that his credits or record had been transmitted to any other school. The address listed on the card of GABRIEL KOVAL was 619章 Virginia Street, and also 617章 Virginia Street.

Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, Sioux City, Iowa, on March 7, 1955 produced their record on GABRIED KOVAL and it was noted that the information contained on this record is identical to that contained on the permanent record card on file at the Sioux City Board of Education. there is nothing on this card indicating GABRIEL KOVAL ever returned to Woodrow Wilson Junior High School, nor that information as to his credits had been sent to any other school. On March 8, 1955, Registrar's Office, Sioux City Board of Education, advised she had made a thorough check for a record of LOUIS KOVAL or LOUIS KAVAL, and had been unable to locate any record for anyone by that name. On March 10, 1955, mentioned above, stated the KOVAL family had consisted of the father, ABE KOVAL, his wife and three boys. He stated he did not know of anyone named LOUIS KOVAL, nor did he know of the death of a KOV.L child, however, he stated that if a child had been born in 1912 and had died shortly thereafter, he would not have necessarily known it. advised ABRAM KOVAL, father of the subject, had three sisters formerly living in Sioux City, Iowa. One was GOLDIE GURSHTEL, wife of HARRY GURSHTEL, who formerly operated the Square Deal Clothing Store at 928-4th Street, Sioux City, now residing in Los ingoles, California, stated another sister of ABRAM KOVAL was Mrs. SARAH BEGUN, widow of MORRIS BEGUN, who now resides in Los angeles, California. He also stated the third sister of ABRAM KOVAL is Mrs. PEARL SILVER widow of PAUL SILVER, who formerly operated a grocery store on West 7th Street in Sioux City, Iowa. mentioned above, on March 10, 1955 advised the KOVAL family consisted of ABRAM KOVAL, his wife and two or three boys. He stated he could not reall the names of the KOVAL children, * however, he did not know anyone named LOUIS KOVIL or KAVAL and he had not known of the death of any of the KOVAL children. However, he stated if a child of ABRAM KOVAL had died in its infancy in 1912 or thereabouts, he would not have known it. Mr. KAPLAN stated the subject's father had three sisters in Sioux City, Iowa, namely Mrs. GOLDIE GURSHTEL, wife of HARRY GURSHTEL, operator of the Squaro Deal Clothing Store, presently residing in Los Angeles;

Mrs. PEARL SILVER, widow of PAUL SILVER, who formerly operated a grocery store on West 7th Street, Sioux City, presently residing Los Angeles, California; Mrs. SARAH BEGUN, widow of MORRIS BEGUN, who is presently residing in Los Angeles.

On March 10, 1955, mentioned above, produced the naturalization record for GERCHIN GURSHTEL, which is recorded in Volume 7 on page 11. An examination of the Declaration of Intention reflected same to bear No. 2086, dated Woodbury County District Court, March 11, 1919, filed Woodbury County District Court, April 27, 1921. This reflects the petition of GERCHIN GURSHTEL, age 33, occupation storekeeper, race white, complexion fair, height 5'9", weight 150 pounds, red hair, gray eyes, born May 1, 1885 at Telechany, Russia. Presence residence was listed as Sioux City; Iowa. GURSHTEL immigrated to the United States from Rotterdam, Holland on the vessel New Amsterdam. His last foreign residence was listed as Telechany Russia, marital status married, wife's name GOLDIE, born Russia, present residence Sioux City, Iowa, date of arrival at Port of New York, September 25, 1910.

Certificate of Arrival for naturalization purposes, attached to the Declaration of Intention, issued by the U. S. Department of Labor, dated Ellis Island April 12, 1921, lists the name of alien as GERSHON GUSHTEL; Port of Entry New York, New York, date of arrival September 26, 1910, vessel Nieuw Amsterdam. This certificate was filed in the Woodbury County District Court on April 27, 1921.

The Petition for Naturalization was filed in Woodbury County District Court, Sioux City, Iowa, No. 1211, on April 27, 1921. Petitioner's name is listed as GERCHIN GURSHTEL, Sioux City, Iowa, occupation storekeeper, born May 1, 1885 at Telechan, Russia, wife GOLDIE, born March 6, 1897, Telechan, Russia. No children are listed on the petition. GURSHTEL stated he was in America since September 26, 1910 and in Iowa since October 20, 1911.

The affidavit of petitioner and witnesses was dated April 27, 1921 and the witnesses were listed as Holping Hand Mission, 920-4th Street, and both of whom stated they had known GURSHTEL since April 1, 1916.

The Oath of Allegiance was signed January 5, 1922, the signature thereon is HARRY GURSHTEL, undernoath is the signature GERCHIN GURSHTEL. The Order of Court admitting petitioner to citizenship

is dated January 5, 1922 and permission was granted to change the name from GERCHIN GURSHTEL to HARRY GURSHTEL. A notation on the Petition under Memo of Continuances reflected that this matter was continued from September 7, 1921 to January, 1922, reason given "to get war record."

Certificate of Naturalization No. 1247898 was issued to GURSHTEL on February 10, 1922.

on March 14, 1955, Proceed to above, procuced Index Book 5, Marriages, page 146, which indicates an application made on January 27, 1922 for the marriage of Miss PEARL KOVAL to SAM GERTZ. Marriage Record No.43, page 562, records the marriage of SAM GERTZ, age 30, 1418 Omaha, Sioux City, Iowa, to Miss PEARL KOVAL, 1100 Jennings, age 25, affidavit of witness signed by HARRY GURSHTEL, dated January 27, 1922.

advised the application for the license was made by HARRY GURSHTEL and this couple was married on January 29, 1922 by Rabbi J. KOP-STEIN.

GERTZ on April 7, 1925, which is recorded on Book 104, page 167, and is Equity Case 50835. According to the petition, there was one minor child, GRACE GERTZ, 2 years of age, born to this union, custody being given to Mrs. PEARL GERTZ.

produced Index to Marriage No. 6, page 201, which indicates the application of Mrs. PEARL GERTZ and PAUL SILVER, filed February 13, 1930. Marriage record 57, page 428, reflects PAUL SILVER, age 35, of 1701 Ross Street, and Mrs. PEARL GERTZ, age 30, of 2028 Jones Street, had been married February 13, 1930 at Sioux City, Iowa. No clergyman was listed. Stated the affidavit as to acquaintanceship of the application for marriage certificate was signed by HARRY GURSHTEL, age 39. She further pointed out the application for marriage license was made by HARRY GURSHTEL. She also stated that in the place where the clergyman is to certify as to the marriage, the name HARRY GURSHTEL is also inserted. She stated it was common practice 25 years ago for Jewish Rabbis not to file marriage licenses, consequently, it appeared HARRY GURSHTEL had been permitted to fill out this information by the Clerk of the District Court. She advised that this Certificate of Marriage had not been filed until May 12, 1939.

An examination of the Register of Marriage Returns, Book M, page 254, furnished background information as to PEARL GERTZ. Her maiden name was listed as KOVAL, age 30 next birthday, race white,

second marriage, address 2028 Jones, place of birth, Telechan, Poland, father IZAAK KOVAL, mother GRACE WIEDEMANN. Information on this marriage return reflected PAUL SILVER's address to be 1701 Ross Street, age 35 next birthday, first marriage, occupation clerk, Davidson's Brothers Company, place of birth Liban, Latvia, father ABRAHAM SILVER, mother SARAH YODELSON.

On May 3, 1942, Mr. WILFORD S. TRIGGS, 1503 Rock, Sioux City, Iowa, advised SA one SILVER, who operates a grocery store on west its street in Sioux City, was either a Communist or a fellow traveller. Mr. TRIGGS is now deceased.

On June 18, 1948, Confidential Informant stated PAUL SILVER and HARRY GURSHTEL had married sisters, and that PAUL SILVER gave up his Jewish religion, as did GURSHTEL, and SILVER had the same strong tendencies towards Communism as GURSHTEL.

On November 20, 1951, JOHN W. ZECHMAN, Deputy Sheriff in charge of Identification Bureau, Woodbury County, Sioux City, Iowa, Sheriff's Office, advised SA that PAUL SILVER, Sheriff's Office No. 2601, occupation clerk, age 40, born Latvia, residence 619 Virginia Street, Sioux City, Iowa, was among a group of incividuals arrested by the Woodbury County Sheriff's Office on September 27, 1933 for the offense of advocating criminal syndicalism. Mr. ZECHMAN advised he was in the Sheriff's Office and had taken part in a raid on a home located at 522 Wall Street, Sioux City, Iowa, at which time PAUL SILVER and others were holding a Communist Party meeting. He stated that a vast amount of Communist Party literature and pamphlets were seized on the occasion of this raid, however, they were subsequently destroyed and he was unable to describe the articles seized. Mr. ZECHMAN advised the charges against SILVER and the others arrested were dismissed on October 16, 1935.

checked the records of the Sioux City, IoWa, Credit Bureau relative to PAUL SILVER, which files reflected PAUL SILVER had died at the age of 44 in May, 1944, that he had operated a grocery store at 800 West 7th Street, Sioux City, and had lived at 613-2nd Street, Sioux City. He married Mrs. PEARL GERTZ in 1930. This couple had twin sons, EUGENE and ELY SILVER, born about 1932.

On June 18, 1948, Confidential Informant of known reliability, Edvised Mrs. PEARL SILVER was moving to California and


The address of HARRY GURSHTEL in the 1929 through 1933 City Directories was 2028 Jones Street. The listing for HARRY GURSHTEL from 1934-1940 was 619 Virginia Street, the former residence of subject KOVAL. The address for GURSHTEL in the 1941-1947 City Directories was listed as 2130 Kennedy Drive. There was no listing for GURSHTEL in the 1948-1954 Directories.

The Sioux City City Directory for the year 1930 lists PEARL KOVAL at 2028 Jones Street; the 1931-1933 Directories lists PAUL SILVER, wife PEARL, at 2028 Jones Street. The 1934 City Directory lists PAUL and PEARL SILVER residing at 619 Virginia Street. The 1937 Directory lists PEARL and PAUL SILVER at 617 Omaha, Sioux City. The 1945 Directory listed PEARL SILVER, widow, residing at 613 Center Street. The last directory containing a listing of PEARL SILVER was in 1948. There was no 1949 Directory published.

The 1932 City Directory carried a listing of MORRIS BEGUN, wife SARAH L., residence 1116-14th Street, occupation of MORRIS BEGUN listed as Begun-Maisel Clothing, 311-4th Street. The 1932 City Directory also listed ESTHER BEGUN, occupation student, and EDITH BEGUN, occupation student, residence 1116-14th Street.

The 1933 City Directory lists SARAH BEGUN, widow of MORRIS BEGUN, and also EDITH BEGUN, at 1116-14th Street. The 1934 City Directory listed SARAH BEGUN at 619½ Virginia Street, which in 1934 was listed as the residence of HARRY GURSHTEL. The 1938-1943 Directories listed SARAH BEGUN at 866-15th Street. On May 4, 1955, was interviewed at his place of employment, Republic Aviation, Guided Missile Division, Hicksville, New York, by SA and advised the following:
He was in the subject's ASTP class at CCNY from September, 1943 to September, 1944. After the completion of the course, he believed the subject was assigned to Oak Ridge, Tennessee. He met him after World War II in 1946 when the subject returned to CCNY for the completion of his education. At that time the subject was working for some X-ray laboratory and attending CCNY. He has not heard from the subject since 1946 and does not know where he is at this time or where he was employed after 1946.
While at CCNY, the subject was a brilliant student, and it is believed by that Professor CCNY, would remember KOVAL. The subject was Triendly with students at CCNY named ARNOLD KRAMISH, and KRAMISH is presently working for the Atomic Energy Commission, location unknown, and and are working for the Atomic Energy Commission at Oak Ridge, Tennessee.
Based upon his association with the subject, is of the opinion that KOVAL was a loyal American citizen concerning whom he cannot recall derogatory information.
The indices of the New York Office, Federal Bureau of Investigation, on May 9, 1955, reflected no derogatory information that could be determined identifiable with ARNOLD KRAMISH, on the basis of background information presently known for those individuals.

was contacted at his place of employment, Hudson Laboratories, Columbia University, Dobbs Ferry. New York, by SAS on May 25, 1955, and advised the following:

He met the subject at CCNY during the Fall of 1943 while he and the latter were members of the ASTP and was in contact with KOVAL until June, 1944, at which time the subject was assigned to the Atomic Energy installation at Oak Ridge, Tennessee. After World War II, he renewed his acquaintance with KOVAL when the latter returned to CCNY in the Fall of 1946 to complete his studies for a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree. He was in contact with KOVAL from 1946 through the Fall of 1948, at which time the subject departed the United States in conjunction with employment recalled to be connected with an "electrical power development in Poland."

His contact with KOVAL during the latter's United States Army service as a member of the ASTP, CCNY, was restricted to a "fellow-student" relationship during which time he cannot recall any activity, statement, or association by the subject which would have suggested his involvement in subversive activity. He has no reason to believe that KOVAL's assignment at the Atomic Energy installation, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, during 1944 was the result of a preconceived plan by KOVAL citing as fact that assignments thereto of members of KOVAL's ASTP class were unknown by the trainees involved, and also were afforded top security regulations by the United States Army.

He has no specific knowledge regarding KOVAL's duties at Oak Ridge, Tennessee, but based upon statements made by the subject, it appears as though his duties consisted of electrical research work. He is unable to relate whether or not KOVAL had access to classified data or material while at Oak Ridge, Tennessee.

During the period 1946-1948, KOVAL's activities are best described as typical of a "veteran attending college under the provisions of the GI Bill of Rights." KOVAL was an excellent student of electrical engineering, and also was exceptionally active in fraternal affairs at CCNY. He apparently relied entirely on his "GI benefits" for his support, and consequently confined his entire activity to school work and related social events.

During this period KOVAL did make statements reflecting pro-Soviet sympathies but did not give the impression of being a Communist or a political fanatic. As an example, KOVAL, upon being questioned concerning a disputable issue involving the governments or foreign policy of Russia and the United States, without exception would attempt to logically set forth a favorable position for Russia. He did not enter into these discussions unless specifically questioned concerning a pertinent issue.

The only information recalled regarding KOVAL's early background is that he was born in Sioux City, Iowa, and, according to his statements, was orphaned during his early childhood. KOVAL never indicated that he had resided outside the United States at any time.

He was extremely evasive as to how he obtained this employment and the length of time he expected to remain abroad in conjunction with it. With the exception of sending a postcard to several of his friends in New York City during the Fall of 1948.

KOVAL has not contected any of his friends or associates in the United States since leaving for Poland. On the basis of his unknown employment in Poland and in consideration of his apparent pro-Russian thinking, it is highly probable that KOVAL is engaged, or has been engaged, in "irregular activity" which might possibly include subversive acts against the United States.

On January 2, 1941, the subject indicated his residence to be 3470 Cannon Place, Apartment I-42, Bronx, New York, in care of ABRAHAM STEVER. On March 14, 1941, KOVAL advised___ that he was employed with the REC, 11 West 25th Street, New York City, as a "Counterman". REC, directed an affidavit to Local Board
126, Selective Service System, Bronx, New York, requesting an occupational deferrment of KOVAL's induction into United States military service. In this request,







For the information of the Chicago and Pittsburgh Offices, who have not previously received information concerning this investigation the following brief summary is noted:

that during 1942 he was employed with the Raven Electric Company, New York, New York. During 1945 he was employed in the Health and Physics Department of the Manhattan Project, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, where he had access to material that could have varied from "unclassified" to "top secret". In 1948, while allegedly employed by the Atlas Trading Corporation, New York City, as a "commissioned representative", he was issued a passport for travel to various European countries, which included On(10/6/18,) he departed the United States aboard the "SS America" destined for Le Havre, France. His whereabouts since that period are unknown. Available background data developed in Sloux City, Iowa, reflects that KOVAL is a native born United States citizen of Polish derivation, who departed the United States in 1932 with his parents and brothers. He possibly resided in Russia, or outside the United States, from 1932 to 1939 or 1941. He was educated as an Electrical Engineer at the University of Iowa during 1929 to 1932, and received a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering Degree at the College of the City of New York.
