SYNOPSIS OF FACTS:

HUBERT HORATIO HUMPHREY, JR., attended Louisiana State University, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, from September 15, 1939 to June 24, 1940; received M. A. Degree on August 28, 1942, after writing his thesis on "The Political Philosophy of the New Deal". Two former professors class him as man of good character and morals, and a loyal American citizen. No credit or criminal record in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

AT BATON ROUGE, LOUISIANA

[REDACTED], Louisiana State University, advised that their records indicated HUMPHREY was born May 27, 1911 in Wallace, South Dakota, and that he had received a B. A. Degree from the University of Minnesota in 1939. He attended Louisiana State University from September 15, 1939 to June 24, 1940, scheduling Government and Economics courses. During this time he maintained an "A Minus" average, which is considered an excellent average. The records indicated that he passed his oral examination in Government for the M. A. Degree on June 24, 1940, and on August 28, 1942 he received his M. A. Degree after writing his thesis on "The Political Philosophy of the New Deal".

[REDACTED], Louisiana State University, advised he taught HUMPHREY while HUMPHREY attended the university working on his Master's Degree. He stated HUMPHREY was a "liberal", and explained that he meant by the term "liberal" that HUMPHREY was a strong supporter of legislation dealing with civil rights and fair employment practices. he said that he felt certain HUMPHREY was loyal to the United States and was not in sympathy with Communism or any other form of government except the democratic form of government which existed in this country. He classed HUMPHREY as a man of good character and morals, and said he had attempted to secure the services of HUMPHREY as an instructor at the university prior to the time HUMPHREY was elected Mayor of Minneapolis.

[REDACTED], Louisiana State University, stated he, too, had taught HUMPHREY at the university, and he was firmly convinced that HUMPHREY was a man of high principles, excellent character, and 100% loyal to the United States. HUMPHREY took three or four courses in Government while working on his Master's Degree, and in class he could always be expected to give a long discussion of the good side of any piece of New Deal legislation that was discussed. Since HUMPHREY held the opinion that there was absolutely nothing wrong with any New Deal legislation, he became involved in numerous arguments both in and out of class. [REDACTED] stated that from his dealings and conversations with HUMPHREY, HUMPHREY never gave the slightest indication at any time of leaning toward Communism or Socialism, and therefore he was thoroughly convinced that HUMPHREY was loyal to this country and the true democratic form of government which existed in this country. b7c

[REDACTED] was the head of the Graduate School at the time HUMPHREY secured his M. A. Degree, but RIPPIN is now deceased.

No local Baton Rouge address was available for HUMPHREY.

No record of HUMPHREY could be located at the Baton Rouge Police Department, the East Baton Rouge Sheriff's Office, or the Baton Rouge Credit Bureau.

AT DENVER, COLORADO:

Reference teletype advised that HUBERT HORATIO HUMPHREY, Jr. attended the Denver College of Pharmacy, Denver, Colorado, during 1932 and 1933.

A search of the Denver City Directories from 1932 to the present failed to disclose any school by the name of Denver College of Pharmacy.

[REDACTED] the Rocky Mountain Druggist, Inc., a publishing firm located at 1441 Welton Street, Denver, advised that HUMPHREY, the present Senator from the State of Minnesota, formerly attended the Capitol College of Pharmacy in Denver.

at times had been referred to as the Denver College of Pharmacy and the Colorado College of Pharmacy. According to [REDACTED] the Capitol College of Pharmacy has been out of existence since 1945 and records of students attending this school are no longer maintained. [REDACTED] was able to verify HUMPHREY's attendance at the school because he has followed the delegate's career with special interest. He recalled HUMPHREY distinctly and stated the latter was an outstanding student, capable and extremely hard-working.

[REDACTED] advised that the Capitol College of Pharmacy was not an accredited school and by way of explanation advised that the school only offered a four months preparatory course in pharmacy to persons seeking to pass State Pharmacy Board examinations. According to [REDACTED] recollection, HUMPHREY completed the four months course in 1932.

[REDACTED] advised he has only seen HUMPHREY on one occasion since that time, which was in 1947 when HUMPHREY delivered the main address at the Retail Druggists' Convention in Chicago. Following the speech, [REDACTED] and the delegate had a long conversation discussing mutual friends and acquaintances. He regarded HUMPHREY as a man of outstanding ability and integrity. He stated he has never heard anything unfavorable regarding the delegate and has no reason to question his honesty or loyalty to the United States. b7c

[REDACTED] the Colorado Pharmacal Association, Room 207 Kittredge Building, Denver, was interviewed. [REDACTED] He stated HUMPHREY was a student at that school during either the year 1932 or 1933 and completed the required course. He stated he had only a vague recollection of HUMPHREY but believed he was a capable student and excellent in every respect. He knew of nothing which would reflect unfavorably against the delegate.

Records of the Retail Credit Men's Association, Denver, failed to reflect any credit information concerning the delegate.

Records of the Denver Police Department contain no information concerning HUMPHREY.

Mr. HUMPHREY born South Dakota 1911; was outstanding high school student and graduated Magna Cum Laude University of Minnesota 1939. He worked in father's drug store in South Dakota and drug stores in Minneapolis, Minnesota; was teaching assistant, Political Science Department, University of Minnesota, and worked in Workers Education Program, WPA, later transferring to War Manpower Commission; served as newscaster on local radio station and was employed as professor of political science, Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota. He served as mayor of Minneapolis spring of 1945 to November 30, 1948, when he resigned after election to U. S. Senate. Former associates, employers and acquaintances consider him capable, enthusiastic, conscientious, honest and definitely a loyal American citizen.

DETAILS:

[REDACTED] Codington County, South Dakota, advised that the official records indicate that Mr. HUMPHREY was born at Wallace, South Dakota, May 27, 1911, the son of HUBERT H. HUMPHREY, a druggist and a native of Oregon, and CHRISTINE SARNES, age twenty-four, a native of Norway.

[REDACTED], Doland High School, Doland, South Dakota, advised that the school records indicate that Mr. HUMPHREY entered this school in the fall of 1925 and graduated May, 1929, as an outstanding student.

The records in the Office of the Dean of Admissions and Records, University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota, reflect that Mr. HUMPHREY enrolled in the University September 30, 1929, and after several years of absence from the University, received his B. A. Degree on June 17, 1939, Magna Cum Laude. The records also indicate that in 1940 and 1941, Mr. HUMPHREY was enrolled in four special courses of government and political science.

[REDACTED] South Dakota, stated that Mr. HUMPHREY worked in his father's drug store at Doland, South Dakota, during vacations, as well as during school years.

[REDACTED] Huron, South Dakota, related that Mr. HUMPHREY worked in his father's drug store after the HUMPHREYS moved to Huron in 1929 and up to the time he left Huron for Minnesota in about 1937.

[REDACTED] Brown's Drug Company, 600 Washington Avenue Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota, advised that Mr. HUMPHREY worked [REDACTED] from about 1937 to 1939 while attending the University of Minnesota. [REDACTED] characterized Mr. HUMPHREY as a very hard worker, conscientious, competent and one who was very well liked by all persons with whom he came in contact. [REDACTED] explained that Mr. HUMPHREY had previously worked for the Swoboda Drug Store near the University of Minnesota Campus, but explained that this drug store has been out of business for many years and the owner, Mr. SWOBODA, has been dead for quite some time.

[REDACTED] the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota, related that Mr. HUMPHREY was a teaching assistant for one school year in 1940-41 in the Political Science Department. He was extremely well liked by his associates and students, and [REDACTED] had no hesitancy whatsoever in recommending Mr. HUMPHREY for any type of assignment given to him by the United States Government.

[REDACTED] University of Minnesota, stated [REDACTED] knew him better later on when Mr. HUMPHREY became a member of the staff at the University. [REDACTED] recalls that Mr. HUMPHREY was exceedingly well liked by the students, and that Mr. HUMPHREY spearheaded a drive in the Democratic Farmer Labor movement in Minnesota to remove the Communists from that party. [REDACTED] regards Mr. HUMPHREY as a capable, competent, clear-thinking man, who, without a doubt, is a loyal American citizen. [REDACTED] further stated that he knows the members of HUMPHREY's family very well and stated they are all beyond reproach.

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[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] explained that Mr. HUMPHREY was employed in the Workers Education Program under the WPA and was hired expressly to counteract the influence that some members of Communist groups had in the Workers Education Program of the WPA. [REDACTED] commented that Mr. HUMPHREY did a very good job; that he has confidence in his ability to handle all his assignments in the best interest of his government. [REDACTED] explained that one of the reasons Mr. HUMPHREY was picked for the job in the Workers Education Program was because of his knowledge of labor elements, various groups of Communists and his ability to stand up to these people without being pushed around. [REDACTED] has no reason whatsoever to doubt Mr. HUMPHREY's loyalty to this country.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] related that he knew Mr. HUMPHREY quite well from 1941 to 1943, when Mr. HUMPHREY was director of the Workers Education Program under the WPA. This program, according to [REDACTED], was to educate labor in the history of labor and parliamentary law. Mr. HUMPHREY was selected to direct this program because of his good record and formal education. The work involved supervising and teaching educators, who, in turn, taught labor subjects to organized labor in the State of Minnesota. According to [REDACTED] this was an extremely difficult job in that it meant Mr. HUMPHREY had to get along with all factions of labor, including the so-called "left-wing" elements in the AFL and CIO. [REDACTED] firmly believes that Mr. HUMPHREY did an excellent job in creating a feeling of harmony between the various labor groups, and he was firm but still fair in running this department. He was very well liked by the people with whom he associated, and [REDACTED] considered Mr. HUMPHREY as an extremely capable and loyal employee.

[REDACTED]

[REDACTED] stated that he has known Mr. HUMPHREY for many years. He knew him while they were both associated with the WPA and verified Mr. HUMPHREY's employment with this agency. According to [REDACTED], Mr. HUMPHREY did a very excellent job stating that he is extremely enthusiastic about everything he undertakes. [REDACTED] described Mr. HUMPHREY as an ambitious, hard-working, honest, loyal American citizen with a good family background. Mr. HUMPHREY has an excellent family life in spite of his public life, according to [REDACTED] and is a man of high principles and Christian background.

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[REDACTED] Minneapolis, Minnesota, advised that the records of that station reflect that Mr. HUMPHREY did a daily news broadcast five nights a week from February 16, 1944, through June 10, 1944. [REDACTED] recalls that Mr. HUMPHREY was very well liked and readily accepted by staff members of Radio Station WTCN.

[REDACTED] St. Paul, Minnesota, explained that Mr. HUMPHREY was a professor of political science at this college for one year during 1944 and 1945. According to [REDACTED] Mr. HUMPHREY had a good understanding of political science and was hired under the condition that he was not to enter politics while employed by the college, which Mr. HUMPHREY agreed to. [REDACTED] recalls that Mr. HUMPHREY later was responsible for removing most of the Communist element out of the Democratic Farmer Labor Party and felt that this accomplishment on the part of Mr. HUMPHREY, in itself, was enough of a recommendation for any type of assignment which would be given to Mr. HUMPHREY. [REDACTED] stated that while at Macalester College, Mr. HUMPHREY was well liked by his associates and appeared to be very well grounded for politics both theoretically and practically. As far as [REDACTED] concerned, Mr. HUMPHREY is an honest, Christian man, whose loyalty to this country is beyond reproach.

[REDACTED] recalls that Mr. HUMPHREY was employed there for one year in the Political Science Department. He was extremely well liked by both students and faculty members and, according to [REDACTED] was considered an honest, loyal, capable man.

[REDACTED] described Mr. HUMPHREY as a realist, who was well liked by both labor and management in the State of Minnesota. [REDACTED] cited Mr. HUMPHREY's excellent record as mayor of Minneapolis as an indication of his attitude toward government and his desire for an honest, fair administration.

[REDACTED] considers Mr. HUMPHREY a good choice as a representative of this country because of his theoretical and practical political background. [REDACTED] also cited Mr. HUMPHREY's well-known record as a good administrator while mayor of Minneapolis and his efforts and success in purging the Democratic Farmer Labor Party of the Communists.

[REDACTED], Minneapolis, Minnesota, related that he has been a personal friend of Mr. HUMPHREY for many years and considers him honest and loyal. [REDACTED] believes that Mr. HUMPHREY is sincere in all his beliefs. Mr. HUMPHREY was mayor of Minneapolis from the spring of 1945 to November 30, 1948, when he resigned after being elected as United States Senator from Minnesota.

[REDACTED] Minneapolis, Minnesota, stated that he has no reason to doubt the honesty, integrity or loyalty of Mr. HUMPHREY.

[REDACTED] Minneapolis, Minnesota, explained that he has known Mr. HUMPHREY since he was mayor of Minneapolis. He considers him honest and sincere in his convictions. He believes that Mr. HUMPHREY places his country before politics and described him as a fair-minded, understanding man, who recognizes the problems of all people, especially labor.

[REDACTED] Huron, South Dakota, advised that he has known Mr. HUMPHREY and his parents, as well as his brother and sister living in Huron, for many years. He described them as fine citizens, who enjoy a splendid reputation in the community. [REDACTED] described Mr. HUMPHREY as an outstanding leader, who is honest, fearless and a man of integrity.

[REDACTED] South Dakota, advised that he has known Mr. HUMPHREY and all members of his family for many years and knew them well when they were residents of Doland. Mr. HUMPHREY's father owned and operated a drug store at Doland for several years and sold it in 1929, when he moved to Huron, South Dakota, where he opened a drug store. He was active in Huron until about a year ago, when he retired because of illness. The reputation and character of the entire family while residing in Doland was excellent and there was never any occasion to doubt or question the loyalty of any member of the family. Mr. HUMPHREY was an outstanding student, very aggressive and energetic in everything he did.

[REDACTED], Doland Public Schools, explained that she was acquainted with the HUMPHREY family and knew them to be leading citizens of the community.

[REDACTED], South Dakota, explained that he knows Mr. HUMPHREY and members of his family and considers Mr. HUMPHREY a strong booster of labor. [REDACTED] has no reason to doubt the loyalty of Mr. HUMPHREY.

[REDACTED] South Dakota, stated that he knows the HUMPHREY family and explained that they enjoyed a good reputation in Doland, South Dakota.

[REDACTED] Huron, South Dakota, considers Mr. HUMPHREY as an aggressive young politician, who has a great deal of ability and is a loyal American citizen.

[REDACTED] Rexall Drug Store, Huron, South Dakota, stated that there is no question in his mind but what Mr. HUMPHREY is a leader and a loyal American.

[REDACTED] Huron, South Dakota, stated that he knows Mr. HUMPHREY and members of his family. He explained that the character and reputation of Mr. HUMPHREY are beyond reproach. b7c

[REDACTED] advised that he knows Mr. HUMPHREY's family well and considers the entire family to be leaders, respectable citizens and loyal Americans.

[REDACTED] of St. Paul and Minneapolis, Minnesota, and Huron, South Dakota, contain no information reflecting on Mr. HUMPHREY's loyalty, integrity or honesty. b7d

[REDACTED] all advised that they have no record in their respective departments for Mr. HUMPHREY. No record was located in the St. Paul or Minneapolis, Minnesota, Police Departments. b7c

An article appearing in the St. Paul "Pioneer Press," a reputable daily newspaper, for October 15, 1949, related that Senator HUMPHREY told 3,500 eastern New York state school teachers at Albany, New York, that this nation was suffering a wave of "mass hysteria" over Communism and stated further: -

"These people who are sponsoring this mass hysteria actually are striking out against any manifestation of independent, creative thought. These Communists are just a nuisance, like fleas on a dog. We see evidence of this witch-hunting hysteria in all sorts of loyalty investigations, investigations of teachers, attempts to purge the schools and to censor the school books. It is an insult to the American people to tell them a handful of zealots are capable of turning America topsy-turvy."

[REDACTED] Correspondence Section, Bureau of Employment Statistics, Department of Labor, made available their records which reflected that the delegate was born May 27, 1911, at Wallace, South Dakota. He entered on duty March 1, 1943, as Administrative Officer, Office of the Chief of Operations, War Manpower Commission, Minnesota Region, and resigned voluntarily without prejudice, May 13, 1943. This file contained no derogatory or disloyal information.

According to the official Congressional Directory for the 81st Congress, First Session, issued February 15, 1949, the delegate is a Democrat of Minnesota, who was born at Wallace, South Dakota, on May 27, 1911, and was elected to the United States Senate on November 2, 1948, for the term ending January 3, 1955.

[REDACTED] advised that she was acquainted with the delegate and his wife, and, although, they had not lived in this neighborhood for too long a time, they appeared to be exceedingly nice persons who were of unquestioned character, reputation, loyalty, and patriotism.

MISCELLANEOUS

The files of the House Committee on Un-American Activities reflect HUBERT HUMPHREY was the initiating sponsor of the Minnesota Division of the Independent Citizen's Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions; source of this information is a letterhead dated September 28, 1946. As you will recall we received a request from the Labor Department to conduct an investigation of Senator Humphrey as a delegate for the International Labor Organization. These investigations are conducted under Public Law 843 of the 80th Congress. Senator Humphrey was advised of this investigation prior to its institution. This investigation has now been completed and is ready for transmittal to the State Department.

During the course of this investigation considerable derogatory disloyal information concerning the Senator was ascertained. In the main it showed Senator Humphrey's close connection with known Communists and Communist infiltrated organizations in connection with his election for mayor of Minneapolis in 1945. It is apparent from the information developed that this association on the part of Humphrey was for political purposes and that he himself used the Communists for his own personal gain rather than espousing their doctrines.

Senator Humphrey, during the course of an interview with a Special Agent of the Bureau in 1945, admitted that he was a liberal and that he had had to associate with Communists for political reasons. He advised that he had no use for the Communists as such.

The derogatory information which follows appears on the Administrative pages of the Minneapolis report which are being deleted from the report before transmittal to the State Department. It is felt that the information contained therein would not help the State Department in its determination of the desirability of Senator Humphrey to act as a delegate, as it shows no connection between Humphrey and the Communist Party for other than political reasons. Further it is not known the ultimate disposition which the State Department will make of this report and in fairness to Senator Humphrey it is felt that this information should not be passed amongst other Government agencies:

"These people who are sponsoring this mass hysteria actually are striking out against any manifestation of independent, creative thought. These Communists are just a nuisance, like fleas on a dog. We see evidence of this witch-hunting hysteria in all sorts of loyalty investigations, investigations of teachers, attempts to purge the schools and to censor the school books. It is an insult to the American people to tell them a handful of zealots are capable of turning America topsy-turvy."

On March 12, 1946, Mr. HUMPHREY, who was then mayor of Minneapolis, was interviewed by [REDACTED] During the course of the interview, Mr. HUMPHREY advised that he was a liberal, but that he was a

Democrat and had an intense dislike and almost hatred for the Communists. He stated he realized that the Communist Party worked aggressively for him in the municipal election held in the spring of 1945, and he further realized that he has had to associate with some Communist Party members. He stated, however, that he has done everything in his power to disassociate himself from any Communist Party members. HUMPHREY advised that he is familiar with most of the Communist Party members with whom he associated.

HUMPHREY'S CAR, A CONVERTIBLE WITH THE TOP CLOSED, DROVE AWAY UNSCATHED BUT THE FOLLOWING PRESS AND OFFICIAL CARS WERE HIT BY A COUPLE OF STONES AND THUMPED BY THE DEMONSTRATORS WITH THEIR FISTS.

THE DEMONSTRATORS UNFURLED A BANNER ALMOST 10 FEET LONG WHICH SAID: "WE CONDEMN UNITED STATES IMPERIALISTS."

THE DEMONSTRATORS MILLED AROUND THE WIDE BOULEVARD IN FRONT OF THE SITE WHERE A MONUMENT TO PATRICE LUMUMBA, THE CONGO'S FIRST PREMIER, IS BEING BUILT.

ONLY SCATTERED GROUPS TURNED OUT ELSEWHERE TO SEE HUMPHREY'S ARRIVAL BECAUSE TODAY IS A HOLIDAY MARKING THE JAN. 4, 1959, ANTI-BELGIAN RIOT WHICH LED TO CONGOLESE INDEPENDENCE. THE KINSHASHA STOP IS HUMPHREY'S FOURTH ON A NINE-NATION AFRICAN TOUR.

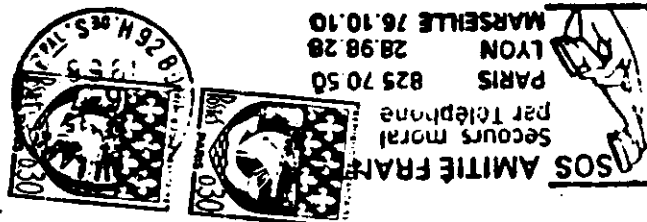



RUTH L. BONDE, Chairman, Department of Home Economics, Northwestern University College of Arts and Sciences, Evanston, Illinois, was contacted by the interviewing Agent at her offices. She indicated that her schedule was such that she would be unable to be interviewed in person for several days and requested that she furnish any information which she had telephonically.

BONDE indicated that she received through the mails an envelope which was postmarked in France. This envelope contained a cartoon depicting Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY and President LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON. Beneath the faces of these two men was a road adjacent to which appeared tombs marked M. LUTHER KING, R. KENNEDY, and J.F. KENNEDY. In addition, was the statement:

"The tombs of J.F. KENNEDY, M.L. KING, and ROBERT F. KENNEDY are milestones in the 'great society' of L.B. JOHNSON and H.H. HUMPHREY. If you prefer

- racial injustice and violence
- the unpopular, dirty war in Viet Nam
- the dollar crisis
- attempts on the life of popular statesmen

vote for H.H. HUMPHREY for President."

This letter contained no other literature and was addressed to her at her home, 1511 Hinman Avenue, Evanston, Illinois. She has discussed the receipt of this literature with other members of the faculty at Northwestern University but to date she has not heard of anyone else receiving similar communications.

She sent this literature to Mr. HUMPHREY in Washington shortly after she received it. She indicated that she had no idea of any individual or group in France who might have sent this literature to her. She has no friends or acquaintances currently living in France, but did meet several French people at a meeting of the International Federation of Home Economics held in Bristol, England in July of this year. She did not feel that any of the persons she met at this convention were



BONDE stated that she is not actively engaged in political activity at either the national or local level. She is a member of the Evanston Democratic Club but holds no office in this organization and does not participate to any great degree. She does not engage in any political activity with faculty or student groups on the Northwestern Campus and is not a member of any civil rights organizations. She stated that she has never actively campaigned for any candidate for public office although she did make a financial contribution to the Senatorial campaign of Senator DOUGLAS of Illinois in 1966.

Archbishop LEO BINZ was interviewed at the Jesuit Retreat House and advised that he received a hate-type, scurrilous type of campaigning material impugning reputation of Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY, which was received through the mail sometime in mid September, 1968. The envelope was addressed to him at his St. Paul, Minnesota, residence and bore a French post stamp indicating it had been mailed in France. He stated the postmark was blurred and not decipherable and he promptly forwarded this material to Vice President HUMPHREY in Washington, D.C.

Archbishop BINZ advised that he has no idea of the source of this material except he was positive it did not emanate from the United States. He stated that he had made inquiries and had not developed any information indicating that subject material was received by other hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church. He stated he did not know anyone in France who may have a contributory influence in the transmission of this type of material.

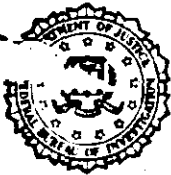

On October 23, 1968, Mr. Samuel J. Archibald, Executive Director, Fair Campaign Practices Committee, Inc., 328 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation the only information he has received regarding printed matter mailed from France intended to "smear" Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey consists of information furnished by the Vice President's office which consisted of two letters sent to the Vice President by two private citizens identified as Archbishop Leo Binz of 366 Summit Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota, and Ruth L. Bonde, 1511 Hinman Avenue, Evanston, Illinois. Both of these individuals wrote to the Vice President enclosing identical drawings depicting Vice President Humphrey and President Lyndon B. Johnson against a background of the American Flag. Underneath the drawings of Vice President Humphrey and President Johnson were drawings of the graves of John F. and Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King. In addition, the drawing depicted a group of individuals who appeared to be dressed in robes as worn by Ku Klux Klansmen.

Accompanying the drawing was a printed form stating that the tombs of the Kennedy brothers and Martin Luther King were milestones in the "Great Society" of Vice President Humphrey and President Johnson. The form warned the reader that if one prefers racial injustice and violence, the war in Vietnam, the dollar crisis and attempts on the lives of statesmen, then he should vote for Humphrey. He said he routinely forwarded this matter to the Justice Department.

The General Accounting Office has referred to the Attorney General the Committee for the Nomination of Hubert H. Humphrey, Inc. for failure to timely report receipts of approximately \$460,000 and expenditures of approximately \$420,000 during the period of April 7, 1972 to February 28, 1973. During that period, the Committee reported receipts and expenditures of approximately \$2,600,000. In the summer of 1973 the Committee filed amended reports to correct the previous omissions.

The Committee, through its attorneys, presented a detailed analysis of the reporting omissions and the reasons therefor. According to the analysis, there appear to be two principal reasons for the reporting omissions. First, the Committee assumed responsibility for record-keeping and reporting on behalf of all state and local committees supporting Humphrey throughout the nation without exercising adequate supervision. Second, the Committee implemented a computerized record-keeping system without adequate checks and controls.

The Committee concludes that all reporting omissions were due to inadvertence and mistake; not to any concerted plan to conceal information.

Attached as Exhibit A is a list of the state and local committees which appear to be responsible for the majority of the transactions which were not reported by the Committee on a timely basis. Please note that each list contains the name and address of the committee Treasurer, along with the details of the significant unreported transactions.

In order to determine the reasons for the reporting errors, it is requested that the Bureau interview each of the Treasurers. In each instance, determine the method employed for reporting receipts and expenditures to the national Committee. Determine whether or not the Treasurer received confirmation of receipt of the information from the national Committee. Also determine if the Treasurer employed a system for informing the national committee of the receipt of specific significant contributions, such as, for example, a \$5,000 or \$10,000 contribution. Obtain documentation wherever possible.

With regard to the Los Angeles Committee, determine why no reports were sent to the National Committee after June 27, 1972. Determine when and how the National Committee ultimately received the information not reported after June 27, 1972. Determine whether or not the Treasurer was instructed not to report after June 27, 1972. The Committee's analysis of errors also indicates that the June 26, 1972 report of the Los Angeles Committee and the June 1, 1972 report of the Los Angeles Dinner Committee were not received. Determine how and when the Treasurer learned the reports were not received and how and when he originally and ultimately informed the Committee of the information contained in those reports.

With regard to the New Jersey Committee, the analysis of errors indicated that the report for the period including May 26, 1972 through June 7, 1972 was not received by the reporting clerk. Determine how and when the Treasurer learned the reports were not received, and how and when he originally and ultimately informed the Committee of the information contained in the reports. Please obtain the same information with regard to the Nebraska Committee, the San Francisco Committee, the Minnesotans for Humphrey Committee and the San Diego Committee.

Because of the three-year statute of limitations it is requested that these interviews be conducted as soon as is practicable.
