

At approximately 2:00 p.m. on August 21, 1968, a female who declined to identify herself, stating, "My husband does not want me to get involved" telephonically contacted the El Paso, Texas, Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The anonymous caller stated that she and her husband had been in a local El Paso bar on Sunday evening, August 18, 1968, where they overheard a male whose identity is unknown to them discussing the pending Democratic Convention in Chicago, Illinois. bar, whose name the caller could not recall, is described as being very small and located or Dyer St., just off Rushing St. in El Paso. According to the caller, the unknown male made comments to other persons seated at the bar to the effect, "If Humphrey is nominated, he will never live to be President. Somebody is going to shoot him." The individual alleged to have made the above statements is described as being a white male, age approximately 58 to 60, of medium height, possibly around 5'9", weighing 150 to 160 pounds and with grey hair, balding. individual was allegedly overheard saying that he was retired military, having spent a total of 33 years in various branches of the service, including the Air Force, Navy and Army.

The anonymous caller commented that she felt that this individual from the conversation overheard was actually not involved in any assassination plot and probably was only making bar room conversation. The caller concluded by

telephonically advised the Chicago , had left Office of the FBI that his home, taking their two minor children. stated that he had no information as to their current whereabouts; that he had reported this matter to the Chicago Police Department and requested that the FBI place a stop for these individuals,

once again called the Chicago FBI Office to request that the missing person's stop be canceled in that his family had been located in California. At the same time stated that he was going to try to see Vice President Humphrey during the latter's visit to Chicago in an attempt to solicit his assistance regarding a personal matter, the nature of which he would not specify. He added that he had no political connections through which to obtain an appointment and was just going to try to push up to Vice President Humphrey and would climb over a fence, if necessary. After some discussion regarding this manner of approach, admitted that this procedure might not be the best and that he perhaps would write a letter to the Vice President, rather than attempting to meet him in Chicago on August 19, 1968. During this conversation spoke as if he might have been somewhat spoke as if he might have been somewhat emotionally upset, but he did not indicate the source of his concern, and at the conclusion it was not certain whether he contemplated attempting to meet Vice President Humphrey or write a letter.

The above information was furnished to United States Secret Service, Chicago, at 4:45 n m. on August 19. 1968, and same was relayed to who was in the party accompanying Vice President Mubert H. Humphrey in Chicago at that time. Investigation is being - 1\* conducted in this matter.

He was asked to explain this statement and he said that he had a TV set built in his brain which shows him moving pictures of incidents about to happen. He had no further information concerning this matter and no information as to who will do the shooting of the Vice President. He also said he feels that unknown people will soon kill all Congressman and all Senators.







# STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE



Literature distributed by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362 Nelson Street, S.W., Atlanta, Georgia, describes itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which erupted across the South beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that Spring, brought together many of the demonstrating Southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October, 1960.

Carmichael was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May, 1967, Carmichael was replaced as Chairman Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August, 1967, at the invitation of Fidel Castro, Carmichael participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thereto, Carmichael traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December, 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

Chairman of SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. Rap Brown as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wide struggle for human rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February, 1968, identifies SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.


# STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE

The group demonstrated peacefully upon HUMPHREY's arrival at the Hotel Bethlehem from 8:20 to 9:00 p.m., August 15, 1968.

There were no incidents or arrests.

Special Agents of the FBI observed on August 16, 1968, approximately 100 to 150 pro-McGovern, pro-McCarthy, and anti-Victnam individuals demonstrate from approximately 9:00 to 11:00 a.m., in front of Hess Brothers Department Store, Allentown, Pa.

The demonstrators also included about 20 supporters of the Little Lehigh Redevelopment Associates, urging the U. S. Department of Housing and Urban Development to be responsive to their complaints of hardships for residents in the local redevelopment program.

There were no incidents or arrests.

Demonstration Against the Appearance of Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey Labor Day Parade, New York City

New York City, advised of the Federal Sureau of Investigation (FBI) on August 30, 1968, that Vice-President Hubert H. Humphrey would participate in the Labor Day Parade in New York City on September 2, 1968.

On September 2, 1968, SAS of the FBI observed approximately thirty demonstrators across the street from the reviewing stand where Vice-President Humphrey was sitting at Forty Second Street and Fifth Avenue. The demonstrators chanted slogans of "Peace Now", "Heil Humphrey", and "Dump the Hump". Some of the signs carried by the pickets read as follows:

"HHH - Little Herod"
"Humphrey Fascist State"
"Chicago Prague USA"
"Don't Change Hearses in Midstream"

The demonstrator's left the area at approximately 12:00 noon, after the Vice-President had left the reviewing stand.

At approximately 11:00 AM, as a parade unit identified as members of Local 40 Iron Workers marched by the reviewing stand, one member of the unit raised a sign reflecting "God" Bless Daley". Some anti-war demonstrators heckled the marchers and threw leaflets at them. Approximately twenty marchers broke ranks and went after the hecklers. The New York City Police Department (NYCPD) immediately controlled the crowd and one demonstrator was taken away, but was not arrested.

Leaflets were passed out along Fifth Avenue, the route of march, announcing that demonstrators would march in the parade with "Anti-War Local Number 65" and that a "teachin" would be held at Central Park sponsored by New York Regional of Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and the Columbia Strike Coordinating Committee (CSCC) of Columbia University. A xerox copy of the aforementioned leaflet is attached hereto which was obtained by an SA of the FBI.

### Columbia Strike Coordinating Committee (CSCC)

In May, 1968, a confidential source advised that the CSCC was dominated by SDS.

A characterization of SDS is attached.

SAS observed approximately two hundred demonstrators join District 65, Retail Wholesale Department Store Union (RWDSU) at the assembly point of 28th Street and Lexington Avenue at approximately 2:00 PM. Observed in the crowd was Paul O'Dwyer, candidate for United States Senate, who greeted members of the Union and demonstrators. At the assembly point, one spokesman for the demonstrators announced that no anti-war or anti-Humphrey signs were to be carried and that all were to march in an orderly manner. The spokesman further announced that members of the W.E.B Du Bois Club were in the group.

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

The unit joined the parade at approximately 4:00 PM, and marched up Fifth Avenue to the Central Park area. The parade was terminated at that time due to a heavy rain. Approximately twenty demonstrators entered the park at approximately 5:30 PM; however, no "teach-in" or rally was observed being held.

When Sen. McCarthy began his campaign, newspaper commentators and politicians spoke of him as the bringer of a "new politics": one-divorced from the usual party clubs, relying on the best interests of people, engaging hundreds of thousands of young Americans into the established political process. Suddenly, it was proclaimed, there is hope in America. On Aug. 28th, Sen. McCarthy did not receive the Democratic nomination; that night, thousands of McCarthy supporters, without any compromise of their alienation from America, or their deep hopes for its reconstruction from which that alienation sprang, found, at the very moment their candidate was defeated, a new hope. The next day, when McCarthy told them to

stay within the system; they shouted, "No!" It was not .

### A NEW POLITICS IS A NEW KIND OF FOWER

Their despair had come from this knowledge: that America was practising a genocidal war in Vietnam; that it ruled its ghetios as police-states; that it practised on all its citizens thorough and alienating forms of social manipulation. And this: that, they thought, there was nothing they could do to stop any of it. They wanted the government to return to the people. And so they picked a new governor.

But when he was defeated they discovered something more important: that they were the people. They had tried to delegate their wishes for eight months: a very old form of politics; a very old may of not changing the system. Then they tried to simply express their wishes in a people's demonstration a very new form of politics indeed.

IT IS NOT SIMPLY THAT THE . STREETS BELONG TO THE PEOPLE: THE PEOPLE RELONG IN THE STREETS!

For, infact there are only two kinds of politics: the system's and the people's. What was the need for door to door canvassing, primaries, counting delegates' votes one by one? The need was to make people express their deep sense of alienation and disgust by letting someone clse do it; and then defeat him in a convention ruled by the same laws: canvassing, primaries, delegates' votes. But people have the right and duty to express their desires by themselves; to end the results of the system they must attack it from outside. For, as Chicago made clear, the rules of the system are all rigged.

The respression has already hit labor.
