Assets of that business were acquired by the Freeman Store and Equipment Company and at present, FREEMAN is the owner of the Freeman Building Corporation, which owns the building at 1200 West 28th Street. This building is occupied by the Freeman Store and Equipment Company and Norben, Inc., and FREEMAN is presently treasurer of all these corporations.

Informant further advised that Norben, Inc. manufactures a line of anodized aluminum gift ware, including tumblers, bowls, dishes, coasters, trays, clocks, icebox dishes, and other kinds under the brand name Gemtone and that this company was short of aluminum but that during the late part of 1951 and early 1952, the company obtained additional supplies of aluminum, having imported it from Italian sources.

Investigation conducted by this office reflects that this person is identical with SOLOMAN AARON LISCHINSKY who resides at RFD #2, Sterling Virginia and who is the subject of a Security Matter - C investigation conducted by this office which was based upon information furnished by Miss ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY as reflected in the report of SA RICHARD E. LEONARD at Washington, D. C. dated October 13, 1950 in the case captioned SOLOMAN AARON LISCHINSKY, Was. SolyLischinsky, SolyLeschinsky and SolyLeshinsky, Security Matter - C. This report reflects that LISCHINSKY has been in frequent contact with HAROLD GLASSER and that GLASSER, when interviewed on May 30 and May 3, 1947 by agents of the Washington Field Office, stated in part "I met SolyLischinsky in Chicago, Illinois in 1932. 

Information reported by Informants of the Newark Office reflects additionally that in 1944 and 1945 WOLFSON was in close contact with a number of C.P. members and party functionaries in N.J. and regularly contributed financially to the C.P. In 1946 and 1947 WOLFSON was active in contributing to the American Youth for Democracy.

Newark Confidential Informant of known reliability, advised in 11/48 that WOLFSON had been a member of the C.P. for 25 or 30 years but did not then attend C.P. meetings and was no longer interested in the C.P. This latter informant observed however, that when approached by C.P. members for funds, WOLFSON donated substantial amounts. In 1948 he donated \$200 to the Progressive Citizens of America.

Since 1940 WOLFSON has at one time or another been active in the following C.P. front organizations; Washington Committee for Democratic Action, National Federation for Constitutional Liberties and Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee.

Informants of the Newark Office who were contacted in 8/49, advised that they knew of no current C.P. activity on the part of Dr. WOLFSON.

By letter dated 12/20/51 entitled "BORIS BYKOV, ESPIONAGE - RUSSIAN", NY 100-287685, the New York Office was furnished by Newark with a photograph of Dr. WILSON as well as a physical description. It is additionally noted that Dr. ABRAHAM WOLFSON is the brother-in-law of HARRY DEXTEN WHITE one of the subjects in the case entitled "NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, was., ETAL, ESPIONAGE - RUSSIAN, NY 105-1393.

W. 19th Street, secured a Florida Driver's License on October 30, 1951, at which time he stated he was born July 15, 1832, white, male, with blue eyes, gray hair, 5'6" tall, 160 pounds, and gave occupation as retired. COHEN held Illinois Driver's License #569-490 in the past.

The Dade County Voting Registration records list MORRIS COHEN, 1660 S. W. 19th Street, a resident of Miami, Florida, since September, 1947, registered as a voter November 23, 1948. The files of the Miami Credit Bureau list MORAIS COHEN with wife, LENA, residing at 1611 S. W. 19th Street, as of December 3, 1947, at which time he was sixty-five years of age. This record lists him as being born in Poland; indicates he started in the building contracting business in Chicago in 1925, and was in business for himself until 1927, at which time he was elected Secretary of the Northwest Side Lumber Company in Chicago. That concern was unsuccessful and he later appeared as Secretary and Treasurer of the Harvey Lumber and Supply Company on 147th Street in Harvey, Illinois. He formerly resided at 34 N. E. 155th Street, Harvey, Illinois.

T-2, of known reliability, listed MORRIS COHEN as President of the Sibley Lumber Company of 30 East 147th Street, Harvey, Illinois, as of September, 1947. Sibley Lumber Company was described as an Illinois corporation chartered in October, 1946, formed to succeed the Sibley Lumber Company (not incorporated), which was owned and operated individually by MORRIS COHEN. Miss ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY, a self-confessed former Soviet espionage agent, has advised that P. BERNARD NORTMAN and she were both around 1936 members of Unit 1 of the Harlem Section of the Communist Party. She stated that she saw NORTMAN frequently at Communist Party meetings and from her observation of his activities she believed he was very active and he could well have been a functionary within Unit 1 of the Harlem Section of the Communist Party. She advised that about 1937 this unit was split and NORTMAN became associated with another unit of the Communist Party. Miss RENTLEY continued to meet NORTMAN around Columbia University until about 1938 and knew that he was still active in Communist Party activities.

The Communist Party has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

HARRY DEXTER WHITE has been named by ELIZABETH BENTLEY as a member of a Soviet espionage ring who furnished information to the Soviets while he was in an official capacity with the Treasury Department. It is further noted that HAROLD GLASSER was with the United States Treasury Department during the same period as HARRY DEXTER WHITE.

On April 1, 1952, Confidential Informant T-Wadvised GLASSER had also contacted the number FArmingdale 2-1700.

On June 17, 1952, Confidential Informant T-Wadvised that the subscriber to the above number was The City of Glass, Melville Road, Farmingdale, Long Island, New York. The City of Glass is a well-known garden nursery on Long Island,

Confidential Informant T-Zadvised in April, 1952, that GLASSER had received correspondence from LISHINSKY, R. F. D. 2, Sterling, Virginia.

de (u) Confidential, Informant T-47also advised that GLASSER had contacted one S. XESHCHINSKY, telephone number 10Wl, Herndon, Virginia.

The 1952 telephone directory for Washington, D. C., lists telephone number 10Wl for SOLABISHINSKY. Investigation conducted by the Richmond office disclosed that this person is identical with SOLOMON AARON THIS CHINSKY who resides at R. F. D. 2, Sterling, Virginia.

The subject, when interviewed on April 30, 1947, and May 3, 1947, advised that he met SOL LISCHINSKY in Chicago in 1932. GLASSER stated that LISCHINSKY was a long-time friend and he still regarded him as a close friend.

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ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY advised that during the early part of 1944 EARL BROWDER arranged a meeting for her with the group which was known as a PERLO espionage group. It was indicated at this meeting that all the individuals were government employees and were furnishing information which they had obtained from government files for use of the Soviet Union. Subsequent to this meeting, BENTLEY recalled that a member of this group was SOL LISCHINSKY, who was an employee of UNRRA. BENTLEY stated, however, that she could not recall having ever received any information from LISCHINSKY.

The informant stated that he had no specific information as to whether SUPERIOR was a member of the Communist Party, but that in his study of Communism he felt that SUPERIOR was inclined along those lines.



Reference is being made to New York letter to Director, 7/24/52 in case entitled "JAMES MICHAEL ANSARA, ESPIONAGE - R" (Bufile 100-352833). This letter reflects that RAPHAEL CHARLES POLLOCK had changed his address to 3613 Military Road, N.W., Washington, D.C. Further this letter reflects that POLLOCK in 1951 went to Quito, Ecuador, as assistant Director of the Institute of Overseas Studies. As you are aware, HAROLD GLASSER was at that time and is currently the Director of the Institute of Overseas Studies.

In the report of SA WILLIAM H. ATKINSON, 2/20/52, Washington D. C. in the ANSARA matter it was requested that POLLOCK be interviewed regarding JAMES M. ANSARA inasmuch as ANSARA and PCLLOCK were coemployers in the Foreign Economic Administration.

Inasmuch as New York has not been advised to the contrary, it is assumed that POLLOCK has been interviewed by the WFO re ANSARA.

In view of the fact that POLLOCK was assistant Director to GLASSER in the Institute of Overseas Studies, and the WFO feels that POLLOCK was cooperative in the interview regarding ANSARA, the Bureau is requested to authorize WFO to interview POLLOCK re GLASSER. Should WFO have any objections to such an interview, it is requested that the WFO advise the Bureau of these objections.

For the benefit of the WFO in conducting the proposed interview, it is noted that GLASSER for the past few months has received numerous correspondence from various export firms in New York City. He has also contacted various firms in Italy, Germany and Belgium asking price quotations and ordering materials, which is an indication that possibly GLASSER is engaged in export and import activities.

It is requested that the WFO attempt to ascertain from POLLOCK the exact nature of subject's duties with the Institute of Overseas Studies along with his reported export activities. WFO is also requested to ascertain subject's associates, activities and current sympathies.

Membership in the Independent Progressive Party, however, does not of itself, indicate Communist Party membership on the part of any particular member.

The Communist Party has been cited by the Attorney General as falling within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

T-4, T-5 and T-6, all of known reliability, who have been generally familiar with some Communist activities in the Los Angeles area, which includes Inglewood, California, had no information concerning MARGERY ROWEN, SEYMOUR LESTER DRIBBEN, LILLIAN DRIBBEN or S. E. DRIBBEN, (X)

It is noted that in the report of SA ROBERT F.X.O'KEEFE dated April 25, 1949, at New York in the JAHAM case (Bureau file #74-1333) on page 14, HAROLD L. POSNER was interviewed at which time he advised that he had a brother, STANLEY I. POSNER, and further that KATHERINE WILLS PERLO had identified a brother of HAROLD POSNER as "sympathetic or a member." Inasmuch as it is not known whether or not STANLEY POSNER is the only brother of HAROLJ or that Mrs. PERLO had STANLEY in mind, this information was not included in rerep.

Concerning Mrs. ARTHUR J. GOLDB RG, also mentioned in rerep, it is noted that in the report of SA LAMBERT G. ZANDER dated December 23, 1946, at Washington, D.C., Page 17, as well as in SA ZANDER's report dated March 25, 1947, Page 4, in the GREGORY case, Mrs. GOLDBERG corresponded with Mrs. GLASSER. information was not set out in rerep because it was not determined pertinent to this inquiry.

Concerning ARTHUR J. GOLDBERG, in reports of SA THOMAS A. MENDENHALL dated February 7, 1951, and April 3, 1951, at Washington, D.C., entitled "UNSUB, wa., HARE (SOVME) Espionage-R, there is set forth information indicating Communist activity and association on the part of GOLDBIRG.

In addition, the files of this office could furnish information indicating association on the part of GOLDBERG with the National Lawyers' Guild and the National Federation for Constitutional Liberties.

It is also noted that in a report of SA W. ALBERT STEWART, JR., dated April 10, 1946, at Washington, D.C., in the GR. GORY case, on Page 7, it was indicated that GOLDBERG and GLASSER were in telephonic communication. However, in view of the fact that it was clearly indicated that las. ARTHUR J. 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The files of this office reflect that investigations were conducted concerning SEITZ in 1942 and 1948, at which time the following background information was developed concerning him:

He was born on May 17, 1905, in New York City, and attended New York University, receiving a B.S. Degree in 1926 and a B.J. Degree in 1929. He was married to MYRA PATRICIA TOLINS on December 23, 1931. He formerly resided at 4920 Hamben Lane Bethesda, Maryland, and 409 Rosemary Street, Chevy Chase, Natyland

From 1929 to 1932, SEITZ was employed as an Attorney in the law firm of Kaye, McDavitt, and Scholer, 149 Broadway, New York City, and from 1932 to 1934, in the law firm of Rosenman, Weil, Gotshal, and Mange, New York City. He entered on duty on June 11, 1934, as Assistant Counsel, with the National Recovery Administration and served until February 15, 1936, when he transerred to the Social Security Board, where he served in the Office of the General Counsel. He held the position of Principal Attorney at the time of his separation from this agency on August 27, 1942. On August 28, 1942, he began work in the Labor Department as Principal Attorney in the Office of the Solicitor. He transferred from the Labor Department to the National War Labor Board on February 13, 1945, and was made Vice-Chairman of the Appeals Committee. He served with this agency and with the National Wage Stabilization Board until February 13, 1947, when he returned to the Labor Department on February 24, 1947, and served as Attorney-Advisor in the Solicitor's Office until October 5, 1947. On October 6, 1947, he was made General Counsel, Office of the General Counsel.

The files of the Labor Department, as reviewed by the writer, reflect that he resigned this position on October 26, 1951, and gave his forwarding address as PETER SEITZ, Vice-President in Charge of Industrial Relations, Liebmann Breweries, Incorporated, 36 Forrest Street, Brooklyn, New York. The file also reflects that during various periods subsequent to April 2, 1951, SEITZ was on a loan basis on special assignment with the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

During the course of the investigations conducte concerning SEITZ, it was developed that according to the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, SEITZ was





a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, the American League for Peace and Democracy, and the National Lawyers' Guild. The Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the American League for Peace and Democracy have been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835, and the National Lawyers' Guild has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist front.

When interviewed in connection with the investigation conducted in 1942, SEITZ denied membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action but admitted receiving literature from this organization. He admitted membership in the American League for Peace and Democracy from early 1939 until October 30, 1939, at which time he formally resigned by directing a letter to that organization, a copy of which he furnished to this office. He likewise admitted membership in the National Lawyers! Guild from which he formally resigned on June 28, 1940.

Confidential Informant T-2 Jof known reliability, advised in April, 1948, that SEITZ was a national member of the National Lawyers' Guild with dues last paid for 1946 - 1947.

During the course of the 1948 investigation of SEITZ, Confidential Informant T-3, or known reliability, advised that SEITZ at that time was receiving literature from the National Lawyers' Guild, 902 20th Street, N.W., and that on December 7, 1947, the National Lawyers' Guild sent him a bill for dues from April 1, 1947, to March 21, 1948. T-2/could not advise as to whether or not these dues had been paid. It was also developed during this investigation that according to Confidential Informant T-4. For known reliability, subject's brother, JULIUS SEITZ, and JULIUS's wife, HELEN, who were at that time residing at Croton-On-Hudson, New York, were members of the Croton-On-Hudson Communist Party Club in 1948. JULIUS SEITZ was issued Membership Book Number 32720 and HELEN, who was listed as Membership Secretary, was issued Book Number 32719.

The records of the D.C. Board of Education, Franklin School Building, 13th K Streets, N.W., reflect that MYRA FOLINS FITZ-was born on November 3, 1907, in Brooklyn, New-York. She received an A.B. Degree from Cornell University in 1928 and A.A. Degree from Sorbonne, Paris, France, in 1929. She received a Ph.D Degree from New York University in 1935. These records further reflect that she was employed as an instructor at New York University, part-time, from 1931 to 1935; at Brooklyn College from the street of the str



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1932 to 1935, evenings, and Pennsylvania State College during the summers 1934 and 1935.

Mrs. SEITZ was appointed a High School Language Teacher in the D.C. Public Schools on September 1, 1936, and served in various high schools throughout the city until January 31, 1952, at which time she resigned except for the period from July 1, 1939, to April 4, 1941, during which time she was on maternity leave.

The files of this office reflect that according to Confidential Informant T-5, or known reliability, the name of Mrs. PETER SEITZ, 4920 Hamden Lane, Bethesda, Maryland, appeared in the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, previously described.

Confidential Informant T-6 of known reliability, advised that the name of Mrs. PETER SEITZ, 3920 Hamden Lane, Bethesda, Maryland, appeared in a list of members as of January 1, 1941, of the League of Women Shoppers in Washington, D.C. The League of Women Shoppers has been cited by the House Committee as a Communist controlled front organization.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, in 1942, made available what was believed to have been the active indices or mailing list of the United American Spanish Aid Committee. On this list were the names, Mr. and Mrs. PETER SEITZ, not further identified. This organization has been declared by the Attorney General as an organization within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

It was previously reported that the subject received correspondence from POSNER; BERGE, FOX, and ARENT, 1200 18th Street, N.W. Martindale-Hubbell Law Directory for 1951 reflects this to be a law firm with offices in the Ring Building, 1200 18th Street, N.W. The firm is reportedly engaged in general practice and observations in Taxation, Labor Relations, Anti-Trust, Trade Regulations, and International and Administrative Law. The New York Office of this firm is indicated to be Arent, Friedburg, Rich, and Blue, 8 W. 40th Street, New York City.

STANLEY I. POSNER, Partner, was born on July 15, 1909, in Leominster, Massachusetts. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1938. He received a B.A. Degree from Amherst in 1930, a M.A. Degree in Economics from the University of Chicago in 1932, and an LL.B. Degree from Harvard Law School in 1938. He also attended Brookings Institute, Washington, D.C., in 1933. Current directories reflect his present address as 3750 Oliver Street, N.W.

Confidential Informant T-27 has advised that STANLEY I. POSNER, 213 Standard Oil Building, Washington, D.C. was a member of the D.C. Chapter of the National Lawyers' Guild during 1947-1948.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, in 1944 furnished a list of expired members of the Washington Bookshop.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised concerning this list that the date following the name indicated the last payment of dues and stated that the fact that a person is listed as an expired member did not necessarily mean that membership had actually expired.

The following appeared on this list:

"STANLEY I. POSNER #208, 8/10/40, 1024 Woodward Building, DI. 5405."

Confidential Informant T-10, of known reliability, on March 8, 1950, advised that ROBERT SILBERSTEIN, National Executive Secretary of the National Lawyers' Guild, suggested to DAN CRYSTAL that the latter consult STANLEY POSNER for views concerning the availability of jobs in Washington, D.C.

It is to be noted that Confident al Informant T-11, of known reliability, has advised that DAN CRYSTAL was a Communist Party member in 1949.

WENDELL BERGE Partner, was born on April 23, 1903, in Lincoln, Nebraska. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1931. He received an A.B. Degree from the University of Nebraska in 1925, an L.L.B. Degree from the University of



Michigan in 1927, and a S.J.D. Degree from the same university in 1930. He served as Special Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States from 1930 to 1941 and as Assistant Attorney General from 1941 to 1947. Current directories reflect his address as 9508 W. Stanhope Road, Rock Creek Hills, Maryland.

Confidential Informant T-2, BERGE was a member of the D.C. Chapter of the National Lawyers' Guild, with dues last paid for 1947-1948.

HENRY J. FOX, Partner, was born on January 21, 1911, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin He was admitted to the Bar in Wisconsin in 1934 and in Florida_and the District_of_Columbia in 1942. He received a B.A. Degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1932, an LL.B. Degree from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 1934, and a S.J.D. Degree in 1937. He also received an LL.M. Degree from Harvard University in 1936. FOX was a member of the faculty of the University of Wisconsin Law School from 1936 to 1937; the University of Kentucky Law School from 1937 to 1938; for Stetson Law School from 1937 - 1938. an attorney with the National Labor Relations Board from 1937 to 1938 with the Rural Electrification Administration in 1938 and with the Department of Justice from 1941 to 1942. address, according to current directories is 6401 Beechwood Drive, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

The files of this office contained no pertinent identifiable security information concerning FOX.

ALBERT E. ARENT, Partner, was born on August 25, 1911, in Rochester, New York. He was admitted to the New York Bar in 1945. He received a B.A. Degree from Cornell University in 1932, and an LL.B. Degree from Cornell Law School in 1935. He was employed as an Attorney with the United States Bureau of Internal Revenue from 1935 to 1939 and with the Department of Justice from 1939 until 1942. The current directories reflect his address as 7008 Rolling Road, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

According to Confidential Informant T-12, of known reliability, ALBERT E. ARENT, 362 N. Glebe Road, Arlington, Virginia, was listed as an active member of the National Lawyers' Guild, with dues last paid on March 2, 1940.

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Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, has advised that among the effects of one SARAH BHAPIRO, who formerly resided at 29 Buchanan Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., were the names of various individuals which were noted on pages of different books and slips of paper inside the books. Among these names was that of ALBERT ARENT, 7008 Rolling Road, Chevy Chase 1913. The informant could furnish no information as to the significance of ARENT's name appearing in SHAPIRO'S effects.

On June 1, 1944, Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that as of May 6, 1944, the official records of the Communist Party, D.C., contained information that SARAH SHAPIRO was a member of the Mid-City Club and was either recruited or reported into that club as of April 8, 1943.

She was employed as a Special Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States from 1942 to 1945. Current directories reflect her address as 200 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W.

The files of this office contain no pertinent identifiable security information concerning MEYER.

MILTON M. COTTESMAN, Associate, was born on May 16, 1922, in New York City. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1948. He received an A.B. Degree from Columbia University in 1943, and an LL.B. Degree from the Yale Law School in 1948. Current directories reflect his address as 2700 Q Street, N.W.

The files of this office contain no identifiable information concerning GOTTESMAN.

It was previously reported that correspondence was received by the subject from Mrs. ARTHUR J. COLDBERG, 2811 Albermarle Street, N.W.

The files of the D.C. Credit Bureau, as checked by SE WALTER J. TOLSON, reflect a report dated February 27, 1951, for ARTHUR J. and DOROTHY B. GOLDBERG, who have resided at 2811 Albermarle Street, N.W., since August, 1950. The July, 1952, Address Telephone Directory for D.C. and Vicinity reflects ARTHUR J. GOLDBERG as still residing at the above address.

According to the credit report, Mr. GOLDBERG has been General National Counsel of the C.I.O. since 1947, and he previously had law offices in Chicago, Illinois, where he resided at 5411 S. Greenwood Street. His wife is listed as unemployed.

The files of this office fail to reflect and pertinent identifiable security information concerning DOROTHY B GOLDBERG, nee \KURGANS.


In connection with another investigation, SA LEWIS E. GLENN interviewed Mr. H.J. BITTERMAN, Senior Finance Advisor, Treasury Department. During the course of the interview, Mr.



BITTERMAN advised that he came to the Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, about September of 1943, at which time HARRY DEXTER WHITE, was the Director of the Division. He stated that WILLIAM H. TAYLOR, HAROLD GLASSER, EDWARD M. BURN-STEIN, and an individuals named NESS were Assistant Directors According to Mr. BITTERMAN, GLASSER and TAYLOR perof WHITE. formed similar functions in the Division, primarily dealing with geographical problems in countries other than those in the Far East. He said that both GLASSER and TAYLOR went on missions abroad for the Treasury Department, and in general when GLASSER was abroad, TAYLOR was here and when TAYLOR was abroad, GLASSER was here. He said that the Division under WHITE was a rather disorganized operation, in that there was never a clear cut division of functions. He continued by stating that WHITE became an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury after the Bretton Woods conference in order that he might present to Congress the bill dealing with the Fund of the International Monetary Fund and the International Bank. He said that when WHITE became Assistant Secretary, FRANK COE came to the Division of Monetary Research as Director of the Division. He advised that as a result of COE's appointment as Director of the Division, relations between GLASSER and COE were "cool," and those between BURNSTEIN and COE were "worse than cool."

Mr. BITTERMAN stated that he considered COE, GLASSER, TAYLOR, and WHITE, to be "new dealers who were products of the depression era," and that they were interested in equitable distribution of wealth through progressive taxation, full employment, expansion of international policy, and considered it desirable and possible to reach an agreement with Russia.

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The files of this office reflect that investigations were conducted concerning SEITZ in 1942 and 1948, at which time the following background information was developed concerning him:

He was born on May 17, 1905, in New York City, and attended New York University, receiving a B.S. Degree in 1926 and a B.J. Degree in 1929. He was married to MYRA PATRICIA TOLINS on December 23, 1931. He formerly resided at 4920 Hamden Lane, Bethesda, Maryland, and 409 Rosemary Street, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

From 1929 to 1932, SEITZ was employed as an Attorney in the law firm of Kaye, McDavitt, and Scholer, 149 Broadway, New York City, and from 1932 to 1934, in the law firm of Rosenman, Weil, Gotshal, and Mange, New York City. He entered on duty on June 11, 1934, as Assistant Counsel, with the National Recovery Administration and served until February 15, 1936, when he transerred to the Social Security Board, where he served in the Office of the General Counsel. He held the position of Principal Attorney at the time of his separation from this agency on August 27, 1942. On August 28, 1942, he began work in the Labor Department as Principal Attorney in the Office of the Solicitor. He transferred from the Labor Department to the National War Labor Board on February 13, 1945, and was made Vice-Chairman of the Appeals Committee. He served with this agency and with the National Wage Stabilization Board until February 13, 1947, when he returned to the Labor Department on February 24, 1947, and served as Attorney-Advisor in the Solicitor's Office until October 5, 1947. On October 6, 1947, he was made General Counsel, Office of the General Counsel.

The files of the Labor Department, as reviewed by the writer, reflect that he resigned this position on October 26, 1951, and gave his forwarding address as PETER SEITZ, Vice-President in Charge of Industrial Relations, Liebmann Breweries, Incorporated, 36 Forrest Street, Brooklyn, New York. The file also reflects that during various periods subsequent to April 2, 1951, SEITZ was on a loan basis on special assignment with the Office of the Secretary of Defense.

During the course of the investigations conducted concerning SEITZ, it was developed that according to the files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, SEITZ was

a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, the American League for Peace and Democracy, and the National Lawyers' Guild. The Washington Committee for Democratic Action and the American League for Peace and Democracy have been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835, and the National Lawyers' Guild has been cited by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist front.

When interviewed in connection with the investigation conducted in 1942, SEITZ denied membership in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action but admitted receiving literature from this organization. He admitted membership in the American League for Peace and Democracy from early 1939 until October 30, 1939, at which time he formally resigned by directing a letter to that organization, a copy of which he furnished to this office. He likewise admitted membership in the National Lawyers! Guild from which he formally resigned on June 28, 1940.

Confidential Informant T-2 Jof known reliability, advised in April, 1948, that SEITZ was a national member of the National Lawyers' Guild with dues last paid for 1946 - 1947.

Confidential Informant T-3.7 of known reliability, advised that SEITZ at that time was receiving literature from the National Lawyers' Guild, 902 20th Street, N.W., and that on December 7, 1947, the National Lawyers' Guild sent him a bill for dues from April 1, 1947, to March 21, 1948. T-27 outs not advise as to whether or not these dues had been paid. It was also developed during this investigation that according to Confidential Informant T-4. For known reliability, subject's brother, JULIUS SEITZ, and JULIUS's wife, HELEN, who were at that time residing at Croton-On-Hudson, New York, were members of the Croton-On-Hudson Communist Party Club in 1944. JULIUS SEITZ was issued Membership Book Number 32720 and HELEN, who was listed as Membership Secretary, was issued Book Number 32719.

The records of the D.C. Board of Education, Franklin School Building, 13th K Streets, N.W., reflect that MYRA TOLINS SEITZ was born on November 3, 1907, in Brooklyn, New York. She received an A.B. Degree from Cornell University in 1928 and a M.A. Degree from Sorbonne, Paris, France, in 1929. She received a Ph.D Degree from New York University in 1935. These records further reflect that she was employed as an instructor at New York University, part-time, from 1931 to 1935; at Brooklyn College from





1932 to 1935, evenings, and Pennsylvania State College during the summers 1934 and 1935.

Mrs. SEITZ was appointed a High-School Language Teacher in the D.C. Public Schools on September 1, 1936, and served in various high schools throughout the city until January 31, 1952, at which time she resigned except for the period from July 1, 1939, to April 4, 1941, during which time she was on maternity leave.

The files of this office reflect that according to Confidential Informant T-5, Opt known reliability, the name of Mrs. PETER SEITZ, 4920 Hamden Lane, Bethesda, Maryland, appeared in the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, previously described.

Confidential Informant T-6, Jor known reliability, advised that the name of Mrs. PETER SEITZ, 3920 Hamden Lane, Bethesda, Maryland, appeared in a list of members as of January 1, 1941, of the League of Women Shoppers in Washington, D.C. The League of Women Shoppers has been cited by the House Committee as a Communist controlled front organization.

Confidential Informant T-7, of known reliability, in 1942, made available what was believed to have been the active indices or mailing list of the United American Spanish Aid Committee. On this list were the names, Mr. and Mrs. PETER SEITZ, not further identified. This organization has been declared by the Attorney General as an organization within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

It was previously reported that the subject received correspondence from POSNER, BERGE, FOX, and ARENT, 1200 18th Street, N.W. Martindale - Hubbell Law Director y for 1951 reflects this to be a law firm with offices in the Ring Building, 1200 18th Street, N.W. The firm is reportedly engaged in general practice and observations in Taxation, Labor Relations, Anti-Trust, Trade Regulations, and International and Administrative Law. The New York Office of this firm is indicated to be Arent, Friedburg, Rich, and Blue, 8 W. 40th Street, New York City.

The following background information concerning the partners and associates of this firm was taken from Martindale-Hubbell:

STANLEY I. POSNER, Partner, was born on July 15, 1909, in Leominster, Massachusetts. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1938. He received a B.A. Degree from Amherst in 1930, a M.A. Degree in Economics from the University of Chicago in 1932, and an LL.B. Degree from Harvard Law School in 1938. He also attended Brookings Institute, Washington, D.C., in 1933. Current directories reflect his present address as 3750 Oliver Street, N.W.

Confidential Informant T-2 has advised that STANLEY I. POSNER, 213 Standard Oil Building, Washington, D.C. was a member of the D.C. Chapter of the National Lawyers' Guild during 1947-1948.

Confidential Informant T-8, of known reliability, in 1944 furnished a list of expired members of the Washington Bookshop.

Confidential Informant T-9, of known reliability, advised concerning this list that the date following the name indicated the last payment of dues and stated that the fact that a person is listed as an expired member did not necessarily mean that membership had actually expired.

The following appeared on this list:

*STANLEY I. POSNER #208, 8/10/40, 1024 Woodward Building, DI. 5405.

Confidential Informant T-10 of known reliability, on March 8, 1950, advised that ROBERT SILBERSTEIN, National Executive Secretary of the National Lawyers Guild, suggested to DAN CRYSTAL that the latter consult STANLEY POSNER for views concerning the availability of jobs in Washington, D.C.

It is to be noted that Confidential Informant T-11, X(u) of known reliability, has advised that DAN CRYSTAL was a Communist Party member in 1949.

WENDELL BERGE Partner, was born on April 23, 1903, in Lincoln, Nebraska. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1931. He received an A.B. Degree from the University of Nebraska in 1925, an L.L.B. Degree from the University of



Michigan in 1927, and a So.D. Degree rom the same university in 1930. He served as Special Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States from 1930 to 1941 and as Assistant Attorney General from 1941 to 1947. Current directories reflect his address as 9508 W. Stanhope Road, Rock Creek Hills, Maryland.

The files of this office reflect that according to Confidential Informant T-2, EERGE was a member of the D.C. Chapter of the National Lawyers Guild, with dues last paid for 1947-1948.

HENRY J. FOX, Partner, was born on January 21, 1911, in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He was admitted to the Bar in Wisconsin in 1934 and in Florida and the District of Columbia in 1942. He received a B.A. Degree from the University of Wisconsin Law School in 1934, and a S.J.D. Degree in 1937. He also received an LL.M. Degree from Harvard University in 1936. FOX was a member of the faculty of the University of Wisconsin Law School from 1936 to 1937; the University of Kentucky Law School from 1937 to 1938; for Stetson Law School from 1937 - 1938. He was an attorney with the National Labor Relations Board from 1937 to 1938 with the Rural Electrification Administration in 1938 and with the Department of Justice from 1941 to 1942. His address, according to current directories is 6401 Beechwood Drive, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

The files of this office contained no pertinent identifiable security information concerning FOX.

ALBERT E. ARENT, Partner, was born on August 25, 1911, in Rochester, New York. He was admitted to the New York Bar in 1945. He received a B.A. Degree from Cornell University in 1932, and an LL.B. Degree from Cornell Law School in 1935. He was employed as an Attorney with the United States Bureau of Internal Revenue from 1935 to 1939 and with the Department of Justice from 1939 until 1942. The current directories reflect his address as 7008 Rolling Road, Chevy Chase, Maryland.

According to Confidential Informant T-12.7of known reliability, ALBERT E. ARENT, 362 N. Glebe Road, Arlington, Virginia, was listed as an active member of the National Lawyers' Guild, with dues last paid on March 2, 1940.

Confidential Informant T-13, of known reliability, who has advised that among the effects of one SARAH SHAPIRO, who formerly resided at 29 Buchanan Street, N.E., Washington, D.C., were the names of various individuals which were noted on pages of different books and slips of paper inside the books. Among these names was that of ALBERT ARENT, 7008 Rolling Road, Chevy Chase, OL. 2983. The informant could furnish no information as to the significance of ARENT's name appearing in SHAPIRO's effects.

On June 1, 1944, Confidential Informant T-14, of known reliability, advised that as of May 6, 1944, the official records of the Communist Party, D.C., contained information that SARAH SHAPIRO was a member of the Mid-City Club and was either recruited or reported into that club as of April 8, 1943.

JEAN R. MEYER, Associate, was born on April 27, 1912, in Portland, Oregon. She was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1938. She received an LL.B. Degree from the Northwestern College of Law in 1938. She was employed as a Special Assistant to the Attorney General of the United States from 1942 to 1945. Current directories reflect her address as 200 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W.

The files of this office contain no pertinent identifiable security information concerning MEYER.

MILTON M. GOTTESMAN, Associate, was born on May 16, 1922, in New York City. He was admitted to the D.C. Bar in 1948. He received an A.B. Degree from Columbia University in 1943, and an LL.B. Degree from the Yale Law School in 1948. Current directories reflect his address as 2700 Q Street. N.W.

The files of this office contain no identifiable information concerning GOTTESMAN.

It was previously reported that correspondence was received by the subject from Mrs. ARTHUR J. GOLDBERG, 2811 Albermarie Street, N.W.

The files of the D.C. Credit Bureau, as checked by SE WALTER J. TOLSON, reflect a report dated February 27, 1951, for ARTHUR J. and DOROTHY B. GOLDBERG, who have resided at 2811 Albermarle Street, N.W., since August, 1950. The July, 1952, Address Telephone Directory for D.C. and Vicinity reflects ARTHUR J. GOLDBERG as still residing at the above address. According to the credit report, Mr. GOLDBERG has been General National Counsel of the C.I.O. since 1947, and he previously had law offices in Chicago, Illinois, where he resided at 5411 S. Greenwood Street. His wife is listed as unemployed.

The files of this office fail to reflect any pertinent identifiable security information concerning DOROTHY B. GOLDBERG, nee KURGANS.

In connection with another investigation, SA LEWIS E. GLENN interviewed Mr. H.J. BITTERMAN, Senior Finance Advisor, Treasury Department. During the course of the interview, Mr.

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BITTERMAN advised that he came to the Division of Monetary Research, Treasury Department, about September of 1943, at which time HARRY DEXTER WHITE was the Director of the Division. stated that WILLIAM H. TAYLOR, HAROLD GLASSER, EDWARD M. BURN-STEIN, and an individuals named NESS were Assistant Directors According to Mr. BITTERMAN, GLASSER and TAYLOR perof WHITE. formed similar functions in the Division, primarily dealing with geographical problems in countries other than those in the Far East. He said that both GLASSER and TAYLOR went on missions abroad for the Treasury Department, and in general when GLASSER was abroad, TAYLOR was here and when TAYLOR was abroad, GLASSER was here. He said that the Division under WHITE was a rather disorganized operation, in that there was never a clear cut division of functions. He continued by stating that WHITE became an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury after the Bretton Woods conference in order that he might present to Congress the bill dealing with the Fund of the International Monetary Fund and the International Bank. He said that when WHITE became Assistant Secretary, FRANK COE came to the Division of Monetary Research as Director of the Division. He advised that as a result of COE's appointment as Director of the Division, relations between GLASSER and COE were "cool," and those between BURNSTEIN and COE were "worse than cool."

Mr. BITTERMAN stated that he considered COE, GLASSER, TAYLOR, and WHITE, to be "new dealers who were products of the depression era," and that they were interested in equitable distribution of wealth through progressive taxation, full employment, expansion of international policy, and considered it desirable and possible to reach an agreement with Russia.





During the course of the interview, it was ascentained that DANIEL has shared her apartment for the last four years with a Miss DOROTHY BUCKLEY, concerning whom CROWLEY furnished the following information:

She is presently the Senior High School Librarian, but since 12/23/52 has been on a leave of absence because of a trip she is making to India. MENORANDUI IN OPPOSITION TO DOTION, FOR STAY

Appellants, by these motions to stay "the effectiveness" of the orders of the District Court entered on April 10, 1957, seek to frustrate the operation of section 3486 of Title 18, U. S. Code, and the attempts of the Internal Security Subscommittee of the United States Senate to utilize this statute.

Appellants seek to maintain a position in which they will be able with impunity to refuse to furnish information to the committee. Dut appellants have no legal right to maintain this position.

Appellants Claim a Right They to tot Have
Appellants contend they have a right to use the Fifth.
Amendment of the Constitution as a shield against giving
information to the Subcommittee. But they have no such right.
They only have the right to use the Fifth Amendment as a
shield against being compelled to give self-incriminating
testimony. Much all danger of incrimination is removed by
a grant of immunity in response to the claim of Fifth Amendment privilege, there is no right to withhold portinent
information. (Uliman v. United States, 350 U.S. 422):

Appellants Misconstrue the Legal Situation

Counsel for the prospective witnesses assert that under the District Court's orders of April 10, 1957, the appellants are being summoned to appear before the Subcommittee swithout

protection of the Fifth Amendment". This statement is contrary to fact. The Fifth Amendment privilege, being constitutional, cannot be cut off, circumscribed, or limited either by an Act of Congress or by an order of a court. The truth is that the Court's orders of April 10, 1957,

merely put these cases in such posture that, if one of the appellants, while testifying before the Subcommittee, asserts his Fifth Amendment privilege against self-incrimination in response to a particular question, the Subcommittee will have an option to accord him the claimed privilege against self-incrimination in either one of two ways: (1) by allowing him to stand mute, without responding to the question, or (2) by granting him complete immunity from prosecution with respect to all matters and things concerning which he shall testify responsively to the question. Only in the latter case, when the privilege has been recognized and allowed by a grant of immunity as broad as the privilege itself, will the committee become entitled to have an answer to the question.

As the Supreme Court said in <u>Ullman</u> v. <u>United States</u>, <u>supras</u>

"We are not dealing here with one of the vague, undefinable, admonitory provisions of the Constitution whose scope is inevitably addressed to changing circumstances. privilege against self-incrimination is a specific provision of which it is peculiarly true that 'a page of history is worth a volume of logic. New York Trust Co. v. Fisner, 255 U. S. 345, 349. For the history of the privilege establishes not only that it is not to be interpreted literally, but also that its sole concern is, as its name indicates, with the danger to a witness forced to give testimony leading to the infliction of penalties affixed to the criminal acts Soyd v. United States, 116 U.S. 616, 634. We leave <u>Dovd</u> v. <u>United States</u> unqualified, as it was left unqualified in <u>Crown</u> v. <u>Walker</u>. Immunity displaces the danger. Once the reason for the privilege ceases, the privilege ceases. We reaffirm Brown v. Walker, and in so doing we need not repeat the answers given by that case to the other points raised by petitioner."

No Constitutional Question Presented

Appellant makes much of a purported challenge to the constitutionality of section 3486 of Title 18, U. S. Code. Dut no constitutional question has yet arisen. Such a question can only arise if and when a witness before the committee, having claimed his privilege under the Fifth Amendment as a basis for refusing to answer a question, and having thereafter been required to answer it in connection with a grant of immunity under section 3486, nevertheless refuses to answer, and is thereupon cited for contempt and either called before the bar of the Senate to answer or indicted by a grand jury. No prospective witness in advance of such eventuality is entitled to have an advisory opinion concerning the constitutionality of the law as applied to his particular case.

Appellants Show No Injury

No showing of injury has been made by appellants, and none can be made. The only right which appellants allege to be involved is the right to claim the privilege against solf-incrimination under the Fifth Amendment.

District Court's Order Leaves Appellant's Rights Intact

The order signed by Judge Pine leaves the Fifth Amendment rights of each appellant intact. It leaves intact his right to object to, or refuse to answer, any impertinent or immaterial question. It leaves intact his right to refuse, with complete impunity, to answer any question which may tend to incriminate him. It leaves intact his right to question the constitutionality of the so-called "imminity statute," section 3486 of Title 18, U. S. C. It leaves intact his right to challenge the jurisdiction of the committee, or the composition of the committee, or its authority. In no way is any right which the appellant had before the issuance of the order in any way circumscribed or limited or rendered more difficult of exercise by reason of the District Court's order of April 10.

Judge Pine's order does not compel the witnesses to do anything that would not otherwise be required of them. It does not command their appearance before the committee except in response to a lawful summons from the committee, which in and of itself would command such appearance just as strongly.

Appellants Inconsistent

Appellants are wholly inconsistent in arguing that "the proposed immunity will be spurious and unavailing" because the District Court's orders of April 10 "are invalid," It is the appellants here who are attempting to overthrow the District Court's order. But for them, the order would stand unchallenged. In such case, there can be no doubt that the order would be effective to meet the requirements of the statute. Appellants cannot consistently seek to attack the District Court's order and justify their right to attack it on the ground that they have been, are being, or will be injured by the fact that it is under attack.

Under subsections (a) and (b) of section 3486, where the questions are to be asked by authority of the Senate, and not by authority of the Court, the proper view is that the court should not be asked to pass upon any specific questions in advance. Thus the right of a witness to object to a question for lack of pertinency will remain unimpaired.

Either the Court must approve specifically every one of the questions which are to be asked of the prospective witness, thus substituting its judgment for that of the legislative corrittee, or else it must leave the committee free to ask at least some questions without the specific prior approval of the Court. In the latter case, it is obvious that the provisions of the statute still apply, and the questions must be such as fall within the statute or else the witness is not required to answer.

not specifically approved in advance by the Court is to make it impossible for the committee to follow up testimony actually given by the witness for the purpose of making a clear and coherent record; or else to require the committee, having learned from the answers to some of its questions the nature of certain additional questions which should be asked, to come back to the Court for specific approval of those questions, the answers to which in turn may lead to further questions which will again have to be brought back to the Court for specific approval, and so on, ad infinitum.

In the Uniman case, the Court was asked to approve certain specific questions because those were questions which had been asked before the grand jury (and, therefore, by authority of the court); but although it was there argued that the Court's order should not command the answering of other or further questions, the Court declined to be limited in this way and did in fact order the answering of other and further questions than those specifically approved in advance.

Appellants May Not Halt Legislative Inquiry

Appellants have no right to prevent the committee from completing the preliminary procedural steps which will put it in a position, in the exercise of its discretion, to offer a grant of immunity under the statute. Appellants have no right to say whether or how the committee shall complete these preliminary procedural steps. The statute does not say that these steps are to be completed to the satisfaction of the prospective witness; the statute says they are to be completed to the Satisfaction of the prospective witness; the statute says

Statute Complied With

provides. This compliance with the statute is complete.

The purpose of the statute was to procure a determination by the Court that certain prerequisites to the grant of immunity had been met, and to provide for the making of a permanent record by the Court with respect to this determination. The Court has made this determination, and its order evidencing the determination has been entered. This fully satisfies the requirement of the statute that the record show such action to have been taken.

This Court Has Passed On The Issues

This Court already has passed on the issues involved in this motion. By its order of April 9, 1957, stating that mo showing has been made of injury due to the pendency of the proceedings in the District Court, this Court clearly and necessarily comprehended a finding that the issuance of the order applied for below would not injure the appellant nor adversely affect his rights. A contrary finding would have justified a stay, pending appeal of the denial of appellant's motion to intervene in the proceeding below.

CONCLUSION!

Of all the facts and law of this matter - which boil down to the finding already entered by this Court, that 'no showing has been made of injury's to appellants or any of them, the motion for stay should be denied.

SUPPLEMENTARY MEMORANDUM IN OPPOSITION TO MOTION FOR STAY

This supplementary memorandum is submitted pursuant to the order of this Court entered April 12, 1957.

Supplementary Statement of Facts

The statement of facts set forth in the memorandum accompanying appellants' motion for stay, under the subhead "The Proceedings Below", should be supplemented and modified in the following respects:

- (1) The applications made to the District Court on March 1, 1957, were by J. G. Sourwine, the authorized representative of the Committee on the Judiciary of the United Statis Senate and the Internal Security Subcommittee thereof, not by the Subcommittee alone.
- (2) The orders entered by the District Court on April 10, 1957, in terms "approved" the applications of the Subcommittee.
- (3) These orders of April 10, 1957, were issued on the basis of the applications on behalf of the Committee on the Judiciary of the United States Senate and its Internal Security Subcommittee: supported by substantial evidence presented to the Court with respect to each of the allegations of the applications, such evidence including a certified copy of a resolution of the Committee on the Judiciary showing the

authority of the Subcommittee and the nature of its inquiry; an affidavit by the Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary of the United States Senate certified copies of letters of notification to the Attorney General pursuant to 18 U.S.C. 3486, and letters from the Acting Attorney General stating that he did not desire to be heard regarding the applications and would interpose no objection to the issuance of the orders.

- (4) The appeals in numbers 13808, 13809, 13810 and 13811 were taken from these orders entered by the District Court on April 10, 1957.
- not been served prior to entry of this Court's order of April 12, 1957, temporarily staying the effectiveness of the order of the District Court entered on April 10, 1957, and such subpoena has been recalled by the Subcommittee. The hearing of the Subcommittee scheduled for April 30, 1957, pursuant to subpoenaes served on appellants McElrath, Oka and Symonds has been continued without date, subject to further order of the Subcommittee. Counsel for the respective appellants have been advised with respect to these matters.

Senator Eastland's affidavit stated, in part:

"Information at hand respecting the threat of treason, sabotage, espionage, sedition or seditious conspiracy, both in the Hawaiian Islands and elsewhere, to the possible serious and immediate endangering of the national security or defense of the United States needs verification and amplification to provide a proper basis for congressional action designed so far as possible to meet such threatened danger.

far as possible to meet such threatened danger.

"Time is of the utmost importance in securing the testimony needed and desired to supplement, verify or amplify information already at hand. Even such delay as might be involved in appeal procedure in the Court of Appeals might be sufficient to thwart or frustrate the Committee's purpose to secure the needed and desired testimony in time to permit formulation and enactment of appropriate legislation while it will help maximum impact and effect in preserving and protecting the national security and defense of the United States."

ARGUMENT

I.

In order to enjoin the proceedings herein, appellants have a duty to show that the possible damage to them from a continuation of the proceedings far outweighs any injury to the appellee resulting from a stay. It is clear that in the instant case such a showing is wholly impossible. The effect of a stay order by the Court would be to harm and to frustrate the Congressional investigation presently in being. It is axiomatic that courts will not interfere with the operation of the Legislative Branch unless there is an absolute and clearly demonstrable necessity therefor, and unless there is absolutely no other way to safeguard individual rights. As a matter of fact there are few, if any, examples of court interference with the legislative process such as would result if a stay order were entered in the instant case. If prospective witnesses in Congressional proceedings had the right to full judicial, appellate review proceedings before even proceeding to testify, the activities of the Congress and its committees could well be brought to a standstill, for no this Court knows, appellate proceedings, if carried to the highest courts, might well exceed in time the term of a Congressional session or the life of a particular Congressional investigation. It is obvious, therefore, that so far as appellee is concerned, the possibility of injury is not only apparent and extreme, but it is also of such an unusual nature that every conceivable presumption ought to to indulged in to prevent its occurrence.

On the other hand, appellants can point to no present injury whatever. The injury to them is purely speculative. For example, the committee may never call them as witnesses;

or if they are called as witnesses, it may never question them concerning activities as to which they might desire to invoke their privilege against self-incrimination under the Fifth Amendment; or if they do assert privilege under the Fifth Amendment the committee may not wish to offer them immunity under the statute; or if immunity is offered under the statute, the appellants may desire to testify in response so as to mature the grant of immunity; or if such testimony is refused, the Congress may not proceed against them for contempt. The possible harm to appellants at this point could hardly be more speculative. And there is, therefore, no urgency whatever to grant them presently the relief they sex for.

Moreover, it would appear that the Court should not indulge in the presumption or the assumption that the grant of immunity will be injurious to appellants. If any speculation is to be made, the Court might well conclude the grant of immunity would be beneficial rather than injurious so far as the recipients of immunity are concerned.

It would appear that appellants' asserted rights could be very effectively safeguarded by litigation and appellate procedures growing out of any contempt citations that might possibly result from the proceedings presently contemplated by the committee. Court litigation at this point, therefore, is entirely premature. In view of the far reaching consequences to the operations and functioning of a co-equal branch of the Government, on the one hand, and the availability of effective, judicial review, if and when an invasion of appellants' rights actually has occurred, on the other hand, the Court should deny a stay for that reason alone.

Moreover, there is another strong public-interest reason why the order of a District Court pursuant to 18 U.S. Code section 3486 should not be subject to collateral attack.

Such an order should represent solid assurance to the witness that his immunity, if granted, will be full and complete. It cannot be such assurance if collateral attack is possible. The District Court's determination with respect to the procedural prerequisites of the contemplated immunity grant should be conclusive of the issues; but if these matters can be re-examined in any way after the order has been entered, it will not serve this purpose, and the witness will not have the protection Congress has sought by this means to give him.

Since appellants cannot show irreparable injury, and since, on the other hand, the most potent reasons of policy and equity favor an uninterrupted Congressional proceeding, the granting of a stay pending appeal would definitely be unwarranted.

II.

Furthermore, appellants would not prevail on the merits of their appeal; and a stay should not be awarded on an appeal which has as little hope of ultimate success as the instant one.

In our Memorandum in Opposition to Motion for Stay we have listed some of the reasons why appellants position on the merits is not well taken. The following additional thoughts occur in this regard.

Appellants feel that 18 U.S.C. section 3486 is unconstitutional as violative of the Fifth Amendment. But, as indicated above, there is no constitutional question as yet because the privilege against self-incrimination guaranteed by the Fighh Amendment has not yet been claimed. Consequently, much of appellants constitutional argument is simply not before the Court at this juncture.

The Court certainly should not indulge in a premature construction of the statute which would render it unconstitutional, where -- to say the least -- a constitutional interpretation is possible.

The duty of courts, in construing congressional enactive ments, to take care to interpret them so as to avoid a danger of unconstitutionality (as pointed out by the Supreme Court in <u>United States</u> v. <u>Congress of Industrial Organizations</u>, 68 S. Ct. 1349, 335 U. S. 106, 92 L. Ed. 1849, and in <u>United States</u> v. <u>Harriss</u>, 74 S. Ct. 808, 347 U. S. 612, 98 L. Ed. 989) has been repeatedly recognized by this Court.

Thus, in <u>Duchay</u> v. <u>Acacia Mutual Life Insurance Company</u>, 70 App. D.C. 245, 105 F. 768, 124 A.L.R. 1268, this Court held that the cardinal principle of statutory construction is to save and not destroy, and as between two possible interpretations, by one of which the statute would be unconstitutional and by the other valid, the plain duty of the court is to adopt that which will save the statute, and the rule is the same even to avoid a serious doubt. (Emphasis supplied).

A statute is not to be declared unconstitutional unless clearly so, this Court said in Lindsey v. United States, 77 U. S. App. D. C. 1, 133 F. 2d 368.

Courts must avoid the issue of constitutionality if the statute which is being interpreted is susceptible of any

It is interesting that one of the early but leading cases on this point was Thompson v. Riggs, 6 D.C. 99, affirmed 72 U.S. 663, 5 Wall. 663, 18 L. Ed. 704, in which it was held that for a legislative act to be pronunced unconstitutional the opposition between the Constitution and the act in question should be such as to lead the court to a clear and strong conclusion of their incompatibility with each other.

reasonable interpretation consistent with constitutionality, this Court held in <u>First Iowa Hydro-Electric Co-op</u> v.

Federal Power Commission, 80 U.S. App. D.C. 211, 151 F. 2d

20, reversed 66 S. Ct. 906, 328 U.S. 152, 90 L. Ed. 1143, rehearing denied 66 S. Ct. 1336, 328 U.S. 879, 90 L. Ed. 1647.

And in <u>Blackmer v. United States</u>, 60 App. D. C. 141, 49 F. 2d 523, <u>certiorari granted</u> 52 S. Ct. 19, 284 U. S. 602, 76 L. Ed. 516, <u>affirmed</u> 52 S. Ct. 252, 284 U. S. 421, 76 L. Ed. 375, this Court held that a statute should be construed so as to avoid grave doubts of its constitutionality, if such construction is fairly possible.

In Naganab v. Hitchcock, 25 App. D. C. 200, affirmed 26 S. Ct. 667, 202 U. S. 473, 50 L. Ed. 1113, this Court held that in passing on the constitutionality of statutes generally, it is a well settled rule that nothing but a clear violation of the Constitution will authorize the courts to overrule the legislative will, and, where there is reasonable doubt as to the constitutionality of an act, it must be resolved in favor of the act. And in United States ex rel. Bernardin v. Seynour, 10 App. D. C. 294, affirmed United States v. Duell, 19 S. Ct. 236, 172 U. S. 576, 43 L. Ed. 559, this Court held that the fact that a court entertains doubt as to the constitutionality of a statute is of itself sufficient ground for upholding the power of the legislature in enacting the law.

And in <u>Pelley v. Botkin</u>, 80 U. S. App. D. C. 251, 152

F. 2d 12, having found that the Subversive Activities Control

Act is not "plainly and palpably void", this Crumb held to the
a presumpt on exists in favor of its valicity.

The so-called "immunity statute", 18 U. S. Code 3486, is susceptible of construction as a constitutional statute. It is possible to hold that the purpose and intent of subsections (a) and (b) is the same as the purpose and interse of 78809

The court need not hold that the "approval" under subsection
(b) is any more or less than approval of the application for an order. Since a constitutional interpretation is possible on the face of the statute, the court is not compelled by any portion of the legislative history to construe the law in such a way as to find it unconstitutional.

Appellants indicate that the District Court has no power to issue orders in connection with immunity to be granted by a Committee of the Congress. One of the aspects of that argument is that a proceeding to obtain such an order is not a "case or controversy" within the meaning of Article III of the Constitution.

If appellants' restrictive view as to the power of courts of the United States under Article III were correct, the courts would be precluded from issuing warrants, subpoenaes duces tecum, show cause orders, temporary restraining orders, disbarment orders, orders revoking bondsmen's licenses, orders in aid of the jurisdiction of administrative agencies, etc., in all of which there are no present adverse parties before the court. Article III has never been given such a narrow construction.

To have a "case or controversy" under Article. III of the Constitution, it is enough that there exist "present or possible adverse parties" whose contentions are submitted to the court for indication (In re Pacific Rellway Corression 32 2. 240, 250). This is the situation here. There is the possibility of some future criminal prosecution of one of these prospective witnesses for or in connection with some matter or thing concerning which he may testify under a grant

of immunity. It is important that in connection with any such case, the witness be able to establish the validity of his immunity grant.

It is also possible that there may be in the future a contempt proceeding against one of these witnesses for refusing to answer a proper and pertinent question even though offered immunity with respect to all matters and things concerning which he might testify responsively in his answer. In such case also it would be important to know that the offer of immunity was valid.

In either of the circumstances suggested above, there would be adverse parties; in the first case, the witness and the Government; in the second case, either the witness and the Senate, or the witness and the Government.

As pointed out in the Pacific Railway case at page 257 in the note, "Proceedings to perpetuate testimony, where litigation is expected or apprehended, are within the ordinary jurisdiction of courts of equity, and come under the designation of 'cases in equity' in the Constitution." Similarly, perpetuation of a record of judicial determination of compliance with important procedural prerequisites to a grant of immunity, where litigation is expected or apprehended is within the jurisdiction of the district courts under 18 U.S. Code 3486.

It is obvious that the proceeding before the District Court was a proceeding in aid of a legislative inquiry. As appellants have clearly stated in the memorandum accompanying their motion for stay, the application to the District Court was "for orders requiring appellants to testify under 18 U.S. Code 3486 (a) and (b)." (Emphasis supplied). The important effect of the Court's order is not to compel the appellants to appear and testify or give evidence (for this can

and will be correlled by the inherent power of the committee itself), but to require that when the appellants do appear, if they do, they appear pursuant to 18 U.S. Code 3486 (a) and (b). To state the matter in another way, the effect of the District Court's order is to put the committee in a position to offer each of the witnesses a valid and unchallengeable immunity.

Just as a Pederal court may, in an exparte proceeding, order the issuance of a warrant of arrest, or a subpoena duces tecum, or a search warrant, in aid of a possible or expected criminal proceeding, so a court may, in an exparte proceeding, issue an order of the type provided for by 18 U. S. Code 3436, in aid of a legislative proceeding. That is all that is here involved.

Appellants have also indicated that under appellee's interpretation of the statute the District Court has no real function to perform. That is not appellee's position.

The statute requires the court to make a determination with respect to compliance or non-compliance with the procedural prerequisites to a valid grant of immunity. The court may find non-compliance, in which case it will not approve the application nor enter the order applied for. If the court does find compliance, and enters its order showing that fact, the order is not subject to collateral attack but becomes conclusive with respect to the matters determined by the court, and thereafter only a valid offer of immunity followed by testimony of the witness in response thereto need be shown in order to make the immunity effective.

The function of the court to determine whether there was compliance with the procedural requirements of the statute, and the purpose to safeguard the rights of those who have been granted immunity pursuant to the procedure prescribed by the statute by having its order stand as a conclusive bar to prosecution inconsistent therewith, are of considerable importance, and can hardly be dismissed as insignificant.

Finally, it must be remembered that unlikelihood of reversal exists here if for no other reason than that in Numbers 13,787 and 13,788, 13,789, and 13,790, the appeals are moot, (as well as having been premature since no one of appellants has suffered any legal injury) and that in Numbers 13,808, 13,809, 13,810 and 13,811 appellants, not having been parties to the proceeding below, have no standing to appeal. To stay the effectiveness of the District Court's order would, therefore, be merely to delay the Senate committee in its legislative course, to no ultimate purpose.

III.

There is precedent for denial of a stay in these circumstances. In the <u>Uliman</u> case, after the Justice Department had presented its application, and the District Judge had given notice that he would sign an order, counsel for the witness moved for (1) a stay and (2) their own form of order. Judge Weinfeld refused the stay. Counsel for the witness appealed to the Second Circuit, and also asked the Second Circuit to stay the proceedings. The Justice Department filed a motion to dismiss the appeal, claiming the order was not appealable within Section 1291, Title 28; U. S. Code. The Court of Appeals of the Second Circuit issued a written opinion:

"Motion to dismiss appeal granted on the authority of Cobbledick v. United States (309 U. S. 323). Motion for stay dismissed as most since motion to dismiss the appeal is also being hereby granted." See also, 350 U. S. at p. 425. The situation here is of course analogous.

Moreover, a-division of this Court denied a stay just prior to the entry of Judge Pine's order herein, rejecting arguments quite similar to those made by appellants in connection with this renewed application. If a stay pending appeal were now granted, there would appear to be a conflict with the original order denying a stay. It is submitted that the Court here should follow its own precedent and that of the <u>Ullman</u> case.

CONCLUSION

Wherefore, it is respectfully requested that the motion for stay pending appeal be denied.

The records of the Chicago Credit Bureau, Inc. dated February 9, 1942 as checked by SE HUGH M. BARNHARDT on March 9, 1953 reflected that SIDNEY ALASSER resided at 5025 North Monticello. The records also reflected that his spouse is ANNI-CROVES and that he is thirty-eight years of age and previously resided at 4711 North Lawndale. Since 1932, he has operated the Central Grocery Store located at 6818 West North Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. The records also reflected nothing of a derogatory nature concerning SIDNEY GLASSER. In the second state of the central Grocery SIDNEY GLASSER.

It is noted that HAROLD GLASSER previously reported that he has a brother named SIDNEY GLASSER who operates a grocery store in Chicago.

The Chicago files reflected no information not previously reported concerning SIDNEY GLASSER and reflected no information concerning DOROTHY TELMAN who is also a resident at 5025 North Monticello.

They advised that the COHENS spent their winters in Miami and that about a



year ago they moved to a new location in Harvey, Illinois. The police officers advised that the only L. OOHEN of 34 East 155th Street, Harvey, would be LENA COHEN who is a housewife and is seventy years of age. She is reported to be quite ill.

Sgt. ABRAHAM advised that the name of HAROLD GLASSER was familiar to him and that it was his opinion that GLASSER was related to the COHENS by marriage. He could not provide any further information concerning GLASSER's relationship to the COHENS:

It is to be noted that previous investigation has determined that MORRIS COHEN is the father-in-law of HAROLD GLASSER and that HAROLD GLASSER was once employed by MORRIS COHEN at the Sibley Lumber and Supply Company.

Chief ROMER and Sergeant ABRAHAM both advised that MORRIS COHEN is the owner of the Sibley Lumber and Supply Company, 147th and Vine Streets in Harvey, Illinois and that the COHEN family are considered to be respectable and in good standing in the community, Chief ROMER and Sergeant ABRAHAM stated that they knew of no derogatory information concerning the COHEN family.

The Chicago files contained no identifiable information concerning L. COHEN or LENA COHEN.

The Chicago Telephone Directory for June of 1952 reflected no individual or firm by the name of Kromex.

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The Certified List of Foreign and Domestic Corporations for the years 1945 through 1951 reflected no corporation by the name in Kromex. This certified list is printed by the authority of the State of Illinois and is compiled by the Secretary of State of Illinois. The Chicago files reflected no information concerning Kromex.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

The Chicago files reflected the following information concerning HAROLD GLASSER:

The "Chicago Daily Tribune" issue dated February 9, 1946 in an article entitled "Charges State Department Is A Tool of Reds" by WILLARD EDWARDS points out that HAROLD GLASSER was a "Red" sympathizer. The article reflects that "GLASSER formerly was military research director in the Treasury and (JOSIAH) DUBOIS (also named as a Red sympathizer) is a close friend. GLASSER'S wife was corresponding secretary of the League of Women Shoppers which was regarded by the Special House Committee on Un-American Activities as a Communist front organization".

Mr. MILTON WALTERS, 1646 Jonquil Terrace, Regional Director, Social Security Administration, Chicago, Illinois, advised SA DANIEL J. MC CARTHY in June of 1948 that SOLOMON ADLER, Aka. ILL associated a great deal with HAROLD GLASSER in 1935 and 1936. ENG Mr. WALTERS added that ADLER had been induced by HAROLD GLASSER, then Dean of the Peoples! Junior College, Chicago, to travel from England to accept a teaching position at the College.

Mr. WALTERS advised that he was of the opinion that ADLER was a Socialist in view of the fact that he associated a great deal with HAROLD GLASSER who, he stated, was an avowed Socialist.

Mr. /ALTERS further advised that he knew of no Communist activity on the part of an employee or any faculty member at Peoples: Junior College.

Concerning SOLOMON ADLER, ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, a former Russian espionage agent, advised that during the latter part of 1942 and through the early part of 1943, mention was made by other individuals involved in a Soviet espionage conspiracy of SOL ADLER who was a Treasury Department representative in Chungking, China. On occasions BENTLEY observed official letters written

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by ADLER in possession of other individuals prominently involved in this conspiracy, who characterized ADLER as an opportunist but further indicated that they would like to place him in some strategic location in the U. S. Government. ADLER was also known by SENTLEY to be a Communist Party member.

T-5, of known reliability, advised on January 21, 1953 that he recognized a photograph of HAROLD GLASSER as a man he had seen at a meeting of the International Labor Defense at 55th Street and South Harper Avenue. He said that this meeting was in the late 1930's or early 1940's and also stated that he believed he had seen GLASSER at several of the meetings during this same period.

T-5 could not provide any further information concerning HAROLD GLASSER except to say that he did not hold office in the International Labor Defense. (U)

The International Labor Defense has been cited by the Attorney General under Executive Order 9835 as a subversive and Communist organization.

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

ALEXANDER SACKS, an attorney, office address at 36 West 44 Street, New York City, residence address at 463 East 178 Street, Bronx, New York, was interviewed at the New York Office on February 4, 1953, by SA PAUL J. BLASCO and SA BLAZE J. TOMASONI regarding his association with NORMAN BURSLER.

In this regard, it is noted that Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, advised that during the month of April, 1946, BURSLER had received correspondence from ALEXANDER SACKS, 463 East 178 Street, Bronx, New York.

ELIZABETH TERRELL BENTLEY, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, advised SA THOMAS G. SPENCER and SA JOSEPH M. KELLEY on February 1, 1946, that NORMAN BURSLER, an employee of the Anti-Trust Division of the Department of Justice, had furnished Department of Justice reports to NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and his wife, HELEN SILVERMASTER, for transmission to the Soviet Union.

Miss BENTLEY described the SILVERMASTERs as active in Soviet espionage work in Washington, D. C., in the 1940's and as active members of the Communist Party.

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Department of Justice personnel records for ALEXANDER SACKS, as reviewed by SA WILLIAM H. ATKINSON, in December, 1951, reflected that SACKS was appointed a Special Attorney in the Anti-Trust Division at Washington, D. C., on August 1, 1938, and resigned August 20, 1938. According to these records SACKS, carried as an employee of the Department of Justice, was actually assigned to the La Follette Committee, or Senate Civil Liberties Committee as it was popularly referred to at that time, as an investigator.

The records further reflected that on May 25, 1942, SACKS was appointed Special Attorney in the Anti-Trust division with beactienters at New York City. He resigned in June, 1947. SACKS was assigned to the New York Division in the Department of Justice from September 29, 1944, to July 1, 1945, in the Economic Welfare Section. It was further reflected that SACKS served on a special assignment for the Department of Justice in Germany where his services were utilized on the Decartelization Program. Upon returning from Germany, SACKS was again assigned to the Department of Justice in New York City from September, 1945, until May, 1946, after which he returned to Washington, D. C.

It is noted that NORMAN BURSIER accompanied SACKS on his assignment for the Department of Justice in Germany.

Further, the records disclosed that SACKS was born November 11, 1909, in New York City. He received a Bachelor of Laws Degree in 1932 from Brooklyn Law School, New York City.

It was also reflected that SACKS had been employed as a social investigator for the Department of Welfare, New York City, and as an agent in the United States Bureau of Narcotics, New York City, in 1937.

CHARLES RINDONE, 41-10 10th Street, Long Island City, Queens, New York, furnished a signed statement to SA ARTHUR V. HART and SA RICHARD J. BURNETT on February 21, 1949. In the signed statement RINDONE stated that while he

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was employed by the Department of Welfare, City of New York, he joined the Communist Party about 1937. His unit was in the Men's Service Division, No. 2. RINDONE stated that some time after he joined the Communist Party ALEXANDER SACKS became employed by the Department as an investigator and stayed for approximately two years. Within a few months after coming to the Welfare Office, SACKS joined RINDONE's Communist Party unit, and RINDONE stated that he was present when SACKS' Communist Party card was signed at a meeting.

The Communist Party has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

During the course of the interview with SACKS regarding NORMAN BURSLER he was questioned briefly about several other individuals, one of whom was the subject, HAROLD GLASSER.

During the interview SACKS advised that upon resigning from the Department of Justice he was engaged as an attorney-economist with the Decartelization Branch of the Office of Military Government of the United States in Frankfurt, Germany, from the latter part of 1947 to November, 1949.

He stated that after he returned from Germany in the latter part of 1949 he was subsequently contacted by HAROLD GLASSER. SACKS explained that the subject had a friend, whose name he could not recall, who was engaged in the manufacture of goods for deportation to the United States from Germany. SACKS stated that because of his extended knowledge regarding Germany's cartels and other business enterprises, GLASSER "used him" for a business connection in Germany. He went on to say that he had many conferences with GLASSER regarding businesses in Germany and that after GLASSER had garnered all of the information he could from SACKS, GLASSER then "dropped" him. He said that this was the extent of his associations with GLASSER and that he has not seen GLASSER for approximately one year.

SACKS pointed out that he had not known GLASSER prior to their initial contact in late 1949 or early 1950 and

said he knew nothing about GLASSER other than the subject had formerly been employed by the Treasury Department and that during his association with GLASSER, the subject was employed by an organization in New York dealing with Jewish matters

Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, advised on December 22, 1952, that the subject maintains an account with the Great Neck Trust Company, 51 Middle Neck Road, Great Neck, New York, under the name of HAROLD and FAYE GLASSER. The account was opened in both names on July 6, 1948, while GLASSER was residing at 52 Colgate Road, Great Neck, New York. For the past year the average balance has been from \$1,400 to \$2,400. The informant advised that the account is used mainly to pay for general household expenses.

in the communication made available by T-3 is probably (4) identical with the PHILIP BERNSTEIN who corresponded with the subject on July 22, 1952. The return address of Sweets College, Lake Dunmore, Salesky, is undoubtedly identical with Sweets Cottages, Salisbury, Vermont, the address given by GLASSER to T-3 in August, 1952, as a temporary vacation address. It is quite possible that Confidential Informant T-4 had difficulty in translating the return address on the correspondence of July 22, 1952.



Testimony Before the Senate Subcommittee ATE6/18/84 on Internal Security, aka Jenner Committee TE6/18/84 April 14, 1953, Volume II, Executive Session

Harold Glasser appeared before an Executive Session of the Jenner Committee on April 14, 1953. The Bureau has received the testimony on a confidential basis for review. The original has been returned to the Jenner Committee. Glasser is the subject of a current Bureau investigation arising out of the charges of Elizabeth T. Bentley that he furnished her with information from the files of the Treasury Department in 1943 and 1944, to be transmitted through her to a Soviet espionage agent. The Glasser main file is 101-3599. It is noted that Executive Session testimony should not be disseminated outside the Bureau.

A review of the testimony reflects that there is no new information of a pertinent nature contained therein. Mr. Morris, Counsel for the Committee, advised that the Committee had evidence before it that Glasser had been a member of the Communist Party and a Communist organization. Glasser refused to answer any questions regarding Communist Party membership or membership in any Communist organization on the ground that it may tend to incriminate him. Glasser refused to admit that he knew Victor Perlo, Alger Hiss, Donald Hiss, Whittaker Chambers or Harry Dexter White on the ground that it might tend to incriminate him. Glasser did answer some general questions about his past employment history, place of residence and education.

RECOMMENDATION:

No action is necessary in connection with Glasser's testimony and a copy of the testimony is being filed in the Jenner Committee control file 62-88217 and in the main case file on Harold Glasser, 101-3599. New York, office of origin in the Glasser case, has been advised by separate letter of the review of the Executive Session testimony.

Glasser har't Testify About Red Advice

A former Treasury economist, who was named in the 1948 spy ring hearings here, yesterday refused to tell Senate investigators whether he gave pro-Communist advice to high Federal officials between 1936 and 1947.

The witness, Harold Glasser, testified before the Senate Internal Security subcommittee. The group is seeking to develop new links to the testimony of Whittaker Chambers and Elizabeth Bentley five years ago, and uncover Communist infiltration of Government.

In questioning Glasser, the subcommittee headed by Sen. William E. Jenner (R-Ind.), spread on the record the names of many New Deal and Fair Deal officials, a development which appeared to have political implications for the 1954 congressional elections.

Adviser to Marshall

Glasser said that in 1947 he served as an adviser on economic problems of Trieste for them Secretary of State George C.

Over a period of seven years Glasser said, he attended possible "30 or 40" economic conferences with Dean Acheson when Acheson was Assistant Secretary of State and later Undersecretary of State.

Glasser refused on grounds of possible self-incrimination to say whether he is a Communist or whether he passed on to Federal officials advise he received from Communist sources.

"The fact is," Sen. Herman

"that in your entire Government duties you were engaged
in espionage activities against

Acheson stated in the letter that he worked with Glasser for seven years on problems of "foreign funds control and other economic warfare matters." He said Glasser served under him on two United States delegations to United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration council meetings.

Glasser "impressed" him, Acheson wrote, "with his technical competence" and his ability to carry "a large part of the burden of the financial committee of the council."

Acheson stated that Glasser was "a good working companion" who is "able to approach problems in a well-organized and analytical manner" and would be found to be "a first-rate economist."

At the time the letter was written, Acheson was not in the State Department. Acheson resigned from the department in July, 1947, and returned to it as Secretary of State in 1949.

Information which appears in last year's hearings before the same Senate subcommittee, and which was not mentioned yesterday, states that Glasser was under a loyalty investigation when he resigned from the Treasury on December 31, 1947

Report List Measures

The present Federal loyalty program began in March of 1947. A Civil Service Commission report in last year's hearings states that when Glasser resigned, "Precautionary measures were taken to prevent Mr. Glasser's reemployment in the Federal service at a later date until the question of his loyalty has been resolved.

Glasser is a soft-spoken man of 47. He has repeatedly been accused of engaging in Communist underground work with Alger Hiss-who is now in prison—but yesterday was the first time Glasser has testified publicly.

He said he attended the University of Chicago and Harvard University. In 1936, after a job with the Works Progress Administration, Glasser began work at the Treasury Department. In 1940 he served as a financial adviser to the government of Ecuador, and in 1943 he was on another financial mission to North Africa. Later, back in the Treasury Department, Glasser said he served as an adviser to former Treasury, Secretary Henry Morgenthau, jr.

Accused by Former Reds

Former Communists Chambers and Bentley have stated that the late Harry Dexter White, former Assistant Secretary of the Treasury, Glasser, and Victor Perlo were fellow Communists in the department Miss Bentley said Glasser had worked with Hiss in the Red underground.

Counsel Morris yesterday put in the record what he said was a part of a heretofore unpublicized intelligence report which mentioned Glasser and was dated November 25, 1945.

The report, obviously made to the FBI—referred to as the "bureau"—was based on state ments by Miss Bentley. It said she was told that "Hiss of the State Department had taken Harold Glasser of the Treasury Department and two or three others and had turned them over to direct control by the Soviet representatives in this country."

Morris stressed the date of that report. He noted that it was referred to in 1950 by Vice President Richard M. Nixon, then a Congressman, as part of a secret 1945 memorandum "circulated among several Government departments and ... made available to the President."

Refuses to Identify List

Glasser was asked yesterday to identify a long list of persons named in that document and other records; he declined to do so. Morris asked him if he knew that "after a conference with Stephen Spingarn at the White House, Victor Perio's record was cleared." Glasser declined to answer that.

Stephen J. Spingarn, now a member of the Federal Trade Commission, told reporters yes terday: "The implication in the question is completely without truth." Spingarn said he has asked Morris for a copy of the transcript.

Spingarn was assistant general counsel in the Treasury Department and became a White House aide in 1949. At the Treasury Department he was counsel for the Secret Service, and he served in counter-espionage work during World War II.

Harold Glasser has been under investigation over a period of several years arising out of information furnished by Elizabeth T. Bentley that Glasser, a former Assistant Director in the Treasury Department, furnished her with information in 1943 and 1944, from Treasury Department files, which information she turned over to her Soviet espionage superior for transmittal to the U.S.S.R. According to Bentley, Glasser was a member of the Victor Perlo group of the Soviet espionage apparatus.

Whittaker Chambers and Katherine Wills Perlo, former wife of Victor Perlo, have described Classer as a Communist.

Investigative reports have been regularly furnished to the Records Administration Branch.

It would be appreciated if you would advise if Glasser is subject to registration under the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended by Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

There are attached hereto for the information of the New York Office two copies of a memorandum to the Criminal Division which seeks its opinion as to whether or not subject, Harold Classer, should register under terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938; as amended by the Internal Security Act of 1950.

A review of the Classer case file at the Bureau reveals that no information has been developed own the past several years to indicate that Glasser is currently engaged in any Soviet espionage activity or Communist Party activity.

The report of SA Carl N. deTemple dated 5-18-49 at WFO, two copies of which were designated for New York, reflects that Glasser was interviewed at the WFO on April 30 and May 3, 1947, and gave considerable information to the interviewing agents concerning many persons connected with the Silvermaster and Perlo espionage groups. Glasser admitted knowing and being friendly with both Nathan Gregory Silvermaster and Victor Perlo. The admissions of Glasser were set down in statement form and on May 7, 1947, Glasser appeared at the WFO and refused to sign the prepared statement because of differences of opinion concerning two items therein. One of the items was that Glasser claimed he would rather call the meetings he attended with Art Witt "social workers meetings rather than Communist Party meetings." The other point of difference was that Classer claimed he had not said he was a member of the American League Against War and Fascism but that he had stated that he may have been a member. The admissions of Glasser are set out on pages fifteen through twenty-three of referenced report. It is noted, however, that although Classer admitted close friendship with various members of the espionage apparatus and lesser association with others in a business and social way, he did not admit any complicity in or knowledge of the operation of the espionage apparatus.

On January 28, 1949, Glasser was interviewed by MYC agents at which time he refused to answer any questions concerning his alleged Communist or Soviet espionage activity

On February 2 and 3, 1949, Classer was reinterviewed by NYC agents and declined to answer, any disections RECORDED 67)/0

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Classer testified before the Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, but failed to give any information concerning Communist or espionage activities.

On April 14, 1953, Glasser testified before an Executive Session of the Senate Subcommittee on Internal Security (Jenner Committee). A review of this testimony at the Bureau reflected that Glasser refused to state on grounds of self-incrimination whether or not he is or was a Communist or a member of any Communist organization. He also refused on grounds of self-incrimination to state whether or not he knew Harry Dexter White, Alger Hiss, Donald Hiss, Victor Perlo or Whittaker Chambers. No new information concerning instant case was noted from a review of the above Executive Session testimony. The fact that the above Executive Session testimony was reviewed by Bureau representatives should not be divulged outside the Bureau.

Olasser also testified on April 14, 1953, in public hearing before the Jenner Committee, the transcript of which has not as yet been received at the Bureau. Newspaper accounts of same, however, reflect that he failed to give any information to the Committee regarding Communist or espionage activities on his part.

The Times-Herald newspaper for April 28, 1953, reflects that Columnist George Sokolsky devoted his column that day to Harold Glasser pointing out the fact that Glasser is connected with the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, an important organisation which functions in this country and in Europe.

Sokolsky stated that Glasser had held some of the must important positions in the United States Government to which Sokolsky would refer in a subsequent article.

Sokolsky pointed out the fact that Glasser had been uncooperative with the Jenner Committee and ended his column stating: "Harold Glasser, hidden away in a vast bureaucracy, was in a position to influence the policies and actions of the United States. His importance cannot be overestimated. Yet, he rejected identifying an oath which he signed and his own signature lest they incriminate him. When a man is so afraid of his past, and when that past was so important in American life, he needs to be investigated even more fully. That is being done, but such an investigation would be incomplete unless it includes avidence as to how he got his job in the important council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, who gave it to him, who keeps him in that job, and what he did during his trips to Europe every year."

The New York Division is instructed to review the file on Glasser and make recommendations as to how this case may be brought to a logical conclusion. New York is also instructed to make recommendations to the Bureau as to whether drinet further attempts should be made to interview Glasser.

New York should handle this matter promptly and advise the Bureau of the recommendations.

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THESE DAYS

By George Sokolsky

Harold Glasser, who had long been in government service, is now connected with the Council of Jewish Federations and Wel-fare Funds. This is an important organization which functions in this country and in Europe,

Glasser was called before the Jenner committee where he used the fifth amendment to refuse to answer questions which obviously could not incriminate him. For instance:

"Mr. Morris. Mr. Alder lived with you in Chicago at that time, did he not?

"Mr. Glasser. I refuse to answer that question, sir, on the ground it may tend to incrim-inate me."

Solomon Adler, it is true, has been identified by two witnesses as a Communist, but how is it possible that a demonstrable fact, as to living with Glasser, could incriminate Glasser? Either they did live together or they did not.

Similarly, Glasser used the fifth amendment in connection with an oath he took on January 8, 1944, to which he signed his name, and in it Glasser, among other things, swears "That I am not an alien, nor a Communist; nor a member of any Nazi bund organization, that I will not become a Communist, or a member of any Nazi bund organization during such time as I am an employe of the federal govern-ment.

This man, who has held some of the most important positions in the United States government, to which I shall refer in a subsequent article, was shown this oath, signed by him.

Then the following colloquy

occurred:
"Sen. Jenner — Is that your signature, Mr. Glasser?

Mr. Glasser—I refuse to answer that question, sir, on the ground that it may tend to incriminate me.

"Sen. Jenner-You refuse to answer whether or not that is your signature?

"Mr. Glasser- Yes, sir, I refuse to answer that question.
"Sen. Jenner—You know your

own signature when you see it. do you not?

"Mr. Glasser-I refuse to answer that question, sir, on the ground it may tend to incriminate me."

This amazing sequence of questions and answers followed:

"Sen. Welker - Were you a member of the Communist party on the 8th day of January, 1944, when you were administered that oath, when you took that oath?...

"Mr .Glasser—I refuse to answer that question on the ground it may tend to incriminate me, "Sen. Welker-You want to deny that you ever took an oath such as that, do you?

"Mr. Glasser-I refuse to answer that question on the ground it may tend to incriminate me.

Sen. Welker—As a matter of fact, at the time you were administered that oath, you were 2 member of the Communist

party? ... Mr. Glasser—I refuse to an swer that question on the ground to incriminate me. it may tend to incriminate me. "Sen. Smith. May I ask again? Did I understand the witness to say that admitting his own signature would be evidence tending to incriminate him?
"Sen. Jenner. That was his

statement.

"Sen. Smith, Is that right, Mr. Glasser?

"Mr. Glasser, Yes, sir.
"Sen, Smith, That you refuse to identify your own signature to an oath because to do so would tend to incriminate you?

"Mr. Glasser. I refuse to answer the question on the grounds it would tend to incriminate me."

Sen, Jenner made the point that he believed the witness was within his rights under the fifth amendment because "if he admits that is his oath, he admits he lied when he took it."

Yet, he rejected identifying an oath which he signed and his own signature lest they incriminate him. When a man is so afraid of his past, and when that past was so important in American life, he needs to be investigated even more fully. Confidential Informant T-3, of known reliability, a furnished the names of individuals who were officers of various International Workers Order lodges in New York City. Among this list appeared the name of ABELINSTEIN, 1323 West Farms Road, Bronx, New York. He was listed as being the Vice President of Thomas Paine Lodge number 807 JA as of November 16, 1948.

The International Workers Order has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

ANNA SOKOLOW 10 Monroe Street New York City

THOMAS A. GRAY, Manager, Knickerbocker Village, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, advised on May 5, 1953 that his records failed to reflect that ANNA SOKOLOW is or has been one of their tenants. However, a further check by GRAY disclosed that ANNA SOKOLOW stayed in apartment HF10 for a period of two weeks in the fatter part of 1952. This apartment is rented to ARNOLD BANK.

ALEXANORTH, 338 North Crescent Drive, Beverly Hills, California, was interviewed on November 30, 1950 by SAS WILLIAM H. VAN LANDINGHAM and HARVEY G. BERWEY. It is noted that ALEX NORTH is the brother of JOSEPH NORTH, former editor of "New Masses".

ALEX NORTH advised that he met ANNA SOKOLOW, who was then a member of the Martha Graham Dancing Group, and from approximately 1933 to the summer of 1939 NORTH lived with ANNA SOKOLOW in common-law marriage. NORTH pointed out that both he and ANNA SOKOLOW gave various concerts at parties and rallies sponsored by such organizations as

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the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and the International Workers Order, but that his and ANNA SOKOLOW's participation in such activities was strictly limited to a professional basis. He stated that they were separated in approximately July, 1939 subsequent to a quarrel over a love affair.

The only address he had for ANNA SOKOLOW was the Sherman Square Studio, West 73rd Street, New York City. NORTH also suggested contact with SOKOLOW's sister, Mrs. ARNOLD BANK, also known as ROSE BANK, Knickerbocker Village, New York City, for her current whereabouts

Confidential Informant T-2 advised that ANNA (U) SOKOLOW was an instructor in "Dancing for Children" at the Jefferson School of Social Science for the fall term of 1946. The informant also advised that both ANNA SOKOLOW and ALEX NORTH, 19 West 16th Street, New York City, registered as Communists in 1936 from the 10th Assembly District in the 26th Election District.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Miss JO ANN TOZIO, in care of Urban Company, 1457 Broadway, New York City, agents for 71 West 55th Street, New York City, advised on November 1, 1951 that ANNA SOKOLOW resides in apartment 2R at 71 West 55th Street, New York City. She stated that SOKOLOW is in business for herself as a choregrapher and resides at that address with her husband.

The January 14, 1938 edition of the "Daily Worker", the well known East Coast Communist newspaper, announced that the New York State Committee of the Communist Party had made public complete details for a Lenin Memorial Meeting to be held at Madison Square Garden on January 19, 1938. ANNA SOKOLOW, who is described in the article as a "noted young modern dancer" was to present her dance group in the "Dance of all Nations".

The "Daily Worker" of May 6, 1938 contained an article concerning a review to be held on May 8, 1938 at

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the Mecca Temple in New York City. The review was to be presented by the Negro Cultural Committee for the benefit of the New York Chapter of the National Negro Congress. The review included a ballet dance entitled "Filibuster" which was under the direction of ANNA SOKOLOW. According to the article, the Negro Cultural Committee was composed of several individuals including ANNA SOKOLOW.

The National Negro Congress has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The Negro Cultural Committee was described as a Communist front organization in the 1947 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities.

The 1946 Spring catalogue of the Jefferson School of Social Science listed ANNA SOKOLOW under the caption of "Instructors and Guest Lecturers". The Winter catalogue of 1947 of the Jefferson School of Social Science listed ANNA SOKOLOW as a member of the faculty.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been previously mentioned above.

The records at the Board of Elections, New York City, checked by SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK on March 30, 1953 failed to reflect a record for ANNA SOKOLOW at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York checked by SE RICHARD F. O'HARA on March 27, 1953 failed to reflect any record for ANNA SOKOLOW, 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

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The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York checked by SE RICHARD F. O'HARA on March 26, 1953 failed to reflect any record for BETTY ACKERMAN at the above address.

The records at the Board of Elections, New York City, checked by SE WILLIAM R. SWEENEY on March 31, 1953 reflected that one BEATRICE ACKERMAN, age 41 and married, registered to vote under one of the two major political parties in 1952 from the address of 31-46 81st Street, Jackson Heights, New York. She indicated that she had been in the state and city for 41 years and in the Election District 14 years.

Her husband, SIDNEY ACKERMAN, age 43, also registered to vote under the of the two major political parties in 1952. SIDNEY ACKERMAN indicated that he had been in the state and city for 43 years and in the Election District for 14 years. Both indicated that they were born in the United States. It was also noted that both ACKERMANS registered to vote under one of the two major political parties for the years 1944 through 1952.

However, the records further reflected that in 1937 BEATRICE and SIDNEY ACKERMAN registered to vote in that year from 4222 Ketcham Street, Elmhurst, Long Island, New York. At that time both indicated their political preference as the American Labor Party. SIDNEY ACKERMAN indicated in 1937 that he was self-employed at 4003 National Avenue, Corona, Queens, New York. BEATRICE ACKERMAN at that time indicated that she was a housewife.

A review of the New York indices failed to reflect any information which could be identified with REATRICE ACKERMAN.

The Queens telephone directory for 1952 reflected that SIDNEY ACKERMAN, lawyer, resides at 31-46 81st Street, Jackson Heights and that he maintains an office at 20 West 47th Street, New York City.

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It should be noted that the current address of 31-46 81st Street, Jackson Heights, for the ACKERMANS is not the same as the 41-46 81st Street address which was furnished by Confidential Informant T-1. However, it is believed that this is one and the same person and there could have been an error in the transcription of the address by Confidential Informant T-1.


The "New York Times" on April 15, 1953 carried an article emanating from Washington, D. C. which reflected that HARCLD GLASSER testified before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on April 14, 1953.

GLASSER refused to say whether he had conferred with Communists before offering his advice to then Secretary MARSHALL at the Council of Foreign Ministers Meeting in Moscow in 1947; questions concerning conferences with then Secretary ACHESON; and whether he is now or had been a Communist during his 12 years of federal service. GLASSER testified that he entered government service with the Works Progress Administration in 1935 and that he went to Washington, D. C. to join the Treasury Department the following year. Later as an economist and specialist in currency matters, he was made financial advisor to the government of Ecuador and he served in North Africa, Italy, Germany and other overseas posts, he related to the Subcommittee. The subject refused to say whether his assignment as financial advisor to Ecuador had been influenced by the late HARRY DEXTER WHITE, former Secretary of the Treasury. GLASSER testified that the advice given Secretary MARSHALL at the Moscow Conference concerned Trieste.

At the first and second United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration meetings at which he was a financial advisor, GLASSER said he gave advice to Mr. ACHESON, then Undersecretary. The subject stated that his particular task was to advise as to which UNRRA countries could pay the full costs of the aid given them.

Concerning ALLAN R. ROSENBERG, it is noted that when GLASSER was interviewed on April 30 and May 3, 1947 by SAS JEROME M. GARLAND and E. HYATT MOSSBURG at the Washington Field Office, he stated that he first met ALLAN ROSENBERG sometime before 1940.

ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, stated that ALLAN ROSENBERG furnished information to be turned over to JACOB M. GOLOS, a Soviet agent. ROSENBERG obtained this information as a result of observation, recommendations, plans and proposals made by various government officials regarding the handling of postwar Germany. During that period he was employed in the Foreign Economic Administration and material of the above description came to him in the course of his duties with that agency. ROSENBERG was also known by BENTLEY as a member of the Communist Party.

In regard to Robert R. Nathan Associates, mentioned above as a correspondent of the subject, it is noted that this organization is headed by ROBERT R. NATHAN and is a law firm in Washington, D. C.

Confidential Informant T-4, of known reliability, but who will not testify or give a signed statement, has previously reported that the name ROBERT R. NATHAN, 3420 16th Street Northwest, Washington, D. C., appeared in the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic

Bureau authority is not being granted at this time to interview Allan R. Rosenberg and Solomon A. Lischiasky in view of the fact that efforts are under way in another case, the success of which would possibly produce another witness in the Gregory case. When the results of this case are known, further consideration will be given to the interview of Rosenberg and Lischinsky.

Copies of this letter are being forwarded to the Offices involved so that if any reason exists for not interviewing any of these individuals the Bureau may be so advised. If Bureau authority is granted to conduct these interviews, the NYO will furnish the appropriate offices with the necessary information regarding the subject.

It is further recommended that investigation continue to establish the extent of the subject's apparent interest in the import-export business, also, if the subject has other bank accounts. The possibliity exists that the subject is diverting funds for CP use.

Because of the subject's lack of cooperation when interviewed by agents of the NYO in 1949, and subsequent lack of cooperation when called before the Jenner Committee this year, it does not appear likely that a reinterview would be productive.

It is believed that the recommended interviews and the suggested investigation will enable this case to be brought to a logical conclusion.

A few months ago a congressional investigating committee on communistic activities had before them a witness by the name of Harol Glasser. At the investigation Mr. Glasser refused to answer some questions on the grounds of "self-incrimination."

I have been informed recently that he was cleared by the F. B. I. in 1948 when he first appeared before a Grand Jury, investigating, I believe, communistic activities in the government.

Since the recent newspaper publication of Mr. Glasser's refusal to answer some questions, his niece and the women I hope to marry, Miss Jacqueline Glasser and I have had some heated arguments over her uncle's allegiance to this nation. She is convinced of his innoncence; I am undecided. The quarrel between us can easily be settled if we knew Mr. Glasser's present status as regarded by the F. B. I.

Our quarrel if not settled will lead to an eventual break between us. I know this may seem a trivial request to ask of you, but is Mr. Glasser as clean an American as the rest of us, and if he is would he be acceptable enough for a civil service job? Please give us any information which will be helpful. We would be very grateful.

A review of the information previously furnished to this Division indicates that, according to Elizabeth Bentley, the subject during the course of his service in the Treasury Department gave her confidential government information for transmittal to the Soviet Government. This information is considered sufficient to warrant a determination that the activities of the subject fall within the purview of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended by Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950. However, the evidence presently available has not been sufficiently corroborated to support a successful prosecutive action against the subject if his registration were solicited and he refused to register.

It is considered advisable that the subject be summoned before a grand jury for a thorough interrogation concerning his past activities, particularly with respect to a possible violation of Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950. Consequently, you are requested to forward to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York all investigative reports and other pertinent matter in your possession concerning the subject. Upon review of the subject's testimony before the grand jury, you will be advised as to any decision regarding the violation of any federal statute by the subject.

SYNOPSIS:

As a step in bringing this case to a logical conclusion, it is suggested that P. Bernard Nortman, subject of a pending SM - C case, be interviewed. Nortman was a former associate of Glasser. Nortman was interviewed by WFO agents 4-15-47, and admitted knowing various persons connected with the Gregory case, but denied any complicity therein. Nortman was interviewed in January, 1952, by Richmond agents regarding subject of an SM - C case and although cooperative, claimed he knew no subversive derogatory information regarding the subject of the SM - C case. Suggest that field not be authorized to interview Allan R. Rosenberg and Solomon A. Lischinsky, subjects of the Gregory case, in view of the recent decision in the Joseph Katz case to attempt to have Katz returned to the United States. Cooperation of Katz would open possibility of successful prosecutive consideration of Gregory subjects.

RECOMMENDATION:

That attached letter be sent authorizing Newark to interview Nortman; denying authority to Boston to interview Rosenberg; and denying WFO authority to interview Lischinsky.

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DETAILS:

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Harold Glasser, subject of instant case, has been under investigation for a number of years arising out of charges of Elizabeth Bentley that Glasser, a former Treasury Department official, furnished her with information obtained through his official position for transmission to a Russian espionage agent. Investigation has developed that among others, Glasser has been associated with P. Bernard Nortman, 324 Beechwood Place, Leonia, New Jersey: Allan R. Rosenberg, 10 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts; and Solomon A. Lischinsky, RFD #2, Sterling, Virginia (Fairfax County). Glasser was interviewed by Bureau agents on January 28, February 2, and February 3, 1949. He testified before the Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, and before an executive and an open session of the Jenner Committee on April 14, 1953. To date he has declined to admit his participation in Soviet espionage or Communist Party activity.

Elizabeth Bentley has stated that Nortman was a Communist Party member during the late 1930's, and that Nortman, while in Government employment in Washington, D. C., associated with Communist Party members, William Remington, Mary Jane Keeney, and Victor Perlo. Investigation revealed that Nortman registered in the American Labor Party in 1938-39 and 1941-42. Nortman was interviewed April 15. 1947, by WFO agents and admitted knowing Remington, Keeney, and Perlo. but denied Communist Party membership or sympathies. Nortman stated he is diametrically opposed to Communist philosophy and considers himself a rugged individualist and a subscriber of the policies and doctrines of the late President Roosevelt. Nortman is the subject of a Security Index card and currently resides at 324 Beechwood Place, Leonia, New Jersey, where he is believed to be employed as a free-lance writer. Informants have been unable to determine any recent subversive activities on his part.

New York letter of June 10, 1953, also suggested that Allan R. Rosenberg, 10 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, and Solomon A. Lischinsky, RFD #2, Sterling, Virginia, subjects of the Gregory case be interviewed.

Both Rosenberg and Lischinsky, who are major subjects in the Gregory case, have been previously interviewed by Bureau agents and have not furnished any admissions regarding Soviet espionage or Communist Party activity. Both have appeared before various Congressional investigating committees and have failed to give pertinent information.

A decision was reached in the Joseph Katz case authorizing the Israeli Intelligence Service to attempt to set plans in motion for the return of Joseph Katz to United States authorities. Should Joseph Katz return to the United States and be cooperative, the Bureau would stand its best chance to date of being able to successfully prosecute the subjects of the Gregory case. In light of this, the field is being refused authority at this time to reinterview Rosenberg and Lischinsky; however, when the success or failure of the Katz venture is known, further consideration will be given to interviewing Rosenberg and Lischinsky as well as other major subjects in the Gregory case.

The answers to his queries appear to be available from current investigation; therefore, the New York Office is instructed to address a conorandum to the United States Attorney using the information set out below as a guide in phrasing your neperandum to him.

Any additional investigation which the United States Attorney desires to clarify questions should be conducted inmediately and the results furnished to him in on investigative report.

New York should point out to the United States . Attorney that in regard to his suggestions in paragraph 3 of his memorandum that Glasser was under physical surveillance by New York agents as recently as December, 1952, and that no activities of significance were noted.

In regard to the United States Attorney's query as to whether or not any confessed Communists can identify. Glasser and corroborate Bentley, it should be called to his attention that anytime a confessed Communist is interviewed by Burcan agents this avenue is explored if there is any reason to believe the confessed Communist would be in a position to know of the Silvermaster espionage network.

Regarding the United States Attorney's suggestion that Lee Presence and David Lahl be interviewed, it should be noted as follows: Pressman was interviewed by agents of the New York Office 1-27-49; 8-30, 31-50; and 1-20-53. Presence was cooperative only to a limited degree. On 8-28-50, Pressman testified before the MCUA and was reluctant to furnish details or to involve other individuals. Pressuan has been under intensive investigation for perjury as a ...

result of his testimony before the HCUA on 8-28-50. Recent investigation of Pressnan has not indicated that he would be cooperative with Bureau agents to any greater degree than he has been in the past. In view of the above, and not-withstanding the fact that Glasser has previously admitted being a close social acquaintance of Pressnan, it is not believed advisable at this time to interview Pressnan about Glasser. You should so inform the United States Attorney.

In regard to David Vahl, it should be noted that Sahl testified before an executive session of the Senate Subcommittee on Internal Security (Jenner Committee) on 6-18-53. A review of the testimony reflected that Wahl in his answers specifically denied all matters relating to his Communist Party memberchip and activities. Investigative efforts are now under way to determine if a perjury violation can be established against Wahl for his testimony before the Jenner Committee. In view of Lahl's attitude toward the Jenner Committee, it is not believed logical or desirable to interview him about the Communist Party activities and/or Soviet espionage activities of Glasser. The executive session testimony of Vahl before the Jenner Committee is confidential. You should therefore not opecifically mention it to the United States Attorney at this time, but advice him that Cahl has recently refused to advise a Government agency of his Communist Party activities,

Recent Bureau investigation of Vahl has reflected that during the past two years he has been in contact with persons of known Communist background, such as, Mary Jane Keeney, Robert T. Hiller, Charles Kramer, and others. He has also been in touch with known Israeli intelligence agents, such as, Reuken Shiloah, Ifrain Ben-Armi, Theodor Kollek and Wahum Bernatein. New York is familiar with the activities of Vahl and until recently has been the office of origin in the Vahl case. The information regarding the contacts with Israeli intelligence agents should not be made known to the United States Attorney.

New York should suggest to the United States
Attorney that he may desire to call Preseman and Tahl before
a Federal Grand Jury and question them about Glasser.

How York by letter dated 6-10-53, advised that subject has a low four-figure bank account which is not in keeping with his income from the import-export business and his position with the Council of Jewish Federations and belfare Funds. New York suggested that the subject could be diverting funds for Communist Party use and that this line of the investigation was being pursued. New York should so inform the United States Attorney.

Hew York should recontact established confidential informants and sources of information who would be in a position to know of any current Communist Party activities on the part of Glasser and report the results of the contacts in the next investigative report.

After the above menorandum to forwarded to the United States Attorney, New York way also orally point out the following to the United States Attorney: Glasser has been the subject of investigation by this Bureau at various times since 1961 and centinuously since the allegations of Elizaboth Bontloy in 1945. The reports concerning the investigation of Glasser have regularly been disseminated to the Records Administration Branch of the Department of Justice and have recently been furnished to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Lew York. The investigation has been directed entirely foward determining whether or not Glasser is or. was engaged in Soviet copionage and/or Communist Party activities. As in other cases arising from Bentley's allegations, and although much investigative effort has been expended, a second vitnees cannot be found to substantiate her allegations concerning Glasser's participation in Soviet copionage cetivity.

Unitater Chambers and Catherine Villa Perlo have both stated that Glasser was a Communist; however, Glasser refused to testify on this point before the Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, and the Jenner Committee on 4-14-53, on the grounds of self-incrimination. He therefore avoided a possible perjury violation.

Eunerous persons who were associates of Glasser and who were involved in the Lathan Gregory Silvermanter espionage network have been interviewed in the past and have failed to make any admissions which would make then witnesses against Glasser. These persons include Charles Araner, Solonon Lischinsky, Allan Recemberg, Henry Hill Collins, Victor Perlo and others.

After the United States Attorney's queries have been answered in writing, you should advise the Bureau promptly of your discussions with the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York and submit an investigative report reflecting his prosecutive opinion in order that it may be disseminated to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. The Criminal Division will then be asked for its opinion as to whether or not Glasser's registration will be solicited under Lection 20 (a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

New York should pursue all leads vigorously and bring this case to a logical conclusion at an early date.

On 7/21/53 USA LEONARD P. MOORE and AUSA C. W. WICKERSHAM, both of the EDNY gave their opinion regarding bringing the subject before a Federal Grand Jury at this time. The opinion was prepared by AUSA WICKERSHAM and agreed to by USA MOCRE. The full opinion is as follows:

I.

Prosecution at this time appears premature or much too late. ELIZABETH BENTLEY'S testimony is the only real evidence tottie GHASSER into espionage in 1944 only and she is unable to identify any particular report as one she received from GLASSER. CHAMBERS! testimony is no help except as hearsay. Other evidence ties him in with Communists but alone is onlycircumstantial. GLASSER'S own statement is unsigned and very carefully guarded so as to deny unlawful activity.

II.

GLASSER has refused to testify before Congressional committees but has stood on Constitutional rights and there is no reason to believe that he would not do so again if called before Grand Jury. It would therefore appear that no benefit is to be obtained by calling him at this time and on the contrary he would be in a position to cause the government unfavorable publicity by charging persecution.

III.

There are many loose ends in present reports. Among them are:

- 1. What business activity (if any) outside of GLASSER'S job as Director of Overseas Studies is GLASSER now engaged in?
- If he is engaged in outside business activity, how is it financed?
- 3. Does GLASSER receive communications at places other than his home and office? It is doubtful that he would receive unlawful communications at his home which he must know is under some surveillance.
- Can other confessed Communists identify GLASSER and corroborate BENTLEY? Particularly how about LEE PRESSMAN and DAVID RECURDED - 28 404 = 37/ - 7/ WAHL?

IV.

When the results of further investigation are made known, this office will be in a better position to indict or to put real pressure on GLASSER to answer questions before the Grand Jury.

It is noted that the suggested investigation set forth in paragraph III by the AUSA will in no way aid possible prosecution in this case with the exception of the possibility of obtaining corroborating information from LEE PRESSMAN and DAVID WAHL.

The Bureau's opinion is requested in this matter.

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



KAHN, who was investigated under the provisions of Executive Order 10422 as a United Nations employee, indicated on a Personnel Data Form that prior to her United Nations employment, she was employed as Executive Director of the Welfare Council of New York City. She was affiliated with this Council since September, 1948. It was also noted that she was Assistant Director Secretary of the American Association of Social Workers from 1939 to 1942. She was also affiliated with the Office of War Information in 1944.

The February 5, 1941, issue to the "Daily Worker," an east coast Communist Party newspaper, reflected that DOROTHY KAHN, Assistant Executive Director of the American Association of Social Workers, was reported to have spoken on a Social Welfare Panel at the New York State Conference on Legislature for Democracy, sponsored by the New York Conference for Inalienable Rights. (The New York Conference for Inalienable Rights was cited as a "Communist front" by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities, March 29, 1944, page 149.)

T-9 of known reliability, advised that D. C. KAHN ap-(a) peared on a list of members of the American Committee to Win the Peace. Informant was unable to furnish any further data regarding this individual.

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CONSTRUCTION

T-10, of known reliability, stated the American Committee to Win the Peace is identical with the National Committee to Win the Peace, which organization is within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

On August 24, 1953, the New York "Daily News" newspaper contained a column, entitled "Capitol Stuff" by JOHN O'DONNELL. This column referred to a National Issues Committee, which is to be formed by ELEANOR ROOSEVELT. This Committee is described as "An effect to educate us poor dumb American voters about the lost virtues of the New and Fair Deals and, as Mrs. ROOSEVELT put it, "reverse the reactionary trend." The column further states "One threat that frightens the relics of the New Deal is the uncovering of what went on in the Treasury under Mrs. ROOSEVELT's good frind, HENRY MORGENTHAU, his No. One Assistant, the mysterious HARRY DEXTER WHITE, and tight-lipped HAROID GLASSER."

The column mentions that GLASSER during his recent examination before the Jenner Committee had on 24 occasions refused to answer questions on the ground that it would incriminate him. The column describes GLASSER as "no minor figure by any means. He had held highly important government posts in the twelve years before he resigned in 1947, with letters of recommendation from TRUMAN'S Secretary of State, ACHESON, and his Secretary of the Treasury, SNYDER. He had been a trusted and confidence advisor to both these top cabinet members and had accompanied then Secretary of State, General GEORGE CATLETT MARSHAL, to the 1947 Moscow meetings of Foreign Ministers." The column pointed out that GLASSER refused to answer questions about a Russian passport or his association with HARRY DEXTER WHITE.

It is to be noted that ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY, self-confessed espionage agent, identified HARRY DEXTER WHITE as a member of a Communist underground espionage group, which was active in Washington, D. C. during World War II.

This article mentioned that the "Post" had learned that certain affiliated groups of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds had demanded the acceptance of GLASSER's resignation when he first submitted it. It appeared that GLASSER had submitted his resignation when he first refused to tell the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee whether he had been a member of the Communist Party. This was on June 1, 1953. It was further mentioned that the subject planned to enter private business, but there was no explanation of what business he intended to go into.

The "New York Times," daily newspaper of October 21, 1953, contained an article which stated that a special subcommittee headed by Senator KARL E. MUNDT was attempting to establish how certain engraving plates, on which currency for expenses in occupied Germany were printed, were given to Russia. According to the article, on October 20, 1953, six individuals were called before this committee and questioned regarding these plates. Among those called was the subject, and he again invoked the privilege of the Fifth Amendment to remain mute on answers that might tend to incriminate him.

The announcement stated that Action Books, Room 2800, 165 Broadway, had announced for fall publication "The Atom Spy Myth -- from Hiroshima to the Rosenbergs," by WILLIAM A. RUEBEN. It was stated that this is the book in which RUEBEN, who wrote the original "Guardian" articles for the ROSENBERG case in 1951, "had been working on for two years." It described the book as an examination of all the "Atom Spy Cases" "in light of parallel Washington cold war moves." It was stated that the "Atom bomb spy hunt is the greatest hoax in history."

Regarding the "National Guardian," the 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation which they found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and content. (1949 report of the California Senate Fact Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, page 394.)

The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case was formed in December, 1950, for the purpose of raising funds for the legal defense of, and to arouse public sympathy for, JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG, executed Soviet agents who died in the electric chair on June 19, 1953.

Rebulet dated 7-7-53 entitled "JUST LUNNING, IS-R", in which the Bureau directed the WFO to report in individual case files information regarding certain personalities as reflected in an affidavit submitted to the Passport Office, Department of State, by JUST LUNNING. Two affidavits were submitted by LUNNING and are hereinafter more fully identified.

JUST LUNNING was born 5-14-10 at Odense, Denmark. His father, EDUARD FREDERIK LUNNING immigrated to the U. S. in 1923 and was naturalized on 5-20-29. JUST LUNNING received his derivative Certificate of Naturalization (U.S.) on 5-19-44 which was to date from 7-14-30.

LUNNING attended Harvard University from 1930 to 1937, where he, according to his own admission, with fellow like-minded students, participated in the reading of the works of MARX and ENGELS and attended Marxists study groups. He denies any present adherence to Marxists philosophy.

LUNNING was employed by the U. S. Government from 1942 to 1947 and was on duty with the U. S. Navy, assigned to the Office of Strategic Services, Washington, D. C. and Europe from January, 1944 to May, 1946. He continued his employment as a State Department employee until 4-18-47 on which date he resigned. During the above period LUNNING// associated with a number of suspected Communist and Soviet V agents. He denies knowledge of any of his associates having been known to him as Communists or engaged in Soviet espionage.

LUNNING admits being a stockholder in the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company, Washington, D. C., a number of whose stockholders are reported to be Communists or Communist sympathizers. He is also reported by a reliable informant to have had Marxists literature in his apartment at 1851 Columbia Road, NW, Washington, D. C., during early 1947 and to be a his included the state of the state o member of the Consumers Union, 17 Union Square, West, New York 3, New York.

The Consumers Union has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities in a report issued by that Committee on 3-29-44, Page 153.

Since May, 1947, LUNNING has resided at 24 Gramercy Park, New York City. He is employed as General Manager and Vice President of GEORG JENSEN, Inc., 667 5th Avenue, New York City.

The Passport Office, Department of State, directed letters to LUNNING under the date of 4-1-53 and 6-15-53, requesting that he furnish the Passport Office answers to certain questions as well as an explanation of the extent of his past association with certain named personalities. Thereafter, LUNNING submitted two affidavits to the Passport Office under the date of 5-9-53 and 7-17-53, in which he explained the extent of his association with these individuals, one of which was: HAROLD GLASSER.

LUNNING stated he represented the Foreign Economic Administration at the Atlantic City Conference which resulted in the creation of UNRRA in the Fall of 1943, and it was at this conference he first met HAROLD GLASSER. He said he next met GLASSER in 1944 or 1945 in London, England, where they discussed the preparation of reports or papers similar to the "Guides" prepared in Washington concerning enemy or enemy-occupied territory and their problems. He did not see or have any further contact with GLASSER until the Fall of 1946 in Washington, D. C. LUNNING said he called on GLASSER in his office at the Treasury Department in his capacity of an Administrative Officer of the State Department, at which time they discussed the status of employees of the Treasury Department sent abroad on official business.

Regarding their social contacts, LUNNING stated that in the Fall or Winter of 1943-44 he attended a fair sized party at the ALLAN ROSENBERG residence in Maryland. He also stated that he did not own a car while in Washington, D.C., so someone, probably ROSENBERG, arranged for he and MRS. LUNNING to ride to the party with MR. and MRS. GLASSER. LUNNING does not remember having returned from the party with the GLASSERS, or to have engaged in any conversation of significance. He stated he believes this to be a complete statement of all his contacts with HAROLD GLASSER. C.

There is attached a memorandum to Ur. Olney of the Criminal Division which is in answer to his memorandum of November 19, 1953, enclosing summaries prepared by the Criminal Division on eleven individuals. We reviewed the summaries to determine if there was material contained therein which would reveal confidential sources or confidential investigative techniques, and to determine if dissemination to the Jenner Committee would interfere with current investigations. While we informed the Criminal Division that we did not check these summaries specifically for accuracy, we do make comment to the Criminal Division on various misstatements which we have found in the summaries and which it might be noted show the summaries were very

We are also furnishing to the Department as an attachment to the memorandum to Mr. Olney, individual memoranda on eleven individuals showing the dissemination we made on these persons. It is to be noted in this dissemination we left out instances where we wrote memoranda to the Attorney General requesting authorization for technical surveillances. In the dissemination on Harold Glasser, we also comitted the fact that oral information was given to representatives of the World Bank on October 31, 1947. We did this because our dissemination to the World Bank representatives was on a pery-confidential basis and is not something which should be made known to the Tenner Committee. B

An original and two copies will be filed in this case file. A copy of the listing for each of the 49 subjects will be serialized into each main file and this fact will also appear on the same summary card. Copies are being made available to the Espionage Section and other copies will be used in this section, in order to further evaluate this method of improving our indexing procedures in major cases.

Mrs. RICHTER has, from time to time, rented rooms to individuals unknown to informant, but has no roomers at the present time. She is also employed in a clerical capacity, although her exact place of employment is unknown.

T-2 advised also that Mrs. RICHTER occasionally hears from her son in Israel. Her mother, Mrs. LENABUDNICK, also known as LENATEEMAN, about seventy-five years of age, resides also at 2308 West 39th Street in the downstairs unit, which is jointly owned by them both. T-2 added that Mrs. RICHTER has given no indications of being pro-Communist or being engaged in any subversive activities.

T-2 has observed, however, that Mrs. RICHTER has (u)
definitely appeared to be very interested in "Socialism" which
T-2 described as the general improvement of working conditions (u)
for the common man. T-2 tated also that SARA RICHTER currently (u)
receives the "National Guardian" publication.

The above named "National Guardian" has been described by the 1949 Report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation, which was found to be, from its inception, notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and content.

T-3, of known reliability, advised in March, 1949 that SARA RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California, had attended classes at the California Labor School in 1948. (u)

T-3 also advised in August, 1950 that the records of the California Labor School in 1948 contained the names of "SARAH and LOUIS RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street." Further, that "SARAH RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street" was included on a list headed "donations." ((U))

The above named California Labor School is one of the organizations named by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Exequtive Order 10450.

T-4, of known reliability, advised in December, 1949 (W) that on a list of names bearing the notation "mailing list," Mexico," the significance of which was unknown to the informant, though it was believed to relate to the Civil Rights Congress, appeared the names of SARA RICHTER and E. LOUIS RICHTER, both indicated as residing at 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California.
