Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey arrived at the Salt Lake City Airport at 8:00 p.m. on July 26, 1968. Several hundred persons met the Vice President, including a few individuals carrying anti-Humphrey and anti-Vietnam placards. These persons mingled with the crowd, and it was difficult to judge how many were present. The Vice President gave an address and left the airport. There were no violence or disturbances of any kind at the airport.

Vice President Humphrey appeared at the Utah State Democratic Convention, which was held at the Valley Music Hall, North Salt Lake, Utah, on July 27, 1968. He addressed the convention at 11:00 a.m. A few persons were outside the hall distributing anti-Vietnam literature. The hall itself was closed to the public, and only delegates and other designated persons were allowed to enter. Immediately after his address, the Vice President was taken to the Salt Lake City Airport and departed from Salt Lake City shortly after 1:00 p.m. enroute to Los Angeles. There were no disturbances or violence at the Valley Music Hall or Salt Lake City Airport.

It is a loose knit organization which has no official membership or financial responsibility. The only identifying feature of the Brown Berets are fatigue jackets and berets worn by these considered to be members or supporters.

On July 23, 1968, a demonstration, sponsored by the PAC, was staged in the vicinity of the Century Plaza Hotel, evenue of the Stars and Constellation, Los Angeles, against the appearance of Vice President Humphrey in Los Angeles. The lamonstration commenced at 4:00 p.m. and lasted until approximately 8:00 p.m. The LAPD estimated, at first, a crowd of 3,500 to 4,000 participants. Later, the LAPD revised the estimate downward to 2,500 participants.



The LAPD advised that 13 arrests were made in the vicinity of the Century Plaza Hotel. Most of the arrests were for the use of obscene language toward policemen. No major incident occurred as the LAPD acted quickly to keep the crowd orderly.


As the crowd dwindled in the vicinity of the Century Plaza Hotel, leaders of the demonstration urged members of the DAC and VFP to go to Warner Brothers Studio, Burbank, and stage another demonstration to coincide with Vice President Humphrey's appearance there at approximately 9:00 p.m. on July 23, 1968.

Special Agents of the FBI observed a small demonstration the vicinity of Warner Brothers Studio, Burbank, at approxitately 8:30 p.m. on July 28, 1968. The demonstration, comprised mainly of members of the VFP, appeared poorly organized.



On July 29, 1963, Special Agents of the FBI observed a demonstration which took place in front of the Biltmore Hotel, Los Angeles. The demonstration was staged by the VFP and DAC. Approximately 20 persons participated in a peaceful picket in front of the hotel from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. Vice President Humphrey arrived at the hotel for a speaking engagement about 12:30 p.m. and entered through another entrance. The demonstration was without incident.



The July 29, 1968 issue of the Los Angeles Herald Examiner, a Los Angeles daily newspaper, indicated that stones had been hurled at police officers during the Century Plaza demonstration. This report was not substantiated through contact with the LAPD. The same issue of this paper depicts a female. In the grasp of two police officers. The picture shows this female on her knees and the photo is captioned "Girl Winds Up On Pavement During Melee". A Special Agent of the FBI recalls that on July 23, 1968, the 11:00 p.m. newscast on INCAT-TV showed films of the demonstration. The film showed that the female, mentioned above, was being picked up by the officers when she refused to rise on her own initiative.

Throughout the demonstrations contact was maintained by Special Agents of the FBI with Secret Service, Los Angeles.

, that the Women Strike for reace (WSP) in the Southern California area began its operations in the late fall of 1961, as an affiliate of the national organization formed that year in Washington, D. C. It is a peace oriented women's organization which is opposed to the present American foreign policy in Vietnam. It has also sought legislation which would bring about the abolition of the House Committee on Un-American Activities. to conducting numerous letter writing campaigns which concern current United States civil rights and foreign policy problems, WSP locally has become quite active in draft counseling and draft b7ddeafleting. Counseling, in the form of providing information concerning alternatives to the draft, and distributing leaflets providing this information have taken place on an increasingly consistent pace. Much of the leafleting takes place adjacent to han school campuses and in shopping centers. WSP feels that these methods of opposing United States intervention in Vietnam have been quite effective and more effective than frequent participation in demonstrations protesting the war in Vietnam.

that WSP is a non-membership organization and has no officers. The organization is open to semen of all political opinions who are interested in world peace. It makes no effort to exclude from its activities members of, or persons sympathetic to, the Communist Party and related groups.
