On September 9. 1965, dvised that at approximately 11:40 AM this date, he received an anonymous call. This call was from a male, and the voice was heavy and muffled. The caller stated, "Listen. I'm only gdng to say this once so get it straight. Humphrey is going to be shot." The caller $b \gamma c$ then immediately hung up.

immediately telephonically contacted in charge of the detail of local officers at the Moline, Illinois airport, and also contacted nited States Secret Service, at the Moline Airport, advising them of the receipt of this anonymous call and threat.

The Vice-President's plane arrived at the Moline, Illinois airport at 2:05 PM, and the Vice-President departed at 2:15 PM in a plane for Wilton Junction, Iowa. Vice-President Humphrey arrived back at the Moline Airport at 4:25 PM this date and departed at 4:58 PM. No incidents occurred.

tional meeting of the Lares Board was called by independentist attorney CARLOS CARRERA BENITEZ and was held on August 22, 1962, at the Darlington Hotel in Rio Piedras, Puerto Rico, with the six major pro-independence organizations, including the PARTIDO COMUNISTA PUERTORRICUENO (Communist Party of Puerto Rico) (PCP) and the NATIONALIST PARTY OF PUERTO RICO (NPPR), in attendance. At this meeting the Lares Board was actually established as a permanent body to coordinate the efforts of the independence groups, its immediate purpose to begin a program of activities opposing the plebiscite recently proposed by Puerto Rico Governor LUIS MUNOZ MARIN to establish a permanent political status for Puerto Rico.

the Lares Board is composed of a President, a Secretary General, two delegates from each of the member groups, and seven delegates at large. Each member group is to retain its own organizational identity and the Lares Board is to function as a coordinating body in matters of mutual agreement. No headquarters was established.



On this date the Puerto Rican group established momentary control of Puerto Rico. This date has a special significance for the NPPR, inasmuch as a main thesis of NPPR doctrine is the claim that Puerto Risovereignty was actually established on September 23, 1868, with the rebellion at Lares. The large NPPR celebration on September 23 of each year is concentrated at Lares.

The MPIPR was organized November 23, 1959, at Ponce, Puerto Rico, according to its first Secretary General, JUAN MARI BRAS, for the avowed purpose of working for the independence of Puerto Rico. It was stated that the organization did not advocate violence but would accept anyone who believed in Puerto Rican independence regardless of his beliefs as to the use of violence provided he agreed with the MPIPR Declaration of Principles.

Since its inception, the MPIPR has had as its leader and guiding force JUAN MARI BRAS who, speaking on behalf of himself and the organization, said the MPIPR does not advocate violence as a means of obtaining independence for Puerto Rico only because he felt violence would be ineffective against the power of the United States Government. He stated that he believed in the right of the Puerto Rican people to use violence to obtain their freedom if and when the circumstances were such that they could possibly be successful in their efforts.


the MPIPR Secretary of Youth, BENJAMIN ORTIZ BELAVAL, stated that although the use of arms and violence is not presently advantageous to the Puerto Rican independence movement, the right would be reserved to use arms and violence in the future.

The MPIPR has missions throughout the Island of Puerto Rico and in New York, New York; Chicago, Illinois; and Buffalo, New York. It has an estimated membership of between 1,000 and 1,300 persons according to Police of Puerto Rico.

Since its inception, MPIPR and its leaders have frequently expressed sympathy for the communist revolution in Cuba and with the Castro Government in Cuba.





The "Natio Guardian," " weekly New York, New 10, k newspaper, in its issue of January 9, 1965, carried an article captioned, "SDS Calls April 17 Demonstration in Washington," in which it was indicated the SDS would sponsor a "Student March on Washington," April 17" (1965) to demand an end to United States intervention in the Vietnam war. The article continued that the SDS constitution describes it as a group of "liberals and radicals, activists and scholars, students and faculty," united to work toward a society in which "the people have control of the decisions that affect them and the resources on which they are dependent." The article continued the "SDS, in recent years, has moved away from a sectarian approach and toward the new left.

The "National Guardian" is characterized in the appendix.

On October 21, 1965, a representative of the Security Section, The Boeing Company, Seattle, advised dedicatory activities will extend throughout the day on October 30, 1965. Vice President HUMPHREY is scheduled to arrive at the Kent Space Laboratory about 10:10 AM, begin his dedicatory remarks about 10:40 AM, and will leave the area about 11:20 AM, en route to downtown Seattle for a luncheon.





Humphrey when he visits New Haven. Thursday (October 21, 1965) for the first of a series of regional seminars on urban problems, federal and local officials disclosed Tuesday. The Vice-President will conduct the conference for New England mayors at the Jewish Community Center, 1162 Chapel Street, at 12:30 PM. After the three hour meeting, Humphrey will attend a reception given by Mayor Richard C. Lee at the Yale Art and Architecture Building." This article also set forth, "A group of Yale students is planning to demonstrate in favor of U.S. foreign policy when Humphrey is here, it was announced Tuesday. 

On October 21, 1965, Special Agents of the FBI observed a number of individuals distributing, between 12 Noon and 1:15 PM, in front of the Jewish Community Center, a leaflet entitled, "What The War in Vietnam Means", issued by the NHYCPV, which leaflet is critical of United States policy in Viet Nam and calls for recipients of the leaflet to send postcards directed to Congressman CANIMO calling for him to hold open hearings in New Haven, Connecticut, on the war in Vietnam.

These individuals were also observed to distribute the above mentioned postcard and the distribution of the leaflet and postcards terminated prior to the arrival of Vice-President HUMPHREY at the Jewish Community Center.

On October 21, 1965, Special Agents of the FBI observed and several other individuals arrive in the vicinity of the Jewish Community Center at 2:05 PM, whereupon they informed an officer of the New Haven Police Department that they planned to conduct a "peace picket line" in the vicinity of the Jewish Community Center. and these individuals were observed to return at 2:25 PM, at which time they commenced a picket line on the sidewalk in front of the Midtown Motor Inn, which is directly across the street from the Jewish Community Center, which picket line they conducted until 5 PM. These individuals were observed to carry placards, all identified as being placards of the "W. E. B. Du Bois Club" and on which appeared the following slogans:

"Get The Troops Out of Vietnam"
"President Johnson" (surname inverted)
"American Bombs Kill Women and Children"
"Real Patriots Fight Only for Peace"
"Yanqui, Fuera de Vietnam"

Humphrey told 200 New England mayors here Thursday that 'creative federalism'—a partnership between federal and local government—can supply answers to many problems facing the nation's cities. the first in a series of seminars on urban and rural problems. Speaking in New Haven he said, 'This community represents one of the best, if not the best, examples of creative federalism in America'. The seminar was held at the New Haven Jewish Community Center. Also here from Washington were a number of top federal officials including Secretary of Commerce JOHN T. CONNOR and WILLIAM L. SLAYTON, Head of the Urban Renewal Administration. Following the two hour meeting HUMPHREY was the guest of honor at a reception at the Yale Art and Architecture Building. He then left for Tweed-New Haven Airport where he took off for Syracuse, New York, at 6:05 PM."

This article also set forth, "While Humphrey was speaking at the conference, the Jewish Center was picketed by several members of the Bridgeport Chapter of the W. E. B. Du Bois Club. They carried signs protesting the war in Vietnam, including such slogans as 'American Bombs Kill Women and Children'. On the Yale campus, meanwhile, some four hundred persons gathered in front of the Beinecke Rare Book and Memorial Library, to protest civil disobedience as a means of protest against the war."

New Haven-Yale Committee for Peace in Vietnam distributed a leaflet in April 1965, announcing that the Committee had been formed on February 25, 1965, by a group of students and faculty at Yale University, New Haven, Connecticut, and New Haven townspecple who protested the United States bombins of North Vietnam. According to the leaflet, the committee protested United States escalation of the war in Vietnam and called for the negotiation for the immediate withdrawal of United States troops from Vietnam.

These delegates were also told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

A second conference of over 20 persons met in Chicago on December 28-29, 1963, for the purpose of initiating a "call" to the new youth organization and planning for a founding convention to be held in June, 1964.

that the Founding Convention for the new youth organization was held during the period of June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to the constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful co-existence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and right wing forces



in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anti-communism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people. As young people in the forces struggling for democracy, we shall actively strive to defeat these reactionary and neo-fascist elements and to achieve complete freedom and democracy for all Americans, thus enabling each individual to freely choose and build the society he would wish to live in. Through these struggles we feel the American people will realize the viability of the socialist alternatives."




