





### THE PEACE AND FREEDOM PARTY OF WASHINGTON

The records of the Secretary of State, Olympia, Washington, indicate that the Peace and Freedom Party (PFP) of Washington is a duly constituted minority political party in statutory conformity with the laws of the State of Washington. As a result of a nominating convention held in Seattle, Washington, on September 20, 1966, 276 registered voters qualified as delegates.

A press release issued by the PFP from its office, 512 Wellington Avenue, Seattle, Washington, on September 26, 1966, states the Party's platform is based on opposition to U.S. intervention in the war in Vietnam and declared "that the war is immoral, brutal, and illegal," and asked that American troops be withdrawn. It expressed concern about the grave effects of this war at home; and that preoccupation of the government and the American people with the war in Vietnam is causing the civil rights movement, which the Party supports, to meet with increasing resistance.

hat many communists attended the nominating convention of the PFP upon the urging and insistence of Communist Party leaders and qualified as delegates.

Issues Conference held in Seattle on May 7, 1967, Communist
Party leaders participated and submitted position papers. A
larger number of Communist Party members than at the nominating
convention participated and many were elected to Congressional
District Committees and representation on the PFP State Committee.

meeting of the PFP held in Scattle on August 21, 1967, delegates were selected to attend a conference in Chicago, Illinois.

Committee meetings held during early 1968. These indicated several present and former Communist Party members continued to function as members of the Committee. These minutes also reflected the PFP's support of draft resistance, abolition of the death penalty and opposition to attempts to revive provisions of the "McCarren Act" declared unconstitutional by the U.S. Supreme Court, as well as continued opposition to the Vietnam war and efforts to field. ### SOCIALIST WORKERS PARTY - SEATTLE DRANCH

that during the month of May, 1941, the Seattle Branch of the Socialist Workers Party (SWP) was reorganized and received official recognition as a branch of the Party from the National Office of the SWP in New York, New York.

The Socialist Workers Party has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

Branch, SWP, with headquarters at 3815 Fifth Avenue Northeast, Seattle, was an affiliate of the National SWP.

Branch, Shr, executed a statement of resignation from the National SWP, dated April 9, 1966; that they had made reference to the group as the Seattle Branch, SWP (Unaffiliated); and later adopted the name Freedom Socialist Party (FSP) of Washington.

were in disagreement with the National SMP over the questions of the Negro struggle, the colonial revolution, the Vietnamese war, regroupment, woman's emancipation, and party organizational principles.

They established SWP headquarters at their residence at 5265 - 15th Avenue Northeast, Scattle.

The January 29, 1968, issue of "The Militant" listed the address of the Seattle SWP as 5257 University Way (NE).

"The Militant" is a weekly newspaper of the SWP.



Greenville, Mississippi, filed a temporary restraining order in U. S. District Court, Northern District of Mississippi, Greenville, Mississippi, to allow Evers to proceed with the speech. Federal Judge William Keady signed the restraining order October 2, 1968.

Oxford, Mississippi, advised on October 2, 1968, that approximately 70 Negroes and 200 white persons attended the political rally, Educational Building, University of Mississippi, Oxford, Mississippi, October 2, 1968.

Mississippi, along with Charles Evers, made political speeches on behalf of Humphrey-Muskie. There were no incidents at the rally. Following the rally the group attended a reception at the Holiday Inn, Oxford, where 2 white males attempted to start a fight with 3 Negro male students, names not obtained by the police department.

"Congressional Record" and official biography of Vice President Humphrey contains statement indicating Humphrey, while Mayor of Minneapolis, received "FBI Award for Effective Law Enforcement." Logical Bureau and Minneapolis Office files contain no record of any such award. Inquiries requesting further details of award from Republican and Democratic National Committees as well as office of Republican Congressman have been answered with "no comment" reply.

### **DETAILS:**

In memorandum from Jones to Bishop, 9/17/68, entitled "Senator Daniel K. Inouye, (D.-Hawaii) Statement in Congressional Record Concerning FBI" it is reflected that the 9/13/68 issue of the "Congressional Record" had a statement by Inouye to the effect that Humphrey, while Mayor of Minneapolis, Minnesota, received "FBI Award for Effective Law Enforcement." This memorandum reflected that logical Bureau and Minneapolis Office files contained no record of any such award. In the past few days my office has received inquiries concerning this matter from of the Republican National Committee and of the Democratic National Committee and the office of Congressman Ancher Nelsen (R.-Minnesota). at the time of her inquiry, stated that this same statement appears on page 125 of the book entitled "Humphrey, A Candid Biography" by Win Griffith, who is the official biographer of the Vice President. She also advised that she has checked with the Vice President's Office and with the biographer but can secure no further information concerning the award.

To all of these inquirers we have been making no comment.

It is noted that although an examination of logical Bureau and Minneapolis Office files disclosed no record of any such award being given by the Bureau to Vice President Humphrey when he was Mayor of Minneapolis, these files do reveal that he won election as Mayor on a "cleanup" platform that promised to completely reorganize the Minneapolis Police Department. In this effort, Humphrey did seek the advice of the Bureau and, in fact, appointed as his police chief a National Academy graduate whom Humphrey knew we considered favorably for that position. Humphrey even visited the Director during his administration as Mayor and invited Mr. Hoover to visit the city of Minneapolis some time in the future for the purpose of viewing the changes (presumably in the Police Department) that had taken place. The Director, of course, made no commitments in this regard.

It is entirely possible that this statement as far as Humphrey is concerned might refer to a letter of commendation that he or his chief of police at Minneapolis could have received for assistance on a Bureau case or on another cooperative matter, could be referring to a letter of appreciation from the SAC with regard to some specific matter, or even could be referring to a personal gift which he might have received from the SAC. In other words, we do not know what Humphrey has reference to when an "FBI Award for Effective Law Enforcement" is mentioned. In view of the above circumstances, it is felt that we should continue to make no comment to inquiries on this matter and thus avoid what could become a political issue.

An article in the Detember, 1967, issue of "The Southern Patriot" (SP) commemorating the twenty-fifth anniversary of the publication with that issue recites the following:

The Southern Torfetence for Human Welfare (SCHW) was organized in 1938: SP. started to 1942, as the publication of SCHW, was taken over by the Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc., (SCEF), in the late 1947's when SCHW went out of existence. SCEF, originally the "educational wing" of SCHW, continued as an independent organization. For almost two decades, concern of SCHW and SCEF was with recis) segregation and oppression of black people. In 1964, SCEF recognized that the legal back of segregation had been broken and economic and political gains were necessary if Southern life was to change. In the past few years, SCEF has also supported battles for academic freezent and the Southern movement for world peace.

The Southern Conference for Human Welfare (SCHW) was cited as a communist front by the House Commuttee on An-American Activities. House Report 592 June 12, 1947. In the same house report "The Southern Patriot" was cited as an "organ" of the SCHW.

The September. 136%, issue of SP refers to SCEF as a "community of Organizers and Writers" stating its work is centered in organizing the poor in Appalachia for political and economic power, helping white people in the Deep South find a common cause with black people, helping local groups organize action for peace and working for abolition of the "Eguse Un-American Activities Committee".

The Masthead of SF in its April, 1968, issue states "The Southern Conference is dedicated to ending racism, poverty, and other injustices in the South it opposes war as an instrument of national policy."

Listed in the Masthead are SCER officers consisting of eight executive committee members, four executive staff members headed

## STUDENT NONVIOLENT COORDINATING COMMITTEE

Literature distributed by the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC), headquartered at 360-362 Nelson Street, S. W., Atlanta, Georgia, describes itself as not being a membership organization, but rather an agency attempting to stimulate and foster the growth of local protest movements. SNCC was born out of the sit-in movement which erupted across the South beginning on February 1, 1960. A conference at Raleigh, North Carolina, that Spring, brought together many of the demonstrating Southern students in a loose network of militant youth which was officially named SNCC in October, 1960.

Carmichael was elected National Chairman by the Central Committee. In May, 1967, Carmichael was replaced as Chairman by H. Rap Brown, with Carmichael assuming the position of Recruiter and Organizer for the SNCC. In August, 1967, at the invitation of Fidel Castro, Carmichael participated in the Organization of Latin American Solidarity Conference which was held in Havana, Cuba. Subsequent thereto, Carmichael traveled to Hanoi and other sections of North Vietnam. He returned to the United States in December, 1967, at which time his passport was picked up because of travel to unauthorized countries.

that when Carmichael was elected Chairman of SNCC, the organization embarked on a program of eliminating Caucasians from its ranks. With the election of H. Rap Brown as Chairman in 1967, it embarked on a world-wide struggle for human rights and to take a firm stand against violations of these rights by the American Government and to strengthen its programs of opposition to the draft and to the United States involvement in Vietnam.

Literature distributed in February, 1968, identifies SNCC as an organization in the revolutionary vanguard. It advocates that to be successful it is necessary to develop a revolutionary ideology and revolutionary program.

On August 13, 1967, while addressing a group in the Watts area of Los Angeles, California, H. Rap Brown said "You better shape up America, or we'll burn you down." Later in February, 1968, in a publicized note Brown wrote, "America, if it takes my death to organize my people to revolt against you and to organize your jails to revolt against you and to organize your children, your God, your poor, your country, and to organize mankind to rejoice in your destruction and ruin, then here's my life "

and his SSOC group from Durham, North Carolina were not observed to be in attendance at this speech of Mr.

HUMPHREY. No anti-HUMPHREY groups were observed in attendance.

One small group of about twenty hippie-type individuals who appeared to be teenagers were present in the Coliseum. They carried signs opposing the Viet Nam War and occasionally chanted, "Stop the war"; however, they cheered HUMPHREY during his speech and caused no disturbance.

the Southern Student Organizing Committee (SSOC) was formed on the weekend of April 3-5, 1964, to stimulate activity of Southern student groups in areas of civil rights, peace, academic freedom, civil liberties, capital punishment, and unemployment. Originally, it was to be a white counterpart of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC). It has agreed to work with similar interested groups such as SNCC and Students for a Democratic Society (SDS) and Southern Conference Educational Fund, Inc. (SCEF). SSOC is a fraternal affiliate of the SDS.

Beginning in the Fall of 1966, SSOC became a membership organization and embarked on a campaign to form local chapters on various college campuses throughout the South. SSOC publishes, October through May each year, a publication, "New South Student," which according to the above source has increasingly espoused and defended the pro-Communist and anti-United States position on domestic and foreign policy.

continues to be headquartered at 1703 Portland Avenue, Nashville, Tennessee, and continues to defend and espouse the pro-Communist and anti-United States position with particular emphasis on attacking Unites States policy in Vietnam and emphasis on attacking the Selective Service System. Source two noted that SSOC Chairman Themas N. Logical Bureau and Minneapolis Office files contain no record of any such award.

### DETAILS:

The 9-13-68 issue of the Congressional Record, page S10734, (copy attached), contains a statement by Senator Daniel K. Inouye of Hawaii in delense of Vice President Humphrey's record against crime. This statement notes that Humphrey, 'As mayor of Minneapolis, ... strengthened the police force, rid the city of racketeers and won an FBI award for effective law enforcement."

An examination of logical Bureau and Minneapolis Office files (as requested telephonically) disclosed no record of any such award given by the Eureau to Vice President Humphrey when he was mayor of Minneapolis.

Files do reveal that Humphrey won election as mayor on a "cleanup" platform that promised to completely reorganize the Minneapolis Police Department. In this effort, Humphrey did seek the advice of the Buretu and, in fact, appointed as his police chief a National Academy graduate whom Humphrey knew we considered favorably for that position. Humphrey even visited the Director during his administration as mayor and invited Mr. Hoover to visit the city of Minneapolis some time in the future for the purpose of viewing the changes (presumably in the Police Department) that had taken place. The Director, of course, made no commitments in this regard.





He stated he was a

He claimed to have met an unidentified Negro male on Jefferson Street near the Greyhound bus station in Toledo, Ohio, at 2:00 a.m. on September 21, 1968 who he described as a "kook". He stated this man during the conversation asked him if it "would be safe for the Vice President to go to the Dorr Street area during his visit to Toledo on September 23?" Lescribed this man as a Negro male, 24 to 25 years old, neatly dressed in a business suit. The man told he was an aide to the Vice President.
