



UNC, both Chapel Hill, North Carolina, were advised of the above described contemplated activities on the part of SDS.

At 9:40 A. M., February 23, 1967, United States Secret Service, Charlotte, North Carolina, was advised of the proposed picketing of Vice President HUMPHREY by SDS on March 1, 1967.

The February 23, 1967, issue of the "Charlotte Observer", a Charlotte, North Carolina, daily newspaper, carried an article on Page 6A reflecting a statement by SDS leader GARY WALLER, stating that his group would picket Vice President HUMPHREY in Chapel Hill on March 1, 1967. WALLER emphasized however that "We don't want any violence, we don't expect any, hobody wants to get arrested. We just want to give people a chance to express themselves."



United States District Judge Herbert W. Christenberry, Eastern District of Louisiana, New Orleans, made available to Assistant Special Agent in Charge Joseph T. Sylvester of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, New Orleans, Louisiana, a letter received by him from the Clerk of U. S. District Court, New Orleans, Louisiana. This letter had been forwarded in a sealed envelope by the Chief of Classification - Parole, United States Penitentiary, Terre Haute, Indiana, with an explanation that the letter had been placed in the prisoners' mail box for forwarding Judge Christenberry furnished a copy of the letter from the Chief of Classification - Parole. It reflects that the letter placed in the prisoners' mail box had not been opened nor inspected by the penitentiary personnel.

The letter enclosed with the above correspondence was in an envelope bearing return address, Terre Haute, 47808 Official Business." This envelope was addressed by handprinting to "Herbert W. Christenberry, United States District Judge, Room 400 - 400 Royal Street, New Orleans, Louisiana 70130."



Reference is made to letterhead memorandum at Charlotte, North Carolina, dated February 24, 1967.

The February 25, 1967, issue of "The Daily Tar Heel," a University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, North Carolina, student newspaper, carried an article captioned "HHH Reschedules Panel for Tuesday." This article reflected that Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY had rearranged his schedule and would appear on a Carolina Forum panel at the University of North Carolina on Tuesday, February 28, 1967. According to this article. GARY WALLER, spokesman for the campus chapter of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS), a group highly critical of present American involvement in Vietnam, said, "We'll be there to welcome him." This group had previously announced that it intended to picket the Vice President.

On February 28, 1967, University of North Carolina (UNC), Chapel Hill, North Carolina, advised that there had been a change of plans and that Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY had changed the date of his speech at UNC from March 1, 1967, to February 28. 1967.

advised that Vice President HUMPHREY 570 spoke at Memorial Hall, UNC, from 3 P. M. to about 4:10 P. M. February 28, 1967, before an audience of approximately 3000. At the time of his entrance into Memorial Hall and subsequent to his speech, there were about 57 pickets on the outside of Memorial Hall carrying various signs which generally protested American involvement in the Vietnam war. These demonstrators as well as the audience inside of Memorial Hall were peaceful, and there was no shouting or incidents of any kind.

The March 1, 1967, issue of the "Charlotte Observer," a Charlotte, North Carolina, daily newspaper, carried an article on page one captioned, "Humphrey Gets N. C. Glad Hand." This article reflected that Vice President HUBERT HUMPHREY was warmly received when he spoke at UNC on February 28, 1967. It stated that the only discordant note came at UNC's Memorial Hall, when anti-Vietnam war pickets met HUMPHREY with signs like "Shame on you, Hubert," "Build Not Burn," "Hubie is a murderer of Vietnamese Children," and "Would napalm convert you to democracy?". According to this article, the protesters seemed a small minority.

Attached concerns activities of demonstrators when the Vice President spoke at Stanford University. Subsequently, information was received that two persons did approach a follow-up car and were pushed away by Secret Service Agents. The Vice President's car was not involved. One Secret Service Agent had urine thrown on him by an unidentified person in the crowd.

Yesterday afternoon, the Vice President spoke at the Civic Auditorium, San Francisco. About 70 anti-Vietnam demonstrators appeared outside the auditorium. They were lead in chants by two individuals who had been publicly identified as being associated with the Progressive Labor Party, the pro-Red Chinese Marxist organization.

The above information and the information in the attached was furnished by teletype to the White House, Secretary of State, Central Intelligence Agency, the military intelligence agencies and the Secret Service. It will also be given to the Acting Stroney Semeral.





The SDS is an association of young people on the left and has a current program of protesting the draft, promoting a campaign for youth to develpe a conscientious objector status, denouncing United States intervention in the war in Vietnma and to "radically transform" the university community, and provide for its complete control by students. Gus Hall, General Secretary, Communist Farty, USA, when interviewed by a representative of United Press International in San Francisco, California, on May 14, 1965, described the SDS as a part of the "responsible left" which the Farty has going for us." At the June, 1965, SDS National Convention, an anticommunist proviso was removed from the SPS constitution. In the October 7, 1966, issue of "New Left Motes," the official publication of SDS, an SDS spokesman stated that there are some communists in SDS and they are welcome. The national headquarters of this organization as of April 18, 1967, was located in Room 206, 1608 West Madison Street, Chicago, Illinois.

CCSA IS COMPOSED OF VARIOUS PEACE, STUDENT, AND CIVIL RIGHTS ORGANIZATIONS IN SAN DIEGO IN WHICH COMMUNIST PARTY HAS TAKEN AN ACTIVE PART SINCE ITS INCEPTION.

SECRET SERVICE ALSO HAS UNCONFIRMED RUMOR OF PICKETING DURING HUMPHREY'S BREAKFAST, MAY TWO, NINETEEN SIXTY SEVEN, BUT HAS NO SPECIFIC INFORMATION CONCERNING ANY BREAKFAST ENGAGEMENT OR TALK BY HUMPHREY.

APPROPRIATE LAW ENFORCEMENT AND APPROPRIATE MILITARY INTELLIGENCE AGENCIES NOTIFIED RE PICKETING. INFORMANTS AND SOURCES CONTACTED AND ASSIGNED TO TASK TO PROMPLY FURNISH INFORMATION CONCERNING DEMONSTRATION AND DISTURBANCES. CLOSE LIAISON MAINTAINED AND COOPERATIVE SERVICES BEING AFFORDED SECRET SERVICE.

As the Bureau is undoubtedly aware, Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY is scheduled to be the main speaker before the Pillars of Freedom group in the Community Concourse in San Diego on 5-2-67. He is one of several speakers selected and, in connection with his visit, certain plans and security measures are being taken by the local Secret Service as well as members from Washington, D. C.

Service, Washington, D. C., appeared at the office and furnished a tentative itinerary for Mr. HUMPHREY. As it stands now, he is scheduled to arrive at San Diego at approximately 10:00 p.m. 5-1-67 and will be housed at the Del Coronado Hotel, Coronado, California. He is scheduled to make his speech at noon on Tuesday, 5-2-67, and follow this with another appearance at the Miramar Naval Air Station, Miramar, California (a suburb of San Diego) and will then depart at approximately 3:30 p.m. the same date.



"Forced to remain in Washington, D. C., to cast a possibly tie-breaking vote in the U.S. Senate, Vice President Humphrey today will give the Kiwanis Club a major policy speech by telephone.

"The vice president had been scheduled for four appearances in the San Diego area today.

"All but the Kiwanis Club Pillars of Freedom address were canceled."

#### COORDINATING COUNCIL FOR SOCIAL ACTION
