Yesterday afternoon, j contacted my office and advised that "Fortune" magazine is currently preparing an article on the Vice President. said that research on this project included an examination of the recent biography of the Vice President which was written by Winthrop Griffith. Griffith worked on Mr. Humphrey's Senate staff for about four years. Miss Robertson said that in discussing Humphrey's service as Mayor of Minneapolis. Griffith states on page 125 of his biography that "The FBI gave Humphrey its top award for effective municipal law enforcement." She said she was unaware the FBI ever gave such an award and wanted to know whether or not this was a true statement on the part of Griffith. said if it is not true it will not be included in 'Fortune's' article; however, if it is a valid statement it will be used. She asked that she be advised as to the Bureau's wishes as quickly as possible and said that she can be reached in New York City

A review of Bureau files pertinent to the period failed to disclose any information indicating any such award was ever given by the Director to Mr. Humphrey. It is noted, however, that on September 21, 1945, Mr. Humphrey met with the Director following his election as Mayor of Minneapolis. He told Mr. Hoover that he was particularly desirous of giving that city a clean vigorous administration particularly in the field of law enforcement. He said that he had appointed as Superintendent of Police a National Academy graduate, Edward Ryan. The Director told Mr. Humphrey that he was acquainted with Ryan and he believed he would be an honest and efficient executive.

Mr. Humphrey urged the Director at that time to come to Minneapolis in the near future to see whether there had been an improvement in the local situation with respect to law enforcement. He said he hoped Mr. Hoover would find there had been improvements and would feel free to make some comment concerning this. The Director said his commitments were very heavy but he would keep the invitation in mind.

Bureau files also indicate that the Director met Mr. Humphrey in January, 1947, on a train en route to New York City, however, there is no indication that any commendation of the type in question was given Mr. Humphrey at that time.

OBSERVATION:

Apparently Mr. Griffith is in error in his statement concerning an FBI award for Mr. Humphrey. In view of statement that she did not wish to use this information unless it was verified by the FBI, it is felt we should tactfully advise her we believe it would be better to leave it out.

RECOMMENDATION:

That I be permitted to contact and tactfully advise her we prefer she not use this statement in the article.






