he said that he felt certain HULTHREY was loyal to the United States and was not in sympathy with Communism or any other form of government except the democratic form of government which existed in this country. He classed HUMPHREY as a man of good character and morals, and said he had attempted to secure the services of HUMPHREY as an instructor at the university prior to the time HUMPHREY was elected Mayor of Minneapolis.

State University, stated he, too, had taught HUMPHREY at the university, and he was firmly convinced that HUMPHREY was a man of high principles, excellent character, and 100% loyal to the United States. HUMPHREY took three or four courses in Government while working on his Master's Degree, and in class he could always be expected to give a long discussion of the good side of any piece of New Deal legislation that was discussed. 



As you will recall we received a request from the Labor Department to conduct an investigation of Senator Humphrey as a delegate for the International Labor Organization. These investigations are conducted under Public Law 843 of the 80th Congress. Senator Humphrey was advised of this investigation prior to its institution. This investigation has now been completed and is ready for transmittal to the State Department.

During the course of this investigation considerable derogatory disloyal information concerning the Senator was ascertained.
In the main it showed Senator Humphrey's close connection with
known Communists and Communist infiltrated organizations in connection with his election for mayor of Minneapolis in 1945. It is
apparent from the information developed that this association on the
part of Humphrey was for political purposes and that he himself
used the Communists for his own personal gain rather than espousing
their doctrines.

Senator Humphrey, during the course of an interview with a Special Agent of the Bureau in 1945, admitted that he was a liberal and that he had had to associate with Communists for political reasons. He advised that he had no use for the Communists as such.

The deregatory information which follows appears on the Administrative pages of the Minneapolis report which are being deleted from the report before transmittal to the State Department. It is felt that the information contained therein would not help the State Department in its determination of the desirability of Senator Humphrey to act as a delegate, as it shows no connection between Humphrey and the Communist Party for other than political reasons. Further it is not known the ultimate disposition which the State Department will make of this report and in fairness to Senator Humphrey it is felt that this information should not be passed amongst other Government agencies:



The House Un-American Activities Committee in its report in 1946 cited the Abraham Lincoln School as a Communist front. The Department of Justice named this school as an adjunct of the Communist Farty on November 24, 1947.



The official letterhead in 1946 of the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences and Professions, Inc., 1209 Fourth Street Southeast, Minneapolis, Minnesota, listed the delegate HULTORITY as an initiating sponsor of this organization. This letterhead also listed the names of fourteen directors, which included MIRIDEL LeSUEUR, previously identified, SA CASON, SYLVESTURE, and A. FATARAS.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities on page 262 of report 1948 cites the Independent Citizens Committee of the Arts, Sciences, and Professions as follows: "This Communist front grew out of the Independent Voter's Committee of the Arts and Sciences."

An article appearing in the "Minnesota Daily," official organ of the University of Minnesota in 1946, related that COFSON promoted Mussian interests and policies in forums and lectures at the University of Minnesota.

The California Committee on Un-American Activities on page 318 of report 1948 cites the American Association of Scientific Workers as follows: "Included among the Communist fronts represented at the Win the Peace Conference in Washington, D. C., April 5-7, 1946."

An article appearing in the St. Paul "Pioneer Press," a reputable daily newspaper, for October 15, 1949, related that Senator HUMPHREY told 3,500 eastern New York state school teachers at Albany, New York, that this nation was suffering a wave of "mass hysteria" over Communism and stated further: -

"These people who are sponsoring this mass hysteria actually are striking out against any manifestation of independent, creative thought. These Communists are just a nuisance, like fleas on a cog. We see evidence of this witch-hunting hysteria in all sorts of loyalty investigations, investigations of teachers, attempts to purge the schools and to censor the school books. It is an insult to the American people to tell them a handful of zealots are capable of turning America topsy-turvy."

On Earch 12, 1946. Ar. HULPHREY, who was then mayor of Linneapolis, was interviewed by Lineapolis, but that he was a liberal, but that he was a

Democrat and had an intense dislike and almost hatred for the Communists. He stated he realized that the Communist Farty worked aggressively for him in the municipal election held in the spring of 1945, and he further realized that he has had to associate with some Communist Party members. He stated, however, that he has done everything in his power to disassociate himself from any Communist Party members. HUMPHREY advised that he is familiar with most of the Communist Party members with whom he





The Department by a memorandum advised the Fair Campaign Practices Committee has forwarded to the Attorney General Anonymous Campaign material concerning Vice President Humphrey. A letter was received by the Vice President from Ruth L. Bonde of Northwestern University and Archbishop Leo Binz of St. Paul, Minneapolis, calling attention to the literature, which was mailed in France. Both of these letters described the literature as malicious and vicious. The Department is requesting an investigation under Title 18, U. S. Code, Section 612, to determine the source of this material. The respective divisions are being instructed to conduct interviews and surep to the Bureau.

Mr. Brown of the Department advised on 10-15-68 that the investigation at this time should be limited to the three interviews as it may not be in the best interest to further investigate this matter.

RUTH L. BONDE, Chairman, Department of Home Economics, Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois, advised she received malicious mail concerning President L.B. JOHNSON and Vice President H.H. HUMPHREY. This mail was postmarked in France. BONDE had no idea of source of material and indicated she was not active politically. Her only association with Vice President HUMPHREY was the fact that she served on the faculty with him at Mc Allister College, St. Paul, Minnesota.

DETAILS:

FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Date October 21, 1968

RUTH L. BONDE, Chairman, Department of Home Economics, Northwestern University College of Arts and Sciences, Evanston, Illinois, was contacted by the interviewing Agent at her offices. She indicated that her schedule was such that she would be unable to be interviewed in person for several days and requested that she furnish any information which she had telephonically.

BONDE indicated that she received through the mails an envelope which was postmarked in France. This envelope contained a cartoon depicting Vice President HUBERT H. HUMIHREY and President LYNDON BAINES JOHNSON. Beneath the faces of these two men was a road adjacent to which appeared tombs marked H. LUTHER KING, R KENNEDY, and J.F. KENNEDY. In addition, was the statement:

. "The tombs of J.F. KENNEDY, M.L. KING, and ROBERT F. KENNEDY are milestones in the 'great society' of L.B. JOHNSON and H.H. HUMHREY. If you prefer

- racial injustice and violence
- the unpopular, dirty war in Viet Nam
- the dollar crisis
- attemts on the life of popular statesmen vote for H.H. HUMTHREY for President."

This letter contained no other literature and was addressed to her at her home, 1511 Himman Avenue, Evanston, Illinois. She has discussed the receipt of this literature with other members of the faculty at Northwestern University but to date she has not heard of anyone else receiving similar communications.

She sent this literature to Mr. HUMA HREY in Washington shortly after she received it. She indicated that she had no idea of any individual or group in France who might have sent this literature to her. She has no friends or acquaintances currently living in France, but did meet several French people at a meeting of the International Federation of Home Economics held in Bristol, England in July of this year. She did not feel that any of the persons she met at this convention were



involved in this matter and indicated that no political matters whatsoever were discussed at this meeting.

BONDE stated that she is not actively engaged in political activity at either the national or local level. She is a member of the Evanston Democratic Club but holds no office in this organization and does not participate to any great degree. She does not engage in any political activity with faculty or student groups on the Northwestern Campus and is not a member of any civil rights organizations. She stated that she has never actively campaigned for any candidate for public office although she did make a financial contribution to the Senatorial campaign of Senator DOUGLAS of Illinois in 1966.

She indicated that the only connection she might have with Vice Iresident HUMFHREY was the fact that she was a member of the Home Economics Department at Nc Allister College, St. Isul, Minhesota, at the same time that Mr. HUMPHREY was connected with the Political Science Department of that institution. At that time, she had a casual acquaintance with Mr. HUMPHREY but doubts that Me would remember her at this time.

Archbishop LEO BINZ was interviewed at the Jesuit Retreat House and advised that he received a hate-type, scurrilous type of campaigning material impugning reputation of Vice President HUBERT H. HUMPHREY, which was received through the mail sometime in mid September, 1968. The envelope was addressed to him at his St. Paul, Minnesota, residence and bore a French post stamp indicating it had been mailed in France. He stated the postmark was blurred and not decipherable and he promptly forwarded this material to Vice President HUMPHREY in Washington, D.C.

Archbishop BINZ advised that he has no idea of the source of this material except he was positive it did not emanate from the United States. He stated that he had made inquiries and had not developed any information indicating that subject material was received by other hierarchy of the Roman Catholic Church. He stated he did not know anyone in France who may have a contributory influence in the transmission of this type of material.

On October 23, 1968, Mr. Samuel J. Archibald, Executive Director, Fair Campaign Practices Committee, Inc., 328 Pennsylvania Avenue, N. W., advised a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation the only information he has received regarding printed matter mailed from France intended to "smear" Vice President Hubert H. Humphrey consists of information furnished by the Vice President's office which consisted of two letters sent to the Vice President by two private citizens identified as Archbishop Leo Binz of 366 Summit Avenue, Saint Paul, Minnesota, and Ruth L. Bonde, 1511 Hinman Avenue, Evanston, Illinois. Both of these individuals wrote to the Vice President enclosing identical drawings depicting Vice President Humphrey and President Lyndon B. Johnson against a background of the American Flag. Underneath the drawings of Vice President Humphrey and President Johnson were drawings of the graves of John F. and Robert F. Kennedy and Martin Luther King. In addition, the drawing depicted a group of individual's who appeared to be dressed in robes as worn by Ku Klux Klansmen.

Accompanying the drawing was a printed form stating that the tombs of the Kennedy brothers and Martin Luther King were milestones in the "Great Society" of Vice President Humphrey and President Johnson. The form warned the reader that if one prefers racial injustice and violence, the war in Vietnam, the dollar crisis and attempts on the lives of statesmen, then he should vote for Humphrey. He said he routinely forwarded this matter to the Justice Department.

Committee for the Nomination of Hubert H. Humphrey, Inc.; Possible Violations of 2 U.S.C. 434(b)

The General Accounting Office has referred to the Attorney General the Committee for the Nomination of Hubert H. Humphrey, Inc. for failure to timely report receipts of approximately \$460,000 and expenditures of approximately \$420,000 during the period of April 7, 1972 to February 28, 1973. During that period, the Committee reported receipts and expenditures of approximately \$2,600,000. the summer of 1973 the Committee filed amended reports to correct the previous omissions.

The Committee, through its attorneys, presented a detailed analysis of the reporting ommissions According to the and the reasons therefor. analysis, there appear to be two principal reasons for the reporting omissions. First, the Committee assumed responsibility for record-keeping and reporting on behalf of all state and local committees supporting Humphrey throughout the fation without exercising adequate supervision. Second, the Committee implemented a computerizefi record-keeping

system without adequate checks and controls.

The Committee concludes that all reporting omissions were due to inadvertance and mistake; 15 JUL 8 1975 not to any concerted plan to conceal information.

Attached as Exhibit A is a list of the state and local committees which appear to be responsible for the majority of the transactions which were not reported by the Committee on a timely basis. Please note that each list contains the name and address of the committee Treasurer, along with the details of the significant unreported transactions.

In order to determine the reasons for the reporting errors, it is requested that the Bureau interview each of the Treasurers. In each instance, determine the method employed for reporting receipts and expenditures to the national Committee. Determine whether or not the Treasurer received confirmation of receipt of the information from the national Committee. Also determine if the Treasurer employed a system for informing the national committee of the receipt of specific significant contributions, such as, for example, a \$5,000 or \$10,000 contribution. Obtain documentation wherever possible.

With regard to the Los Angeles Committee, determine why no reports were sent to the National Committee after June 27, 1972. Determine when and how the National Committee ultimately received the information not reported after June 27, 1972. Determine whether or not the Treasurer was instructed not to report after June 27, 1972. The Committee's analysis of errors also indicates that the June 26, 1972 report of the Los Angeles Committee and the June 1, 1972 report of the Los Angeles Dinner Committee were not received. Determine how and when the Treasurer learned the reports were not received and how and when he originally and ultimately informed the Committee of the information contained in those reports.

With regard to the New Jersey Committee, the analysis of errors indicated that the report for the period including May 26, 1972 through June 7, 1972 was not received by the reporting clerk. Determine how and when the Treasurer learned the reports were not received, and how and when he originally and ultimately informed the Committee of the information contained in the reports. Please obtain the same information with regard to the Nebraska Committee, the San Francisco Committee, the Minnesotans for Humphrey Committee and the San Diego Committee.

Because of the three-year statute of limitations it is requested that these interviews be conducted as soon as is practicable.
