



American Federation of Labor - Congress of Industrial Organizations, 429 Government Street, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, advised that Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey was to speak in Baton Rouge, Louisiana April 9, 1965 at 10:45 a.m. to the convention of the Louisiana American Federation of Labor-Congress of Industrial Organizations. The speech is to be given at the Jack Tar Capitol House Hotel, Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

advised that he believed that the Vice-President was to also speak at Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana on the afternoon of April 9, 1965 and then go to New Orleans, Louisiana for a speech in New Orleans that night.

stated that Governor John J. McKeithen, the State of Boulsiana, had asked Vice-President Humphrey to be his house guest for three or four days, however, he did not know if the Vice-President had accepted this





December, 1960, a group was organized at Shreveport, Louisiana, known as the Original Knights of the Ku Klux Klan (OKKKK). The purpose of this organization was to promote Americanism, white supremacy, and the maintaining of segregation.



According to general news information, there is to be a memorial centennial at Durnam, North Carolina, on April 25, 1965, marking the ending of the Civil War in the Durham, North Carolina, vicinity. The celebration will take place at the Bennett Memorial which is located on Old Highway 70 a short distance west of the City of Durham. North Carolina.

In Durham, North Carolina, is the property of the activities of the Bennett Place in Durham. Vice President of the United States Hubert Humphrey, has been invited to speak at this Civil War Centennial in Durham. He is to appear at Duke University in Durham, North Carolina, on April 24, 1965, sponsored by the Duke Law School student body and subsequently is to speak on April 25, 1965, at the Bennett Place Memorial.



APPENDIX

UNITED KLANS OF AMERICA, INC. KNIGHTS OF THE KU KLUX KLAN (UNITED KLANS)

Records of Superior Court of Fulton County, Georgia, show that this Klan organization was granted a corporate charter on February 21, 1961, at Atlanta, Georgia, under the name United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc.

that United Klans was formed as a result of a split in U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, Inc. According to the source, the split resulted from a leadership dispute, and United Klans has the same aims and objectives as the parent group. These are the promotion of Americanism, white supremacy, and segregation of the races.

that United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., merged with Alabama Knights, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. The merged organization established headquarters in Suite 401, The Alston Building. Tuscaloosa, Alabama. The organization is directed and is the dominant Klan group in the South with units in several southern states.

On advised that the organization formerly known as United Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan of America, Inc., would be known in the future as United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan. said the name was changed by a resolution adopted at the National Klonvocation held July 8, 1961, at Indian Springs, Georgia.

a majority or the Klaverns of the U. S. Klans, Knights of the Ku Klux Klan, merged with the United Klans of America, Inc., Knights of the Ku Klux Klan.

The organization in North Carolina has the same aims and objectives as the parent group; that is, advocacy of segregation of the races and white supremacy.







NATION OF ISLAM, formerly referred to as the Muslim Cult of Islam, also known as Muhammad's Temples of Islam

NATION OF ISLAM

In a source advised Elijah Muhammad has described his organization on a nationwide basis as the "Nation of Islam" (NOI) and "Muhammad's Temples of Islam".

On advised Elijah Muhammad is the national leader of the NOI; Muhammad's Temple of Islam No. 2, 5335 South Greenwood Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, is the national headquarters of the NOI; and in mid-1960, Muhammad and other NOI officilas, when referring to Muhammad's organization on a nationwide basis, commenced using either "Mosque" or "Temple" when mentioning one of "Muhammad's Temples of Islam."

The NOI is an all-Negro organization which was originally organized in 1930 in Detroit, Michigan. Muhammad claims to have been selected by Allah, the Supreme Being, to lead the so-called Negro race out of salvery in the wilderness of North America by establishing an independent black nation in the United States. Members following Muhammad's teachings and his interpretation of the "Koran" believe there is no such thing as a Negro; that the so-called Negroes are slaves of the white race, referred to as "white devils," in the United States; and that the white race, because of its exploitation of the so-called Negroes, must and will be destroyed in the approaching "War of Armageddon."

In the past, officials and members of the NOI, including Muhammad, have refused to register under the provisions of the Selective Service Acts and have declared that members owe no allegiance to the United States.

On advised Muhammad had, upon advice of legal counsel, tempered his personal statements and instructions to his ministers concerning the principles of his organization in order to avoid possible prosecution by the United States Government; however, he did not indicate any fundamental changes in the teachings of his organization.

On advised Muhammad had, early in July, 1958, decided to de-emphasize the religious aspects of the teachings of Islam and to stress the economic benefits to be derived by those Negroes who joined the NOI. This policy change, according to Muhammad, would help him acquire additional followers and create more interest in his programs.





On March 29, 1965, at approximately 6:15 p.m., a group of approximately 100 men, women, and children started picketing in front of the Civic Center, Baltimore, Maryland, where the Democratic Fund-Raising Dinner at which Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey appeared, was being held. This group picketed in an orderly manner until 7:50 p.m. They carried signs and passed out flyers reflecting that they represented the Baltimore Committee for a SANE Nuclear Policy. The flyers and signs proclaimed welcome to Vice President Humphrey from "Baltimore Supporters and Friends," and stated, "We are here to ask you to act for Americans, to use your influence to end the war in Vietnam!"

This group 'also had a truck with sound equipment and signs which circled the Civic Center proclaiming a similar message. Some of the people picketing with this group were dressed in evening clothes and were apparently going to attend the dinner.

"The Sun," a Baltimore morning newspaper, on March 30, 1965, reflected that among this group were several prominent civic leaders who paraded in their evening clothes and then went inside the Civic Center for the dinner. "The Sun" stated that the Paltimore Committee for a SANE Nuclear Policy set up a "friendly" demonstration line to protest the Administration sforeign policy in South Vietnam. This group was entirely orderly and there were no incidents or arrests in connection with this group.

Vote in Selma, Alabama and South Vietnam. The flyers said that the Vietnamese people wish to live in peace and freedom and for 25 years they have been fighting against the imperialism of Japan, France and the United States. It said that the United States Air Force is even now frying Vietnamese families to death in clear violation of international law. The flyer also said in Dixia, U.S.A. Negro and white freedom fighters are being bull-whipped, clubbed, gassed and murdered. The flyers demanded that the United States pull out of Vietnam immediately and that the United States Constitution be enforced in Dixie immediately. Two members of the group threw a 25 pound bag of sheep manure compost in the lobby of the Civic Center and shouted, "This symbolizes what we think of Johnson's foreign policy." These individuals, who were a man and a woman, were promptly arrested by the Baltimore Police and were charged with disorderly conduct.

YOUNG SOCIALIST ALLIANCE

The May, 1960, issue of the "Young Socialist" (YS), page 1, column 3, disclosed that during April 15-17, 1960, a national organization entitled "The Young Socialist Alliance" (YSA) was established at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. This issue stated that this organization was formed by the nationwide supporter clubs of the publication YS.

The above issue, page 6, set forth the Founding Declaration of YSA. This declaration stated that the YSA recognizes the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) as the only existing political leadership on class struggle principles, and that the supporters of the YS have come into basic political solidarity with the SWP on the principles of revolutionary socialism.

A scurce advised on that the original YSA was an organization formed during October, 1957, in New York City by youth of various left socialist tendencies, particularly members and followers of the SWP. The leaders of this group wore the guiding forces in the establishment of the national organization.

The source further advised on that the YSA is dominated and controlled on a national basis by the SWP through having SWP members comprise exclusively the National Executive Committee (NEC) and through an official SWP representative at all YSA NEC meetings. The YSA, in reality, is the youth and training section of the SWP and the main source of new SWP members.

The headquarters of the YSA are located in Room 631, 41 Union Square West, New York City.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

With reference to Mr. DeLoach's memorandum to Mr. Mohr dated 2-9-65 noting the Vice President had indicated that he desired to see the Director within the near future and discuss matters of security and civil rights, the following information concerning the Vice President's staff is set forth for the Director's information.

100

Requests for full field investigations in connection with fifteen individuals assigned to the Vice President's staff have been received up to the present time and summaries have been forwarded to the White House on all of these cases. Two additional requests were received 1-27-65 and these cases are currently being investigated. Security Investigation Data For Sensitive Position sheets, Form 86 (background data), have been received on ten additional individuals but requests have not been received for investigation of these persons up to the present time. There is attached a list of all of these individuals.

In connection with the Vice President's staff, it is our understanding that the only requests for investigations received to date are in connection with those persons who will have access to the White House. It is not believed this meets the criteria which has been set by the President for the White House personnel. In this connection, we are currently receiving requests and conducting investigations on all of the civilian personnel in the White House and have already forwarded 389 summaries setting forth results of these investigations. Inasmuch as it is believed that all members of the Vice President's staff will have access at least to a limited degree of highly classified information, it is felt that the same rules adopted by the President with regard to the White House


