

J. H. Ward of Fairfax, Oklahoma, states that he is the legal owner of the Paige Cabriolet, Motor #412,026, Serial #406,407, which he purchased from Mr. T. E. McCune at Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, on April 16, 1926. The car in question is insured by the Commercial Investment Trust Company, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; that he is an automobile dealer at Fairfax, Oklahoma, and placed this car in his show room at the time of purchasing same, and that on June 6, 1926, 11 A. M. he took the car out of his show room and parked it on South Main Street; that he discovered the car missing some time that night, and presume that it was stolen some time that afternoon. Mr. Ward further stated that he advertised extensively for the car and the thieves, and that on June 9, 1926, he received word from the Chief of Police at Ft. Scott, Kansas, that he had recovered the car in possession of the two Subjects of this case. On receipt of this information the following wire was sent to the Kansas City Office: "Frank J. Blake, Department of Justice, Latarop Building, Kansas City, Missouri. Ft. Scott authorities holding Al Ayres and J. L. White who stole Paige Coupe number four one two naught two six from Henry Ward Fairfax Oklahoma June seventh Request made this office handle quick as officers proceeding there to recover car. Complaint was filed in the Kansas district when it seemed unlikely state prosecution would be successful in Oklahoma, as per report of this Agent, Kansas City, October 7, 1936. Our files do not reflect whether subjects have ever been turned over to the Government or that fugitives wanted for trial are located in Oklahoma. Assuming they are in custody in the State courts or can be located in your district I have advised the United States Attorney at Topeka, Kansas, to forward the certification copy of the indictment and to give you the same information as you may desire.





Jones, one of the above subjects, was arrested with Ray Merrill on a charge of burglary by the Sheriff's office at Ardmore and on September 21, 1926, broke jail by overpowering the jailer and making their escape. These two were undoubtedly assisted by Valva Lockett, alias Mrs. Ray Merrill, Mrs. Ethel Snyder, alias Mrs. Ethel Mayhill, and Mrs. Edna Lamp, alias Edna Lamp DeLoach, as these three women were in the City of Ardmore on the day and making provision to the jail break. Agent has been informed that after this jail break all the above mentioned parties disappeared from Ardmore. Jones and Merrill were next heard of at Springfield, Missouri, where they robbed a bank of \$7,000, and then proceeded to Wichita, Kansas, where they bought a new Indian Brougham, and that they transferred their guns, etc., from the car they were driving to the Indian Brougham. (Agent was unable to learn the kind of car they used to come to Wichita, Kansas.) They then left Wichita, Kansas, enroute to Arizona, stating they were going to a warm climate for the winter, since which time Agent has been unable to trace them.

The investigation by Agents Graham and Fitzpatrick indicates that in all probability these notorious outlaws have made an arrangement with certain County officers in this state and that by means of this arrangement, whenever these parties are arrested for any offense, these County officers, or some of them, appear on the scene with a false warrant, by means of which they obtain custody of these outlaws, ostensibly to return them to Ottawa County, Oklahoma, but in reality to liberate them. This is apparently what happened at the time these subjects were arrested in Fort Scott, Kansas in possession of the automobile which is the basis of our present investigation.

On Monday August 1, 1927 a man using the name of R.D. Snodgrass walked into the American National Bank, a local bank of Cheyenne, Wyoming, and presented three American Express Company traveler's cheques which were cashed by the teller. As Snodgrass left the Bank, the teller referred to his memorandum on stolen American Express Cheques and noted that the Cheques he had cashed were listed as taken in a bank robbery at Buffalo, Kansas, in December 1926.

The Teller followed the man across the street to his automobile and advised him that the cheques were no good, and asked him to return the money. Snodgrass was backing his car away from the curb. He replied to the bank teller that he would drive around the block and stop at the Bank.

The Teller returned to the Bank but the man did not. The Sheriff's office was then notified and all nearby officers were given a description of Snodgrass and his woman companion, as well as a description of the car they were driving.

Deputy Sheriff Arthur Osborn who was located at Pine Bluffs, Wyoming, about forty miles east of Cheyenne on the Lincoln Highway, was one of the officers who received the message to be on the lookout for Snodgrass. Osborn immediately drove out on the Lincoln Highway about two and one-half miles west of Pine Bluffs. About thirty minutes later Osborn was found on the road by a Deputy Sheriff from Nebraska who happened along the Highway. He was unconscious and died a few minutes later.

A doctor's examination revealed that he had been shot through the body twice with a .32 automatic pistol. Osborn's revolver was in the holster and he had apparently been shot down when he signaled the driver of the car to stop.

All Officers within a radius of two hundred miles were notified by telephone of the murder and requested that all roads be covered. No trace was found of the Chrysler Coach until August 5, when a report was received by Sheriff Carroll that a Chrysler Coach was stalled in a mud hole Monday afternoon on the road leading from Bushnell, Nebr., to Sterling, Colorado. Several people who happened to be on this road assisted the man and woman in getting the car out of the mud. W.C.Rutherford, agent in charge of the American Express Co., assisted Sheriff Carroll in his investigations. Mr Rutherford had in his possession photos and description of several underworld characters, and among these photos was one of Elmer A Inman and Ace Pendleton, who were known to have had in their possession a quantity of the stolen Traveler's Cheques that were taken in the Buffalo Kansas bank robbery, and Inman's photo was identified by at least six or eight people who had seen the occupants of the Chrysler Coach. Inman was also identified by the bank teller as the man who had presented these cheques for payment. This identification is positive and we are also in a position to identify the woman described in our circular.

All Officers should make copies of the enclosed list of stolen cheques and request banks as well as business houses to be on the lookout for anyone presenting these cheques for payment. This detailed information is given with a view of assisting Officers in the search for Inman and his woman companion.







Agent interviewed I. E. Walston, Chief of Police, Wichita, Kansas who stated that Subject ERMAN PARKER was wounded in a gun battle with Wichita police on August 29, 1927, and then committed suicide in the presence of officers; that Parker's companions were CHARLES STALCUP, Oklahoma bandit, who was wounded and is now in custody at Wichita, and PORTER MCKEE, also an Oklahoma outlaw, who was killed on August 30th by a Wichita Officer after escaping during the fight on the previous day.

Mr. Walston states that it was at first thought that the third man was Subject ELMER DIXON, but that he was later positively identified as ERMAN. He stated further that there were only three members of this gang, who had staged a robbery at Newton, Kansas, and were passing through Wichita when accosted by Police officers. He stated there was no indication that Subject ERMAN had been with those men.

The Kansas City Office is in receipt of a letter dated August 29, 1927, from George J. Carroll, Sheriff of Laramie County, Cheyenne, Wyoming, requesting information concerning Subject ERMAN and his alleged woman companion, W. J. CAROL HAMILTON. This request was referred to the Denver office for attention. PAL OF MATTHEW KIDDE JAILED IN HOT SPRINGS

Ray Terrill Arrested After Chase by Officer.

ADmits ROBBING BANK

Banking Bandit and Companion,
With Their Wives, Held to Bail
in City, Where They Were Im-
suspicious Arkansas Outlaws.

Special to The Commercial Appeal.
HOT SPRINGS, Ark., Aug. 28.—
After an exciting chase during which officers fired two shots at him, Ray Terrill, 21, partner of Matthew Kimes, notorious Oklahoma outlaw, now serving a life sentence, late this afternoon was arrested. With him also was captured A. J. Pittman. The wife of the man, who previously had been apprehended at their rented cottage here.

Terrill readily admitted his identity when questioned. He declined, however, to state anything concerning his activity since July this year, when the Oklahoma Bankers Association issued a circular announcing a reward of \$2,000 for his arrest.

"I admit I engaged in some robbery," said Terrill, "but what it was is for you to find out. I am not talkative, and I'll not give you any information. It is now up to you to find out where I am wanted." There were a number of rays not satisfied this but I'm not guilty of one but the bank job I surrendered myself."

Pittman stated he had had no association with Terrill in any of his operations. And only met Terrill in this city about 10 days ago. Marshall leaves Terrill before continuing to Hot Springs, and when he gets there the hotel manager will have a letter from Terrill, and will receive a telegram to the effect.

"I am a gambler and a drunkard, and I don't know where I am going to go. I have always been a member of Daniels."

Auto Leads to Arrest.

The arrest of Terrill came when Chief of Police Joe Wakelin and Detective Herbert Akery went to the cottage on Pleasant Street to investigate the ownership of a black, sleek automobile bearing a Kansas license, which the local officers had been asked to look out for. Neither Terrill nor Pittman were home when the officers arrived, and while the officials were questioning Mrs. Terrill and Mrs. Pittman the officers found a leather portfolio, which contained a full and complete set of burglar tools. The women were promptly placed under arrest. Before they could be taken to headquarters, Terrill and Pittman dove up the entrance of the house. Mrs. Terrill ran to the back door and gave the alarm. The men leaped from the car, Pittman going toward Grand Avenue, very shot engaged him, and he fled. Terrill kept on running and two shots fired at him, but he escaped their mark.

Terrill fled to the rear of a negro house, nearby, entered through the bathroom and went upstairs where he was fortunate in finding a suit of cloth that fit him. He changed clothes and even removed a small mustache he had worn. The negro woman heard a man walking up stairs and informed Constable John Young, who with county officers, had received a report of the shooting on Pleasant Street. Constable Young entered the house and found Terrill, who had since donned his coat and gone to the rear, standing in the kitchen. His revolver in his hand, Constable Young got the "doggie" out

Terrill, ordered him to throw up his hands on the floor, which he did. The constable then searched him and found a pistol in his pocket. Terrill was then taken to the station house, where he was held until the arrival of Sheriff Arthur H. Osborne, who had been summoned from Muskogee, Okla., to take charge of the investigation. Osborne, who had been to the scene of the shooting, and had been informed of the facts, ordered Terrill to stand up and told him he was under arrest. Terrill was then taken to the jail, where he was held until the arrival of Sheriff Osborne.

A search of the cottage the fugitive occupied revealed a large amount of material to his advantage brought to headquarters. Most interesting of all the exhibits, however, was the collection of firearms, which were four revolvers, two pistols, two pump guns and a six-shot shotgun, and every one of the weapons were loaded. The kit of burglar tools also, officers said, is the finest they have ever confiscated. There was one large box almost entirely filled with ammunition.

Terrill, fearing his escape and aware that the jury takes the officer's side in such cases, which often results in a conviction, had gone to Memphis, and was to appear in court.

Made Daring Proposition.

After Terrill had been briefly interviewed, he offered \$1,000 to Elizabeth Akery if she would permit him to sleep from the doorway window to the other bally, which Akery said,

Little information was given by the women. In answer to questions, Mrs. Pittman said: "You men have had my husband for a. He does all the talking for our family and I am not telling you anything."

Mrs. Terrill, however, took her husband's arrest to heart and burst into tears. She said she had married Terrill two years ago in Gallup, New Mexico, and was very devoted to him.

The men had over \$1,000 in cash on them when arrested, and cashed the amount of \$750, together with about 30 diamond rings, also gold taken from the women.

Terrill, it was learned, once was a prisoner in the Arkansas penitentiary. He made his escape while serving a sentence for burglary. Later he turned up in Lawrence County, Ohio, where he was convicted for robbing the First State Bank of Marquette, and sentenced to serve 10 years. While out on an appeal bond he again was arrested for burglary in Ardmore, imprisoned and escaped in January, 1935. Later he was arrested in Joplin, Mo., in connection with the robbery of the Bank of Joplin and while held transferred from the penitentiary at McAlester, where he had been 10 years, jumped from an automobile and has been at large just recently.

Late tonight the men who gave his name as A. V. Pittman, after viewing a picture in a circular sent out by Sheriff George A. Correll of Pine Bluff, Lonoke County, Ark., admitted that he was Elmer A. Pittman.

The circular asked for Pittman's arrest on the charge of having shot and killed Deputy Sheriff Arthur H. Osborne, the shooting taking place on the afternoon of Aug. 1, this year, 45 miles east of Cheyenne.

"That's me, all right; only the men are from a different state. They did want me for that one, but the crime has been cleared up and the men set straight out there, my name," was Pittman's statement.

Word from officials of Cheyenne, Okla., indicated officials from that place would come to Hot Springs in an effort to obtain possession of Terrill. It was anticipated to find the fallowing officers needed, possibly \$100 to be paid for Terrill's services. Terrill is also the man responsible for a diamond robbery in Kansas and Texas officials gather him to have him for an alleged bank robbery. In which, last night, he was involved.




