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A. BIRTH DATA

Petition for Naturalization No. 75206 maintained by the Clerk of the United States District Court, San Francisco, reflected the subject was born September 11, 1917, at Morton, Marsh, England. (u)

In March 1943, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that JESSICA ROMILLY was born November 9, 1917, at Glos, England, the daughter of Lord Redesdale. (u)

It is noted that birth dates and birthplaces in the preceding two paragraphs do not agree.

B. CITIZENSHIP STATUS

Certificate of Arrival No. 4-34289 reflected that JESSICA LUCY ROMILLY entered the Port of New York on March 2, 1939 on board the SS AURANIA. (u)

Petition for Naturalization No. 75206 maintained by the Clerk of the United States District Court, San Francisco, reflected that the subject was admitted to United States citizenship in that court on January 3, 1944. (u)

C. EDUCATION

[redacted] another governmental agency, furnished information reflecting that TREUHART attended the Sorbonne, Paris, France, from 1933 to 1934, receiving a diploma in December 1934. (u)

In March 1943, records of the Strayer College, 13th and F St., NW, Washington, D. C., reflected the subject attended that school, studying shorthand and typing from September 15, 1942 to February 26, 1943. (u)

D. MARITAL STATUS

In September 1944, [redacted] furnished information reflecting that ROBERT E. TREUHART and the subject were married on June 21, 1943, at Guerneville, California. (u)

However, the "San Francisco Examiner" dated December 4, 1943, stated that these individuals were married several months previous to that date in Washington, D. C. This article also stated that the subject was formerly married to ESMOND ROMILLY, author-nephew of WINSTON CHURCHILL. ROMILLY was reportedly killed in action while a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force. (4)

F. CRIMINAL RECORD

In March 1943, no record of the subject was located in the files of the Metropolitan Police Department, Washington, D. C. (4)

No criminal record for the subject was located on March 3, 1952, by Special Employee [redacted] in the files of the Oakland, California, Police Department.

In March 1943, [redacted] advised that TREUHAFI in 1939 and 1940 had been part owner of the Roma Bar and Restaurant in Miami, Florida. (u)

San Francisco County Retailers Credit Association records reflect that from January 1944 to June of 1944, TREUHAFI was employed in the offices of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee (JAFRC) in San Francisco. (u)

The JAFRC has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835. (u)

On September 12, 1944, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that TREUHAFI was employed at 2030 Broadway, Oakland, as Financial Director of the Oakland Branch of the California Labor School (CLS) of San Francisco. (u)

The CLS of San Francisco has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835. (u)

On April 26, 1945, [redacted] of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI received an indefinite leave of absence from the Oakland Branch of the CLS in order to assist in establishing the Friends of the Spanish Democracy Committee. [redacted] said that this organization was establishing a West Coast Branch for the purpose of lobbying at the UN Conference against recognition of the Franco Government in Spain. [redacted] furnished information reflecting that the principal individuals who established this committee in San Francisco were members of the Communist Party. (u)

On May 19, 1950, [redacted] of known reliability, said TREUHAFI had been named Executive Secretary of the East Bay Chapter of the Civil Rights Congress (CRC). (u)

The CRC has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835. (u)

On April 23, 1952, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that TREUHAFI was employed as Director of the East Bay Chapter of the CRC with headquarters at 700 21st St., Oakland, California. (u)

H. RESIDENCES

The records of the San Francisco County Retailers Credit Association reflected that in 1944 TREUHAFI resided at 956 Clayton St., San Francisco. (u)

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company telephone directory dated January 1945 reflected that subject resided at 956 Clayton St., San Francisco. (u)

In January 1949 [redacted] of known reliability, advised that DECCA TREUHAFI resided at 675 Jean St., Oakland, California. (u)

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company Street-Address Directory dated February 1951 reflected JESSICA TREUHAFI resided at 730 59th St., Oakland. (u)

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Street-Address Directory dated July 1952 reflected DECCA TREUHAFI resided at 730 59th St., Oakland, California. (u)

II. CONNECTIONS WITH THE COMMUNIST PARTY AND RELATED GROUPS

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A. INFORMATION CONCERNING ADMISSION TO THE REVOLUTIONARY GROUP

COMMUNIST PARTY (CP)

On January 15, 1944, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that DECCA TREUHAFI had become a member of the Southside Club Professional Group, CP, San Francisco. According to [redacted] TREUHAFI had previously been active in CP affairs and was known to have recruited new members into the CP, but waited until she had received her citizenship papers before joining. (u)

The CP has been declared by the Attorney General as coming within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

B. HISTORY OF ACTIVITY IN, ATTENDANCE AT MEETINGS OF, AND POSITIONS HELD IN THE SUBVERSIVE MOVEMENT WITH WHICH THE SUBJECT IS IDENTIFIED

On September 9, 1944, [redacted] both of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI and her husband had been awarded. (u)

SF 100-21480

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a life-time subscription to the "Daily People's World" (DPW) for obtaining contributions exceeding \$100.00 during a fund raising campaign for the DPW. (u)

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[redacted] has advised that the DPW is a West Coast publication under the control of the CP. (u)

On July 10, 1947, [redacted] was told by AUBREY GROSSMAN, Educational Director, San Francisco County CP, that TREUHAFI was no longer employed by the CP of San Francisco. (u)

On March 26, 1945, [redacted] of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI completed a Registration Card in January 1945 indicating that she was a member of a Communist Political Association (CPA) club in San Francisco and that her occupation was Financial Director, CIS, Oakland. According to this source, TREUHAFI held 1945 CPA Membership Card No. 40334 and 1944 CP Membership Card No. 39232. (u)

On July 19, 1946, [redacted] advised that TREUHAFI had been directed by the CP of San Francisco to appear as a witness in the trial of one [redacted] who was being tried by the CP for opposition to the CP and for factionalism, on July 27, 1946. (u)

During the period from January 28, 1944, to February 19, 1945, [redacted] advised that TREUHAFI had been in regular attendance at meetings of the Southside Club, CP and CPA, San Francisco County, attending at least fifteen meetings, some of which were held in the subject's home. (u)

On February 3, 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that TREUHAFI was the new Financial Director, CP, San Francisco County. (u)

On March 16, 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that the County Committee, CP, San Francisco County, had decided to ask TREUHAFI to resign as Financial Director because she allegedly did not account for certain funds, and if she refused to resign, it was decided to dismiss her. (u)

TREUHAFI, according to [redacted] refused to resign, taking the position that since she had been elected by the membership of the CP the Executive Board had no authority to dismiss her. (u)

On March 21, 1946, [redacted] said that TREUHAFI had been reinstated in the good graces of the CP and retained in the employ of the San Francisco County CP by a vote of 8 to 5 in a committee hearing. (u)

On February 1, 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI had made application to attend a fulltime school sponsored by the CP of San Francisco County. (u)

In the spring of 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that from January 22, 1946 to April 29, 1946, TREUHAFI attended at least four meetings of the San Francisco County CP Committee at CP Headquarters, San Francisco. (u)

In October 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that in addition to being San Francisco County CP Financial Director and maintaining the financial records, TREUHAFI was President of the Twin Peaks Club, CP, San Francisco County. (u)

During the period from December 10, 1945 to January 9, 1947, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that TREUHAFI attended San Francisco County CP executive and staff meetings at CP Headquarters, San Francisco, on at least eight occasions. (u)

On September 12, 1947, [redacted] of known reliability, stated TREUHAFI, a recent transferee from the Twin Peaks Club, CP, San Francisco, had attended a meeting of the 16th A. D. Club, CP, Alameda County, on August 25, 1947, at [redacted]. (u)

On April 15, 1947, [redacted] said that at a meeting of the 16th A. D. Club on April 4, 1947, held at the home of [redacted] TREUHAFI was elected Educational Director of that club. (u)

In September 1947, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished CP Transfer Card No. 29319 which reflected that TREUHAFI had been transferred from the Twin Peaks Club, CP, San Francisco, to the Alameda County CP on July 15, 1947. (u)

During the period from September 1947 to November 1948, [redacted] furnished information reflecting that TREUHAFI was in frequent attendance at meetings of the 16th A. D. Club, CP, of Alameda County. (u)

In February 1948, [redacted] stated that a meeting of the 16th A. D. Club was held on February 9, 1948 at TREUHAFI's residence at Oakland, at which TREUHAFI was elected to the position of Press Director of the club and was also nominated as Educational Director but had declined the latter nomination. (u)

[redacted] advised in 1949 that during the first half of that year TREUHAFI was in regular attendance at meetings of the 16th A. D. Club, CP of Alameda County. In July 1949, according to [redacted] and [redacted] (u)

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and [redacted] TREUHAFI left the club to become Financial Secretary of the East Bay Chapter of the CRC Fund Drive. (u)

On March 31, 1947, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that TREUHAFI was present on March 20, 1947, at a meeting of the CPUSA, 1400 Greenwich St., San Francisco. According to [redacted] the subject gave a lecture at this meeting telling the group that "all branch members should be warned that they might expect a visit from the FBI at any moment. Each member must be told they are not to so much as speak to the FBI without first consulting CP Headquarters for advice." (u)

On August 31, 1948, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that TREUHAFI attended the Alameda County CP Convention on July 3 and 4, 1948, in Oakland, California. (u)

On May 27, 1948, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that TREUHAFI was acting as Director of a fund raising drive in Alameda County for the benefit of the CP and DFW. (u)

On September 2, 1949, [redacted] furnished information indicating that DECCA TREUHAFI would relinquish her CP duties to go into the CRC shortly after Labor Day 1949. (u)

On August 9, 1948, [redacted] of known reliability, said that DECCA TREUHAFI attended the first session of the East Oakland Section Convention, CP, Alameda County, on June 25, 1948, at the residence of [redacted]. At the second session held the following day at the residence of [redacted] TREUHAFI was elected a delegate to the Alameda County CP Convention, according to [redacted]. (u)

On February 16, 1949, [redacted] both of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI attended [redacted] CP functionaries held at CRC Hall, 263 12th St. Oakland, on January 28, 1949. (u)

On July 10, 1950, [redacted] stated that [redacted] of CP functionaries [redacted] was held on June 23, 1950 at [redacted] and was attended by DECCA TREUHAFI. (u)

On April 13, 1950, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that during 1949, [redacted] with DECCA TREUHAFI, including meetings of the West Oakland Section, [redacted] CP, Alameda County. (u)

On March 2, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that the CP would sponsor a public meeting at Norway Hall, 2839 Piedmont Ave., Oakland on March 4, 1951. (u)

On March 4, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, made available the following information concerning the above public meeting. The meeting was opened by MICKEY LIMA, Organizer, Communist Party, East Bay Region, acting as Chairman. He stated the meeting was under the auspices of the Communist Party and given in connection with Negro History Week. According to [redacted] LIMA stated, "Present policy of the bipartisan government of the United States dictated by Wall Street monopolists is the policy of aggression, a policy designed and aimed at enslaving the people and robbing them for these same trusts. It is a policy of aggression and war. It is criminal to follow a policy of aggression against the independence of nations, big and small. We do not believe the United States is in danger of being attacked in any quarter or by any force and that the danger that arises among any people and throughout the world, arises only because of the expansionist imperialist aggressive practices of Wall Street. We are against all war measures that cut the living standards of the American people, that deny the Constitution and the rights that are guaranteed by it and we are against the militarization of our youth." (u)

According to [redacted] LIMA next introduced DECCA TREUHAFI as Executive Director of the CRC in the East Bay and followed by introducing WILLIAM TAYLOR, Labor Secretary, CP, Los Angeles County. (u)

On April 30, 1951, [redacted] of unknown reliability, a former member of the Communist Party, advised that in 1943 and 1944, DECCA TREUHAFI and her husband, Attorney ROBERT TREUHAFI, were present at several Communist Party meetings in San Francisco which were composed principally of lawyers and those connected with the legal profession. (u)

On September 6, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished a signed statement identifying DECCA TREUHAFI as a member of the Ben Davis Club, CP, Alameda County in 1947. (u)

[redacted] of known reliability, has advised that during the period December 4, 1949 to May 24, 1950, TREUHAFI was observed by [redacted] to be present at a minimum of five CP meetings in Alameda County. (u)

On September 11, 1950, [redacted] stated that a meeting of the West Oakland Section Council and Committee, CP, Alameda County, was held on August 29, 1950, at the home of [redacted]. According to [redacted] at this meeting it was decided to reassign CP members of the defunct 16th A. D. Club to other clubs. [redacted] said that DECCA TREUHAFI was assigned to the Ben Davis Club and added that the Ben Davis Club was stocked with top Communist Party personnel, including [redacted] member of the Alameda CP committee and [redacted] a long-time CP member. (u)

On December 7, 1950, [redacted] said that a meeting of the West Oakland Section Council and Committee, CP, Alameda County, was held on November 16, 1950 at [redacted] According to [redacted] this meeting was held for the purpose of drawing up a schedule to be followed at the proposed West Oakland Convention to be held the first weekend in December 1950. [redacted] stated that TREUHAFI was present at the above meeting and was selected to give a report on the CRC at the proposed convention. (u)

On December 13, 1950, [redacted] said that the West Oakland Convention, CP of Alameda County was held on December 9, 1950. [redacted] TREUHAFI was present at this meeting and made a report to the delegates on the activities of the CRC. [redacted] stated that TREUHAFI talked of bigger projects for the CRC during the coming year and complained that in the past the CP had not cooperated with CRC to the fullest extent and called upon the CP to furnish the top leadership in CRC activities. [redacted] said that TREUHAFI was present at this convention as a representative of the Ben Davis Club, CP, Alameda County and was elected to serve as a delegate to the Alameda County CP Convention. (y)

On January 24, 1951, [redacted] advised that the CP Regional Convention for Alameda and Contra Costa Counties would be held in two sessions on January 27-28, 1951. On February 7, 1951, [redacted] said that the first session of the above convention was held at [redacted] on January 27, 1951. According to [redacted] TREUHAFI was in attendance at the first session as a delegate from the West Oakland Section, CP, East Bay Region. The convention was addressed by WILLIAM SCHNEIDERMAN, Chairman, District No. 13, CPUSA, according to [redacted] (w)

DECCA TREUHAFI was observed to leave 3138 Grove St., Berkeley, site of the above convention by Special Agents [redacted] (w)

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[redacted] said that the second session of the regional convention was held on January 28, 1951, at 2002 San Pablo Avenue, El Cerrito, California. According to [redacted] TREUHAFI was also present at the second session and read a report on the past work and future aspirations of the CRC. She claimed the CRC had grown to 500 members. (w)

TREUHAFI was observed to enter 2002 San Pablo Avenue, El Cerrito on the date of the above convention by Special Agents [redacted] [redacted] She was observed to leave the above meeting place by Special Agents [redacted]

On May 4, 1951, [redacted] advised that at a meeting of the West Oakland Section, CP, East Bay Region held April 7, 1951 at [redacted] a decision was reached to re-organize the section into squads. According to [redacted] TREUHAF was assigned to Squad No. 1 under the direction of [redacted] (u)

On April 15, 1952, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that a meeting would be held on April 20, 1952, at 321 Divisadero, San Francisco, address of the California Labor School. [redacted] said WILLIAM SCHNEIDERMAN, Chairman, CP, 13th District, would be present and admission to this meeting would be by written invitation only and would be closed to all but CP members. (u)

On April 20, 1952, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that DECCA TREUHAF was observed to enter [redacted] at approximately the time the above meeting was scheduled to begin. (u)

The Civil Rights Congress (CRC) has been declared by the Attorney General to be within the purview of Executive Order 9835. (u)

On May 19, 1950, [redacted] stated that TREUHAF had been named Executive Secretary of the East Bay Chapter, CRC, at a meeting of that organization held May 9, 1950 at 1740 University Ave., Berkeley. (u)

The DFW issue of August 25, 1950, page 2, columns 3-5, carried an article identifying TREUHAF as Director of the East Bay Chapter, CRC. (u)

On April 23, 1952, [redacted] said that TREUHAF was employed as Director, East Bay Chapter, CRC, 700 21st St., Oakland, California. (u)

On October 18, 1949, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that the CRC locally had raised \$9000.00 bail money for CP leaders on trial in New York with another \$1,000.00 promised. [redacted] indicated that DECCA TREUHAF was in charge of this fund. (u)

The DFW of September 6, 1951, page 8, columns 1 and 2, carried an article which set out the following information: (u)

The Burns Un-American Committee (California State Legislature) moved today to grab some of the witch hunting headlines that have recently been almost the exclusive property of Federal agencies (u)

The State Legislative Group formerly headed by Senator JACK B. TENNEY served a subpoena on DECCA TREUHAF, Director of the East Bay Civil Rights Congress ordering her to appear at San Francisco City Hall on September 11, 1951. The article quoted TREUHAF in her testimony as follows: (u)

"It is quite understandable with Progressives being arrested throughout the United States and its territories under the notorious Smith Act and with mounting Government inspired violence against the Negro people that the next organization slated for destruction would be the Civil Rights Congress.

"It is little wonder that the vicious forces behind the Burn's Committee regard CRC as a threat to their program of Fascism and war, but all their attempts to smash the people's organization are doomed to failure.

"CRC members and their progressive friends will demonstrate their determination to fight by packing the Patterson mass meeting at the Oakland Auditorium on the night of September 13."

The DPW issue of September 17, 1951, page 3, column 4, carried the following article:

"Oakland,
September 16

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"More than 400 persons gave WILLIAM L. PATTERSON, national head of the Civil Rights Congress, a standing ovation following his speech here Thursday night.

PATTERSON's talk climaxed a program which included Dr. HOLLAND ROBERTS, Director of the California Labor School and Mrs. DECCA TREUHAF, East Bay CRC Director. Both appeared before the State Senate Un-American Committee last week and are now facing possible 'contempt' citations because they stood on their constitutional rights and refused to answer some of the committee's questions."

[redacted] of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that TREUHAF was in attendance at approximately six meetings of the CRC in the East Bay Area from February 14, 1950 to June 27, 1950.

On June 26, 1950, [redacted] said that on that date AUBREY GROSSMAN, a representative of the National Office of the CRC, outlined to DECCA TREUHAF the policy of the CRC. According to [redacted] GROSSMAN stated that there is a definite agreement that the CRC shall be the defense organization for the Foley Square case, the Dennis case and similar cases; that the CRC will not do all the work but will coordinate and establish the basic program with which the CP is to work in particular areas; that if the CRC is going to be the defense organization there must be a national plan; and that the responsibility for the campaign would not rest primarily upon the CP.

[redacted] of known reliability, stated that DECCA TREUHART was in attendance at approximately eight CRC meetings in the East Bay area February 1, 1951 to May 18, 1951. (u)

On June 1, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, said that a regular meeting of the Oakland Branch of the CRC was held on May 10, 1951 at McClymonds High School, Oakland, which was attended by DECCA TREUHART and at which a speech was given by one [redacted]. (u)

According to [redacted] at the conclusion of the meeting, [redacted] stated, "We will fight for freedom of speech; do away with Jim/Crow; fair employment. We won't stop until we get what we want and what we are fighting for; do away with big business and establish a government for the people." (u)

[redacted] has been identified by [redacted] as a member of the Communist Party. (u)

On June 30, 1951, [redacted] furnished a flyer announcing that a mass protest meeting sponsored by the CRC would be held on June 29, 1951 at Norway Hall, Oakland. This flyer stated that OLETA O'CONNOR YATES, State Committeewoman, CP of California, would speak on the subject, "Say No To Fascism in America." Mrs. DECCA TREUHART, Executive Secretary of the East Bay CRC was also listed as a speaker. (u)

On June 30, 1951, [redacted] said that the above described meeting was held as scheduled and that DECCA TREUHART was in attendance and gave the collection speech. [redacted] continued that OLETA O'CONNOR YATES in her speech stated in part, "We are for the Eleven men with all our might; and don't worry the Party will build an organization. No law on earth, no one is going to stop us no matter what they do. We are here to stay and by the end of 1952 we will have an organization that none can touch because the Party has big plans ahead." (u)

[redacted] stated that YATES further said, "We are not going to stop until we get what we are working for, a progressive government with a solid foundation. The USA is trying to demand one thing, we are going to demand what we want and are going to get it. The price will not be cheap but we are willing to pay." (u)

On February 6, 1952, [redacted] furnished information reflecting that in addition to her duties as Director of the East Bay Chapter, CRC, TREUHART had been nominated and elected as a member-at-large of the Executive Board, Oakland Branch, CRC. [redacted] said TREUHART was elected to this post at a meeting of the Oakland Branch, CRC at McClymonds High School, Oakland, on January 3, 1952.

[redacted] advised that TREUHAFI was in attendance at approximately 31 meetings of the CRC in the East Bay area during the period September 15, 1949 to July 7, 1952. [redacted] said these meetings included [redacted] of the Oakland Branch and the East Bay Chapter, as well as regular meetings of the Oakland Branch. (u)

On June 7, 1951, [redacted] stated that DECCA TREUHAFI was in attendance at a meeting sponsored by the CRC in honor of PAUL ROBESON at Masonic Hall, 30th and Myrtle St., Oakland, on May 13, 1951. This meeting launched a drive for membership in the Negro Labor Council which [redacted] states was dominated to a great extent by the CP. (u)

Set out below is a portion of a speech made by PAUL ROBESON at this meeting as reported by [redacted] (u)

"He commented on the statement he made that Negroes would never fight against the Soviet Union. He said that statement was based upon his belief and not on any facts. He said that Negroes are asking themselves this question: Why should I fight against the Koreans, Chinese or any other Power? Can a Negro truthfully say that he is fighting for the preservation of freedom and democracy? You cannot give another that which you, yourself, do not possess. What does the Negro have at stake in this war? It is about time more Negroes started asking themselves this question. Why should I fight the Chinese people? Their problems are similar to ours. (the Negroes) in the United States. They are fighting for their liberation from foreign control. Here, we are fighting for our liberation. The two of us can best realize our objectives by localizing our actions. We cannot win freedom for the Negro people by fighting the Chinese in China. Our fight is here, not there. Our enemies are not the Chinese, but the ruthless characters in the South, such as RANKIN and WRIGHT and Company. I believe before long the Negro people will realize who their real enemies are and when they do they will refuse enmass to be sent overseas to fight and kill innocent people. I (PAUL ROBESON) am not going to fight an Imperialist war, nor is my son going to fight." (u)

On April 7, 1952, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that DECCA TREUHAFI was in attendance at [redacted] CRC, on February 29, 1952, at CRC Headquarters, Oakland. (u)

On March 6, 1952, [redacted] advised that a dangerous situation had developed at the home of one [redacted] San Pablo, California. [redacted] said that a large crowd of neighbors had gathered in front of the [redacted] residence on the evening of March 5, 1952, and had threatened the [redacted] family because they had moved into a previously all-white neighborhood. [redacted] advised that the [redacted] family were Negroes. (u)

[redacted] also reported DECCA TREUHAFI through the CRC was organizing patrols to guard the [redacted] family on a 24-hour basis.

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[redacted] has advised that the CRC use such incidents as that described in the preceding paragraph to promote racial intolerance and to gain publicity for the CRC.

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During March and April 1952, [redacted] furnished information reflecting that TREUHAFI as Director of the East Bay Chapter, CRC, was very active in assisting the [redacted] family, mentioned above, by organizing guards and patrols and obtaining publicity for the [redacted] family. She was reported by [redacted] to be especially critical of efforts of the proper police authorities to maintain order in the [redacted] neighborhood.

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On May 1, 1952, [redacted] advised that on April 25, 1952, TREUHAFI visited Stockton, California, for the announced purpose of organizing a chapter of the CRC in that city.

JOINT ANTI-FASCIST REFUGEE COMMITTEE (JAFRC)

The JAFRC has been declared by the Attorney General as being within the purview of Executive Order 9835.

The January 17, 1944, issue of the DPV contained an article stating that TREUHAFI had joined the staff of the JAFRC.

On August 23, 1950, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished information reflecting that from January 1, 1944 to March 15, 1944, DECCA TREUHAFI was a salaried employee of the JAFRC in San Francisco, California.

NEGRO LABOR COUNCIL (NLC)

[redacted] has advised that the NLC in the East Bay area was dominated and controlled by CP members. (4)

On January 3, 1952, [redacted] advised that TREUHART was present at a meeting of the NLC on December 6, 1951, at 7th and Center Sts., Oakland, California. (4)

III. REVOLUTIONARY STATEMENTS BY SUBJECT
SHOWING ADVOCACY OF THE OVERTHROW OF THE
GOVERNMENT BY FORCE OR VIOLENCE

A. STATEMENTS MADE

On August 26, 1946, [redacted] of known reliability, advised that TREUHART attended a meeting of the New Era Club, CP, San Francisco County, at [redacted] on August 15, 1946. According to [redacted] TREUHART reported at this meeting concerning a split within the Congress of Industrial Organizations (CIO) in California and stated that the leaders in Southern California have brought about the split but that the rank and file members of the CIO in the southern part of the state were strong for the type of leadership expounded by HARRY BRIDGES. (4)

TREUHART reported on the Party and their position on Socialism. She told the club that while the Party is struggling for the establishment of a Socialistic and classless society, the Party at that moment could not take that position and the Party at that moment was still revisionist. She stated that the Party must recruit and inspire people to work for immediate gains "for then the ultimate goal of the Party will be the overthrow of monopoly capitalism and democratic form of government that has failed up to this point." (4)

TREUHART further stated that the Party must plan and act for the defeat of President TRUMAN and his forces and those of imperialistic government. She stated that the United States is in the same position as Germany was during the rise of the Hitler forces and that the Party must not make the mistakes that the Communists made in Germany and in France. She said that only the controlling forces of the Communist Party prevented a workers revolution in this country at that time. She stated, "This is not yet the time as dictated by the ultimate Party goal." (4)

In February 1948, [redacted] advised that TREUHAF was present at a meeting of the 16th A. D. Club, CP of Alameda County at TREUHAF's residence, 675 Jean St., Oakland, on January 9, 1948. According to [redacted] a discussion was held concerning the importance of certain proposed club work. In explaining her reluctance to perform a certain task, TREUHAF stated, "I didn't think this was any emergency. I know in the event of a real Party emergency I would be right there working - such as a revolution." (u)

B. STATEMENTS MADE BY THE SUBJECT SHOWING ADHERENCE TO THE PRINCIPLES OF MARKISM-LENINISM OR OTHER REVOLUTIONARY DOCTRINES ESPOUSED BY THE COMMUNIST PARTY.

On April 4, 1949, [redacted] stated that TREUHAF was present at a public meeting of the Alameda County CP on March 25, 1949 at Norway Hall, Oakland. (u)

On March 28, 1949, [redacted] the public meeting mentioned in the preceding paragraph. [redacted] said that WILLIAM SCHNEIDERMAN, Chairman, CP, State of California, was the principal speaker on the topic, "Who Are The Traitors?" and quoted SCHNEIDERMAN as follows: (u)

"It (Atlantic Pact) was a plan to send American soldiers, sailors and flyers abroad in a dozen countries to establish military bases so that anything that happens anywhere will involve the United States in war without the authority of Congress. The Communist Party will not support any unjust war that is aimed against the working class or against the individuals of any nation."

He stated, "The Communist Party has been misquoted in the idea that it would support Russia in the event Russia should attack the United States. The Party really stated that first and foremost we must fight against any war; that the two forms of government can exist side by side and war is not inevitable. FOSTER and DENNIS say that if in spite of the efforts of the Communist Party, the men in Wall St. are able to plunge us into a war, we will oppose it as a capitalistic war and do everything to bring such a war to a speedy conclusion on the basis of a democratic peace. In case we fail in the fight for peace, we will continue to struggle against war even if it breaks out. We have no blueprint as to how it can be done but nevertheless can state our position. We will express our political opposition to such a war and even as Lincoln and as other great Americans did who were not in theory Communists and revolutionaries in the sense that we Communists are." (u)

[redacted] corroborated information contained in the preceding two paragraphs. (u)

IV. ALL OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE SUBJECT
INDICATING FURTHERANCE OF THE PROGRAM
OF THE CP AND RELATED GROUPS

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A. SPEECHES

On August 17, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that TREUHAFI appeared as a speaker at a CRC meeting at Norway Hall, Oakland, on June 29, 1951. According to [redacted] the theme of the meeting was to protest the Smith Act convictions of top CP leaders. [redacted] said that OLETA O'CONNOR YATES was the principal speaker at this meeting. (u)

[redacted] has identified OLETA O'CONNOR YATES as Organizational Secretary, CP, State of California. (u)

The "Daily People's World" issue of January 31, 1951, page 6, columns 3 to 5, carried the following article which is quoted in part: (u)

"Resolutions calling on the government to drop Contempt of Congress charges against WILLIAM PATTERSON, national Civil Rights Congress leader and editor of 'We Charge Genocide' were unanimously adopted by mass meetings in Seattle and Portland over the weekend. (u)

"At both meetings DECCA TREUHAFI, Oakland, California CRC leader who led a delegation of women to Mississippi on behalf of WILLIE MCGEE, received a standing ovation. Mrs. TREUHAFI said the delegation went into the South to 'challenge the 'rape myth' and to expose those white supremacists who hide their crimes behind the skirts of white women.' (u)

"Applause greeted Mrs. TREUHAFI again when she said that history will record 'WILLIAM PATTERSON as man of the year for 1951.'" (u)

On September 14, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, said TREUHAFI appeared as a speaker at a mass meeting of the CRC held September 13, 1951 at Oakland Auditorium, Oakland. According to [redacted] WILLIAM PATTERSON, a national functionary of the CRC, was the featured speaker and made the following statements: (u)

"If there are any FBI agents in the audience and I am sure there are, I say this for their benefit. I hate the United States Government and all it stands for. I know that I and others will be arrested. We may (u)

be arrested by twos or threes or in groups of twelve or more, but when we are incarcerated there will be more here to take our places." (u)

On November 5, 1951, [redacted] advised that TREUHAFI was the principal speaker at a membership meeting of the Oakland Branch, CRC held on October 2, 1951 at McClymonds High School, Oakland. [redacted] said that in her speech TREUHAFI made an appeal for new members in the CRC. (u)

On March 5, 1952, [redacted] furnished a copy of a CRC report on the Third Annual Conference of the East Bay Chapter, CRC, captioned, "A Fighting Program for Civil Rights." The report was published by the East Bay CRC, 700 21st St., Oakland, California. (u)

This report reflected that the conference was held on November 24, 1951, was attended by more than sixty delegates and claimed to be a tremendous success, both organizationally and socially. The report set out that DECCA TREUHAFI, Director, East Bay Chapter, CRC, chaired the conference and acted as keynote speaker, devoting her speech largely to outlining the background and history of the CRC from its original organization to its present day activities. (u)

On March 26, 1952, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished information concerning a meeting held by the California Emergency Defense Committee (CEDC) at Shriner's Temple, 7th and Henry Sts., Oakland, on March 8, 1952. [redacted] reported the meeting was called by the East Bay Division of the CEDC, whose purpose was the defense of the fifteen Communists on trial in Los Angeles for violation of the Smith Act. [redacted] said that [redacted] and MICKEY LIMA, two of the fifteen Communists on trial at Los Angeles, were featured speakers on the program. DECCA TREUHAFI also appeared as a speaker and according to [redacted] her speech consisted principally of a summary of CRC activities on behalf of [redacted] a negro veteran who had purchased a home in an all-white neighborhood in Rollingwood, San Pablo, California. (u)

[redacted] has advised that the CEDC in the East Bay Area is dominated and controlled by Communist Party members. (u)

B. WRITINGS

On July 21, 1948, [redacted] of known reliability, made available a bulletin entitled, "Pre-Convention Discussion Bulletin No. 3," issued by the California State Committee CP, 942 Market St., San Francisco, on July 10, 1948. (u)

This bulletin contains an article captioned, "Party's Tasks Require Improvement in Financial Work" and is signed "DECCA". DECCA is believed to be identical with the subject of this case. (u)

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C. PERTINENT CONTACTS BETWEEN THE SUBJECT AND LEADERS OF THE PARTY

On May 4, 1951, [Redacted] said that a celebration in honor of PETTIS PERRY, National Chairman of the Negro Commission, CPUSA, was held on April 21, 1951, at the home of [Redacted]. According to [Redacted] PETTIS PERRY was the featured speaker and most of the speakers in attendance were members of the CP. [Redacted] said that DECCA TREUHAFI attended this celebration. (u)

On April 3, 1952, [Redacted] of known reliability, advised that at a public meeting held March 8, 1952, at 7th and Henry Sts., Oakland, TREUHAFI appeared on the speakers' platform with LORETTA STARVUS STACK and MICKEY LIMA, two CP leaders on trial at that time in Los Angeles for violation of the Smith Act. (u)

D. ATTENDANCE AT TRAINING SCHOOLS OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY

On March 11, 1946, [Redacted] advised that TREUHAFI attended a Leadership Institute sponsored by the CP at Redmen's Hall, San Francisco, on March 10, 1946. (u)

On March 22, 1948, [Redacted] of known reliability, said that TREUHAFI attended a Club Leadership Institute held March 12, 1948, at [Redacted] home of [Redacted]. (u)

In March 1948, [Redacted] said that TREUHAFI attended a Club Leadership Institute on March 14, 1948 at Norway Hall, Oakland. (u)

[Redacted] have advised that the Marxist-Leninist Institute, later known as the Emil Rabin Institute, was a school operated (u)

in Alameda County for selected CP members for purposes of training in secondary leadership. [redacted] advised that the school started in April 1949 and continued for approximately a year. (u)

In 1949 and 1950, [redacted] reported that TREUHART was in regular attendance at classes of the Marxist Institute in Alameda County during that period. (u)

[redacted] advised that during the period January 25, 1950 to March 29, 1950 TREUHART attended seven meetings of the Emil Rabin Institute, all at [redacted] home of [redacted] (u)

On April 13, 1950, [redacted] advised that during 1949, TREUHART was a student at the Marxist Institute which met principally at 263 12th St., Oakland, California. (u)

V. MISCELLANEOUS

The "San Francisco Examiner" in the American Weekly Section for October 27, 1946, carried the following article concerning the subject and her family. (u)

"Once upon a time there lived in England a lord and lady who might have been called the happiest parents in the land. (u)

"They were Lord and Lady Redesdale, surname FREEMAN-MITFORD. (u)

"There were six beautiful daughters in the MITFORD home, bearing six lovely names: UNITY, JESSICA, NANCY, PAMELA, DIANA and DEBORAH. (u)

"In addition there was one son, who might have been called a special blessing in this tranquil household. (u)

"Then one day, politics crept down the chimney of this ideal home. Insidiously various 'isms' pried into the sanctity of the household and took hold of the lives of the MITFORDS. (u)

"The only son, who had great stability, apparently escaped the clutches of new doctrines, but he later gave his life in the war. (u)

"UNITY, with the fanatic devotion she developed for HITLER, was the first noticeable political casualty. Eventually she got a disabling bullet in her head. (u)

"From that unhappy beginning, three of the glamorous British sisters seem to have run the gamut from Communism to Fascism. (u)

"JESSICA has only recently rocked the home foundations by contributing \$2,000 to the 'London Daily Worker,' a Communist paper. (u)

"NANCY, who is the wife of the Hon. PETER RODD, son of Lord and Lady RENNELL, and a prominent British socialist, contributed her bit to the family eccentricity when she published a book lampooning the British aristocracy. (u)

"'Pursuit of Happiness' deals with a fictional family almost as impetuous as NANCY's own turned out to be. (u)

"Meanwhile PAMELA married the son of a baronet in 1928. (u)

"DEBORAH, the youngest, married Second Lieutenant Lord ANDREW CAVENDISH of the Coldstream Guards, and son of the Duke and Duchess of Devonshire, early in the war, and lives as quietly as a Marchioness can. (u)

"It was DIANA, UNITY and JESSICA who leaped out into the spotlight of politics and eccentricity, dragging their dignified father and their Victorian mother along with them. UNITY started it by lunching with a paperhanger named HITLER in Munich one summer afternoon 15 years ago. (u)

"Not long after that UNITY, whose middle name was WALKYRIE, was seen everywhere with the Nazi bigwigs. Soon after, her elder sister, DIANA, who had been married to the son of Lord MOYNE in as ornate a wedding as London's Mayfair ever saw, but who divorced him later on grounds of infidelity joined her in Berlin. (u)

"The two tall, beautiful, blond sisters were the toast of Berlin, each wearing huge swastikas signed on the back by HITLER himself. They even persuaded their father and mother to attend the Nazi Congress at Nuremberg. DIANA was married secretly in the home of Propaganda Minister GOEBBELS to Sir OSWALD MOSLEY, of the British Union of Fascists. (u)

"When the war broke out, Lady MOSLEY was in England. She and her husband were detained by British wartime regulations and lived, together with her children, now three, in an apartment in Holloway jail. (u)

"UNITY, however, stayed in Germany with her ideal, ADOLF. This sojourn in her beloved enemy's country was cut short, however, by a mysterious bullet. Though denying all knowledge of it, the Nazis cared for her by HITLER's direct command. The two warring governments soon afterwards (u)

made arrangements to get UNITY home. Her father met the boat, took the muffled figure in charge, and sent her to an isolated community in Scotland. (u)

"Lord REDESDALE, convinced of his mistake in following his daughter's political ideas, returned to London in spite of the blitz. (u)

"That leaves JESSICA. In 1937 she was the storm center of three countries, as members of her family, the consular service, and reporters followed her trail. JESSICA had eloped with ESMOND ROMILLY, who already had developed a reputation as a left-wing warrior and writer, and was on her way to war-torn Spain. (u)
reference to book

"The various entourages finally caught up with the lovers in Bayonne, France. There JESSICA, in an old hat and brown suit, was married to ROMILLY, in the British consulate. The bride and groom took off right away for Dieppe, where they honeymooned and ROMILLY wrote a book on Spain in two weeks. (u)

"Later they came to America, where both got jobs, and lived happily and quietly until the war. ROMILLY immediately joined the Royal Canadian Air Force, and was shot down over the North Sea. (u)

"JESSICA's whereabouts were a secret to strangers until the strange bequest of money to the Communist paper was revealed. Then it was learned that she had married ROBERT TREUHAF, had lived in the Greenwich Village section of New York until two years ago and had a son named for Marshal Tito of Yugoslavia. (u)

"Now they are living in San Francisco, where JESSICA has been an OPA investigator. TREUHAF, an attorney, is a member of a firm which represents CIO unions. Both are active in the National Citizens Political Action Committee, which is somewhat more left than the CIO's PAC." (u)

[redacted] of known reliability, has advised that WILLIE MCGEE was a Negro youth held in Jackson, Mississippi awaiting execution after being convicted of the crime of rape. (u)

On March 1, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, stated that DECCA TREUHAF was one of a four women delegation from the East Bay Area which would visit Jackson, Mississippi, to participate in a demonstration in behalf of WILLIE MCGEE. (u)

On September 20, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, furnished two photographs of the subject when she appeared in a picket line in front of the United States Post Office, San Francisco, California, on that date. [redacted] learned that the picketing occurred during the noon (u)

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recess of the U. S. Circuit Court of Appeals which was hearing appeals by defense attorneys in connection with lower bail for fifteen CP leaders who were incarcerated in Los Angeles for violation of the Smith Act. (4)

On November 3, 1951, [redacted] of known reliability, reported TREUHAFI participated in a picket line in front of the U. S. Post Office, San Francisco, on September 20, 1951. [redacted] said this picket line was sponsored by the CP in protest of high bail for certain arrested CP leaders. (CW)



In view of the foregoing this matter is being RUC'D at this time. In the event that information concerning the subjects is developed in the future the Bureau will be immediately advised. Inasmuch as the foregoing information is entirely negative, no dissemination is being made locally.


