

Germany, and as of 3-1-66 resided at 51242 De Longpre Avenue,
Los Angeles.

New York letter of 8-28-63 re Charles Bukowski, New York file 100-15155, indicates that one Charles Bukowski, poet, was the author of an article appearing on page 43 of the June, 1963, issue of "Mainstream." It was indicated that Charles Bukowski could not be further identified at that time.

The March, (1968) edition of the "Underground Digest, The Best of the Underground Press," Volume 1, published by the Underground Communications, Inc., P. O. Box 211, Village Station, New York, New York 10014, telephone WI 7-6900, contains an article by Charles Bukowski on pages 76-79 entitled "Notes of a Dirty Old Man." Page 79 indicates that the writer's name may be Henry Charles Bukowski. The publication indicates at the end of the article on page 79 that the article may have originally appeared in "Open City" 5420 Carlton Way, Los Angeles, California, 90027; \$5 per year. Single copies of the article "Notes of a Dirty Old Man" together with a copy of the masthead of the Underground Digest are enclosed for New York and Los Angeles under obscene cover.

New York and Los Angeles should make discreet efforts to resolve whether this article and the item appearing in the June, 1963, issue of "Mainstream" were written by the employee. If employee's authorship is indicated copies of the articles should be designated as exhibits.

You are authorized to conduct necessary investigation involving persons connected with educational institutions unless your office is aware of a possible problem at a particular school. No such contacts are to be made on campuses except as provided in SAC Letter 67-29. Should a problem exist or should it be felt any other interview on a campus is necessary, furnish the Bureau full details together with your recommendation for specific Bureau authority. It is incumbent upon each office to insure that any such investigation involving persons connected with educational institutions are handled by mature personnel to avoid possible embarrassment to the Bureau. All persons interviewed must be advised that the Bureau is conducting a background investigation of the captioned individual who is an applicant or employee of the Federal Government to preclude any assumption that the investigation is of a criminal or security type.



when Henry's mother died it wa n't had. nice Catholic fact, i. the priest waved some smoking sticks and it was all over. the coffin remained closed. Henry went right from that funeral to the racetrack. had a good day. found a light yellow girl there and they went to her apartment. she cooked steaks and they made it. when his father died it was more complicated. they left the coffin open and he had the last look. before that, the old man's girlfriend, somebody he'd never met, a Shirley, this Shirley reached into the coffin, moaning and crying and grabbed that dead head and 'dissed it. they had to pull her off. then when Henry came down the steps this Shirley grabbed him and started kissing him, "oh, you look just like your father!" he got hot as she kissed him and when he shoved her off something was showing through his pants. he hoped the people didn't notice. he made a note to check Shirley out. she wasn't much older than he. he went from the funeral to the track, but no high yellow this time. and he also lost some money. the old man had left his stigma on

the lawyer said no will had been left. there was no money but there was a house and a car. Henry wasn't working so he moved right in. and drank. drank with his old girlfriend Maggy. he'd get up about noon and water the damned lawn. and the flowers. the old man liked flowers. he watered the flowers. he stood there hungover, remembering how the old man had hated him because Henry didn't like to work, just drink and lay up with women. now he had the damn house and the car and the old man was down in the

dirt. he got to know the neighbors. especially the guy on the North. some guy who was manager of a laundry. Harry, this Harry had a yard full of birds. 5,000 dollars full of birds. all kinds. from everywhere. they were strangely colored and strangely shaped and some of them talked one of them kept saying over and over again, "go to hell! go to hell!" Henry squirted water on the thing but it was no use, the bird said "got a match?" and then it said "go to hell"



5 or 6 times, real fast. the whole yard was full of wire cages. Harry lived for the booze, and the gash. Maybe he'd try one of those birds. how do you screw a bird?

Maggy was good on the springs but she was Irish-Indian and had one hell of a temper when she drank. once in a while he had to hit her. he got Shirley's phone number and asked to come over. she started kissing him again, saying he looked like his father. he let her, and kissed back. he didn't make t that night, choosing to wait and make sure. he didn't want to scare her.

Harry came over almost every night with his wife and they all drank. Harry talked about the birds. the birds hated Harry's wife. Harry's wife crossed her legs real high while talking about how she hated the birds and Henry got something working under his pants. god-damned women kept teasing him. then Shirley started coming over and they all drank together. Maggy didn't like Shirley there and Henry kept looking from Shirley

to Harry's wife and wondering which one would be best. so it all happened the same night. Harry's wife got drunk and let all the birds out, 5,000 dollars worth of birds, and Harry sat in shock, drunk, and then he started screaming and hitting his wife. everytime he hit his wife she fell down and Henry peeked up her dress. he saw her panties several times. he started getting hot as hell. Maggy ran outside frying to catch the birds and put them in their cages but she couldn't seem to catch them. they

were running all up and down the street, sitting in trees, standing on rooftops, 5,000 dollars worth of crazy birds, all differer -- -- and shapes, tasting the confusion of meedom. Henry couldn't stand it anymore and grabbed Shirley and took her into the bedroom. he stripped her down and got on top. he was almost too drunk to operate. each time Harry hit his wife, his wife screamed and he gave it an extra little thrust. then Maggy came in with a bird, a bird with an orange tuft on its head and an orange tuft pn its chest and 2 orange tufts at the top of the feet, the rest of the bird was grey skin and stupid. he'd cost Harry \$300. Maggy hollored, "I caught a bird!" and when she didn't see Henry she went into the bedroom and when she saw what was happening she just sat in a chair with the bird on her lap, watching and screaming, and Harry kept knocking his wife down and she kept screaming. and when the police came in that's the way it was. 2 young cops. the cops pulled Henry off, made everybody put on their clothes and took them down to the station. another patrol car came up with 2 other young cops. Maggy got vicious and hit one of the cops and they took her alone in one of the patrol cars. the cops drove the car into the hills and they each screwed Maggy in the back seat. they had to handcuff her. the other cops took Henry Harry, Stirley, Harry's wife down to the station, booked them and jailed them. and the birds ran all up and down the street. that Sunday the preacher spoke of the "letcherous alcoholics who bring sin and shame to our community." Maggywas the only one who was out of

jail. she was very religious. she sat in the front row with her legs crossed high. from the pulpit the preacher could look right up her legs. he could almost see the panties. he started to get something under his pants. the pulpit, luckily, hid this section of him from view. he had to look out the window and keep talking until the thing under his pants went away.

Harry lost his job. Henry sold the house, the preacher made it with Maggy. Shirley married atv repairman. Harry sat around looking at the empty cages and the birds starved and died in the streets. every time he saw another dead bird he beat his wife again. Henry gambled and drank away the money from the house in 6 months.

my name is Henry. Charles is my middle name. wasn't bad. nice Catholic funeral. smoking when my father died it was more complicoffin open and the old man's girl-the coffin . . . kissed that started the whole thing.

in the Dec. issue of EVERGREEN there is a small poem by one Charles Bukowski far in the back pages, and all through the magazine there is an interview of LeRoi Jones, poems by LeRoi Jones, ads for LeRoi Jones' latest book, plus a speech by the departed Malcolm X - "God's Judgment of White America." EVERGREEN was beginning to look like EBONY. I read on through.

later in the day the woman came over with my 3 year old child, we sat down to dinner.

"I think I'll write a poem called WHO'S AFRAID OF LEROI JONES?"

"YOU'RE afraid of LeRoi Jones!" the woman shouted, she was a very liberal white liberal liberal.

"WHO'S AFRAID OF LEROI JONES?" I asked again, looking at my little girl.

she pointed an arm at me over her ground round and french fries, "YOU ARE! YOU ARE!"

the woman was meanwhile pantering and bantering, her voice neurotically high-pitched, explaining to me the meaning of black America and LeRoi Jones, only in the way that a very liberal white liberal female can do. I " the old man, after a hard day at the ballpoint pen office, would take her to the play anything, rather than try to get his dick hard.

"I don't understand," I said, "Hitler rold me that the whites were the superior race and now Jones turns around and tells me that the blacks are the superior race."

"well, who do YOU think is the superior race?"

she went on some more, sentence running into sentence she must have spoken ten minutes without pause, a little of it was good stuff, most of it was just religious sacrifice at the altar, hot white liberal liberal female air, even Jones wouldn't want to hear it.

"how many blacks have you known?" I asked.

this is always a good stopper in a religious argument. being a common laborer all mylife at poor and underpaid jobs I had worked with more black men, known more black men, drank with more black men, fought with more black men than any theoretical liberal with books jammed between the ears, coming up through the back streets of New Orleans in a light rain with my paper suitcase, a high yellow sitting on her porch showing leg had named me, she laughed and shouted, "POOR WHITE TRASH!" I put down my paper suitcase and looked up her legs. "Come on!" she said, "come on, poor white trash and get yourself a little!" I saw a curtain move just a little and behind it this black male face, eyes beautiful with murder for my 2 dollars and twenty cents, then I laughed, feeling good in the early sun, picked up my suitcase full of poems and moved on down the street.

"Jones got out on 25,000 dollars bail," I threw at her, money only represents evil to the white liberal ladies - until you stop giving it to them.

"well, YOU got out of jail, in ten minutes, YOU had bail!"

"it took 6 or 7 hours, the bail was between 20 and 30 dollars. I had it in my dresser but it took me a long time to find somebody who would trust me for it. Jones got up \$2,500 in cash, if you want comparisons, plus 2 houses, friends of his parents. I don't know anybody who owns a house, I don't even have parents. I'm still poor white trash."

"Jones' house doesn't belong to him, it belongs to the Negro community."

"oh, shit," I said, so there it was, haggling over Le-Roi Jones over the frenc'i fract to find out who owns a

man's house find out who is shitting in the crapper and who is fucking in the bed you can bet he owns part of it, also, if you have to ring the bell to get in, you don't own any of it.

I decided to let the conversation go but she had hold of it.

"suppose you kept walking down the street and getting punched in the nose and told you were getting punched in the nose because of the color of your skin, how would you feel? you can't blame them for wanting Black Power. Black Power isn't anything because they don't have any power. . . ."

she went on and on and on I didn't have any particular argument with her, she only PRESUMED that I did, but I knew that if the blacks ever got total power they would kill her long before they got around to me, so I listened and listened and then kissed the little girl goodbye and drove on down to work.

down there, 9 out of ten of them are black-but you forget this as the years go on, it's nothing special until the female white liberal liberals make it so, we worked away, then I said, "LEROI JONES!"

the one next to me turned, and here was the finger again, "you BETTER NOT SAY ANYTHING ABOUT LEROI JONES!"

"my little girl says that I am afraid of him "

"YOU ARE! YOU ARE! YOU BETTER NOT SAY ANYTHING ABOUT LERO! JONES!"

"what will happen if I do?"

"you'll be taken care of, that's what will happen!"

"you mean mentally or physically?"

"we don't care about the mental, his boys will handle you the other way."

his friend walked over. "hello, brother," he said. "hello, brother." I answered.

"you gonna invite me over to your house for break-fast?" (we work nights.)

"sure, we'te having grits and beans, only I don't have a house,"

"you got a front door?"

"yeah."

"well, I'm comin' to the front door in broad daylight and ring your bell, I'm not comin' to the back door so's people will think I'm some servant or trashman or delivery boy. I'm comin' in BROAD DAYLIGHT so's they can see my skin, I'm comin' to your FRONT door!"

"brother Roy, my front door is your front door as long

as the rent is paid."

"good, and I'm gonna grow me some of that shit like you got on your chin and I'm gonna get me some young hippy girl and we gonna walk down Sonset Blvd. hand in hand, right, down Sunset Boulevard."

"I'd like to get me one of those nice young blonde hippy girls myself," I told him.


after some remarks about Gov. Reagan he walked over and sat down, we worked away, while back at my place the mother of my child got ready to go to a communist party meeting, of all white members.

Charles Bukowski?" and I said, "come on in," and she did, she came in and sat on the chair in front of the fireplace and the walls of the room began to weave in and out like on a trip, and the rug said, what the hell oh my god oooh ooocoonooch, and she CROSSED HER LEGS and the skirt was high and

I won't be trapped in love is a form of selfishness, love is an excuse for cowards to quit"

"micely spoken, sounds all right, bastard, but what does it mean?"

she lifted her beerbottle again, recrossed her legs, the skirt going HIGHER, jesus have mercy, the skirt going HIGHER, all that leg, all that thigh, all that red HAIR, god.

I got up and pulled the beerbottle from her mouth and put my dirty bearded face to hers, my lips sucking and twisting at hers, hard full crazy, she did not push me away. I grabbed her under the back, I had her back arched, I had her head rolling on the back of the chair, our lips splashed together spliced together crazy, my hand under the back of that BIG body, god, the beerbottle knocked over and spewing on the floor, and I reached down with the other hand and ripped her skirt all the way UP, lord lord lord then I had her standing, I was walking pushing her all over the room, feeling that red hair around my ears across my face, feeling that the my ears across

ing miracle and madness, and then I worked the pants down and then I HAD HER, I HAD HER, THAD HER, and I worked, I grabbed that long red hair and I yanked down on it, I had her back arched arched hurting her and I HAD HER I worked and holding the hair still in

my hands in back I got the cheeks and spread them wide, I had her natied in the center of the rug. I had her on the cross, it was too late for her, she was on the spike, ripped ripped and the yellow light from the lamps bathed us and all that could be heard was our breathing and our grappling, who would have guessed? who? and then BANG the walls shook, a man on the street stepped on a grease spot, fell and broke his ankle and we slid apart like worms going in different directions, and she stood there then and said, "ooooh ooooh I liked it, I liked it I liked it, you filthy greasy pig," and then she turned and walked into the bathroom and closed the door. I went into the kitchen, took a dishtowel, wiped off, got out 2 more beers. It a smoke.

she came on out, looking better than ever, she glowed all over burning, she was really beautiful, I could say it easy, she was really beautiful, I drink my beer and looked at her, neither of us saying anything. I lit her a cigarette, then I had to piss. I went to the bathroom, closed the door, pissed, flushed, washed my hands, came out, and she was... gone, fast like that, no goodbye, nothing. I looked at the chair she had sat in, at the beerbottle on the floor, no, it had happened, yes, I found one of her earrings, a green earring, just one, it's always ONE earring what the hell, but never an earring like this.

I drank my beer straight down, walked outside. It was cold, all up and down DeLongpre it was the same, people locked in tight, behind doors, behind windows, everybody with their possessions, their people, their madness, their bank accounts, their car keys, their walnut faces, their constipation.





NO T-1 further advised that numerous names and addresses of individuals appear as contributors to this magazine including the name CHARLES BUKOWSKI, 5124 Delongpre Avenue, Los Angeles, California.

NO T-1 also stated that and are members of the New Orleans Movement for a Democratic Society (NOMDS) and that both have been active in the New Orleans area in anti-Vietnam War activity.

NO T-1 advised that the NOMDS was formerly known as the New Orleans Committee to End the War in Vietnam (NOCEWV). The latter committee voted to change its name to the NOMDS in the Spring of 1967, and a constitution prepared for it specified that it was an affiliate of the Students for a Democratic Society (SDS).

APPENDIX

STUDENTS FOR A DEMOCRATIC SOCIETY

The Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), as it is known today, came into being at a founding convention held at Port Huron, Michigan, in June, 1962. The SDS is an assocation of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develop a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnam and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Party, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Party has "going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anti-Communist proviso was removed from the SDS constitution.

In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Notes", the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some Communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization, as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.



S. Attorney's Office, New Orleans, Louisiana, asking for assistance in getting Registrant BUKOWSKI examined by a Medical Advisory Board. This letter further advised the Registrant was rejected for Military Service on July 2, 1943, by reason of "Military Unsuitable Group 5". Prior to reporting, he advised Local Draft Board #2 by letter that he did not have any intentions of reporting for induction due to his personal philosophy, and wanted to know just what action Local Draft Board #2 would take in view of that information. Local Draft Board #2 advised him unless he reported the matter would be handled by the U. S. Attorney's Office, New Orleans. For several months following his rejection, the case was not re-opened, but after the medical survey program was put into effect, Local Draft Board #2, endeavored to have him examined by a Phychiatrist, in order to determine if Registrant was a malingerer. On March 15, 1944, Local Draft Board #2, had been unsuccessful in locating Registrant at any of the various addresses that was furnished to Local Draft Board #2. All mail was returned "Unclaimed". Last address was Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. On June 27, 1944, this case was referred to the FBI Office, New Orleans, Louisiana, by the U.S. Attorney's Office, New Orleans, for investigation. On August 7, 1944, the Registrant was examined by Armed Service Forces, Armed Forces Induction Station, 32nd Street and Lancaster Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, by Captain, Q.M.C. Induction Officer and was found to be physically and mentally disqualified for military service and rejected for "Failing To Meet Medical Standards." - 2 -
