The Vice President will speak to students during the afternoon of May 13, 1967, and answer questions of the students. The student meeting is open to the public. No demonstrations are expected by the University.

After the student meeting, the Vice President will attend a reception at the Elk's Club in Fargo and during the evening, he will speak at a testimonial dinner for Governor William L. Guy at the Fargo Memorial Auditorium.

No disturbances occurred in connection with the visit of Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey at Fargo, North Dakota, May 13, 1967. A few persons carrying placards bearing anti-Vietnam war slogans were present during some activities attended by the Vice President. Also, there were persons who carried placards bearing slogans voicing agreement with the United States policy pertaining to Vietnam.

There were no placard carriers at the airport when the Vice President arrived in Fargo, North Dakota, at about 2:30 p.m. on May 13, 1967, although several thousand persons were present.

At North Dakota State University, Fargo, North Dakota, where the Vice President spoke and answered questions of students during the afternoon, approximately twenty persons carrying anti-Vietnam war placards, along with about twenty persons carrying pro-Vietnam war signs, lined the campus street traveled by the Vice President's motorcade. After he had passed the group, the signs were put away. There were no incidents in connection with the address in the University fieldhouse when the Vice President answered questions from the students.

Three persons carried anti-Vietnam war placards for a short time outside of the Fargo Memorial Auditorium building while the Vice President attended a testimonial dinner inside for North Dakota Governor William L. Guy during the evening.

The Vice President left Fargo, North Dakota, at 10:45 p.m. May 13, 1967.

conference of members of the Communist Party (CP), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W. E. B. DuBois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention. The aims of this organization, as set forth in the preamble to its constitution, are: "It is our belief that this nation can best solve its problems in an atmosphere of peaceful coexistence, complete disarmament and true freedom for all peoples of the world, and that these solutions will be reached mainly through the united efforts of all democratic elements in our country, composed essentially of the working people allied in the unity of Negroes and other minorities with whites. We further fully recognize that the greatest threat to American democracy comes from the racist and rightwing forces in coalition with the most reactionary sections of the economic power structure, using the tool of anticommunism to divide and destroy the unified struggle of the working people."

Over the Labor Day weekend, 1965, the DCA held a conference in Chicago, Illinois, and a new slate of officers was elected to the National Executive Committee (NEC) of the DCA. Since Labor Day, 1965, identities of those serving on the NEC has varied; however, according to a third source, as of May, 1966, thirteen of the fifteen members of the NEC were members of the CP in the San Francisco Bay area.

As of July, 1966, the headquarters of the DCA was located at 180 North Wacker Drive, Chicago, Illinois.

THE REVOLUTIONARY COMMITTEE OF THE FOURTH INTERNATIONAL

Revolutionary Committee of the Fourth International (RCFI) was also known as the Spartacist Committee and the Spartacist Group. This source described the RCFI as being composed of former members of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP), who had split from the SWF and who were led by ** ROBERTSON.** Lated that this political unit has its main center in New York City, where it publishes "Spartacist" on a very irregular basis, but their formal meetings are held at least once a week.

FARRELL DOBES, National Secretary of the SWP, sent a letter to all SWP branches in February, 1964, in which he advised that the expelled leader of a minority faction of the SWP, JAMES ROBERTSON, announced on February 10, 1964, that his faction would publicly criticize the SWP and had followed this with a public organ called "Spartacist" in which they attacked the SWP.

The July-August, 1964, issue of "Spartacist" in its masthead describes this publication as follows:

"... published bi-monthly by supporters of the Revolutionary Tendency expelled from the Socialist Workers Party."

This masthead sets forth that the editor of the publication is JAMES ROBERTSON, and its main address is Post Office Box 1377, General Post Office, New York, New York.

The SWP has been designated pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Now we'll sit for a while and then go home."

The July 28, 1967 edition of the Boston Globe, a daily newspaper published in Boston, Massachusetts, contained an article by Gloria Negri, staff reporter, quoted Albert Szent Gyorgyi, a Nobel Prize Winner, as saying, "The Government must talk to the people and make peace in Vietnam. This Government doesn't want to make peace. It just wants to destroy the people."

Humphrey arrived at Carswell Air Force Pase at 2:38 PM that date and was escorted with his party directly to the Texas Hotel in downtown Fort Worth where he spoke to the AFL-CIO Convention. Following his speech, Vice President Humphrey was escorted to Carswell Air Force Base and departed at 6:49 PM en route to Hilo, Hawaii.

President Habert H. Humphrey spoke before representatives of the AFL-CIO, holding their convention at the Texas Hotel in Fort Worth, Texas, on that date. Stated that no demonstration was staged nor were there any incidents during the Vice President's visit to Fort Worth on that date.

I just received a call from ASAC Larson of the Philadelphia Office stating he had had a telephone request from an individual identifying himself as an assistant to Vice President Humphrey who pointed out that the Vice President is scheduled to deliver a speech in Philadelphia tomorrow, 10-24-67, and wanted to have the speech sent to Philadelphia over Bureau teletype facilities.

In my memo to you of 10-10-66 I pointed out that a similar request had been made by an assistant of Vice President Humphrey's through the telephone company in Boston and I recommended at that time, and the Director approved, that he be told that since the Bureau's teletype facilities must be constantly available to send and receive urgent traffic, that it would not be possible to transmit the Vice President's speech over them. In that particular instance, a possible to the telephone company in Boston had offered the use of telephone company facilities for this purpose.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that I tell ASAC Larson that he should advise Humphrey's assistant that it will not be possible to transmit the Vice President's speech over our teletype facilities in view of the urgent need for them by the Bureau, particularly in view of our heavy traffic due to the weekend demonstrations just completed. DEMONSTRATION AGAINST VICE PRESIDENT HUMPHREY ROCHESTER, NEW YORK DECEMBER 4, 1967

On December 4, 1967, Special Agents of the FBL observed 48 demonstrators at Midtown Plaza, Main and North Clinton Streets, Rochester, New York. The demonstration was timed to coincide with the arrival of Vice President MUBERT H. HUMPHREY at the Midtown Plaza where he made a luncheon address. The address dealt with the Model Cities Program under which, according to public sources in Rochester, New York, 63 titles are receiving Federal funds to alleviate city problems.

The demonstrators included members of Voters for Peace and Women's Strike for Peace who distributed leaflets. Members of the University of Rochester Chapter of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and other area college students were also observed in the demonstration. Members of FIGHT, although not participating in the demonstration, were observed in the vicinity of the demonstration distributing leaflets. The demonstration was directed against participation by the United States in the Viet Nam war.

At approximately 12:45 PM, shortly after the arrival of the Vice President at the Midtown Plaza, the demonstration was terminated and the demonstrators disbursed. No arrests were made.

A characterization of SDS appears in an attached appendix.






