# Sen. Humphrey Backs Elected

Senator Hubert Humphrey, looking every bit the Presidential candidate, flew into town for almost two hours yesterday, and during that short period, managed to shake at least 30 hands at the airport, confer with local Democratic leaders, drink a toast at Government House and hold an abbreviated press conference overlooking the harbor at Bluebeard's Castle.

The Minnesota Democrat emphasized that he intended to have his party's platform

for you," Humphrey said at the press conference. "You don't get the same kind of dedication from an executive group (the Department of Interior) that you would from an elected legislative representative."

Talking with Government officials at Government House, Senator Humphrey commented that he was not only in favor of the proposed sea-water distillation plant for the Virgin Islands, but that "we should promote such water conversion plants on an international level.

"Atomic energy," he re-marked, "is part of the answer, and as a by-product, you would get drinking water. This conversian problem is one of universal importance now."

At the press conference the Senator also commented on:

Tax Incentives - "I wouldn't want it to develop into an escape hatch merely to avoid tax laws in the Virgin Islands. I will oppose the Mills bill but work with Senator Murray of Montana in support of his bill. Such would give tax incentives for economic development.\*

National Roads Act."I think it's a tragedy that the National Roads Act doesn't include the Virgin Islands. You are now on the threshhold of a tremendous economic push."

### 'Péople, Peace, Progress' Needed, Says Humphrey

CHRISTIANSTED, St. Croix, Virgin Islands, Dec. 1 — "America needs to clearly identify itself with People, Progress and Peace — this is the challenge and opportunity before us," Senator Hubert H. Humphrey told a Democratic Party rally here Tuesday night.

day night.
"Democracy is being t challenged all over the world. Our task is to continuously expand and invigorate our own processes of government and to make this great nation of ours a democratic showpiece for the uncommitted areas of the world.

"In this, the second half of the 20th century, power is best defined by the words People and Progress. The balance of power for either democracy or communism lies in the great population centers of Asia, Africa, and Latin America. The people of these vast areas demand progress. We dare not fail — our very freedom and survival require a victory for democratic values.

"We can be proud of our progress in recent years. Deeds are more impressive than words.

"Consider, for example, the former territories of Alaska and Hawaii. Their admission to state-hood, accomplished by the two most recent Democratic Congresses, has demonstrated to the (Continued on Page 6)

Bufiles contain a great deal of information concerning Senator Humphrey. In brief, it shows that the communists in Minneapolis worked very aggressively to elect Humphrey major of Minneapolis in 1945. At this time, he was closely connected with known communists and communist-infiltrated organizations, however, these associations obvicusly were for political purposes, and he apparently used the communists for his personal gain. Following his election as major, he appointed an FBI National Academy graduate as Superintendent of Police; and in February, 1947, a Communist Party functionary in Minneapolis stated that for the Party could no longer trust Humphrey. (62-26225-906) In later years, Humphrey led a fight to raige the communists from the Farmer-Labor Party and has been obsolved anticommunist. Shortly after being elected mayor of Minneapolis in 1945, Humphrey called on the Director to advise that he was desirous of giving Minneapolis a clean, vigorous administration, particularly in the field of law enforcement. Investigation conducted in Nov., 1949, at request

of Department of Labor, as delegate to the 3rd Session of Iron and Steel Committee of the International LabordOrganization in Geneva, Switzerland. (77-44669) In 10/50, Humphrey was the subject of a security investigation based on letter from Minneapolis citizen alleging he was a communist. Allegation not substantiated by investigation. Humphrey attended the FBI National Academy Graduation exercises 3/30/51. In April, 1956, in connection with Bertrand Russell's criticism of the Resemberg case, the "Congressional Record" published extensive remarks by Humphrey in support of the FBI and the Government's handling of the Rosenberg case. Humphrey has professed a high regard for the Director and the Bureau on a number of occasions in recent years. We thanked him for his remarks by 1tr dated 4/25/56. (62-77485) Director wrote Senator Humphrey on 6/26/57 in connectin with the accident involving the Senator's wife and daughter, wishing them a speedy recovery. According to the "Congressional Recof 1/31/58, Senator Humphrey introduced a bill to increase the personnel of the FBI and to require special training of such personnel in order to provide for effective investigation of civil rights cases. (66-1731-1437) Byltr dated 5/16/58, Humphrey wrote the Director in connection with an invitation for the Director to speak at a city-wide celebration of United Nations Day. Director replied by tr 5/21/58, expressing regret that he could not comply. (94-51355-4) The Director wrote him a letter of congratulations on his election to the Senate on 11/4/48. Nov 1958

#### A POSITIVE PROGRAM FOR ANTI-COMMUNISTS

Mr. HUMPHREY. Mr. President, I had brou lit to my attention recently a feature article in the Minneapolis Star, emittled "25 Do's and Don'ts: A Positive Program for Anti-Communists," pre-pared by William C. Sullivan, Assistant Director, reagal Bureau of Investiga-tion and officially given in a speech at the Lightand Park Methodist Church, Dalles, Tex.

The editor notes that because a number or requests for this article were recelved, and because of recent events, several readers with good memories suggosted to the Star that it reprint the article which was first printed on No-

vember 13, 1901.

I urge every American citizen to study the article carefully. Mr. Sullivan is to be commended for his constructive, thoughtful approach to the serious problem of combating communism in the United States. He does so in a most constructive, affirmative manner.

We must also guard against the tendency to characterize as Communists those who merely disagree with us or who advocate unorthodox or unpopular beliefs.

"When anyone is erroneously branded a Communist, it not only constitutes an injustice to the individual, but also helps communism by diffusing the strength of

6 Do not contribute to bigotry, intolerance, and hatred of fellow human beings. 7. Do not violate or infringe upon any

person's civil liberties.

8 Do not confuse the theological doctrine with political principles or attempt to make one serve the cause of the other.

9 Do not attribute all our social defects. difficulties, and setbacks to communism. Heaver emphasizes: "Attributing every adversity to communism is not only irrational. but contributes to hysteria and fosters grounciess fears."

10 Do not fall to oppose all individuals. regardless of their ideological posture, who would subvert our social principles and traditions. Totalitarianism in any form must be rejected.

7. Join proven local institutions or establish new organizations designed to improve and strengthen the community.

Participate in them regularly and effectively.

8. Fradicate the causes of communism in local communities. These include: (a) poverty, (b) disease, (c) illiteracy, (d) economic dislocation, (e) social injustices, (f) social discrimination, (g) political corrup-tion, (h) educational inadequacies, (l) psychological maladjustments, (1) philosophical materialism, (k) religious anemia, and (l) moral decadence, personal, and social.

9. Work steadily toward better relations between races, religions, and different social groups and between labor and management.

10. Encourage in one's local community original thinking, intellectual pioneering, and moral growth.

11. Contribute to a continuous community, beginning with oneself.

12. Stimulate cultural diversity, variety, and creativity, for the unity we seek is not uniformity.

13. Help to direct individual and community thinking into constructive action replete with social vision, because it is as true today as it was centuries ago when it was stated that where there is no vision the people perish.

14. Develop and hold forth as a community goal for the young and old alike self-disclpline, personal responsibility, dedication to worthy causes, loyalty to basic values, and a deep-rooted set of convictions in the inherent dignity and preciousness of every human being and the superiority of a free and open society in which every individual has an equal opportunity to achieve selfrealization.

15. Recognize that while there are both permanence and change in life, there is no fixed status quo; hence, our need to understand social transitions and to control and to direct these transitions in accordance with the spiritual and moral values of the Judeo-Christian tradition.
