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

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He indicated that he expects to depart from the port of New York during 8/55 for a proposed four weeks' stay abroad. He further indicated that their means of transportation was via a steamship, and they expect to visit England and Scotland. The purpose of the trip was to visit his/wife's family and for the settlement of his wife's estate. ROBERT TREUHAFT/was described as being 519", black hair, brown eyes, no distinguishing marks or scars, and his occupation was shown as that of a lawyer. MS. ESMOND MARK

DAVID KOMILLU In part two of his application, TREUHAFT requested his passport include his wife, JESSICA LUCY TREUHAFT, who was born in Batsford Manor, Glos, England, on 9/11/17. His wife's maiden name was shown as JESSICA LUCY FREEMAN MITFORD. She was formerly married to ESMOND MARK DAVID DOMILLY at Bayonne, France, the date of which was not shown. His wife was maturalized as a citizen of the United States before United States District Court at San Francisco, California, on 1/3/hh. It/was also requested that his passport include his children.

He stated that his last American passport was obtained in San Francisco. California, 1950, which passport was mailed to the Department of State, Washington, D. C., with an application for its renewal in 3/54. He claimed this trip was cancelled, and that his passport was never returned to him. The passport which was issued to ROBERT TREUHAFT during 1950 also included his wife. JESSICA TREUHAFT.

The passport file also reflects that ROBERT E TREUHAFT was issued passport #310752 on 6/20/50, which passport also included his wife, JESSICA LUCY TREUHAFT and their child, Their permanent residence at the time that the passport was issued was 675 Jean Street, Oakland, California, and their mailing address was the same. Their passport application which was executed prior to the issuance of their passport disclosed that they planned to depart New York City on 9/5/50 aboard the "S S New Amsterdam" for a six weeks stay in England. The purpose of their trip was to visit his wife's parents.


The passport file further reflects that on 12/8/53, ROBERT E. TREUHAFT executed a passport renewal application for his passport #310752 which passport was issued to him originally on 6/20/50. In this renewal, he stated, that they expect to depart from the port of New York during 1/54 for a one-month stay in England.

It was noted that his passport renewal application showed that his fee was returned to him on 2/16/54 and that passport #310752 was maintained in his passport file at the Passport Office, Department of State.

The file reflects that by letter dated 2/2/55, the Immigration and Naturalization Service, Washington, D. C., advised the Passport Office, Department of State, that they were conducting an investigation of the subject, looking forward to possible revocation of her citizenship. It was requested of the Passport Office that a Consular Investigation be conducted in England, in order that the Communist Party connections and activities of JESSICA LUCY TREUHAFT and her first husband, ESMOND ADMILLY, could be determined prior to FRENCE their entry into this country in 1939. It was further requested that any records bearing upon their affiliation be Photostated, and that sworn statements be taken from any persons found competent to testify regarding this matter. A letter dated 4/1/55 to the INS from the Passport Office, Department of State, advised that the Embassy at London has mot in the past informed the Department of State in connection with similar cases; that the British authorities are not prepared to undertake direct questioning of individuals in the United Kingdom who are not American citizens regarding past political beliefs and associations of persons now in the United States who the INS appears to believe may be subject to deportation. It was further stated that the British authorities will not even in the behalf of their own Government question British subjects with respect to the political beliefs and affiliations. Embassy has pointed out that it is very reluctant to approach known American Nationals in the United Kingdom and to question them overthere regarding their knowledge of the political affiliations and associations of persons now in the United States who are suspected of having Communist beliefs.





III. OTHER ACTIVITIES OF THE SUBJECT INDICATING FURTHERANCE OF PROGRAM OF SUBVERSIVE ORGANIZATIONS WITH WHICH ASSOCIATED

On December 6, 1954, made available a mimeographed letter from the East Bay CRC, 700 - 21st Street, Oakland, California, dated November 26, 1954, and carrying the typewritten name "DECCA TREUHAFT, Executive Secretary," as the writer. This letter pertained to the November 20 rejailing of WILLIAM L. PATTERSON for failure to submit the names of contributors to the CRC. This letter also contained a "partial reprint of article from 'Pittsburgh Courier,' of November 20, 1954," which, according to the letter, "...focuses national attention upon the Government's persecution of WILLIAM L. PATTERSON...."

"Last Friday, November 20, Mr. PATTERSON was AGAIN imprisoned. Only a few weeks after his release from Danbury Prison (described in the enclosed article) he was sentenced to serve another 90 days for the same alleged offense--failure to turn over to the Government the names of contributors to CRC.

"Mr. PATTERSON has testified that the records sought by the Government no longer exist; therefore, he cannot comply with their demand. He has also stated that he would under no circumstances become an informer against those who gave to civil rights causes.

"The U. S. Constitution expressly forbids that a person be held in double jeopardy--yet the Government seeks to hold WILLIAM L. PATTERSON in perpetual jeopardy by citing him in contempt of court because of his failure to produce non-existent records.



"The basic rights of every organization, and of every American are linked to the fate of WILLIAM L. PATTERSON; for if he can be arbitrarily imprisoned at the whim of the Attorney General, having committed no crime, so can any one of us.

"We urge you to take these steps in defense of democracy:

- "l. Write or wire Attorney General HERBERT BROWNELL JR., uring that Mr. PATTERSON be freed.
- "2. Send funds to help in the fight to free Mr. PATTERSON.

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"We would much appreciate being informed of any action you may decide to take."

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

She stated that a passport was issued to her within twenty-four hours and she was treated with every courtesy. She then explained that upon arrival in New York on November 30, on theiliberte, the person responsible for stamping on theiliberte, the person responsible for stamping the passports confiscated her passport and refused to make any explanation except to state that he was funded orders from the State Department. TREUHAFT requested

in this letter the immediate return of her passport and a prompt explanation of the incident.

On March 6, 1956, the Passport Office wrote to the Subject at 574 - 61st Street, Oakland, California, explaining to her that Passport 7364, issued on October 25, 1955, at the American Embassy in Paris, was taken up upon her return to the United States, since the Department of State had received information which indicated that she was ineligible under Section 51.135 of the of the Passport Regulations to continue to receive passport facilities. (This Section relates to limitations on issuance on passports to persons supporting the communist movement.) TREUHAFT was informed in this letter that consideration would be given to the matter of returning this passport if she would furnish an affidavit of the nature outlined in Section 51.142 of the Regulations. The letter stated that if the Subject were at any time a member of the Communist Party or the Communist Political Association, she should include in her affidavis the dates of membership and the description of the offices or other positions that she might have held therein, and if her membership terminated, under what conditions such termination occurred.







The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case (NCSJRC) maintains national headquarters in Room D, 940 Broadway, New York City, and the mail box serving this organization is labeled "Sobell Committee".

JULIUS and FTHEL ROSENBERG and MORTON SOBELL were convicted in the United States District Court, Southern District of New York, on March 29, 1951, of conspiracy to commit espionage on behalf of the Soviet Union. ROSENBERG were legally executed at Sing Sing Prison, Ossining, New York, on June 19, 1953, and MORTON SOBELL is currently serving his sentence at the United States Penitentiary, Alcatraz, California.

HOWARD RUSHMORE, a newspaper reporter with the "New York Journal American", advised in January, 1952, that the NCSJRC was formed on January 2, 1952 for the purpose of obtaining a new trial for the ROSENBERGS.

A source advised on May 9, 1956, that the NCSJRC was attempting to keep alive the Rosenberg Case and to fight for the release of MORTON SOBELL. The source stated that the Communist Party took an extremely active part in assisting the Committee.


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

A review of the file in the Passport Office of the Department of State on January 20, 1959, reflects that on December 2, 1958, United States Passport Number 1269760 was issued to ROBERT EDWARD TREUHAFT, based on his application at San Francisco, California, on October 9, 1958. On February 11, 1959, a source of this Office advised that in mid January, 1959, JESSICA TREUHAFT had informed him that she planned to visit Europe some time in March, 1959, further indicating she intended to take her daughter, who is in school in New York, and her son with her. It was not indicated that ROBERT EDWARD TREUHAFT planned to make the trip.

JESSICA LUCY TREUHAFT was born September 11, 1917 at Morton-Marsh, England. She attended Sorbonne, Paris, France, receiving a diploma in December 1934. In 1937 she reportedly ran away from home and joined the Spanish Loyelists in Spain. later marrying ESMOND ROMILLY, a nephew of Sir WINSTON CHURCHILL, at Bayonne, France. She entered the U.S. at New York City, New York, on March 2, 1939. In 1941. ESMOND ROMILLY was killed while serving in the Royal Canadian Air Force and she was married to ROBERT EDWARD TREUHAFT at Guerneville, California, on June 21, 1943. JESSICA TREUHAFT was naturalized in U.S. District Court, San Francisco, California, on January 3, 1944.

On January 15, 1944, DECCA TREUHAFT was reported a new member of the Southside Club, Professional Group, Communist Party of San Francisco, and to have previously been active in Communist Party affairs, waiting until she received her citizenship before joining.

JESSICA TREUHAFT was reportedly employed by the Office of the Joint Anti-Fascist Refugee Committee in San Francisco, and as Financial Director of the Oakland Branch of the California Labor School in 1944.

In 1946, she was reported to be the Financial Director of the San Francisco County, California, Communist Party. She was a paid employee of the Communist Party of San Francisco from Fall, 1945 to Fall, 1948, inclusive. In October, 1946, JESSICA TREUHAFT was reported President of the Twin Peaks Club, Communist Party, San Francisco County, California.

JESSICA TREUHAFT transferred from the Twin Peaks Club, Communist Party, San Francisco County to the Communist Party, Alameda County, California, on July 15, 1947, where she attended meetings of the 16th A.D. Club. In July, 1949 she was reported to have left this club to work in the East Bay Chapter of the Civil Rights Club. JESSICA TREUHAFT was elected as Executive Secretary and Director of the East Bay Civil Rights Congress in May, 1950.

In September, 1950, TREUMAFT was assigned to the Ben Davis Club, Alameda County Communist Party, and in 1950 attended both Sectional and Regional Communist Party Conventions. In 1953 she was reported to be an active member of the D.T. Club, West Cakland Section, Alameda County Communist Party.

JESSICA TREUHAFT offered her resignation as Executive Secretary of the East Bay Chapter of the Civil Rights Congress and it was accepted at a meeting of the Executive Board of that group in March, 1955.

During late 1956 a book written by JESSICA TREUHAFT, entitled "Lifeitselfmanship, or How to Become a Precisely - Because Man; An Investigation into Current L (Or Left Wing) Usage," was introduced for sale to benefit the "Daily People's World" Fund Drive, of which she was reported to be the East Bay Regional Director.

The "People's World", formerly known as the "Daily People's World" prior to February, 1957, is a west coast communist newspaper published in San Francisco, California.

During July, 1956 and March, 1957, TREUHAFT was reported to be the Organizational Secretary of a Professional Group of the Communist Party, East Bay Region (Alameda and Contra Costa Counties, California). She attended meetings of the convention of the Communist Party, East Bay Region, held in Oakland and Berkeley, California, in January, 1957; the convention of the Communist Party, State of California, held in Los Angeles, California, in February, 1957; the convention of the Communist Party, USA, held in New York City in February, 1957; and the convention of the Communist Party, Northern District of California, held in San Francisco in April, 1957.

TREUHAFT was also in attendance at a conference of the Communist Party, East Bay Region, in December, 1957. She was reported to have resigned from the Communist Party with her husband in April, 1958.

In addition to the above noted activity, TREUHAFT has, within this same time, been active in behalf of or has attended meetings and social affairs of numerous other groups, including the "Daily People's World" and "People's World", the California Labor School, the California Emergency Defense Committee and the National Negro Labor Council. Since she reportedly resigned from the Communist Party, she has held a Book Fair in her home in November, 1958 to benefit the "People's World".



"1. Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel & Julius Rosenberg in June, 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' co-defendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case --A Communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States--was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October, 1953, and 'then as National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg Case.' National headquarters remained at 1050 - 6th Avenue, New York City. Co-chairman of the newest organization were Daniel Marshall and Joseph Brainin.

"(Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, 'Trial by Treason: The National Committee to Secure Justice for the Rosenbergs and Morton Sobell,' August 25, 1956, pp. 118 and 120; also cited in Annual Report for 1955, House Report 1648, January 17, 1956, originally released January 11, 1956, p. 30.)"

A confidential source advised on January 4, 1957, that there was no difference between the Bay Area Council of Sobell Committees (BACSC), formed to manage committees in and around the San Francisco Bay area, and the Northern California Council of Sobell Committees (NCCSC), formed to manage committees in the rest of Northern California.

A second confidential source advised on May 5, 1959, that the BACSC is affiliated with the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell. The source stated that the BACSC is continuing to function and plan future Sobell affairs.

BAY AREA COUNCIL OF SOBELL COMMITTEES

A source advised on October 31, 1955, that the Bay Area Council of Sobell Committees (BACSC) was formed on October 17, 1955, in San Francisco, California, as the local affiliate of the National Sobell Committee, to carry out the policies of the National Committee to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOBELL.

On November 25, 1959, a second source advised that the BACSC, also referred to as the Northern California Council of Sobell Committees, is one and the same, and their headquarters is located at 345 Franklin Street, San Francisco, California, and is continuing to function and plan future Sobell affairs.

On December 18, 1959, a third source advised that MARY KRVAR, a member of the Warehouse Club, Communist Party (CP), East Bay Region, Oakland, California, and the paid organizer for the BACSC, has stated that the CP is interested in controlling the BACSC so that the BACSC will continue to follow the line of the National Sobell Committee in attempting to obtain the freedom of MORTON SOBELL.

On April 25, 1960, the second source advised that the BACSC was still active and planning future Sobell activities.

"Following the execution of atomic spies Ethel and Julius Rosenberg in June 1953, the 'Communist campaign assumed a different emphasis. Its major effort centered upon Morton Sobell,' the Rosenbergs' codefendant. The National Committee to Secure Justice in the Rosenberg Case - a communist front which had been conducting the campaign in the United States - was reconstituted as the National Rosenberg-Sobell Committee at a conference in Chicago in October 1953 and 'then as the National Committee to Secure Justice for Morton Sobell in the Rosenberg case'...."
