Synopsis: Open and assign captioned matter.

Details: On 02/03/2012, at approximately 10:15am, the Anchorage Police Department (APD) requested assistance in the investigation of the suspected robbery and/or kidnapping of Samantha Koenig, date of birth (DOB) 08/30/1993, which was believed to have occurred at approximately 8:00pm, on 02/01/2012. Koenig was working alone at the Common Grounds coffee stand, which is located near the intersection of Tudor Road and Fairbanks Street in Anchorage, at the time of this incident. According to APD, surveillance video footage and information received from Koenig's boss and boyfriend (different individuals) appears to support that she was robbed and/or kidnapped during the aforementioned incident.

APD has been and continues to aggressively pursue all available leads, but has not yet been able to locate Koenig or conclusively determine if she was robbed and/or kidnapped. In particular, APD requested assistance in the location of Koenig's cellular telephone bearing number (907) 884-8370, which she appears to have been using immediately prior to, and possibly after said robbery and/or kidnapping. Consequently, it is recommended that captioned matter be opened and assigned.

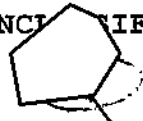

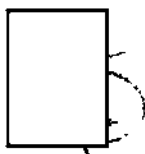

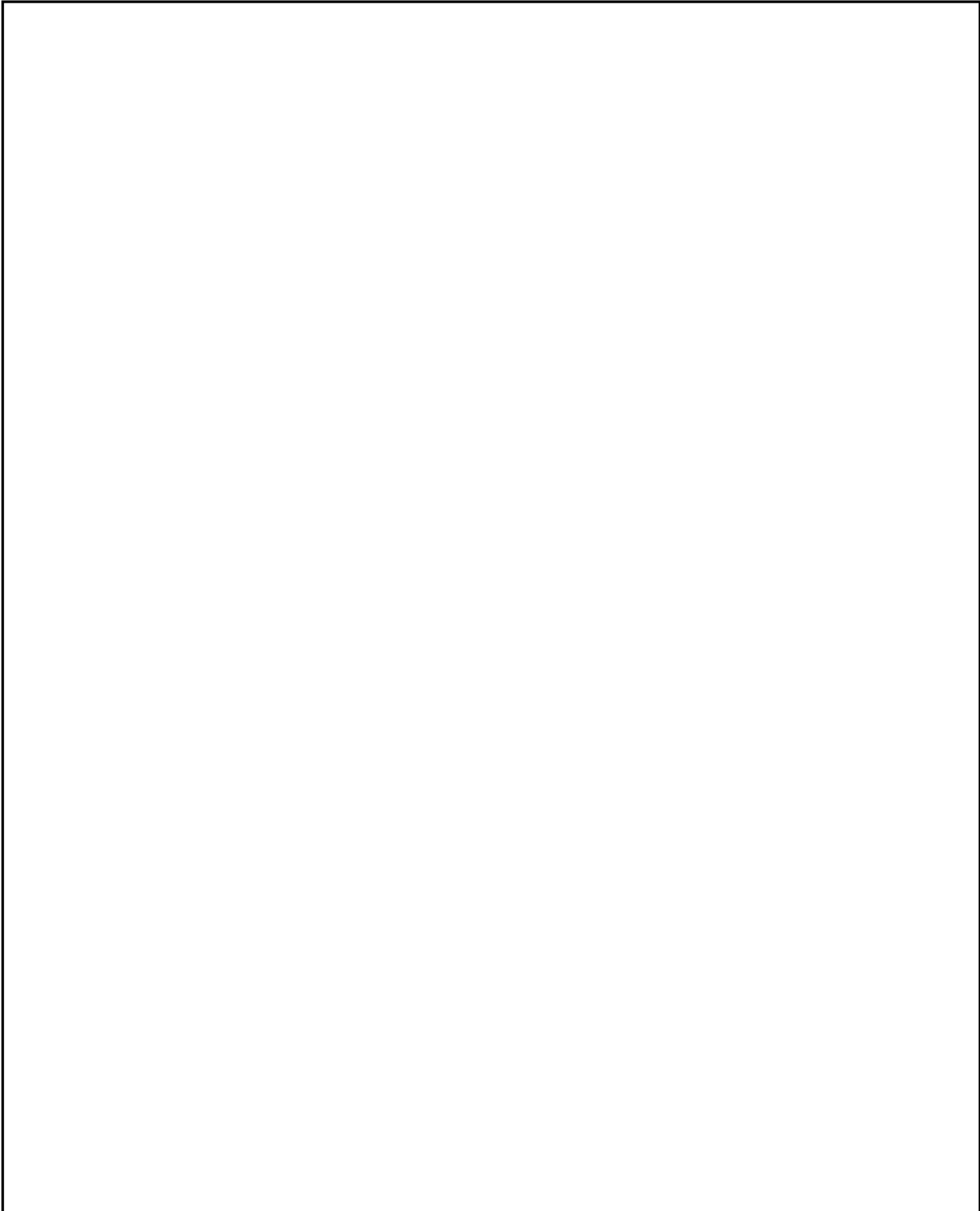

Complainant contacted FBI Anchorage on 2/12/2012 at approximately 6:45pm and advised that he was in the APD parking lot and wanted to provide information about Samantha Koenig ("Samantha") to law enforcement, however, did not entirely trust APD. Complainant stated that he believed his GCI cell phone was cloned and wanted to talk in person. Complainant agreed to meet at the FBI office with writer. Writer met with complainant at the FBI office between approximately 730pm and 930pm.



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The above information was provided to SSA [redacted] Writer then contacted APD Lt. [redacted] and told her the highlights of the above information. Lt. [redacted] advised that some of this information was not known by APD and she would have Det. [redacted] come to the FBI to interview complainant in one hour. About five minutes later, writer received call from Det. [redacted] advised that [redacted] had contacted her earlier in the day with the information told to him by complainant. [redacted] advised that [redacted] had already provided a sworn statement to APD. [redacted] was dismissive of the information provided by writer and described it as "drug drama" and advised writer to encourage complainant to contact [redacted] the following morning to meet and be interviewed at APD.

After talking with Lt. [redacted] writer told complainant that Det. [redacted] would be coming over to interview him. However, after writer heard from Det. [redacted] and she advised that she wasn't going to interview complainant tonight and that he would have to meet her at APD in the morning, complainant became frustrated that his information wasn't being taken seriously. Complainant then advised that he had made calls to individuals (NFI) earlier in the day that worked towards finding and [redacted] (NFI). Complainant explained that there was a plan [redacted] and coordinate an exchange for Samantha. Writer does not know to what extent complainant was involved in this plan. Complainant advised that he would not likely be able to meet with [redacted] the following morning, but would call her to discuss. Writer advised complainant to lay low and not take any proactive action against or for any of the individuals involved in this case. Complainant agreed that he would lay low and not take proactive actions.

After terminating the interview with complainant, writer advised SSA [redacted] of the above information.

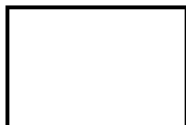

On the evening of 02/24/2012, [redacted] [redacted] received a text message from her telephone. The message gave [redacted] instructions on how to find the location of a note placed in a local Anchorage park. [redacted] notified APD and led investigators to this note along with what appeared to be a photograph [redacted] Koenig. Also displayed in this photograph is the front page of the Anchorage Daily News from 02/13/2012. Whoever wrote the note demanded \$30,000.00 be placed on a VISA debit card, issued by a local Credit Union. The author provided no deadline for when this deposit was to be made nor outline any consequences for failure to do so.

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The surveillance video, recent activity on Koenig's cellular telephone, along with the demand note and photograph, indicate Koenig may have been kidnaped. However, the note's placement in a local park, the use of a local Credit Union debit card, along with no apparent use of her cellular telephone outside of the coverage area, suggest Koenig may still be in Alaska.

APD investigation to date yields no conclusive evidence regarding Koenig's location or possible transport in interstate or foreign commerce. Furthermore, due to its need of technical and analytical resources, the APD has requested assistance from the FBI.

In view of the above, the Anchorage Division is converting this matter from a 343G (Domestic Police Cooperation) classification to a 7A (Kidnaping). Investigative efforts during [redacted] will focus on establishing whether or not Koenig has left the state of Alaska.

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SA [redacted] will remain the case agent.

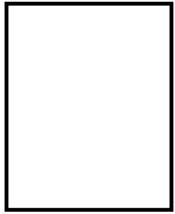

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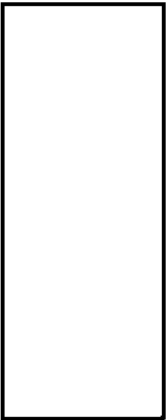

Results of Examinations:

The requested latent print examinations were conducted, but no latent prints were detected.

Methods:

Items of evidence submitted to the Latent Print Operations Unit for examination may be examined visually, examined with various light sources, and/or processed with chemicals and powders to detect the presence of latent friction ridge prints. The specific sequence of examinations and processes depends upon the nature of the evidence.

Friction ridge print examinations are conducted using the Analysis, Comparison, Evaluation, and Verification methodology (ACE-V), which includes an assessment of the quantity and quality of the information present. The steps of ACE-V are applied to each examination as appropriate.

Analysis is the assessment of a friction ridge print to determine if sufficient reliable details are present to conduct a comparison with another print and to reach an identification conclusion. If these conditions are met, the print is determined to be of value.

Comparison is the direct side-by-side observation of friction ridge prints of value to determine whether or not the information in two prints is in agreement.

Evaluation is the formulation of a conclusion based on the information gathered during the analysis and comparison of the friction ridge prints.

Conclusions that can be reached are as follows:

- Identification - the determination that there is sufficient quality and quantity of detail in agreement to conclude that two friction ridge prints originated from the same source.
- Exclusion - the determination that there is sufficient quality and quantity of detail in disagreement to conclude that two friction ridge prints did not originate from the same source.
- Inconclusive - the determination that corresponding areas of friction ridge prints are absent and/or unreliable and therefore cannot be identified or excluded.

Verification is the independent application of the analysis, comparison, and evaluation phases of the ACE-V methodology to a friction ridge print by another examiner.

Interpretations:

Due to the many factors involved in the deposition of a friction ridge print, neither the absence of a friction ridge print on evidence nor the exclusion of a friction ridge print with a given source disassociate that source from having touched the evidence.

AFFIDAVIT OF

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I, being first duly sworn on oath, hereby depose and state:

1. That since December 1997 I have been employed as a police officer with the Municipality of Anchorage. Upon graduation of a twenty-one week police academy, I completed fourteen weeks of field training and was assigned to patrol until May 2001. At this time I was promoted to the Special Assignment Unit, which specialized in conducting investigations into street level drugs, gambling, and prostitution.
2. In March 2002 I was promoted to Detective and assigned to the Burglary Unit at APD. In June 2002 I became a part of the

Metro Drug Unit until July 2007, when I was assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration as a Task Force Officer until January 2012, when I was assigned to the Anchorage Police Department Homicide Unit and am currently assigned there.

3. Prior to being hired at the Anchorage Police Department, I graduated from Northern Michigan University with a Bachelor's Degree in Science. The focus of the degree was a major in Criminal Justice and a minor in Psychology. In December 2003 I obtained a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from Boston University.
4. I have also completed an additional forty- hour advanced course in Crime Scene Processing and a forty- hour advanced course in Accident Investigation, as well as a forty- hour Detective Academy taught by the Anchorage Police Department. Additionally, I have completed a forty- hour course in clandestine drug laboratories from the Drug Enforcement Administration.
5. I have also completed an eighty-hour course of instruction in Basic Drug Investigations conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration's training staff. This school trained me in state and federal drug laws, development of probable cause, search and seizure law, drug identification and field testing, informant handling, marijuana eradication, surveillance techniques, street lingo, packaging and pricing, transportation and distribution of drugs. I also received

- formal and supervised hands-on training in the field testing of cocaine, heroin, Methamphetamine and marijuana.
6. In July of 2005, I conceptualized, wrote, and instituted the drug field testing class at the Anchorage Police Department Police academy, and am currently the lead instructor for that course.
 7. On September 7th, 2006 I was qualified as an expert witness in drug paraphernalia in front of the honorable Judge Wolverton in Alaska Superior Court. In July 2007, I was qualified as an expert drug witness in front of the honorable Judge McKay in Alaska Superior Court. I have been qualified and testified as an expert witness in narcotics distribution in Alaska State grand jury proceedings approximately fifty (50) times in the past three years.
 8. During my tenure as a police officer, I have conducted and/or participated in numerous investigations relating to the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, and I have become familiar with devices, paraphernalia, techniques, and practices used by people engaged in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances. I have conducted and/or participated in investigations which have resulted in the seizure of marijuana, marijuana grow operations, cocaine hydrochloride, cocaine base (crack), opium, PCP, heroin, ketamine, methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA/ecstasy),

methamphetamine, methamphetamine laboratories, prescription medications, firearms, pagers, cellular telephones, surveillance systems, cameras, memory cards, computers, documents, money, and precious metals. I have also conducted numerous interviews of people involved in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, adding to my knowledge of the illegal drug culture in the Anchorage area. In addition to my formal training and experience, I have gained knowledge and insight by working and speaking with many experienced law enforcement agents from local, state, and federal agencies, and I consider this knowledge and insight to be an integral part of my experience and training.

9. I have worked as an undercover officer for prostitution and controlled substance cases and have assisted other Detectives with controlled substance cases as photographer, surveillance officer, evidence custodian, and entry/search team member. I have been the case officer on drug cases, assigning and directing other officers in the investigations. I have also acted as a Control Officer for handling Cooperating Sources in controlled substance cases.

INVESTIGATION

10. I am currently assisting in the investigation of APD case 12-5307, a kidnapping investigation. The following information is based upon either my own observations or the

observations of other Anchorage Police Officers conveyed to me orally or via their written reports prepared under Anchorage Police Case 12-5307.

11. On 2-2-12 at about 12:39 [REDACTED]

Common Ground Coffee stand at 630 E. Tudor, contacted APD dispatch. [REDACTED] was calling from Oregon, where he was vacationing. He reported that while viewing his internet based security system he saw one of his employees, Samantha Koenig, appear to be abducted. [REDACTED] said he was contacted by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who had been unable to locate her. This contact prompted [REDACTED] to review his security video which showed an unknown man climb through the window of the coffee stand at about 20:00 on 2-1-12 while Koenig was working. The video shows Koenig giving the man the money from the register and leaving with him.

12. During a taped Mirandized interview on 02-02-2012 by Detective [REDACTED] and I, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said he went to the coffee stand on 2-1-12 at about 20:33 to give her a ride home but the stand appeared to be closed and she was not there. [REDACTED] was asked to describe in detail exactly what he did when he arrived at Common Grounds to pick S. Koenig up from work on 02-01-2012. [REDACTED] stated he drove around the coffee stand and noticed the interior lights were off. He then parked the truck, got out, and looked through one of the windows.

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He stated that "everything was closed", that the wooden slides used to block the windows from sliding were in place. He added that there were napkins on the floor and the towels used to clean still sitting on the countertop which he thought was unusual as S. Koenig was very conscientious about being neat. [REDACTED] stated that after looking in the windows and noticing the wooden blocks were in place, he did not attempt to see if the door was locked as he did not want to "trigger an alarm and be accused of breaking in." [REDACTED] provided a cellular telephone number of [REDACTED] (the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER.**)

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13. APD Detectives have obtained both interior and exterior surveillance tape from Common Grounds. On 02-01-2012 at approximately 2023 hours, multiple surveillance cameras show a vehicle matching [REDACTED] (truck) drive up to Common Grounds, briefly pause at one of the windows (as if the driver is looking in the window) and then drive away. As indicated by the surveillance videos, the vehicle was in the vicinity of the coffee stand for approximately 8 seconds.

14. Throughout the interview, [REDACTED] consulted text messages and telephone call logs on his cell phone to provided Detective [REDACTED] and I with the exact times of events that occurred on 02-01-2012 and 02-02-2012. [REDACTED] initially told Detectives that he and Koenig's

relationship had been "bumpy" at one point, but had been going well recently, including the day Koenig disappeared. When asked to describe why the relationship was "bumpy", [] stated he had been talking to other girls on Facebook- which Koenig did not like. During the time [] was speaking about the day Koenig disappeared, he referenced several texts between him and Koenig and moved his cell phone across the table in the interview room so I could read them as well. After reading several of the texts from 02-01-2012 between [] and Koenig (with [] scrolling through them without prompting so I could read them), I indicated several texts that implied S. Koenig and [] were arguing. [] then admitted that at one point he had called Koenig to talk to her, and she told him she couldn't talk because she was busy with a customer. [] stated he said, "Whatever," and ended the call. [] vehemently denied any further disagreements between he and S. Koenig.

15. [] said he tried to contact S. Koenig at her cell phone by calling and texting but he did not get an immediate reply. Samantha Koenig's cellular telephone number is (907)884-8370. [] said he continued attempting to contact Koenig and got a reply at about 2324 hours on 2-1-12. [] showed me the text, which read, "F U asshole i know what u did i am going to spend a couple of days with friends need time to think plan actig weird

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let my dad know." [redacted] said from the word usage and texting style he does not believe Koenig authored the text. Koenig's cell phone provider is GCI, her number is (907) 884-8370. At 2353 hours, [redacted] cell phone showed a second text message received from S. Koenig's phone. The second text message read, "F U".

16. [redacted] also reported that at about 0300 on 2-2-12 he saw a man wearing a mask going through Koenig's vehicle which was parked at their residence, [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. [redacted] told me during an initial interview on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours that he subsequently went through the vehicle and found nothing missing but Samantha Koenig's Alaska Driver's License- which was kept in a zippered pocket on a visor organizer on the driver's side of the vehicle. [redacted] told Detective [redacted] and I he was positive nothing else was missing from the vehicle.

17. [redacted] said he and Koenig share the vehicle, a [redacted] [redacted] AK plate [redacted] and each of them have keys to the vehicle [redacted] said the last time Koenig used the vehicle was when she drove it to work the morning of 2-1-12. [redacted] told me that he remained at his residence of [redacted] in Anchorage where he fell asleep at approximately 0430 hours until approximately 0920 hours. When I asked him why he had not at some point contacted the police department to report the suspicious circumstances

and S. Koenig missing, he replied that he did not think the police would "do anything about it until they were missing for 24 hours." This was the same answer [redacted] provided during his interview, which immediately preceded [redacted]

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18. The [redacted] AK plate [redacted] was impounded to APD secure storage on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours. A search warrant was subsequently obtained and executed on the vehicle by the Anchorage Police Department. In the visor organizer, in the same pocket as [redacted] described Koenig's missing id was kept, was a Visa credit card and a Credit Union 1 debit card.

19. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 0330 hours, an individual dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt, sunglasses, jacket and black gloves utilized an ATM at the Denali Alaskan FCU located 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. The individual utilized an ATM card issued to [redacted]

20. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 2000 hours and at my request, APD Officers [redacted] [redacted] responded to [redacted] I requested a brief follow up with [redacted] in reference to why he had called Common Grounds the morning of 02-02-2012 demanding to see the video surveillance from the night before. Officer [redacted] told me he knocked on the door to [redacted] and [redacted] answered the door. Immediately after opening

the door, [] opened it enough to allow himself through, and left the door only slightly ajar while he spoke with Officer [] Upon requesting to talk to [] re-entered the apartment via the same method, and closed it firmly behind him. When [] came to the door, he too opened it only enough he could fit through, and then closed it behind him while he spoke to Officer []

21. On 02-05-2012, at approximately 0900 hours, APD Detective [] and I went to [] in an effort to contact [] reference the ATM card usage. No one answered the knock on the door to the residence. The occupant of [] a white male who identified himself as [] stated that neither [] was home. I called [] and asked him to come to APD Headquarters. [] who stated he was with [] distributing missing person fliers. He refused my request to come to APD Headquarters, and then the phone was taken by [] [] angrily demanded to know why "we were at his house looking for him." I told [] we were in fact looking for [] because we had further questions for him. [] expressed suspicion at this and stated he and [] would meet us at a separate location, but not at the residence.

22. At approximately 1200 hours, Detective [] and I contacted [] behind the Spenard

Builder's Supply located at Tudor Road and Minnesota Blvd. They arrived with [redacted] operating a [redacted] [redacted] Alaska license plate [redacted] Detective [redacted] contacted [redacted] while I spoke with [redacted] During the contact, which was tape recorded, I asked [redacted] what his knowledge of S. Koenig's finances were. He stated she had an account at Credit Union One for a long while, and approximately a week and a half prior, he had been added to the account. He stated two debit cards were issued for the account- which had a balance of approximately \$5.00 United States Currency. He stated the cards bore different numbers even though they were for the same account, but they had obtained the same PIN number for both of the cards. [redacted] knew "for a fact" that the last activity on the account was on January 31st when he used the account to cash a check for \$30.00. When asked what his debit card was, [redacted] stated it was in his wallet- which he described as brown in color- which was in the [redacted] stated the wallet was either in the same visor organizer S. Koenig's identification had been taken from, or in the center console of the vehicle. When a State of Alaska search warrant was executed on the vehicle on 02-03-2012, no wallet was found.

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23. During his initial contact with APD Officer [redacted] on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1200 hours, [redacted] denied any knowledge that Samantha Koenig had ever used drugs. He

provided his cellular telephone number of [REDACTED]
During the taped, Mirandized interview of [REDACTED]
conducted on 02-02-2012, [REDACTED] told me that S. Koenig
used marijuana, and had used cocaine a year prior but had
been "clean" since that time. [REDACTED] provided a
cellular phone number of [REDACTED] the **TARGET TELEPHONE
NUMBER.** During a recorded interview with S. Koenig's
[REDACTED] stated Samantha
Koenig was a recovering cocaine addict. During interviews
with several other friends and acquaintances of Samantha
Koenig, the fact that she was recovering from a substance
abuse problem and that she occasionally relapsed seemed to
be a common theme.

24. On 02-05-2012, Detectives [REDACTED] drove to
a residence located at [REDACTED] in Anchorage,
Alaska in an attempt to contact [REDACTED]
was not there, but they spoke with [REDACTED] who
identified himself as S. Koenig's [REDACTED] During the
interview, [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] behavior
changed dramatically about a week and a half prior as he
was moving out of the [REDACTED] address. Specifically, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was "doing licks" (street
lingo for robbing drug dealers). Furthermore, [REDACTED]
[REDACTED] observed what he described as a black and grey
smith and Wesson .40 semi auto pistol tucked in the front
of [REDACTED] pants and stated [REDACTED] boasted of "pulling

a lick" at that time.

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25. On 02-05-2012 Detectives [redacted] conducted an interview with [redacted] Samantha Koenig's

[redacted] During interviews with multiple friends and family members of Samantha Koenig, [redacted] is considered S. Koenig's

[redacted] During the interview, [redacted] stated he knew S. Koenig, but did not have much of a relationship with her. He indicated his girlfriend- [redacted] [redacted] knew her much better, and Detectives should talk to [redacted] for more information. [redacted] told Detectives that he knew from relatives that S. Koenig was missing, but did not believe it was a legitimate abduction. [redacted] stated he had been talking with his father- [redacted] regarding S. Koenig, and stated he told his father that S. Koenig had relapsed and was on a "cocaine binge." [redacted] stated his cell phone number was [redacted]

26. On 02-08-2012, pursuant to Alaska Search warrant #3AN-12-206sw, members of the Anchorage Police Department searched [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. Per Detective [redacted] present in the crawl space of the apartment appeared to be a marijuana grow operation that was recently dismantled. In addition to two 1000 watt halogen bulbs, there was growing medium, several pots, black plastic, and

marijuana "shake"- or small pieces of discarded marijuana plant material.

27. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a recorded, Mirandized interview with [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] told Detectives that his friend [redacted] whom he later identified as [redacted] from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License Photo- told him of a recent conversation [redacted] had with [redacted] best friend - [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that [redacted] had been receiving packages containing marijuana from out-of-state, and [redacted] was being paid \$500 per package to "catch" (receive) them at his house.

28. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that approximately a month prior, [redacted] had come up with a ruse. Per [redacted] the ruse was to keep one of the packages containing marijuana, and lie to the senders- saying it had been seized by police and that was the reason for his imprisonment. Per [redacted] the person/people who sent the package discovered the ruse, and had kidnapped S. Koenig and were holding her as collateral for repayment on the drug debt. [redacted] stated he did not know how much the debt was that [redacted] owed, but thought there might have been 32 pounds of marijuana in the package. ...

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29. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview of [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated he had recently had a telephone conversation with [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] related the CS had told him that [redacted] had gone through with the ruse outlined in paragraph 15, and S. Koenig had been kidnapped and was being held until the debt was repaid. [redacted] did not know how much marijuana was in the package, but estimated the debt to be approximately \$60,000.

30. On 02-10-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview with [redacted] after he was contacted by Anchorage Police. [redacted] stated he had met S. Koenig a couple of times, most recently 6 months ago. [redacted] stated he had heard of S. Koenig's disappearance, but did not know where S. Koenig might be. [redacted] stated there was no conversation regarding Koenig's disappearance at that time. [redacted] was shown an Alaska Driver's license photo of [redacted] recognized [redacted] as being [redacted] and added that [redacted] was S. Koenig's [redacted]

31. During the interview, [redacted] stated that approximately 3 months prior, [redacted] picked up two boxes that contained approximately 15 pounds of marijuana. [redacted] thought the incident happened after New Year's Eve in 2012. [redacted] did

not know how the boxes were sent, however [] thought [] had picked the boxes up from an independent mailing center near Arctic Boulevard. Your Affiant is aware of a business called The Mail Cache- an independent packaging and shipping center- on Arctic Boulevard just south of 36th Avenue in Anchorage, Alaska.

32. [] stated he assisted [] in carrying one of the two boxes into [] residence. [] stated once opened, he/she observed marijuana in vacuum packed plastic bags secreted in backpacks and other carriers. [] stated that it was high quality marijuana, and would probably have a street value of about \$4,000 per pound.

33. [] stated [] contacted the people who were intended to receive the marijuana, and told them one of the boxes was there. [] stated he thought [] was paid \$500 by the individual(s) who picked up the box, but he/she did not observe the box being picked up and therefore could not describe the individual(s). [] stated [] kept the other box and gave the contents to a man [] knew as [] who [] described as a [] year old male who drove a [] When asked, [] estimated the worth of the marijuana in both boxes to be \$66,000.00.

34. [] stated [] knew he had an outstanding warrant. Upon keeping the second box, [] turned

himself into the police, knowing he would be remanded to jail. Per [redacted] then explained to the intended recipient(s) of the second box that it had been seized by police, thereby resulting in his incarceration.

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35. A check of Anchorage Police databases revealed that per APD Police Report #11-90558, on 12-29-2012 at approximately 2132 hours, [redacted] contacted APD Dispatch and stated that he was in the lobby of the Ramada and knew that he had a warrant outstanding for his arrest for failing to appear for community work service. Per [redacted] the intended recipient(s) of the box found out [redacted] ruse, and demanded either payment for the marijuana or the marijuana returned. [redacted] stated that he/she believed a possible motivation for S. Koenig's kidnapping was that the intended recipient(s) of the aforementioned package had abducted her and were holding her as "collateral" for payment of the marijuana.

36. When asked, [redacted] initially stated the last time he/she had contacted [redacted] was several weeks prior. Upon being questioned further, including being told APD intended to apply for search warrants on both [redacted] cell phone records, [redacted] stated he spoke with [redacted] on either 02-04-2012 or 02-06-2012. On 02-10-2012, Detective [redacted] applied for and was granted glass warrant 3AN-12-223-sw, which authorized the monitoring and recording of conversations between [redacted] Pursuant to

that glass warrant, several monitored attempts were made on 02-11-2012 to contact [] at [] All of the calls were routed to voicemail.

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37. On 02-11-2012 at approximately 1430 hours, Detectives [] spoke to [] Detectives [] had previously interviewed [] on 02-10-2012. [] stated that at approximately 0100 hours on 02-11-2012 he had been at a residence located at [] [] in Anchorage, Alaska when [] arrived at the apartment. Per [] stated he had just been to an APD substation being questioned for 6 hours. [] stated [] then proceeded to utilize heroin to "get high."

38. Furthermore, [] stated that 3-4 days prior to the 11th, [] arrived at [] carrying a makeup case and a white winter jacket with odd stains on the back. [] indicated to Detective [] that he thought the stains looked like bloodstains. [] agreed to bring the makeup and jacket, which had been kept by the owner of [] since they had been brought to the residence. [] provided Detective [] with a white plastic bag which contained a white jacket and a small satchel which contained makeup, as well as two hairbrushes. [] stated the owner of the residence at [] [] had initially taken the makeup out of the container and co-mingled it with her own. At his request, she placed

it back inside the makeup kit before turning it over to APD. APD Officer [] conducted a presumptive test on some of the stain on the white jacket. The stain tested presumptively positive for blood.

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39. A Chase debit card found in the pocket of the jacket bore the name of [] On 02-09-2012, Detectives [] had contact with [] after she walked out of [] residence. [] was obviously under the influence of controlled substances. [] also had multiple obvious track marks- indicative of drug injections- on her inner elbows.

40. [] said [] then told him he was leaving to go out to Wasilla. [] questioned [] telling him he did not understand why [] was going to drive out to Wasilla because he did not live out there nor did he have any contacts out there. [] stated [] was insistent that he was going to Wasilla, then going to Kenai. Per [] left the residence on [] [] at approximately 0200 hours.

41. On 02-10-2012 at approximately 1830 hours, Detectives [] contacted [] At their direction, [] attempted to place several recorded telephone calls to [] All of the attempted calls went through to voicemail. Detective [] then asked [] if he had told anyone he had been contacted by police the evening

before. [redacted] vehemently denied telling [redacted] he had been held at an APD substation for 6 hours on 02-10-2012, as [redacted] indicated. Detectives [redacted] questioned [redacted] repeatedly about his drug use. Contrary to what [redacted] stated, [redacted] stated he was not high and did not use drugs. At no time did [redacted] mention bringing the white jacket or makeup kit to [redacted]. Detective [redacted] described [redacted] unique physical descriptors [redacted] has [redacted] to [redacted] who told Detective [redacted] he had never met anyone by that description.

42. On 02-11-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [redacted]. At the same time but at a different location, Detectives [redacted] [redacted] interviewed [redacted] girlfriend, [redacted] [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] initially denied any knowledge regarding receiving the boxes of marijuana. He later amended he may have done so, but stated he firmly believed it did not have anything to do with S. Koenig's kidnapping, as he and S. Koenig weren't actual relatives.

43. Detective [redacted] relayed to Detective [redacted] that during his interview with [redacted] she stated that at the end of December, [redacted] had received two boxes. The first box had been given to [redacted] received \$500 for "catching" (receiving) the package. [redacted] kept the second package for himself, and executed a ruse to go

to jail and tell the intended recipients that the police had seized the package just prior to his being remanded to jail. Per [redacted] then sold the second package to [redacted] for \$5,000.00. [redacted] stated that [redacted] came over several times in the subsequent weeks and inquired about the box and having it returned to the intended recipient. At one point, [redacted] told [redacted] "Hey you don't know what these people are capable of; it's out of my hands." Per [redacted] stated he had heard about S. Koenig's abduction. [redacted] reassured [redacted] that this did not have anything to do with the debt, as it "had been taken care of."

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44. When confronted with the information provided by [redacted] [redacted] acknowledged that it was correct. He identified [redacted] as [redacted] from his Alaska driver's license photograph. [redacted] stated he did not have any information about who sent the box or where it came from. He stated only that we needed to speak to [redacted] to obtain information regarding the intended recipient of the box. He stated that the debt he owed for the second box was inconsequential, and reiterated it had nothing to do with S. Koenig's disappearance.

45. On 02-12-2012, Detective [redacted] and I conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [redacted]. He supplied his cell phone number of [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated that he had seen S. Koenig on a couple of

occasions, but had no contact with her recently. [redacted] stated that he was good friends with [redacted] and had only met S. Koenig through being at [redacted] residence. When we asked [redacted] who he gave the box of marijuana to after paying [redacted] \$500 for "catching" it, [redacted] became very upset. He placed his hand on the missing person flyer for S. Koenig and stated, "I had nothing to do with this!" I assured [redacted] that we did not believe he was responsible for S. Koenig's kidnapping or that we believed [redacted] knew where she was. Instead, we were keenly in need of the identity of the individual who was the ultimate recipient of the first box of marijuana, as that would likely be the person who wanted to collect on the debt [redacted] owed for stealing the second box. [redacted] stated again, "I had nothing to do with this. I want to leave." The interview was terminated and [redacted] was allowed to leave and provided a ride to his residence.

46. On 02-13-2012 and at the request of Detective [redacted] United States Postal Inspector Service (USPIS) Investigator [redacted] contacted the Mail Cache located at [redacted] [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. USPIS [redacted] discovered that [redacted] received three parcels at that location, where he rented box [redacted] Per USPIS [redacted] [redacted] paid cash for the Post Office Box rental, which he rented for only a month. All the parcels had been shipped via Fed Ex, and all were signed for by [redacted]

- a. The first parcel had tracking number 951376972815 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/15/2011. It was picked up in Anchorage on 12/16/2011.
- b. The second parcel had tracking number 951376972881 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/21/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.
- c. The third parcel had tracking number 490395927259 and was mailed from Red Bluff, CA on 12/22/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.

47. On 02-13-2012, Detectives [redacted] spoke with [redacted] [redacted] stated that 3-4 days prior, [redacted] had given her a ride to her mother's house to pick up some clothing. [redacted] stated she did not have a chance to get her white jacket and makeup kit out of [redacted] vehicle prior to his leaving to [redacted] [redacted] stated it was her understanding [redacted] gave the white jacket and makeup kit to [redacted] at [redacted]

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48. On 02-15-2012, [redacted] made several calls to APD Dispatch reporting that he was "being followed". [redacted] initially contacted APD on 02-15-2012 while at his residence and wanted to report a dark colored Mazda Navajo had been following him. APD Officer [redacted] responded and found the Mazda Navajo in question was visiting a house down the street from [redacted]

49. Per the call log, [] stated a male wearing a bullet proof vest was following him in a white Cadillac Escalade. A few minutes after making the 911 call to report someone following him, [] called back and stated he observed an elderly male exiting the vehicle suspected of following him and no police response was necessary.

50. It should be noted that surveillance was indeed initiated on [] but none of the "suspect vehicles" [] described were the undercover vehicles operated by law enforcement conducting the surveillance. Furthermore, none of the officers on surveillance were wearing bullet proof vests. Per APD Officer [] even after placing the second call to APD to indicate he was mistaken, [] continued to drive very erratically- speeding, making multiple lane changes without using his turn signals, and running two red lights.

51. On 02-04-2012, [] posted the following on his Facebook page: ... IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DONATE TO THE REWARD FUND FOR THE RECUE OF SAMANTHA TESSLA KOENIG YOU CAN DO SO BY GOING TO ANY DENALI ALASKAN FEDERAL CREDIT UNION AND USE ACCOUNT #135006, OR I HAVE ALSO SET UP A PAYPAL ACCOUNT GOTO PAYPAL.COM AND ENTER MY EMAIL ADDRESS, ALL LOWER CASE, [] ALL PROCEEDS GO TO THE RESCUE EFFORTS AND REWARD TO ANYONE THAT CAN RETURN HER HOME TO ME SAFELY AND UNHARMED... . . .

52. Investigators have confirmed the existence of a living trust account with the same account number as above (135006) exists at Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union. Furthermore, it is believed that other than Samantha Koenig, [REDACTED] is the only other person who has the ability to withdraw funds from the account.

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53. During the week of February 5th, 2012 Detective [REDACTED] and I spoke with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] stated that an unusual amount of emphasis was being placed on raising reward funds, and expressed concern that raising money seemed to be the foremost goal of both [REDACTED]

54. On 02-08-2012 [REDACTED] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...WHOEVER HAS MY DAUGHTER JUST BRING HER ANYWHERE, TO A HOSPITAL, HOMES, SEND HER IN A CAB HOME ANONYMOUSLY, AND I WILL LEAVE ALL THE MONEY WE HAVE COLLECTED IN A CERTAIN PLACE OF YOUR CHOOSING WITHIN MINUTES OF YOUR INSTRUCTIONS, JUST RETURN HER TO ME.

55. On 02-14-2012, I received a call from [REDACTED] who wished to report that [REDACTED] had made a death threat to her earlier in the day. [REDACTED] explained that her daughter had printed t-shirts with Samantha Koenig's photograph on them and was selling the t-shirts for \$10 each. \$5 of the proceeds was to remain with [REDACTED]

daughter, while \$5 was to be donated to the reward fund. Per [redacted] her daughter sold \$200 worth of t-shirts and earlier that day, [redacted] had contacted [redacted] in an attempt to collect the \$100 owed to her daughter. [redacted] stated [redacted] became very angry, and refused to give her the money. [redacted] stated [redacted] told her, "If you make one more t-shirt with [redacted] face on it, I will kill you." [redacted] maintained that [redacted] actions during the last two weeks- when she often assisted in search efforts- was highly unusual. [redacted] stated [redacted] was almost obsessive about collecting money for the reward fund, at times checking the same donation jar several times a day. [redacted] asked me to "check on it, because something about this just isn't right. He [redacted] cares more about the money than he does about [redacted] also told me she had observed [redacted] carrying a shotgun in a soft-sided case on multiple occasions since the abduction. [redacted] indicated she thought this was highly unusual behavior for [redacted] concerned over the loss of [redacted]

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56. On 02-16-2012, [redacted] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...PLEASE FIND IT IN YOUR HEART TO HELP SAMANTHA, EVEN IF YOU COME TO ME, I WILL GUARANTEE YOUR SAFETY, AND SET YOU UP WITH ENOUGH MONEY TO LEAVE STATE AND START ANEW SOMEWHERE OF YOUR CHOOSING. AS LONG AS THE RESULT IS HER RETURNING TO ME SAFE AND

UNHARMED, ANYTHING LESS I WILL DEVOTE MY LIVE, AND RESOURCES TO HUNTING DOWN THE INDIVIDUALS RESPONSIBLE FOR STEALING MY LIFE FROM ME...

57. Based on the above information, I believe probable cause exists that [redacted] may attempt to enter into an agreement with S. Koenig's abductors and pay out the money in the reward fund in return for S. Koenig. Furthermore, the above information indicates [redacted] may not be forthcoming with the details of S. Koenig's abduction; including the identity of her abductors and the reasons behind her abduction.

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58. Furthermore, evidence sought that may show a relationship between the victim and person(s) that may have crucial knowledge of or participation in the crime of kidnapping. Further, that such a search may identify unknown witness who has vital information to this investigation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

59. On 02-24-2012, at 1956 hours [redacted] received the following text on his cell phone [redacted] the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER** from Samantha Koenig's cell phone- 907-884-8370: "Conner park sign under pic of albert aint she purty". [redacted] contacted me and relayed the information to me. At my request, APD Patrol Officers arrived at Conner Park- located on the southeast corner of

Jewel Lake Road and International Airport Road in Anchorage, Alaska- at approximately 2018 hours. [redacted] [redacted] were already present. Attached to the park sign, below a flyer for a lost dog named "Albert", was a Ziploc bag which contained a folded piece of paper.

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60. Anchorage Police Officer [redacted] photographed the item and the surrounding area. The Anchorage Police Crime Scene team also responded to process the scene. Officer [redacted] then seized the Ziploc bag and the item inside and transported it to APD Headquarters prior to turning it over to me.

61. Once unfolded, the piece of paper was shown to contain a photograph [redacted]

[redacted] A persons arm with a latex-gloved hand was in the lower left screen of the photo. The hand was holding onto the hair of the female; which had been braided. In the upper part of the screen was an Anchorage Daily Newspaper. I was able to find the front page of the Anchorage Daily News which corresponded with the one shown in the photograph. It was the issue released on Monday, February 13th, 2012. On 02-25-2012, [redacted] positively identified the female in the photograph as [redacted]

[redacted] Samantha Koenig:

62. On the reverse side of the piece of paper was a ransom note which demanded \$30,000. The note indicated that in exchange for the money, between 6 months and a year from receipt of the money, the author would text the location of a packet of information which would provide law enforcement with all the information they needed to find her (S. Koenig.) The note indicated an account to which the money should be deposited. Investigators believe that the "account" numbers provided are not actually a bank account. Instead they are a 16 digit debit card number- the debit card belonging to [REDACTED]

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63. At my direction, [REDACTED] attempted to make multiple telephone calls to S. Koenig's telephone from 2330 hours on 02-24-2012 through 0135 hours on 02-25-2012. During all of the calls, there was one short ring followed by 4 long rings then an automated voicemail. Based on my training and experience, this is the type of cadence that occurs when a cellular telephone is forwarded to another telephonic device.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND PROCEDURAL REQUESTS

69. Based on the above information, I respectfully state that there is probable cause to believe that that the information likely to be obtained from the requested pen

register, calling line identifiers and related subscriber information would lead to evidence of kidnapping and/or the identification of the person or persons responsible for Samantha Koenig's abduction. I would like to request the installation of a pen register (a device to identify/register telephone numbers dialed or pulsed from a specified telephone number), and calling line identifiers (a device to identify incoming telephone numbers from which calls are made into a specified telephone number, statutorily referenced as a "trap and trace device") on the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER**, [REDACTED] which is a cellular telephone issued by AT&T for a period of 60 (sixty) days from the date of installation. I request the Court authorize the installation, service, and monitoring of this device to be conducted by members of the Anchorage Police Department or other qualified law enforcement personnel to include technical assistance in implementing this order, warrant, etc., provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This application also seeks authorization to receive subscriber information including the subscriber names, addresses, and billing information related to the outgoing and incoming telephone numbers identified by the pen register and calling line identifier and to record or decode dialing, routing, addressing, cellular telephone towers, or signaling information transmitted from the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER**.

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70. I further request that the Court direct that upon service of the order upon it, the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire communication service in the United States whose assistance may facilitate execution of the order, furnish the information, facilities, and technical assistance necessary to accomplish unobtrusively the installation and use of the pen register and trap and trace device with compensation to be paid by the investigative agencies for reasonable expenses directly incurred in providing such facilities and assistance.

71. I further request that the order direct the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire or electronic communication service in the United States whose assistance is used to facilitate execution of the order, furnish the results of the pen register and trap and trace installation to the investigative agencies, as soon as practicable, twenty-four (24) hours a day, for the duration of the order.

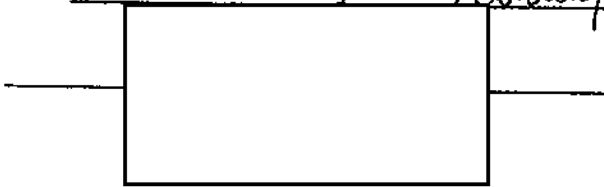
72. I further request that the order direct any other communications common carriers to furnish forthwith, related subscriber information, including subscriber names, addresses and related billing information related to such numbers identified per the pen registers and calling line identifiers.

73. The Affiant also requests that The Court orders authorization to notice the provision of Criminal Rule 37 be relaxed pursuant to Criminal Rule 53, so that we do not have to leave a copy of the affidavit and or authorizations with the person(s) and or premise(s). This is a continuing investigation and the Affiant feels that it would hamper the ability of the Affiant to gather other evidence. Additionally, and for the same reasons, the Affiant asks that the authorizations, and the affidavit in support of them be sealed by The Court in order to prevent unauthorized persons from seeing this affidavit and authorization as the safety of the CS and associated law enforcement officers would be compromised.

74. I respectfully request that this authorization be sealed by the Court in order to prevent unauthorized people from seeing this affidavit and authorization.

AFFIDAVIT OF

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I, being first duly sworn on oath, hereby depose and state:

1. That since December 1997 I have been employed as a police officer with the Municipality of Anchorage. Upon graduation of a twenty-one week police academy, I completed fourteen weeks of field training and was assigned to patrol until May 2001. At this time I was promoted to the Special Assignment Unit, which specialized in conducting investigations into street level drugs, gambling, and prostitution.
2. In March 2002 I was promoted to Detective and assigned to the Burglary Unit at APD. In June 2002 I became a part of the

Metro Drug Unit until July 2007, when I was assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration as a Task Force Officer until January 2012, when I was assigned to the Anchorage Police Department Homicide Unit and am currently assigned there.

3. Prior to being hired at the Anchorage Police Department, I graduated from Northern Michigan University with a Bachelor's Degree in Science. The focus of the degree was a major in Criminal Justice and a minor in Psychology. In December 2003 I obtained a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from Boston University.
4. I have also completed an additional forty- hour advanced course in Crime Scene Processing and a forty- hour advanced course in Accident Investigation, as well as a forty- hour Detective Academy taught by the Anchorage Police Department. Additionally, I have completed a forty- hour course in clandestine drug laboratories from the Drug Enforcement Administration.
5. I have also completed an eighty-hour course of instruction in Basic Drug Investigations conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration's training staff. This school trained me in state and federal drug laws, development of probable cause, search and seizure law, drug identification and field testing, informant handling, marijuana eradication, surveillance techniques, street lingo, packaging and pricing, transportation and distribution of drugs. I also received

- formal and supervised hands-on training in the field testing of cocaine, heroin, Methamphetamine and marijuana.
6. In July of 2005, I conceptualized, wrote, and instituted the drug field testing class at the Anchorage Police Department Police academy, and am currently the lead instructor for that course.
 7. On September 7th, 2006 I was qualified as an expert witness in drug paraphernalia in front of the honorable Judge Wolverton in Alaska Superior Court. In July 2007, I was qualified as an expert drug witness in front of the honorable Judge McKay in Alaska Superior Court. I have been qualified and testified as an expert witness in narcotics distribution in Alaska State grand jury proceedings approximately fifty (50) times in the past three years.
 8. During my tenure as a police officer, I have conducted and/or participated in numerous investigations relating to the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, and I have become familiar with devices, paraphernalia, techniques, and practices used by people engaged in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances. I have conducted and/or participated in investigations which have resulted in the seizure of marijuana, marijuana grow operations, cocaine hydrochloride, cocaine base (crack), opium, PCP, heroin, ketamine, methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA/ecstasy),

methamphetamine, methamphetamine laboratories, prescription medications, firearms, pagers, cellular telephones, surveillance systems, cameras, memory cards, computers, documents, money, and precious metals. I have also conducted numerous interviews of people involved in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, adding to my knowledge of the illegal drug culture in the Anchorage area. In addition to my formal training and experience, I have gained knowledge and insight by working and speaking with many experienced law enforcement agents from local, state, and federal agencies, and I consider this knowledge and insight to be an integral part of my experience and training.

9. I have worked as an undercover officer for prostitution and controlled substance cases and have assisted other Detectives with controlled substance cases as photographer, surveillance officer, evidence custodian, and entry/search team member. I have been the case officer on drug cases, assigning and directing other officers in the investigations. I have also acted as a Control Officer for handling Cooperating Sources in controlled substance cases.

INVESTIGATION

10. I am currently assisting in the investigation of APD case 12-5307, a kidnapping investigation. The following information is based upon either my own observations or the

observations of other Anchorage Police Officers conveyed to me orally or via their written reports prepared under Anchorage Police Case 12-5307.

11. On 2-2-12 at about 12:39 [REDACTED] Common Ground Coffee stand at 630 E. Tudor, contacted APD dispatch. [REDACTED] was calling from Oregon, where he was vacationing. He reported that while viewing his internet based security system he saw one of his employees, Samantha Koenig, appear to be abducted. [REDACTED] said he was contacted by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] who had been unable to locate her. This contact prompted [REDACTED] to review his security video which showed an unknown man climb through the window of the coffee stand at about 20:00 on 2-1-12 while Koenig was working. The video shows Koenig giving the man the money from the register and leaving with him.

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12. During a taped Mirandized interview on 02-02-2012 by Detective [REDACTED] and I, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said he went to the coffee stand on 2-1-12 at about 20:33 to give her a ride home but the stand appeared to be closed and she was not there. [REDACTED] was asked to describe in detail exactly what he did when he arrived at Common Grounds to pick S. Koenig up from work on 02-01-2012. [REDACTED] stated he drove around the coffee stand and noticed the interior lights were off.. He then parked the truck, got out, and looked through one of the windows.

He stated that "everything was closed", that the wooden slides used to block the windows from sliding were in place. He added that there were napkins on the floor and the towels used to clean still sitting on the countertop- which he thought was unusual as S. Koenig was very conscientious about being neat. [redacted] stated that after looking in the windows and noticing the wooden blocks were in place, he did not attempt to see if the door was locked as he did not want to "trigger an alarm and be accused of breaking in."

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13. APD Detectives have obtained both interior and exterior surveillance tape from Common Grounds. On 02-01-2012 at approximately 2023 hours, multiple surveillance cameras show a vehicle matching [redacted] truck) drive up to Common Grounds, briefly pause at one of the windows (as if the driver is looking in the window) and then drive away. As indicated by the surveillance videos, the vehicle was in the vicinity of the coffee stand for approximately 8 seconds.

14. Throughout the interview, [redacted] consulted text messages and telephone call logs on his cell phone to provided Detective [redacted] and I with the exact times of events that occurred on 02-01-2012 and 02-02-2012. [redacted] initially told Detectives that he and Koenig's relationship had been "bumpy" at one point, but had been going well recently, including the day Koenig disappeared.

When asked to describe why the relationship was "bumpy", [redacted] stated he had been talking to other girls on Facebook- which Koenig did not like. During the time [redacted] was speaking about the day Koenig disappeared, he referenced several texts between him and Koenig and moved his cell phone across the table in the interview room so I could read them as well. After reading several of the texts from 02-01-2012 between [redacted] and Koenig (with [redacted] scrolling through them without prompting so I could read them), I indicated several texts that implied S. Koenig and [redacted] were arguing. [redacted] then admitted that at one point he had called Koenig to talk to her, and she told him she couldn't talk because she was busy with a customer. [redacted] stated he said, "Whatever," and ended the call. [redacted] vehemently denied any further disagreements between he and S. Koenig.

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15. [redacted] said he tried to contact S. Koenig at her cell phone by calling and texting but he did not get an immediate reply. [redacted] said he continued attempting to contact Koenig and got a reply at about 2324 hours on 2-1-12. [redacted] showed me the text, which read, "F U asshole i know what u did i am going to spend a couple of days with friends need time to think plan actig weird let my dad know." [redacted] said from the word usage and texting style he does not believe Koenig authored the text. Koenig's cell phone provider is GCI, her number is (907) 884-8370. At

2353 hours, [] cell phone showed a second text message received from S. Koenig's phone. The second text message read, "F U".

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16. [] also reported that at about 0300 on 2-2-12 he saw a man wearing a mask going through Koenig's vehicle which was parked at their residence, [] in Anchorage, Alaska. [] told me during an initial interview on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours that he subsequently went through the vehicle and found nothing missing but Samantha Koenig's Alaska Driver's License- which was kept in a zippered pocket on a visor organizer on the driver's side of the vehicle. [] told Detective [] and I he was positive nothing else was missing from the vehicle.

17. [] said he and Koenig share the vehicle, a [] [] AK plate [] and each of them have keys to the vehicle [] said the last time Koenig used the vehicle was when she drove it to work the morning of 2-1-12. [] told me that he remained at his residence of [] in Anchorage where he fell asleep at approximately 0430 hours until approximately 0920 hours. When I asked him why he had not at some point contacted the police department to report the suspicious circumstances and S. Koenig missing, he replied that he did not think the police would "do anything about it until they were missing for 24 hours." This was the same answer []

provided during his interview, which immediately preceded

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18. The [REDACTED] AK plate [REDACTED] was impounded to APD secure storage on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours. A search warrant was subsequently obtained and executed on the vehicle by the Anchorage Police Department. In the visor organizer, in the same pocket as [REDACTED] described Koenig's missing id was kept, was a Visa credit card and a Credit Union 1 debit card.

19. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 0330 hours, an individual dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt, sunglasses, jacket and black gloves utilized an ATM at the Denali Alaskan FCU located 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. The individual utilized an ATM card issued to [REDACTED]

20. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 2000 hours and at my request, APD Officers [REDACTED] [REDACTED] responded to [REDACTED] I requested a brief follow up with [REDACTED] in reference to why he had called Common Grounds the morning of 02-02-2012 demanding to see the video surveillance from the night before. Officer [REDACTED] told me he knocked on the door to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] answered the door. Immediately after opening the door, [REDACTED] opened it enough to allow himself through, and left the door only slightly ajar while he spoke with Officer [REDACTED] Upon requesting to talk to [REDACTED]

re-entered the apartment via the same method, and closed it firmly behind him. When [redacted] came to the door, he too opened it only enough he could fit through, and then closed it behind him while he spoke to Officer [redacted]

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21. On 02-05-2012, at approximately 0900 hours, APD Detective [redacted] and I went to [redacted] in an effort to contact [redacted] reference the ATM card usage. No one answered the knock on the door to the residence. The occupant of [redacted] a white male who identified himself as [redacted] stated that neither [redacted] was home. I called [redacted] and asked him to come to APD Headquarters. [redacted] who stated he was with [redacted] distributing missing person fliers. He refused my request to come to APD Headquarters, and then the phone was taken by [redacted] [redacted] angrily demanded to know why "we were at his house looking for him." I told [redacted] we were in fact looking for [redacted] because we had further questions for him. [redacted] expressed suspicion at this and stated he and [redacted] would meet us at a separate location, but not at the residence.

22. At approximately 1200 hours, Detective [redacted] and I contacted [redacted] behind the Spenard Builder's Supply located at Tudor Road and Minnesota Blvd. They arrived with [redacted] operating a [redacted] [redacted] Alaska license plate [redacted] Detective

[redacted] contacted [redacted] while I spoke with [redacted]. During the contact, which was tape recorded, I asked [redacted] what his knowledge of S. Koenig's finances were. He stated she had an account at Credit Union One for a long while, and approximately a week and a half prior, he had been added to the account. He stated two debit cards were issued for the account- which had a balance of approximately \$5.00 United States Currency. He stated the cards bore different numbers even though they were for the same account, but they had obtained the same PIN number for both of the cards. [redacted] knew "for a fact" that the last activity on the account was on January 31st when he used the account to cash a check for \$30.00. When asked what his debit card was, [redacted] stated it was in his wallet- which he described as brown in color- which was in the [redacted] stated the wallet was either in the same visor organizer S. Koenig's identification had been taken from, or in the center console of the vehicle. When a State of Alaska search warrant was executed on the vehicle on 02-03-2012, no wallet was found.

23. During his initial contact with APD Officer [redacted] on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1200 hours, [redacted] denied any knowledge that Samantha Koenig had ever used drugs. He provided his cellular telephone number of [redacted] the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER.**) During the taped, Mirandized interview of [redacted] conducted on 02-02-2012, [redacted]

told me that S. Koenig used marijuana, and had used cocaine a year prior but had been "clean" since that time.

[redacted] provided a cellular phone number of [redacted]

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During a recorded interview with S. Koenig's [redacted]

[redacted] stated Samantha Koenig was a recovering cocaine addict. During interviews with several other friends and acquaintances of Samantha Koenig, the fact that she was recovering from a substance abuse problem and that she occasionally relapsed seemed to be a common theme.

24. On 02-05-2012, Detectives [redacted] drove to a residence located at [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska in an attempt to contact [redacted] was not there, but they spoke with [redacted] who identified himself as S. Koenig's [redacted] During the interview, [redacted] stated that [redacted] behavior changed dramatically about a week and a half prior as he was moving out of the [redacted] address. Specifically, [redacted] [redacted] stated [redacted] was "doing licks" (street lingo for robbing drug dealers). Furthermore, [redacted] [redacted] observed what he described as a black and grey smith and Wesson .40 semi auto pistol tucked in the front of [redacted] pants and stated [redacted] boasted of "pulling a lick" at that time.

25. On 02-05-2012 Detectives [redacted] conducted an interview with [redacted] Samantha Koenig's

[REDACTED]
[REDACTED] During interviews with multiple friends and family members of Samantha Koenig, [REDACTED] is considered S. Koenig's

[REDACTED]
[REDACTED] During the interview, [REDACTED] stated he knew S. Koenig, but did not have much of a relationship with her. He indicated his girlfriend-[REDACTED] [REDACTED] knew her much better, and Detectives should talk to [REDACTED] for more information. [REDACTED] told Detectives that he knew from relatives that S. Koenig was missing, but did not believe it was a legitimate abduction. [REDACTED] stated he had been talking with his father-[REDACTED] regarding S. Koenig, and stated he told his father that S. Koenig had relapsed and was on a "cocaine binge." [REDACTED] stated his cell phone number was [REDACTED]

26. On 02-08-2012, pursuant to Alaska Search warrant #3AN-12-206sw, members of the Anchorage Police Department searched [REDACTED] in Anchorage, Alaska. Per Detective [REDACTED] present in the crawl space of the apartment appeared to be a marijuana grow operation that was recently dismantled. In addition to two 1000 watt halogen bulbs, there was growing medium, several pots, black plastic, and marijuana "shake"- or small pieces of discarded marijuana plant material.

27. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a recorded, Mirandized interview with [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] told Detectives that his friend [redacted] whom he later identified as [redacted] from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License Photo- told him of a recent conversation [redacted] had with [redacted] best friend - [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that [redacted] had been receiving packages containing marijuana from out-of-state, and [redacted] was being paid \$500 per package to "catch" (receive) them at his house.

28. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that approximately a month prior, [redacted] had come up with a ruse. Per [redacted] the ruse was to keep one of the packages containing marijuana, and lie to the senders- saying it had been seized by police and that was the reason for his imprisonment. Per [redacted] the person/people who sent the package discovered the ruse, and had kidnapped S. Koenig and were holding her as collateral for repayment on the drug debt. [redacted] stated he did not know how much the debt was that [redacted] owed, but thought there might have been 32 pounds of marijuana in the package.

29. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview of [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated he

had recently had a telephone conversation with [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] related the CS had told him that [redacted] had gone through with the ruse outlined in paragraph 15, and S. Koenig had been kidnapped and was being held until the debt was repaid. [redacted] did not know how much marijuana was in the package, but estimated the debt to be approximately \$60,000.

30. On 02-10-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview with [redacted] after he was contacted by Anchorage Police. [redacted] stated he had met S. Koenig a couple of times, most recently 6 months ago. [redacted] stated he had heard of S. Koenig's disappearance, but did not know where S. Koenig might be. [redacted] stated there was no conversation regarding Koenig's disappearance at that time. [redacted] was shown an Alaska Driver's license photo of [redacted] recognized [redacted] as being [redacted] and added that [redacted] was S. Koenig's [redacted]

31. During the interview, [redacted] stated that approximately 3 months prior, [redacted] picked up two boxes that contained approximately 15 pounds of marijuana. [redacted] thought the incident happened after New Year's Eve in 2012. [redacted] did not know how the boxes were sent, however [redacted] thought [redacted] had picked the boxes up from an independent mailing center near Arctic Boulevard. Your Affiant is

aware of a business called The Mail Cache- an independent packaging and shipping center- on Arctic Boulevard just south of 36th Avenue in Anchorage, Alaska.

32. [] stated he assisted [] in carrying one of the two boxes into [] residence. [] stated once opened, he/she observed marijuana in vacuum packed plastic bags secreted in backpacks and other carriers. [] stated that it was high quality marijuana, and would probably have a street value of about \$4,000 per pound.

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33. [] stated [] contacted the people who were intended to receive the marijuana, and told them one of the boxes was there. [] stated he thought [] was paid \$500 by the individual(s) who picked up the box, but he/she did not observe the box being picked up and therefore could not describe the individual(s). [] stated [] kept the other box and gave the contents to a man [] knew as [] who [] described as a [] year old male who drove a [] When asked [] estimated the worth of the marijuana in both boxes to be \$66,000.00.

34. [] stated [] knew he had an outstanding warrant. Upon keeping the second box, [] turned himself into the police, knowing he would be remanded to jail. Per [] then explained to the intended

recipient(s) of the second box that it had been seized by police, thereby resulting in his incarceration.

35. A check of Anchorage Police databases revealed that per APD Police Report #11-90558, on 12-29-2012 at approximately 2132 hours, [] contacted APD Dispatch and stated that he was in the lobby of the Ramada and knew that he had a warrant outstanding for his arrest for failing to appear for community work service. Per [] the intended recipient(s) of the box found out [] ruse, and demanded either payment for the marijuana or the marijuana returned. [] stated that he/she believed a possible motivation for S. Koenig's kidnapping was that the intended recipient(s) of the aforementioned package had abducted her and were holding her as "collateral" for payment of the marijuana.

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36. When asked, [] initially stated the last time he/she had contacted [] was several weeks prior. Upon being questioned further, including being told APD intended to apply for search warrants on both [] cell phone records, [] stated he spoke with [] on either 02-04-2012 or 02-06-2012. On 02-10-2012, Detective [] applied for and was granted glass warrant 3AN-12-223-sw, which authorized the monitoring and recording of conversations between [] Pursuant to that glass warrant, several monitored attempts were made on

02-11-2012 to contact [] at [] All of the calls were routed to voicemail.

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37. On 02-11-2012 at approximately 1430 hours, Detectives [] spoke to [] Detectives [] had previously interviewed [] on 02-10-2012. [] stated that at approximately 0100 hours on 02-11-2012 he had been at a residence located at [] [] in Anchorage, Alaska when [] arrived at the apartment. Per [] stated he had just been to an APD substation being questioned for 6 hours. [] stated [] then proceeded to utilize heroin to "get high."

38. Furthermore, [] stated that 3-4 days prior to the 11th, [] arrived at [] carrying a makeup case and a white winter jacket with odd stains on the back. [] indicated to Detective [] that he thought the stains looked like bloodstains. [] agreed to bring the makeup and jacket, which had been kept by the owner of [] since they had been brought to the residence. [] provided Detective [] with a white plastic bag which contained a white jacket and a small satchel which contained makeup, as well as two hairbrushes. [] stated the owner of the residence at [] [] had initially taken the makeup out of the container and co-mingled it with her own. At his request, she placed it back inside the makeup kit before turning it over to

APD. APD Officer [] conducted a presumptive test on some of the stain on the white jacket. The stain tested presumptively positive for blood.

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39. A Chase debit card found in the pocket of the jacket bore the name of [] On 02-09-2012, Detectives [] had contact with [] after she walked out of [] residence. [] was obviously under the influence of controlled substances. [] also had multiple obvious track marks- indicative of drug injections- on her inner elbows.

40. [] said [] then told him he was leaving to go out to Wasilla. [] questioned [] telling him he did not understand why [] was going to drive out to Wasilla because he did not live out there nor did he have any contacts out there. [] stated [] was insistent that he was going to Wasilla, then going to Kenai. Per [] left the residence on [] [] at approximately 0200 hours.

41. On 02-10-2012 at approximately 1830 hours, Detectives [] contacted [] At their direction, [] attempted to place several recorded telephone calls to [] All of the attempted calls went through to voicemail. Detective [] then asked [] if he had told anyone he had been contacted by police the evening before. [] vehemently denied telling [] he had

been held at an APD substation for 6 hours on 02-10-2012, as [] indicated. Detectives [] questioned [] repeatedly about his drug use. Contrary to what [] stated, [] stated he was not high and did not use drugs. At no time did [] mention bringing the white jacket or makeup kit to [] Detective [] described [] unique physical descriptors [] has [] to [] who told Detective [] he had never met anyone by that description.

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42. On 02-11-2012, Detectives [] conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [] At the same time but at a different location, Detectives [] [] interviewed [] girlfriend, [] [] During the interview, [] initially denied any knowledge regarding receiving the boxes of marijuana. He later amended he may have done so, but stated he firmly believed it did not have anything to do with S. Koenig's kidnapping, as he and S. Koenig weren't actual relatives.

43. Detective [] relayed to Detective [] that during his interview with [] she stated that at the end of December, [] had received two boxes. The first box had been given to [] received \$500 for "catching" (receiving) the package. [] kept the second package for himself, and executed a ruse to go to jail and tell the intended recipients that the police

had seized the package just prior to his being remanded to jail. Per [redacted] then sold the second package to [redacted] for \$5,000.00. [redacted] stated that [redacted] came over several times in the subsequent weeks and inquired about the box and having it returned to the intended recipient. At one point, [redacted] told [redacted] "Hey you don't know what these people are capable of; it's out of my hands." Per [redacted] stated he had heard about S. Koenig's abduction. [redacted] reassured [redacted] that this did not have anything to do with the debt, as it "had been taken care of."

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44. When confronted with the information provided by [redacted] [redacted] acknowledged that it was correct. He identified [redacted] as [redacted] from his Alaska driver's license photograph. [redacted] stated he did not have any information about who sent the box or where it came from. He stated only that we needed to speak to [redacted] to obtain information regarding the intended recipient of the box. He stated that the debt he owed for the second box was inconsequential, and reiterated it had nothing to do with S. Koenig's disappearance.

45. On 02-12-2012, Detective [redacted] and I conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [redacted]. He supplied his cell phone number of [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated that he had seen S. Koenig on a couple of occasions, but had no contact with her recently. [redacted]

stated that he was good friends with [redacted] and had only met S. Koenig through being at [redacted] residence. When we asked [redacted] who he gave the box of marijuana to after paying [redacted] \$500 for "catching" it, [redacted] became very upset. He placed his hand on the missing person flyer for S. Koenig and stated, "I had nothing to do with this!" I assured [redacted] that we did not believe he was responsible for S. Koenig's kidnapping or that we believed [redacted] knew where she was. Instead, we were keenly in need of the identity of the individual who was the ultimate recipient of the first box of marijuana, as that would likely be the person who wanted to collect on the debt [redacted] owed for stealing the second box. [redacted] stated again, "I had nothing to do with this. I want to leave." The interview was terminated and [redacted] was allowed to leave and provided a ride to his residence.

46. On 02-13-2012 and at the request of Detective [redacted] United States Postal Inspector Service (USPIS) Investigator [redacted] contacted the Mail Cache located at [redacted] [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. USPIS [redacted] discovered that [redacted] received three parcels at that location, where he rented box [redacted] Per USPIS [redacted] [redacted] paid cash for the Post Office Box rental, which he rented for only a month. All the parcels had been shipped via Fed Ex, and all were signed for by [redacted]

- a. The first parcel had tracking number 951376972815 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/15/2011. It was picked up in Anchorage on 12/16/2011.
- b. The second parcel had tracking number 951376972881 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/21/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.
- c. The third parcel had tracking number 490395927259 and was mailed from Red Bluff, CA on 12/22/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.

47. On 02-13-2012, Detectives [redacted] spoke with [redacted] [redacted] stated that 3-4 days prior, [redacted] had given her a ride to her mother's house to pick up some clothing. [redacted] stated she did not have a chance to get her white jacket and makeup kit out of [redacted] vehicle prior to his leaving to [redacted] [redacted] stated it was her understanding [redacted] gave the white jacket and makeup kit to [redacted] at [redacted]

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48. On 02-15-2012, [redacted] made several calls to APD Dispatch reporting that he was "being followed". [redacted] initially contacted APD on 02-15-2012 while at his residence and wanted to report a dark colored Mazda Navajo had been following him. APD Officer [redacted] responded and found the Mazda Navajo in question was visiting a house down the street from [redacted].

49. Per the call log, [] stated a male wearing a bullet proof vest was following him in a white Cadillac Escalade. A few minutes after making the 911 call to report someone following him, [] called back and stated he observed an elderly male exiting the vehicle suspected of following him and no police response was necessary.

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50. It should be noted that surveillance was indeed initiated on [] but none of the "suspect vehicles" [] described were the undercover vehicles operated by law enforcement conducting the surveillance. Furthermore, none of the officers on surveillance were wearing bullet proof vests. Per APD Officer [] even after placing the second call to APD to indicate he was mistaken, [] continued to drive very erratically- speeding, making multiple lane changes without using his turn signals, and running two red lights.

51. On 02-04-2012, [] posted the following on his Facebook page: ... IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DONATE TO THE REWARD FUND FOR THE RECUE OF SAMANTHA TESSLA KOENIG YOU CAN DO SO BY GOING TO ANY DENALI ALASKAN FEDERAL CREDIT UNION AND USE ACCOUNT #135006, OR I HAVE ALSO SET UP A PAYPAL ACCOUNT GOTO PAYPAL.COM AND ENTER MY EMAIL ADDRESS, ALL LOWER CASE, [] ALL PROCEEDS GO TO THE RESCUE EFFORTS AND REWARD TO ANYONE THAT CAN RETURN HER HOME TO ME SAFELY AND UNHARMED.. .

52. Investigators have confirmed the existence of a living trust account with the same account number as above (135006) exists at Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union. Furthermore, it is believed that other than Samantha Koenig, [REDACTED] is the only other person who has the ability to withdraw funds from the account.

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53. During the week of February 5th, 2012 Detective [REDACTED] and I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that an unusual amount of emphasis was being placed on raising reward funds, and expressed concern that raising money seemed to be the foremost goal of both [REDACTED].

54. On 02-08-2012 [REDACTED] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...WHOEVER HAS MY DAUGHTER JUST BRING HER ANYWHERE, TO A HOSPITAL, HOMES, SEND HER IN A CAB HOME ANONYMOUSLY, AND I WILL LEAVE ALL THE MONEY WE HAVE COLLECTED IN A CERTAIN PLACE OF YOUR CHOOSING WITHIN MINUTES OF YOUR INSTRUCTIONS, JUST RETURN HER TO ME.

55. On 02-14-2012, I received a call from [REDACTED] who wished to report that [REDACTED] had made a death threat to her earlier in the day. [REDACTED] explained that her daughter had printed t-shirts with Samantha Koenig's photograph on them and was selling the t-shirts for \$10 each. \$5 of the proceeds was to remain with [REDACTED].

daughter, while \$5 was to be donated to the reward fund. Per [] her daughter sold \$200 worth of t-shirts and earlier that day, [] had contacted [] in an attempt to collect the \$100 owed to her daughter. [] stated [] became very angry, and refused to give her the money. [] stated [] told her, "If you make one more t-shirt with [] face on it, I will kill you." [] maintained that [] actions during the last two weeks- when she often assisted in search efforts- was highly unusual. [] stated [] was almost obsessive about collecting money for the reward fund, at times checking the same donation jar several times a day. [] asked me to "check on it, because something about this just isn't right. He [] cares more about the money than he does about [] also told me she had observed [] smoking marijuana and carrying a shotgun in a soft-sided case on multiple occasions since the abduction. [] indicated she thought this was highly unusual behavior for a [] concerned over the loss of []

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56. On 02-16-2012, [] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...PLEASE FIND IT IN YOUR HEART TO HELP SAMANTHA, EVEN IF YOU COME TO ME, I WILL GUARANTEE YOUR SAFETY, AND SET YOU UP WITH ENOUGH MONEY TO LEAVE STATE AND START ANEW SOMEWHERE OF YOUR CHOOSING. AS LONG AS THE RESULT IS HER RETURNING TO ME SAFE AND

UNHARMED, ANYTHING LESS I WILL DEVOTE MY LIVE, AND RESOURCES TO HUNTING DOWN THE INDIVIDUALS RESPONSIBLE FOR STEALING MY LIFE FROM ME...

57. Based on the above information, I believe probable cause exists that [REDACTED] may attempt to enter into an agreement with S. Koenig's abductors and pay out the money in the reward fund in return for S. Koenig. Furthermore, the above information indicates [REDACTED] may not be forthcoming with the details of S. Koenig's abduction; including the identity of her abductors and the reasons behind her abduction.

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58. Furthermore, evidence sought that may show a relationship between the victim and person(s) that may have crucial knowledge of or participation in the crime of kidnapping. Further, that such a search may identify unknown witness who has vital information to this investigation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

59. On 02-24-2012, at 1956 hours, [REDACTED] received the following text on his cell phone [REDACTED] from Samantha Koenig's cell phone (907-884-8370): "Conner park sign under pic of albert aint she purty". [REDACTED] contacted me and relayed the information to me. At my request, APD Patrol Officers arrived at Conner Park- located on the southeast corner of Jewel Lake Road and

International Airport Road in Anchorage, Alaska- at approximately 2018 hours. [redacted] were already present. Attached to the park sign, below a flyer for a lost dog named "Albert", was a Ziploc bag which contained a folded piece of paper.

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60. Anchorage Police Officer [redacted] photographed the item and the surrounding area. The Anchorage Police Crime Scene team also responded to process the scene. Officer [redacted] then seized the Ziploc bag and the item inside and transported it to APD Headquarters prior to turning it over to me.

61. Once unfolded, the piece of paper was shown to contain a

photograph [redacted]

[redacted]

[redacted] A persons arm with a latex-gloved hand was in the lower left screen of the photo. The hand was holding onto the hair of the female; which had been braided. In the upper part of the screen was an Anchorage Daily Newspaper. I was able to find the front page of the Anchorage Daily News which corresponded with the one shown in the photograph. It was the issue released on Monday, February 13th, 2012. On 02-25-2012, [redacted] positively identified the female in the photograph as [redacted] [redacted] Samantha Koenig.

62. On the reverse side of the piece of paper was a ransom note which demanded \$30,000. The note indicated that in exchange for the money, between 6 months and a year from receipt of the money, the author would text the location of a packet of information which would provide law enforcement with all the information they needed to find her (S. Koenig.) The note indicated an account to which the money should be deposited. Investigators believe that the "account" numbers provided are not actually a bank account. Instead they are a 16 digit debit card number- the debit card belonging to [REDACTED]

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63. At my direction, [REDACTED] attempted to make multiple telephone calls to S. Koenig's telephone from 2330 hours on 02-24-2012 through 0135 hours on 02-25-2012. During all of the calls, there was one short ring followed by 4 long rings then an automated voicemail. Based on my training and experience, this is the type of cadence that occurs when a cellular telephone is forwarded to another telephonic device.

This application also seeks authorization to receive subscriber information including the subscriber names, addresses, and billing information related to the outgoing and incoming telephone numbers identified by the pen register and calling line identifier and to record or decode dialing, routing, addressing, cellular telephone towers, or signaling information transmitted from the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER**.

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70. I further request that the Court direct that upon service of the order upon it, the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire communication service in the United States whose assistance may facilitate execution of the order, furnish the information, facilities, and technical assistance necessary to accomplish unobtrusively the installation and use of the pen register and trap and trace device with compensation to be paid by the investigative agencies for reasonable expenses directly incurred in providing such facilities and assistance.

71. I further request that the order direct the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire or electronic communication service in the United States whose assistance is used to facilitate execution of the order, furnish the results of the pen register and trap and trace installation to the investigative agencies, as soon as practicable, twenty-four (24) hours a day, for the duration of the order.

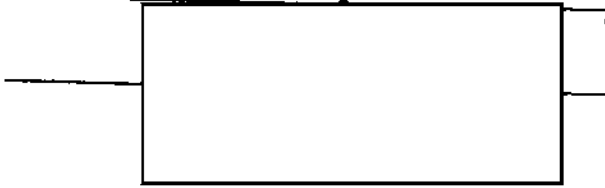

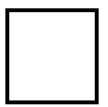

1. That since December 1997 I have been employed as a police officer with the Municipality of Anchorage. Upon graduation of a twenty-one week police academy, I completed fourteen weeks of field training and was assigned to patrol until May 2001. At this time I was promoted to the Special Assignment Unit, which specialized in conducting investigations into street level drugs, gambling, and prostitution.
2. In March 2002 I was promoted to Detective and assigned to the Burglary Unit at APD. In June 2002 I became a part of the

Metro Drug Unit until July 2007, when I was assigned to the Drug Enforcement Administration as a Task Force Officer until January 2012, when I was assigned to the Anchorage Police Department Homicide Unit and am currently assigned there.

3. Prior to being hired at the Anchorage Police Department, I graduated from Northern Michigan University with a Bachelor's Degree in Science. The focus of the degree was a major in Criminal Justice and a minor in Psychology. In December 2003 I obtained a Master's Degree in Criminal Justice from Boston University.
4. I have also completed an additional forty- hour advanced course in Crime Scene Processing and a forty- hour advanced course in Accident Investigation, as well as a forty- hour Detective Academy taught by the Anchorage Police Department. Additionally, I have completed a forty- hour course in clandestine drug laboratories from the Drug Enforcement Administration.
5. I have also completed an eighty-hour course of instruction in Basic Drug Investigations conducted by the Drug Enforcement Administration's training staff. This school trained me in state and federal drug laws, development of probable cause, search and seizure law, drug identification and field testing, informant handling, marijuana eradication, surveillance techniques, street lingo, packaging and pricing, transportation and distribution of drugs. I also received

- formal and supervised hands-on training in the field testing of cocaine, heroin, Methamphetamine and marijuana.
6. In July of 2005, I conceptualized, wrote, and instituted the drug field testing class at the Anchorage Police Department Police academy, and am currently the lead instructor for that course.
 7. On September 7th, 2006 I was qualified as an expert witness in drug paraphernalia in front of the honorable Judge Wolverton in Alaska Superior Court. In July 2007, I was qualified as an expert drug witness in front of the honorable Judge McKay in Alaska Superior Court. I have been qualified and testified as an expert witness in narcotics distribution in Alaska State grand jury proceedings approximately fifty (50) times in the past three years.
 8. During my tenure as a police officer, I have conducted and/or participated in numerous investigations relating to the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, and I have become familiar with devices, paraphernalia, techniques, and practices used by people engaged in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances. I have conducted and/or participated in investigations which have resulted in the seizure of marijuana, marijuana grow operations, cocaine hydrochloride, cocaine base (crack), opium, PCP, heroin, ketamine, methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA/ecstasy),

methamphetamine, methamphetamine laboratories, prescription medications, firearms, pagers, cellular telephones, surveillance systems, cameras, memory cards, computers, documents, money, and precious metals. I have also conducted numerous interviews of people involved in the use, possession, manufacture, and trafficking of controlled substances, adding to my knowledge of the illegal drug culture in the Anchorage area. In addition to my formal training and experience, I have gained knowledge and insight by working and speaking with many experienced law enforcement agents from local, state, and federal agencies, and I consider this knowledge and insight to be an integral part of my experience and training.

9. I have worked as an undercover officer for prostitution and controlled substance cases and have assisted other Detectives with controlled substance cases as photographer, surveillance officer, evidence custodian, and entry/search team member. I have been the case officer on drug cases, assigning and directing other officers in the investigations. I have also acted as a Control Officer for handling Cooperating Sources in controlled substance cases.

INVESTIGATION

10. I am currently assisting in the investigation of APD case 12-5307, a kidnapping investigation. The following information is based upon either my own observations or the

observations of other Anchorage Police Officers conveyed to me orally or via their written reports prepared under Anchorage Police Case 12-5307.

11. On 2-2-12 at about 12:39 [REDACTED]

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Common Ground Coffee stand at 630 E. Tudor, contacted APD dispatch. [REDACTED] was calling from Oregon, where he was vacationing. He reported that while viewing his internet based security system he saw one of his employees, Samantha Koenig, appear to be abducted. [REDACTED] said he was contacted by [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] who had been unable to locate her. This contact prompted [REDACTED] to review his security video which showed an unknown man climb through the window of the coffee stand at about 20:00 on 2-1-12 while Koenig was working. The video shows Koenig giving the man the money from the register and leaving with him.

12. During a taped Mirandized interview on 02-02-2012 by Detective [REDACTED] and I, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] said he went to the coffee stand on 2-1-12 at about 20:33 to give her a ride home but the stand appeared to be closed and she was not there. [REDACTED] was asked to describe in detail exactly what he did when he arrived at Common Grounds to pick S. Koenig up from work on 02-01-2012. [REDACTED] stated he drove around the coffee stand and noticed the interior lights were off. He then parked the truck, got out, and looked through one of the windows.

He stated that "everything was closed", that the wooden slides used to block the windows from sliding were in place. He added that there were napkins on the floor and the towels used to clean still sitting on the countertop which he thought was unusual as S. Koenig was very conscientious about being neat. [redacted] stated that after looking in the windows and noticing the wooden blocks were in place, he did not attempt to see if the door was locked as he did not want to "trigger an alarm and be accused of breaking in."

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13. APD Detectives have obtained both interior and exterior surveillance tape from Common Grounds. On 02-01-2012 at approximately 2023 hours, multiple surveillance cameras show a vehicle matching [redacted] truck) drive up to Common Grounds, briefly pause at one of the windows (as if the driver is looking in the window) and then drive away. As indicated by the surveillance videos, the vehicle was in the vicinity of the coffee stand for approximately 8 seconds.

14. Throughout the interview, [redacted] consulted text messages and telephone call logs on his cell phone to provided Detective [redacted] and I with the exact times of events that occurred on 02-01-2012 and 02-02-2012. [redacted] initially told Detectives that he and Koenig's relationship had been "bumpy" at one point, but had been going well recently, including the day Koenig disappeared.

When asked to describe why the relationship was "bumpy", [redacted] stated he had been talking to other girls on Facebook- which Koenig did not like. During the time [redacted] was speaking about the day Koenig disappeared, he referenced several texts between him and Koenig and moved his cell phone across the table in the interview room so I could read them as well. After reading several of the texts from 02-01-2012 between [redacted] and Koenig (with [redacted] scrolling through them without prompting so I could read them), I indicated several texts that implied S. Koenig and [redacted] were arguing. [redacted] then admitted that at one point he had called Koenig to talk to her, and she told him she couldn't talk because she was busy with a customer. [redacted] stated he said, "Whatever," and ended the call. [redacted] vehemently denied any further disagreements between he and S. Koenig.

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15. [redacted] said he tried to contact S. Koenig at her cell phone by calling and texting but he did not get an immediate reply. Samantha Koenig's cellular telephone number is (907)884-8370 (the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER.**) [redacted] said he continued attempting to contact Koenig and got a reply at about 2324 hours on 2-1-12. [redacted] showed me the text, which read, "F U asshole i know what u did i am going to spend a couple of days with friends need time to think plan actig weird let my dad know." [redacted] said from the word usage and texting style he does not

believe Koenig authored the text. Koenig's cell phone provider is GCI, her number is (907) 884-8370. At 2353 hours, [redacted] cell phone showed a second text message received from S. Koenig's phone. The second text message read, "F U".

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16. [redacted] also reported that at about 0300 on 2-2-12 he saw a man wearing a mask going through Koenig's vehicle which was parked at their residence, [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. [redacted] told me during an initial interview on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours that he subsequently went through the vehicle and found nothing missing but Samantha Koenig's Alaska Driver's License- which was kept in a zippered pocket on a visor organizer on the driver's side of the vehicle. [redacted] told Detective [redacted] and I he was positive nothing else was missing from the vehicle.

17. [redacted] said he and Koenig share the vehicle, a [redacted] [redacted] AK plate [redacted] and each of them have keys to the vehicle [redacted] said the last time Koenig used the vehicle was when she drove it to work the morning of 2-1-12. [redacted] told me that he remained at his residence of [redacted] in Anchorage where he fell asleep at approximately 0430 hours until approximately 0920 hours. When I asked him why he had not at some point contacted the police department to report the suspicious circumstances and S. Koenig missing, he replied that he did not think the

police would "do anything about it until they were missing for 24 hours." This was the same answer [redacted] provided during his interview, which immediately preceded [redacted]

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18. The [redacted] AK plate [redacted] was impounded to APD secure storage on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1400 hours. A search warrant was subsequently obtained and executed on the vehicle by the Anchorage Police Department. In the visor organizer, in the same pocket as [redacted] described Koenig's missing id was kept, was a Visa credit card and a Credit Union 1 debit card.

19. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 0330 hours, an individual dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt, sunglasses, jacket and black gloves utilized an ATM at the Denali Alaskan FCU located 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. The individual utilized an ATM card issued to Duanne Tortolani.

20. On 02-02-2012 at approximately 2000 hours and at my request, APD Officers [redacted] [redacted] responded to [redacted] I requested a brief follow up with [redacted] in reference to why he had called Common Grounds the morning of 02-02-2012 demanding to see the video surveillance from the night before. Officer [redacted] told me he knocked on the door to [redacted] and [redacted] answered the door. Immediately after opening the door, [redacted] opened it enough to allow himself through,

and left the door only slightly ajar while he spoke with Officer [redacted]. Upon requesting to talk to [redacted] re-entered the apartment via the same method, and closed it firmly behind him. When [redacted] came to the door, he too opened it only enough he could fit through, and then closed it behind him while he spoke to Officer [redacted].

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21. On 02-05-2012, at approximately 0900 hours, APD Detective [redacted] and I went to [redacted] in an effort to contact [redacted] reference the ATM card usage. No one answered the knock on the door to the residence. The occupant of [redacted] a white male who identified himself as [redacted] stated that neither [redacted] was home. I called [redacted] and asked him to come to APD Headquarters. [redacted] who stated he was with [redacted] distributing missing person fliers. He refused my request to come to APD Headquarters, and then the phone was taken by [redacted]. [redacted] angrily demanded to know why "we were at his house looking for him." I told [redacted] we were in fact looking for [redacted] because we had further questions for him. [redacted] expressed suspicion at this and stated he and [redacted] would meet us at a separate location, but not at the residence.

22. At approximately 1200 hours, Detective [redacted] and I contacted [redacted] behind the Spenard Builder's Supply located at Tudor Road and Minnesota Blvd.

They arrived with [redacted] operating a [redacted] [redacted] Alaska license plate [redacted] Detective [redacted] contacted [redacted] while I spoke with [redacted]. During the contact, which was tape recorded, I asked [redacted] what his knowledge of S. Koenig's finances were. He stated she had an account at Credit Union One for a long while, and approximately a week and a half prior, he had been added to the account. He stated two debit cards were issued for the account- which had a balance of approximately \$5.00 United States Currency. He stated the cards bore different numbers even though they were for the same account, but they had obtained the same PIN number for both of the cards. [redacted] knew "for a fact" that the last activity on the account was on January 31st when he used the account to cash a check for \$30.00. When asked what his debit card was, [redacted] stated it was in his wallet- which he described as brown in color- which was in the [redacted] stated the wallet was either in the same visor organizer S. Koenig's identification had been taken from, or in the center console of the vehicle. When a State of Alaska search warrant was executed on the vehicle on 02-03-2012, no wallet was found.

23. During his initial contact with APD Officer [redacted] on 02-02-2012 at approximately 1200 hours, [redacted] denied any knowledge that Samantha Koenig had ever used drugs. He provided his cellular telephone number of [redacted]

During the taped, Mirandized interview of [redacted] conducted on 02-02-2012, [redacted] told me that S. Koenig used marijuana, and had used cocaine a year prior but had been "clean" since that time. [redacted] provided a cellular phone number of [redacted]. During a recorded interview with S. Koenig's [redacted] [redacted] stated Samantha Koenig was a recovering cocaine addict. During interviews with several other friends and acquaintances of Samantha Koenig, the fact that she was recovering from a substance abuse problem and that she occasionally relapsed seemed to be a common theme.

24. On 02-05-2012, Detectives [redacted] drove to a residence located at [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska in an attempt to contact [redacted] was not there, but they spoke with [redacted] who identified himself as S. Koenig's [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated that [redacted] behavior changed dramatically about a week and a half prior as he was moving out of the [redacted] address. Specifically, [redacted] [redacted] stated [redacted] was "doing licks" (street lingo for robbing drug dealers). Furthermore, [redacted] [redacted] observed what he described as a black and grey smith and Wesson .40 semi auto pistol tucked in the front of [redacted] pants and stated [redacted] boasted of "pulling a lick" at that time.

25. On 02-05-2012 Detectives [redacted] conducted an interview with [redacted] Samantha Koenig's

[redacted]
[redacted] During

interviews with multiple friends and family members of Samantha Koenig, [redacted] is considered S. Koenig's

[redacted]
[redacted] During the interview, [redacted]

stated he knew S. Koenig, but did not have much of a relationship with her. He indicated his girlfriend- [redacted]

[redacted] knew her much better, and Detectives should talk to [redacted] for more information. [redacted] told Detectives

that he knew from relatives that S. Koenig was missing, but did not believe it was a legitimate abduction. [redacted]

stated he had been talking with his father- [redacted] regarding S. Koenig, and stated he told his father that S.

Koenig had relapsed and was on a "cocaine binge." [redacted] stated his cell phone number was [redacted]

26. On 02-08-2012, pursuant to Alaska Search warrant #3AN-12-206sw, members of the Anchorage Police Department searched

[redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. Per Detective [redacted] present in the crawl space of the apartment

appeared to be a marijuana grow operation that was recently dismantled. In addition to two 1000 watt halogen bulbs, there was growing medium, several pots, black plastic, and

marijuana "shake"- or small pieces of discarded marijuana plant material.

27. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a recorded, Mirandized interview with [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] told Detectives that his friend [redacted] whom he later identified as [redacted] from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License Photo- told him of a recent conversation [redacted] had with [redacted] best friend - [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that [redacted] had been receiving packages containing marijuana from out-of-state, and [redacted] was being paid \$500 per package to "catch" (receive) them at his house.

28. [redacted] stated [redacted] told him that approximately a month prior, [redacted] had come up with a ruse. Per [redacted] the ruse was to keep one of the packages containing marijuana, and lie to the senders- saying it had been seized by police and that was the reason for his imprisonment. Per [redacted] the person/people who sent the package discovered the ruse, and had kidnapped S. Koenig and were holding her as collateral for repayment on the drug debt. [redacted] stated he did not know how much the debt was that [redacted] owed, but thought there might have been 32 pounds of marijuana in the package.

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29. On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview of [redacted] date of birth [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated he had recently had a telephone conversation with [redacted] whom he identified from [redacted] Alaska Driver's License photo. [redacted] related the CS had told him that [redacted] had gone through with the ruse outlined in paragraph 15, and S. Koenig had been kidnapped and was being held until the debt was repaid. [redacted] did not know how much marijuana was in the package, but estimated the debt to be approximately \$60,000.

30. On 02-10-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped, Mirandized interview with [redacted] after he was contacted by Anchorage Police. [redacted] stated he had met S. Koenig a couple of times, most recently 6 months ago. [redacted] stated he had heard of S. Koenig's disappearance, but did not know where S. Koenig might be. [redacted] stated there was no conversation regarding Koenig's disappearance at that time. [redacted] was shown an Alaska Driver's license photo of [redacted] recognized [redacted] as being [redacted] and added that [redacted] was S. Koenig's [redacted]

31. During the interview, [redacted] stated that approximately 3 months prior, [redacted] picked up two boxes that contained approximately 15 pounds of marijuana. [redacted] thought the incident happened after New Year's Eve in 2012. [redacted] did

not know how the boxes were sent, however [redacted] thought [redacted] had picked the boxes up from an independent mailing center near Arctic Boulevard. Your Affiant is aware of a business called The Mail Cache- an independent packaging and shipping center- on Arctic Boulevard just south of 36th Avenue in Anchorage, Alaska.

32. [redacted] stated he assisted [redacted] in carrying one of the two boxes into [redacted] residence. [redacted] stated once opened, he/she observed marijuana in vacuum packed plastic bags secreted in backpacks and other carriers. [redacted] stated that it was high quality marijuana, and would probably have a street value of about \$4,000 per pound.

33. [redacted] stated [redacted] contacted the people who were intended to receive the marijuana, and told them one of the boxes was there. [redacted] stated he thought [redacted] was paid \$500 by the individual(s) who picked up the box, but he/she did not observe the box being picked up and therefore could not describe the individual(s). [redacted] stated [redacted] kept the other box and gave the contents to a man [redacted] knew as [redacted] who [redacted] described as a [redacted] year old male who drove a [redacted]. When asked, [redacted] estimated the worth of the marijuana in both boxes to be \$66,000.00.

34. [redacted] stated [redacted] knew [redacted]
[redacted]

Per		then explained to

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35. A check of Anchorage Police databases revealed that per APD Police Report [redacted] on [redacted] at approximately 2132 hours, [redacted] contacted APD Dispatch and stated that

--

[redacted] Per [redacted] the intended recipient(s) of the box found out [redacted] ruse, and demanded either payment for the marijuana or the marijuana returned. [redacted] stated that he/she believed a possible motivation for S. Koenig's kidnapping was that the intended recipient(s) of the aforementioned package had abducted her and were holding her as "collateral" for payment of the marijuana.

36. When asked, [redacted] initially stated the last time he/she had contacted [redacted] was several weeks prior. Upon being questioned further, including being told APD intended to apply for search warrants on [redacted] cell phone records, [redacted] stated he spoke with [redacted] on either 02-04-2012 or 02-06-2012. On 02-10-2012, Detective [redacted] applied for and was granted glass warrant 3AN-12-223-sw, which authorized the monitoring and recording of conversations between [redacted] Pursuant to

that glass warrant, several monitored attempts were made on 02-11-2012 to contact [] at [] All of the calls were routed to voicemail.

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37. On 02-11-2012 at approximately 1430 hours, Detectives [] spoke to [] Detectives [] had previously interviewed [] on 02-10-2012. [] stated that at approximately 0100 hours on 02-11-2012 he had been at a residence located at [] [] in Anchorage, Alaska when [] arrived at the apartment. Per [] stated he had just been to an APD substation being questioned for 6 hours. [] stated [] then proceeded to utilize heroin to "get high."

38. Furthermore, [] stated that 3-4 days prior to the 11th, [] arrived at [] carrying a makeup case and a white winter jacket with odd stains on the back. [] indicated to Detective [] that he thought the stains looked like bloodstains. [] agreed to bring the makeup and jacket, which had been kept by the owner of [] since they had been brought to the residence. [] provided Detective [] with a white plastic bag which contained a white jacket and a small satchel which contained makeup, as well as two hairbrushes. [] stated the owner of the residence at [] [] had initially taken the makeup out of the container and co-mingled it with her own. At his request, she placed

it back inside the makeup kit before turning it over to APD. APD Officer [redacted] conducted a presumptive test on some of the stain on the white jacket. The stain tested presumptively positive for blood.

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39. A Chase debit card found in the pocket of the jacket bore the name of [redacted] On 02-09-2012, Detectives [redacted] had contact with [redacted] after she walked out of [redacted] residence. [redacted] was obviously under the influence of controlled substances. [redacted] also had multiple obvious track marks- indicative of drug injections- on her inner elbows.

40. [redacted] said [redacted] then told him he was leaving to go out to Wasilla. [redacted] questioned [redacted] telling him he did not understand why [redacted] was going to drive out to Wasilla because he did not live out there nor did he have any contacts out there. [redacted] stated [redacted] was insistent that he was going to Wasilla, then going to Kenai. Per [redacted] left the residence on [redacted] [redacted] at approximately 0200 hours.

41. On 02-10-2012 at approximately 1830 hours, Detectives [redacted] contacted [redacted] At their direction, [redacted] attempted to place several recorded telephone calls to [redacted] All of the attempted calls went through to voicemail. Detective [redacted] then asked [redacted] if he had told anyone he had been contacted by police the evening

before. [redacted] vehemently denied telling [redacted] he had been held at an APD substation for 6 hours on 02-10-2012, as [redacted] indicated. Detectives [redacted] questioned [redacted] repeatedly about his drug use. Contrary to what [redacted] stated, [redacted] stated he was not high and did not use drugs. At no time did [redacted] mention bringing the white jacket or makeup kit to [redacted]. Detective [redacted] described [redacted] unique physical descriptors [redacted] has [redacted] to [redacted] who told Detective [redacted] he had never met anyone by that description.

42. On 02-11-2012, Detectives [redacted] conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [redacted]. At the same time but at a different location, Detectives [redacted] [redacted] interviewed [redacted] girlfriend, [redacted]. [redacted] During the interview, [redacted] initially denied any knowledge regarding receiving the boxes of marijuana. He later amended he may have done so, but stated he firmly believed it did not have anything to do with S. Koenig's kidnapping, as he and S. Koenig weren't actual relatives.

43. Detective [redacted] relayed to Detective [redacted] that during his interview with [redacted] she stated that at the end of December, [redacted] had received two boxes. The first box had been given to [redacted] received \$500 for "catching" (receiving) the package... [redacted] kept the second package for himself, and executed a ruse to go

to jail and tell the intended recipients that the police had seized the package just prior to his being remanded to jail. Per [redacted] then sold the second package to [redacted] for \$5,000.00. [redacted] stated that [redacted] came over several times in the subsequent weeks and inquired about the box and having it returned to the intended recipient. At one point, [redacted] told [redacted] "Hey you don't know what these people are capable of; it's out of my hands." Per [redacted] stated he had heard about S. Koenig's abduction. [redacted] reassured [redacted] that this did not have anything to do with the debt, as it "had been taken care of."

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44. When confronted with the information provided by [redacted] [redacted] acknowledged that it was correct. He identified [redacted] as [redacted] from his Alaska driver's license photograph. [redacted] stated he did not have any information about who sent the box or where it came from. He stated only that we needed to speak to [redacted] to obtain information regarding the intended recipient of the box. He stated that the debt he owed for the second box was inconsequential, and reiterated it had nothing to do with S. Koenig's disappearance.

45. On 02-12-2012, Detective [redacted] and I conducted a taped Mirandized interview with [redacted]. He supplied his cell phone number of [redacted]. During the interview, [redacted] stated that he had seen S. Koenig on a couple of

occasions, but had no contact with her recently. [redacted] stated that he was good friends with [redacted] and had only met S. Koenig through being at [redacted] residence. When we asked [redacted] who he gave the box of marijuana to after paying [redacted] \$500 for "catching" it, [redacted] became very upset. He placed his hand on the missing person flyer for S. Koenig and stated, "I had nothing to do with this!" I assured [redacted] that we did not believe he was responsible for S. Koenig's kidnapping or that we believed [redacted] knew where she was. Instead, we were keenly in need of the identity of the individual who was the ultimate recipient of the first box of marijuana, as that would likely be the person who wanted to collect on the debt [redacted] owed for stealing the second box. [redacted] stated again, "I had nothing to do with this. I want to leave." The interview was terminated and [redacted] was allowed to leave and provided a ride to his residence.

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46. On 02-13-2012 and at the request of Detective [redacted] United States Postal Inspector Service (USPIS) Investigator [redacted] contacted the Mail Cache located at [redacted] [redacted] in Anchorage, Alaska. USPIS [redacted] discovered that [redacted] received three parcels at that location, where he rented box [redacted] Per USPIS [redacted] [redacted] paid cash for the Post Office Box rental, which he rented for only a month. All the parcels had been shipped via Fed Ex, and all were signed for by [redacted]

- a. The first parcel had tracking number 951376972815 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/15/2011. It was picked up in Anchorage on 12/16/2011.
- b. The second parcel had tracking number 951376972881 and was mailed from Anderson, CA on 12/21/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.
- c. The third parcel had tracking number 490395927259 and was mailed from Red Bluff, CA on 12/22/2011. It was picked up on 12/27/2011.

47. On 02-13-2012, Detectives [redacted] spoke with [redacted] [redacted] stated that 3-4 days prior, [redacted] had given her a ride to her mother's house to pick up some clothing. [redacted] stated she did not have a chance to get her white jacket and makeup kit out of [redacted] vehicle prior to his leaving to [redacted] [redacted] stated it was her understanding [redacted] gave the white jacket and makeup kit to [redacted] at [redacted]

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48. On 02-15-2012, [redacted] made several calls to APD Dispatch reporting that he was "being followed". [redacted] initially contacted APD on 02-15-2012 while at his residence and wanted to report a dark colored Mazda Navajo had been following him. APD Officer [redacted] responded and found the Mazda Navajo in question was visiting a house down the street from [redacted]

49. Per the call log, [] stated a male wearing a bullet proof vest was following him in a white Cadillac Escalade. A few minutes after making the 911 call to report someone following him, [] called back and stated he observed an elderly male exiting the vehicle suspected of following him and no police response was necessary.

50. It should be noted that surveillance was indeed initiated on [] but none of the "suspect vehicles" [] described were the undercover vehicles operated by law enforcement conducting the surveillance. Furthermore, none of the officers on surveillance were wearing bullet proof vests. Per APD Officer [] even after placing the second call to APD to indicate he was mistaken, [] continued to drive very erratically- speeding, making multiple lane changes without using his turn signals, and running two red lights.

51. On 02-04-2012, [] posted the following on his Facebook page: ... IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO DONATE TO THE REWARD FUND FOR THE RECUE OF SAMANTHA TESSLA KOENIG YOU CAN DO SO BY GOING TO ANY DENALI ALASKAN FEDERAL CREDIT UNION AND USE ACCOUNT #135006, OR I HAVE ALSO SET UP A PAYPAL ACCOUNT GOTO PAYPAL.COM AND ENTER MY EMAIL ADDRESS, ALL LOWER CASE, [] ALL PROCEEDS GO TO THE RESCUE EFFORTS AND REWARD TO ANYONE THAT CAN RETURN HER HOME TO ME SAFELY AND UNHARMED..

52. Investigators have confirmed the existence of a living trust account with the same account number as above (135006) exists at Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union. Furthermore, it is believed that other than Samantha Koenig, [REDACTED] is the only other person who has the ability to withdraw funds from the account.

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53. During the week of February 5th, 2012 Detective [REDACTED] and I spoke with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] stated that an unusual amount of emphasis was being placed on raising reward funds, and expressed concern that raising money seemed to be the foremost goal of both [REDACTED].

54. On 02-08-2012 [REDACTED] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...WHOEVER HAS MY DAUGHTER JUST BRING HER ANYWHERE, TO A HOSPITAL, HOMES, SEND HER IN A CAB HOME ANONYMOUSLY, AND I WILL LEAVE ALL THE MONEY WE HAVE COLLECTED IN A CERTAIN PLACE OF YOUR CHOOSING WITHIN MINUTES OF YOUR INSTRUCTIONS, JUST RETURN HER TO ME.

55. On 02-14-2012, I received a call from [REDACTED] who wished to report that [REDACTED] had made a death threat to her earlier in the day. [REDACTED] explained that her daughter had printed t-shirts with Samantha Koenig's photograph on them and was selling the t-shirts for \$10 each. \$5 of the proceeds was to remain with [REDACTED].

daughter, while \$5 was to be donated to the reward fund. Per [redacted] her daughter sold \$200 worth of t-shirts and earlier that day, [redacted] had contacted [redacted] in an attempt to collect the \$100 owed to her daughter. [redacted] stated [redacted] became very angry, and refused to give her the money. [redacted] stated [redacted] told her, "If you make one more t-shirt with [redacted] face on it, I will kill you." [redacted] maintained that [redacted] actions during the last two weeks- when she often assisted in search efforts- was highly unusual. [redacted] stated [redacted] was almost obsessive about collecting money for the reward fund, at times checking the same donation jar several times a day. [redacted] asked me to "check on it, because something about this just isn't right. He [redacted] cares more about the money than he does about [redacted] also told me she had observed [redacted] smoking marijuana and carrying a shotgun in a soft-sided case on multiple occasions since the abduction. [redacted] indicated she thought this was highly unusual behavior for [redacted] concerned over the loss of [redacted]

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56. On 02-16-2012, [redacted] posted the following information on his Facebook page: ...PLEASE FIND IT IN YOUR HEART TO HELP SAMANTHA, EVEN IF YOU COME TO ME, I WILL GUARANTEE YOUR SAFETY, AND SET YOU UP WITH ENOUGH MONEY TO LEAVE STATE AND START ANEW SOMEWHERE OF YOUR CHOOSING. AS LONG AS THE RESULT IS HER RETURNING TO ME SAFE AND

UNHARMED, ANYTHING LESS I WILL DEVOTE MY LIVE, AND
RESOURCES TO HUNTING DOWN THE INDIVIDUALS RESPONSIBLE FOR
STEALING MY LIFE FROM ME...

57. Based on the above information, I believe probable cause exists that [REDACTED] may attempt to enter into an agreement with S. Koenig's abductors and pay out the money in the reward fund in return for S. Koenig. Furthermore, the above information indicates [REDACTED] may not be forthcoming with the details of S. Koenig's abduction; including the identity of her abductors and the reasons behind her abduction.

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58. Furthermore, evidence sought that may show a relationship between the victim and person(s) that may have crucial knowledge of or participation in the crime of kidnapping. Further, that such a search may identify unknown witness who has vital information to this investigation.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

59. On 02-24-2012, at 1956 hours, [REDACTED] received the following text on his cell phone [REDACTED] from Samantha Koenig's cell phone- 907-884-8370- the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER:** "Conner park sign under pic of albert aint she purty". [REDACTED] contacted me and relayed the information to me. At my request, APD Patrol Officers arrived at Conner Park- located on the southeast corner of

Jewel Lake Road and International Airport Road in

Anchorage, Alaska- at approximately 2018 hours. [redacted]

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[redacted] were already present. Attached to the park sign, below a flyer for a lost dog named "Albert", was a Ziploc bag which contained a folded piece of paper.

60. Anchorage Police Officer [redacted] photographed the item and the surrounding area. The Anchorage Police Crime Scene team also responded to process the scene. Officer [redacted] then seized the Ziploc bag and the item inside and transported it to APD Headquarters prior to turning it over to me.

61. Once unfolded, the piece of paper was shown to contain a photograph [redacted]

[redacted] A persons arm with a latex-gloved hand was in the lower left screen of the photo. The hand was holding onto the hair of the female; which had been braided. In the upper part of the screen was an Anchorage Daily Newspaper. I was able to find the front page of the Anchorage Daily News which corresponded with the one shown in the photograph. It was the issue released on Monday, February 13th, 2012. On 02-25-2012, [redacted] positively identified the female in the photograph as [redacted]

62. On the reverse side of the piece of paper was a ransom note which demanded \$30,000. The note indicated that in exchange for the money, between 6 months and a year from receipt of the money, the author would text the location of a packet of information which would provide law enforcement with all the information they needed to find her (S. Koenig.) The note indicated an account to which the money should be deposited. Investigators believe that the "account" numbers provided are not actually a bank account. Instead they are a 16 digit debit card number- the debit card belonging to [REDACTED]

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63. At my direction, [REDACTED] attempted to make multiple telephone calls to S. Koenig's telephone from 2330 hours on 02-24-2012 through 0135 hours on 02-25-2012. During all of the calls, there was one short ring followed by 4 long rings then an automated voicemail. Based on my training and experience, this is the type of cadence that occurs when a cellular telephone is forwarded to another telephonic device.

I would like to request the installation of a pen register (a device to identify/register telephone numbers dialed or pulsed from a specified telephone number), and calling line identifiers (a device to identify incoming telephone numbers from which calls are made into a specified telephone number, statutorily referenced as a "trap and trace device") on the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER**, (907)884-8370, which is a cellular telephone issued by General Communications Incorporated (GCI) for a period of 60 (sixty) days from the date of installation. I request the Court authorize the installation, service, and monitoring of this device to be conducted by members of the Anchorage Police Department or other qualified law enforcement personnel to included technical assistance in implementing this order, warrant, etc., provided by the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). This application also seeks authorization to receive subscriber information including the subscriber names, addresses, and billing information related to the outgoing and incoming telephone numbers identified by the pen register and calling line identifier and to record or decode dialing, routing, addressing, cellular telephone towers, or signaling information transmitted from the **TARGET TELEPHONE NUMBER**.

70. I further request that the Court direct that upon service of the order upon it, the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire communication service in the United States whose assistance may facilitate execution of the order, furnish the information, facilities, and technical assistance necessary to accomplish unobtrusively the installation and use of the pen register and trap and trace device with compensation to be paid by the investigative agencies for reasonable expenses directly incurred in providing such facilities and assistance.

71. I further request that the order direct the local, long distance, and wireless carriers, and any other person or entity providing wire or electronic communication service in the United States whose assistance is used to facilitate execution of the order, furnish the results of the pen register and trap and trace installation to the investigative agencies, as soon as practicable, twenty-four (24) hours a day, for the duration of the order.

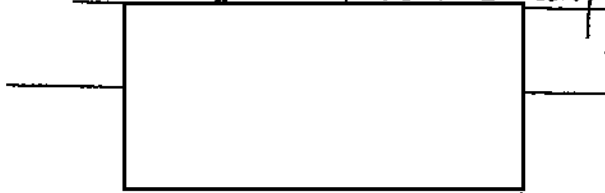

73. Additionally, and for the same reasons, the Affiant asks that the authorizations, and the affidavit in support of them be sealed by The Court in order to prevent unauthorized persons from seeing this affidavit and authorization as the safety of the CS and associated law enforcement officers would be compromised.

74. I respectfully request that this authorization be sealed by the Court in order to prevent unauthorized people from seeing this affidavit and authorization.

At approximately 10:13pm that night, the subject conducted a balance inquiry and attempted to withdraw \$600 of the ransom money at a local automated teller machine (ATM). This withdrawal attempt exceeded the daily withdrawal limit, and thus, was unsuccessful. This ATM did not have a camera. However, the subject was captured arriving and departing the area in what appeared to be a light-colored mid-size sport utility vehicle, by the surveillance system covering the parking lot of the nearby Sea Galley restaurant (item 1b4). For reference, the subject SUV entered the parking lot from the west (right side of screen) near the beginning of the video and parked at the back of the lot. The subject sat in the vehicle for several minutes, then exited the vehicle and walked off the screen the same way he drove in, shortly after a truck drove through the lot. A few minutes later, the subject returned to the vehicle and departed the area.

At approximately 11:56pm that night, an unknown subject wearing a face mask, glasses and dark clothing withdrew \$500 of the ransom money at the ATM located at the Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union (DAFCU) at 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage. It is strongly believed that this is the same individual who conducted the aforementioned balance inquiry and withdrawal attempt. On 02/24/2012, a ransom note demanding \$30,000 was delivered. On 02/28/2012, \$5,000 was deposited into the specified ransom account by the victim's father. These funds can only be accessed using a VISA debit card bearing account number [REDACTED] expiration date [REDACTED] in the name of [REDACTED] [REDACTED] and who does not currently appear to have participated in this abduction.

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To date, the card has only been used at Automated Teller Machines (ATMs), rather than point of sale (POS) devices in stores. [REDACTED] reported that his identification was co-located with his debit card in his wallet at the time of it's loss/theft. However, it is unknown if the unsub(s) are in possession of [REDACTED] identification/other cards or bear sufficient resemblance to [REDACTED] to use his identification in conjunction with the aforementioned VISA debit card (if necessary).

From approximately 10:13pm on 02/28/2012, to about 12:28am on 02/29/2012, the unsub(s) conducted a balance inquiry, attempted withdrawal (which was denied because it exceeded the \$500 daily withdrawal limit), and a series of two successful withdrawals in the amount of \$500 each. These transactions were conducted at three separate ATMs, operated by two different financial institutions, scattered throughout midtown Anchorage. To date, no connection has been established between these institutions/ATMs and the unsub(s) in this matter.

Although substantial amounts of surveillance video have been collected throughout this matter, the unsub(s) have routinely demonstrated excellent preparation and patience in the selection of outdoor ATMs located in areas with sparse late-night traffic. He/they also sometimes park in adjacent lots, and appear to scan the area thoroughly before exiting the vehicle and approaching the ATM. Finally, the unsub(s) wear excessive amounts of clothing, including glasses, facemasks, hoods and gloves, presumably to limit exposure to surveillance cameras and/or latent prints. Consequently, to date, very limited descriptive data has been collected regarding the unsub(s), other than that at least one subject appears to be a male adult with light skin tone, muscular build and athletic physical movements. Special Agent (SA) [redacted] notified Supervisory Senior Resident Agent (SSRA) [redacted] Las Cruces Resident Agency (LCRA), of the aforementioned information. SSRA [redacted] responded in concert with other personnel, and collected surveillance footage from this WB, conducted neighborhood canvasses, and other logical investigation in Lordsburg and the surrounding Interstate 10 corridor. 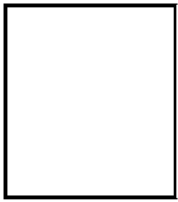

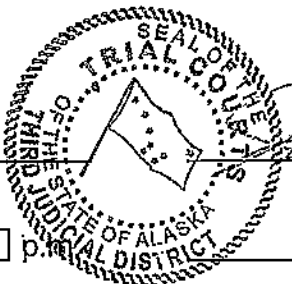

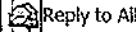

I spoke with [Redacted] (NM DOT) [Redacted] at around 4:15 PM MST and she advised that her supervisor reviewed the overpass videos from the I-10 NM DOT cameras in Lordsburg for our subject vehicle (i.e. the white Chevy Cruz or Sonic looking car), and they saw no vehicle matching that description between midnight and 3:00 AM. The caveat is that that these cameras only pick up video from the off-ramps at the east and west ends of Lordsburg, so if the car stayed on I-10 and exited at Main Street (where the ATM is located) then the cameras would not have captured our subject vehicle. The only other NM DOT cameras on I-10 in Lordsburg are located off to the side of the highway at the NM DOT check station, where it is doubtful that our subject car would have traveled through. That is all.

[redacted] provided the following information.



The Peoples State Bank's ATM is located outside near the front entrance and is monitored with surveillance video. [redacted] SA [redacted] SA [redacted] Sgt. [redacted] and Deputy [redacted] entered the bank. [redacted] accessed the bank's surveillance video and conducted a review of the bank's surveillance video for 03/12/2012. The bank's surveillance video [redacted] revealed an unknown vehicle entering the bank's parking lot area at approximately 02:39 hours and the vehicle continued through the parking lot out of video coverage. 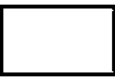

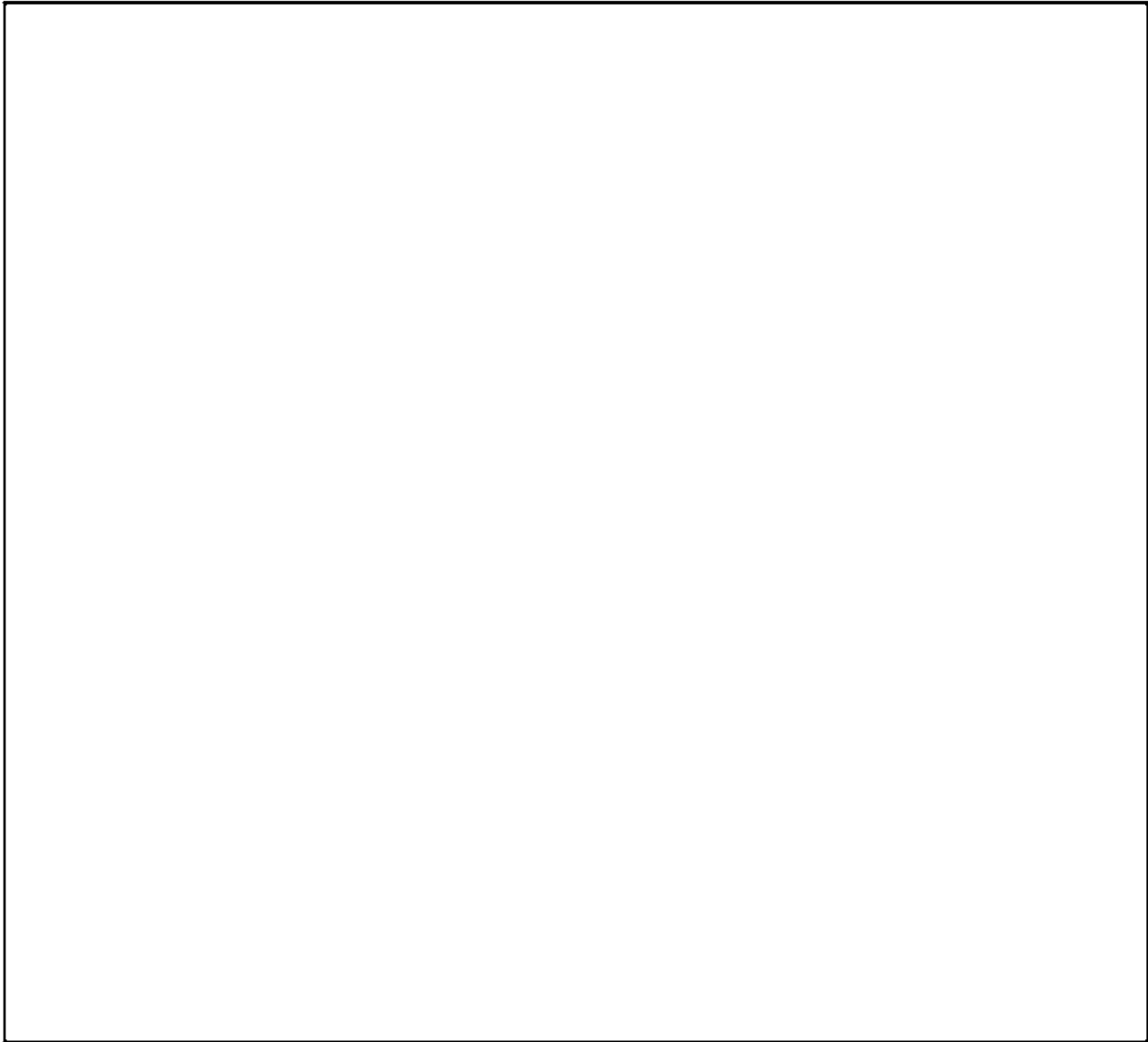

On 3/13/2012, Israel Keyes, date of birth 01/07/1978, was arrested in Lufkin, Texas. In his possession was the previously mentioned VISA debit card which had been used to access funds from Automated Teller Machines across the Southwest United States. As of 03/15/2012, Koenig's whereabouts were still unknown.

The Anchorage Division of the FBI is requesting CJIS activate a tip line with 24 hour coverage effective 03/15/2012 until 03/18/2012. After this time, the necessity of the tip line will be re-evaluated.

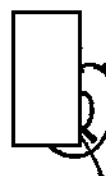

Also displayed in this photograph is the front page of the Anchorage Daily News from 02/13/2012. Whoever wrote the note demanded \$30,000.00 be placed on a VISA debit card, issued by a local Credit Union. The author provided no deadline for when this deposit was to be made nor outline any consequences for failure to do so.

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The surveillance video, activity on Koenig's cellular telephone, along with the demand note and photograph, indicate Koenig may have been kidnaped. However, the note's placement in a local park, the use of a local Credit Union debit card, along with no apparent use of her cellular telephone outside of the coverage area, suggest Koenig may still be in Alaska.

APD investigation to date yields no conclusive evidence regarding Koenig's location or possible transport in interstate or foreign commerce. Furthermore, due to its need of technical and analytical resources, the APD has requested assistance from the FBI.

In view of the above, the Anchorage Division converted this matter from a 343G (Domestic Police Cooperation) classification to a 7A (Kidnaping). Investigative efforts [redacted] [redacted] focused on establishing whether or not Koenig has left the state of Alaska.

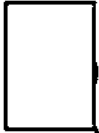

03/10/2012 - SA [redacted] was contacted by SA [redacted] [redacted] Anchorage Division at 2:45 a.m. regarding the abduction of SAMANTHA TESSLA KOENIG. SA [redacted] advised an UNSUB had withdrawn \$480 at 2:23 a.m. from an automated teller machine [ATM] at the Humble Community Bank, 1515 FM 1960 Bypass East, Humble, Texas. SA [redacted] advised the withdrawal had been made utilizing a debit card belonging to [redacted] SA [redacted] further advised an UNSUB had made two previous withdrawals utilizing [redacted] debit card; on 03/07/2012 in Wilcox, Arizona and on 03/08/2012 in Lordsburg, New Mexico. SA [redacted] advised that investigation to date revealed the UNSUB had been operating a late model, white color Ford Focus. The only portion of the UNSUB revealed on the video was the upper portion of the UNSUB's right arm, the right one-third of the UNSUB's torso, and the lower right portion of what appeared to be the hood of a hooded sweatshirt pulled over the UNSUB's head. The UNSUB appeared to be wearing a white or light gray color hooded sweatshirt. [redacted] attempted to download the video on to a compact disc but was unable to complete the download. SA [redacted] advised [redacted] that he would contact her on 03/12/2012 to coordinate having FBI personnel download the video.

At approximately 4:10 p.m., SA [] obtained video from HPD from three different traffic light cameras, for the time period 2:15 a.m. - 2:45 a.m., from the three traffic lights located closest to the bank. A review of the aforementioned video revealed the quality of the video was insufficient for determining the make or model of the vehicles captured in the video.

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03/13/2012 - SA [] telephonically contacted [] regarding downloading the video from 03/10/2012. [] activated the speaker phone function on her telephone and stated [] was also present. [] asked SA [] why he needed the video since she did not understand how it would assist the FBI in locating KOENIG. SA [] advised [] that the video was evidence and he would obtain a subpoena for the video if [] requested. [] stated she would allow FBI personnel to download the aforementioned video.

03/14/2012 - At 3:00 p.m., SA [] who is assigned to the Greater Houston Regional Computer Forensic Laboratory of the FBI Houston Division, downloaded the video from 03/10/2012 from Humble Community Bank on to a digital video disc [DVD]. 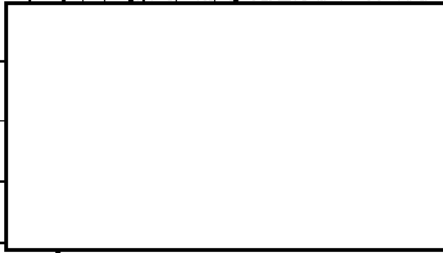

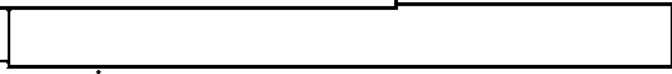

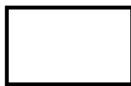

If the victim rescinds their declination of services after indictment, the VS and VWC are to work collaboratively to keep each other updated in regard to any/all services provided to the victim from that point forward. VSs are also required to keep the Special Agent aware of any services provided to the victim. In multiple victim cases, the VS may consider developing a spreadsheet, and/or revising this form to be used to convey information on multiple victims at one time.

If a victim is requesting assistance from the VWC, the VWC is encouraged to reach out to the VS to discuss what services may have already been offered.

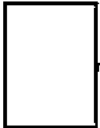

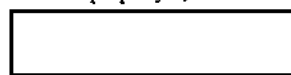

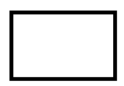

Synopsis: To request VICAP assistance in developing a timeline, crime mapping, and crime analysis.

Details: Captioned case was opened in February 2012. Samantha Koenig was an 18 year old female who was abducted on 2/1/2012 from a drive up coffee stand in Anchorage. Keyes sent a ransom note requesting money be put into Samantha [redacted] account. Keyes then used her debit card to make withdrawals in Alaska, Arizona, and Texas. Evidence obtained from these withdrawals led to a vehicle description. The Texas Rangers stopped Keyes on 3/12/2012 and he was arrested. To date, investigators have been unable to find any connection between Keyes and Samantha. Keyes agreed to speak with agents and indicated it was a random act and he intended to abduct any female that was working that night at the coffee stand.

Keyes admitted to committing other homicides during the past fourteen years but has yet to give specific details such as the location, victim, and manner of death. He has lived in Alaska since 2006 but resided in several other areas prior to this, including but not limited to Washington, Texas, and Maine.

Anchorage has obtained numerous historical records related to Keyes and would be willing to send these to VICAP if it is deemed appropriate. The documents include military

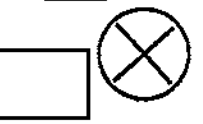

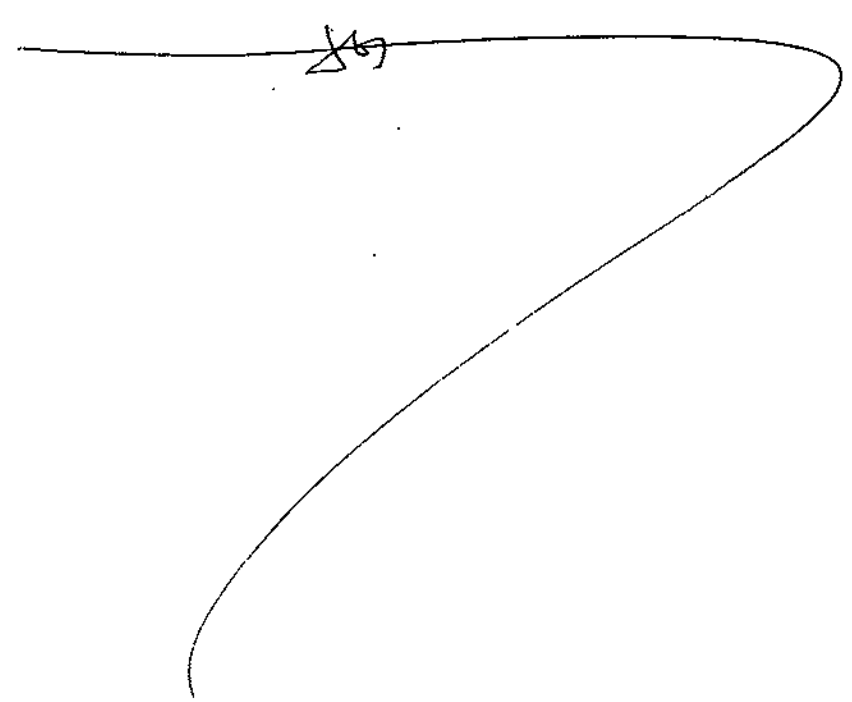

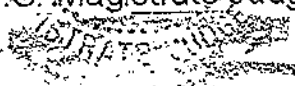

**AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF
AN APPLICATION FOR A SEARCH WARRANT**

I, Jolene Goeden, being first duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:

INTRODUCTION AND AGENT BACKGROUND

1. I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). I have been a Special Agent of the FBI since April 2004. I am charged with the duty of investigating violations of the laws of the United States, collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be a party in interest, and performing other duties imposed by law. I have been assigned to investigate most criminal matters within the jurisdiction of the FBI, including kidnaping matters, fraud matters and other white collar crime.

2. I make this affidavit in support of an application under Rule 41 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure for a warrant to search a Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB03686639, further identified in Attachment A (Target Device), for the information identified in Attachment B.

3. As set forth herein, there is probable cause to believe that in the property to be searched there exists evidence of a crime, contraband, fruits of a crimes, or other items illegally

possessed in violation of Title 18, United States Code (USC), Section 1029(a)(5) (Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices)(FRACAD); Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnapping); and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money), as further described in Attachment A.

RELEVANT STATUTES

4. The Target Device contains evidence of and is an instrumentality used for violations of Title 18, USC, Section 1029(a)(5), Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices, which provides that:

Whoever, knowingly and with intent to defraud effects transactions with 1 or more access devices issued to another person or persons, to receive payment or any other things of value during any 1-year period that aggregate value of which is equal to or greater than \$1,000;

and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnaping), which provides that:

Whoever unlawfully seizes, confines, inveigles, decoys, kidnaps, abducts, or carries away and holds for ransom or reward or otherwise any person, except in the case of a minor by the parent thereof, when the person is willfully transported in interstate or foreign commerce, regardless of whether the person was alive when transported in interstate or foreign commerce or uses the mail or any means, facility, or instrumentality of interstate or foreign commerce in committing or in furtherance of the commission of the offense;

and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money), which provides that:

Whoever receives, possesses, or disposes of any money or other property, or any portion thereof, which has at any time been delivered as ransom or reward in connection with a violation of section 1201 of this title, knowing the same to be money or property which has been at any time delivered as such ransom or reward.

IDENTIFICATION OF THE DEVICE TO BE EXAMINED

5. The property to be searched is identified in Attachment A as a Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB03686639, currently located at the FBI's Anchorage

District Office, Anchorage, Alaska, in a non-drug evidence vault.

6. The applied for warrant would authorize the forensic examination of the device for the purpose of identifying electronically stored data particularly described in Attachment B.

PROBABLE CAUSE

7. The information contained below is from my personal knowledge and experience, information provided to me by other law enforcement personnel, or from those specific sources as set forth. Since this affidavit is being submitted for the limited purpose of seeking authorization to search a Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB03686639, I have not included each and every fact known to me regarding this investigation. I have set forth only the facts that I believe are necessary to establish a foundation to support the aforementioned request for a search warrant.

Abduction of S.K.

8. On 2-2-12 at about 12:39 Alaska Standard Time (AST), Duncan, the owner of the Common Ground Coffee stand at 630 E. Tudor, Anchorage, Alaska, contacted APD dispatch. Duncan was calling from Oregon, where he was vacationing. He reported that while viewing his internet-based security system he saw one of his employees, 18-year-old S.K., appear to be abducted. Duncan said he was contacted by S.K.'s father (J.K.) and boyfriend (D.T.), who had been unable to locate her. This contact prompted Duncan to review his security video which showed an unknown man climb through the window of the coffee stand at about 20:00 AST on 2-1-12 while S.K. was working. The video appears to show S.K. retreating a short distance and raising her hands in an apparent sign of submission to the man who subsequently

climbed into the coffee stand, robbed S.K. and escorted her away from the scene. The abductor climbed through the window into the coffee stand without any significant difficulty. He appeared to be significantly taller than S.K., who is 5'4" tall, but due to the limited lighting and quality of the video, a more accurate estimate of his height has not been made. The robber/abductor appeared to have a medium to large build and athletic movements.

9. At the time of her abduction, S.K. was wearing a dark-colored jacket, a green shirt with light-colored stripes on the sleeves, a thin dark-colored bracelet, dark-colored pants, and dark-colored shoes. At the time of her abduction, S.K. was also believed to be in possession of a carabineer with three keys and possibly a white lanyard, a medium-to-large size leopard print purse, and a black cellular telephone with sliding keyboard. S.K. is a white female adult, approximately 5'4" tall, 150 pounds, 18 years old, with shoulder-length brown hair and brown eyes.

10. Video surveillance appeared to show S.K.'s robber/abductor wearing a dark-colored, possibly hooded, jacket, dark-colored glasses, a dark-colored face mask, dark-colored gloves, dark-colored pants; and dark-colored shoes. He appeared to be carrying a white coffee cup and a dark-colored bag. Although to date no weapon has been conclusively identified in the surveillance videos that captured this robbery/abduction, the scene was generally poorly lit and the robber/abductor was not always fully visible. Furthermore, S.K.'s reaction appeared to be consistent with someone who was confronted or threatened with a weapon. In addition, during separate subsequent interviews, both S.K.'s father and boyfriend adamantly indicated that S.K. was very strong-willed and would not have complied with a robber or abductor's demands, unless she had been threatened with a weapon.

11. Surveillance video from a nearby Home Depot at approximately 19:54 AST on 2-1-12 showed a white Chevrolet extended cab truck roll through the Home Depot parking lot and park just east of an International House of Pancakes. From a distance, the surveillance showed an individual with a black garment and hat get out of the truck and walk westbound through the parking lot towards Denali St., cross it, get on the sidewalk, walk southbound on Denali St. to Tudor Rd., cross Tudor Rd. at the intersection, and, finally, exit the frame. The individual's travel was in the direction of the Common Ground Coffee stand, from which S.K. was abducted. One minute later, the video surveillance footage from Common Ground Coffee stand showed the individual who abducted S.K. approach from the direction of the man in the Home Depot video. Approximately two minutes after S.K. and her abductor exited the frame of the Common Ground Coffee stand video footage, two persons appearing to match S.K. and her abductor again entered the frame of the Home Depot video footage, this time walking back towards the location where the white Chevrolet truck was originally parked. The Home Depot video then showed the two people approach the passenger side door of the Chevrolet truck. It then showed the person who appeared to be S.K. enter the passenger side of truck. The other individual then walked around truck, entered the driver's side, and drove out of the surveillance video's frame. As described below, police have now identified KEYES' residence and located a white Chevrolet truck registered to him at that residence. This white Chevrolet truck belonging to KEYES appears to match the vehicle in the Home Depot surveillance footage, although KEYES' truck has several toolboxes and a ladder rack fastened with removable bolts to the truck bed, and these items do not appear on the truck in the Home Depot video.

12. During an interview on 02-02-2012, D.T. (S.K.'s boyfriend) said he went to the

coffee stand on 2-1-12 at about 20:33 AST to give her a ride home but the stand appeared to be closed and she was not there. D.T. further reported to law enforcement that on 02/02/2012, at approximately 03:00 AST, he observed an unknown male adult wearing a ski mask and dark clothing going through the vehicle he shared with S.K. D.T. did not alert authorities to the burglary of the vehicle at that time.

13. When D.T. was asked where his ATM debit card was by APD Detectives several days after the abduction, he indicated he had left it in the vehicle he shared with S.K. This vehicle had been seized by APD on 02-02-2012 and searched pursuant to a State of Alaska search warrant. The debit card referenced above was not located during the search; however law enforcement did not notify D.T. of this fact. D.T. indicated that his debit card was a Credit Union 1 VISA debit card (VISA debit card) bearing XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration 01/15, and that he did not give his VISA debit card to anyone else or give anyone permission to use it. The card is thus believed to have been stolen from D.T.'s vehicle at the time D.T. observed the vehicle break-in. D.T. further related that S.K.'s driver's license had also been in his vehicle. That driver's license was missing when searched for on 02-02-2012, indicating that it also was stolen at that time. I know that a driver's license is generally necessary to leave the State of Alaska by airplane, road or ferry, due to established interstate (or international in the case of travel to/from Alaska via the Alaska-Canada Highway) travel requirements. Furthermore, due to Alaska's unique geographic location, the difficulty of traveling by road through northern Canada in winter, and the lengthy periods generally associated with traveling to/from Alaska by ferry, commercial airlines are the most common and popular mode of interstate travel to/from Alaska, especially during the winter.

Ransom Note and Transfer of Funds to "Ransom Account"

14. On 02-24-2012, at 19:56 AST, D.T. received the following text on his cell phone 907-231-9835 from S.K.'s cell phone 907-884-8370 - "Conner park sign under pic of albert aint she purty". J.K. (S.K.'s father) contacted law enforcement officers and relayed the information. At the request of APD Detectives, at approximately 20:18 AST, APD Patrol Officers arrived at Conner Park located on the southeast corner of Jewel Lake Road and International Airport Road in Anchorage, Alaska. J.K. and D.T. were already present. Attached to the park sign, below a flyer for a lost dog named "Albert," was a ziploc bag which contained a folded piece of paper.

15. On one side of the piece of paper, there was a photograph of S.K. with silver duct tape around her mouth and chin. She appeared to be wearing eye liner, and a light-colored, latex-gloved hand and lightly complected, muscular arm was holding S.K.'s hair. In the upper part of the photo was an Anchorage Daily Newspaper determined to be the issue released on Monday, February 13, 2012.

16. On the reverse side of the piece of paper was a ransom note which demanded \$30,000. The note included the 16-digit card number of the debit card belonging to D.T., which he had reported stolen on the night of the kidnaping, as summarized above. This debit card number is correlated to a bank account number held by D.T. and S.K. The note demanded that \$30,000.00 be deposited into that account and indicated that the writer of the note intended to withdraw money at regular intervals over the coming days, and in locations other than Alaska. Specifically, it said, "I may not use the card much in ak due to small pop but as I will be leaving soon I will be using it all over." The note further gave an indication that S.K. had been moved from Alaska, stating that "she did almost get away twice. once on tudor and once in the desert.

must be losing my touch.” I know from research, training, and experience, and discussions with law enforcement officers familiar with Alaska that there are no areas in Alaska commonly referred to and known to be “deserts.” Many such areas do exist in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas. Subsequent analysis of the demand note by the FBI Laboratory revealed that it was typed with a typewriter that used a carbon ribbon, and that the aforementioned picture on the back of the demand note was printed with an inkjet printer.

17. On 02-29-2012, at approximately 16:55 AST, J.K. contacted APD Detectives and told them he was withdrawing \$5,000.00 from the reward account set up for S.K. at Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union, and he intended to deposit it in the ransom fund, which was an account held by Credit Union 1. Pursuant to a State search warrant obtained by APD Detective Joseph Barth on 02-25-2012, investigators were informed that \$5,000.00 was deposited in the Credit Union 1 account indicated on the ransom note, (the account attached to the Credit Union 1 VISA debit card [VISA debit card] bearing XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration 01/15 issued to D.T).at 17:45 AST on 02-29-2012).

Unauthorized use of Credit Union 1 VISA debit card

18. On 02-29-2012 at 22:13 AST, an unknown person utilizing D.T.’s Credit Union 1 debit card attempted to withdraw \$600.00 in US Currency from the account indicated on the ransom note. The attempted withdrawal took place at the Automatic Teller Machine (ATM) located at the Alaska USA bank at 4000 Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. Because the attempted amount was over the \$500.00 daily limit, the withdrawal was declined. Surveillance video in the area of the ATM revealed a male dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt and black

pants, operating a light-colored SUV, arrived in the parking lot of the Sea Galley restaurant across the street. After parking the SUV, the male exited and quickly walked across the street to the area of the Alaska USA ATM. The SUV was later determined by the FBI to be a silver Nissan Xterra of a model between the years 2005 and 2012. As noted below, police have now determined that KEYES' girlfriend owns a silver 2007 Nissan Xterra.

19. On 02-29-2012 at 23:56 AST, \$500.00 in US Currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union located at 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. The debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the same Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T. Surveillance video obtained of the area revealed this withdrawal was conducted by an unknown male with a muscular appearance wearing a dark-colored, possibly hooded, jacket with a light-colored design or paint spatter on the left chest and front, and light-colored lettering, including possibly "CORPS" across the back shoulders; clear or light-colored glasses; a gray face mask; gray gloves; dark-colored pants; and light-colored shoes.

20. During the course of the investigation, Detective Blanton and Officer Pierce of APD obtained surveillance footage from businesses surrounding the Alaska USA, which is located on Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. Immediately before the withdrawal, a hidden surveillance camera located at the Sea Galley at 4101 Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska captured a similarly dressed male park in the extreme southwest corner of the Sea Galley parking lot driving a silver Nissan Xterra. From the surveillance video, the male appeared to exit the vehicle and walk westbound across the street to the Alaska USA and return a short while later. Both the male's appearance and timing are commensurate with him being the person who attempted to withdraw the money.

21. On 03-01-2012 at approximately 00:28 AST, \$500.00 in US currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Alaska USA located at 7701 Debarr Road in Anchorage, Alaska. As with the prior two transactions, the debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T.

22. On 03-07-2012 at approximately 21:57 AST, \$400.00 in US currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Western Bank located at 200 West Rex Allen Road in Willcox, Arizona. The debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T. Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the debit card for the withdrawal was a white male dressed in a gray hooded jacket or sweatshirt, glasses, a gray face mask, gray gloves, dark-colored pants, and light-colored shoes, and appeared to be driving a late model white Ford Focus sedan.

23. On 03-07-2012 at approximately 23:24 AST, there was an attempted \$400.00 withdrawal at the Western Bank located at 711 Main Street in Lordsburg, New Mexico, using D.T.'s Credit Union 1 debit card (the same card referenced in prior paragraphs.) The withdrawal was declined by the ATM as it would have put the debit card over the daily withdrawal limit. At 23:25 AST, at the same ATM, a balance inquiry was conducted on the account utilizing the debit card. The balance shown was \$3,598.91. At 23:26 AST, \$80.00 was withdrawn from the account utilizing the debit card. Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the debit card wore similar clothing to the first ATM withdrawal in Arizona.

24. On 3-9-2012 at approximately 23:23 AST, there was a \$483.00 withdrawal made at an ATM at Houston Community Bank, 1515 FM 1960 Bypass East, Humble City, Texas. Initial review of the surveillance video from the ATM appeared to show that the individual using

the debit card wore similar clothing to that worn during the two aforementioned ATM withdrawals in Arizona and New Mexico.

25. On 03-11-2012 at approximately 23:47 AST, there was a \$480.00 withdrawal at the People's State Bank located at 5850 Hwy 59 South, Shepherd, Texas using D.T.'s Credit Union 1 debit card (the same card referenced in prior paragraphs.) Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the debit card wore similar clothing to the first ATM withdrawal in Arizona, as well as the subsequent withdrawals in New Mexico and Texas.

Stop of the White Ford Focus

26. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:00 Central Time (CT), Texas Ranger Steven Rayburn, while in the company of your Affiant, was notified by Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) Highway Patrol Corporal Bryan Henry (Corporal Henry) that a white Ford Focus sedan bearing Texas license plate DH4N930 was observed parked at the Quality Inn & Suites (QIS), 4306 South First Street, Lufkin, Texas, which is a short drive from Shepherd, Texas.

27. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:15 CT, Ranger Rayburn and your Affiant responded to the QIS, at which time your Affiant conducted a walk-by and visual inspection of the white Ford Focus. Your Affiant noted a bar-code sticker on the driver's side back passenger window consistent with stickers applied to rental vehicles. Your Affiant also noted numerous items of clothing, trash and other debris in plain sight within the vehicle, including what appeared to be a girl's or woman's pink item of clothing. Ranger Rayburn caused a Texas license plate database search to be conducted which revealed the white 2012 Ford Focus was registered to PV Holding Corporation, 9603 John Saunders Road, San Antonio, Texas. DPS Criminal Investigative Division (CID) Lieutenant Mickey Hadnot (Lieutenant Hadnot) maintained

surveillance on the Ford Focus.

28. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:30 CT, Lieutenant Hadnot reported to Ranger Rayburn, who was in the company of your Affiant, that a white male adult exited room 215 of the QIS, placed some items into the trunk of the aforementioned white Ford Focus, and departed the scene alone, driving the white Ford Focus. Your Affiant had previously obtained from the QIS front desk manager an "in house list" of all occupants of the QIS on the night of 03/12/2012, which reflected room 215 was rented by ELIJAH KEYES for the time period 03/09/2012 through 03/13/2012.

29. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:45 CT, Corporal Henry conducted a traffic stop on the white Ford Focus sedan based in part on Affiant's suspicion that the vehicle was the same vehicle used in the Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas ATM withdrawals, as well as Corporal Henry's assessment that the driver of the vehicle was traveling in excess of the posted speed limit. Upon your Affiant's arrival at the car stop location, Corporal Henry provided to your Affiant Alaska Driver's License number 7268639, in the name of ISRAEL KEYES, which KEYES had provided to Corporal Henry prior to your Affiant's arrival at the scene. Corporal Henry told your Affiant that KEYES informed him he flew from Anchorage, Alaska, to Las Vegas, Nevada, on 03/07/2012, and that he rented the white Ford Focus at the Las Vegas airport, driving to his present location over the course of the ensuing week. KEYES provided to your Affiant a copy of his car rental agreement, which corroborated his statement that he had rented the car at the Las Vegas, Nevada, airport on 03/07/2012. KEYES was unable to describe to your Affiant the route he drove from Nevada to Texas, but stated he was in Lufkin, Texas, to attend his sister's wedding in Wells, Texas. KEYES told your Affiant he "probably" paid for fuel

throughout his travels from Nevada to Texas with cash. Ranger Rayburn reported to your Affiant that there was a pair of large white tennis shoes partially pushed under the driver's seat of the Ford Focus, which Ranger Rayburn could plainly see through the window. During questioning by your Affiant and Ranger Rayburn, KEYES became increasingly agitated and uncooperative, and he refused to allow your Affiant and/or Ranger Rayburn to inspect his wallet (which was in his pocket) or his vehicle. KEYES became unusually nervous and began to sweat profusely, in spite of the slightly cool weather and the tank top which he was wearing at the time. KEYES expressed to your Affiant that if he was going to be kept in the area for a longer period of time, he desired to call his brother (who has KEYES' daughter in a separate car) and notify him of same. Your Affiant suggested KEYES make that call. A short time later, the 2012 Ford Focus was transported to and secured at the Lufkin, Texas, Police Department.

30. Based on the aforementioned observations, including the fact that the rented Ford Focus matched the description of the vehicle utilized in the ATM withdrawals in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas, KEYES' arrival in Las Vegas, Nevada, and his subsequent travel from Nevada to Texas very likely resulting in KEYES traveling through Arizona on or about 03/07/2012 (the date of a \$400.00 ATM withdrawal in Arizona) and New Mexico on or about 03/08/2012 (the date of an \$80.00 ATM withdrawal in New Mexico), KEYES' appearance closely matching the description of the white male adult observed in videos of the above-described ATM withdrawals, KEYES' own admission that he lived in the Anchorage, Alaska, area, KEYES' Alaska driver's license reflecting an Anchorage, Alaska, address, the white tennis shoes under the driver's seat matching the description of the shoes worn by the white male adult

observed in the videos of the above-described ATM, as well as other observations, your Affiant instructed Corporal Henry to place KEYES under arrest. Ranger Rayburn, in your Affiant's presence, searched KEYES' wallet, revealing a VISA ATM/Debit card bearing account number XXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration date 01/15, in the name of D.T. This card is linked to the "ransom account" identified above, from which the withdrawals and attempted withdrawals summarized above were made.

Discovery of KEYES' White Chevrolet Truck

31. APD Detectives discovered that ISRAEL KEYES listed a mailing address of 3705 Arctic Blvd. #2891 in Anchorage, Alaska, on 07-18-2011, which is the Mail Cache. APD Detectives also discovered that KEYES listed a residential address of 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska, as of 07-18-2011.

32. On 03-13-2012 at approximately 10:30 AST, members of the APD Special Assignment Unit went to KEYES' home address at 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska. No one answered repeated knocks on the door. Per APD Sergeant Redick, there were fresh tire impressions in the snow in the driveway of the address that appeared as if a vehicle had been parked there as recently as the morning of 03-13-2012.

33. There was also a white Chevrolet pickup truck parked in the driveway of the address. The truck had a large toolbox in the bed and a ladder rack on top. The bolts securing those items were removable and appeared to have been recently added. The license plate on the truck was Alaska license plate FTC990, relating to a white 2004 Chevrolet Silverado, registered to ISRAEL KEYES at 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska. The white Chevrolet truck appeared to match the vehicle appearing in the Home Depot surveillance video, as summarized

above. Further, Detectives eventually contacted KEYES' girlfriend and discovered that she drives a 2007 Nissan Xterra, which matched the general description of the vehicle used by an individual who appeared to attempt to use the stolen debit card on 2-29-12, as summarized above.

Discovery OF KEYES' Computer Use and Use of Yahoo Account

34. KEYES' girlfriend, who also lives at his residence, was interviewed on approximately March 14, 2012. She indicated KEYES was out of Alaska. She also indicated that KEYES owned a laptop computer and that his computer was not in the residence.

35. Alaska Airlines provided travel records for KEYES pursuant to a Federal Grand Jury Subpoena that was issued to them on March 14, 2012. In reviewing the returns for this subpoena, travel records were found showing KEYES and his young daughter traveled to Houston on February 2, 2012. KEYES was originally scheduled to return on February 14, 2012 but changed the ticket to return on February 17, 2012. The ticket was booked online October 1, 2011 and an email confirmation was sent on the same date. The return ticket was changed to February 17, 2012 and an email confirmation was sent on 2/15/2012. The notes for this transaction indicate the email confirmation was sent to an email address believed to belong to A.K., the mother of KEYES' daughter. However, the tickets were booked using A.K.'s credit card. A.K. does not reside in the state of Alaska and it is likely she had to forward the email confirmation to KEYES so that he would know the dates/times of travel.

36. In reviewing the returns for this subpoena, travel records were also found showing KEYES and his young daughter traveled to Las Vegas on March 6, 2012 via Alaska Airlines. This ticket was booked online and he provided an email address with the

reservation. The notes section of the travel records indicated the email address provided was israelkeyes@yahoo.com. The records also indicated an email confirmation was sent to israelkeyes@yahoo.com on March 1, 2012.

Execution of Search Warrant on Ford Focus and Discovery of Laptop Computer

37. On March 16, 2012, law enforcement agents in Beaumont, Texas obtained a search warrant, which authorized the search of the white Ford Focus driven by KEYES. Execution of that search warrant on March 17, 2012 revealed numerous items, including a cellular phone believed to belong to S.K. and a Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB03686639.

38. In my training and experience, I know that photos from digital cameras and cellular phones are frequently downloaded to computers and electronic tablets, and then printed or stored on media devices. I also know that cellular phones, computers, electronic tablets and similar devices are frequently used to arrange travel and hotel reservations, rent vehicles, and conduct other personal business related to traveling. I also know that computers and cellular phones can be used to connect to the internet, which can be used to locate banks, ATM's, hotels, maps, send email, draft documents, and communicate with others. I also know that storage devices for electronic information, or "thumb" drives, are often used to store such information for later use by computers, cellular phones and other media devices. I know that electronic records of all such uses of computers and similar electronic devices are retained within those devices and may be retrieved by forensic technicians.

39. The Device is currently in the lawful possession of the FBI. The Device came into the FBI's possession as outlined above. Although the FBI might already have the lawful

authority to examine the Device, I seek this additional warrant out of an abundance of caution to be certain that an examination of the Device will comply with the Fourth Amendment and other applicable laws.

40. The Device is currently in storage at FBI Anchorage District, Anchorage, Alaska. In my training and experience, I know that the Device has been stored in a manner in which its contents are, to the extent material to this investigation, in substantially the same state as they were when the Device first came into the possession of the FBI.

TECHNICAL TERMS

41. Based on my training, my experience, and information provided to me by other law enforcement personnel, I use the following technical terms to convey the following meanings:

- a. "Storage medium": A storage medium is any physical object upon which computer data can be stored. Examples include a laptop computer's internal hard disk drive.
- b. "Computer": Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1), a computer is "an electronic, magnetic, optical, electrochemical, or other high speed data processing device performing logical or storage functions, and includes any data storage facility or communications facility directly related to or operating in conjunction with such device."
- c. IP Address: An Internet Protocol address (or simply "IP Address") is a unique numeric address used by computers on the Internet. An IP address is a series of four numbers, each in the range 0-255, separated by periods (e.g., 121.56.97.178). Every computer attached to the Internet must be assigned an IP address so that Internet traffic sent from and directed to that computer may be directed properly from its source to its destination. Most Internet

service providers control a range of IP addresses. Some computers have static- that is, long-term - IP addresses, while other computers have dynamic – that is, frequently changed – IP addresses.

- d. Internet: The Internet is a global network of computers and other electronic devices that communicate with each other. Due to the structure of the internet, connections between devices on the internet often cross state and international borders, even when the devices communicating with each other are in the same state.

COMPUTERS, ELECTRONIC STORAGE, AND FORENSIC ANALYSIS

42. The applied-for warrant would authorize the forensic imaging and examination of the Target Device for the purpose of identifying and seizing the electronically stored information particularly described in Attachment B in accordance with Federal Criminal Procedure Rule 41(e)(2)(B) (“Warrant Seeking Electronically Stored Information”).

43. *Probable Cause:* Based on my training, experience, and information related to me by agents and others involved in the forensic examination of computers, I submit there is probable cause to believe that information that was once stored on the Target Device may still be stored there, for at least the following reasons:

- a. Based on my knowledge, training, and experience, I know that computer files or remnants of such files can be recovered days, months or even years after they have been stored on a storage medium (e.g., laptop computer’s hard drive). Even when files have been deleted, they can be recovered using forensic tools. This is so because when a person “deletes” a file on a computer, the data contained in the file does not actually disappear; rather, that data remains on the storage medium until it is overwritten by new data.

- b. Therefore, deleted files, or remnants of deleted files, may reside in free space or slack space -- that is, in space on the storage medium that is not currently being used by an active file -- for long periods of time before they are overwritten. In addition, a computer's operating system may also keep a record of deleted data in a "swap" or "recovery" file.
- c. Wholly apart from user-generated files, computer storage media -- in particular, a laptop computer's internal hard drive -- contain electronic evidence of how a computer has been used, what it has been used for, and who has used it. To give a few examples, this forensic evidence can take the form of operating system configurations, artifacts from operating system or application operation, file system data structures, and virtual memory "swap" or paging files. Computer users typically do not erase or delete this evidence, because special software is typically required for that task. However, it is technically possible to delete this information.
- d. Similarly, files that have been viewed via the Internet are sometimes automatically downloaded into a temporary Internet directory or "cache". Things that have been viewed via the internet are typically stored for some period of time on the device. This information can sometimes be recovered with forensics tools.
- e. Based on my knowledge, training, and experience, I know that computer files or remnants of such files can be recovered months or even years after they have been downloaded onto a storage medium, deleted, or viewed via the Internet. Electronic files downloaded to a storage medium can be stored for years at little or no cost. Even when files have been deleted, they can be recovered months or years later using forensic tools. This is so because when a person "deletes" a file on a computer, the data contained in the file does not actually disappear; rather, that data remains on the storage medium until it is overwritten by new data.
- f. Therefore, deleted files, or remnants of deleted files, may reside in free space or slack space—that is, in space on the storage medium that is not currently being used by an active file—for long periods of time before they are overwritten. In addition, a computer's operating system may also keep a record of deleted data in a

“swap” or “recovery” file.

- g. Wholly apart from user-generated files, computer storage media—in particular, computers’ internal hard drives—contain electronic evidence of how a computer has been used, what it has been used for, and who has used it. To give a few examples, this forensic evidence can take the form of operating system configurations, artifacts from operating system or application operation, file system data structures, and virtual memory “swap” or paging files. Computer users typically do not erase or delete this evidence, because special software is typically required for that task. However, it is technically possible to delete this information.

44. Based on my training, experience, and research, I know that the Device has capabilities that allow it to serve as a portable media player, internet browser, and digital camera and photoshop, amongst other capabilities.

45. *Forensic evidence:* As further described in Attachment B, this application seeks permission to locate not only electronically stored information that might serve as direct evidence of the crimes described on the warrant, but also forensic evidence that establishes how the Target Device was used, the purpose of its use, who used it, and when. There is probable cause to believe that this forensic electronic evidence more likely than not is stored in the Target Device because:

- a. Data on a storage medium can provide evidence of a file that was once on the storage medium but has since been deleted or edited, or of a deleted portion of a file (such as a paragraph that has been deleted from a word processing file). Virtual memory paging systems can leave traces of information on the storage medium that show what tasks and processes were recently active. Web browser, chat and email programs store configuration information on the storage medium that can reveal information such as online passwords and aliases. Operating systems can record additional information, such as the attachment of peripherals, the attachment of USB flash storage devices or other external storage media, and

the times the computer was in use. Computer file systems can record information about the dates files were created and the sequence in which they were created.

- b. Forensic evidence stored within the Target Device can also indicate who has used or controlled the Target Device. This “user attribution” evidence is analogous to the search for “indicia of occupancy” while executing a search warrant at a residence.
- c. A person with appropriate familiarity with how the Target Device works may, after examining this forensic evidence in its proper context, be able to draw conclusions about how electronic devices were used, the purpose of their use, who used them, and when.
- d. The process of identifying the exact electronically stored information on a storage medium that are necessary to draw an accurate conclusion is a dynamic process. Electronic evidence is not always data that can be merely reviewed by a review team and passed along to investigators. Whether data stored on a computer is evidence may depend on other information stored on the computer and the application of knowledge about how a computer behaves. Therefore, contextual information necessary to understand other evidence also falls within the scope of the warrant.
- e. Further, in finding evidence of how the Target Device was used, the purpose of its use, who used it, and when, sometimes it is necessary to establish that a particular thing is not present on a storage medium.

46. *Nature of examination:* Based on the foregoing, and consistent with Rule 41(e)(2)(B), the warrant I am applying for would permit the examination of the Target Device consistent with the warrant. The examination may require authorities to employ techniques, including but not limited to computer-assisted scans of the Target Device’s entire storage medium, that might expose many parts of the device to human inspection in order to determine whether it is evidence described by the warrant.

47. *Manner of execution:* Because this warrant seeks only permission to examine a laptop computer already in law enforcement's possession, the execution of this warrant does not involve the physical intrusion onto a premises. Consequently, I submit there is reasonable cause for the Court to authorize execution of the warrant at any time in the day or night.

48. *Forensic image retention:* I hereby request judicial authorization to retain full image copies of seized storage media after the review is complete (to the extent that this warrant does not already authorize me to retain that storage media as seized forfeitable property) and until further order of the Court. That judicial authorization is justified in this case in part because:

- a. Should the execution of the warrant uncover data that may later need to be introduced into evidence during a trial or other proceeding, the authenticity and the integrity of the evidence and the government's forensic methodology may be contested issues. Retaining copies of seized storage media can be required to prove these facts.
- b. Returning the original storage medium to its owner will not allow for the preservation of that evidence. Even routine use may forever change the data it contains, alter system access times, or eliminate data stored on it.
- c. Because the investigation is not yet complete, it is not possible to predict all possible defendants against whom evidence found on the storage medium might be used. That evidence might be used against persons who have no possessory interest in the storage media, or against persons yet unknown. Those defendants might be entitled to a copy of the complete storage media in discovery. Retention of a complete image assures that it will be available to all parties, including those known now and those later identified.
- d. The act of destroying or returning a storage medium could create an opportunity for a defendant to claim, falsely, that the destroyed or returned storage medium contained evidence favorable to him. Maintaining a copy of the storage medium would permit the government, through an additional warrant if necessary, to investigate such a claim.

- e. Similarly, should a defendant suggest an explanation for the presence of evidence on a storage medium, it may be necessary to investigate such an explanation by, among other things, re-examining the storage medium with that defense in mind. This may require an additional examination of the storage medium for evidence that is described in Attachment B but was not properly identified and segregated previously.

CONCLUSION

49. Based on my training and experience, and the facts as set forth in this affidavit, there is probable cause to believe that on the Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB03686639 there exists fruits, evidence, and instrumentalities of violations of Title 18, United States Code (USC), Section 1029(a)(5) (Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices)(FRACAD); Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnapping); and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money).

50. This Court has jurisdiction to issue the requested warrant because it is “a court of competent jurisdiction” as defined by 18 U.S.C. § 2711. 18 U.S.C. §§ 2703(a), (b)(1)(A) & (c)(1)(A). Specifically, the Court is “a district court of the United States . . . that – has jurisdiction over the offense being investigated.” 18 U.S.C. § 2711(3)(A)(I).

REQUEST FOR SEALING

51. The investigation of this case is ongoing and disclosure of the issuance of the search warrant could result in destruction of evidence and could also impact officer, witness and victim safety. Accordingly, pursuant to the case law outlined in the government’s motion to seal,



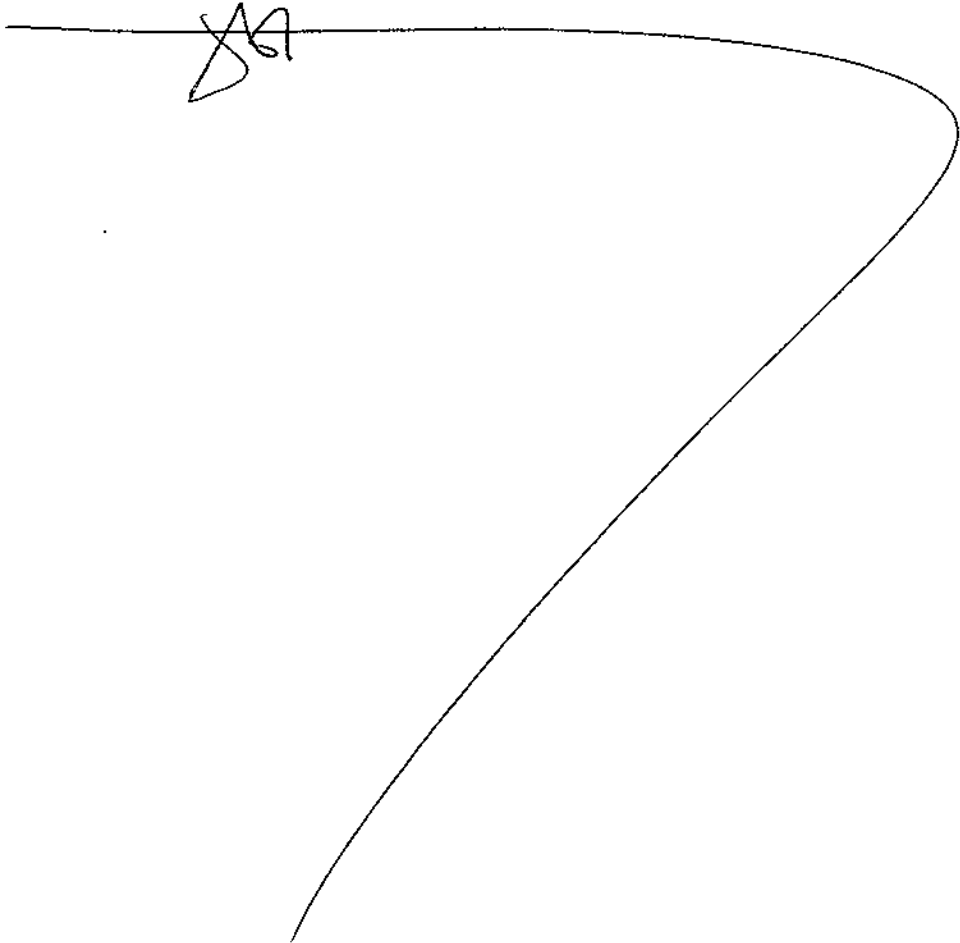



**AFFIDAVIT IN SUPPORT OF
AN APPLICATION FOR A SEARCH WARRANT**

I, Jolene Goeden, being first duly sworn, hereby depose and state as follows:

INTRODUCTION AND AGENT BACKGROUND

1. I am a Special Agent of the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI). I have been a Special Agent of the FBI since April 2004. I am charged with the duty of investigating violations of the laws of the United States, collecting evidence in cases in which the United States is or may be a party in interest, and performing other duties imposed by law. I have been assigned to investigate most criminal matters within the jurisdiction of the FBI, including kidnapping matters, fraud matters and other white collar crime.

2. I make this affidavit in support of an application under Rule 41 of the Federal Rules of Criminal Procedure for a warrant to search a Samsung cellphone, black in color, slider type. Model# SCH-R63 1. Possible S/N 80015743 (this number is on the back of the phone but it does not indicate it as a S/N), further identified in Attachment A (Target Device), for the information identified in Attachment B.

3. As set forth herein, there is probable cause to believe that in the property to be searched there exists evidence of a crime, contraband, fruits of a crimes, or other items illegally possessed in violation of Title 18, United States Code (USC), Section 1029(a)(5) (Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices)(FRACAD); Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnapping); and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money), as further described in Attachment A.

RELEVANT STATUTES

4. The Target Device contains evidence of and is an instrumentality used for violations of Title 18, USC, Section 1029(a)(5), Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices, which provides that:

Whoever, knowingly and with intent to defraud effects transactions with 1 or more access devices issued to another person or persons, to receive payment or any other things of value during any 1-year period that aggregate value of which is equal to or greater than \$1,000;

and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnaping), which provides that:

Whoever unlawfully seizes, confines, inveigles, decoys, kidnaps, abducts, or carries away and holds for ransom or reward or otherwise any person, except in the case of a minor by the parent thereof, when the person is willfully transported in interstate or foreign commerce, regardless of whether the person was alive when transported in interstate or foreign commerce or uses the mail or any means, facility, or instrumentality of interstate or foreign commerce in committing or in furtherance of the commission of the offense;

and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money), which provides that:

Whoever receives, possesses, or disposes of any money or other property, or any portion thereof, which has at any time been delivered as ransom or reward in connection with a violation of section 1201 of this title, knowing the same to be money or property which has been at any time delivered as such ransom or reward.

IDENTIFICATION OF THE DEVICE TO BE EXAMINED

5. The property to be searched is identified in Attachment A as a Samsung cellphone, black in color, slider type. Model# SCH-R631. Possible S/N 80015743 (this number is on the back of the phone but it does not indicate it as a S/N) currently located at the FBI Anchorage District Office, Anchorage, Alaska, in a non-drug evidence vault.

6. The applied for warrant would authorize the forensic examination of the device for the purpose of identifying electronically stored data particularly described in Attachment B.

PROBABLE CAUSE

7. The information contained below is from my personal knowledge and experience, information provided to me by other law enforcement personnel, or from those specific sources as set forth. Since this affidavit is being submitted for the limited purpose of seeking authorization to search a Samsung cellphone, black in color, slider type. Model# SCH-R631. Possible S/N 80015743 (this number is on the back of the phone but it does not indicate it as a S/N), I have not included each and every fact known to me regarding this investigation. I have set forth only the facts that I believe are necessary to establish a foundation to support the aforementioned request for a search warrant.

Abduction of S.K.

8. On 2-2-12 at about 12:39 Alaska Standard Time (AST), Duncan, the owner of the Common Ground Coffee stand at 630 E. Tudor, Anchorage, Alaska, contacted APD dispatch. Duncan was calling from Oregon, where he was vacationing. He reported that while viewing his internet-based security system he saw one of his employees, 18-year-old S.K., appear to be

abducted. Duncan said he was contacted by S.K.'s father (J.K.) and boyfriend (D.T.), who had been unable to locate her. This contact prompted Duncan to review his security video which showed an unknown man climb through the window of the coffee stand at about 20:00 AST on 2-1-12 while S.K. was working. The video appears to show S.K. retreating a short distance and raising her hands in an apparent sign of submission to the man who subsequently climbed into the coffee stand, robbed S.K. and escorted her away from the scene. The abductor climbed through the window into the coffee stand without any significant difficulty. He appeared to be significantly taller than S.K., who is 5'4" tall, but due to the limited lighting and quality of the video, a more accurate estimate of his height has not been made. The robber/abductor appeared to have a medium to large build and athletic movements.

9. At the time of her abduction, S.K. was wearing a dark-colored jacket, a green shirt with light-colored stripes on the sleeves, a thin dark-colored bracelet, dark-colored pants, and dark-colored shoes. At the time of her abduction, S.K. was also believed to be in possession of a carabineer with three keys and possibly a white lanyard, a medium-to-large size leopard print purse, and a black cellular telephone with sliding keyboard. S.K. is a white female adult, approximately 5'4" tall, 150 pounds, 18 years old, with shoulder-length brown hair and brown eyes.

10. Video surveillance appeared to show S.K.'s robber/abductor wearing a dark-colored, possibly hooded, jacket, dark-colored glasses, a dark-colored face mask, dark-colored gloves, dark-colored pants; and dark-colored shoes. He appeared to be carrying a white coffee cup and a dark-colored bag. Although to date no weapon has been conclusively identified in the surveillance videos that captured this robbery/abduction, the scene was generally poorly lit and

the robber/abductor was not always fully visible. Furthermore, S.K.'s reaction appeared to be consistent with someone who was confronted or threatened with a weapon. In addition, during separate subsequent interviews, both S.K.'s father and boyfriend adamantly indicated that S.K. was very strong-willed and would not have complied with a robber or abductor's demands, unless she had been threatened with a weapon.

11. Surveillance video from a nearby Home Depot at approximately 19:54 AST on 2-1-12 showed a white Chevrolet extended cab truck roll through the Home Depot parking lot and park just east of an International House of Pancakes. From a distance, the surveillance showed an individual with a black garment and hat get out of the truck and walk westbound through the parking lot towards Denali St., cross it, get on the sidewalk, walk southbound on Denali St. to Tudor Rd., cross Tudor Rd. at the intersection, and, finally, exit the frame. The individual's travel was in the direction of the Common Ground Coffee stand, from which S.K. was abducted. One minute later, the video surveillance footage from Common Ground Coffee stand showed the individual who abducted S.K. approach from the direction of the man in the Home Depot video. Approximately two minutes after S.K. and her abductor exited the frame of the Common Ground Coffee stand video footage, two persons appearing to match S.K. and her abductor again entered the frame of the Home Depot video footage, this time walking back towards the location where the white Chevrolet truck was originally parked. The Home Depot video then showed the two people approach the passenger side door of the Chevrolet truck. It then showed the person who appeared to be S.K. enter the passenger side of truck. The other individual then walked around truck, entered the driver's side, and drove out of the surveillance video's frame. As described below, police have now identified KEYES' residence and located a white Chevrolet

truck registered to him at that residence. This white Chevrolet truck belonging to KEYES appears to match the vehicle in the Home Depot surveillance footage, although KEYES' truck has several toolboxes and a ladder rack fastened with removable bolts to the truck bed, and these items do not appear on the truck in the Home Depot video.

12. During an interview on 02-02-2012, D.T. (S.K.'s boyfriend) said he went to the coffee stand on 2-1-12 at about 20:33 AST to give her a ride home but the stand appeared to be closed and she was not there. D.T. further reported to law enforcement that on 02/02/2012, at approximately 03:00 AST, he observed an unknown male adult wearing a ski mask and dark clothing going through the vehicle he shared with S.K. D.T. did not alert authorities to the burglary of the vehicle at that time.

13. When D.T. was asked where his ATM debit card was by APD Detectives several days after the abduction, he indicated he had left it in the vehicle he shared with S.K. This vehicle had been seized by APD on 02-02-2012 and searched pursuant to a State of Alaska search warrant. The debit card referenced above was not located during the search; however law enforcement did not notify D.T. of this fact. D.T. indicated that his debit card was a Credit Union 1 VISA debit card (VISA debit card) bearing XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration 01/15, and that he did not give his VISA debit card to anyone else or give anyone permission to use it. The card is thus believed to have been stolen from D.T.'s vehicle at the time D.T. observed the vehicle break-in. D.T. further related that S.K.'s driver's license had also been in his vehicle. That driver's license was missing when searched for on 02-02-2012, indicating that it also was stolen at that time. I know that a driver's license is generally necessary to leave the State of Alaska by airplane, road or ferry, due to established interstate (or international in the

case of travel to/from Alaska via the Alaska-Canada Highway) travel requirements.

Furthermore, due to Alaska's unique geographic location, the difficulty of traveling by road through northern Canada in winter, and the lengthy periods generally associated with traveling to/from Alaska by ferry, commercial airlines are the most common and popular mode of interstate travel to/from Alaska, especially during the winter.

Ransom Note and Transfer of Funds to "Ransom Account"

14. On 02-24-2012, at 19:56 AST, D.T. received the following text on his cell phone 907-231-9835 from S.K.'s cell phone 907-884-8370 - "Conner park sign under pic of albert aint she purty". J.K. (S.K.'s father) contacted law enforcement officers and relayed the information. At the request of APD Detectives, at approximately 20:18 AST, APD Patrol Officers arrived at Conner Park located on the southeast corner of Jewel Lake Road and International Airport Road in Anchorage, Alaska. J.K. and D.T. were already present. Attached to the park sign, below a flyer for a lost dog named "Albert," was a ziploc bag which contained a folded piece of paper.

15. On one side of the piece of paper, there was a photograph of S.K. with silver duct tape around her mouth and chin. She appeared to be wearing eye liner, and a light-colored, latex-gloved hand and lightly complected, muscular arm was holding S.K.'s hair. In the upper part of the photo was an Anchorage Daily Newspaper determined to be the issue released on Monday, February 13, 2012.

16. On the reverse side of the piece of paper was a ransom note which demanded \$30,000. The note included the 16-digit card number of the debit card belonging to D.T., which he had reported stolen on the night of the kidnaping, as summarized above. This debit card number is correlated to a bank account number held by D.T. and S.K. The note demanded that

\$30,000.00 be deposited into that account and indicated that the writer of the note intended to withdraw money at regular intervals over the coming days, and in locations other than Alaska. Specifically, it said, "I may not use the card much in ak due to small pop but as I will be leaving soon I will be using it all over." The note further gave an indication that S.K. had been moved from Alaska, stating that "she did almost get away twice. once on tudor and once in the desert. must be losing my touch." I know from research, training, and experience, and discussions with law enforcement officers familiar with Alaska that there are no areas in Alaska commonly referred to and known to be "deserts." Many such areas do exist in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas. Subsequent analysis of the demand note by the FBI Laboratory revealed that it was typed with a typewriter that used a carbon ribbon, and that the aforementioned picture on the back of the demand note was printed with an inkjet printer.

17. On 02-29-2012, at approximately 16:55 AST, J.K. contacted APD Detectives and told them he was withdrawing \$5,000.00 from the reward account set up for S.K. at Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union, and he intended to deposit it in the ransom fund, which was an account held by Credit Union 1. Pursuant to a State search warrant obtained by APD Detective Joseph Barth on 02-25-2012, investigators were informed that \$5,000.00 was deposited in the Credit Union 1 account indicated on the ransom note, (the account attached to the Credit Union 1 VISA debit card [VISA debit card] bearing XXXXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration 01/15 issued to D.T.) at 17:45 AST on 02-29-2012).

Unauthorized use of Credit Union 1 VISA debit card

18. On 02-29-2012 at 22:13 AST, an unknown person utilizing D.T.'s Credit Union 1 debit card attempted to withdraw \$600.00 in US Currency from the account indicated on the

ransom note. The attempted withdrawal took place at the Automatic Teller Machine (ATM) located at the Alaska USA bank at 4000 Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. Because the attempted amount was over the \$500.00 daily limit, the withdrawal was declined. Surveillance video in the area of the ATM revealed a male dressed in a black hooded sweatshirt and black pants, operating a light-colored SUV, arrived in the parking lot of the Sea Galley restaurant across the street. After parking the SUV, the male exited and quickly walked across the street to the area of the Alaska USA ATM. The SUV was later determined by the FBI to be a silver Nissan Xterra of a model between the years 2005 and 2012. As noted below, police have now determined that KEYES' girlfriend owns a silver 2007 Nissan Xterra.

19. On 02-29-2012 at 23:56 AST, \$500.00 in US Currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Denali Alaskan Federal Credit Union located at 3020 Minnesota Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. The debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the same Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T. Surveillance video obtained of the area revealed this withdrawal was conducted by an unknown male with a muscular appearance wearing a dark-colored, possibly hooded, jacket with a light-colored design or paint spatter on the left chest and front, and light-colored lettering, including possibly "CORPS" across the back shoulders; clear or light-colored glasses; a gray face mask; gray gloves; dark-colored pants; and light-colored shoes.

20. During the course of the investigation, Detective Blanton and Officer Pierce of APD obtained surveillance footage from businesses surrounding the Alaska USA, which is located on Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska. Immediately before the withdrawal, a hidden surveillance camera located at the Sea Galley at 4101 Credit Union Drive in Anchorage, Alaska captured a similarly dressed male park in the extreme southwest corner of the Sea Galley

parking lot driving a silver Nissan Xterra. From the surveillance video, the male appeared to exit the vehicle and walk westbound across the street to the Alaska USA and return a short while later. Both the male's appearance and timing are commensurate with him being the person who attempted to withdraw the money.

21. On 03-01-2012 at approximately 00:28 AST, \$500.00 in US currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Alaska USA located at 7701 Debarr Road in Anchorage, Alaska. As with the prior two transactions, the debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T.

22. On 03-07-2012 at approximately 21:57 AST, \$400.00 in US currency was withdrawn from the ATM at the Western Bank located at 200 West Rex Allen Road in Willcox, Arizona. The debit card utilized to withdraw the money was the Credit Union 1 debit card issued to D.T. Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the debit card for the withdrawal was a white male dressed in a gray hooded jacket or sweatshirt, glasses, a gray face mask, gray gloves, dark-colored pants, and light-colored shoes, and appeared to be driving a late model white Ford Focus sedan.

23. On 03-07-2012 at approximately 23:24 AST, there was an attempted \$400.00 withdrawal at the Western Bank located at 711 Main Street in Lordsburg, New Mexico, using D.T.'s Credit Union 1 debit card (the same card referenced in prior paragraphs.) The withdrawal was declined by the ATM as it would have put the debit card over the daily withdrawal limit. At 23:25 AST, at the same ATM, a balance inquiry was conducted on the account utilizing the debit card. The balance shown was \$3,598.91. At 23:26 AST, \$80.00 was withdrawn from the account utilizing the debit card. Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the

debit card wore similar clothing to the first ATM withdrawal in Arizona.

24. On 3-9-2012 at approximately 23:23 AST, there was a \$483.00 withdrawal made at an ATM at Houston Community Bank, 1515 FM 1960 Bypass East, Humble City, Texas. Initial review of the surveillance video from the ATM appeared to show that the individual using the debit card wore similar clothing to that worn during the two aforementioned ATM withdrawals in Arizona and New Mexico.

25. On 03-11-2012 at approximately 23:47 AST, there was a \$480.00 withdrawal at the People's State Bank located at 5850 Hwy 59 South, Shepherd, Texas using D.T.'s Credit Union 1 debit card (the same card referenced in prior paragraphs.) Surveillance video on the ATM showed the individual using the debit card wore similar clothing to the first ATM withdrawal in Arizona, as well as the subsequent withdrawals in New Mexico and Texas.

Stop of the White Ford Focus

26. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:00 Central Time (CT), Texas Ranger Steven Rayburn, while in the company of your Affiant, was notified by Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) Highway Patrol Corporal Bryan Henry (Corporal Henry) that a white Ford Focus sedan bearing Texas license plate DH4N930 was observed parked at the Quality Inn & Suites (QIS), 4306 South First Street, Lufkin, Texas, which is a short drive from Shepherd, Texas.

27. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:15 CT, Ranger Rayburn and your Affiant responded to the QIS, at which time your Affiant conducted a walk-by and visual inspection of the white Ford Focus. Your Affiant noted a bar-code sticker on the driver's side back passenger window consistent with stickers applied to rental vehicles. Your Affiant also noted numerous items of clothing, trash and other debris in plain sight within the vehicle, including what

appeared to be a girl's or woman's pink item of clothing. Ranger Rayburn caused a Texas license plate database search to be conducted which revealed the white 2012 Ford Focus was registered to PV Holding Corporation, 9603 John Saunders Road, San Antonio, Texas. DPS Criminal Investigative Division (CID) Lieutenant Mickey Hadnot (Lieutenant Hadnot) maintained surveillance on the Ford Focus.

28. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:30 CT, Lieutenant Hadnot reported to Ranger Rayburn, who was in the company of your Affiant, that a white male adult exited room 215 of the QIS, placed some items into the trunk of the aforementioned white Ford Focus, and departed the scene alone, driving the white Ford Focus. Your Affiant had previously obtained from the QIS front desk manager an "in house list" of all occupants of the QIS on the night of 03/12/2012, which reflected room 215 was rented by ELIJAH KEYES for the time period 03/09/2012 through 03/13/2012.

29. On 03/13/2012, at approximately 11:45 CT, Corporal Henry conducted a traffic stop on the white Ford Focus sedan based in part on Affiant's suspicion that the vehicle was the same vehicle used in the Arizona, New Mexico, and Texas ATM withdrawals, as well as Corporal Henry's assessment that the driver of the vehicle was traveling in excess of the posted speed limit. Upon your Affiant's arrival at the car stop location, Corporal Henry provided to your Affiant Alaska Driver's License number 7268639, in the name of ISRAEL KEYES, which KEYES had provided to Corporal Henry prior to your Affiant's arrival at the scene. Corporal Henry told your Affiant that KEYES informed him he flew from Anchorage, Alaska, to Las Vegas, Nevada, on 03/07/2012, and that he rented the white Ford Focus at the Las Vegas airport, driving to his present location over the course of the ensuing week. KEYES provided to your

Affiant a copy of his car rental agreement, which corroborated his statement that he had rented the car at the Las Vegas, Nevada, airport on 03/07/2012. KEYES was unable to describe to your Affiant the route he drove from Nevada to Texas, but stated he was in Lufkin, Texas, to attend his sister's wedding in Wells, Texas. KEYES told your Affiant he "probably" paid for fuel throughout his travels from Nevada to Texas with cash. Ranger Rayburn reported to your Affiant that there was a pair of large white tennis shoes partially pushed under the driver's seat of the Ford Focus, which Ranger Rayburn could plainly see through the window. During questioning by your Affiant and Ranger Rayburn, KEYES became increasingly agitated and uncooperative, and he refused to allow your Affiant and/or Ranger Rayburn to inspect his wallet (which was in his pocket) or his vehicle. KEYES became unusually nervous and began to sweat profusely, in spite of the slightly cool weather and the tank top which he was wearing at the time. KEYES expressed to your Affiant that if he was going to be kept in the area for a longer period of time, he desired to call his brother (who has KEYES' daughter in a separate car) and notify him of same. Your Affiant suggested KEYES make that call. A short time later, the 2012 Ford Focus was transported to and secured at the Lufkin, Texas, Police Department.

30. Based on the aforementioned observations, including the fact that the rented Ford Focus matched the description of the vehicle utilized in the ATM withdrawals in Arizona, New Mexico and Texas, KEYES' arrival in Las Vegas, Nevada, and his subsequent travel from Nevada to Texas very likely resulting in KEYES traveling through Arizona on or about 03/07/2012 (the date of a \$400.00 ATM withdrawal in Arizona) and New Mexico on or about 03/08/2012 (the date of an \$80.00 ATM withdrawal in New Mexico), KEYES' appearance closely matching the description of the white male adult observed in videos of the above-

described ATM withdrawals, KEYES' own admission that he lived in the Anchorage, Alaska, area, KEYES' Alaska driver's license reflecting an Anchorage, Alaska, address, the white tennis shoes under the driver's seat matching the description of the shoes worn by the white male adult observed in the videos of the above-described ATM, as well as other observations, your Affiant instructed Corporal Henry to place KEYES under arrest. Ranger Rayburn, in your Affiant's presence, searched KEYES' wallet, revealing a VISA ATM/Debit card bearing account number XXXXXXXXXXXXX2851, expiration date 01/15, in the name of D.T. This card is linked to the "ransom account" identified above, from which the withdrawals and attempted withdrawals summarized above were made.

Discovery of KEYES' White Chevrolet Truck

31. APD Detectives discovered that ISRAEL KEYES listed a mailing address of 3705 Arctic Blvd. #2891 in Anchorage, Alaska, on 07-18-2011, which is the Mail Cache. APD Detectives also discovered that KEYES listed a residential address of 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska, as of 07-18-2011.

32. On 03-13-2012 at approximately 10:30 AST, members of the APD Special Assignment Unit went to KEYES' home address at 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska. No one answered repeated knocks on the door. Per APD Sergeant Redick, there were fresh tire impressions in the snow in the driveway of the address that appeared as if a vehicle had been parked there as recently as the morning of 03-13-2012.

33. There was also a white Chevrolet pickup truck parked in the driveway of the address. The truck had a large toolbox in the bed and a ladder rack on top. The bolts securing those items were removable and appeared to have been recently added. The license plate on the

truck was Alaska license plate FTC990, relating to a white 2004 Chevrolet Silverado, registered to ISRAEL KEYES at 2456 Spurr Lane in Anchorage, Alaska. The white Chevrolet truck appeared to match the vehicle appearing in the Home Depot surveillance video, as summarized above. Further, Detectives eventually contacted KEYES' girlfriend and discovered that she drives a 2007 Nissan Xterra, which matched the general description of the vehicle used by an individual who appeared to attempt to use the stolen debit card on 2-29-12, as summarized above.

Discovery OF KEYES' Computer Use and Use of Yahoo Account

34. KEYES' girlfriend, who also lives at his residence, was interviewed on approximately March 14, 2012. She indicated KEYES was out of Alaska. She also indicated that KEYES owned a laptop computer and that his computer was not in the residence.

35. Alaska Airlines provided travel records for KEYES pursuant to a Federal Grand Jury Subpoena that was issued to them on March 14, 2012. In reviewing the returns for this subpoena, travel records were found showing KEYES and his young daughter traveled to Houston on February 2, 2012. KEYES was originally scheduled to return on February 14, 2012 but changed the ticket to return on February 17, 2012. The ticket was booked online October 1, 2011 and an email confirmation was sent on the same date. The return ticket was changed to February 17, 2012 and an email confirmation was sent on 2/15/2012. The notes for this transaction indicate the email confirmation was sent to an email address believed to belong to A.K., the mother of KEYES' daughter. However, the tickets were booked using A.K.'s credit card. A.K. does not reside in the state of Alaska and it is likely she had to forward the email confirmation to KEYES so that he would know the dates/times of travel.

36. In reviewing the returns for this subpoena, travel records were also found showing KEYES and his young daughter traveled to Las Vegas on March 6, 2012 via Alaska Airlines. This ticket was booked online and he provided an email address with the reservation. The notes section of the travel records indicated the email address provided was israelkeyes@yahoo.com. The records also indicated an email confirmation was sent to israelkeyes@yahoo.com on March 1, 2012.

Execution of Search Warrant and Discovery of Cellular Telephone Matching

Description of Phone Belonging to S.K.

37. On March 16, 2012, law enforcement agents in Beaumont, Texas obtained a search warrant which authorized the search of the white Ford Focus driven by KEYES. Execution of that search warrant on March 17, 2012 revealed numerous items, including a Samsung cellphone, black in color, slider type. Model# SCH-R631. Possible S/N 80015743 (this number is on the back of the phone but it does not indicate it as a S/N), which matched the description of S.K.'s cellular phone provided by S.K.'s boyfriend (per paragraph 9, S.K. is believed to have been carrying the phone when the kidnapping took place), and a laptop computer.

38. In my training and experience, I know that photos from digital cameras and cellular phones are frequently downloaded to computers and electronic tablets, and then printed or stored on media devices. I also know that cellular phones, computers, electronic tablets and similar devices are frequently used to arrange travel and hotel reservations, rent vehicles, and conduct other personal business related to traveling. I also know that computers and cellular phones can be used to connect to the internet, which can be used to locate banks, ATM's, hotels, maps, send email, draft documents, and communicate with others. I also know that storage

devices for electronic information, or "thumb" drives, are often used to store such information for later use by computers, cellular phones and other media devices. I know that electronic records of all such uses of computers and similar electronic devices are retained within those devices and may be retrieved by forensic technicians.

Interview of KEYES

39. In an interview with defense counsel present on March 17, 2012, KEYES admitted to using S.K.'s debit card at locations throughout the southwest United States. He also claimed that he received the debit card and the cellular telephone matching the description of S.K.'s telephone together in a plastic bag from an anonymous person, who left the plastic bag in his vehicle. Based on my training and experience, it appears very likely that the specifics of KEYES' account of the origin of his possession of the phone and debit card is not truthful; however, his admission that the phone and debit card are associated with each other associates both items with S.K., and confirms the identification of the phone as belonging to S.K.

40. The Device is currently in the lawful possession of the FBI. The Device came into the FBI possession as outlined above. Although the FBI might already have the lawful authority to examine the Device, I seek this additional warrant out of an abundance of caution to be certain that an examination of the Device will comply with the Fourth Amendment and other applicable laws.

41. The Device is currently in storage at FBI Anchorage Station, Anchorage, Alaska. In my training and experience, I know that the Device has been stored in a manner in which its contents are, to the extent material to this investigation, in substantially the same state as they were when the Device first came into the possession of the government.

TECHNICAL TERMS

42. Based on my training, my experience, and information provided to me by other law enforcement personnel, I use the following technical terms to convey the following meanings:

- a. "Storage medium": A storage medium is any physical object upon which data can be stored, including a cellular telephone's flash memory or other data storage components, such as a SIM card.
- b. "Wireless telephone": A wireless telephone (or mobile telephone, or cellular telephone) is a handheld wireless device used for voice and data communication through radio signals. These telephones send signals through networks of transmitter/receivers, enabling communication with other wireless telephones or traditional "land line" telephones. A wireless telephone usually contains a "call log," which records the telephone number, date, and time of calls made to and from the phone. In addition to enabling voice communications, wireless telephones offer a broad range of capabilities. These capabilities include: storing names and phone numbers in electronic "address books"; sending, receiving, and storing text messages and e-mail; taking, sending, receiving, and storing still photographs and moving video; storing and playing back audio files; storing dates, appointments, and other information on personal calendars; and accessing and downloading information from the Internet. Wireless telephones may also include global positioning system ("GPS") technology for determining the location of the device.
- c. "Computer": Pursuant to 18 U.S.C. § 1030(e)(1), a computer is "an electronic, magnetic, optical, electrochemical, or other high speed data processing device performing logical or storage functions, and includes any data storage facility or communications facility directly related to or operating in conjunction with such device."
- d. IP Address: An Internet Protocol address (or simply "IP Address") is a unique numeric address used by computers on the Internet. An IP address is a series of four numbers, each in the range 0-255, separated by periods (e.g., 121.56.97.178). Every computer

attached to the Internet must be assigned an IP address so that Internet traffic sent from and directed to that computer may be directed properly from its source to its destination. Most Internet service providers control a range of IP addresses. Some computers have static- that is, long-term - IP addresses, while other computers have dynamic – that is, frequently changed – IP addresses.

- e. Internet: The Internet is a global network of computers and other electronic devices that communicate with each other. Due to the structure of the internet, connections between devices on the internet often cross state and international borders, even when the devices communicating with each other are in the same state.

43 Based on my training, experience, and research, I know that the Target Device has capabilities that allow it to serve as a wireless telephone and digital camera, and may also function as a computer and internet browser. In my training and experience, examining data stored on devices of this type can uncover, among other things, evidence that reveals or suggests who possessed or used the device.

ELECTRONIC STORAGE AND FORENSIC ANALYSIS

44. The applied-for warrant would authorize the forensic examination of the Target Device for the purpose of identifying and seizing the electronically stored information particularly described in Attachment B in accordance with Federal Criminal Procedure Rule 41(e)(2)(B) (“Warrant Seeking Electronically Stored Information”).

45. *Forensic evidence:* As further described in Attachment B, this application seeks permission to locate not only electronically stored information that might serve as direct evidence of the crimes described on the warrant, but also forensic evidence that establishes how the Target Device was used, the purpose of its use, who used it, and when. There is probable cause to believe that this forensic electronic evidence more likely than not is stored in the Target Device because:

- a. Data on a storage medium can provide evidence of information that was once on the storage medium but has since been deleted or edited, or of a deleted portion of the information.
- b. Forensic evidence stored within the Target Device can also indicate who has used or controlled the Target Device. This “user

attribution” evidence is analogous to the search for “indicia of occupancy” while executing a search warrant at a residence.

- c. A person with appropriate familiarity with how the Target Device works may, after examining this forensic evidence in its proper context, be able to draw conclusions about how electronic devices were used, the purpose of their use, who used them, and when.
- d. The process of identifying the exact electronically stored information on a storage medium that are necessary to draw an accurate conclusion is a dynamic process. Electronic evidence is not always data that can be merely reviewed by a review team and passed along to investigators. Whether data stored on a cellular telephone is evidence may depend on other information stored on the cellular telephone and the application of knowledge about how a cellular telephone operates. Therefore, contextual information necessary to understand other evidence also falls within the scope of the warrant.
- e. Further, in finding evidence of how the Target Device was used, the purpose of its use, who used it, and when, sometimes it is necessary to establish that a particular thing is not present on a storage medium.
- f. Based on my knowledge, training and experience, I know that electronic devices can store information for long periods of time. Similarly, things that have been viewed via the internet are typically stored for some period of time on the device. This information can sometimes be recovered with forensics tools.

46. *Nature of examination:* Based on the foregoing, and consistent with Rule 41(e)(2)(B), the warrant I am applying for would permit the examination of the Target Device consistent with the warrant. The examination may require authorities to employ techniques, including but not limited to computer-assisted scans of the Target Device’s entire storage medium, that might expose many parts of the device to human inspection in order to determine whether it is evidence described by the warrant.

47. *Manner of execution:* Because this warrant seeks only permission to examine a cellular telephone already in law enforcement’s possession, the execution of this warrant does not involve the physical intrusion onto a premises. Consequently, I submit there is

reasonable cause for the Court to authorize execution of the warrant at any time in the day or night.

48. *Forensic image retention:* I hereby request judicial authorization to retain full copy of the cellular telephone's storage media after the review is complete (to the extent that this warrant does not already authorize me to retain that storage media as seized forfeitable property) and until further order of the Court. That judicial authorization is justified in this case in part because:

- a. Should the execution of the warrant uncover data that may later need to be introduced into evidence during a trial or other proceeding, the authenticity and the integrity of the evidence and the government's forensic methodology may be contested issues. Retaining copies of seized storage media can be required to prove these facts.
- b. Returning the original storage medium to its owner will not allow for the preservation of that evidence. Even routine use of a cellular telephone may forever change the data it contains or eliminate data stored on it.
- c. Because the investigation is not yet complete, it is not possible to predict all possible defendants against whom evidence found on the storage medium might be used. That evidence might be used against persons who have no possessory interest in the storage media, or against persons yet unknown. Those defendants might be entitled to a copy of the complete storage media in discovery. Retention of the entire content of the storage medium assures that it will be available to all parties, including those known now and those later identified.
- d. The act of destroying or returning a cellular telephone could create an opportunity for a defendant to claim, falsely, that the destroyed or returned cellular telephone contained evidence favorable to him. Maintaining a copy of the cellular telephone's storage medium would permit the government, through an additional warrant if necessary, to investigate such a claim.
- e. Similarly, should a defendant suggest an explanation for the presence of evidence on a storage medium, it may be necessary to

investigate such an explanation by, among other things, re-examining the storage medium with that defense in mind. This may require an additional examination of the storage medium for evidence that is described in Attachment B but was not properly identified and segregated previously.

CONCLUSION

49. Based on my training and experience, and the facts as set forth in this affidavit, there is probable cause to believe that on the Lenovo B570 laptop, black in color, Model #1068, S/N WB036866 there exists fruits, evidence, and instrumentalities of violations of Title 18, United States Code (USC), Section 1029(a)(5) (Fraud and Related Activity in Connection with Access Devices)(FRACAD); Title 18, United States Code, Section 1201 (Kidnaping); and Title 18, United States Code, Section 1202(b) (Ransom Money).

50. This Court has jurisdiction to issue the requested warrant because it is "a court of competent jurisdiction" as defined by 18 U.S.C. § 2711. 18 U.S.C. §§ 2703(a), (b)(1)(A) & (c)(1)(A). Specifically, the Court is "a district court of the United States . . . that – has jurisdiction over the offense being investigated." 18 U.S.C. § 2711(3)(A)(I).

51. The investigation of this case is ongoing and disclosure of the issuance of the search warrant could result in destruction of evidence and could also impact officer, witness and victim safety. Accordingly, pursuant to the case law outlined in the government's motion to seal, I respectfully request that the search warrant, search warrant affidavit, attachments, and returns be sealed.

[redacted] did not know Keyes to have any tattoos but did recall an incident where Keyes branded an Anarchist "A" on his chest using a coat hanger and a propane torch. This occurred at Keyes house. [redacted] recalled that there had been a lot of "goading" of Keyes during this incident. [redacted] identified [redacted] as another friend of Keyes. 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the up-side-down cross or the pentagram. [REDACTED] did not know Keyes to be involved in the occult.

[REDACTED] advised that Keyes had been disowned by his father and was not allowed to see his mother for a long time. [REDACTED] knew Keyes to have a brother who was going to move to Alaska to help him with work. [REDACTED] also recalled that Keyes had a sister who lived in Texas.

[REDACTED] last spoke with Keyes in September or October 2011. During that conversation they talked about Neah Bay news.

[REDACTED] recalled that Keyes owned a handgun, shotgun, and an assault style rifle. [REDACTED] stated that he held onto Keyes' handgun for him when Keyes moved to Alaska. Later, after a trip to California, Keyes stopped on his way back to Alaska, and picked up the handgun from [REDACTED] could not recall what type or color the handgun was, only remembering that the pistol case was black in color.

[REDACTED] did not know if anything had happened to Keyes in December 2011. Lucas understood that Keyes and [REDACTED] had "split" but were still living together. [redacted] advised that Keyes did not want her to keep the baby. When [redacted] unemployment ran out, [redacted] moved back to Neah Bay, Washington.

A few months later, Keyes contacted [redacted] made up, and moved to Neah Bay to be with her. [redacted] In December 2001, Keyes and [redacted] got engaged.

[redacted] advised that even though they were broken up, Keyes and [redacted] were still "messing around" when Keyes was in his relationship with [redacted] [redacted] knew [redacted] to be a [redacted]

[REDACTED] advised that in December 2011, Keyes had commented that getting work had been harder and he seemed depressed. [REDACTED] speculated that it his apparent depression may have been from the lack of sunlight in Alaska.

Keyes called [REDACTED] on Christmas Day and it sounded to [REDACTED] and Keyes had had a good day. They were suppose to have a Christmas party but [REDACTED] got sick, so the party never happened. Keyes told [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] was hung over and did not come home.

In January 2012, [REDACTED] received several calls from [REDACTED]. On February 2, 2012, Keyes, [REDACTED] took a cruise down in Mexico. This trip was not unexpected and Keyes had mentioned it to [REDACTED] a couple months prior. [REDACTED] advised that she would usually call [REDACTED] cellular phone and if she could not get through, then she would call Keyes' cellular phone. [REDACTED] identified her cellular telephone number at the time as [REDACTED] stated that

[REDACTED] had reported that there were cuts in the curtains and couch and a hole had been punched in the wall. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that she had heard Keyes on the phone at 3:00 AM, asking [REDACTED] when she was going to be home. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] to tell Keyes to call her. Keyes did not return the call that morning, but talked to [REDACTED] that evening. Keyes told [REDACTED] that everything was "fine" and "don't worry." [REDACTED] believed that this occurred the day after [REDACTED] [REDACTED] also placed the phone call the morning that [REDACTED] was suppose to go to [REDACTED] advising that Keyes had [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] may still have the text messages from that evening on her cellular phone.

[REDACTED] first heard about Keyes' arrest from her son, [REDACTED] advised that her sister [REDACTED] tried calling her first, but that [REDACTED] had missed the phone call. [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that Keyes had been arrested in Texas and that it was in connection with the abduction in Anchorage.

[REDACTED] stated that after the cruise, Keyes and [REDACTED] had traveled to Texas for [REDACTED] told [REDACTED] that they had driven to Texas but [REDACTED] does not know if that meant they drove the entire way or if they flew part way and drove the remaining distance. [REDACTED] recalled that Keyes had talked about a Texas road trip in the past but had cancelled it due to money issues. [REDACTED] commented that Keyes was very "tight" with his money.

[REDACTED] stated that she called Keyes the night that he arrived in Texas. [REDACTED] recalled that Keyes was in a good mood and was driving through a thunderstorm at the time. [REDACTED] was not on the trip as far as [REDACTED] was aware.

[REDACTED] was asked about Keyes' "brands." [REDACTED] stated that the brand of the pentagram happened when Keyes was in the Army and while in Egypt. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes would get teased about his Amish background and that the branding had occurred when he was drunk, further advising that his army buddies did it to him.

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[REDACTED] stated that the brands of the upside down cross and the anarchist "A" were ones that Keyes did himself. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes was not into the occult, but chose those brands as a anti-religion statement, which "pissed" [REDACTED] off.

[REDACTED] stated that Keyes had no history of aggression. [REDACTED] stated that she would try to "push his buttons" but that Keyes would not react. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes was not the jealous type and that this would also bother her.

[REDACTED] was asked about a domestic violence incident which occurred between her and Keyes while they lived in Neah Bay. [REDACTED] stated that the incident was entirely her fault. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes was playing games on-line and was instant messaging some girl. Later [REDACTED] got on the internet and used Keyes' password to talk to the girl. [REDACTED] confronted Keyes about this and pulled out the phone jack from the wall. [REDACTED] stated that she was trying to get "a rise" out of Keyes, who was drunk at the time. [REDACTED] stated that this was the worse fight that they had ever had.

[REDACTED] stated that Keyes was not into any "fetishes" or bondage, as far as she knew. Keyes viewed pornography, but nothing unusual or anything that she was ever concerned about. [REDACTED] did not know Keyes to have any sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) but noted that he was "worried" about them.

[REDACTED] recalled that Keyes had a few guns, recalling a shotgun and a rifle. Keyes also believed that Keyes may have had a handgun, but she was not sure. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes had taught her to shoot and described him as the "Typical American guy."

[REDACTED] stated that she did not believe that Keyes had anything to do with the abduction of the barista in Anchorage, noting that Keyes was into older women. [REDACTED] noted that she was approximately [REDACTED] years older than Keyes and that [REDACTED] was approximately [REDACTED] years older.

Keyes did braid [REDACTED] hair, recalling that he would braid her hair in pig tails and french braids. [REDACTED] stated that Keyes learned braiding hair from growing up with his sisters.

[redacted] reported that [redacted] was "freaked-out" over the incident. [redacted] talked with Keyes later that evening and was told that everything was fine. The date of this incident is unknown but reportedly happened the day after [redacted] received [redacted]

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[redacted] both provided information on Keyes' brands (the pentagram, the upside-down-cross, and the Anarchist "A"). [redacted] advised that the pentagram was burned onto Keyes while he was in the Army, during a tour in Egypt. SA [] and Ranger [] interviewed KEYES in the parking lot of the Cotton Patch Cafe. KEYES indicated he had rented the vehicle in Las Vegas, Nevada, on or about March 7, 2012, and had driven from Nevada to Lufkin, Texas. KEYES was unable to describe the route he drove from Nevada to Texas and indicated he "probably" paid for fuel throughout his travels from Nevada to Texas with cash. Ranger [] reported to SA [] that he could plainly see a pair of light-colored tennis shoes partially pushed under the driver's seat of the vehicle. KEYES became increasingly agitated and uncooperative and refused to allow a search of his vehicle and wallet. Based on information obtained and observed by SA [] and Ranger [] during the interview, as well as items viewed in plain sight within the vehicle, SA [] and Ranger [] conducted a cursory search of the vehicle. Within the vehicle SA [] and Ranger [] located a pair of men's white and gray tennis shoes (partially pushed under the driver's seat) and a gray hooded sweatshirt, the pocket of which contained a pair of amber shooting glasses and a piece of gray fabric which appeared to be a short-sleeve cut from a gray tee-shirt (in the trunk of the vehicle). The items located within the vehicle matched the description of the clothing/disguise worn by the individual described in the aforementioned BOLO. In addition, three large rolls of U.S. currency were located in the driver's door panel pocket of the vehicle, and KEYES refused to provide an explanation for his possession of the cash.

The search of the vehicle was discontinued at that time, and at approximately 12:46 p.m. on March 13, 2012, KEYES was arrested and transported to the Lufkin, Texas, Police Department and placed into an interview room. When they found him he told them that his credit cards had been frozen and that he had not eaten or slept in two days. He said he ran out of gas, and [REDACTED] saw that there was mud all over the car. He told them that he had gotten the car stuck out in the middle of nowhere but gave no good explanation of where. Israel [REDACTED] stayed with [REDACTED] a couple of more days and went back to Alaska on the 18th.

[REDACTED] has never heard the name Samantha Koenig and has never heard Israel mention that name. She did not notice anything strange going on with either Israel [REDACTED] while they were in for the wedding.

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared Texas Department of Public Safety Corporal [redacted] who being duly sworn on oath states:

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My date of birth is [redacted] I am of sound mind and am 18 years-of-age or older. I am a Texas Peace Officer and was so on 03-12-2012, and 03-13-2012.

I am voluntarily submitting this statement to Texas Ranger [redacted] I am giving this statement without any threats or promises and on my own free will. This statement may be used for whatever purpose deemed necessary. (INITIALS: [redacted])

On the morning of 3-12-2012, I, Texas Highway Patrol (THP) Corporal [redacted] was at the Texas Department of Public Safety (DPS) office in Lufkin, Texas. I met with Texas Ranger [redacted] who gave me a bulletin he had prepared, and asked that I attempt to locate the vehicle on the bulletin and identify any occupants. The bulletin gave the following details:

"02-01-2012, at approx. 2:00 AM, the victim was kidnapped in the State of Alaska at her place of employment. Her family and boyfriend have since been cleared as suspects. On 03-07-2012, at Debit Card [redacted] was used at an ATM in Wilcox, AZ at approx 10:15 AM. The card was again used in Lordsburg, NM at approx 11:30 AM. The card was last used in Shepherd, TX on 03-12-2012, at approximately 2:47 AM."

The bulletin included a photograph of Anchorage, Alaska Kidnapping Victim Samantha Koenig and photographs from ATM surveillance of the unknown actor with his face and head partially covered. Photographs indicated to me the unknown male was a tall white male with a thin or average build. Included also was a photograph of what, according to Ranger [redacted] was a white late model Ford Focus four-door passenger car. The car did not appear to have tinted windows or anything remarkable such as decals or body damage.

Ranger [redacted] asked me to check motels, rest stops, and truck stops. He said he believed the white Ford Focus likely continued northbound on US 59 from Humble, through Shepherd, and

likely entered or passed through Lufkin. I knew Shepherd to be approximately an hour South of Lufkin.

I left the DPS office and drove to the local Ford dealership. I observed a Ford Focus and agreed the photograph in the bulletin was most likely a late model Ford Focus. I searched for a car matching the vehicle in the bulletin at local motels, truck stops, businesses, and on the roadway until my shift ended at approximately 5:00 PM. I did not find a single white late model Ford Focus.

On 03-13-2012, my shift began at approximately 6:00 AM. At approximately 10:50 AM, I glanced into the parking lot of the Quality Inn located on US 59 South in Lufkin. The Quality Inn is included in a cluster of four motels sharing the same driveway, and would have been one of the first motels northbound travelers entering Lufkin on US 59 would have encountered. Parked in front of one of the rooms, on the north side of the motel, was a late model white Ford Focus four-door passenger car that matched the description on Ranger [redacted] bulletin. I drove past the car and noted the license plate was Texas DH4-N930. At approximately 10:55 AM, I notified Ranger [redacted] Ranger [redacted] said he and Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) Special Agent (SA) [redacted] were in his office and would respond to the Quality Inn to investigate. I checked the vehicle registration by "in car computer" and it came back to PV Holding out of San Antonio, Texas. I recognized through my training and experience that the car was likely a rental. THP Trooper [redacted] responded to the motel and also observed the Ford Focus. Trooper [redacted] agreed it perfectly matched the description in Ranger [redacted] bulletin. Trooper [redacted] and I waited for Ranger [redacted] and SA [redacted] at the motel's entrance, and out of view of the white Ford Focus. Ranger [redacted] and SA [redacted] soon arrived on scene. Ranger [redacted] advised that they would have a DPS Criminal Investigation Division (CID) Agent keep eyes on the vehicle while SA [redacted] interviewed the motel staff. Trooper [redacted] and I left the area. b6
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At approximately 11:30 AM, Ranger [redacted] advised the vehicle and driver were preparing to leave the motel, and to "set up" on US 59. Ranger [redacted] told me to contact CID Lieutenant [redacted] for more information. Lieutenant [redacted] advised the vehicle was leaving and requested I conduct a traffic stop of the vehicle. I understood Ranger [redacted] SA [redacted] and Lieutenant [redacted] wanted to determine if the vehicle or occupant was associated with the ATM transaction in Shepherd, or the kidnapping in Anchorage, Alaska.

I responded to the area and observed the white Ford Focus turn left (north) from the motel's driveway onto US 59. I observed the vehicle being followed by Lieutenant [redacted] unmarked

vehicle. I sat in a center median, north of the motel, and as the car passed, I observed the driver was a thin to average framed white male with dark hair. He appeared to be alone in the vehicle. I further observed the driver wore dark sunglasses. I turned and drove northbound behind the Ford Focus.

The driver of the Ford Focus stopped for a red light at the US 59 and FM 819 intersection. I was two vehicles behind him at the light. As the red light turned green the white Ford Focus excelled much faster than other vehicles. I am trained and tested in visually estimating the speed of moving vehicles to within five miles per hour accuracy, and believed the vehicle was traveling greater than the posted 55 mile per hour limit. I commented to Lieutenant [redacted] over the telephone that I thought the vehicle was speeding. I used my radar to measure the speed of the Focus. I'm trained and tested in the use of my radar. I checked the calibration of my radar at the beginning of my shift and knew it was working properly. I used the radar in the same lane mode and measured the Focus' speed at 58 miles per hour in a 55 mile per hour zone. I activated emergency lights to stop the Focus. This also activated my mobile video recorder. Approximately two minutes prior to emergency light activation was also captured on video because of the pre-event function of the camera. The camera system also captured the time, date, and radar unit's display. There was a slight delay with the data from the radar being captured by the camera, and the speed recorded on the camera showed to be 57 miles-per-hour. The white Ford Focus drove into and stopped in the Cotton Patch Cafe' parking lot. I made the traffic stop because the driver was speeding three miles over the posted 55 mile-per-hour speed limit, and because the vehicle and driver matched the description of the vehicle and actor in Ranger [redacted] bulletin. Speeding over the posted 55 mile-per-hour speed limit was a traffic violation. This occurred at approximately 11:40 AM.

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I stepped up to the vehicle and identified myself as being with the Highway Patrol. I told the driver we were looking around the hotel areas and asked him where he was from. The driver advised that he was from Alaska. I then asked the driver for his driver's license and asked him to step out of the vehicle. The driver advised he was in the area for a family wedding. He advised the wedding was in [redacted] Texas; fifteen minutes north of Lufkin. The driver handed me his Alaska driver license indentifying him as Israel Keyes of Anchorage. He was white male born on 01-07-1978. His Alaska driver license number was #7268639. I asked Keyes to place the knife I could see clipped inside his front blue jean's pocket on the trunk of the white Ford Focus. Keyes also had a Leatherman tool in his rear pocket. I asked him to place it with the knife. I stepped to my patrol car and ran his Alaska driver license through DPS Lufkin Communications. I also made a hand gesture to Lieutenant [redacted] who was observing the traffic stop from inside his unmarked patrol car. Lieutenant [redacted] was parked across the

parking lot. Lieutenant [] drove over to my location and I showed him the Anchorage, Alaska driver license. I thought it more than a coincidence that the driver was from Anchorage, Alaska, the same city from where Samantha Koenig's kidnapping occurred. I've been with the THP for more than 22 years and could not ever recall stopping anyone from Anchorage, Alaska. I also thought it more than a coincidence Keyes and his vehicle matched the description on Ranger [] bulletin, and was observed leaving a Lufkin motel, only a day after the fraudulent ATM withdrawal in Shepherd. I believed I may have stopped the person and vehicle photographed at the ATM, and associated with the kidnapping of Samantha Koenig.

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Lieutenant [] notified Ranger [] Ranger [] and SA [] advised that they would immediately respond to our location from the motel south of our location. Other THP and CID personnel arrived on scene. I spoke with Keyes while I waited on Ranger [] and SA [] arrival. Keyes asked what the investigation was about. I told him that we were looking into a kidnapping from Alaska. I observed Keyes appeared unusually nervous. I observed he was sweating. He wore a thin gray sleeveless undershirt. There were sweat marks under his arms. Keyes advised that he had been staying in [] but had stayed the night at the Quality Inn with his brother. Keyes advised that both his brothers were in town for the wedding and both of them were from the State of [] I asked Keyes how long he had been in Texas, and there was an unusual pause before he answered. Keyes said he arrived in Texas the previous Thursday, on the same day as a big rain. I asked Keyes if he flew down to Texas or drove and he advised that the only ticket he could get was to Vegas, so he flew to Vegas and drove to Texas. He then said he flew into Vegas so he could take [] to see the Grand Canyon. Keyes advised [] was in town, but with his brother in [] Keyes advised [] I asked Keyes if he was married and he advised "No." At around 11:48 AM, Ranger [] and SA [] arrived. I briefly spoke with them and shared with them some of my observations.

Ranger [] took my cordless in-car video microphone and placed it in his shirt pocket, so that his contact with Keyes would be recorded. Ranger [] and SA [] stepped up to speak with Keyes and I observed from a distance.

After several minutes I observed Ranger [] and SA [] searching the white Ford Focus. I observed Sergeant [] taking digital photographs throughout the search. During the search I observed Ranger [] and SA [] find rolls of money inside the pocket of the driver's door. I observed thin rubber bands around the rolls of money. There were at least three money rolls. I heard Ranger [] ask Keyes to open the truck

and I again observed as they searched through the trunk area. Ranger [] pulled out several articles of clothing including a gray hooded sweatshirt. From within the sweatshirt, Ranger [] located what I believed was a gray colored cloth or mask and safety glasses, all consistent with items worn by the person depicted in Ranger [] bulletin. I looked at Keyes to see if he might try to run away, but two officers were standing beside him.

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At approximately 12:46 PM, Ranger [] consulted with SA [] and instructed me to place Keyes under arrest for Kidnapping out of Alaska. After I advised Keyes he was under arrest, Ranger [] provided me with a brown evidence bag. Trooper [] and I placed into Ranger [] evidence bag all Keys' personal property, including his shoes and leather wallet. Keyes was then placed in my patrol car and I read aloud to him a Miranda Warning. This was done at approximately 12:50 PM. Keyes said he understood his rights. I transported Keyes to the Lufkin Police Department (LPD) to be held in the video interview room. We arrived at LPD at approximately 1:04 PM. Trooper [] followed me to LPD to assist with Keyes. On the way to LPD I noticed scars or brands of something on both of Keys upper arms. He said he received the brands while serving in the Army. I also noticed a brand on the back of his neck. The brand on his upper right arm looked like a smiley face and the brand on his upper left arm appeared to be the letters "IZ." The brand on his neck looked like a star with a circle around it. Keyes later told me "IZ" was for his nickname, "Izey." I placed Keyes in the video interview room and activated the recorder. We remained there for a couple of hours until Ranger [] and SA [] arrived to question Keyes. Ranger [] and SA [] spoke with Keyes in the interview room while we remained outside in the hallway. After Ranger [] and SA [] spoke with Keyes, they advised Keyes would be transported and held at a federal facility. I left Keyes with Ranger [] and SA [] and ended my shift.

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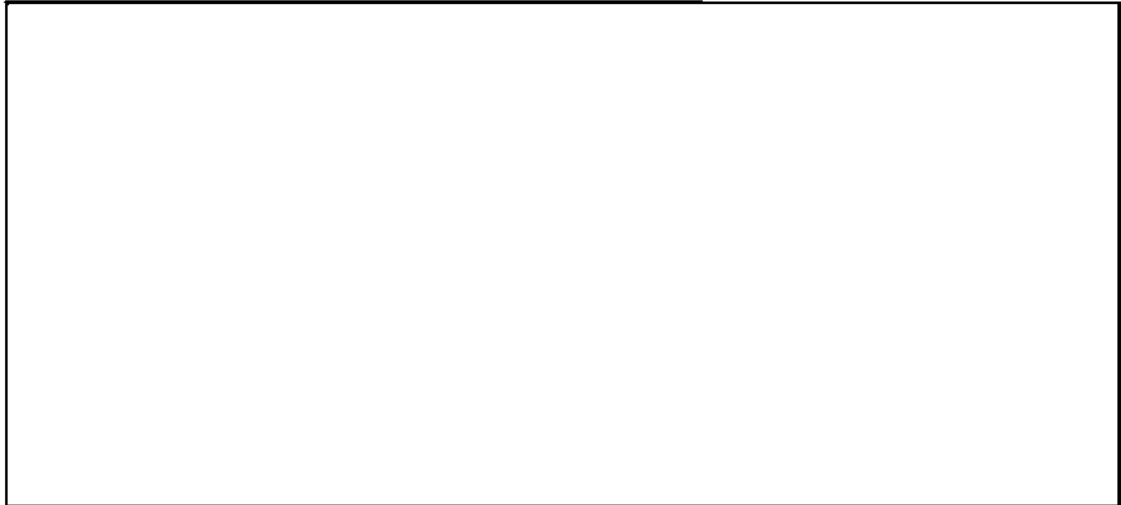
