

The information furnished herewith concerns an individual who is believed to be covered by the agreement between the FBI and Secret Service concerning Presidential protection, and to fall within the category or categories checked.

- 1. The Has attempted or threatened bodily harm to any government official or employee, including foreign government officials residing in or planning an imminent visit to the U. S., because of his official status.
- 2. Has attempted or threatened to redress a grievance against any public official by other than legal means.
- 3. Because of background is potentially dangerous; or has been identified as member or participant in communist movement; or has been under active investigation as member of other group or organization inimical to U.S.

 - (a) Evidence of emotional instability (including unstable residence and employment record) or irrational or suicidal behavior:
 - (b) Expressions of strong or violent anti-U. S. sentiment;
 - (c) Prior acts (including arrests or convictions) or conduct or statements indicating a propensity for violence and antipathy toward good order and government.




that vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY appeared in San Diego on October 24, 1968, and spoke at the Community Concourse at approximately 5:00 PM.

About fifty hecklers were present during the speech but because of their location among the crowd, they caused little or no interference with the speech made by Mr. HUMPHREY. No incidents occurred during or after the speech and Vice President HUMPHREY left San Diego without incident.

On March 1, 1969, an article appeared in <u>Jackson Clarion Ledger</u>, Jackson, Mississippi, relating that Aaron Henry of Clarksdale, Mississippi, Chairman and President of the Loyalist Democrat Party (LDP) and National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), respectively, in the State of Mississippi, had disclosed the tentative itinerary for the visit of former Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey to Mississippi, during period April 1-3, 1969. The LDP Of Mississippi is a biracial political group which successfully challenged the seating of the regular Mississippi delegation to the Democratic Convention at Chicago, Illinois, in August, 1968. Charles Evers and Patricia Derian, residents of Jackson, Mississippi, are National Committee members of same party.

Former Vice President Humphrey is scheduled to arrive at Memphis, Tennessee, at Noon, April 1, 1969, and proceed by automobile to Greenville, Mississippi, with informal stops planned en route at selected areas of Tunica and Bolivar Counties, Mississippi. At 4:00 P.M., the same day, Humphrey is scheduled to meet with students of Delta State College (Cleveland, Mississippi) and Mississippi Valley State College (Itta Bena, Mississippi) at Greenville, Mississippi.

Congressman MacGregor has written the Director noting that in a recent TV debate, former Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey boasted "of his success in improving law enforcement in Minneapolis while Mayor from 1945 to 1948." According to MacGregor, Humphrey claimed in this debate that he was granted the "FBI award for effective law enforcement."

We have had favorable relations with both MacGregor and Humphrey over a number of years. MacGregor is the Republican candidate for the Senate and is opposing Humphrey who is the Democratic candidate for that office.

Bufiles reflect that during the fall of 1968 the same claim concerning Humphrey appeared in The Congressional Record and in a book entitled "Humphrey, A Candid Biography," by Win Griffith, who was the official biographer of the Vice President. Since Bufiles, including those of the Director's Office and the Minneapolis Field Office, contained no information indicating the FBI had given such an award to Humphrey or any communications with him that could reasonably be construed as such, it was recommended and approved that a number of oral inquiries we received concerning Humphrey's claim be answered with 'ho comment."

Bufiles do reveal that Humphrey won election as mayor of Minneapolis on a "cleanup" platform that promised to completely reorganize the Police Department. In this effort, Humphrey did seek the advice of the Bureau and, in fact, appointed as his police chief a National Academy graduate whom Humphrey knew we considered favorably for that position. Humphrey even visited the Director during his administration as mayor and invited Mr. Hoover to visit the city of Minneapolis some time in the future for the purpose of viewing the changes (presumably in the Police Department) that had taken place. The Director, of course, made no commitments in this regard.

However, Humphrey was a guest speaker at the graduation exercises of the 77th Session of the National Academy held 5-25-66. He was introduced by the Director who made several favorable comments concerning Humphrey's administration of the Minneapolis city government while Mayor of that city.

In accordance with the Director's instructions, SAC Held at Minneapolis was telephonically instructed on 10-15-70 to personally contact Humphrey and specifically determine what he had reference to when claiming to have received an "FBI award for effective law enforcement." Held subsequently advised that Humphrey could recall only that just before completing his term as Mayor of Minneapolis (1948), the city and/or its police department received an award "for an effective law enforcement program for cities of 200,000 to 500,000 population" which, he always presumed, although admittedly uncertain of, was made by the FBI. Humphrey acknowledged this award was not given him personally but as the city's Mayor he felt no reluctance sharing in its recognition. SAC Held made it clear to Humphrey that the award he referred to was not made by the FBI.

Humphrey further noted that before and after his speech at the FBI National Academy graduation (noted above) the Director made a number of laudatory comments from the dais concerning Humphrey's handling of crime while Mayor of Minneapolis. Humphrey said he was flattered and honored by the Director's remarks since he has always held Mr. Hoover in the very highest esteem. Humphrey specifically requested SAC Held to obtain for him a copy of the Director's remarks on that occasion. However, Held made no commitments in this regard.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

(1) That the attached letter be sent to Congressman MacGregor.

(2) Since the Director's remarks (copy attached) concerning Humphrey at the 77th Session graduation of the FBI National Academy were publicly made and recorded, it is recommended that a copy of them be forwarded to Minneapolis for delivery to Humphrey.

Rep. Clark MacGregon laid seige today to Huber Humphrey's reputation as a crime-busting Minneapo lis mayor of the 1940s, saying the record reveals Humphrey's boasts as "fictitious."

The Republican Senate nominee produced a raft of FBI statistics showing major crime in Minneapolis increased 21/2 times as fast as the national average in 1946, Humphrey's first full year as mayor.

The congressman also displayed an Oct. 16 letter from FBI director J. Edgar Hoover which MacGregor said directly disproves a Humphrey claim to an FBI award for developing an effective law enforcement pprogram in the city.

"We have Hubert's claims, we have the FBI

figures, we have Mr. Hoo-Ter's letter," MacGregor raid at a morning news conference."

"My opponent has once again exhibited a lack of discipline between mind and tongue. The Hubert Humphrey credibility gap continues to widen.'

There was no immediate desponse from Humphrey, he DFL Senate nominee In the current campaign and in past contests, including his 1968 presiden-1 tial race with Richard Nixon. Humphrey has frequently asserted her "broke the back" of organized crime while mayor of Minnesota's largest

MacGregor's assault on Humphrey's crime-fight ing credentials opened the final week of a campaign

that has seen the congressman focus increas iligly on the former vice president's credibility.

Statistics released by MacGregor showed the major crime rate rising 17.6 percent in Minneapolis in 1946 compared with a 6.9 percent national in-

They also showed crime in Minneapolis increased 5½ times as fast during Humphrey's three years in office as during the three years following Humphrey's departure.

MacGregor said that if Humphrey's claims regarding organized crime were true, "I would have thought . . . gambling and vice arrests would have increased."

On Aug. 28, 1946, a newspaper article said that such arrests dropped during the first eight months.

MacGregor said he con-≼tacted Hoover by letter following an Oct. 7 television debate in which Humphrey made the following statement:

"I have been and I am an advocate of law and order. Change with order and order with change. As mayor of Minneapolis, I enforced the law in this acity. We broke the back of organized crime. We received the Federal Bureau of Investigation award for effective law enforcement."

MacGregor displayed a photostatic copy of Hoover's one-paragraph reply. It said in part, "For your information, the FBI has not granted an award of The type you describe."

"That is the record of which Hubert is so

proud," MacGregor said. 'That is the record for which he claims to have received an FBI award. It is a record of failure that campaign propaganda can't change. More than that, he has insulted the intelligence of Minnesotans everywhere ..."

MacGregor left immediately following the news conference for a campaign swing through southern Minnesota. Humphrey, regarded as an almost certen winner Nov. 3, was campaigning in the Twin Cities today.
