My dear Mr. Vice President:

It gives me great pleasure to invite you to deliver an address at the graduation exercises of the 77th Session of the FBI National Academy at 10:30 a.m., Wednesday, May 25, 1966. The ceremonies, which will be attended by approximately 1,500 persons, will be held in the Departmental Auditorium located on Constitution Avenue between 12th and 14th Streets, Northwest, Washington, D. C.

Since the FBI National Academy was established by this Bureau in July, 1935, over 4,800 law enforcement officers have been trained as police instructors and police executives. In recent years we have included law enforcement representatives from friendly nations outside the United States. We anticipate having 100 officers attend the 77th Session with 14 coming from foreign countries and 1 from the Virgin Islands.

We would consider it a distinct honor if you could address these graduates as they prepare to return to their own departments. We hope you will be able to be with us on May 25, and I will be pleased to furnish any additional information concerning the National Academy which you might like to have.



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

The February 3, 1966, edition of "The Spectator," on page 1, contained an article captioned, "Anti-Commie Campaign Started." That article, written by Tom Seslar, began by stating that 'John K. Madden, 31 E. Town Street, has launched a campaign to rid Columbus of 'left-wing Extremists.'" According to the article, Madden told "The Spectator" during the week that his prime target was the Spartacist Party, "a group which recently opened an office and mailing headquarters at 1508 Summit St."

The article noted Madden already had sent letters to President Lyndon B. Johnson, Governor James A. Rhodes, Mayor M. E. Sensenbrenner, and many newspapers. The article then quoted Madden as stating, "'Now I want to bring together people and money for an opposition campaign to run the Spartacists out of the state. If somebody doesn't do something quick, these people are going to ruin the American way of life.'"

The article declared that Madden belived the Spartacists' basic goal was to create turmoil on the Ohio State University campus and he accused university officials of being lax in dealing with students who were members of the organization. The article then quoted Madden as follows: "'I was in the U. S. Marines during the Korean War. I know what America stands for, and I think it is disgusting that we allow Communists to operate in our own back yards while Americans are fighting on the other side of the world.'"

PROGRESSIVE LABOR PARTY (PLP) PROGRESSIVE LABOR MOVEMENT (PLM)

that the PLP. formerly known as the PLM, held its first national convention April 15-18, 1965, at New York City, to organize the PLM into a PLP. The PLP will have as its ultimate objective the establishment of a militant working class movement based on Marxism-Leninism.

"The New York Times," City Edition, Tuesday, April 20, 1965, page 27, reported that a new party of "revolutionary socialism" was formally founded on April 18, 1965, under the name of the PLP. The PLP was described as an outgrowth of the PLM. Its officers were identified as Milton Rosen, New York, President, and William Epton of New York and Mort Scheer of San Francisco, Vice Presidents. A 20-member National Committee was elected to direct the party until the next convention.

According to the article, "The Progressive Labor Movement was founded in 1962 by Mr. Rosen and Mr. Scheer after they were expelled from the Communist Party of the United States for assertedly following the Chinese Communist line."

The PLP publishes the "Marxist-Leninist Quarterly." a theoretical magazine; "Progressive Labor." a monthly magazine; "Challenge," a New York City newspaper; and "Spark," a west coast newspaper.

The June 1, 1965, issue of "Challenge," page 6, states that, "this paper is dedicated to fight for a new way of life - where the working men and women own and control their homes, factories, the police, courts, and the entire government on every level."

#### REVOLUTIONARY COMMITTEE OF THE FOURTH INTERNATIONAL

that the Revolutionary Committee of the Fourth International (RCFI) was also known as the Spartacist Committee and the Spartacist Group. This source described the RCFI as being composed of former members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWD) who had solit from the SWP and who were led by that this political unit has its main center in New York City, where it publishes "Spartacist" on a very irregular basis, but their formal meetings are held at least once a week.

Farrell Dobbs, National Secretary of the SWP, sent a letter to all EWP branches in February, 1964, in which he advised that the expelled leader of a minority faction of the SNP, announced on February 10, 1964, that his faction would publicly criticize the SWP and had followed this with a public organ called "Spartacist" in which they attacked the SWP.

The July-August, 1964, issue of "Spartacist," in its masthead described this publication as follows: "... published bi-monthly by supporters of the Revolutionary Tendency expelled from the Socialist Workers Party." This masthead sets forth that the editor of the publication is James Robertson, and its main address is Post Office Box 1377. General Post Office, New York, New York.



On the evening of April 29, 1966, between approximately 6:15 p.m. and approximately 8:40 p.m., a group of pickets, varying in size at times from seven to a maximum of 15 individuals, picketing outside the Atlanta Americana Motor Hotel, at the corner of Spring Street and Carnegie Way, protesting the United States commitment in Viet Nam. During the time the picketing was being conducted, Vice President Hubert Humphrey was present in the Atlanta Americana Motor Hotel for the purpose of delivering a speech to the DeKalb County Education Association.





He revoked a previously enacted land reform program. He was hated by the Buddhist majority of his fellow countrymen. Senator Frank Church of Idaho, Congressional Record, David Halberstam, New York Times Foreign Correspondent and Phillippe Devillers, noted French foreign correspondent, both quoted in Gettleman, VIETNAM, a 95¢ Fawcett paperback.



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


SDS was formed by a group of 200 students at a meeting in Port Huron, Michigan in 1962. It is a militant - socialist oriented youth organization which has adopted a policy of non-exclusion of subversives. The SDS currently claims a membership in excess of 3,000 in some 90 chapters throughout the United States.

At approximately 7:30 p.m. on May 17, 1966, about 50 persons, male and female, predominately white, started picketing in front of the Baltimore Civic Center, carrying signs denouncing United States intervention in Vietnam, the military draft and name signs also contained unflattering statements concerning Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY. The picketing continued until approximately 9:50 p.m. During the course of the picketing, the demonstrators sang songs and shouted from time to time; however, the picketing was otherwise peaceful and there were no incidents and no arrests during the demonstration.

Several individuals associated with the demonstrators passed out a flyer entitled, "HUBERT HUMPHREY - Liberalism and the War in Vietnam" which was signed "Johns Hopkins Students for a Democratic Society (SDS)." This flyer attacked the reputation of Vice President HUMPHREY as a major "Liberal" figure and stated that if the Administration and Vice President HUMPHREY represent American liberalism, "Then we reject it."

A Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation witnessed portions of this demonstration.






