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work at that time. I acted in the capacity of treasurer for the dinner which was given in VAN KLEECK's honor. I do not know who was the head of the Chicago group of the Inter-Professional Association for Social Insurance. I have never heard of BORIS GOPSTEIN and I did not know that this organization was in any way connected with the Communist Party.

"During the period 1933 to 1935 when I was an instructor in the People's Junior College in Chicago, Illinois, and a member of the American League Against War and Fascism, I may have contributed funds to this organization but I cannot definitely recall that I did. I also gave money on a number of occasions to the Spanish Loyalist cause through the medium of the United American Spanish Aid Committee. As a matter of fact, I contributed this money all during the Spanish Civil War as I felt very strongly for the Loyalist cause and I believe that the defeat of the Loyalists by the Franco Group was a great tragedy. This tragedy, in my opinion, opened the door to the invasion of Europe by Fascist forces. I also feel that the non-aggression pact entered into by the Soviet Union and Germany was a similar tragedy.

"I have never at any time been active in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. I did receive certain pamphlets which I believe were from that organization, and I may have been on their mailing list.

"I first met VICTOR PERLO in Washington, D. C., around 1937 and 1938, probably at a friend's home, whom I do not recall. PERLO was interested in the domestic affairs of the business world and I consider him an excellent statistician. However, at the time PERLO attempted to secure employment in the Monetary Division of the Treasury Department about a year and a half ago, I opposed his appointment inasmuch as this division is concerned with international affairs only, and I felt that PERLO's appointment would be at cross purposes with the aims of this division. In spite of my protest, however, PERLO was employed. I heard from my superiors at the Treasury Department that PERLO was subsequently investigated by the FBI in connection with the securing of this job at the Treasury Department. PERLO remained in the Treasury until March or April, 1947, a total of about a year and a few months, at which time he was informed by me that he would have to resign inasmuch as the FBI investigation had developed unfavorably on security lines concerning him. I became fairly well acquainted with PERLO in a social way over the period of time that I knew him, but I did not know his first wife at all well. In my opinion, I considered her 'a little cuckoo'. I only met her on one or two occasions and can definitely say that on those occasions she acted in a peculiar manner and dressed rather unusually. I first met VICTOR PERLO's second wife shortly after they were married in 1944 or 1945. However, since

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PERLO's second marriage neither my wife nor I have had very much to do with them socially and most of my contacts with PERLO have been in the form of business meetings and luncheon dates.

"From November 30, 1942, to January 10, 1943, I was on loan from the U. S. Treasury to the War Production Board and during that time I saw a great deal of VICTOR PERLO. I was new on the job and I asked him a great many questions concerning the work I was engaged in. During that same period I also saw HARRY MAGDOFF, and VEET BASSIE. I knew MAGDOFF only casually at the War Production Board through my business contacts with him. I first met VEET BASSIE at the University of Chicago in 1929 and have known him well. I have never furnished VICTOR PERLO with any confidential information which I secured in my official capacity at the Treasury Department or which I may have secured through any other Governmental agency. However, during the time I was on loan to the War Production Board it was necessary of course for me to discuss some of the work I was engaged in at the War Production Board with VICTOR PERLO.

"I recall that in February, 1943, I went to North Africa on business for the Treasury Department and I returned to this country around September, 1943. Shortly after my return I had lunch with VICTOR PERLO at the Madrillon Restaurant, and at that time I discussed with him some of my experiences during my trip, which I knew were not confidential and had in fact appeared in the newspapers in this country. These discussions were only concerned with general non-confidential information and were not carried on with the idea of furnishing information to PERLO.

"I first met HARRY DEXTER WHITE in November, 1936, when I was asked to come to the Treasury Department to be interviewed concerning a position that was open at that time. I later found out that my name had been recommended to WHITE by FRANK COE, a former classmate of mine at the University of Chicago. At the time I was hired on November 23, 1936, the Treasury Department - and particularly HARRY WHITE's section - was engaged in assisting President ROOSEVELT in the inauguration of various economic plans in furtherance of the NEW DEAL. HARRY WHITE and I worked together on nights and weekends at the Treasury Department and at WHITE's residence. We put in considerable overtime working on these plans requested by the President. I was therefore extremely close to HARRY WHITE until sometime around the first part of 1940, at which time for some reason unknown to me, WHITE's friendship for me soured and he actually sent me to South America to be rid of me. I asked WHITE on one or two occasions around 1940 the reason for the breaking up of our friendship but he refused to discuss it with me. I do not know the real reason for the breaking off of our friendship as I have always thought a great deal of Mr. WHITE. How-

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ever, I do recall that about 1938 I met Mr. and Mrs. NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and LUDWIG ULLMAN at HARRY WHITE's residence, and as a result of this meeting my wife and I were invited to the SILVERMASTER residence sometime shortly thereafter. During the dinner I recalled that I mentioned having been previously married. I have considered the possibility that my failure to acquaint the WHITES with this information concerning my previous marriage may have been the reason WHITE broke off our friendship.

"In regard to HARRY WHITE's background I recall that he mentioned on several occasions that he was formerly a salesman. Years ago he was extremely interested in an orphanage in Boston, Massachusetts, where he spent a great deal of his time assisting the children there. He met his wife ANN TERRY, a social worker, at this orphanage and they subsequently moved to New York City from Boston, where they were both engaged in managing an orphanage. I do not recall the reason, but this project came to an abrupt end, and from there the WHITES went to Stanford University, where he began his college education. I recall that WHITE has a life-long friend, SAMUEL MILLER, formerly with the Treasury Department and now in Chicago, Illinois, who was reared in the orphanage in New York which Mr. and Mrs. WHITE managed. I also remember that HARRY WHITE added 'Dexter' to his name sometime when he was living in Boston and that he took this name from the street where he and his wife formerly lived. Since 1940 I have had very little contact with HARRY WHITE, and this has been entirely a business relationship.

"In regard to my relationship with Mr. and Mrs. NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and LUDWIG ULLMANN, I recall meeting them at WHITE's home in 1938 and I probably saw them again at the WHITES prior to 1940, and as mentioned above, my wife and I were guests at the SILVERMASTER home, where LUDWIG ULLMANN was also in attendance, sometime around 1938 or 1939. Inasmuch as it was my belief that SILVERMASTER was the cause of my breaking off with HARRY DEXTER WHITE, I never returned the favor by inviting the SILVERMASTERS to my home. I last saw the SILVERMASTERS during the fall of last year at a party at the home of WILLIAM TAYLOR. I have seen LUDWIG ULLMANN on numerous occasions in a business manner at the Treasury Department and at Treasury Department parties inasmuch as he was employed there up until a few months ago.

"I first met ALGER HISS in an interdepartmental committee meeting on the Philippine Islands Independence Act of 1938. I do not know ALGER HISS at all socially and had very little contact with him at any time. I am, however, much better acquainted with his brother DONALD HISS, who for sometime at the State Department handled Inter-

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national Loans and Affairs, which prompted him to have numerous contacts with me at the Treasury Department. As a matter of fact I have never been socially acquainted with either ALGER or DONALD HISS. I do recall meeting ALGER HISS on a streetcar in 1945, and on another occasion I met him and his wife and child while walking along the Canal. I last saw him at the Wardman Park Hotel in September, 1946.

"I would never have been in a position to furnish ALGER HISS or DONALD HISS any official information with regard to Treasury Department international loans inasmuch as all of the international policy actually emanated from the Department of State itself. As a matter of fact, DONALD HISS through his official capacity would be in a position to obtain first hand knowledge of any information that I might develop through my official capacity in the Treasury Department regarding international loans.

"Regarding my contacts and the dates at the Treasury Department when I became responsible for and actively engaged in confidential Government information concerning loan activities, I would like to set forth the following information.

"In 1938 the U. S. Government had a loan negotiation with China, which was the only important one at that time. From the beginning of 1940 until May, 1942, I was on loan to the Government of Ecuador from the United States and of course was out of the picture as far as any knowledge of vital confidential Treasury Department information was concerned. When I returned to the United States in May, 1942, I went into foreign funds work until around November, 1942. Most of this work was concerned with South America. I then left the Treasury Department on a special assignment to North Africa in February, 1943. I was there until September, 1943. It is about this time that I began to handle very highly confidential Treasury Department information. The first few months in 1944 was a very active period. I went to Italy for about three months at that time and returned in June, 1944. During this period I was particularly concerned with the confidential nature of the work that I was engaged in and was extremely careful in my discussions with individuals not to reveal any information to unauthorized persons before the matter became public. ALGER HISS was never involved in any of the above confidential Treasury Department work, and I was never engaged in any discussion with him concerning this work. On the other hand, DONALD HISS was employed in the State Department and was handling the exact thing that I was handling in the Treasury Department. I believe that I first met DONALD HISS in May, 1942, and then until 1944 I freely exchanged Treasury Department information with him in his official capacity. Actually, DONALD HISS furnished me more information concerning the work he was engaged in than I furnished him. I believe that it was sometime in 1944 that DONALD HISS left the State

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Department and I have had no contacts with him since that time.

"I first met JOHN ABT in Chicago, Illinois, in 1932 through AGNES JACQUES, whom I had met in the fall of 1932. JOHN ABT and JACQUES both came from the Leopold-Loeb Section of Chicago, a wealthy Jewish group. JOHN ABT had been a very close friend of mine from that day on although I have seen him very little since the beginning of World War II. We have been on a social and business basis for a long time. I last saw AGNES JACQUES in November, 1946, when she happened to drop by my home in Washington, D. C. JACQUES formerly taught at the People's School in Chicago, Illinois, where I was also an instructor. I have also a very close social acquaintance with NATHAN WITT of New York City and LEE PRESSMAN, which dates back to my earlier acquaintanceship in the early thirties with JOHN ABT. I last saw JOHN ABT a year or two ago for a short time in Washington, D. C. I first met CHARLES KRAMER in 1937 or 1938 at a social gathering, which I believe was at the home of JOHN ABT in Washington, D. C. I have never known KRAMER too well but I have seen him around quite a bit as he and HERBERT SCHIMMELL frequently dropped in at the Treasury Department in connection with HENRY MORGANTHAU's plan for the economic partition of Germany. I have seen CHARLES only three or four times on a social basis. The last meeting I recall was on November 25, 1945, when KRAMER called at my home. It was about this time that I had been selected by the Treasury Department to make a trip to Japan. However, it had been decided that I would not make the trip. In this connection, KRAMER called by my home and was extremely interested in whether I was going to the Far East or not. I believe he was interested in this matter for Senator CLAUDE PEPPER. I of course informed him that I did not intend to make the trip and I don't believe KRAMER stayed at my residence for over a half an hour on that day. I recall that CHARLES KRAMER was originally employed by JOHN ABT on the LaFollette Committee in Washington, D. C. and in 1943 while I was on special assignment to North Africa my wife and the family of CHARLES KRAMER got together at some social functions.

"I first met ROGER RUTCHIK in Minneapolis, Minnesota, since he was in that city and I was employed there from May to November, 1936 by the Department of Agriculture. As I recall, RUTCHIK was the leader of the Farm Labor Party in Minneapolis. We became friendly during my six month's stay in Minneapolis at that time. I first met DONALD WHEELER when I was employed in the Treasury Department. I recall that he was not a very good employee and had left the Treasury and went to work for Senator WAGNER. I do not know him very well; I have never had any social contact with him but I do see him occasionally on the streetcar or on the street. I knew his brother GEORGE SHAW WHEELER much better. I met GEORGE WHEELER at the University of Chicago Graduate School.

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"I first met ALLAN ROSENBERG sometime before 1940. I do not recall the circumstances of my meeting and I knew him only casually at that time. When I got back from South America in 1942 I got to know him much better inasmuch as he moved into my neighborhood about that time. About the end of 1944 ROSENBERG became extremely dissatisfied with his position in the Government. He was continually complaining to me that the Government was frustrated and in his opinion the entire thing was run incorrectly. As a result of his feelings and the fact that they embarrassed me to some extent when he would make the complaints, I suggested to him that he get out of the Government, and go into private law practice. He took my suggestion and opened up an office in Washington, D. C. About this time ROSENBERG informed me that he and an individual by the name of SERGE RIPS were interested in forming the Transcontinental Corporation as commission brokers to make purchases and do business with certain Balkan countries, such as Greece and Yugoslavia. They needed financial assistance and because of my friendship with ROSENBERG, I introduced my brother MORRIS to ROSENBERG and MORRIS subsequently invested \$11,000 in the business. The business was a failure and my brother lost the entire sum of money. I believe the business was a failure because ROSENBERG spent more time in handling his law practice than he did attending to the business in order to make it a success. As I stated, I have known ROSENBERG since about 1944 very intimately. Our families are on a very close friendly relationship. I believe I know him extremely well and I do not believe that he is a member of the Communist Party. He is extremely interested in civil liberties and I believe that he represented CARL MARZANI in court not so long ago. I was very sorry to see him get mixed up in anything like this.

"As I stated above, I met HARRY MAGDOFF at the War Production Board when I was on loan from the Treasury. I know him only slightly. I met SOL LISCHINSKY in Chicago, Illinois, in 1932. LISCHINSKY lived in the same building as FRANK COE in Chicago and he taught at People's Junior College, where I was an instructor. LISCHINSKY is a long time friend of mine and I still regard him as a close friend. I met EDWARD FITZGERALD through my business contacts with the Foreign Economic Administration. I know him only slightly. RICHARD SASULY is also a casual acquaintance of mine. I knew his mother and father, Mr. and Mrs. MAX SASULY in Washington, D. C. in the thirties when I was at Brookings Institute. However, I have had very little contact with RECHARD SASULY. I also know CARL GREEN and met him through ALLAN ROSENBERG at ROSENBERG's residence. He impresses me as being very effeminate. He is an extremely casual acquaintance. I also met MARY JANE and 'ANGUS' KEENEY at the home of ALLAN ROSENBERG. I only know them casually. I believe that Mrs. KEENEY once came to my residence for a short visit when I was giving her a ride from

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the ROSENBERG residence downtown. I believe that MARY JANE KEENEY is a friend of MORDECAI EZEKIAL. Mr. and Mrs. EZEKIAL are also friends of mine and my wife, and in fact I regard them as our very best friends. I feel that MORDECAI EZEKIAL is a liberal.

"I first met WILLIAM TAYLOR at the Treasury Department in 1942 when I returned from South America. I believe that he secured his employment with the Treasury Department while I was out of the country. I have had close social contact with him and he now resides near my residence. I have never met and do not know MAYNARD GERTLER or ARTHUR STEIN. I recall having met Mr. and Mrs. PHILIP DUNAWAY at ROSENBERG's residence on one occasion but they are not friends of mine and I have had no further contact with them. I have had considerable business contact with JUST LUNNING, and when JUST LUNNING was employed at the FEA he had considerable business in my office. I have had lunch with him several times recently and he impresses me as a liberal. I also met Mr. and Mrs. DAVID WAHL through ALLAN ROSENBERG sometime in 1943. Mrs. WAHL at the present time teaches the Sunday School, where my children attend, and our children take music lessons from the same school in Chevy Chase, Maryland; my wife and I have had very little social contact with the WAHLS and we do not consider them close friends. I knew MORRIS FRIEDBERG at the Treasury Department and he worked under me. I believe he is an extremely close friend of HARRY WHITE, who arranged for his being employed by the Treasury Department. I believe that he came from Boston, Massachusetts, and grew up with WHITE. At the Treasury I also knew BELLE MAYER, who is a lawyer there. I have had little social contact with him. I first met FRANK COE in Chicago, Illinois in 1925 when we both attended the University of Chicago. We also were employed together at the Labor Bureau of the Midwest in Chicago.

"I regard myself as an intellectual and come from an intellectual family. I realize that intellectuals are not too stable and I also realize that I wasted a great deal of time 'playing around' with intellectuals during my life. I feel that I am a liberal. In the past years prior to my coming to the Treasury Department I had many liberal and radical friends. I recall that we engaged in intellectual discussions on numerous topics during that time. However since coming to the Treasury my discussions with intellectual groups have gradually disappeared. I have many radical and liberal friends; however, regardless of these associations I have never engaged in furnishing any information of any kind which came to me in my official capacity to unauthorized persons.

"This is the second time an accusation has been made against me of furnishing confidential Government information to an unauthorized source. At the time of the Quebec Conference in 1944 I was one

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of the Treasury Department representatives. The night before MORGANTHAU left for Canada I remember staying up all night preparing his German Plan for delivery to the conference. As you may recall, during the conference the press obtained details concerning the MORGANTHAU Plan before it was made public. Shortly thereafter, while I was in Montreal, Canada, attending the Second Council Meeting of UNRRA, EMELIO C. CALLAJO of the State Department. During that time, I discussed the German Plan with him. When MORGANTHAU and I had returned to the United States, MORGANTHAU called me to his office and accused me of this leakage to the press. I denied it at that time and of course I deny it now. It is my opinion that through CALLAJO the State Department accused me of talking and being overheard by a newspaperman. I know MORGANTHAU has never forgotten this and I believe that is the reason why I was passed over and FRANK COE was selected as Director of the Division of Monetary Research when HARRY WHITE left the Treasury Department.

During the above interview, background information regarding GLASSER as set forth in instant report was substantiated and confirmed and in addition, he furnished the following background information:

GLASSER stated that the birth records in Chicago, Illinois, reflect his birth as November 24, 1905, under the name "Baby GLASSER", inasmuch as he was not named until several days after his birth. GLASSER stated he has the following brothers and sisters:

CHARLES GLASSER, born Cincinnati, Ohio, who formerly was employed by the Chicago "Herald Tribune" and now resides at 2019 North Nordica Street, Chicago, Illinois

ISIDORE GLASSER, (deceased two years), who prior to World War I played semi-pro baseball under the name of EDWARD GLASSER;

JACOB GLASSER, who is an accountant with the firm of Alteschuler, Melvin, and Glasser, of 110 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, Illinois;

SEDNEY GLASSER who owns a grocery store in Chicago, Illinois

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Mrs. ANN BENJAMIN, sister, whose husband is an engineer for the Western Electric Company in Chicago, Illinois.

In regard to the addresses at which GLASSER has lived it is noted that from 1936 to 1937 he resided at 908 South Ode Street, Arlington, Virginia; in June, 1937, he lived at 1338 Tuckermann Street, Apartment 2B, Washington, D. C.; he has lived at 339 Willard Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland; in 1942 he resided at 662 Bennington Drive, Silver Spring, Maryland; and in 1943 he moved to 5410 Cathedral Avenue, N. W. He also advised that when he was attending graduate school in Chicago, Illinois, in 1931 he lived at 5734 Maryland Avenue. He also advised that he resided at 2011 Third Avenue, Minneapolis, Minnesota, when he was employed by the Department of Agriculture in 1936. He lived at Quito, Ecuador, from 1940 to 1942 when on a special assignment from the Treasury Department to the Government of Ecuador. He advised that his wife FAYE previously lived in Dixon, Illinois, where she worked for the Illinois Psychiatric Institute. GLASSER confirmed the fact that his mother and father were born in Russia, stating that his mother was 69 years of age in 1938, that his father was a couple of years older than his mother, that they were both born somewhere near Riga, USSR, and he believes they were both naturalized in Cincinnati, Ohio.

In addition to the children ALICE, RACHEL and LINDA, he advised that he has a son ROBERT (GLASSER) HAMILTON, born in March, 1932. As an item of interest, GLASSER stated that he returned from a trip to Italy in June, 1944, and had previously left the United States in March, 1944. He stated that he was employed in the Treasury Department in Washington, D. C. during the months of January and February, 1944.

GLASSER further stated that prior to his present marriage he was married to IRENE TILL GLASSER, whom he married in Albany, New York in January, 1932. GLASSER and IRENE were divorced in New York City in the spring of 1932, after which he married his present wife on July 7, 1932. His former wife is now Mrs. WALTON HAMILTON, whose husband has been employed by the Department of Justice and Yale University.

Upon being questioned concerning what "S", his middle initial stands for, GLASSER stated he has no middle name. The records of the Treasury Department inadvertently carried this initial as a consequence of which he offered no objection. He stated the middle initial merely adds color to his name and he has also been carried on the rolls of the Department as HAROLD G. GLASSER.

The associates of HAROLD GLASSER as previous set forth in instant report may be briefly described as follows:

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According to ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, previously described, LAUCHLIN CURRIE orally furnished information on various matters to GEORGE SILVERMAN who in turn made such information available to her through the medium of NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER. Miss BENTLEY knew CURRIE to have been involved in this Soviet espionage conspiracy in the late 1930s and early 1940s in Washington, D. C., and New York. It may be noted that it was LAUCHLIN CURRIE who requested GLASSER's services for Foreign Economic Administration.

Miss BENTLEY described VICTOR PERLO as a Communist Party member who furnished her with considerable information obtained by him through his official position at the War Production Board. It was also obvious to BENTLEY that PERLO had been engaged in some sort of espionage work for EARL BROWDER, former head of the Communist Party, USA, prior to their original meeting in early 1944.

Miss BENTLEY has advised that HARRY MAGDOFF, whom she knew to be a member of the Communist Party, furnished her information obtained by him through his official position at the War Production Board. According to BENTLEY, he had been engaged in espionage activity for EARL BROWDER prior to 1944.

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY has reported that HARRY DEXTER WHITE supplied information obtained by him in the course of his duties as Assistant Secretary of Treasury. WHITE was considered one of the most valuable assets in this particular circle of Soviet intelligence in view of his position in the U. S. Government and his ability to secure employment for individuals whom the group was anxious to have assigned to the Treasury Department. WHITE was also considered valuable in view of his close relationship with the former Secretary of Treasury, HENRY MORGENTHAU, JR.

With regard to FRANK COE, an employee of the Treasury Department, Miss BENTLEY advised that he furnished economic information to NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and HARRY DEXTER WHITE which was ultimately made available to her and her Russian superior. This information was obtained by COE through his official duties at the Treasury Department, however, according to Miss BENTLEY, he occupied a relatively unimportant position in this Communist underground apparatus.

With regard to NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, Miss BENTLEY reported that he occupied a prominent position in a Soviet espionage conspiracy which operated in Washington and New York in the late 1930s and early 1940s; that he furnished her with voluminous information obtained from U. S. Government sources, knowing that such information would be made available to the Soviet Government. Further, Miss BENTLEY, for over a period of time, knew SILVERMASTER to be a dues-paying Communist Party member.

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Concerning WILLIAM LUDWIG ULLMAN, Miss BENTLEY advised that she knew him to be a member of the Communist Party and he furnished considerable information to her to be turned over to her Russian contact, which information was obtained by ULLMAN through his official position in the Treasury Department and while an officer in the U. S. Army stationed in the Pentagon Building in Washington, D. C.

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY has advised that WILLIAM HENRY TAYLOR was a member of the Communist Party and was placed in the Treasury Department by HARRY DEXTER WHITE. He was sent to China and later to Lisbon, Portugal for Foreign Economic Administration. During the interim of his return to China and his departure to Lisbon, he was with the Treasury Department in Washington, D. C., and supplied written and oral information obtained from the Treasury Department. She has also advised that TAYLOR prepared a report on conditions in China which was later given to the Russians.

With regard to JOHN ABT, Miss BENTLEY has described him as an active participant in Communist Underground apparatus in the early 1940s. He assisted her in the procurement of information to be furnished to the Russian Government. Miss BENTLEY knew ABT to be a member of the Communist Party.

Concerning CHARLES KRAMER, Miss BENTLEY advised that at a meeting in the apartment of JOHN ABT, New York City, arranged by Earl Browder in early 1944, KRAMER indicated that he would be able to pass on information regarding Capitol Hill gossip, which type of information was actually furnished at a later date. It was at this time that KRAMER indicated he was associated with the Senator KILGORE Committee in Washington, D. C. BENTLEY also knew KRAMER as a Communist Party member.

With regard to ALLAN ROSENBERG, Miss BENTLEY stated that he furnished information to be turned over to JACOB M. GOLOS, a Soviet agent. He obtained this information as a result of observing recommendations, plans and proposals made by various Government officials regarding the handling of post-war Germany. During that period he was employed in the Foreign Economic Administration and material of the above description came to him in the course of his duties with that agency. ROSENBERG was also known by BENTLEY as a member of the Communist Party.

Concerning SOLOMON LISCHINSKY, Miss BENTLEY has advised that during the early part of 1944, EARL BROWDER arranged a meeting for her with the group which was known as the PERLO group. It was indicated at this meeting that all the individuals were Government employees and were furnishing information which they had obtained from Government files to BENTLEY for the use of the Soviet Union. Subsequent to this meeting, BENTLEY remembered that a member of this group was SOLOMON LISCHINSKY who was an employee of UNRRA. Although definitely a member of this

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group, BENTLEY never knew LISCHINSKY to furnish any intelligence information.

With regard to VEET BASSIE, it may be noted that a previous investigation conducted by this office concerning V. LOUIS BASSIE, revealed that from September, 1925 to June, 1928 he attended the University of Chicago and from October, 1934 to June, 1935 he was employed as a teacher at People's Junior College in Chicago. It may be pointed out that this information is in line with that offered by GLASSER concerning their first meeting inasmuch as the above dates correspond with the period of GLASSER's affiliations with the same institutions.

Confidential informants of known reliability have advised that BASSIE during 1946 and 1947 was a close associate of a number of the above individuals described by BENTLEY as having been involved in a Soviet espionage conspiracy in Washington and New York in the late 1930s and early 1940s.

Concerning ALGER HISS, JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, previously described, has described ALGER HISS as a former member of the Communist Party and in the late 1930s he furnished restricted and classified information to sources whom he knew to be Soviet principals and was aware that such information would eventually be furnished to the Soviet Government.

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY also knew ALGER HISS to have been involved in a Soviet conspiracy in the late 1930s and early 1940s.

With regard to DONALD HISS, WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has advised that he, DONALD HISS, was active in a Communist underground conspiracy in Washington, D. C., in the late 1930s. CHAMBERS knew DONALD HISS to be a member of the Communist Party.

Concerning LEE PRESSMAN, WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has described him as a member of an elite Communist cell in the late 1930s and was prompted to enter the employment of the CIO at the insistence of the Communist Party. PRESSMAN's wife has been a teacher at the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C.

[T-8, a reliable informant] ^(u) familiar with the affairs and activities of LEE PRESSMAN, stated that PRESSMAN has been in close and frequent contact with known Communists and persons accused of being active in Soviet espionage.

Concerning NATHAN WITT, [T-9, an informant] ^(u) who was for some years extremely active in the affairs of the Communist Party and has a personal knowledge of many national and local Communists and who has for a considerable period furnished generally reliable information concerning Communist matters, advised in February, 1948 that NATHAN WITT was a member of the Communist Party.

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WHITTAKER CHAMBERS has also stated that he knew NATHAN WITT to be an important member of the underground Communist Party in the late 1930s.

Regarding DAVID WAHL, [T-9] ~~(u)~~ advised that DAVID WAHL was a member of a Communist Party underground movement in Washington, D. C., in the late 1930s and early 1940s. He was reported as a close associate of known Communists and pro-Soviet sympathizers. On one occasion WAHL advised this informant that he had been sent from New York to Washington to direct the activities of this group.

With regard to LUCILLE FINSTERWALD EZEKIAL, [T-9] ~~(u)~~ described her as a member of the Communist Party.

MISCELLANEOUS

A letter from CATHERINE WILLIS PERLO made available to the Washington Field Office addressed to the President of the United States, dated April 14, 1944 at Fort Worth, Texas, contained a partial list of the Communist underground group in Washington, D. C.

CATHERINE PERLO, when interviewed on September 9, 1944 by Special Agent Agents WIRT R. JONES and SYDNEY M. WOLF at her residence, 2133 South Jennings Street, Fort Worth, Texas, with regard to the above communication, elaborated that HAROLD GLASSER, whom she identified as having been sent to Ecuador by the U. S. Government as an economist in 1939, was a member of the Communist Party. She could not recall any information which might substantiate this allegation.

In approximately June, 1942, [T-10] ~~(u)~~, an informant familiar with the affairs of the United American Spanish Aid Committee, advised the names of Mr. and Mrs. HAROLD GLASSER, 339 Willard Avenue, Chevy Chase, Maryland, appeared on a list of local donors to the committee. According to this informant, Mr. and Mrs. GLASSER contributed \$15.00.

With regard to the United American Spanish Aid Committee, the House Committee on Un-American Activities in its report dated March 29, 1944 cited this organization as a Communist front.

[T-11] ~~(u)~~, an informant of established reliability who is acquainted with many known and admitted Communists stated that this organization in Washington, D. C., was organized by the Communist Party and completely controlled by it.

[T-9] ~~(u)~~, previously described, stated that the United American Spanish Aid Committee in Washington, D. C., was organized and controlled by the

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Communist Party and was an important transmission belt of the Communist Party.

(T-12) ^(u) a member of the Communist Party who over a long period of time has furnished reliable information, stated that this organization in Washington, D. C., was completely controlled by the Communist Party, that the organization had no active membership and many of its members had no active association with the organization.

In approximately January, 1941, (T-13) ^(u) an informant familiar with the affairs of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action, advised that the names Mr. HAROLD GLASSER, 339 Willard Avenue, Friendship Heights, Maryland, Assistant Director of Monetary Research and Mrs. HAROLD GLASSER of the same address, appeared on the membership list of that organization.

It may be noted that the Washington Committee for Democratic Action has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order No. 9835.

On June 21, 1948, the Washington Field Office was notified by the release of information, Investigations Division, Civil Service Commission that the investigative files of the Commission contained no information not already in the possession of the FBI.

ASSOCIATES

(T-14) ^(u) an informant familiar with the affairs and activities of HAROLD GLASSER over a period of 1945-1947 who has furnished reliable information, advised that HAROLD and FAYE GLASSER were close social acquaintances and frequent contacts of ERMA and ALLAN ROSENBERG. This situation was further confirmed by Special Agents of the Washington Field Office who observed the GLASSERS and ROSENBERGS in each other's company on numerous occasions over the same period.

(T-14) also reported that during this period the GLASSERS were associated with MORDECAI J. EZEKIEL and his wife LUCILLE. According to this informant, Mrs. GLASSER was on especially friendly terms with Mrs. EZEKIEL.

In this connection, it may be noted that (T-15) ^(u) an informant familiar with the affairs of the League of Women Shoppers advised in approximately March, 1941 that Mrs. FAYE GLASSER was executive secretary of the local chapter of that organization during 1940 and 1941 and that LUCILLE F. EZEKIEL was president of the local chapter during that period and from 1940 to 1942 was a national member at large.

With regard to the League of Women Shoppers, the House Committee on Un-American Activities, in its report of March 29, 1944,

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cited the League of Women Shoppers as a Communist front.

(T-12, an informant) ^(u) previously described, stated that the League of Women Shoppers in Washington, D. C., is infiltrated by the Communist Party and that the Southeast Club of the League is dominated by the Communist Party since influential members of the club work hand-in-glove with the Southeast Club of the Communist Party.

(T-11) ^(u) has stated that the League of Women Shoppers in Washington, D. C., was not controlled or dominated by the Communist Party but that it was infiltrated to some extent and sometimes cooperated with the Communist Party.

(T-9) ^(u) who has been described previously has stated that the League of Women Shoppers in Washington, D. C., was infiltrated by the Communist Party.

CHARLES KRAMER, who has been previously described, was observed by Special Agents H. B. MCGAHEY and JAMES B. McMAHON, on November 25, 1945 to enter the residence of HAROLD GLASSER at 8:30 P. M. and remain until 9:00 P. M. The nature or purpose of this visit was unknown to observing agents.

(T-14) ^(u) previously described, advised on January 11, 1946 that SOLOMON LISCHINSKY is a social contact of HAROLD GLASSER.

(T-14) ^(u) advised on January 20, 1946 that HAROLD GLASSER had recommended GEORGE SILVERMAN for a position as Head of an Italian Technical Commission in the United States, however, according to the informant, SILVERMAN was tied up with a position with the French and did not want to put a full-time job on the matter.

With regard to GEORGE SILVERMAN, ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY has stated that GEORGE SILVERMAN is a Communist who, while employed as a civilian with the U. S. Air Force, War Department, furnished her through NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER, voluminous information concerning materiel data of the U. S. Air Force. This information included considerable data regarding the B-29. SILVERMAN was also known to furnish information related to her by other highly placed government officials.

JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, who was also previously described, knew SILVERMAN as a Communist and an individual engaged in aiding Soviet espionage activities in the United States. CHAMBERS knew SILVERMAN to be held in high regard by his Russian superiors.

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T-14 has advised that Mrs. ANNIE STEIN was in frequent contact with Mrs. GLASSER. According to the informant, these contacts were usually with regard to taking their children to school. The informant has advised that ANNIE STEIN is the wife of ARTHUR STEIN.

With regard to ARTHUR and ANNIE STEIN, T-9 has advised that both ARTHUR and ANNIE STEIN have admitted to the informant that they are members of the Communist Party. Informant believes that ARTHUR STEIN is on a very high level in the Communist Party.

T-16, an informant who has furnished considerable reliable information in the past, advised that on January 26, 1945 GLASSER was in contact with NANCY WERTHIMER, at 21 Cornelia Street, New York City. The nature and extent of this contact were unknown to the informant.

Concerning NANCY WERTHIMER, T-17 in approximately July, 1946 made available to the New York Office documentary evidence of NANCY WERTHIMER's membership in the Sacco Van Zetti Club of the Communist Party of America, Manhattan.

T-18 in approximately July, 1946, advised the New York Office that NANCY WERTHIMER was active in the affairs of the Sacco Van Zetti Club, Communist Party of America, Manhattan from February 1945 through June 1945.

On August 3, 1946 Special Agents EARL L. FUOSS and AUBREY S. BRENT observed SOL ADLER proceed from his residence, Hotel Washington, at 2:30 P. M., to the residence of HAROLD GLASSER. He was observed in conversation with an individual believed to be Mrs. GLASSER and a young girl on the porch of this residence. ADLER remained there until 6:20 P. M., at which time he was observed returning to his hotel.

Concerning SOL ADLER, ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY has advised that during the latter part of 1942 and through the early part of 1943 mention was made by other individuals involved in a Soviet espionage conspiracy of SOL ADLER who was a Treasury Department representative in Chungking, China. On occasions BENTLEY observed official letters written by ADLER in possession of other individuals prominently involved in this conspiracy, who characterized ADLER as an opportunist but further indicated that they would like to place him in some strategic location in the U. S. Government. ADLER was also known by BENTLEY to be a Communist Party member.

T-19, an informant familiar with the affairs and activities of WILLIAM HENRY TAYLOR for a period in 1946, advised that during May and July of that year TAYLOR attempted to contact HAROLD GLASSER. Further information relative to the nature or purpose of this contact or whether the contact was in fact actually effected, was not known to the informant. A description of

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of WILLIAM HENRY TAYLOR appears in instant report under caption of "Interview with HAROLD GLASSER".

On July 25, 1946, Special Agents CHARLES D. CHAPMAN and EARL L. FUOSS observed SOL ADLER and Mr. and Mrs. ALLAN ROSENBERG in attendance at a party at the residence of HAROLD GLASSER.

[T-20, an informant] ^(X U) familiar with the contacts and affairs of SOLOMON AARON LISCHINSKY for an extended period in 1946, advised that LISCHINSKY made attempts to contact HAROLD GLASSER, the purpose of these contacts not being known to the informant, nor was it known whether in fact such contacts were actually effected.

It may be noted that an examination of the employment application of SOL ADLER, made by Special Agents of this office in January, 1947 at the Civil Service Commission reflected the name of HAROLD GLASSER as a reference for employment.

[T-21, a reliable informant] ^(X U) familiar with the activities and associates of MARY JANE KEENEY, advised that MARY JANE KEENEY dined at the home of ALLAN ROSENBERG on April 26, 1945. Other guests at the dinner were the MORDECAI EZEKIELS and the HAROLD GLASSERS. According to the informant, the next contact with the GLASSER family by MARY JANE KEENEY was on May 25, 1945 at which time she again attended a gathering at the home of ALLAN ROSENBERG. The nature of this meeting was a party given in honor of JUST LUNNING. The informant also advised that DAVID and EDITH WAHL and Mrs. and Mrs. HAROLD GLASSER were in attendance.

[This informant] ^(X U) also indicated that MARY JANE KEENEY on October 6, 1945 again visited the ROSENBERG residence and requested ALLAN ROSENBERG to inquire of HAROLD GLASSER if she, KEENEY, could obtain a position in the Division of Monetary Research at the Treasury Department, however, later that same evening HAROLD GLASSER dropped in to see the ROSENBERGS and at that time GLASSER informed MARY JANE KEENEY that his division was not employing additional personnel.

[T-9] ^(X U) advised that PHILIP OLIN KEENEY and MARY JANE KEENEY, his wife, were active in a Communist Party underground group in Washington, D. C., in the late 1930s and early 1940s and that they are close associates of known Communists and pro-Soviet sympathizers.

[T-1] ^(X U) advised on February 2, 1947 that FAYE GLASSER had a dinner party which was attended by SOLOMON and PEARL LISCHINSKY and their parents.

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T-22, a reliable informant (S)(u) familiar with the affairs and activities of HENRY HILL COLLINS, JR., advised on August 18, 1947 that COLLINS attempted to get in touch with HAROLD GLASSER without success. The nature or purpose of this attempted contact was not known to the informant. (S)(u)

With regard to HENRY HILL COLLINS, JR., CATHERINE WILLS PERLO, 2133 South Jennings Street, Fort Worth, Texas, the former wife of VICTOR PERLO, in May, 1944 reported that HENRY HILL COLLINS was a member of the underground Communist Party group in Washington, D. C., and that she had seen him at least on one occasion attending a Communist Party meeting in Washington, D. C.

WHITTAKER CHAMBERS, in May, 1945, advised that HENRY COLLINS was a member of a group of government employees in high salaried positions who are Communist Party members. CHAMBERS stated that the principal meeting place of this group was the apartment of COLLINS, who was treasurer of the group.

T-9 (S)(u) advised in September, 1946 that COLLINS and his wife were rabid members of the Communist Party.

T-23, a reliable informant (S)(u) familiar with the affairs and contacts of DAVID WAHL, advised on May 22, 1947 WAHL contacted GLASSER in an attempt to learn the location of another Treasury Department employee. T-23 has also advised that on June 27, 1947 and again on October 9, 1947, DAVID WAHL made attempts to contact GLASSER without success. The nature or purpose of these contacts was not known to the informant. (S)(u)

Please be advised that Henry Tasca, former Deputy Director of the International Monetary Fund, United States Treasury Department, is now associated with the Economic Cooperation Administration with headquarters in Paris, France.

Our Legal Attache in Paris interviewed Mr. Tasca on February 10, 1950, at which time he furnished the following information concerning Glasser:

He stated that Glasser while in the United States Treasury Department was a close friend of Harry White. He stated that Glasser was his, Tasca's, superior in Washington at the time that he, Tasca, was in Italy. He said that Glasser at that time questioned Tasca's attitude toward the Tito government and proved himself to be definitely pro-Tito. He said that this was at the time that Tito was considered the leading orthodox Communist leader of Central Europe. He said that Glasser went so far as to abolish Tasca's job in order to get him out of the way due to his, Tasca's, anti-Tito policy.

Re New York let June 18, last, in case captioned,
"Source; Espionage - R."

Your attention is directed to paragraph 4 on page 5. This paragraph states that Elizabeth Bentley advised that the fact that Harold Glasser was out of the country may have been mentioned at the second meeting of the Perla Group in John Abt's apartment. However, she does not recall specifically when this was mentioned. Bentley stated the Treasury Department sent Glasser abroad for some reason unknown to her. Following his return, Glasser prepared a report of his activities abroad for the Treasury Department and furnished a copy to the espionage apparatus.

A review of instant case file at the Bureau, particularly the WFO report of Special Agent Cori N. DeTemple of 5/18/49 which sets forth the allegations of Bentley, reveals that Bentley has not previously advised the Bureau that Glasser furnished a copy of the above-mentioned report to the espionage apparatus or in fact ever made such a report. Therefore, the New York Office should check into this matter further with Bentley to determine if she can identify Glasser's report; if she received a report; and if she did, if she can recall to whom she delivered it. WFO should conduct an investigation to identify Glasser's report and determine the exact classification of same.

Further correspondence in this matter should carry the character of Espionage - R.

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

In an effort to locate the report, a copy of which ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY has alleged was furnished her by the subject, GEORGE H. WILLIS, Director, Office International Finance, Treasury Department, was requested to make available to this office copies of reports submitted by GLASSER upon his return to the United States after completing his assignments overseas.

WILLIS, after reviewing certain Treasury Department files, advised he was unable to locate any formal report submitted by GLASSER which was concerned with monetary exchange problems. He did advise, however, that GLASSER had submitted certain memoranda upon returning from abroad in 1944 but stated that these memoranda were not concerned with exchange problems and further could not even be considered reports.

In 1944, WILLIS stated that GLASSER was assigned by the Treasury Department to the staff of Ambassador HENRY F. GRADY, who was then in Italy serving as Vice-Chairman of the Allied Commission for Italy. WILLIS said that GLASSER in December of 1944, submitted a nine page memorandum which was largely concerned with the inflationary developments of Liberated Italy and which contained certain information which was obtained by virtue of his assignment to Italy in February and March, 1944.

In order to assist WILLIS in locating the report, the New York Office, in the interview with BENTLEY, should secure as complete as possible physical description of this report, including the number of pages and also specific details regarding the contents of this report. In addition, the approximate date that the report was furnished BENTLEY should be ascertained and it should also be determined whether BENTLEY at that time considered the report to be current.

In addition, it should also be definitely determined if the report furnished BENTLEY was actually a copy of the report made by GLASSER to the Treasury Department.

ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY was interviewed at Clinton, Conn. by SA LESTER O. GALLAHER on 8/23/51. At that time she was questioned for further details concerning a report which she has previously advised had been furnished by HAROLD GLASSER to the Soviet espionage apparatus, through the Perlo group, following a trip to Europe made by GLASSER for the Treasury Department in 1944.

Miss BENTLEY stated that it was her understanding that the document was a rather complete report of GLASSER'S activities and observations while he was abroad and that the document, as received by her, was a copy of the original which GLASSER had submitted to the Treasury Department. She stated she has no recollection of the classification given the document but assumes that the material was highly confidential, inasmuch as it was her understanding that GLASSER'S activities at the time were of a confidential nature. She was unable to definitely state whether the document was technically designated as a report or a memorandum, nor does she remember the number of pages that it contained. She believes that, since the document was supposed to have been a rather complete resume of GLASSER'S activities while abroad, it consisted of a number of pages; but she is unable to furnish an estimate as to how many pages were contained in the document. It is her recollection that the document was furnished to her in the late spring or early summer of 1944. It was brought to New York from Washington, D. C. with the regular delivery of material from the Perlo group. She does not recall who delivered the material on this occasion but believes it may have been brought to her by VICTOR PERLO.

Miss BENTLEY stated she may be able to recognize the document if it is located. She explained that her recollection of this matter is somewhat hazy because of the large volume of material which she was handling at this period and because of the fact that she had only about twelve hours leeway before she

passed it on to her principal "BILL". She does not have a clear recollection of having read the GLASSER report and in fact doubts that she did because of the large volume of material which she was handling.

In view of BENTLEY'S statement that she received this document in the late spring or early summer, it would appear that the report or memorandum in question dealt with the trip made by GLASSER to Europe in the spring of 1944. In this connection it is to be noted that in the unsigned statement made by GLASSER, he advised as follows:

"The first two months in 1944 was a very active period. I went to Italy for about three months at that time and returned in June, 1944."

Inasmuch as BENTLEY has characterized this report or memorandum as more or less as a resume of GLASSER'S activities and observations while he was abroad, it is possible that the report did not deal primarily with monetary matters but may have been a memorandum dealing with conditions observed by him during his trip abroad.

It is also possible that the memorandum referred to in the third paragraph of referenced WFO letter may be identical with or may be able to furnish some indications as to the nature and identity of the report submitted by GLASSER to the Treasury Department mentioned by BENTLEY.

The WFO is requested to recontact Mr. GEORGE H. WILLIS at the Treasury Department and discuss with him the information contained in this letter in order that further search may be made in an effort to obtain a copy of the document referred to. This case will be held in abeyance in the New York Office until such time as the WFO has obtained a copy of the above mentioned report or has exhausted all efforts to identify and obtain this report.

BUT, SHE SAID, THE RUSSIANS ASKED "WHICH CODE" AND SHE WAS NOT ABLE TO FIND OUT.

MISS BENTLEY DID NOT IMMEDIATELY GIVE A DATE FOR THE CODE-CRACKING INCIDENT BUT SAID CURRIE AT THE TIME WAS IN THE WHITE HOUSE AS AN EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT TO THE LATE PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT.

ALTHOUGH SHE DID NOT KNOW WHETHER CURRIE WAS ACTUALLY A PARTY MEMBER, SHE CONSIDERED HIM A "FULL FLEDGED MEMBER OF THE SILVERMASTER GROUP," THE FORMER RED COURIER SAID.

MISS BENTLEY SAID WHITE, WHO DIED OF A HEART ATTACK IN NEW HAMPSHIRE SHORTLY AFTER HER TESTIMONY BEFORE A HOUSE COMMITTEE IN 1948, PERSUADED MORGENTHAU TO PUSH FOR THE PLAN TO STRIP GERMANY INDUSTRIALLY AND MAKE IT PURELY AN AGRICULTURAL STATE.

"YOU MEAN THAT WAS A MOSCOW MOVE?" SEN. HOMER FERGUSON, R., MICH., ASKED.

"DEFINITELY," SHE REPLIED. MISS BENTLEY SAID WHITE "PUSHED MORGENTHAU HARD... EVERY TIME MORGENTHAU GOT A LITTLE WEAK, HARRY DEXTER WHITE PUSHED HIM."

SHE SAID WHITE ALSO PERSUADED MORGENTHAU TO SET UP AN INFORMATION EXCHANGE SYSTEM BETWEEN THE TREASURY AND SEVERAL OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES WHICH HELPED THE SILVERMASTER GROUP GET LOTS OF INFORMATION.

MISS BENTLEY TOLD AGAIN HOW WHITE SENT HER MANY SECRET DOCUMENTS WITH MESSAGES THAT THEY WERE FROM "HARRY" SO SHE WOULD KNOW. THEY WERE SNEAKED OUT OF TREASURY, USUALLY BY WILLIAM TAYLOR OR WILLIAM LUDWIG ULLMANN, SHE TESTIFIED, AND OFTEN HAD TO BE RETURNED AFTER BEING COPIES OR MICROFILMED IN SILVERMASTER'S BASEMENT.

SHE SAID THE ESPIONAGE AGENTS CONSIDERED CURRIE AND WHITE TWO OF THEIR BEST SOURCES--"THEY WERE FRIENDS IN COURT"--AND THAT BOTH HELPED GET MEMBERS OF THE APPARATUS INTO KEY GOVERNMENT JOBS.

"DID YOU EVER HAVE CONFIDENTIAL REPORTS FROM HARRY DEXTER WHITE?" SUBCOMMITTEE COUNSEL ROBERT MORRIS ASKED.

"MANY OF THEM," SHE REPLIED. "ALL SIGNED JUST 'HARRY'."

MISS BENTLEY WAS ASKED ABOUT A NUMBER OF GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AND ABOUT SOME IPR ASSOCIATES WHOSE NAMES HAVE FIGURED PROMINENTLY IN THE HEARINGS. AMONG THEM WERE:

SOLOMON ADLER, A FORMER TREASURY OFFICIAL -- SHE SAID HE WAS A MEMBER OF THE SILVERMASTER GROUP WHO REPRESENTED THE TREASURY IN CHINA. HE SENT INFORMATION TO HER THROUGH HARRY DEXTER WHITE, SHE SAID, EVEN THOUGH HIS JOB REQUIRED HIM TO BE FRIENDLY WITH THE NATIONALISTS. ON ONE OCCASION, SHE SAID, THERE WERE COMPLAINTS ABOUT ADLER'S NEGLECTING HIS ESPIONAGE DUTIES "BECAUSE HE WAS PLAYING BRIDGE TOO MUCH WITH MADAME CHIANG KAI-SHEK."

JOSEPH BARNES, FORMER FOREIGN NEWS EDITOR FOR THE NEW YORK HERALD TRIBUNE -- SHE SAID HE WORKED WITH GOLOS AND THAT GOLOS TOLD HER "HE (BARNES) WOULD TAKE COMMUNIST DIRECTIVES."

ALGER HISS -- SHE SAID THAT SHE WAS ONCE TOLD THAT HAROLD GLASSER OF THE TREASURY DEPARTMENT, ALLEGEDLY ONE OF THE SPY GROUP HEADED BY VICTOR PERLO, WAS AT ONE TIME ASSIGNED TO WORK WITH "A PERSON WORKING FOR SOVIET INTELLIGENCE." SHE SAID SHE WAS LATER TOLD BY GOLOS THAT THIS PERSON WAS HISS AND THAT HISS "WAS ONE OF US."

ROBERT T. MILLER, A STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIAL WHO WAS ONCE WITH THE COORDINATOR OF INTER-AMERICAN AFFAIRS -- SHE SAID HE SUPPLIED INFORMATION FOR HER RING.

JOHN P. DAVIES, THE STATE DEPARTMENT OFFICIAL WHO WAS RECENTLY CLEARED BY THE DEPARTMENT'S LOYALTY BOARD -- SHE SAID SHE WAS TOLD BY SILVERMASTER THAT DAVIES "WAS SYMPATHETIC TO US." SHE SAID SHE WAS ONCE SHOWN A REPORT BY DAVIES THAT DEMONSTRATED HIS SYMPATHY. SHE DID NOT AMPLIFY.

PHILIP JAFFE, FORMER EDITOR OF "AMERASIA" MAGAZINE, AND AN ASSOCIATE IN IPR -- SHE SAID SHE WAS TOLD THAT JAFFE WAS AMONG THE "BEST POSSIBLE PERSONS IN IPR FOR INTELLIGENCE WORK." SHE SAID SHE DECIDED NOT TO USE HIM BECAUSE HE WAS "TOO OPEN A COMMUNIST."

SHE EXPLAINED THAT IN INTELLIGENCE WORK, IT IS NECESSARY TO USE INDIVIDUALS "WHO ARE INCONSPICUOUS." SHE SAID THAT AN OPEN, AVOWED COMMUNIST -- ESPECIALLY ONE WHO IS WELL-KNOWN PUBLICLY -- IS UNDESIRABLE.

IN THIS REGARD MISS BENTLEY TESTIFIED THAT GOLOS ONCE CAUTIONED HER ABOUT WORKING TOO CLOSELY WITH THE INSTITUTE. SHE QUOTED HIM AS SAYING:

"IT'S AS RED AS A ROSE AND YOU SHOULDN'T TOUCH IT WITH A 10-FOOT POLE."

SHE ALSO TESTIFIED THAT "AMERASIA" MAGAZINE WAS UNDER "COMMUNIST INFLUENCE."

SPECIAL COUNCIL ROBERT MORRIS READ INTO THE RECORD NUMEROUS DOCUMENTS DESIGNED TO SHOW HOW THE PERSONS MENTIONED BY MISS BENTLEY WERE CONNECTED WITH THE INSTITUTE.

ONE OF THESE DOCUMENTS CONSISTED OF A MEMORANDUM FROM EDWARD C. CARTER, FOR YEARS THE INSTITUTE'S SECRETARY-GENERAL, TO WILLIAM L. HOLLAND, ITS PRESENT EXECUTIVE SECRETARY, WHICH SAID:

"I AM, OF COURSE, DELIGHTED THAT YOU HAVE PERSUADED CHI (A CHINESE COMMUNIST) TO ALLOW US TO GO AHEAD WITH HIS BOOK SUPPRESSING ONLY THOSE PASSAGES WHICH ARE LIKELY TO AFFECT CHI'S WORK.

ANOTHER WAS A 1942 LETTER FROM CARTER TO BARNES IN WHICH CARTER REFERRED TO CURRIE AS "AN INTIMATE FRIEND AND ADMIRER OF OWEN LATTIMORE."

"YOU AND HE WOULD FIND A GREAT DEAL IN COMMON, NOT ONLY IN MATTERS CHINESE, BUT IN AFFAIRS ELSEWHERE," THE LETTER SAID.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, an admitted Soviet espionage courier, advised that subject after returning from an overseas assignment for the Treasury Department in the spring or early summer of 1944, made available to her a copy of his report which was prepared especially for the Treasury Department. Investigation has disclosed that GLASSER was in Algiers, North Africa, and Italy from February 27, 1944 until June 2, 1944, as a Treasury Department representative. During this period, he served as member of a committee established by the War and Treasury Departments and which included a General Accounting Office representative. This committee was designated to study the fiscal policies of the Army overseas. This committee issued a formal report consisting of 190 mimeographed pages on May 11, 1944. GLASSER, although a member of this committee, did not assist in the preparation of this report which was classified secret and its distribution was controlled by the Army. Efforts to locate distribution record of this report were unsuccessful but because its distribution was controlled, it appears doubtful that this was the report furnished to BENTLEY. Photostatic copies of other memoranda pertaining to GLASSER's travel during the pertinent period secured.

DETAILS:

AT WASHINGTON, D.C.Basis For Investigation

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, who has publicly admitted participation in a Soviet inspired espionage apparatus which operated in Washington, D.C., and New York City during the early 1940's, has identified this subject as a member of a Russian espionage group, then operating in Washington, D.C., under the leadership of VICTOR PERLO, a member of the United States War Production Board. BENTLEY has advised that in the spring of 1944, GLASSER was serving on a foreign mission for the United States Treasury Department. She stated that upon GLASSER's return to the United States, he prepared a report relating to his activities abroad for the Treasury Department and, thereafter, furnished her a copy of this report. BENTLEY was unable to recall who actually handed this report (GLASSER's report) to her in New York City for ultimate transmittal to the Soviet Union. She believed, however, that PERLO may have been the person who brought this report to her. She has advised that no particular system existed for the transmittal of information secured from the PERLO Group in Washington, D.C., to New York City. She explained that when a member of the PERLO Group had occasion to visit New York City, that person would gather the material and bring it to her in New York City. According to BENTLEY, the selection of the individuals designated to bring this material to her was made by the members of the VICTOR PERLO Group. BENTLEY has identified the following as members of the VICTOR PERLO Group and included in addition to GLASSER the following:

EDWARD JOSEPH FITZGERALD, War Production Board employee.

CHARLES KRAMER, Office of Price Administration employee.

ALGER HISS, former State Department official recently convicted of perjury in New York City.

SOLOMON A. LISCHINSKY, War Production Board employee.

GEORGE N. PERAZICH, United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration employee.

ALLAN R. ROSENBERG, Foreign Economic Administration (FEA) employee.

DONALD N. WHEELER, Office of Strategic Services employee.

This investigation has been initiated to identify the report that BENTLEY has alleged was furnished the espionage apparatus by GLASSER and further to determine the security classification afforded this particular document in 1944.

Foreign Travel of GLASSER - 1944

The personnel and travel files of HAROLD GLASSER maintained by the Treasury Department disclosed that by letter dated February 1, 1944, GLASSER was authorized by the Treasury Department to travel to North Africa, Spain, and Portugal. In requesting a passport for GLASSER, the Treasury Department informed the State Department in February of 1944 that GLASSER would visit the previously identified countries to make a study of and report to the Treasury Department concerning foreign exchange problems and other matters of interest to the Treasury Department now pending in Spain and Portugal. It was also stated that one of the purposes of this trip would be indicated in a communication to the State Department from the combined Chiefs of Staff of the United States Army.

By letter dated February 11, 1944, HARRY DEXTER WHITE, then the Director of the Monetary Research Division of the United States Treasury Department and who has also been identified by BENTLEY as a Soviet espionage agent, mentioned in a letter to LEO CROWLEY, Administrator for the F.E.A., that GLASSER was leaving for the Mediterranean area and would visit Spain. It was also mentioned that GLASSER would discuss with a Mr. RICHARD MAY of the F.E.A., the problems of foreign exchange relating to Spain on his visit to Spain.

GLASSER's file indicated that he departed from the United States for the Mediterranean area on February 27, 1944, and was accompanied by GILBERT L. CAKE, Associate Commissioner, Bureau of Accounts, Treasury Department. CAKE and GLASSER arrived in Algiers, North Africa, on March 4, 1944. On March 28, 1944, GLASSER informed the Treasury Department that one FOLEY desired that he return to Naples to assist the Finance Sub-Committee in the preparation of a program for the Finance and Economic Stabilization of Italy. GLASSER suggested in this cable to the Treasury Department that he be permitted to attend this conference and asked that his stay in Naples be limited to thirty days. His file disclosed, however, that GLASSER departed from Algiers on April 6, 1944, for Spain but returned to Algiers on April 8, 1944, and then proceeded to Naples, Italy. His file indicated that this trip to Spain was made because instructions pertaining to the request made by him on March 28, 1944, had not been received by him on or about April 6, 1944. However, on April 6, 1944, GLASSER was instructed by the Treasury Department to attend the Sub-Committee Hearings in Italy. His file did not indicate if GLASSER had actually arrived in Spain before returning to Algiers and then departing for Italy.

On May 1, 1944, GLASSER cabled the Department from Naples advising that the Italian Conference would end on May 10, 1944. GLASSER was then instructed by the Treasury Department to proceed to Spain. On May 12, 1944, GLASSER was instructed by the Treasury Department to remain in Italy as requested by the Allied Central Commission at Naples and to confer with the United Kingdom Representative who was reported to be enroute to Naples from Cairo. This United Kingdom Representative was identified as one LLOYD.

On May 26, 1944, a cable was directed to GLASSER at Naples by the Treasury Department and instructed him to return to Washington, D.C. This file revealed that GLASSER arrived in the United States on June 2, 1944, and returned to his employment at the Treasury Department in Washington, D.C., on June 3, 1944.

Purpose of Travel

GILBERT L. CAKE, previously identified, and who accompanied GLASSER on his assignment to the Mediterranean area in 1944, advised that sometime in the fall of 1943, Secretary of Treasury, HENRY MORGANTHAU, Jr., visited Italy and upon his return suggested to the War Department that a joint mission be established to examine the financial aspects of liberated Italy. CAKE said that the War Department agreed to this suggestion and organized a mission which consisted of the following representatives of the War Department, Treasury Department and the General Accounting Office:

Colonel ANDREW STEWART, Finance Division, United States Army.

Lieutenant Colonel E.O. McCONAHAY, Finance Division, United States Army.

J.P.C. NEVITT, General Accounting Office.

HAROLD GLASSER, United States Treasury Department.

GILBERT L. CAKE, United States Treasury Department.

CAKE advised that the foregoing individuals comprised the entire mission which was charged with the responsibility for studying the financial structures, procedures and operations of the American Military Government together with the pertinent portions of the administrative activities of those agencies which affected fiscal operations.

In addition, CAKE advised that this mission was charged with securing information which might assist in determining future foreign fiscal policies and also to determine if adequate records were being maintained which were necessary for the consideration of post war policies and ultimate financial settlements.

CAKE advised that this mission was classified "top secret" by the Military and the members were ordered to proceed to the North African theatre. CAKE advised that the Group arrived in Algiers, North Africa, late in February, 1944. He recalled that in carrying out the mission's objectives, the Group visited Algiers, Naples, Palermo, Sicily and Oran, North Africa. CAKE was reasonably certain that GLASSER accompanied the Group on its visits to the foregoing places. He also stated that prior to their returning to the United States, members of the mission also visited England but he recalled that GLASSER did not accompany the mission to England. He advised that all the members of the mission, excepting GLASSER, returned to the United States on April 25, 1944. He believed that GLASSER had been instructed by the Treasury Department to remain in Italy. CAKE was not aware of the reasons why GLASSER remained in Italy but assumed that GLASSER had been given another assignment by the Treasury Department which required his presence in Italy.

After the four members of the mission returned to the United States, CAKE stated that the group, excepting GLASSER, who was abroad, prepared a formal report setting forth the results of their study. This report, CAKE stated, was prepared at the Pentagon under the supervision of the Army and he also advised the distribution of this report, which was classified "secret" by the Army, was also controlled by the Army. The report, CAKE advised, was entitled "Report of Finance Mission to North African Theatre In Connection With the Military Government In Italy." This report, according to CAKE, was dated May 11, 1944, and was not directed to the attention of anyone in particular.

CAKE was not aware of the number of copies that had been prepared but stated that he had in his possession copy number nineteen. He recalled that this report had been sent to him by the Army but he was unable to recall the methods by which this report had been transmitted and could not locate any letter sending this report to him. He could not recall the particular office or branch of the Army which had distributed this report but believed that this had been handled by the Finance Office. He made this report available for examination and it was noted that this report consisted of 190 mimeographed pages and was contained in heavy cardboard covers. The outside cover bore the title of the report, the classification "secret" and the date May 11, 1944.

CAKE stated that this report was non-political in nature and no mention or discussion was made in the report concerning the foreign policies of any foreign Government. He advised that to the best of his recollection, neither he nor any of the members of the group received any information pertaining to the disposition of any of the colonies held by France, Italy or any other foreign Government during their mission abroad. CAKE advised that he was not well acquainted with GLASSER. He advised that after GLASSER returned to the United States, they never entered into any discussion concerning this assignment. During the period they were overseas, CAKE stated that GLASSER did not mix in with other group members and usually kept to himself and made no effort to develop a close relationship with other members of the group.

CAKE was unable to furnish any other pertinent data concerning GLASSER and was not aware of the extent of GLASSER's association with WHITE, VICTOR PERLO, V. FRANK COE, the successor to WHITE, or WILLIAM TAYLOR, who was then employed as an Assistant Director of the Monetary Research Division of the Treasury Department. He was not aware of any other report that GLASSER prepared for the Treasury Department after returning to the United States.

Efforts were made at the Department of the Army, Pentagon, to locate the Control Sheet for the secret document entitled, "Report of Finance Mission to North African Theatre In Connection With the Military Government In Italy."

Mr. JOHN MARSH, Records Clerk, Office of the Comptroller, Chief of Staff, United States Army, WILLIAM CROFT, Records Clerk, Adjutant General's Office, United States Army, Records Center, Alexandria, Virginia, and A.A. SPADA, Records Clerk, Office Secretary of the Army, Pentagon, were all consulted but were unable to locate the control sheet for this report. CROFT advised, however, that copy number two of this report was in file at the Records Depot in Alexandria. None of the foregoing individuals could furnish any information concerning the location of administrative data including the control sheet pertaining to this report.

Reports Submitted to Treasury Department By GLASSER

GEORGE H. WILLIS, Director, Office of Finance, Treasury Department, which was formerly known as the Monetary Research Division, advised after reviewing certain Treasury Department files, that he had been unable to locate any formal report submitted by GLASSER upon his return to the United States in June, 1944, and which was concerned with Monetary exchange problems. He did advise, however, that GLASSER had submitted certain memoranda upon returning from his overseas assignment in June, 1944, and which were concerned with the purposes of this overseas assignment.

CHARLES DILLON GLENDINNING, Deputy Director, Office International Finance, reported through Miss JANE CULLEN, Administrative Assistant, Office Secretary of the Treasury, that an examination of Treasury Department files disclosed that copy number seven of the report of "Finance Mission to North African Theatre In Connection With the Military Government In Italy," was in the possession of the Treasury Department. Miss CULLEN was unable to locate any cover letter transmitting this report to the Department and was not aware of the identity of the office in the Department of Army which had forwarded this report to the Treasury Department.

Mr. GLENDINNING advised that after making a further review of the Treasury Department files for reports and memoranda submitted by GLASSER upon his return to the United States in June, 1944, that the only memoranda or reports which GLASSER assisted in or prepared were the following:

1. A preliminary draft dated June 26, 1944, (23 days after GLASSER's return to the United States) and directed to the Secretary of the Treasury by Undersecretary D.W. BELL, entitled, "Financing Relief and Rehabilitation Aid to Italy." This report bore the initials M.L.H.-E.F., and GLENDINNING advised that this draft was actually prepared by M.L. HOFFMAN. GLENDINNING identified HOFFMAN as a former official of the Foreign Funds Control Office, Department of the Treasury, who was now employed by the "New York Times" in Europe as a Finance Reporter. This draft consisted of four pages and did not bear any security classification, but Mr. GLENDINNING advised that at the time it was prepared, it was considered "confidential."

Treasury Department files disclose that HOFFMAN had served on a Treasury Department mission to North Africa with GLASSER, JOSEPH H. MURPHY, GARDNER PATTERSON, EDWIN F. RAINS and JAMES J. SAXON in June, 1943.

2. A final draft on this same subject matter which bore the initials H.G.-M.L.H., and which was submitted to Secretary MORGANTHAU by Undersecretary BELL on July 1, 1944. This memorandum which consisted of three pages was based entirely on the preliminary draft made by HOFFMAN, according to GLENDINNING.

3. On December 18, 1944, GLASSER submitted a nine page memorandum to Secretary MORGANTHAU, which was entitled "Report on Assignment to Italy, April and May, 1944." GLENDINNING advised that Secretary MORGANTHAU had requested this report from GLASSER inasmuch as he was considering sending GLASSER to London for the Treasury Department in 1945 and wanted this report before approving GLASSER for this assignment.

The foregoing data GLENDINNING advised were the only reports or memoranda which GLASSER submitted or prepared and which were concerned with his assignment to Italy and North Africa in 1944. All of these memoranda GLENDINNING said contained no security classification but he added that the information contained in these memoranda were considered by the Department to be confidential. A photostatic copy of each of these memoranda along with a routing slip dated June 26, 1944, and directed to Mr. BELL by Mr. HOFFMAN, reporting that GLASSER suggested that the draft dated June 26, 1944, be made the basis for the discussions of the Treasury's position on the matter of lend lease for Italy were secured from Mr. GLENDINNING.

GLENDINNING advised after reviewing information pertaining to GLASSER's assignment while employed by the Department, he had been unable to locate any information which indicated that GLASSER had traveled to Spain or Portugal in 1944.

Mrs. GINA PRICE, Administrative Assistant to G.W. WILLIS, Office of International Finance, Treasury Department, advised that she had served as GLASSER's secretary from late 1943 until GLASSER resigned his position at the Department. She recalled that GLASSER had made a trip overseas with GILBERT L. CAKE but was unable to furnish any information concerning the purpose of this assignment with CAKE. She was unable to recall having prepared any summary or resume of GLASSER's overseas assignment after he returned during the early summer of 1944. She was unable to furnish any further information with respect to this particular investigation.

The personnel files, Treasury Department, disclosed that ~~MR. HOFFMAN~~ MICHAEL L. HOFFMAN was born June 15, 1915, at Salisbury, North Carolina, and is married to the former CATHERINE HUGHES. In 1941, it was reported that his parents, EDWIN M. and MARY LINDSAY HOFFMAN, both of whom were reported to be natives of the United States, were residing at Berea College, Berea, Kentucky. HOFFMAN was graduated from Oberlin College, Oberlin, Ohio, in 1935. It was mentioned that he had attended the University of Chicago from 1935 to 1937. During the period from 1938 until 1940, HOFFMAN was employed as a Professor at Trinity College, Hartford, Connecticut. From 1940 until June 18, 1941, he was employed as a Professor at Oberlin College. On June 18, 1941, he was appointed an Exchange Specialist in the Foreign Funds Control Office of the United States Treasury Department. He listed the following as references when applying for this position: JACOB VINER, University of Chicago; ORVIS SCHMIDT, United States Treasury Department; HARVEY WOOSTER; A. NILSSON and BEN W. LEWIS, all of whom were identified as being associated with Oberlin College.

In June, 1941, HOFFMAN resided at 1901 K Street, N.W., apartment 503. His file indicated that he resigned his position at the Treasury Department on September 13, 1941, to return to his position as teacher at Oberlin College.

On November 19, 1941, the Foreign Funds Control Office of the Treasury Department was authorized to employ HOFFMAN as a Consultant. On January 29, 1942, HOFFMAN was appointed Head Commercial Specialist, Foreign Funds Control Office, Treasury Department. At this time, he resided at 4710 Edgemore Lane, Bethesda, Maryland.

On June 24, 1942, HOFFMAN was appointed Assistant to the Director, Office of the Secretary, Foreign Funds Control Office, Treasury Department, under the general supervision of JOHN W. PEHLE, Assistant to the Secretary of Treasury.

HOFFMAN's file referred to cable number 3222 dated December 27, 1942, from General EISENHOWER to the Treasury Department advising that six additional Treasury Department representatives were needed to assist DuBOIS (JOSIAH), TAYLOR (WILLIAM H.), and BERNSTEIN (EDWARD). The file indicated that GLASSER, HOFFMAN and others previously identified in this report, were detailed to North Africa in order to assist Treasury Department representatives DuBOIS, TAYLOR and BERNSTEIN. HOFFMAN's file also indicated that JAMES J. SAXON and HOFFMAN were assigned to the staff of General EISENHOWER at North Africa from February, 1943, until April 23, 1944. HOFFMAN was assigned to the Department from April 23, 1944, until August 1, 1944, when he was designated a Treasury Department representative in Paris, France. He served in this capacity until March 10, 1945, when he again returned to the Department. On April 16, 1945, ORVIS SCHMIDT, Director, Foreign Funds Control, requested HARRY DEXTER WHITE, Assistant to the Secretary, to designate HOFFMAN Acting Director of the Foreign Funds Control. advising that he was assigned the Treasury Department's program of investigating organizations in Germany. Both WHITE and Secretary MORGANTHAU approved SCHMIDT's request regarding HOFFMAN. At this time, HOFFMAN was residing at 3770-39th Street, N.W.

On August 31, 1945, HOFFMAN directed a letter to the Secretary of Treasury and marked specifically for Assistant Secretary WHITE advising that he was resigning his position at the Treasury Department in order to accept a post with the "New York Times" as correspondent on European finance and economic affairs.

This file contained no derogatory data or additional pertinent information.

SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, an admitted Soviet espionage courier, advised that subject after returning from an overseas assignment for the Treasury Department in the spring or early summer of 1944, made available to her a copy of his report which was prepared especially for the Treasury Department. Investigation has disclosed that GLASSER was in Algiers, North Africa, and Italy from February 27, 1944, until June 2, 1944, as a Treasury Department representative. During this period, he served as member of a committee established by the War and Treasury Departments and which included a General Accounting Office representative. This committee was designated to study the fiscal policies of the Army overseas. This committee issued a formal report consisting of 190 mimeographed pages on May 11, 1944. GLASSER, although a member of this committee, did not assist in the preparation of this report which was classified secret and its distribution was controlled by the Army. Efforts to locate distribution record of this report were unsuccessful but because its distribution was controlled, it appears doubtful that this was the report furnished to BENTLEY. Photostatic copies of other memoranda pertaining to GLASSER's travel during the pertinent period secured.

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DETAILS: ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY was interviewed by SA LESTER O. GALLAHER at New York City on October 31, 1951. At that time she was shown photostatic copies of the following documents:

"Financing Relief and Rehabilitation in Italy" dated July 1, 1944

"Report on Assignment to Italy, April and May, 1944" dated December 18, 1944.

Miss BENTLEY stated she did not recognize any of these documents as being similar to documents furnished to her by GLASSER through the Perlo group and which she turned over to her principals.

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Her attention was particularly directed to the fact that the last named document appeared to be a general report on GLASSER's activities in Europe. She stated that this document was prepared much later than one to which she had referred. She was asked if she recalled enough about the document she had received to determine if the "Report on Assignment to Italy, April and May, 1944" prepared December 18, 1944, might have been a copy of a report prepared earlier by GLASSER. She advised she didn't remember enough of the contents of the document to tell if this was so.

Miss BENTLEY then went on to state that it is now her impression that GLASSER submitted various documents and reports to the Treasury Department as a result of his trip to Europe in 1944 but the report, which was received by her and turned over to her principal, was one prepared by GLASSER especially for that purpose.

It will be recalled that BENTLEY had stated previously that she believed the report which had been turned over to her was a copy of one made by GLASSER for the Treasury Department. In view of her most recent statement concerning the report it is believed that further efforts to locate this document would be futile.

Miss BENTLEY was not questioned about the report entitled "Report of Finance Mission to North African Theatre in Connection with the Military Government," inasmuch as she had previously indicated that the document she had received was fairly Brief and in view of her statements set out above.

Re report of SA LESTER O. GALLAHER, dated December 21, 1951, at New York.

This report mentions that ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, after examining the reports prepared by GLASSER following his return to the United States from the Mediterranean area in June, 1944, was unable to identify any of these reports as being similar to those furnished her by GLASSER. BENTLEY was reported as stating that it was her impression at this time that the reports made available by GLASSER were prepared for her espionage apparatus and not for the Treasury Department. BENTLEY also advised that she was unable to identify the contents of the reports furnished her by GLASSER.

This case was reopened in this office by Bureau letter dated July 12, 1951, which instructed this office to identify the reports that GLASSER furnished BENTLEY through an examination of Treasury Department files. Inasmuch as it has now been determined from BENTLEY that the reports made available to her by GLASSER were not actual copies of official Treasury Department documents but contained information extracted from Treasury Department memoranda and reports, and further because BENTLEY is now unable to identify the contents of these reports, no further investigation in this matter is contemplated by this office. Responsible Treasury Department officials advise that GLASSER was the First Assistant to HARRY DEXTER WHITE in the Monetary Research Division throughout 1944. GLASSER acted as Director of this division in WHITE's absence. Information received that GLASSER was tactless and blunt in dealings with associates and would not hesitate to express opposition to WHITE or other ranking Treasury Department officials. GLASSER's former associates identified V. FRANK COE as GLASSER's closest professional and personal friend. These people were also aware that relations between WHITE and GLASSER while superficially cordial were actually strained. Treasury Department files contained no data indicating that GLASSER opposed appointment of VICTOR PERLO to the Department in 1945. These files also contain no data indicating that A. GEORGE SILVERMAN attempted to secure employment in the Department in 1944.

he had been well acquainted with GLASSER, HARRY LOYD WHITE, and V. ROBERT COE during the mid 1940's when they were all employed in the Treasury Department.

(S) [T-1] had no knowledge of the relationship that existed between WHITE and GLASSER during the pertinent period (June - August, 1944). He did advise that he had received information after WHITE had been made an Assistant Secretary of the Treasury Department and COE had been appointed Director of the Monetary Research Division, succeeding WHITE in this position, that the appointment of COE to this position was deeply resented by GLASSER and Assistant Director EDWARD BARNSTEIN. T-1 stated, however, that within a very short period after COE had assumed his duties as Director of the Monetary Research Division, the relations between COE and GLASSER became most cordial and they impressed the informant as being genuinely friendly with each other. It was this informant's opinion that GLASSER eventually became closer to COE than any other person at the Treasury Department. This informant was not aware of any common factors or associations that existed in the backgrounds of GLASSER and COE.

(S) [T-1] said that during the period that COE was Director of the Monetary Research Division, GLASSER acted as his First Assistant Director. Although informant could not furnish information relating to GLASSER's status with respect to HARRY LOYD WHITE during the period that WHITE was Director of this Division, he believed that GLASSER occupied a similar position in that he was the Director's number one man.

(S) [T-1] said that they appeared friendly with each other while at the office, but informant said that he very seldom saw them together. Informant was not aware of any social relationship that existed between these individuals outside of their employment.

HENRY J. BITTERMAN, Financial Advisor to Director, Office of International Finance (formerly known as Monetary Research Division), advised that he had joined the Monetary Research Division of the Treasury Department in September, 1943, and has been employed in this section of the Department continuously since that date. He advised that prior to 1943 he had been employed as a Professor at Ohio State University. He mentioned that he had been employed as a Professor at Ohio State from 1928 until 1943. Prior to 1928, he stated that he had attended the University of Chicago and was in attendance there during the same period that GLASSER and COE were there.

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WFO [65-5810] (S)

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He advised; however, that he had no contact with either GLASSER or COE after he left the university in 1928 until he joined the Department in 1943. He reported that he had secured a position as Economist in the Department in September, 1943, through his own efforts and did not utilize GLASSER or COE in obtaining this assignment.

BITTERMAN advised that throughout 1944 the Monetary Research Division was headed by HARRY DEXTER WHITE, and he identified the following individuals as WHITE's Assistant Directors:

FRANK SOUTHARD
EDWARD M. BERNSTEIN
WILLIAM H. TAYLOR
WILLIAM T. NESS
HAROLD GLASSER

During 1944, BITTERMAN said that SOUTHARD was on a leave of absence from the Department. He stated that BERNSTEIN was in charge of matters affecting the United States stabilization fund and all plans relating to the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank. NESS, according to BITTERMAN, was in charge of Treasury Department matters concerned with Latin American countries, and GLASSER and TAYLOR handled monetary matters affecting European nations. BITTERMAN noted that TAYLOR was in England for a major portion of 1944 and practically the entire year of 1945. This assignment of TAYLOR's, Treasury Department Representative in England, BITTERMAN noted, made GLASSER the sole chief of the Monetary Research Division's affairs concerning Europe.

BITTERMAN identified GLASSER as the First Assistant Director under WHITE during 1944 and stated that GLASSER acted as the Director of the Division whenever WHITE was absent. BITTERMAN pointed out that during the summer of 1944 WHITE was away from the Treasury Department for a considerable period of time. He noted that at this particular time WHITE was preparing for the Bretton Woods Conference and had attended a conference in Atlantic City, New Jersey, from June 15, 1944, through June 30, 1944. Thereafter, BITTERMAN advised, WHITE attended meetings at the Bretton Woods, New Hampshire Monetary Conference from July 1, 1944, through July 22, 1944. Throughout this entire period, BITTERMAN stated GLASSER acted as Director of the Monetary Research Division.

(It will be recalled that on August 31, 1944, Confidential Informant T-2, of known reliability, not to be disseminated outside the Bureau.)

BITTERMAN assumed that GLASSER would have had the authority to employ personnel during this period but could not recall if he had authorized the appointment of anyone in WHITE's absence.

With respect to the appointment of VICTOR PERLO to the Treasury Department in 1945, BITTERMAN advised that he had no knowledge of any objections entered against PERLO by GLASSER. It was BITTERMAN's belief that PERLO had been appointed to the Treasury Department by HARRY DEXTER WHITE despite the fact that COE was actually the Director of the Monetary Research Division at the time PERLO was appointed. BITTERMAN described COE as being WHITE's "office boy". He explained this terminology by stating that COE would perform as directed when ordered by WHITE.

BITTERMAN stated that during the period that WHITE was in the Treasury Department, WHITE had little social contact with his Treasury Department professional associates as far as he knew. BITTERMAN was not aware of any social relationship that existed between WHITE and GLASSER but said that in their contacts at the office their relationship impressed him as being cordial. BITTERMAN noted, however, that GLASSER was not the least bit reluctant or hesitant in voicing opposition or objections to programs authored by WHITE and with which he was not in agreement. BITTERMAN characterized GLASSER as one who formed independent judgments and who was more or less a free thinker. BITTERMAN contrasted this type of personality with that of WILLIAM H. TAYLOR and noted that TAYLOR fell in line with WHITE's policies much more easily and readily than did GLASSER.

After WHITE was promoted to the position of Assistant Secretary in the Treasury Department, BITTERMAN said that a bitter feeling developed between GLASSER and BERNSTEIN. This was caused by their ambitions and desires to succeed WHITE as Director of the Monetary Research Division. The feeling between GLASSER and BERNSTEIN developed to such a degree, BERNSTEIN stated, that WHITE went outside the Department and secured V. FRANK COE for the position. It was BITTERMAN's opinion that BERNSTEIN was so disappointed that shortly thereafter he left the Monetary Research Division and transferred to another section in the Department.

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After COE arrived at the Department early in 1945, BITTERMAN stated that he noted that the relationship between COE and GLASSER was somewhat strained. He knew that both COE and GLASSER had previously been good friends but he stated that in spite of this there was a marked strain in their dealings. He advised that the feeling did not last very long and that within a very short time COE and GLASSER worked closely and in a harmonious manner. BITTERMAN advised that his social contact at this time with both GLASSER and COE was practically nonexistent and for that reason he advised that he was not aware of the extent of the social relationship between GLASSER and COE at this time. He stated, however, that as far as he knew COE was GLASSER's closest professional acquaintance in the Department.

BITTERMAN knew of no close relationship between GLASSER and LAUCHLIN CURRIE and added that he had no reason to believe that they were intimate or that CURRIE could influence GLASSER.

BITTERMAN did not know NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER and stated that he did not learn that he had ever been employed by the Treasury Department or had attended the Bretton Woods Conference, which he had also attended, until ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY, the confessed Russian espionage courier, testified to this in hearings conducted by the United States House Committee on Un-American Activities.

BITTERMAN advised that he was not aware of any close relationship that existed between ABRAHAM GEORGE SILVERMAN and HAROLD GLASSER. He assumed, however, that they were acquainted and did know that SILVERMAN was well acquainted with HARRY DEXTER WHITE.

Concerning the relationship between GLASSER and PERLO, BITTERMAN stated that on one occasion GLASSER indicated to him that he had no respect for PERLO's professional judgment. BITTERMAN was not aware of any social relationship that existed between PERLO and GLASSER.

BITTERMAN said that he never had any reason to question the loyalty and patriotism of those persons who were employed in the Treasury Department and who were identified as Soviet Agents by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY.

He advised that in 1946 he and GLASSER represented the United States at a meeting of a Subcommittee of the Council of Foreign Ministers which was held at Trieste and which was designed to establish a monetary system for that city after it had been established as a free and independent city. BITTERMAN noted that the Russians at this conference were extremely difficult to confer with and exhibited a hostile and uncooperative attitude.

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Throughout the discussions with the RUSSIANS, BITTERMAN said, GLASSER defended the policies and views of the United States as ably as anyone else could have done. At no time, BITTERMAN said, did GLASSER ever indicate to him that he had any sympathy for the Russians or the Yugoslavs.

Mrs. MARY C. HALL, Administrative Assistant Director, Office of International Finance, advised that during 1944 she was employed as the Second Secretary in the office of HARRY DEXTER WHITE. With respect to the administrative functions of the Monetary Research Division in 1944, she advised that, although GLASSER had never been designated the First Assistant Director, he did occupy such a position. She recalled that GLASSER was in charge of the Monetary Research Division during the major portion of the summer of 1944 when WHITE was preparing for and attending the monetary conference held at Bretton Woods, New Hampshire.

During the period that GLASSER was in charge of the Monetary Research Division, Mrs. HALL advised, she did not believe that he had employed any personnel. She expressed the opinion that despite occupying WHITE's position, he would have undoubtedly cleared with WHITE before hiring a professional employee for the Division.

Concerning the appointment of PERLO to the Monetary Research Division in 1945, Mrs. HALL believed that V. FRANK COE, who was then serving as Director, had recommended the appointment of PERLO. She recalled that there had been opposition to this appointment by persons she could not now identify. She could not recall if GLASSER opposed this appointment or if the opposition had resulted from the salary that PERLO was to receive or because PERLO wanted to bring his secretary from the War Production Board with him. Although Mrs. HALL could not recall the nature of the opposition to PERLO, she was definite in her statement that there was opposition in the Treasury Department to the PERLO appointment.

It will be recalled that in an unsigned statement made to this office in 1947, GLASSER advised that he had opposed the appointment of PERLO because he felt that the appointment of PERLO, a statistician, would be at cross purposes with the aims of the Monetary Research Division which was concerned with international affairs only.

Mrs. HALL described GLASSER as a very frank person but one who was lacking in tact and polish especially in his relations with his professional associates. She advised that his professional associates always knew where they stood with GLASSER because he was outspoken and not the least bit hesitant in expressing himself.

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Concerning GLASSER's relations with WHITE, Mrs. HALL advised that it was generally known in the Treasury Department that WHITE had dispatched GLASSER to South America during the early 1940's because of some personal dispute, the nature of which had never been ascertained. Mrs. HALL said that it was suspected that LUDWIG ULLMAN, who at that time was the Administrative Assistant to WHITE, disliked GLASSER and reported unfavorably to WHITE about him. This resulted in WHITE's taking a dislike to GLASSER and subsequently assigning him to South America. Mrs. HALL was not aware of the reasons that ULLMAN disliked GLASSER, nor could she identify anyone who could substantiate this report. After GLASSER returned from South America, Mrs. HALL advised that the professional relationship between GLASSER and WHITE appeared cordial. Mrs. HALL was not aware of any other relationship that existed between WHITE and GLASSER thereafter.

Mrs. HALL advised that after WHITE had been promoted to an Assistant Secretary in the Treasury Department and had left the Monetary Research Division, she learned from Mr. WHITE's First Secretary, Mrs. LINDA SHANAHAN, that V. FRANK GOE would replace him in this position.

Mrs. HALL advised that she was not personally acquainted with A. GEORGE SILVERMAN but advised that he was a frequent visitor to the office of HARRY WHITE. She was not aware of any relationship that existed between SILVERMAN and GLASSER but did believe they were acquainted. It was Mrs. HALL's observation that GLASSER was immune to influence. She said it was well known throughout the Department that he was an independent thinker and formed his own opinions. She advised that he was not politic and was not at all hesitant in expressing himself favorably or unfavorably as the case might be when he discussed his associates. She said that she found that GLASSER was the type who would not hesitate to go to his superior and tell him bluntly and frankly in the event he found himself not in agreement with anything which affected the Monetary Research Division. Mrs. HALL believed, however, that GLASSER was not the type who would make an issue in the event he was overruled by his immediate supervisor and take his case to a higher authority. Mrs. HALL said she had no knowledge of any common denominator which existed in the backgrounds of GOE and GLASSER. She was not aware of the feeling that these persons had toward each other.

Mrs. MARY HERRON, Secretary, International Monetary Fund and former Secretary to HAROLD GLASSER, advised that she did not begin to work in GLASSER's office until September, 1945. Mrs. HERRON stated that she had not been employed in the Treasury Department from June 30, 1943, to September, 1945, and had no association with GLASSER and others in the Monetary Research Division during that period. She advised that after 1945 she became acquainted

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with VICTOR PERLO at the Treasury Department. It was her opinion that GLASSER was not overly fond of PERLO but she could not furnish any specific or concrete reason for this belief. She had no knowledge that GLASSER had ever opposed the appointment of PERLO to the Department.

Concerning the relationship of GLASSER with WHITE, Mrs. HERRON advised that she had learned from a source she could not recall that GLASSER had been sent to Ecuador by WHITE after a disagreement. She was unable to furnish details concerning this disagreement nor could she identify others who could furnish such information. She noted, however, that when she went to work for GLASSER in the Treasury Department in 1945, the attitude of GLASSER and WHITE toward each other did not appear antagonistic.

She also described GLASSER as an independent thinker and did not believe him to be the type who could be influenced easily. Mrs. HERRON was not aware of any close association or friendship that existed between GLASSER and COE or GLASSER and LAUCHLIN CURRIE. She advised that during the period she was employed as GLASSER's secretary, CURRIE was not a frequent caller in GLASSER's office nor did he have frequent telephone contact with GLASSER. In respect to COE and GLASSER, she advised that COE only worked in the Treasury Department for a few months during the period she was GLASSER's secretary. She advised that the relations between them appeared cordial and they appeared to be very friendly and respectful of each other. Mrs. HERRON stated that in 1946, she had attended the Monetary Conference in Trieste along with GLASSER and HENRY J. BITTERMAN. Throughout the conference, she advised that GLASSER was not at all conciliatory in his attitude or manner toward the Russian delegation, and, as far as she was concerned, he fully protected the interests of the United States at this conference. She advised that she had no reason to suspect or doubt the loyalty or patriotism of GLASSER despite the allegations made by BENTLEY.

PAUL McDONALD, Director of Administrative Services, Treasury Department, advised, after reviewing records, that he had not been able to locate any record nor did he have any personal knowledge that HARRY WHITE, HAROLD GLASSER, or any other person had ever interceded to the Treasury Department in an effort to secure employment for A. GEORGE SILVERMAN. He advised that, although Treasury Department records relating to NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER show that he had made a formal request to the Agriculture Department asking that SILVERMASTER be transferred to the Treasury Department, he pointed out that this was a routine function of his duties at that time, and he added that he was not personally acquainted with SILVERMASTER and did not know who was instrumental in securing the employment for him.

The personnel file of VICTOR PERLO maintained at the Treasury Department contained an undated handwritten memorandum which mentioned that "Mr. GSE wants to hire PERLO". A second notation dated March 6, 1945, from GSE and directed to HARRY HOFFER WIRE reported that "PERLO could not get free at the War Production Board. We have agreed to take the matter up again in two or three months if there is an opening here".

PERLO's file also disclosed that in March, 1947, GLASSER had approached S. J. SPINDLER, Assistant General Counsel of the Treasury Department, and informed him that one GARNETT of the State Department had asked him to recommend a qualified person to serve as a representative of the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees. GLASSER inquired if it would be permissible to recommend PERLO for this position on a personal basis. The file on PERLO indicated that he was told that this would be satisfactory. PERLO's file indicated that he resigned from the Treasury Department on March 27, 1947, to take this position, but a subsequent notation indicated that the post did not materialize.



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Clara ~~REINSTEIN~~, was registered to vote for 1952 but failed to designate her political preference.

Mrs. ABRAHAM REINSTEIN gave his age as 38 and indicated that he had been in the state and city for 21 years and in the election district for ten years. He indicated that he was born in the United States.

CLARA REINSTEIN gave her age as 37 and indicated that she had been in the state and city for 30 years and in the election district for nine years. She also stated that she was born in the United States.

Concerning the American Labor Party the following is being set out:

"For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control". (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, page 78.)

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York checked by SE RICHARD F. O'HARA on March 27, 1953 for ABRAHAM REINSTEIN, 1323 West Farms Road, Bronx, New York, failed to disclose any record.

Among this list appeared the name of ~~ABE~~ REINSTEIN, 1323 West Farms Road, Bronx, New York. He was listed as being the Vice President of Thomas Paine Lodge number 807 JA as of November 16, 1948.

The International Workers Order has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

THOMAS A. GRAY, Manager, Knickerbocker Village, 10 Monroe Street, New York City, advised on May 5, 1953 that his records failed to reflect that ANNA SOKOLOW is or has been one of their tenants. However, a further check by GRAY disclosed that ANNA SOKOLOW stayed in apartment HF10 for a period of two weeks in the latter part of 1952. This apartment is rented to ~~ARNOLD~~ BANK. ^{NY}

ALEX ~~NORTH~~, 338 North Crescent Drive, Beverly Hills, California, was interviewed on November 30, 1950 by SAs WILLIAM H. VAN LANDINGHAM and HARVEY G. BERKEY. It is noted that ALEX NORTH is the brother of ~~JOSEPH~~ NORTH, former editor of "New Masses". ^{NY}

ALEX NORTH advised that he met ANNA SOKOLOW, who was then a member of the Martha Graham Dancing Group, and from approximately 1933 to the summer of 1939 NORTH lived with ANNA SOKOLOW in common-law marriage. NORTH pointed out that both he and ANNA SOKOLOW gave various concerts at parties and rallies sponsored by such organizations as

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the Abraham Lincoln Brigade and the International Workers Order, but that his and ANNA SOKOLOW's participation in such activities was strictly limited to a professional basis. He stated that they were separated in approximately July, 1939 subsequent to a quarrel over a love affair.

The only address he had for ANNA SOKOLOW was the Sherman Square Studio, West 73rd Street, New York City. NORTH also suggested contact with SOKOLOW's sister, Mrs. ~~ARNOLD BANK~~, also known as ROSE ~~BANK~~, Knickerbocker Village, New York City, for her current whereabouts

(Confidential Informant T-27~~8~~) advised that ANNA (u) SOKOLOW was an instructor in "Dancing for Children" at the Jefferson School of Social Science for the fall term of 1946. The informant also advised that both ANNA SOKOLOW and ALEX NORTH, 19 West 16th Street, New York City, registered as Communists in 1936 from the 10th Assembly District in the 26th Election District.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

Miss JO ANN FOZIO, in care of Urban Company, 1457 Broadway, New York City, agents for 71 West 55th Street, New York City, advised on November 1, 1951 that ANNA SOKOLOW resides in apartment 2R at 71 West 55th Street, New York City. She stated that SOKOLOW is in business for herself as a choreographer and resides at that address with her husband.

The January 14, 1938 edition of the "Daily Worker", the well known East Coast Communist newspaper, announced that the New York State Committee of the Communist Party had made public complete details for a Lenin Memorial Meeting to be held at Madison Square Garden on January 19, 1938. ANNA SOKOLOW, who is described in the article as a "noted young modern dancer" was to present her dance group in the "Dance of all Nations".

The "Daily Worker" of May 6, 1938 contained an article concerning a review to be held on May 8, 1938 at

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the Mecca Temple in New York City. The review was to be presented by the Negro Cultural Committee for the benefit of the New York Chapter of the National Negro Congress. The review included a ballet dance entitled "Filibuster" which was under the direction of ANNA SOKOLOW. According to the article, the Negro Cultural Committee was composed of several individuals including ANNA SOKOLOW.

The National Negro Congress has been designated by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The Negro Cultural Committee was described as a Communist front organization in the 1947 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities.

The 1946 Spring catalogue of the Jefferson School of Social Science listed ANNA SOKOLOW under the caption of "Instructors and Guest Lecturers". The Winter catalogue of 1947 of the Jefferson School of Social Science listed ANNA SOKOLOW as a member of the faculty.

The Jefferson School of Social Science has been previously mentioned above.

The records at the Board of Elections, New York City, checked by SE CLINTON E. POLLOCK on March 30, 1953 failed to reflect a record for ANNA SOKOLOW at 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York checked by SE RICHARD F. O'HARA on March 27, 1953 failed to reflect any record for ANNA SOKOLOW, 10 Monroe Street, New York City.

Her husband, ^{Mrs.} SIDNEY ACKERMAN, age 43, also registered to vote under one of the two major political parties in 1952. SIDNEY ACKERMAN indicated that he had been in the state and city for 43 years and in the Election District for 14 years. Both indicated that they were born in the United States. It was also noted that both ACKERMANS registered to vote under one of the two major political parties for the years 1944 through 1952. 53

However, the records further reflected that in 1937 BEATRICE and SIDNEY ACKERMAN registered to vote in that year from 4222 Ketcham Street, Elmhurst, Long Island, New York. At that time both indicated their political preference as the American Labor Party. SIDNEY ACKERMAN indicated in 1937 that he was self-employed at 4003 National Avenue, Corona, Queens, New York. BEATRICE ACKERMAN at that time indicated that she was a housewife.

A review of the New York indices failed to reflect any information which could be identified with BEATRICE ACKERMAN.

The Queens telephone directory for 1952 reflected that SIDNEY ACKERMAN, lawyer, resides at 31-46 81st Street, Jackson Heights and that he maintains an office at 20 West 47th Street, New York City.

It should be noted that the current address of 31-46 81st Street, Jackson Heights, for the ACKERMANS is not the same as the 41-46 81st Street address which was furnished by Confidential Informant T-1. However, it is believed that this is one and the same person and there could have been an error in the transcription of the address by Confidential Informant T-1. (u)

The "New York Times" on April 15, 1953 carried an article emanating from Washington, D. C. which reflected that HAROLD GLASSER testified before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee on April 14, 1953.

GLASSER refused to say whether he had conferred with Communists before offering his advice to then Secretary MARSHALL at the Council of Foreign Ministers Meeting in Moscow in 1947; questions concerning conferences with then Secretary ACHESON; and whether he is now or had been a Communist during his 12 years of federal service. GLASSER testified that he entered government service with the Works Progress Administration in 1935 and that he went to Washington, D. C. to join the Treasury Department the following year. Later as an economist and specialist in currency matters, he was made financial advisor to the government of Ecuador and he served in North Africa, Italy, Germany and other overseas posts, he related to the Subcommittee. The subject refused to say whether his assignment as financial advisor to Ecuador had been influenced by the late HARRY DEXTER WHITE, former Secretary of the Treasury. GLASSER testified that the advice given Secretary MARSHALL at the Moscow Conference concerned Trieste.

At the first and second United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration meetings at which he was a financial advisor, GLASSER said he gave advice to Mr. ACHESON, then Undersecretary. The subject stated that his particular task was to advise as to which UNRRA countries could pay the full costs of the aid given them.

ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY, self-confessed Soviet espionage agent, stated that ALLAN ROSENBERG furnished information to be turned over to JACOB M. GOLOS, a Soviet agent. ROSENBERG obtained this information as a result of observation, recommendations, plans and proposals made by various government officials regarding the handling of postwar Germany. During that period he was employed in the Foreign Economic Administration and material of the above description came to him in the course of his duties with that agency. ROSENBERG was also known by BENTLEY as a member of the Communist Party.

Herdon, Virginia 10W1 is subscribed to by SOL LISCHINSKY and that this person is identical with SOLOMON AARON LISCHINSKY who resides at RFD 2, Sterling, Virginia. ELIZABETH BENTLEY advised that during the early part of 1944 EARL BROWDER arranged a meeting for her with the group which was known as the PERLO espionage group. It was indicated at this meeting that all the individuals were government employees and were furnished information which they had obtained from government files for use of the Soviet Union. Subsequent to this meeting, BENTLEY recalled that a member of this group was SOL LISCHINSKY, who was an employee of UNRRA. BENTLEY stated, however, that she could not recall having ever received any information from LISCHINSKY.

Bureau authority is hereby granted to the Newark Division to interview P. Bernard Nortman. In view of the fact that Nortman is believed to be a free-lance writer, Newark is cautioned to use discretion during this interview.

Reference is made to Newark letter to the Bureau dated 2-6-53, in the Abraham Wolfson Security Matter - C case. Relet reveals that Wolfson died 7-18-52, at East Prange, New Jersey.

Bureau authority is not being granted at this time to interview Allan R. Rosenberg and Solomon A. Lischinsky in view of the fact that efforts are under way in another case, the success of which would possibly produce another witness in the Gregory case. When the results of this case are known, further consideration will be given to the interview of Rosenberg and Lischinsky.

New York should advise the Bureau regarding the date of the appearance of Harold Glasser before the Federal Grand Jury.

The interview of Nortman should be conducted according to current standards regarding interviews with security subjects. If Nortman is cooperative, he should be interviewed about his own Communist and/or espionage activities as well as the activities of Harold Glasser.

The interview should be conducted promptly and the results submitted to the Bureau in report form suitable for dissemination to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice.

The file further reflects that the subject, aside from his regular employment appears to be engaged in the import-export business. It is also noted that the only known bank account maintained by the subject reveals a low four figure balance and not in keeping with the substantial income of the subject.

If Bureau authority is granted to conduct these interviews, the NYO will furnish the appropriate offices with the necessary information regarding the subject.

It is further recommended that investigation continue to establish the extent of the subject's apparent interest in the import-export business, also, if the subject has other bank accounts. The possibility exists that the subject is diverting funds for CP use.

Because of the subject's lack of cooperation when interviewed by agents of the NYO in 1949, and subsequent lack of cooperation when called before the Jenner Committee this year, it does not appear likely that a reinterview would be productive.

Dear Mr. Hoover,

A few months ago a congressional investigating committee on communistic activities had before them a witness by the name of Harold Glasser. At the investigation Mr. Glasser refused to answer some questions on the grounds of "self-incrimination."

I have been informed recently that he was cleared by the F. B. I. in 1948 when he first appeared before a Grand Jury, investigating, I believe, communistic activities in the government.

Since the recent newspaper publication of Mr. Glasser's refusal to answer some questions, his niece and the woman I hope to marry, Miss Jacqueline Glasser and I have had some heated arguments over her uncle's allegiance to this nation. She is convinced of his innocence; I am undecided. The quarrel between us can easily be settled if we knew Mr. Glasser's present status as regarded by the F. B. I.

Our quarrel if not settled will lead to an eventual break between us. I know this may seem a trivial request to ask of you, but is Mr. Glasser as clean an American as the rest of us, and if he is would he be acceptable enough for a civil service job? Please give us any information which will be helpful. We would be very grateful.



Reference is made to your memorandum of May 5, 1953.

A review of the information previously furnished to this Division indicates that, according to Elizabeth Bentley, the subject during the course of his service in the Treasury Department gave her confidential government information for transmittal to the Soviet Government. This information is considered sufficient to warrant a determination that the activities of the subject fall within the purview of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended by Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950. However, the evidence presently available has not been sufficiently corroborated to support a successful prosecutive action against the subject if his registration were solicited and he refused to register.

It is considered advisable that the subject be summoned before a grand jury for a thorough interrogation concerning his past activities, particularly with respect to a possible violation of Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950. Consequently, you are requested to forward to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York all investigative reports and other pertinent matter in your possession concerning the subject. Upon review of the subject's testimony before the grand jury, you will be advised as to any decision regarding the violation of any federal statute by the subject.

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

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SYNOPSIS:

As a step in bringing this case to a logical conclusion, it is suggested that P. Bernard Nortman, subject of a pending SM - C case, be interviewed. Nortman was a former associate of Glasser. Nortman was interviewed by WFO agents 4-15-47, and admitted knowing various persons connected with the Gregory case, but denied any complicity therein. Nortman was interviewed in January, 1952, by Richmond agents regarding subject of an SM - C case and although cooperative, claimed he knew no subversive derogatory information regarding the subject of the SM - C case. Suggest that field not be authorized to interview Allan R. Rosenberg and Solomon A. Lischinsky, subjects of the Gregory case, in view of the recent decision in the Joseph Katz case to attempt to have Katz returned to the United States. Cooperation of Katz would open possibility of successful prosecutive consideration of Gregory subjects.

RECOMMENDATION:

That attached letter be sent authorizing Newark to interview Nortman; denying authority to Boston to interview Rosenberg; and denying WFO authority to interview Lischinsky.

DETAILS:

Harold Glasser, subject of instant case, has been under investigation for a number of years arising out of charges of Elizabeth Bentley that Glasser, a former Treasury Department official, furnished her with information obtained through his official position for transmission to a Russian espionage agent. Investigation has developed that among others, Glasser has been associated with P. Bernard Nortman, 324 Beechwood Place, Leonia, New Jersey; Allan R. Rosenberg, 10 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts; and Solomon A. Lischinsky, RFD #2, Sterling, Virginia (Fairfax County). Glasser was interviewed by Bureau agents on January 28, February 2, and February 3, 1949. He testified before the Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, and before an executive and an open session of the Jenner Committee on April 14, 1953. To date he has declined to admit his participation in Soviet espionage or Communist Party activity.

Elizabeth Bentley has stated that Nortman was a Communist Party member during the late 1930's, and that Nortman, while in Government employment in Washington, D. C., associated with Communist Party members, William Remington, Mary Jane Keeney, and Victor Perlo. Investigation revealed that Nortman registered in the American Labor Party in 1938-39 and 1941-42. Nortman was interviewed April 15, 1947, by WFO agents and admitted knowing Remington, Keeney, and Perlo, but denied Communist Party membership or sympathies. Nortman stated he is diametrically opposed to Communist philosophy and considers himself a rugged individualist and a subscriber of the policies and doctrines of the late President Roosevelt. Nortman is the subject of a Security Index card and currently resides at 324 Beechwood Place, Leonia, New Jersey, where he is believed to be employed as a free-lance writer. Informants have been unable to determine any recent subversive activities on his part.

New York letter of June 10, 1953, also suggested that Allan R. Rosenberg, 10 Tremont Street, Boston, Massachusetts, and Solomon A. Lischinsky, RFD #2, Sterling, Virginia, subjects of the Gregory case be interviewed.

Both Rosenberg and Lischinsky, who are major subjects in the Gregory case, have been previously interviewed by Bureau agents and have not furnished any admissions regarding Soviet espionage or Communist Party activity. Both have appeared before various Congressional investigating committees and have failed to give pertinent information.

A decision was reached in the Joseph Katz case authorizing the Israeli Intelligence Service to attempt to set plans in motion for the return of Joseph Katz to United States authorities. Should Joseph Katz return to the United States and be cooperative, the Bureau would stand its best chance to date of being able to successfully prosecute the subjects of the Gregory case. In light of this, the field is being refused authority at this time to reinterview Rosenberg and Lischinsky; however, when the success or failure of the Katz venture is known, further consideration will be given to interviewing Rosenberg and Lischinsky as well as other major subjects in the Gregory case.

Reurlet 7-28-53. The Bureau feels that the questions posed by the United States Attorney in his memorandum should be answered in writing. The answers to his queries appear to be available from current investigation; therefore, the New York Office is instructed to address a memorandum to the United States Attorney using the information set out below as a guide in phrasing your memorandum to him.

Any additional investigation which the United States Attorney desires to clarify questions should be conducted immediately and the results furnished to him in an investigative report.

New York should point out to the United States Attorney that in regard to his suggestions in paragraph 3 of his memorandum that Glasser was under physical surveillance by New York agents as recently as December, 1952, and that no activities of significance were noted.

In regard to the United States Attorney's query as to whether or not any confessed Communists can identify Glasser and corroborate Bentley, it should be called to his attention that anytime a confessed Communist is interviewed by Bureau agents this avenue is explored if there is any reason to believe the confessed Communist would be in a position to know of the Silvermaster espionage network.

Regarding the United States Attorney's suggestion that Lee Pressman and David Lahl be interviewed, it should be noted as follows: Pressman was interviewed by agents of the New York Office 1-27-49; 6-30, 31-50; and 1-20-53. Pressman was cooperative only to a limited degree. On 8-28-50, Pressman testified before the HCUA and was reluctant to furnish details or to involve other individuals. Pressman has been under intensive investigation for perjury as a

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result of his testimony before the HCUA on 8-28-50. Recent investigation of Pressman has not indicated that he would be cooperative with Bureau agents to any greater degree than he has been in the past. In view of the above, and notwithstanding the fact that Glasser has previously admitted being a close social acquaintance of Pressman, it is not believed advisable at this time to interview Pressman about Glasser. You should so inform the United States Attorney.

In regard to David Wahl, it should be noted that Wahl testified before an executive session of the Senate Subcommittee on Internal Security (Jenner Committee) on 6-18-53. A review of the testimony reflected that Wahl in his answers specifically denied all matters relating to his Communist Party membership and activities. Investigative efforts are now under way to determine if a perjury violation can be established against Wahl for his testimony before the Jenner Committee. In view of Wahl's attitude toward the Jenner Committee, it is not believed logical or desirable to interview him about the Communist Party activities and/or Soviet espionage activities of Glasser. The executive session testimony of Wahl before the Jenner Committee is confidential. You should therefore not specifically mention it to the United States Attorney at this time, but advise him that Wahl has recently refused to advise a Government agency of his Communist Party activities.

Recent Bureau investigation of Wahl has reflected that during the past two years he has been in contact with persons of known Communist background, such as, Mary Jane Keeney, Robert T. Miller, Charles Kramer, and others. He has also been in touch with known Israeli intelligence agents, such as, Reuben Shiloah, Iffrain Ben-Arzi, Theodor Kollerik and Nahum Bernstein. New York is familiar with the activities of Wahl and until recently has been the office of origin in the Wahl case. The information regarding the contacts with Israeli intelligence agents should not be made known to the United States Attorney.

New York should suggest to the United States Attorney that he may desire to call Pressman and Wahl before a Federal Grand Jury and question them about Glasser.

New York by letter dated 6-10-53, advised that subject has a low four-figure bank account which is not in keeping with his income from the import-export business and his position with the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. New York suggested that the subject could be diverting funds for Communist Party use and that this line of the investigation was being pursued. New York should so inform the United States Attorney.

New York should recontact established confidential informants and sources of information who would be in a position to know of any current Communist Party activities on the part of Glasser and report the results of the contacts in the next investigative report.

After the above memorandum is forwarded to the United States Attorney, New York may also orally point out the following to the United States Attorney; Glasser has been the subject of investigation by this Bureau at various times since 1941 and continuously since the allegations of Elizabeth Bentley in 1945. The reports concerning the investigation of Glasser have regularly been disseminated to the Records Administration Branch of the Department of Justice and have recently been furnished to the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York. The investigation has been directed entirely toward determining whether or not Glasser is or was engaged in Soviet espionage and/or Communist Party activities. As in other cases arising from Bentley's allegations, and although much investigative effort has been expended, a second witness cannot be found to substantiate her allegations concerning Glasser's participation in Soviet espionage activity.

Whittaker Chambers and Catherine Villa Perlo have both stated that Glasser was a Communist; however, Glasser refused to testify on this point before the Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, and the Jenner Committee on 4-14-53, on the grounds of self-incrimination. He therefore avoided a possible perjury violation.

Numerous persons who were associates of Glasser and who were involved in the Lathan Gregory Silvermaster espionage network have been interviewed in the past and have failed to make any admissions which would make them witnesses against Glasser. These persons include Charles Kraner, Solomon Lischinsky, Allan Rosenberg, Henry Hill Collins, Victor Perlo and others.

After the United States Attorney's queries have been answered in writing, you should advise the Bureau promptly of your discussions with the United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York and submit an investigative report reflecting his prosecutive opinion in order that it may be disseminated to the Criminal Division of the Department of Justice. The Criminal Division will then be asked for its opinion as to whether or not Glasser's registration will be solicited under Section 20 (a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

New York should pursue all leads vigorously and bring this case to a logical conclusion at an early date.

On 7/21/53 USA LEONARD P. MOORE and AUSA C. W. WICKERSHAM, both of the EDNY gave their opinion regarding bringing the subject before a Federal Grand Jury at this time. The opinion was prepared by AUSA WICKERSHAM and agreed to by USA MOORE. The full opinion is as follows:

- I. Prosecution at this time appears premature or much too late. ELIZABETH BENTLEY'S testimony is the only real evidence tottie GLASSER into espionage in 1944 only and she is unable to identify any particular report as one she received from GLASSER. CHAMBERS' testimony is no help except as hearsay. Other evidence ties him in with Communists but alone is only circumstantial. GLASSER'S own statement is unsigned and very carefully guarded so as to deny unlawful activity.
- II. GLASSER has refused to testify before Congressional committees but has stood on Constitutional rights and there is no reason to believe that he would not do so again if called before Grand Jury. It would therefore appear that no benefit is to be obtained by calling him at this time and on the contrary he would be in a position to cause the government unfavorable publicity by charging persecution.
- III. There are many loose ends in present reports. Among them are:
1. What business activity (if any) outside of GLASSER'S job as Director of Overseas Studies is GLASSER now engaged in?
 2. If he is engaged in outside business activity, how is it financed?
 3. Does GLASSER receive communications at places other than his home and office? It is doubtful that he would receive unlawful communications at his home which he must know is under some surveillance.
 4. Can other confessed Communists identify GLASSER and corroborate BENTLEY? Particularly how about LEE PRESSMAN and DAVID WAHL?

IV. When the results of further investigation are made known, this office will be in a better position to indict or to put real pressure on GLASSER to answer questions before the Grand Jury.

It is noted that the suggested investigation set forth in paragraph III by the AUSA will in no way aid possible prosecution in this case with the exception of the possibility of obtaining corroborating information from LEE PRESSMAN and DAVID WAHL.

The Bureau's opinion is requested in this matter.



The column further states "One threat that frightens the relics of the New Deal is the uncovering of what went on in the Treasury under Mrs. ROOSEVELT's good friend, HENRY MORGENTHAU, his No. One Assistant, the mysterious HARRY DEXTER WHITE, and tight-lipped HAROLD GLASSER."

The column mentions that GLASSER during his recent examination before the Jenner Committee had on 24 occasions refused to answer questions on the ground that it would incriminate him. WANGENHEIM that unofficially in their opinion insufficient evidence existed to prosecute the subject under the terms of the Internal Security Act of 1950, or any other statute. They also stated unofficially that calling the subject before the Federal Grand Jury for interrogation would be less as he undoubtedly would resort to his constitutional rights.

The USA stated that he desired to discuss this case with the Department after which he would formally render his opinion.

The Bureau will be immediately notified of the USA'S official opinion in this matter.

MORRIS GLASSER, Attorney, 100 South Dearborn Street, Chicago, advised SA RAYMOND L. BECK in June of 1948 that he has known LEVIN for a number of years and was, in fact, his brother-in-law. He remarked that in his opinion, LEVIN was loyal to the government, and stated that anyone working for the government was loyal, otherwise they would not remain, that is, would attempt to find other work.

It is to be noted that MORRIS GLASSER is the brother of the subject and has previously been identified.

Reference is made to my memorandum of June 4, 1953, in which you were advised that the subject was to be summoned before a grand jury for interrogation concerning his past activities, particularly with respect to his possible obligations under the terms of the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended by Section 20(a) of the Internal Security Act of 1950.

The United States Attorney for the Eastern District of New York during the course of a conference with me on November 3, 1953, stated that in his opinion there would be no useful purpose served by summoning the subject before a grand jury at this time, since the subject not only has denied having engaged in any espionage activity as well as membership in the Communist Party, but has also claimed the privilege against self-incrimination during the course of his interrogation before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee in April of this year.

Since the evidence is insufficient to warrant prosecution of the subject for failure to register, his registration will not be solicited at this time. In the event that additional information is obtained tending to corroborate the allegations of Elizabeth Bentley regarding the subject's participation in a Soviet espionage apparatus, this matter will, of course, be reexamined in the light of such information.

The article stated that the subject resigned his position as Director of the Overseas Institute of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds. was a Communist or Soviet spy during twelve years in Federal service. It mentioned also that subject refused to answer any questions about any Communist or espionage activities. It was mentioned that the subject had headed the Overseas Institute for six years, and in the announcement of his resignation, JULIAN FREEMAN, the Council's President, stated the subject had "an exceptionally fine record," but had "completed" his studies planned for 1953.

On October 12, 1953, the Indianapolis office furnished an article which appeared in the "National Jewish Post," issue of September 18, 1953. This article mentioned that the "Post" had learned that certain affiliated groups of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds had demanded the acceptance of GLASSER's resignation when he first submitted it. It appeared that GLASSER had submitted his resignation when he first refused to tell the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee whether he had been a member of the Communist Party. This was on June 1, 1953. It was further mentioned that the subject planned to enter private business, but there was no explanation of what business he intended to go into.

The "New York Times," daily newspaper of October 21, 1953, contained an article which stated that a special subcommittee headed by Senator KARL E. MUNDT was attempting to establish how certain engraving plates, on which currency for expenses in occupied Germany were printed, were given to Russia. According to the article, on October 20, 1953, six individuals were called before this committee and questioned regarding these plates. Among those called was the subject, and he again invoked the privilege of the Fifth Amendment to remain mute on answers that might tend to incriminate him.

[T-2] advised that Dr. BENDER was born in Russia on June 8, 1904; is married; and his wife's name is SARA SPIRITES BENDER. He is director of Neurological Services at Bellevue Hospital and Mount Sinai Hospital in New York City. He has resided at 400 East Shore Road since 1951 and has been a resident in Great Neck since 1946. A preliminary inquiry was made into the background of Dr. BENDER, but no substantive disloyal information regarding him was developed. (u)

The "National Guardian," publication of November 14, 1951, on Page 3, had an article by WILLIAM A. RUEBEN announcing a pamphlet to be published regarding the ROSENBERG case.

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RUEBEN was described as the provisional chairman of the National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case. (NCSJ)

The "National Guardian" on August 31, 1953, on Page 5, announced the publication of a book entitled "The Atom Spy Myth." The announcement stated that Action Books, Room 2800, 165 Broadway, had announced for fall publication "The Atom Spy Myth -- from Hiroshima to the Rosenbergs," by WILLIAM A. RUEBEN. It was stated that this is the book in which RUEBEN, who wrote the original "Guardian" articles for the ROSENBERG case in 1951, "had been working on for two years." It described the book as an examination of all the "Atom Spy Cases" "in light of parallel Washington cold war moves." It was stated that the "Atom bomb spy hunt is the greatest hoax in history."

Regarding the "National Guardian," the 1949 report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities cited the "National Guardian" as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation which they found to be from its inception notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and content. (1949 report of the California Senate Fact Finding Committee on Un-American Activities, page 394.)

Mike Horan called and stated that Deputy Attorney General Rogers had just told him to contact the Bureau; that the Attorney General had a request from the Jenner Committee for dissemination data on Coe and Glasser, the number of times data was disseminated and a summary of the material that was disseminated. Horan stated that a memo was coming through requesting this information and, in addition, he had seen the transcript; that the names of Perlo also came up, that they would accordingly request the same data for Perlo and that he understood there was a request in the mill for Solomon Adler. Horan asked if we would get started on checking our files and get up a memo on the dates the Bureau disseminated the information on Coe, Glasser, Perlo and Adler. He also asked that we get up a summary of the information which could be made available to the committee.

I told Horan with reference to the summary of the information the Bureau would have furnished the Department all substantive information on these individuals; that since the request was directed to the Department, I felt certain they would prefer to do this; that I would check and see if we had sent anything to the Department on dissemination.

I think we would probably have difficulty avoiding furnishing information on dissemination. I do not think we should prepare summaries for the Department on Coe, Glasser, Perlo and Adler. On the dissemination data, Horan stated they wanted the dates of the dissemination and to whom disseminated.

Rebulet dated 7-7-53 entitled "JUST LUNNING, IS-R", in which the Bureau directed the WFO to report in individual case files information regarding certain personalities as reflected in an affidavit submitted to the Passport Office, Department of State, by JUST LUNNING. Two affidavits were submitted by LUNNING and are hereinafter more fully identified.

JUST LUNNING was born 5-14-10 at Odense, Denmark. His father, EDUARD FREDERIK LUNNING immigrated to the U. S. in 1923 and was naturalized on 5-20-29. JUST LUNNING received his derivative Certificate of Naturalization (U.S.) on 5-19-44 which was to date from 7-14-30.

LUNNING attended Harvard University from 1930 to 1937, where he, according to his own admission, with fellow like-minded students, participated in the reading of the works of MARX and ENGELS and attended Marxists study groups. He denies any present adherence to Marxists philosophy.

LUNNING was employed by the U. S. Government from 1942 to 1947 and was on duty with the U. S. Navy, assigned to the Office of Strategic Services, Washington, D. C. and Europe from January, 1944 to May, 1946. He continued his employment as a State Department employee until 4-18-47 on which date he resigned. During the above period LUNNING associated with a number of suspected Communist and Soviet agents. He denies knowledge of any of his associates having been known to him as Communists or engaged in Soviet espionage.

LUNNING admits being a stockholder in the Metropolitan Broadcasting Company, Washington, D. C., a number of whose stockholders are reported to be Communists or Communist sympathizers. He is also reported by a reliable informant to have had Marxists literature in his apartment at 1851 Columbia Road, NW, Washington, D. C., during early 1947 and to be a member of the Consumers Union, 17 Union Square, West, New York 3, New York.

The Consumers Union has been cited as a Communist front by the Special Committee on Un-American Activities in a report issued by that Committee on 3-29-44, Page 153.

Since May, 1947, LUNNING has resided at 24 Gramercy Park, New York City. He is employed as General Manager and Vice President of GEORG JENSEN, Inc., 667 5th Avenue, New York City.

The Passport Office, Department of State, directed letters to LUNNING under the date of 4-1-53 and 6-15-53, requesting that he furnish the Passport Office answers to certain questions as well as an explanation of the extent of his past association with certain named personalities. Thereafter, LUNNING submitted two affidavits to the Passport Office under the date of 5-9-53 and 7-17-53, in which he explained the extent of his association with these individuals, one of which was: HAROLD GLASSER.

LUNNING stated he represented the Foreign Economic Administration at the Atlantic City Conference which resulted in the creation of UNRRA in the Fall of 1943, and it was at this conference he first met HAROLD GLASSER. He said he next met GLASSER in 1944 or 1945 in London, England, where they discussed the preparation of reports or papers similar to the "Guides" prepared in Washington concerning enemy or enemy-occupied territory and their problems. He did not see or have any further contact with GLASSER until the Fall of 1946 in Washington, D. C. LUNNING said he called on GLASSER in his office at the Treasury Department in his capacity of an Administrative Officer of the State Department, at which time they discussed the status of employees of the Treasury Department sent abroad on official business.

Regarding their social contacts, LUNNING stated that in the Fall or Winter of 1943-44 he attended a fair sized party at the ALLAN ROSENBERG residence in Maryland. He also stated that he did not own a car while in Washington, D.C., so someone, probably ROSENBERG, arranged for he and MRS. LUNNING to ride to the party with MR. and MRS. GLASSER. LUNNING does not remember having returned from the party with the GLASSERS, or to have engaged in any conversation of significance. He stated he believes this to be a complete statement of all his contacts with HAROLD GLASSER. C.

There is attached a memorandum to Mr. Olney of the Criminal Division which is in answer to his memorandum of November 19, 1953, enclosing summaries prepared by the Criminal Division on eleven individuals. We reviewed the summaries to determine if there was material contained therein which would reveal confidential sources or confidential investigative techniques, and to determine if dissemination to the Jenner Committee would interfere with current investigations. While we informed the Criminal Division that we did not check these summaries specifically for accuracy, we do make comment to the Criminal Division on various misstatements which we have found in the summaries and which it might be noted show the summaries were very sloppily written.

We are also furnishing to the Department as an attachment to the memorandum to Mr. Olney, individual memoranda on eleven individuals showing the dissemination we made on these persons. It is to be noted in this dissemination we left out instances where we wrote memoranda to the Attorney General requesting authorization for technical surveillances. In the dissemination on Harold Glasser, we also omitted the fact that oral information was given to representatives of the World Bank on October 31, 1947. We did this because our dissemination to the World Bank representatives was on a very confidential basis and is not something which should be made known to the Jenner Committee.

RECOMMENDATION

There is attached a memorandum to the Criminal Division commenting on the statements they previously prepared and furnishing them the dissemination on the eleven individuals involved in this matter. It is also to be noted that the Director, in connection with a memorandum from Mr. Belmont to Mr. Ladd dated November 19, 1953, stated he wanted Mr. Tolson and Mr. Nichols to look at the material before it went to the Department.

[T-2] of known reliability, advised on November 23, 1953 (u) that the S. RICHTER referred to above is SARA RICHTER who has resided at the above address, the second floor of a two-story duplex, for approximately five or six years. She is about fifty years of age, is believed to be a divorcee, or possibly separated from her former husband residing somewhere back East, and has a son (name unknown) who, for the past year or two, has lived in Israel, - apparently to evade Military Service in the U.S. Army.

Mrs. RICHTER has, from time to time, rented rooms to individuals unknown to informant, but has no roomers at the present time. She is also employed in a clerical capacity, although her exact place of employment is unknown.

[T-2] advised also that Mrs. RICHTER occasionally hears from her son in Israel. Her mother, Mrs. LENA BUDNICK, also known as LENA TEEMAN, about seventy-five years of age, resides also at 2308 West 39th Street, in the downstairs unit, which is jointly owned by them both. [T-2] added that Mrs. RICHTER has given no indications of being pro-Communist or being engaged in any subversive activities. (u)

[T-2] has observed, however, that Mrs. RICHTER has definitely appeared to be very interested in "Socialism" which [T-2] described as the general improvement of working conditions for the common man. [T-2] stated also that SARA RICHTER currently receives the "National Guardian" publication. (u)

The above named "National Guardian" has been described by the 1949 Report of the California Committee on Un-American Activities as a publication launched in New York in 1948 aiming at national circulation, which was found to be, from its inception, notoriously Stalinist in its staff, writers, management, and content.

T-3, of known reliability, advised in March, 1949 that SARA RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California, had attended classes at the California Labor School in 1948. (u)

T-3 also advised in August, 1950 that the records of the California Labor School in 1948 contained the names of "SARAH and LOUIS RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street." Further, that "SARAH RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street" was included on a list headed "donations." (u)

The above named California Labor School is one of the organizations named by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

[T-4] of known reliability, advised in December, 1949 that on a list of names bearing the notation "mailing list, Mexico," the significance of which was unknown to the informant, though it was believed to relate to the Civil Rights Congress, appeared the names of SARA RICHTER and E. LOUIS RICHTER, both indicated as residing at 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California. (u)

The above named Civil Rights Congress is also one of the organizations named by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

EMPLOYMENT

Although declining to furnish her place of employment on December 1, 1953, though indicating she was engaged in clerical work, as noted hereafter, SARA RICHTER, according to T-5, 3 (u) of known reliability, was observed on December 2, 1953 leaving her residence at 2310 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California, at 9:17 A.M. She proceeded to the American Cleaners and Laundry Supply Company, 4310 West Jefferson Boulevard, where she entered at 9:38 A.M. She was thereafter observed occupied at an office desk.

EMIL LOUIS RICHTER

The records of the Los Angeles office reflect that EMIL LOUIS RICHTER, age twenty-three, son of SARA RICHTER, above, registered for Selective Service on September 18, 1948, residing at 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California, with his mother, and was ordered to report for induction by his Local Draft Board on May 2, 1951. By letter dated May 11, 1951, he advised his Local Draft Board from Israel that he had gone to Israel and joined "Tsava Hagana L'Yisrael," the Israel Defense Army.

An authorized complaint was filed before the U.S. Commissioner at Los Angeles on June 17, 1951 and a warrant was issued the same date. Assistant U.S. Attorney, ANGUS D. McEACHEN, advised that the matter would be handled under the provisions of Public Law 431 (now known as 414) relating to Expatriation. To date, he has not returned to the United States.

The records of the Passport Division of the State Department, Washington, D.C., in a passport application #36741 dated December 14, 1951, contained the following background information:

EMIL LOUIS RICHTER was born on May 3, 1930 at New York City, was single, and resided at 2310 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California. His mother was SARA GERTNER RICHTER, born in Sokolow, Poland in January, 1895. She immigrated to the United States in 1906 and acquired her citizenship by naturalization. She also resided at 2310 West 39th Street.

His father, LOUIS RICHTER, was born in Riga, Latvia in September, 1892 and had immigrated to the United States in August, 1919. He was naturalized on April 7, 1916 at Greenville, South Carolina. He resided at 325 Highland Avenue, Palisades Park, New Jersey.

The file also contained a letter from LOUIS RICHTER, Richter's Pharmacy, 301 Broad Avenue, Palisades Park, New Jersey, giving his consent for his son to leave the United States and to go to Israel. Similar consent had also been granted by SARA RICHTER.

The file further contained a communication from the Department of State to the American Embassy at Tel Aviv, Israel dated October 26, 1951, instructing that his passport be taken up and forwarded to the State Department with a report as to whether he might be considered to have lost his American nationality under Section 401 (J) of the Nationality Act, or otherwise.

During an inquiry relative to the above mentioned Selective Service matter in 1951, Mrs. SARA RICHTER was contacted, at which time she advised that her son had left the United States about Christmas, 1950 when his purpose was to visit in France and Israel and she advised he intended to return to the United States. She stated she had previously discussed with him the idea of his going to Israel to live and he had told her many times he intended eventually to go to Israel and become a citizen. She did not now know whether he intended to return to the United States or not.

Subsequently, on December 1, 1953, Mrs. RICHTER advised that her son has indicated no plans whatsoever for his return to the United States. He currently lives in a so-called pioneering community in Israel where he receives some military training. His current address is Kibbutz Gal-On, P.O. Box 2639, Tel Aviv, Israel.

On the occasion of furnishing the above information, Mrs. RICHTER declined to furnish her own place of employment, although stating that she was engaged in clerical work in an office.

[T-6,] another government agency conducting intelligence (u) investigations, advised in May, 1952 that LOUIS RICHTER, Los Angeles, had been reported among a list of Americans, all residing at the Kibbutz Gal-On, a settlement in Tel Aviv, who were described as draft dodgers.

Informant explained that the above settlement was an extreme "left wing" type, and that its ideology was strongly pro-U.S.S.R. and anti-United States.

T-7, of known reliability, made available in 1947 a membership application for the American Youth For Democracy at Los Angeles under the name of E. LOUIS RICHTER, 964 North Court Street, Los Angeles, California, wherein RICHTER indicated that he was sixteen years of age and a student. (u)

The above named American Youth For Democracy is likewise one of the organizations named by the Attorney General of the United States as coming within the purview of Executive Order 10450.

T-8, of known reliability, stated that on October 26, 1948, EMIL LOUIS RICHTER had sent a protest concerning the subpoena of the eight Communists at Los Angeles under investigation at that time, stating, "I protest this subpoena of the eight Communists as an un-American act." (u)

T-9, of known reliability, advised in 1950 that among the records of the Civil Rights Congress, Los Angeles, California, appeared the name of "E. LOUIS RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California." (u)

MISCELLANEOUS

The records of the Registrar of Voters, Los Angeles, California, reflect that Mrs. SARAH RICHTER, 2308 West 39th Street, Los Angeles, California, registered as belonging to a major political party on September 4, 1947. She was born in Poland and gave her occupation as housewife. She was naturalized on July 22, 1926 at New York City, being issued Certificate Number 2321192 in the name of SARAH GERTNER.

The records of the Retail Merchants Credit Association, Los Angeles, California, contained no information pertaining to SARA RICHTER.

The attached memorandum dated 12/10/53 from Mr. Branigan to Mr. Belmont referred to the Alien Property Custodian and named Harry Dexter White, Virginus Frank Coe, Harold Glasser, William Henry Taylor, Mrs. Sonia Gold, and Irving S. Friedman as having varying degrees of influence relating to German and Japanese assets in United States during World War II. Former SA William A. Kolar, now with Senate Judiciary Subcommittee inquiring into the administration of the Office of Alien Property Custodian, furnished certain documents indicating these persons, all employed by Treasury Department, connected with establishment of policy agreed to by Departments of Treasury and State and Alien Property Custodian resulting in Executive Order on 6/8/45 providing for seizure of all German and Japanese assets. Kolar also furnished copy of documents to Michael J. Horan, Justice Department. This confirmed 12/17/53. None of persons named now employed by U. S. Government, although Taylor is Assistant Director, Middle East Department of International Monetary Fund. Among observations in Branigan's memorandum are: the extent of influence of this group on monetary policy of U.S. is now history; an investigation of this type would be one of evaluating influence wielded by various individuals which would be contrary to our position as a fact-finding agency; our investigation in the Gregory case involving these individuals was of an espionage nature and not to determine the influence of any individuals on policy of any government agency or department; any investigation conducted would be a delayed investigation occurring years after the policy of the Treasury Department was formulated and Bureau might be subjected to criticism for a delayed investigation of this type; an investigation to determine possible influence upon monetary policy would appear to be within the province of an administrative inquiry by Treasury or possibly a Congressional Committee. The Domestic Intelligence Division recommended no further action. The Director wanted this matter reviewed to see whether the recommendations are sound.

Inspector G. C. Gearty reviewed this matter thoroughly and in view of the fact dissemination previously made of pertinent Bureau information, concurred in the recommendation that no investigation should be conducted. He discussed the matter

SYNOPSIS:

William A. Solar, former Special Agent now employed by the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee inquiring into the administration of the Office of Alien Property, furnished on 11-18-53, certain material. This material indicates possible subversive connections in the establishment of a policy dealing with German and Japanese assets in this country during World War II. The various Treasury Department memoranda cover a period from 10-31-44, up to 6-13-45, reflecting results of conferences between representatives of the Treasury Department and the Office of Alien Property. Included in material was memorandum dated 1-15-45, setting forth policy regarding German and Japanese assets arrived at in a conference held on 1-13-45, in Harry Dexter White's office at the Treasury Department. The various other memoranda reflect differences of opinion during the initial conferences. Virginias Frank Coe from February, 1945 until May, 1945, was active in various conferences furthering points agreed on in conference held in White's office on 1-13-45. In May of 1945, Coe submitted for Secretary Mergenthau's approval a memorandum advising of informal agreements being reached by Treasury, State and the Alien Property Custodian for control of German and Japanese assets. A result of these various conferences was the issuance of an Executive Order on 6-8-45, which provided for the seizure of all German and Japanese assets. Persons having a connection with the establishment of a policy relative to the seizing of all German and Japanese property interests in the United States include Harry Dexter White, Virginias Frank Coe, Harold Glasser, William Henry Taylor, Mrs. Sonia Gold and Irving S. Friedman. Any investigation conducted to determine influence of various people in Treasury Department to formulate monetary policy would be an investigation to evaluate influence of various people on monetary policy and would occur years after these people left the Treasury Department. This type of investigation would appear to be administrative function within province of Treasury Department. File reviews indicate proper dissemination of pertinent data made and further investigation to determine extent of influence, mainly of Gregory case subjects, is not being recommended.

DETAILS:

William A. Kolar, former Special Agent, called on Supervisor E. J. Lamphere on 11-18-58. Kolar is now employed on the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee under Senator Dirksen, which is inquiring into the administration of the Trading with the Enemy Act (Office of Alien Property). At the time of this call Kolar furnished a series of memoranda covering the period from 10-21-44, up to and including 8-13-58, reflecting the part played by Harry Dexter White, Virginius Frank Cox, Harold Slosser, William H. Taylor, Louis Gold, Irving S. Friedman and others in forcing on the Alien Property Custodian a recommendation to the President that enemy property seized during World War II never be returned. The memoranda were made available to Kolar by Albert Tuttle, General Counsel, Treasury Department.

It should be noted that in no place in the various memoranda are the people identified beyond the listing of their surnames.

In a previous memorandum from Mr. Belmont to Mr. Ladd dated 10-6-58, it was pointed out that Kolar advised the Senate Judiciary Subcommittee was having a report prepared that may have a section devoted to possible subversive connections between the establishment of the Office of Alien Property and its administration.

Included in material furnished by Kolar was a memorandum for the files dated 1-15-45, listing the subject "Vesting of Enemy Assets." This memorandum tells of a meeting held in Mr. White's office on 1-13-45, to discuss a proposal made by the Alien Property Custodian. The meeting ended in general agreement that before agreeing to vesting in the Alien Property Custodian control of German assets now under Treasury jurisdiction, it should be first made certain that the vesting program of the Alien Property Custodian would be effective in permanently removing the German interests. Second, make certain the responsibility rests exclusively with Treasury for determining whether there is any German interest in any of the property held in this country and that the Alien Property Custodian will have an interest in such property only after the Treasury has determined that it is a German interest. Third, the

some considerations as listed above are to apply to Japanese assets. Fourth, Italian, Hungarian, Swedish and Bulgarian assets would not be included in such a program.

The other memoranda furnished by Zoller dated subsequent to 1-15-45, reflect results of conferences and correspondence with representatives of the Office of the Alien Property Custodian and Treasury Department representatives. These various memoranda indicate differences of opinion during the initial conferences.

Virginia Frank was from February, 1945 until May, 1945, was active in various conferences in furthering the points agreed upon in the conference held in Harry Dexter White's office on 1-15-45.

Another memorandum of pertinence furnished by Zoller in was dated 5-25-45. This memorandum was addressed to Secretary Morgenthau and was forwarded by Virginia Frank CAG. This memorandum advised Secretary Morgenthau of the informal agreements made with the State Department and the Alien Property Custodian providing for the vesting of German and Japanese interests in the United States by the Custodian.

Among the points submitted for Secretary Morgenthau's approval in the afore-mentioned memorandum were: (a) Complete elimination of existing Japanese and German interests in the United States is the major objective. (b) All German and Japanese property vested by the Custodian should be liquidated and sold as soon as practicable. (c) American creditors who have claims against persons whose property has been vested should be paid to the extent the vested assets of the debtor permit. (d) Subject to (c) the decision as to the disposition of the proceeds of vested property should be deferred. (e) No provisions for return or compensation to the German or Japanese owners shall be made by the United States. (f) The Custodian and Treasury should jointly recommend to Congress legislation necessary to effectuate the program. This memorandum bore the initials JV and was marked "approved" and also bore what appeared to be the initials of Secretary Morgenthau.

Subsequently, by memorandum dated 6-13-45, Harold Glasser requested Telegrams be sent various Treasury representatives abroad informing them of Executive Order 9387 signed on 6-6-45, which amended Section 5 (a) of Executive Order 9098 of 3-11-44. This Executive Order provided for the seizure of all German and Japanese assets. Glasser in his memorandum also stated the objective of the program of which the Executive Order was a part was the complete elimination of existing German and Japanese property interests in the United States.

As you will recall the Morgenthau Plan contained a provision for the confiscation of all German external assets. In this connection it is pointed out that Elizabeth Bentley on 8-30-53, testified before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee that the Morgenthau Plan was the work of Harry Dexter White. She also testified that White was under Soviet instructions to effect the complete devastation of Germany so that country would never be a barrier between the Soviet Union and the western world.

Of interest it should be noted all the people mentioned in this memorandum as having assisted in formulating the policy concerning German and Japanese assets have been identified by Elizabeth Bentley as having been involved in Soviet espionage. The one exception is Irving C. Friedman who has been, however, the subject of a loyalty investigation and also the subject of a Loyalty of United States Employees case based primarily on his association with people involved in the Gregory case.

On 6-6-52, a memorandum was prepared for you which considered the need for additional investigation to determine the extent of Communist influence upon the monetary policy of the United States. The people mentioned in instant memorandum were discussed in some detail in the memorandum of 5-8-52. Certain observations were made at that time which are applicable to the situation concerning the freeing of German and Japanese assets. These observations were:

- (1) Some of these individuals are employed by the Treasury Department at the present time.
- (2) The extent of the influence of this group on the monetary policy of the United States is now history.
- (3) An investigation of this type would be one of evaluating influence wielded by various individuals in the Treasury Department which would be contrary to our position as a fact finding agency.
- (4) Our investigation which was conducted in the Gregory case was of an espionage nature and not to determine the influence of any individuals on policy of any governmental agency or department.
- (5) Any investigation conducted by us at this time would be a delayed investigation occurring many years after the policy of the Treasury Department was formulated. The Bureau might be subject to criticism for a delayed investigation of this type.
- (6) An investigation to determine possible influence of various individuals upon monetary policy of the Treasury Department would appear to be within the province of an administrative inquiry by the Treasury Department or possibly a Congressional committee.

From a review of the files it is felt proper dissemination was made of pertinent information as it became available to us. Further investigation to determine the extent of Communist influence, mainly of the Gregory case subjects, upon the monetary policy of the United States is not being recommended.

As a matter of interest, William A. Tolson advised copies of the memoranda which he made available to us were also furnished to the Department on 11-16-53.

There is attached hereto a memorandum in which we analyze an executive session hearing before the Jenner Committee on November 18, 1953, which deals with the actions of former Secretary of the Treasury Snyder in supporting Harold Glasser after the Treasury Department was in possession of the allegations concerning Glasser. You will recall that former Secretary Snyder is scheduled to make an appearance before the Jenner Committee and has obtained from the Treasury Department certain documents with which to support his testimony. The following is a brief chronology of the information set forth in the executive session hearing which is damaging to Secretary Snyder:

1. On March 4, 1946, we transmitted to Secretary Vinson a summary in the Silvermaster case which contained allegations concerning Harold Glasser.
2. On August 22, 1946, Snyder directed a letter to Glasser appointing him to the position of Director of Monetary Research at a salary of \$10,000 per year.
3. On December 23, 1947, Glasser submitted his resignation.
4. On December 26, 1947, Snyder wrote Glasser accepting his resignation "with regret," and stating he was sorry that Glasser was leaving the Government and stating "we will miss the fine work that you have done here."
5. On December 26, 1947, Snyder wrote H. L. Lurie, Executive Director, Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds in New York City, praising Glasser highly and stating "he has no hidden facets to his personal qualities which you would discover only after longer association with him."
6. On August 3, 1948, Mr. Lurie wrote to Mr. Snyder and raised the question of Bentley's testimony before the HCUA and stating that he understood Glasser was thoroughly investigated as a security risk while in the Treasury Department. Lurie asked for an additional statement from Snyder.

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7. On August 10, 1948, Snyder wrote Lurie reaffirming the appraisal made of Glasser in his earlier letter.

ACTION

The foregoing is for your information and is of interest as it tends to establish that while Snyder may be able to make a paper record of his demands upon the Department of Justice in late 1946 and early 1947 for more information on individuals charged, he apparently did not accept the information furnished to him at its face value and was willing to personally endorse Glasser concerning whom detailed information had been provided the Treasury Department.

At the above session of the Jenner Committee four letters written by former Secretary of the Treasury, John W. Snyder, in 1946, 1947 and 1948, regarding Harold Glasser were entered into the record. Snyder recommended Glasser highly for employment outside the Government in 1947 and stated on inquiry regarding this recommendation in August, 1948, that "no information regarding Mr. Glasser has been called to our attention that had not been previously considered by the Department prior to my letter to you on December 26, 1947, and all I can do at this time is reaffirm the appraisal I made of him in my earlier letter. Reference was made to the Director's statement before the Committee on November 17, 1953, that between November 8, 1945, and July 24, 1946, two summaries on Soviet espionage activities had gone to the Treasury Department. A 1947 letter by Dean Acheson recommending Glasser for employment outside the Government was placed into the record. The case histories of Virginus Frank Coe, Victor Perlo and Solomon Adler were also placed into the record. This testimony contains no information requiring further investigation at this time. The original copy of the testimony has been returned to the Committee and a Photostat thereof is being filed in the Silvermaster file 65-56402.

RECOMMENDATION:

For your information. Note Snyder's apparent indefensible position regarding Glasser.

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DETAILS:

On November 18, 1953, the Jenner Committee, in connection with its inquiry "Interlocking Subversion in Government Departments," met in Washington, D. C., in Executive Session for the purpose of putting into the record certain correspondence, described by the Committee Chairman as "very serious letters" from the former Secretary of the Treasury, John W. Snyder, regarding Harold Glasser. Snyder was not present at this hearing. The Committee Counsel, Robert Morris, read into this record the summary on Glasser contained in the Committee's July 30, 1953, Report on "Interlocking Subversion in Government Departments." This summary set forth the allegations made against Glasser by Bentley and Chambers as well as the fact that Glasser invoked the privilege granted by the Fifth Amendment when asked about this evidence. Reference was made to the Director's testimony on November 17, 1953, wherein he stated that from November 8, 1945, to July 24, 1946, two summaries on Soviet espionage activities had gone to the Treasury Department and six summaries on the same subject matter had gone to the Attorney General. The letters entered into the record are as follows:

Snyder to Glasser, dated August 22, 1946, in which Glasser was appointed Director of Monetary Research, at \$10,000 per year;

Glasser to Snyder, dated December 23, 1947, in which Glasser submitted his resignation, effective December 31, 1947;

Snyder to Glasser, dated December 26, 1947, stating in part as follows:

It is with deep regret that I am accepting your resignation..... I am sorry that circumstances have led you to seek connections outside the Government.... Best wishes for happiness and success in your new work."

Snyder to H. L. Lurie, Executive Director, Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, Inc., New York City, dated December 26, 1947, in which Snyder recommended Glasser highly for a position with Lurie;

Lurie to Snyder, dated August 3, 1948, which reads in part as follows:

The information recently given by Miss Bentley to the Senate Committee has been very disturbing. I have been informed that the charges made as they relate to Mr. Glasser are not new and that Miss Bentley had previously offered them to various bureaus of the

Government. I understand also that Mr. Glasser was thoroughly investigated as a security risk while he was serving in the U. S. Treasury. It would be very helpful to us at this time if we could receive an additional statement from you bearing upon this aspect of Mr. Glasser's career in Government service.

Snyder to Lurie, dated August 10, 1948, which reads in part as follows:

No information regarding Mr. Glasser has been called to our attention that had not previously been considered by the Department prior to my letter to you of December 26, 1947, and all I can do at this time is re-affirm the appraisal I made of him in my earlier letter.

I am very glad to learn that Mr. Glasser's services have proven so satisfactory, to the Council and that he is rendering for you the same high type of work he performed for the Treasury.

Entered also was a letter from Dean Acheson to H. L. Lurie, dated December 23, 1947, which recommended Glasser to Lurie.

Robert Morris, at this point, read into the record a portion of the case history of Virginus Frank Coe contained in the Committee's July 30, 1953, Report, referred to previously. It points out that Coe was mentioned in the Berle memorandum of 1939 and that Bentley had testified Coe was a member of her espionage ring. In December, 1952, Coe had a position with the International Monetary Fund at \$20,000 per year and when subpoenaed, he invoked the privilege granted by the Fifth Amendment on all questions pertaining to his Communist or espionage activities. Morris also brought up the case of Victor Perlo and pointed out that Bentley, Chambers and Nathaniel Weyl had testified that Perlo was a member of the Communist underground and that Perlo invoked the privilege granted by the Fifth Amendment and refused to testify in response to the evidence with which the Committee confronted him.

At the conclusion of the presentation on Perlo, Morris quoted from Mr. Brownell's testimony on November 17, 1953, as follows:

How was Glasser's access to classified materials limited? As far as we have been able to determine, it was not. Records in the Department indicate that late

in 1946 Glasser, described as a member of the espionage ring, received a copy of the FBI report on Victor Perlo which described him as a member of the Soviet espionage ring. Perlo stayed on in the Treasury Department until March 27, 1947, and then left to accept the post of Treasurer of the Intergovernmental Committee on Refugees.

Thereafter the Committee Chairman stated: "We will have to call him (Snyder) in at some later time to get this matter straightened out."

Morris then introduced into the record the testimony of Chambers and Bentley regarding Solomon Adler in which they testified as to Adler's Communist and espionage activities. Morris stated Adler had been abroad and had not appeared before the Committee. Morris placed into the record background information on Adler's Federal employment and information regarding his association with William Ludwig Ullman and Harry Dexter White.

The Chairman then placed into the record the following:

The following analysis will show the concentration of members of the underground ring of the Communist Party in the Treasury Department and particularly in the Division of Monetary Research.

Harry Dexter White became the first director of the Division of Monetary Research in the Treasury when it was first established. The others who succeeded him as director were Frank Coe and Harold Glasser. Irving Kaplan was assistant director. William Ludwig Ullman, Victor Perlo, Mrs. Bella Gold and Irving S. Friedman were also attached to the Division of Monetary Research when it was under the direction of White, Coe and Glasser.

It was now pointed out that the Committee had asked Mr. Brownell for a FBI summary on Glasser, Coe and Perlo and for information as to whom and when the security reports on those people were distributed in the Executive Branch. Similar information on Adler was to be requested of Brownell.

This Session concluded with a reference to the matter of having Igor Gouzenko made available to the Committee for questioning.

This testimony was reviewed and contained no new pertinent information requiring further investigation at this time. The testimony, Volume 25 B, was received on confidential basis for review from the Committee and has been returned to the Committee. Photostat of the same is being filed in the Silvermaster file 65-56402.

Rebair-tel 12/10/53. Forwarded herewith are clippings of articles by ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY which appeared in the "New York Daily Mirror" on 12/13, 14, 15, 16/53. These are the first four of a six article series which is appearing in the "New York Daily Mirror". It would seem apparent that BENTLEY'S material was closely edited by the publishers of the stories and that in so doing some minor changes have been made to give the articles more reader appeal. It would also appear that the material is basically the same as that originally furnished by BENTLEY to Bureau agents. It is also observed that practically all the material in these articles also appears in Miss BENTLEY'S book "Out of Bondage". It is possible that BENTLEY in rewriting this material in its present form may have "dressed up" the material to point out the importance of the information which she had.

Attention is called to the article appearing in the "New York Daily Mirror" on 12/13/53, in which she relates that WHITE furnished information that Secretary of Treasury MORANTHAU was disgruntled with the reception Moscow was giving American lend-lease effort and WHITE'S suggestion that an accolade for the work being done by the US toward winning the war be included in a speech by STALIN. This information is basically the same as that originally furnished by BENTLEY to Bureau agents regarding this incident.

Information relative to LAUCHLIN CURRIE contained in the article appearing on 12/15/53, appears to be a more colorful portrayal by BENTLEY of information previously given by her to the Bureau and it appears she may be augmenting facts originally known to her with information she has obtained through Congressional hearings and other sources since her original statement.

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New York files indicate BENTLEY has advised previously that she believes CURRIE had something to do with NATHAN GREGORY SILVERMASTER'S securing his position in the Board of Economic Warfare. She also gave information relative to CURRIE advising SILVERMAN that the US was on the verge of breaking the Soviet code which information was passed on by SILVERMAN through SILVERMASTER to BENTLEY. (S)(X)(u)

It does not appear that she has told the Bureau of the instructions SILVERMASTER received when in danger of being ousted from Government service as a disloyal person to contact CURRIE and WHITE, although the part CURRIE played in this matter is well documented and is mentioned in BENTLEY'S book "Out of Bondage" on page 174. CURRIE'S file indicates that this information probably also appeared in BENTLEY'S testimony before the HCUA, inasmuch as he replied to his charge in his own testimony.

It further appears that BENTLEY has not advised concerning the attempts taken by the Silvermaster group to learn more about the identity of the Soviet code which CURRIE had reported to SILVERMAN the US was on the verge of breaking. A separate letter will be directed to the New Orleans Office with a lead to question BENTLEY further concerning these matters pertaining to CURRIE. (S)(X)(u)

Material appearing in the article of 12/12/53 concerning the existence of the "third spy ring" in Washington is similar to material furnished by her in her signed statement of 11/30/45, (page 105 of the report of SA THOMAS G. SPENCER, NY, 12/5/45) concerning HAROLD GLASSER and other statements which she has made to the press, at the Congressional Committee hearings and elsewhere.

Copies of the remaining two articles to appear will be forwarded following their appearance with an accompanying analysis of the information appearing therein.

It was previously reported that the Suburban Chicago Telephone Directory reflects this address as the residence of Dr. FREDERICK WEISS who also has an office at 15320 Center Street, Harvey, Illinois.

An article in the "New York Times" newspaper on November 17, 1953 referred to the estate left by the late HARRY DEXTER WHITE after his death on August 16, 1948. It was noted that the article mentioned that one of the witnesses to WHITE'S original will was HAROLD GLASSER. It was further noted that there was nothing unusual about this will and WHITE'S estate was left to his wife, the former ANNE TERRY White N.Y.

ELIZABETH TERRILL BENTLEY, self-confessed espionage agent, has stated that HARRY DEXTER WHITE was a member of a group of government employees who furnished information obtained in the course of their government employment to her for transmission to her Soviet superiors.

An article in the "New York Times" newspaper on November 19, 1953 captioned "Jenner Unit Acts", stated that the Senate investigators had procured documentary evidence to show that Secretary of the Treasury JOHN W. SNYDER had promoted and later praised HAROLD GLASSER, even after he had been publicly denounced. Mrs N.Y.

According to these letters made public by the Senate Internal Security Sub-Committee, SNYDER promoted the subject in August 1946 from Assistant Director to Director of the Treasury Department Monetary Research. When GLASSER resigned from the Treasury Department in December 1947, SNYDER provided a letter of recommendation to H. L. LURIE, Executive Director of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, Incorporated in New York.

The article set forth in part a letter written by Mr. SNYDER on December 26, 1947 to Mr. LURIE which praised GLASSER'S ability and importance as a Treasury Department official. The article further contended that after ELIZABETH BENTLEY had testified in August 1948, Mr. LURIE wrote SNYDER regarding this testimony and Mr. SNYDER replied by reaffirming his original appraisal of HAROLD GLASSER.

The "New York Times" newspaper of November 24, 1953 contained an article which set forth the fact that the Senate Internal Security Sub-Committee disclosed that reports regarding HARRY DEXTER WHITE, HAROLD GLASSER and others

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were furnished to "at least ten officials in the Truman Administration". The record revealed that all the reports were distributed to various officials before GLASSER was sent to Moscow as an advisor to General of the Army GEORGE C. MARSHALL. This article mentioned that GLASSER was now an Economist and residing in Great Neck, New York.

SYNOPSIS:

Subject born 11-24-05, Chicago, Illinois. Glasser graduated University of Chicago in 1926. He took graduate studies at the University of Chicago and later at Harvard. He first entered U.S. Government service in 1935. On November 23, 1936, he was employed by the U.S. Treasury Department, which employment continued until his resignation 12-31-47. His appointment was recommended by Frank Coe, a personal friend. Glasser was a member of the Civil Affairs Section of General Eisenhower's staff in North Africa. He conducted an anti-inflation study for the Military Government of Italy in 1944. He assisted in the preparation of the Morgenthau German Plan in 1944 and he was a member of the U.S. Delegation to the Council of Foreign Ministers at Moscow in 1947. Subsequent to his resignation from the Treasury Department, he became Director, Overseas Institute, Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds from which position his resignation was announced 9-17-53. Elizabeth T. Bentley advised in 1945 that Glasser had been a member of the Communist Party and a member of the Perlo espionage group. She stated he had furnished information concerning activities of the Treasury Department to her for transmission to the Soviets. Glasser was interviewed April 30 and May 3, 1947, and described himself as definitely interested in theories of the Communist Party in 1933 or 1934. He denied membership in the Communist Party. Chambers, in 1948, advised he met Glasser on two or three occasions pursuant to arrangements made by J. Peters, who advised Glasser was a Party member and could be trusted. The purpose of these meetings was to make inquiry of Glasser concerning Harry Dexter White, who was difficult to handle. Mrs. Katherine Perlo advised, in 1944, that Glasser was a member of the Communist Party. Extensive investigation has failed to locate a second available witness to substantiate Bentley's allegations re Soviet espionage activity. Glasser has admitted acquaintance and friendship in various degrees with various individuals connected with the Silvermaster and Perlo espionage group. Glasser has been interviewed by agents of the Bureau, testified before a Federal Grand Jury October, 1947, and before the Jenner Committee in 1953. He denies espionage activity. He presently resides at 8 Sheffield Road, Great Neck, New York.

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had guided into the Treasury Department. Peters released Dr. Glasser from the American Communist underground and lent him to the Soviet underground. Chambers stated that Glasser soon convinced him that White was turning over everything of importance that came into his hands. Chambers stated that having established that fact he simply broke off relations with Dr. Glasser. Mrs. Victor Perlo, nee Katherine Wills, first wife of Victor Perlo, in 1944 advised that Harold Glasser, who was sent to Ecuador by the United States as an economist in 1939, was a member of the Communist Party but she could not recall any information which would substantiate this allegation.

CORROBORATION:

Glasser was the subject of a Hatch Act investigation in 1941 and has been under continuous investigation since the allegations of Elizabeth Bentley in 1945. The investigation has been directed entirely toward determining whether or not Glasser is or was engaged in Soviet espionage and/or Communist activities.

Although considerable investigative effort has been expended, a second witness cannot be found to substantiate Bentley's allegations concerning Glasser's activity in Soviet espionage. Whittaker Chambers, who might have been a possible second witness, has such a serious heart condition at this time that it is not believed he will ever be available as a witness in any court proceedings. Numerous persons who were associates of Glasser and who were involved in the Nathan Gregory Silvermaster network have been interviewed in the past and have failed to make any admissions which would make them witnesses against Glasser. These persons included Charles Kramer, Solomon Lischinsky, Allan Rosenberg, Henry Hill Collins, Victor Perlo and others.

Glasser, as stated above, was interviewed by Bureau agents in 1947. Subsequently he was interviewed further on January 28, February 2 and 3, 1949. He has testified before a Federal Grand Jury in October, 1947, and before the Jenner Committee in the Executive and Open Session in 1953. To date he has declined to admit his participation in Soviet espionage or Communist Party activities.

The Director asked for memoranda on the following individuals who were mentioned in the Washington Post article of November 19, 1953, which is attached: Harold Glasser, Victor Perlo, Solomon Adler, and Virginius Frank Coe. There are attached individual memoranda which have been prepared on the foregoing individuals. We are also preparing material for transmittal to the Department relative to the dissemination we have made on these individuals.

One issue which may come up on these individuals is why we did not secure data from Whittaker Chambers concerning them at an earlier date. The following are the facts relative to this issue: Whittaker Chambers talked to Adolph Berle of the State Department in 1939. On July 8, 1953, we secured the Berle notes. Of the four individuals listed above, only two were mentioned in the Berle notes. They were Schlozer Adler whom it was indicated worked in the General Counsel's Office at the Treasury Department, and Frank Coe, who, according to the notes, was a teacher at McGill (University in Toronto, Canada). (100-25824-27)

It should be noted in the Berle notes, there was no indication of espionage on the part of either Adler or Coe, and no information of Government employment indicated for Frank Coe. On May 10 and 17, 1945, our agents in New York City interviewed Chambers and in a letter dated June 26, 1945, the results were made available to the Bureau. In this letter it is stated that Chambers mentioned Nathan Perlow (later identified in 1947 by Chambers as Victor Perlo) as a member of a Communist underground group. He also mentioned Adler and said Adler was definitely a Communist who had been employed in the Treasury Department, and he understood Adler had made reports of a financial nature to Peter (Boris Bykov). Chambers also mentioned Frank Coe whom he said was a teacher at McGill and also furnished information concerning

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Bob Coe, a brother of Frank, whom he said had been a member of the Communist underground. It is not indicated that Chambers mentioned Harold Glasser in May, 1945, or when he talked to Adolph Berle in 1939. (100-25824-36)

As has been pointed out on a number of occasions previously, Chambers obviously withheld information concerning his espionage connections until forced into a position in December of 1948 where he had to bring out in detail this information in order to protect himself. An illustration of this is reflected when Chambers was called before the Federal Grand Jury in New York in October, 1948, and Special Assistant to the Attorney General T. J. Donegan stated that while Chambers had been cooperative, his testimony was of no value since, according to Chambers, the purpose of his group was not espionage but the placement of members and sympathizers in key Government posts. (65-56402-3657)

It was not until our extensive interviews with Whittaker Chambers starting in January, 1949, that he furnished to us in detail information concerning Glasser, Adler, and Coe. Chambers has never been able to state that Victor Perlo was furnished espionage data but he has definitely named him as a member of a Communist underground group. In other words, when we interviewed Chambers on May 10 and 17, 1945, he did not name any of these individuals as involved in espionage activities, and it was not until after the Hiss revelations came out that he provided information indicating the apparatus in which he had been involved was engaged in espionage, as well as Communist infiltration of Government agencies.

We did not initiate an espionage-type investigation on any of these individuals until we got the basic allegations from Elizabeth Bentley on November 7, 1945, at which time we did initiate espionage investigations on all four of the individuals and at which time we promptly began disseminating the pertinent data developed.

RECOMMENDATION

There are attached a summary-type memoranda on Harold Glasser, Victor Perlo, Solomon Adler, and Virginus Frank Coe, which have been prepared for your information.

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

Extensive investigation has indicated that Harold Glasser was, at the time of interest, an assistant director of the Monetary Division of the Treasury Department. Information was also developed in the Gregory Case that Glasser and Silverman were not close associates. (S) (U)

In April and May of 1947, during interviews, Glasser advised that after 1940 he never invited Silvermaster to his home again. This would seemingly indicate Silvermaster could not influence Glasser, but would need someone else to approach Glasser in locating a position for Silverman. The inability of Silvermaster to influence Glasser (Page) would seemingly indicate that Glasser was in other espionage apparatus. Elizabeth Bentley has testified that Glasser was a member of the Victor Perlo apparatus. (S) (U)

Investigation has indicated that Frank Virginus Coe (Pik) and Glasser were friends of many years. It appears likely that Glasser might be subject to the influence of his friend Coe. (S) (U)

Referral/Consult

BACKGROUND

Harold Glasser, the subject, presently resides at 8 Sheffield Road, Great Neck, New York. His resignation as Director, Overseas Institute, Council of Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds was announced 9-17-53. (101-3599-105)

Glasser was born November 24, 1905, in Chicago, Illinois, according to his own statement. He graduated from the University of Chicago in 1926, receiving a Bachelor's degree. He continued graduate work until 1928. From April, 1929, to September, 1929, he was an accounting instructor at the University of Akron, Akron, Ohio. He then took graduate work at Harvard University from 1929 to 1930, after which he returned to the University of Chicago for the period 1930-31. During the years 1931-32 he was associated with the Brookings Institute, Washington, D. C. In 1932 he was employed by the Labor Bureau of the Middle West at Chicago, Illinois. In 1933 he became an instructor at the Peoples Junior College, Chicago, Illinois, where he remained until 1935. He first entered U.S. Government service as a statistician with the Works Progress Administration in Chicago August 15, 1935. From May 1, 1936, until November 21, 1936, he was the Director of the Tabulation Pool, Bureau of Home Economics, Department of Agriculture, Minneapolis, Minnesota. On November 23, 1936, he was appointed to a position in the Division of Research and Statistics, U.S. Treasury Department, as an economic analyst. On February 16, 1937, he was promoted to senior economic analyst in the Division of Research and Statistics. On June 1, 1938, he was transferred to the Division of Monetary Research as principal economic analyst. On November 16, 1938, he was designated as Assistant Director. On June 15, 1940, his services were made available by the Treasury Department to the State Department for special detail to assist the Ecuadorian Government with its financial and economic problems. He arrived in Ecuador August 11, 1940, and remained there until May 19, 1942, at which time he returned to the Treasury Department. Subsequently he was borrowed by the War Production Board and assigned to the Office of Production Vice Chairman of the War Production Board from November 30, 1942, until January 10, 1943. On February 11, 1943, he was in Algiers, North Africa, serving as advisor on North African affairs to the Office of Foreign Territories in the American Consulate in Algiers. He was recommended by Henry Morgenthau to be commissioned and made a part of Col. Foley's staff in Africa on August 30, 1943. An interoffice memorandum from the Office of Foreign Territories, State Department, dated January 20, 1943, advised that Glasser, as well as others, an officer of the Treasury Department, was being detailed to the State Department and sent to North Africa to join the Civil Affairs Section of General Eisenhower's staff under Mr. Murphy.

He returned to Washington in August or September, 1943, and on November 11, 1943, Lauchlin Currie requested the services of Glasser for the Foreign Economic Administration. Glasser was praised

by Dean Acheson, Under Secretary of State, for the part he, Glasser, played as U.S. Representative at the United Nations Rehabilitation meeting at Atlantic City, New Jersey, in November, 1943. On December 26, 1943, he was promoted to Chief Economist (Assistant Director). On May 1, 1944, he was given an excellent efficiency rating for the period April 31, 1943, to March 31, 1944, by Harry Dexter White. On May 1, 1944, Glasser was demoted, which demotion was explained by Harry Dexter White as having been caused by the fact that the job to which Glasser had been appointed had not been approved by the Civil Service Commission.

During the Spring of 1944 Glasser went to Italy to do an anti-inflation study for the Military Government. On July 11, 1944, Glasser received a promotion to \$8,000 per year. On December 26, 1944, he was approved to represent the Treasury at conferences on Italian financial matters. On July 29, 1945, he sailed for Europe as a member of the delegation of the United States to the Third Council Session of the United Nations Relief and Rehabilitation Administration at London. On January 13, 1946, he was given a pay increase to \$9012.50 as an Assistant Director of the Monetary Research Division and on August 22, 1946, he was appointed Director of the Monetary Research Division. In January, 1947, he participated in a Four-Power study of the economy of Trieste, and, during the Spring of 1947, he served as a member of the U.S. Delegation to the Council of Foreign Ministers held at Moscow, USSR, which delegation was headed by Secretary of State Marshall. Glasser resigned from the U.S. Treasury Department December 31, 1947, and by January 19, 1948, had been made Acting Director of the Council of Jewish Federation and Welfare Funds, Institute on Overseas studies. His resignation from this position was announced September 17, 1953. (101-3599-15, 23, 77)

Glasser was first married at Albany, New York, January, 1932, and was divorced during the Spring of 1932 at New York City. His wife was Irene Till Glasser, who has presently remarried and is presently known as Mrs. Walter Hamilton. Glasser remarried in Rockville, Maryland, on July 7, 1932. His second wife's name is Faye Cohen Glasser. He has four children; Robert by his first wife and Alice, Rachel and Linda by his second wife.

ALLIGATIONS AND INVESTIGATIONS:

During 1941 an investigation of Harold Glasser was conducted under the Hatch Act. This investigation was predicated on a list furnished by the special committee to investigate Un-American activities of which the Honorable Martin Dies of Texas was Chairman. This list bore the name of Harold Glasser, 339 Willard Avenue, Friendship Heights, Maryland, and indicated he was a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. During the investigation it was disclosed

that Glasser's name appeared in the active indices of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action. It developed further that Mrs. Glasser was active in the League of Women Shoppers. Fellow employees, associates and former neighbors were interviewed and termed Glasser as a liberal but knew of no political interests or affiliations of an unfavorable type concerning him. He exhibited no un-American tendencies while at the University of Akron but incurred the enmity of Military instructors due to his opposition to compulsory military training. The investigation reflected that he was arrested and subsequently charges were dismissed in Chicago in 1929. The charges were for gaming and practicing law without a license. A confidential source of unknown reliability advised during this investigation that Harold Glasser was a suspected organizer in the Inter-Professional Association for Social Insurance. A confidential source of unknown reliability personally recalled that at one time the organization was a legitimate enterprise which was later taken over by the Communists and made a front organization by them. (101-3599-23)

Elizabeth T. Bentley, on November 30, 1945, in New York City, furnished the following information concerning Harold Glasser:

Jacob H. Golos, a former Soviet agent who died November 27, 1949, indicated to Bentley in November, 1943, that he, through Earl Browder, had established contact with a group in Washington, D. C.; subsequently, in the early part of 1944, Earl Browder indicated to Bentley that he would make arrangements for her to meet with this group and the meeting would be held in the apartment of John Abt. Bentley thereupon held a meeting with representatives of this group which was designated as the Perlo group and at that time learned that Harold Glasser also was a member. It was indicated that Harold Glasser had been out of the United States as a representative of the United States Treasury Department and that he returned in the early part of 1944 and was thereafter stationed in the Treasury Department, Washington, D. C. It was further indicated that Glasser was closely associated with and probably an assistant to Harry Dexter White, an official in the Treasury Department. According to Bentley, Harold Glasser subsequently furnished general information concerning the activities of the Treasury Department, particularly concerning proposed loans by the United States to foreign countries. He also supplied information originating in the Foreign Economic Administration, which information had been sent to the Treasury Department. She advised that, after Glasser's return from Europe, Victor Perlo, a member of the group, advised that Glasser had requested to be allowed to return as a member of that group. Bentley was advised by Perlo that Glasser and one or two others had previously been taken by an American in a Government agency in Washington, D. C., and turned over to a Russian contact. Bentley subsequently determined from Charles Kramer that the person who had originally taken Glasser away from the Perlo group was an individual named Hiss in the United States State Department. Bentley advised that Harold Glasser was known to be a member of the Communist Party.

On April 30 and May 3, 1947, Harold Glasser was interviewed by agents of this Bureau. He stated that in 1933 and 1934, while in Chicago, he was definitely interested in the theories of the Communist Party and described himself as a "definite Leftist." One of his close friends was Art Witt, a member of the Communist Party in Chicago, who was later killed fighting in the Spanish War. He stated that he refused to become a member of the Communist Party and had never been a member. He admitted he was associated with the Inter-Professional Association for Social Insurance but did not know this organization was in any way connected with the Communist Party. He denied activity in the Washington Committee for Democratic Action but stated he may have been on the mailing list inasmuch as he received pamphlets from that organization. He stated that he met Victor Perlo in Washington, D. C., about 1937 or 1938 and became fairly well acquainted in a social way with him. After 1944-45 he stated his social acquaintanceship with Perlo became dormant but he continued meeting him for luncheon and meeting him through business. He stated that Frank Coe recommended him for his job at the Treasury Department; that he worked closely with Harry Dexter White until 1940 at which time he felt that the friendship between he and White broke up and as a result, White loaned him to the State Department to work as an advisor to the Ecuadorian Government. He stated he was a close friend of John Abt and a close social acquaintance of Nathan Witt, Lee Pressman and William Taylor. He further advised that he did not know Charles Kramer too well.

Among other things in this interview he stated that the night before former Secretary of the Treasury Morgenthau left for Canada to attend the Quebec conference in 1944 he worked all night preparing the Morgenthau Plan for Germany which Morgenthau delivered to the conference.

Whittaker Chambers, in 1948, advised he had met Harold Glasser on two or three occasions pursuant to arrangements made by J. Peters. (Chambers furnished substantially the same information at that time as appeared later in his book "The Witness," published in 1952, in which he wrote that Harry Dexter White was the least productive of the four original sources. Through George Silverman he turned over material regularly but not in great quantity. Dykoff feared, but there was little he could do about it. As a fellow traveler, White was not subject to discipline. Dykoff suspected, of course, that White was holding back material. Dykoff told Chambers that he must control White. Chambers stated in his book that he thereafter went to J. Peters, who was in Washington constantly in 1937 and whom Chambers saw regularly in New York. Chambers stated he explained the problem to him and asked for a Communist in the Treasury Department who could "control" White. Peters suggested Dr. Harold Glasser, who certainly seemed an ideal man for the purpose, since he was White's assistant and one of several Communists whom White himself

SUMMARY

THIS CORPORATION CHARTERED IN 1946 CONTINUES A BUSINESS ESTABLISHED AS A PARTNERSHIP IN 1944, WITH A CHANGE IN STOCKHOLDER CONTROL DURING SEPTEMBER 1950. SALES VOLUME FOR 1951 REPORTED TO COMPARE FAVORABLY WITH THE VOLUME TRANSACTED IN THE PREVIOUS YEAR, WITH A SATISFACTORY PROFIT REALIZED. A DETAILED BALANCE SHEET HAS BEEN WITHHELD, HOWEVER, CURRENT INVESTIGATION INDICATES THAT THE COMPANY HAS A TANGIBLE NET WORTH IN EXCESS OF \$12,833. HOWEVER, AS A RESULT OF SLOW COLLECTION OF RECEIVABLES WORKING CAPITAL HAS BEEN RESTRICTED AND TRADE OBLIGATIONS ARE RETIRED IN AN IRREGULAR MANNER. SECURED BANKING ACCOMMODATIONS ARE MAINTAINED.

HISTORY

STARTED: 1944 as a partnership of Frank and John Benedetto with the latter being inactive. Partnership continued until August 14, 1945 when at inception the Corporation purchased the assets and assumed the liabilities of the predecessor partnership. Removal was made from 1406 Burke Avenue to 30 E. 10th Street on September 1, 1950.

INCORPORATED: New York Laws August 14, 1945
Authorized Capital Stock: \$7,500.
Outstanding Capital Stock: \$7,500. as of June 30, 1948. On January 11, 1951 Herman D. Sobel, President, stated that the paid in capital was increased to \$30,000. as of December 31, 1950.

At inception Isaac Ezenrich was reported as President owning 50% of the capital stock interest. His interest was purchased on November 1, 1947 by Frank Benedetto who at the time was elected President with his wife Sadie elected Secretary and Treasurer. On September 1, 1950 Herman D. Sobel purchased an interest in that venture for an undisclosed consideration, at which time the captioned officers were elected to their respective positions. In addition the dominant stockholders were reported to have purchased additional capital stock.

Mr. Mrs. Herman D. Sobel, married, native born in 1896. He was employed in the brush field for a number of years, latterly as a salesman for approximately fourteen years by the Rubberset Co. of Newark, New Jersey. From 1932 until 1943 he was National representative of the Star Brush Co. of Boston, Massachusetts. He started in business as a partner with Joseph Sheldon in July of 1943, operating as the Sheldon Brush Co. That partnership manufactured paint brushes and as of April 1, 1946 its assets and liabilities were purchased by the Gale Brush Corp., of which Herman D. Sobel was President. That Corporation was chartered under New York laws on December 1, 1944 and formerly located at 116-18 Wooster Street, New York City. That corporation is reported to have dissolved during October of 1949 with all debts paid in full. On December 3, 1944 Sobel was elected President and a Director of the United Brush Manufacturers, Inc., which was chartered under New York laws on June 23, 1898. Sobel continued as President of that corporation until September 1, 1950 at which time he resigned upon being elected President in the subject corporation.

Mr. Mrs. Frank Benedetto born 1911, in the United States, is married. He was employed by local brush manufacturers throughout the Metropolitan area for a number of years until entering into partnership with his brother John on August 18, 1944, as aforementioned.

Mr. Mrs. Benjamin Elsenberg is 37, Married and native born. He is an engineer by profession and a graduate of City College, Class of 1936. He was formerly employed by Transducer Corp. of 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York City, New York, later purchasing the assets and assuming the liabilities of that corporation and operating as an individual proprietorship under the style Transducer Co. which proprietorship was subsequently succeeded by Electra Laboratories,

ENCLOSURE

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Inc. which was chartered under New York laws October 14, 1940. Benjamin Elsenberg was elected Vice President and Secretary of that Corporation which is located at the caption address and he continues as an officer. He is also reported as Secretary and Treasurer of Kriser Corp., which was chartered under New York laws on January 18, 1939. That corporation manufactures surgical instruments and is also located at the caption address. Detailed financial information has not been submitted on those corporations and according to Herman D. Sobel, there are no inter-company relations between the subject corporation and the ventures in which Ben Elsenberg also holds office, such as loans, endorsements, guarantees or advancement.

Rubin Pogarsky is 35, single and native born. He has been employed as a salesman in the hat line throughout most of his career and is currently employed by the Ruval Hat Shop of Brooklyn, N.Y. He is not active in the subject venture and does not hold any capital stock interest.

Herman D. Sobel is reported to own 40% of the outstanding capital stock and is active in a managerial and sales capacity. Frank Benedetto is reported to hold 40% of the outstanding capital stock and is active in both sales and factory management. Ben Elsenberg is reported to own the balance of the outstanding capital stock and is not active in operations.

This corporation moved on May 1, 1951 from 30 E. 10th Street to 730 East 147th Street.

METHOD OF OPERATION

PRODUCTS: Manufacturers paint brushes featuring a complete line of wall, varnish paint and industrial brushes. (U.S. Standard Industrial Classification # 3981).

DISTRIBUTION: To over 50 jobbers and distributors with volume equally divided.

Territory: Nationwide.

Terms: 2-10 N-30.

Salesman: The President is active in a sales capacity.

Employees: In excess of 20 normally employed.

Seasons: Fairly steady throughout the year, high point Spring and Fall.

FACILITIES-LOCATION: Occupies approximately 15,000 square feet on the second floor of a two storey brick building situated in a semi-industrial section of the Bronx. Necessary fixtures and equipment are available for the manufacture of this type merchandise.

FINANCIAL INFORMATION

This corporation chartered in 1945 succeeding a partnership started in 1944. A change in stockholder control was effected in September, 1950.

The latest financial information available as of June 30, 1948 showed a tangible net worth of \$12,833. The statement as of that date disclosed a heavy indebtedness which was attributed to the fact that a part of the available cash was withdrawn by Frank Benedetto.

The company has consistently withheld financial information and in the absence of a financial statement an analysis of this account could not be made at this time. However, those consulted who have had occasion to do business with this concern report that as a result of additional investment by the officers the tangible net worth has increased to \$30,000.

The management has consistently reported that a large inventory is maintained and has been affected by slow collection of receivables, all of which has resulted in limited working capital. Although the

company utilizes bank support to supplement working capital the outside financial assistance has been insufficient to increase working funds and trade obligations are retired in an irregular manner.

On April 4, 1952, Herman D. Sobel, President, stated that sales volume for the year of 1951 was higher than that of the previous year with a satisfactory profit realized. He declined a balance sheet nor would he discuss the present financial condition of the company however, he reported that the company continues to retire its trade obligations in an irregular manner principally due to the fact that net working capital is limited. He advised that the latter condition is principally due to the slow collection of receivables. Sobel reported that the corporation utilizes bank support to supplement working capital, however, these loans have not materially assisted the company.

An account has been maintained at a local depository where satisfactory four figure balances are reported. Accommodations have been granted in medium four figures on an unsecured basis with satisfactory clean ups and loans currently outstanding. The account is well regarded.

On October 15, 1952, Herman D. Sobel, President, stated that Rubin Pogararsky, Vice President, Frank Benedetto, Treasurer and Ben Elsenberg, Secretary, had resigned during May of 1952. According to Sobel, the only one of the Officers who had a stock interest was Frank Benedetto and his interest had been purchased. Sobel declined to state whether he individually or the corporation had paid for the interest held by Benedetto.

In addition, Sobel stated that he is Secretary and Treasurer of Abbey Brush Corp., which was chartered under New York Laws on February 6, 1947 which company operates as a manufacturer of paint brushes at 730 East 147th Street. Most purchased at this time, according to Sobel are in the name of Abbey Brush Corp., and it is expected that eventually Abbey Brush Corp. and the subject will be merged. However, other information was not made available at this time.

TREND

Sobel stated that operations had shown an increase but declined details on volume and profits.

CONDITION

Sobel withheld a balance sheet. The last available information on this company indicated a net investment of about \$12,000, however, it could not be determined at this time if that investment had been reduced any due to the withdrawal of Benedetto.

outside quarters consulted, reported a recent balance sheet was not available nor could any indication be obtained of the Company's financial condition at this time.

"On April 30, 1953, Herman D. Sobel, stated that he is now President of this corporation. Max Gartner is Secretary-Treasurer, and Henry Greenberg is Vice-President.

Gartner is married, born in Poland 1900. He has been active in the brush line for many years. Came to the U.S. in 1940 and shortly after his arrival became partner in United Bristle Co., 220 W. 25th St., New York City. In March, 1941 he withdrew to become a partner with Walter Lowenstein in Lowenstein & Gartner, importers and jobbers of bristles at 262 Mott St., New York City. Gartner continues to be a partner in the latter concern, and last statement available is as of March 31, 1951 which showed a tangible net worth of \$62,360. It is stated that inter-company relations between this concern and Lowenstein & Gartner are principally confined to merchandise transactions on regular trade terms.

Henry Greenberg, born in U.S. 1899. Formerly employed in this line for many years with Sheldon Brush Co. New York City. Is also Treasurer of Revere Brush Corp. That corporation was chartered under New York laws November 22, 1946 and manufactures brushes at the caption address. Balance sheets are not furnished and the extent of inter-company relations between Revere Brush Co., and Liberty Brush Co. Inc. is reported to be confined to merchandise transactions on regular trade terms.

Henry Greenberg is President and Max Gartner is Vice President of Abbey Brush Corp. at the caption address. That corporation was chartered February 6, 1947 and is located at caption address. Specializes in the manufacture of paint brushes. Inter-company relations between Abbey Brush Co, and Liberty Brush Co. is not disclosed.

TREND

On April 30, 1952, Herman D. Sobel, President, stated that this Company continues to transact sizable volume with operations on a profitable basis. However, Sobel declined all details pertaining to the operations and sales of this concern.

CONDITION

Sobel declined a financial statement at this time. He reported that the tangible net worth of this concern is well in excess of \$12,000. with a satisfactory financial condition maintained. He added that in the past the company utilized bank support to supplement working capital, however, the corporation is now operating on own capital without recourse to outside financing.

There is no indication that Herman D. Sobel is related to Jack Sobel in the Mccase.

As concerns Herman D. Sobel, a review of Bureau files fails to reflect any information identical with the facts furnished concerning this individual.

The New York office is being requested to obtain background information as to Herman D. Sobel and a picture if possible. The result of this investigation will be furnished to you when obtained.

Inasmuch as the State Department would not issue Harold Glasser a passport, the Jewish Federation discharged him from his position because he was unable to fully carry out his duties.

In view of the above, Washington Field will review subject's passport file at the Department of State, reporting information therein from the time he left Government employ to date with specific attention to any affidavits subject may have submitted in an effort to obtain issuance of a passport.

SOBELL and JACK SOBELL the closeness of their business dealings indicates that they possibly know one another.

Investigation into the background of HERMAN D. SOBELL failed to reveal any available photograph as yet. T-1, of known reliability, advised that on November 9, 1953, the subject was observed in Toronto, Canada, with one HERMAN D. SOBEL, of New York. SOBEL made reference to GLASSER as a "world economist" who at one time held a high position in the United States Government. (S) (u)

According to T-1, SOBEL, owner of the Liberty Brush Company in New York City, came to Canada on business and the subject appeared to be acting as his financial advisor. SOBEL had registered at the Royal York Hotel, Toronto, Canada, on the morning of November 7, 1953. ANTHONY CHIODO, Superintendent at 35 Shady Glen Court, New Rochelle, New York, advised SA WILLIAM A. FLYNN that HERMAN D. SOBEL, and his wife FANNY have resided at this address for about a year. They have a $3\frac{1}{2}$ room apartment for which they pay \$145.00 per month rent. They have a married daughter but she does not live with them and they own a Packard Sedan. CHIODO stated that the SOBELS were excellent tenants and he knew nothing regarding their habits or associations.

The records of the Westchester County, New York Credit Bureau at White Plains, New York, reflect that the SOBELS formerly lived at 1 Fifth Avenue, New York City, and maintained a bank account at the Manufacturers Trust Company, 32 University Place, New York City. The records further reflect that the SOBELS have a good credit record and there is no derogatory information regarding them.

The Board of Elections records of Westchester County failed to reflect that the SOBELS ever voted from their present address.

Detective JOHN DOOLEY of the New Rochelle, New York Police Department, advised SA WILLIAM A. FLYNN that there is no record at this police department regarding the SOBELS.

[T-3] of known reliability, advised that HERMAN (u)
D. SOBEL and his wife have resided at their present residence for approximately one year and that they formerly resided at 1 Fifth Avenue, New York City, since 1950. [T-3] (u) stated that from June, 1945 to 1950 SOBEL owned a home at 40 Melrose Drive, New Rochelle, New York, prior to 1945 they were alleged to reside at 985 East 16th Street, Brooklyn, New York, for a period of five years. Informant stated that when SOBEL retained his present apartment he gave as references the Manufacturers Trust Company and a Mr. GARTNER of the Abbey Brush Company. His present occupation was given as President of the Liberty Brush Company.

[T-4] of known reliability, advised that HERMAN (u)
D. SOBEL and his wife FANNY opened a bank account in September, 1950 at the Manufacturers Trust Company, 32 University Place, New York City. He was introduced to the bank by one BEN EISENBERG, a brother-in-law. The account was opened with a deposit of \$10,000.00 and this account also included the firm called the Liberty Brush Company. This company was severed from the account in December, 1951. Informant added that the SOBELS continue a personal account to the present time and the account is in the low four figure range.

The Liberty Brush Company maintains an account at the Federation Bank and Trust Company at the present time.

The description of SOBEL on this license reflects his date of birth as December 5, 1895; weight 160 pounds; 5'4½"; brown hair and brown eyes.

Mr. WILLIAM BOYLE, Assistant Manager of the Park Sheraton Hotel, New York City, provided the information that credit card number 14C533 owned by HERMAN D. SOBEL was not drawn on the New York hotel. Mr. BOYLE advised that the letter C in the serial number indicated that the

It is not known whether this individual is identical to the HERMAN D. SOBEL, associate of the subject.

The Southern Conference for Human Welfare was "cited as a Communist front which received money from the ROBERT MARSHALL Foundation, one of the principal sources of funds by which many Communist fronts operating" (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, dated March 9, 1944, page 147)

his position as Director of the Institute of Overseas Studies, Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, Inc., 165 West 46th Street, New York City. On March 23, 1950, the above passport was renewed by the American Vice Consul at Tel Aviv, Israel, for a period of two years to be good until March 21, 1952. In his renewal application, subject indicated his legal residence to be 52 Colgate Road, Great Neck, New York, and his foreign address in care of Bristol Hotel, Tel Aviv.

In a letter dated February 24, 1953, on the letterhead of the American Jewish League Against Communism, Inc., 220 West 42nd Street, New York City, and signed by ROBBIE BENJAMIN SCHULTZ, Executive Director, it was stated that at a recent Board of Directors meeting of that organization it was voted to call the attention of the Passport Office to the case of the subject. It was stated that subject had been named in sworn testimony as a member of a "Russian spy ring" and that the position which he then held, Director of Overseas Studies, took him to various parts of the world. It was further stated that to their knowledge subject had never asked for an opportunity to refute the accusations under oath and that "your department would have the support of any drastic action taken. Such action is necessary".

In reply to the above under date of April 9, 1953, the Passport Office advised that the above letter had been made a matter of record and that subject was not at that time in possession of a valid passport.

In a letter dated March 12, 1953, on the letterhead of the Council of Jewish Federations and Welfare Funds, Inc., a request was made for a new passport for subject to replace #173349 which had expired. This letter again named subject as Director of the Institute of Overseas Studies of that agency and set forth that subject expected to visit Israel periodically stopping off for short visits to France, Switzerland and Italy, "as he has been doing for the past four years". It was set forth that the purpose of these trips would be for the subject to study the operations of the Jewish philanthropic agencies financed by American philanthropic funds. Under date of May 13, 1953, this organization again communicated with the Passport Office concerning the issuance of a passport to subject and set out that subject had not as yet received one. Under date of May 26, 1953, in reply to this letter, the Passport Office advised that subject's application was still under consideration.

On March 25, 1953, subject filed an application for passport at which time he gave his address as 8 Sheffield Road, Great Neck, New York. He indicated his travel plans to be to leave the port of New York on April 20, 1953, via Air-Sabena to be gone for six weeks to visit Belgium, France and Israel for "economic and social study in Israel". He indicated the following as residences outside of the United States:

Under date of July 2, 1953, the Passport Office advised subject that in connection with the above application for passport it was "obliged to disapprove, tentatively, your request for passport facilities on the ground that the granting of such facilities is precluded under the provisions of Section 51.135 of Title 22 of the Code of Federal Regulations". This letter further pointed out as a reason his application was disapproved was as follows: "In your case it has been alleged that you are now or have been a member of the Communist Party and that you have engaged in espionage activities on behalf of the Soviet Union". The letter further set forth the procedure to be followed if subject desired to "present his case and all relevant information to the Passport Office". It was also stated that he would be "required to submit a sworn statement as to whether or not you are now or ever have been a Communist".

Concerning Section 51.135 of Title 22, Code of Federal Regulations, set forth above, it is noted that this

section is entitled, "Limitations on Issuance of Passports to Persons Supporting Communist Movement". This section provides three instances in which, under the section, passport facilities may be denied, "except for immediate and direct return to the United States". These are as follows:

- (a) Persons who are members of the CP or who have recently terminated such membership under such circumstances as to warrant the conclusion -- not otherwise rebutted by the evidence -- that they continue to act in furtherance of the interests and under the discipline of the CP.
- (b) Persons, regardless of the formal state of their affiliations with the CP who engage in activities which support the Communist movement under such circumstances as to warrant the conclusion -- not otherwise rebutted by the evidence -- that they have engaged in such activities as a result of direction, domination, or control exercised over them by the Communist movement.
- (c) Persons, regardless of the formal state of their affiliations with the CP as to whom there is reason to believe, on the balance of all the evidence that they are going abroad to engage in activities which will advance the Communist movement for the purpose, knowingly and willfully, of advancing that movement.

It is to be noted that a copy of the above regulations was furnished to subject in the Passport Office 's letter to him of July 2, 1953.

Under date of July 30, 1953, the subject directed the following letter to the Passport Office:

"I am writing in reply to your letter dated July 2, 1953. I consider your denial of my passport application to be utterly unwarranted and a violation of my legal and constitutional rights.

"The employment for which my application for passport was required is about to terminate and there is

A review of the file captioned "PEOPLES SONGS, INC; IS-C" fails to reflect any identifying information regarding the HERMAN SOBEL who served on the Board of Sponsors of that organization. It was noted that HARVEY MATUSOW, former CP member was formerly very active in this organization. It appears that MATUSOW would be in a position to identify the HERMAN SOBEL connected with "Peoples Songs".

It is pointed out that the Bureau recently has granted the NYO authority to interview MATUSOW regarding knowledge of CP activities in the NPPR. It is expected that this interview will take place at the NYO in the immediate future and at this time he will also be questioned regarding HERMAN SOBEL.

Efforts to determine if the HERMAN D. SOBEL who is the associate of the subject is identical with the HERMAN D. SOBEL who contributed \$100. to the NY Committee of the Southern Conference for Human Welfare were negative. The original information regarding this matter appeared in the form of a receipt issued to contributors to this organization and merely reflects the name of the individual and the amount of the contribution, but no identifying data.

Investigation will continue at the NYO to develop further background information regarding HERMAN D. SOBEL and his family and will be immediately made available to the Bureau.

Concerning the American Labor Party, the following appears in a booklet entitled Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications, dated May 14, 1951 prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, US House of Representatives.

"American Labor Party

"1. 'For years, the Communists have put forth the greatest efforts to capture the entire American Labor Party throughout New York State. They succeeded in capturing the Manhattan and Brooklyn sections of the American Labor Party but outside of New York City they have been unable to win control.' (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, p. 78)

"2. Among 'organizations that are victims of Communist domination.' (California Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 1948, pp. 40 and 41.)

It was further indicated that both HERMAN and FANNIE SOBEL had previously registered in 1949 from 40 Melrose Drive, New Rochelle.

A review of the records of the Board of Elections at White Plains, New York made by SA WILLIAM A. FLYNN, reflects that from the years 1947 to 1949, HERMAN D. SOBEL and his wife, FANNIE, of 40 Melrose Road, New Rochelle, New York, indicated a preference for one of the two major political parties. He did not register in 1946 but his wife, FANNIE, registered as previously indicated.

It was further noted that one ZELDA SOBEL and MORTON SOBEL also registered from this address in the year 1946. ZELDA SOBEL registered in favor of one of the two major political parties and MORTON SOBEL registered for the American Labor Party.

[T-3] of unknown reliability, but who had knowledge of the Young Communist League at Brooklyn College of New York, advised that one ZELDA SOBEL, a Psychology student, was a member of the Young Communist League sometime in the years between 1940 and 1942. The informant described her as a student who was drifting away from the Communist influence while still at Brooklyn College. (u)

The Young Communist League has been designated by the Attorney General pursuant to Executive Order 10450.



T-2 advised on April 27, 1954 that HERMAN SOBEL and the subject did not complete the purchase of the Meakins Brush Company in Hamilton, Canada but as an alternative SOBEL started a brush company called the Hollins Brush Company located at 260 Willard Avenue, Toronto, Canada. According to T-2, this business was formed shortly after SOBEL had been in England consulting with the Director of the Hollins Brush Company in Darwen, England. The Directors of this new Canadian company are as follows: (S) (U)

HERMAN D. SOBEL, Director and President
HAROLD GLASSER, Director
JOHN WATSON, Director
PERCY S. HUNT, Director

T-2 added that WATSON and HUNT are also Directors of the parent company in England. (S) (U)

According to T-2, SOBEL was in England during January and March of 1954 and apparently returned from England on April 15, 1954. It was the informant's impression that the subject accompanied SOBEL on at least one of these trips. (S) (U)

The purpose of the Hollins Brush Company was to distribute in Canada brushes made from Chinese and Korean bristles. His address at that time was 33 Crestwood Lane, Valley Stream, New York. He was married and had two adopted children. GURIN was considered an outstanding employee.

[T-4] obtained information which reflected that one ARNOLD GURIN was one of the members at large of the executive board of the Social Service Employees' Union, Number 19 of the United Office and Professional Workers of America, CIO, 39 East 30th Street, New York City. (u)

Concerning this union the "CIO News" of February 20, 1950, page 6, column 1, reported that the CIO Executive Board had voted to expel the United Office and Professional Workers of America from the CIO effective March 1, 1950 for "consistent unwavering support of the policies of the Communist Party".

In connection with another matter, ARNOLD GURIN furnished the information that he was born on December 5, 1917 in New York City. He attended the

City College of New York from 1933 to 1937, the University of Chicago in 1938, and Columbia University from 1942 to 1943.

[T-5,] another government agency which conducts security investigations, (u) provided the information that one ARNOLD GURIN signed a petition for approval of the American Student Union chartered at the City College of New York in the spring of 1936.

The American Student Union was cited as a Communist front which was "the result of a united front gathering of young Socialists and Communists in 1937". The Young Communist League took credit for the creation of the American Student Union and the union offered free trips to Russia. The records of the Board of Elections, New York City indicated that HERMAN SOBEL and FANNIE SOBEL first registered in New York City in 1934 from 560 West 165th Street. HERMAN SOBEL'S employment at that time was given as the Rich Art Color Company of 31 West 21st Street, New York City.



Edward Nickolsen, a former Bureau agent who is now employed by the Department as an attorney and who is assisting in handling the Nathan Gregory Silvermaster grand juries in Camden, New Jersey, and Washington, D. C., stopped in my office and spoke with Supervisor E. J. Lamphere and myself. He said that Harold Glasser, a former Treasury Dept. employee and a member of the Perlo network, had been before the Federal Grand Jury in Washington, D. C., on the morning of 9/13/54. Glasser was accompanied to the Grand Jury by his attorney, Milton Friedman, who also has been representing other subjects in this case. Glasser invoked the Fifth Amendment in testimony before the Grand Jury, but when asked if he was familiar with the Immunity Bill he indicated that he was. He said he had been giving it careful consideration and had not yet made up his mind as to what action he would take if he were offered immunity in return for his testimony. He indicated he felt his life was "decayed" and he, therefore, wanted to carefully think over what steps he should take. He said his decision would be his own and indicated, without putting it in so many words, that he would not be influenced by his attorney, who also represents other subjects. Glasser was asked whether he wanted at this time to talk to Government representatives concerning this matter and he said he did not. His Grand Jury subpoena was continued.

Nicholsen was quite elated by the possibility that Glasser might talk and felt that if he did, he would be an extremely valuable witness for the Government.

HAROLD GLASSER was investigated under the Hatch Act in 1941 because his name was listed as a member of the Washington Committee for Democratic Action.

ELIZABETH T. BENTLEY in a signed statement on 11/30/45 advised that JACOB M. SOLOS, a former Soviet agent told her in November 1943 that he, through EARL BROWDER, had established contact with a group in Washington, D. C. Through BROWDER, BENTLEY met this group, the Perlo Group, and learned that HAROLD GLASSER was also a member.

According to BENTLEY, GLASSER subsequently furnished general information concerning activities of the Treasury Department; also information originating in the FEA.

BENTLEY stated also that GLASSER was taken from the Perlo Group and turned over to a Russian contact by an individual believed to be ALGER HISS. BENTLEY stated that GLASSER was a known member of the Communist Party.

In an interview on 12/31/48, JAY DAVID WHITTAKER CHAMBERS stated he met GLASSER on two or three occasions through J. PETERS, a Soviet agent who informed him that GLASSER was a Party member and could be trusted.

HAROLD GLASSER in an interview 4/30, 5/3/47, admitted knowing VICTOR PERLO, HARRY DEXTER WHITE, ALGER HISS and others. He denied ever furnishing any information of any kind to any unauthorized person.

In April 1953 when called before the Senate Internal Security Subcommittee, GLASSER invoked his privilege against self-incrimination when asked about his past activities.

GLASSER was called before a Special Subcommittee headed by K. E. MUNDT in October 1953 regarding his participation in the currency situation in Germany from 1944 to 1946. GLASSER again invoked his privilege.

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In November 1953, the United States Attorney, Eastern District of New York, gave the opinion that it would serve no useful purpose to call GLASSER before a Grand Jury.

It would appear that if GLASSER would testify regarding his past activities and associations, he could furnish valuable information regarding the Victor Perlo Group.

This case as part of the Nathan S. Silvermaster case is currently being considered with regards to the Democracy Bill by the Internal Security Division of the Dept. The Dept of Justice is in possession of pertinent reports. Therefore no action is required until such time as the Dept advises of its decision in this matter.

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
