SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

Subject organization was organized in June, 1940 by Professor RALPH BARTON PERRY. The purpose of the group was to cooperate with the Government; relief of refugees (including medical); to influence public opinion; to promote national unity. The following statement has been adopted by the Steering Committee of this group, May, 1943 and the activities of the subject group will be based on these principles: (a) The completed defeat of the Axis powers, Asiatic as well as European, and their unconditional surrender; (b) A relation of mutual trust and collaboration among the United Nations and the invaded peoples resisting Axis domination; (c) Permanent international organization so implemented and sanctioned as to provide effectively for world-wide security, freedom, welfare and justice is the goal of the present effort of the United Nations; (d) Every manifestation of defeatism, partisan selfishness and totalitarian sympathy at home is to be challenged and attacked. The group is made up of noted Harvard professors, all names and positions set forth. Some of the work performed by the group has been at the request of Government Agencies, such as civilian lectures in the Army Orientation Courses in the Army Camps in the First Service Command. At the request of the Office of Strategic Services, the group prepared a handbook of which 3 chapters are on Nazi Germany

collaborate with a proposed Universities Committee to be created for the purpose of coordinating the work of similar committees throughout the country.

Since the last report, the Committee on Correspondence has maintained its connections with the Defense Groups and similar organizations in the New England colleges. Communications dealing with various subjects such as the availability of speakers for lectures, and lists of books on the background and course of the war, have been issued. Since June the area of correspondence has been spread beyond New England and embraces the entire country, the Committee now being in close contact with some 350 colleges and universities. Communications on post-war problems, India, the manpower problem, inflation, and relations with China have been sent out, and have met with generally favorable response. The work of this Committee has been taken over by a [redacted] this office being held first by [redacted] and since September by HENRY D. AIKEN. The relations of cooperation with similar groups at other colleges and universities are both wider and more active than at any earlier period of the Group's history, and several colleges have formed groups patterned after ours.

The Group works in close cooperation with the following Outside the Scope Committees: The Radio Board, the Committee on War Speeches and the Committee on Pan-American Relations; also with the Moral Inar, under the direction of GOLDON A. WALLPORT and HENRY A. [redacted].

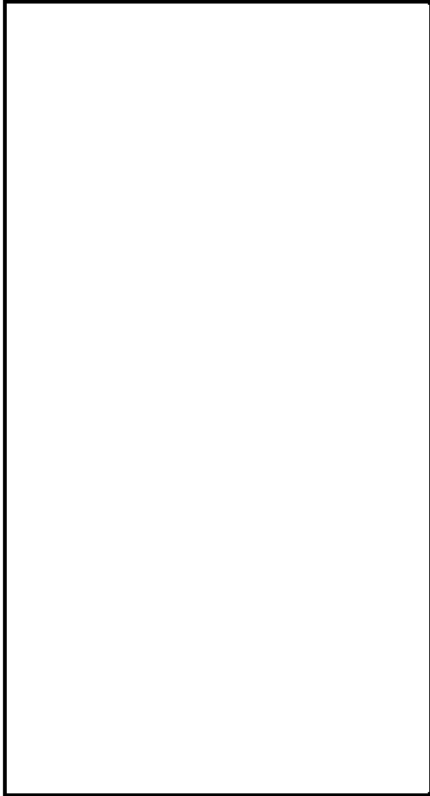
Owing to the generous and time consuming labors of [redacted]
