SALVATORE SCARPA, Office Manager, Mc Glynn - Hays Elevator Company, 62 Grand Street, New York City, was interviewed at his place of employment.

At the outset SCARPA was advised as to the identity of the interviewing agent, and immediately advised orally of rights as set forth on FD-395.

SCARPA advised he has been out of jail about four years now, working a full week at above company, which is owned by his sister's husband, trying to stay out of any trouble.

SCARPA stated there was an electrical fire recently at the SZS Discount Store, 13th Avenue, Brooklyn, however, the owner carried no insurance. The business has been sold for \$6,000. SCARPA admitted he hangs out from time to time in the vicinity of SZS Store. He denied that this operation belonged to his brother, GREGORY SCARPA.

SCARPA denied he had a "piece" of the Circus Lounge, Flatbush Avenue, Brooklyn, stating that it was owned by a friend of his, whom he refused to identify. He knows that it is frequented by "queers".

SCARPA advised the "old timers" are dying off, and that the kids coming along today are different and not interested in taking their place. He stated to agent that if this keeps up, the agent would be "out of a job". He refused to elaborate on this statement.

SCARPA advised he had to interview a prospective employee, and the interview was terminated.

#### DETAILS:

In the March 11, 1976 edition of the New York Times, an article appeared indicating that GREGORY SCARPA, Sr., reputedly a member of the JOSEPH COLUMBO Crime Family and 10 other individuals were indicted on 3/10/76, in connection with the operation of a regional center for policy gambling in the Borough Park section of Brooklyn. The indictments were announced by Brooklyn District Attorney EUGENE GOLD. SCARPA was charged with Bribery and Gambling. In addition to SCARPA, his son, GREGORY, JR., was also arrested.

Also arrested and charged with Perjury were PETER CACASE, 7321 12th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; SALVATORE AZZARELLO, 5423 Fort Hamilton Parkway, Brooklyn, New York; and NICK STOLFI, 1126 73rd Street, Brooklyn, New York. Charged with Criminal Contempt was JOHN SAPONARO, 179 Ardmore Street, Staten Island, New York, and arrested and charged with Promoting Gambling was ETTORE SAMMARCO, 1353 73rd Street,

Brooklyn, New York.

Not arrested but indicted for Perjury and being sought were CHARLES MONOCO, 1253 66th Street, Brooklyn, New York; NICK DI LIA, formerly of 7602 15th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York; ROBERT STASIO, 6605 14th Avenue, Brooklyn, New York, and JOSEPH AMBROSINO, address unknown.
