Reference is made to Boston memorandum dated September 18, 1968.

Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation on September 19, 1968, observed the following:

About three hundred demonstrators gathered at Boston Common, Boston, Massachusetts, about 10:15 a.m., September 19, 1968. This gathering broke up into two groups at about 11:00 a.m. and proceeded to the corner of Summer and Washington Streets, Boston, Massachusetts, where a grandstand from which Vice President Humphrey was to speak was located. The two groups approached the grandstand from two different streets; namely, Washington and Winter Streets, Boston, Massachusetts. The demonstrators were carrying signs protesting the Vietnam War and against Vice President Humphrey.

The demonstrators yelled, "Sig heil," when the Boston Police Tactical Squad arrived to keep them in hand.

When Vice President Humphrey's car arrived, they booed and gave a victory sign. By this time, the demonstrators had increased to an estimated number of between four and five hundred. During introductions on the grandstand, the demonstrators continued to boo. During Senator Edward Kennedy's speech, the demonstrators quieted, except when reference was made to Vice President Humphrey and they again booed. During Vice President Humphrey's speech, the demonstrators continually booed and shouted some obscenities and raised their hands in a victory sign. However, they

did not appear to drown out Vice President Humphrey's talk and the applause from his supporters, who were many more in number. Supporters, during Vice President Humphrey's talk, drowned out the demonstrators.

Subsequent to Vice President Humphrey's talk, the demonstrators mingled in the area for a short period of time but were dispersed by the police. No serious incidents occurred, and no arrests were made.

The "New York Post" in its February 2, 1968 issue, on Page 12, sets forth an article entitled "Gaily, Gaily, Hippies Going Into Politics," which states in part as follows:

"A new group called Youth International Party (YIP) with a high command of 25 'yippies' is promoting a fun-and-games youth festival in Chicago during the Democratic National Convention in late August.

"The New York-based organization, whose leaders include poet ALLEN GINSBERG and folk-singer ARLO GUTHRIE, hopes to lure 500,000 free spirits to Chicago for the occasion.

"It promises singing, dancing in the streets, poetry and 'making love in the parks,' according to the first announcement distributed to radical newspapers by the Liberation News Service (LNS).

"It is clear the top yippies don't think much of President JOHNSON or the 'National Death Party' he hopes to lead to a second four-year term in power."


