furnished literature issued by The Resistance, 5 Beekman Street, New York City, which disclosed that a demonstration sponsored by this organization was scheduled for 7:00 AM, September 3. 1968, at the United States Armed Forces Induction Center (USAFIC), B9 Whitehall Street, New York City, in support of Mark Lyons, who reportedly would refuse military induction into the Armed Forces of the United States.

On September 3, 1968, SAS of the FBI, at 6:20 AM, observed a crowd gathering in front of the USAFIC, supra.

At 7:00 AM, a picket line was conducted in front of the Induction Center manned by approximately 125 pickets who carried signs which stated:

"U.S. Get Out of Vietnam",
"No Draft for Vietnam",
"End the Draft Now",
"Billions for Life Not Death",
"Bury the Bombs Not Our Boys",
"Support Mark Lyons",
"Women Strike for Peace",
"The Draft is In Violation of the 13th Amendment"

At 7:30 AM, several speeches were delivered which included talks delivered by Irma Zigas, self-described as Chairman of the Anti-Draft Committee for Women Strike for Peace; Father David Kirk, announced as coordinator of Emmaus House, a community project; James Forest, announced as National Secretary of the Catholic Peace Fellowship, and Mark Lyons, announced as the Director of the program "Conscience and the Draft" for the American Friends Service Committee. The speeches delivered were generally anti-Vietnam and anti-draft.

Lyons thanked the individuals present for their support and announced that he would refuse induction into the Armed Forces.

At 7:45 AM, loaves of bread were distributed to the pickets to "honor their freedom to choose peace over war and life over death".

Lyons then attempted to enter the Induction Center carrying a loaf of bread and a glass of wine. He was immediately advised by army officials that he would not be allowed to enter the Induction Center carrying an alcoholic beverage. At this point, Lyons consumed the wine and then entered the Induction Center without incident. The picket line continued until 8:00 AM, at which time the crowd dispersed.





Today I am part of a group of young men about to be "accepted" into the United States Army. However a minimum of human values on my part makes it impossible for me to return the compliment. It is not simply that the present war in Viet-Ham violates the spirit of International Law, the Constitution of the United States, and every ethical code devised by man, but more fundimentally, military life is the negation of every decent aspiration of mankind.

'lany centuries ago an acient Hebrew prophet dreamed that one day man would no longer waste his energies learning the art of war. Hore recent activists such as Ghandi and Hartin Luther King have taught that this dream can only be fulfilled if individuals are willing to articulate a neaceful existence with their life. By act today is simply saying that I refuse to learn the technology of modern warfare. I do this not out of any inate non-violent quality but rather from fear of my own violent tendencies. I have no need to learn the U.S. Army's modern sophisticated art of self defense because I do not plan to exploit my fellow man. Only those who so avariciously exploit their brothers need such a rigorous program of self defense, which has become the most aggressive and destructive program known to man.

If I am imprisoned for my act today, my, crime is refusing to learn the technology of modern warfare. If American society considers this a criminal act, then I ask you, what and where is justice?

He is a graduate of New York University (Heights) and is currently enrolled as a candidate for a M.A. degree in political science at the New School for Social Research.

A demonstration has been called by the New York Resistance to * support Mr. Siegel in his decision to refuse induction at 7 AM Thursday.

conference of members of the Communist Party, USA (CPUSA), including national functionaries, met in Chicago, Illinois, for the purpose of setting in motion forces for the establishment of a new national Marxist-oriented youth organization which would hunt for the most peaceful transition to socialism. The delegates were told that it would be reasonable to assume that the young socialists attracted into this new organization would eventually pass into the CP itself.

that the founding convention for the new youth organization was held from June 19-21, 1964, at 150 Golden Gate Avenue, San Francisco, California, at which time the name W.E.B. Du Bois Clubs of America (DCA) was adopted. Approximately 500 delegates from throughout the United States attended this convention.

stated that in Negro communities the Party still supported the plan to build "left" socialist centers and to solidify the Party base through the DCA.

the rarty believes the DCA should have a working class outlook and be a mass organization favorable to socialism, socialist countries and Marxism, and in April, 1967, GUS HALL, CPUSA, General Secretary, indicated that the DCA primary emphasis should be on developing mass resistance to the draft.

Characterizations of the Denver Branch, SWP, and the Denver Chapter, FPCC, appear as appendices hereto, and the sources mentioned therein have furnished reliable information in the past.

Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation observed about 50 individuals assemble in front of the Denver Hilton Hotel at about 5:00 P.M., September 9, 1968, and march up and down the street in front of the Hilton carrying anti-war placards and signs critical of Vice President Humphrey. These individuals marched until 6:00 P.M. and then disbanded without incident.

Special Agents identified the following persons as participating in the marching:



A characterization of the SDS appears as an appendix hereto.

Special Agents observed captioned, "The Meaning of Law and Order," a Xerox copy of which is attached to this memorandum.

Following the arrival of Vice President Humphrey at the Hilton Hotel, he addressed a closed meeting of delegates attending the convention of the United Mine Workers. He appeared at an open forum meeting in the grand ballroom of the Hilton from 7:30 to 8:20 P.M. which was open to the public.

Special Agents observed a number of the individuals who participated in the demonstration outside the Hilton Hotel in attendance at the open forum. What was observed to pass out by a mimeographed leaflet, "An Open Letter to Vice President Humphrey," a Xerox copy of which is attached to this memorandum.

Following opening remarks, Vice President Humphrey answered written questions from the floor and at the conclusion answered several oral questions from the floor, one of which was propounded by an unidentified individual displaying a banner for the Peace and Freedom Party. This individual referred to American plans for dropping napalm in Guatemala and expressed sympathy for the little country of North Vietnam. Some other minor heckling occurred from anti-war protesters during the appearance of Vice President Humphrey; however, no incidents occurred.

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

FAIR PLAY FOR CUBA COMMITTEE (FPCC) DENVER CHAPTER

was held at the headquarters of the Denver Branch, Socialist Workers Party (SWP), on December 10, 1960, for the purpose of establishing a Denver Chapter of the Fair Play for Cuba Committee.

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SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY - DENVER BRANCH

An open letter to Vice-President Humphrey



Dear Vice-President Humphrey:

You are scheduled to answer questions at a Citizens' Forum in Denver today. We, as citizens, would like you to answer the following questions:

- l. Since you advocate free elections, why did you not object when the legally elected government of Guatemala was overthrown with the assistance of the C.I.A. in 1954? Or when the legally elected government of Jagan in Guyana was overthrown with the help of "labor leaders" trained in a labor school financed by the United States government, labor unions, and certain industries? Or when the government of Bosch in the Dominican Republic was toppled with the help of certain elements of the United States government? Or when the elections called for by the Geneva Agreements were not held in Vietnam in 1956.
- 2. Since you want law and order, why haven't you objected when the United States government has broken laws? To refresh your memory, we mention a few examples connected with Vietnam:
- a. The SEATO Treaty, which permitted foreign intervention only with the authorization of the United Nations Security Council.
- b. The United Nations Charter, which states that only the Security Council can determine the existence of an act of aggression.
- c. The Constitution of the United States which states that only the Congress can declare war.
- d. The pledges of Eisenhower, Kennedy, and Johnson to aid South Vietnam which have been used as justification for our aggression in Vietnam. These pledges have never been ratified by the Senate, are not treaties or laws, and have no standing whatsoever when compared to the United Nations Charter or the Constitution.
- 3. Since you believe in democracy, why didn't you strongly object to the undemocratic procedures at the Democratic National Convention in Chicago?
- 4. If you give seemingly adequate answers to the above, how can we believe what you say when you have not objected to the lies and half truths palmed off on the American people by government officials from the president on down?
- 5. Since a forum such as this is toatlly inadequate for us to thoroughly discuss with you the war in Vietnam so that you might relieve our doubts about that war, and since there are millions throughout the country who feel as we do, we request a public discussion of the war between you and a person of our choosing at a time and place of your choosing, except that we need a week's notice to arrange for our speaker. We can be reached at Post Office Box 86, Denver, Colorado 80201. Such a discussion would be a public service to the country on your part.





STUDENTS FOR PEACE (SFP)

The April 5, 1965, issue of "The Pitt News," a student newspaper at the University of Pittsburgh (UP), Pittsburgh, Pa., contained an article announcing the formation of a new student organization called "Students for Peace" (SFP). The article described SFP as a pacifist group, acting as an information center, which hoped to emphasize the importance of "seeking non-violent solutions into both international and domestic crimes." The article further stated that the organization grew cut of the desire of several University pacifists to present students normally opposed to war with an alternative to "ROTO now or draft later."

first meeting of SFP during the 1023 57 achool year on September 13, 1986, , stated that SFP is not a pacifist group and anyone who expected it to be so could leave the meeting. Said the past president was a pacifist, but he would lead the organization as a militant group. He stated that it was not the purpose of the SFP to do only what the University allows, but since SFP was the only radical group on campus, they intended to do whatever they felt necessary to express the radical viewpoint.

On September 9, 1968, Special Agents of the FBI observed no demonstration in the area of the Ambassador Hotel, Los Angeles. Vice President Humphrey arrived at the hotel at approximately 11:15 p.m. without incident. A small crowd was on hand at the hotel; however, no picket signs were observed and none of the individuals, in the crowd, were recognized as participants in previous demonstrations. Contact with Secret Service, Los Angeles, at the Ambassador Hotel, determined that no unusual problems were encountered at Los Angeles International Airport upon the Vice President's arrival at approximately 10:30 p.m. on September 9, 1968.

On September 10, 1968, Vice President Humphrey spoke to a crowd, estimated at 3,000 to 3,500, at TRW, Redondo Beach, California. Special Agents of the FBI observed no demonstration in the area of the TRW facility. The Vice President's speech was delivered outdoors on the mall of the TRW site. Some anti-Humphrey signs were observed in the crowd; however, these appeared to represent the efforts of individuals rather than any organized group. The Vice President concluded his appearance at TRW at approximately 2:00 p.m.

Vice President Humphrey departed Los Angeles International Airport at approximately 2:45 p.m., September 10, 1968, via Trans World Airlines (TWA) Charter, destination Houston, Texas. No demonstration was observed in the vicinity of the West Imperial Terminal of the Los Angeles International Airport on September 10, 1968.

The September 11, 1968 edition of the "Los Angeles Times", a Los Angeles daily newspaper, carried a photograph and an article concerning an individual by the name of John Caton, a 23 year old student at the University of California, Berkeley, California (UCB). The article alleges that Caton

"menhandled" Vice President Humphrey while the Vice President was shaking hands with well wishers upon his arrival at the Los Angeles International Airport on the evening of September 9, 1968. According to the article, Caton grabbed the Vice President, while shaking hands, and attempted to hold the Vice President while he spoke to him. The article states that, at this point, "Three Secret Service agents moved in and beat the young man to break his grasp on Humphrey." Caton was wrestled to the ground and reportedly yelled to Humphrey "You bastard you." The article goes on to say that Caton was released after he had explained to the agents that he only wanted to discuss the Democratic Convention with the Vice President.

On September 11, 1968,
Secret Service, Los Angeles, advised that the incident appears to have been exaggerated by the "Los Angeles Times" newspaper.
advised that Caton was determined to speak with the vice President and climbed over the fence at the airport. In doing so, his sign bumped one of the Secret Service agents and Caton and the agent fell to the ground. Caton was forcibly placed back on the spectator's side of the fence. No arrest was made.

Caton intended to assault the Vice President.

Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY arrived at the Greater Buffalo International Airport at approximately 10:20 a.m. on September 17, 1968 and motored directly to Canisius College, 2001 Main Street, Buffalo, New York, where it had been announced that he would make a speech before the student body and submit himself to questioning.

Approximately one hour before the Vice President arrived, a group of demonstrators, the majority of whom had arrived from the campus of the State University of New York at Buffalo (SUNYAB), appeared and began a picket line at the Main Street Entrance to Canisius. The number of demonstrators grew to an estimated 175 and at approximately 10:10 a.m., the group moved to Hughes Avenue to be closer to the Student Center where the Vice President was to appear. Police barricades previously set up contained the demonstrators so that they were approximately 75 yards to the west of the Student Center entrance. There were approximately 80 placards and banners being carried by the demonstrators and the only sponsoring organization observed was that of the Youth Against War and Fascism (YAWF).

YAWF and the Workers World Party (WWP), with which it is connected, are described in the Appendix pages attached.

Although Vice President HUMPHREY was subjected to questioning following his speech in the auditorium at the Canisius Student Center, some of which was hostile in

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tone, there were no incidents of any sort and he and his cavalcade then proceeded to the Delaware Avenue Entrance of the Statler-Hilton Hotel where it had been announced in the press that he would speak before two different luncheon gatherings.

The demonstrators, who had been present at Canisius College earlier in the morning, had withdrawn from that school area at approximately 11:15 a.m. and about one hour later, had taken fixed positions on Delaware Avenue just to the south of the Statler-Hilton entrance. By this time, the demonstrators were intermingled with those whose dress indicated them to be HUMPHREY supporters and with casual bystanders. It is estimated that the number of demonstrators at this point was approximately 75 and there were approximately 25 anti-HUMPHREY signs being carried.

When the Vice President arrived at the hotel entrance at approximately 12:55 p.m., the demonstrators began a continual chant and they repeated over and over the theme "Dump the HUMP" and "HUMPHREY Lies--G.I.'s Die." The Vice President attempted a four-minute speech and referred to the "monolithic chanters," who were attempting to prevent his talk. He concluded his brief speech amid mingled cheers and hooting. He then entered the Statler-Hilton where he made two different addresses before groups already assembled.

After the Vice President entered the hotel, the demonstrators began to withdraw

The HUMPHREY cavalcade later on the afternoon of September 17, 1968 proceeded to the Studios of WGR-TV on Barton Street where a 30-minute television tape was filmed. There were no demonstrators and no incidents of any sort and shortly after 4:00 p.m., the Vice President was driven to the Greater Buffalo Municipal Airport where his plane departed at 5:09 p.m. en route to Rochester, New York.

Upon arrival in the latter city, Vice President HUMPHREY addressed an audience of approximately 1,500 within a terminal at Page Airways. Prior to his arrival, an estimated 200 anti-HUMPHREY and anti-Viet Nam demonstrators gathered outside the building in which the Vice President's speech was to be given. The group chanted phrases, including "Dump the Hump," but there were no incidents of any sort and none of the demonstrators attempted to enter the building in which the Vice President was to speak.

Vice President HUMPHREY departed Rochester, New York, for Washington, D.C., at 8:42 p.m.

Throughout the Vice President's stay in Buffalo and Rochester, there were no incidents of violence and no arrests were made.


