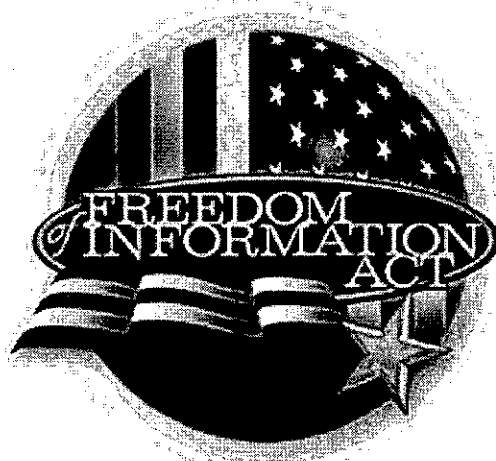

WHERE'S HOFFA? THE ANATOMY OF A HOAX

A convict named Donald Frankos, who peddled a story last fall claiming that former Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa is entombed in New Jersey's Giants Stadium, appears to have pulled one of the most expensive hoaxes since editors scrambled after the spurious "Hiller Diaries."

In a magazine interview that Frankos is following up with a book for which William Morrow & Co. and Avon Books are paying a reported \$300,000, the self-described Mafia associate was portrayed as being under "extraordinary" government protection following a "long series of [federal] debriefings and lie-detector tests" regarding his grisly account of Hoffa's demise.

Jimmy Coonan, New York's Irish gang leader, shot and dismembered Hoffa, Frankos told the magazine, asserting that he'd been asked to kill the missing labor leader himself. "I took a lie-detector test with the F.B.I. concerning Jimmy Hoffa and I passed it with flying colors," Frankos bragged.

Justice Department spokesperson Jo Krozisky denies, however, that the convict has been receiving the protection recounted in the magazine. Far from treating him as a highly regarded witness, explain federal law-enforcement officials familiar with his case, the F.B.I. doubts his

credibility, since he gave agents a different account of Hoffa's purported burial site—and at press time had refused to take a lie-detector examination, protesting that he was "too busy."

An official says, "I think if he took a polygraph, he'd throw ink all over the walls. He told the F.B.I. that Hoffa was disposed of in an area of New Jersey that is now a shopping center," says the official. "He made no mention of Giants Stadium. In the past three years, he has given two or

knowledge of countless killings, none of which had anything to do with Hoffa, recalls Sonnenschein. Learning that I was inquiring about his latest recollections, Frankos made several collect calls to me from jail. He confided that he was "in the process of making [an] agreement" to sell yet another variation on his Hoffa theme to an unidentified media organization. In return for "a lot of money," he will tell this organization the location of Hoffa's body.

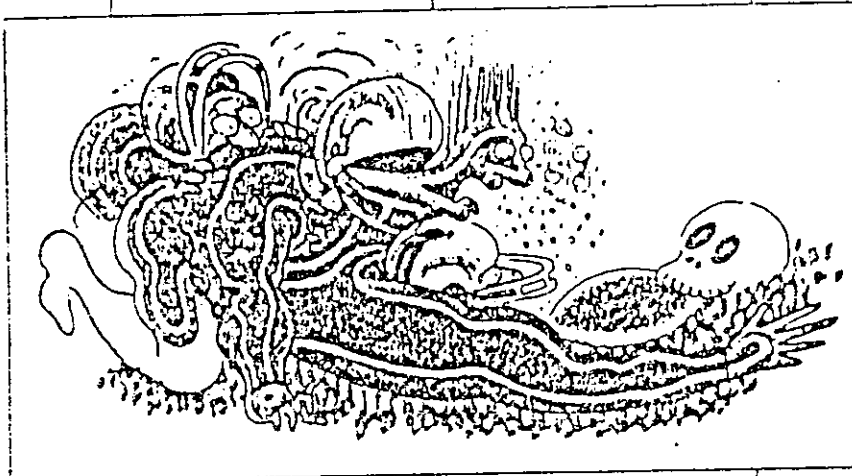
not in the right place," he told me. "It's in that vicinity, but not the right place, no. . . . I didn't say everything in *Playboy*. . . . I'm a gambling man."

"[The correct burial location] was my ace in the hole," Frankos said. The purchaser of his latest story will excavate Hoffa's remains by April 1990, he added. Asked by the F.B.I. why he had changed the burial location from a shopping mall to the stadium, Frankos replied that he was "saving the best for last"

and offered to escort agents on a dig at the stadium. They declined.

"If we'd thought he was truthful, we'd have been digging three years ago," says a federal official. "Frankos is the last guy the mob would pick for a major hit like Hoffa. He's just a low-level hood."

A Giants Stadium official,

Moreover, Frankos, who is serving 25 years to life for the murder of a Yonkers marijuana dealer, approached *Penthouse* Special Features Editor Allan Sonnenschein about three years ago, unsuccessfully attempting to persuade *Penthouse* to buy his life story. He said he had

Based on its interview with Frankos, *Playboy* magazine has already published a Giants Stadium chart with an X where the former Teamsters chieftain was supposedly interred, "right in the cement" between the 20-yard line and the west end zone—the "coffin corner," in football jargon. Since the mob ran the cement-mixing business, they were able to ship the body into the stadium, which was under construction at the time, Frankos had told the magazine. "Of course [the X] is

John Samerjan, doesn't buy Frankos's story for another reason. He has his construction details totally wrong. Hoffa can't be buried in "the cement" because, Samerjan says, "There never was cement under the playing field. Under the artificial turf there's a layer of a special asphalt, under that is crushed stone, and under that is compacted clay."

Frankos pleaded with me to accept that with the exception of that misleading X, he has been consistently truthful. Federal authorities

are lying about him, he claimed, because he is suing them for relocating him to a prison that was unsafe for him.

"Be extra careful with what you print, because if it's a lie, I'm going to get your ass," he counseled. "Be careful, Sharon, I'm telling you now. Take it as a warning, whatever, a threat. . . . You be extremely careful about what you print. I don't play no games in no courtrooms.

"I want you to know this. You can take this as a threat. I don't play no games now. I'm giving you fair warning. . . . That's a threat now."

After the F.B.I. became aware of this conversation, Frankos phoned me in a conciliatory mood. "I never threatened you," he said. He'd merely meant that he might sue me for libel.

He asked about my background.

"I'm a freelance writer, like you were a freelance hit man," I told him.

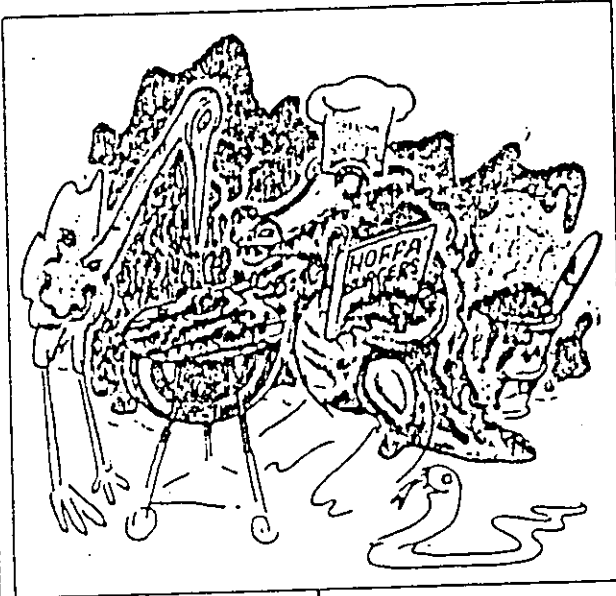
"I wasn't a freelance hit man," he demurred.

I reminded him that in his magazine interview he contended that he was one of the "freelance hitters" whom Genovese family kingpin Anthony "Fat Tony" Salerno initially asked to kill Hoffa. The working title of his "file story," which writer William Holtzman and Lake Headley—a private investigator who undertook the "verification" of the *Playboy* interview—are under contract to write with him, is "Contract Killer."

"I'm a reformed freelance hit man," Frankos corrected me.

As it happens, a Manhattan law-enforcement official has been probing the convict's claim that he had ties to Gambino family god-

father John Gotti as well as Fat Tony. "We haven't been able to verify that he worked for either of them," the official told me at press time.

An F.B.I. agent, frustrated by Frankos's refusal to be polygraphed, came up with another idea for testing the convict's veracity—Francis F. "Mickey" Featherstone.

Featherstone was Jimmy Coonan's right-hand man

in the Westies when that Irish gang was terrorizing Manhattan's Hell's Kitchen (see "West Side Story," by Nick Tosches, *Penthouse*, October 1988). Turning state's evidence in 1986, Featherstone provided the key testimony that led to Coonan's conviction on racketeering and conspiracy charges involving murder, kidnapping, loan-sharking, extortion, bookmaking, and tax evasion.

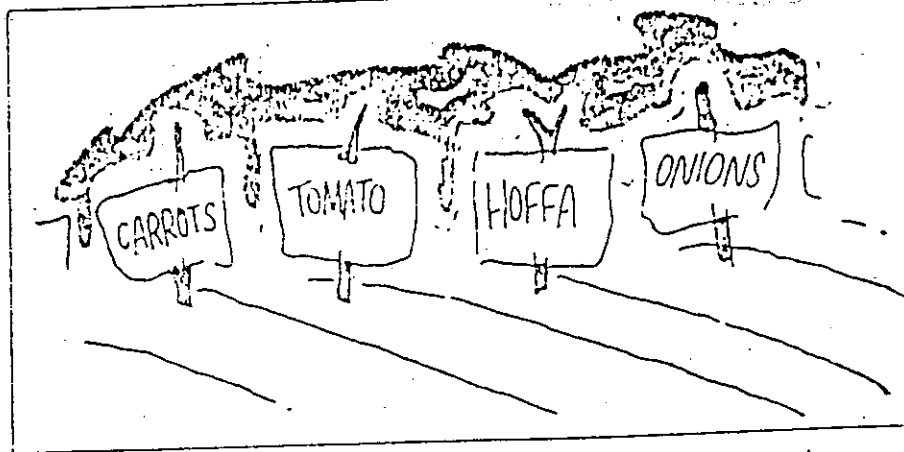
So yes, Coonan, now serving 75 years, is not the sort of man you'd take to a chichi cocktail party. As Frankos could have learned from any news report, Coonan hacked up bodies in exactly the manner Frankos described in *Playboy*'s Hoffa saga.

The F.B.I. agent reasons that if Coonan whacked Hoffa, he would have regaled Featherstone with details. Coonan told Featherstone everything. The agent put Frankos's story on Featherstone.

His response? "Mickey laughed," says a federal law-enforcement official.

To understand the complexities of the riddle that Donald Frankos purports to have solved, you have to start by understanding Jimmy Hoffa, say the FBI-organized-crime experts who still carry the union leader's disappearance as an open case in their files.

Hoffa is often remembered solely as Robert Kennedy's nemesis, a titan on an Olympian scale who owed his power to Mafia. But, more than that, Hoffa was a maverick—a maverick whose first



ambitions eventually would outstrip his common sense. After Richard Nixon arranged his 1971 parole from the federal prison where he had been incarcerated for jury-tampering and looting union pension funds, Hoffa began showing such open contempt for a top mob stooge—his onetime assistant, Frank Fitzsimmons—that the F.B.I. experts believe he signed his own death warrant.

Fitzsimmons, who died of cancer in 1981, had taken the Teamsters helm—as a caretaker, Hoffa expected—while Hoffa was in the penitentiary. But organized crime liked Fitzsimmons. While Hoffa had doled out the graft himself, Fitzsimmons, distracted by perks like private jets that Hoffa had despised, delegated responsibility. During Fitzsimmons's reign, the mob would skim whatever it wanted from union coffers, says an F.B.I. investigator.

Teamsters cohorts like Anthony "Tony Pro" Provenzano—the Genovese mobster who controlled the New Jersey Teamsters with his two brothers—were distressed, investigators surmise, when Hoffa began to make noises about regaining the union presidency. He even threatened to sing to the government about Fitzsimmons's corruption.

From evidence that includes a notation in Hoffa's calendar, the F.B.I. deduces that Anthony "Tony Jack" Giacalone, a Detroit crime nabcb, helped lure the renegade ex-union boss to his death, inviting Hoffa to meet him and Provenzano on July 30, 1975, at the Machus Red Fox, a restaurant in a Detroit suburb, for a peace powwow. At



about 2:30 p.m. that day, Hoffa phoned his wife from the restaurant to say that neither Giacalone nor Provenzano had shown up.

Those were his last known words and, though he has been declared legally dead, his body has never been found, prompting mystery bulls, kooks, and other parties ranging from Teamsters aides to concerned citizens to bombard the F.B.I. over the years with "solutions" to the case. A Hoffa attorney even claimed that the disappearance had to do with the ex-Teamsters boss's alleged participation in the C.I.A.'s bungled plots to assassinate Fidel Castro.

The most generally accepted theory of Hoffa's passing was put to a 1975 grand jury by the F.B.I. The agency conjectured that Hoffa was enticed from the Machus Red Fox by a trusted protégé, whom he'd raised as a son, Charles "Chuckie" O'Brien. The F.B.I. theorized that O'Brien

picked him up at the restaurant in a maroon Mercury owned by Giacalone's son, ostensibly to the delayed sit-down with Giacalone and Provenzano.

Instead, according to one F.B.I. theory, O'Brien drove Hoffa to a meeting with at least two Provenzano operatives—Salvatore "Sally Bugs" Briguglio and either his brother, Gabriel, or a gangster named Thomas Andretta. Hoffa was slain shortly thereafter, the F.B.I. believes. "Who actually did the hit is pure speculation," says an F.B.I. expert.

Many years later, this missing link in the theory would set the stage for Frankos. At the time, the men who were the focus of the agency's investigation all denied any role in the disappearance. O'Brien conceded that he was driving the Mercury owned by Giacalone's son that day, but he said that Hoffa wasn't in it. He had borrowed the vehicle to deliver a large salmon to a Team-

sters vice-president.

The Briguglios, Provenzano, Giacalone, and Andretta cited alibis. Provenzano was playing gin rummy at a Teamsters union hall in New Jersey with the Briguglios and Andretta the day of the disappearance. Giacalone had been getting a massage.

The grand jury did not return indictments.

Provenzano, now dead, was a "very fine person," and "Mr. Giacalone is one of the finest family men I've ever met," Charles O'Brien, now a Florida-based representative for the Teamsters, told me. "Anybody that knew me knew that I would never have let anything happen to Mr. Hoffa."

F.B.I. experts remain unimpressed by such character references.

Provenzano's death occurred while he was serving a 21-year sentence for offenses including the murder of a Teamsters rival, Tony "Three Fingers" Castelli. Three Fingers, like Hoffa, conveniently disappeared during a mob power dispute.

Salvatore Briguglio was the victim of a gangland-style shooting in New York's Little Italy in 1978, months before he also was to be tried in the Castelli case. Some federal officials suspect he was killed because Provenzano was worried that Briguglio would rat about Hoffa in return for leniency in the murder case.

Giacalone began serving 13 years for income tax evasion and extortion in 1979. Andretta began serving 20 years for racketeering the same year.

Some years later, in testimony to the U.S. Senate and in a copyright interview

with *The Richmond Times-Dispatch*, Charlie Allen, a fellow prison inmate of Hoffa's, lent his support—and some background color—to the F.B.I. theory.

Allen said that he was told by Provenzano that Hoffa was shot with an electric stun gun by three Provenzano associates, who shipped the corpse to an ironworks and ground him up and put him in a barrel, took him to Florida, and threw him in the Everglades.

In his book "Vicious Circles," investigative reporter Jonathan Kwitny wrote of two other theories. One was that the body was discarded at a New Jersey garbage dump that had been used in the past as a mob cemetery. The other was that the body was squashed in the garbage-compacting machinery at a Detroit firm, Central Sanitation, that was founded by Raffael "Jimmy O" Quasariano and Dominick "Sparky" Corrado, respectively employed in the narcotics and labor-racketeering sectors of the American economy. Central Sanitation had a pickup spot that would have been conveniently located in terms of the last known movements of the ex-Teamsters boss.

Playboy magazine, in an essay about its decision to carry the Frankos interview, admitted that the Hoffa case has made fools of sensible men before. The magazine recalled that a Michigan attorney general, trailed by a posse of reporters, attacked a 40-acre field with a backhoe. A tipster had told a state investigating committee that Hoffa's body was there.

"Frankos is a credible witness," *Playboy* argued, because "he has lived his life amid a treacherous band of killers."

Frankos told the magazine that Salvatore Briguglio and a man named John Sullivan—identified by the F.B.I. as an associate of both Jimmy Coonan's Westies and the Ganovese family—escorted him to see "Fat Tony" Salerno in 1973. Salerno offered Frankos and Sullivan up to \$200,000 to kill an unidentified federal prisoner "up for parole very shortly," Frankos said, adding that he soon learned that the target was Hoffa.

At this point some publications might have terminated the interview. Hoffa wasn't awaiting parole—he had been out of jail for two years when the meeting with Salerno supposedly took place. *Playboy*, confronting him with this discrepancy, was satisfied by Frankos's assurance that, while his date was off, he wasn't "bullshitting." Jailed himself in 1974, Frankos continued, he was in the same cellblock as Joe "Mad Dog" Sullivan, a freelance hit man who subsequently would be convicted of murdering a Rochester, New York, Teamsters leader during yet another mob war.

Now you would suppose that "freelance hit man" Frankos would be exceedingly wary about letting another hitler know about a task he was undertaking for a godfather of Salerno's standing. Hit men usually reserve their boasting until after a killing, and then talk only to trusted confidants. Frankos, however, said that he briefed Mad Dog on the whole plan, telling him that he could stand in for him on the Hoffa hit if he didn't get out in time to do the deed himself.

Generally, Frankos said, he bribed his way out of prison whenever he needed to do a "job" on the outside, performing "approximately" nine murders during such furloughs. Apparently, the \$200,000 price on Hoffa's head, however, didn't make it worthwhile for him to use that ploy for Salerno's assignment. Or maybe it's just that, as New York State Corrections Department spokeswoman Amy Colodny puts it, "He

tells a good story." Records from the state prison system where Frankos was doing his time show that he got "no furloughs. Zip," Colodny says. In any event, in the summer of 1975, Frankos said he agreed to take a "little percentage of the money" (\$15,000) since he was "not out," while his role in the hit was subcontracted to yet another non-Mafia conspirator, Jimmy Coonan. Mad Dog, similarly still behind bars, also would be "taken care of with 'some money.'"

Once these generous arrangements were completed, Frankos's Hoffa-history blends seamlessly into the F.B.I.'s well-publicized theory, its gaps plugged by Frankos's claim that he had identified the hit men when the veteran lawmen had failed for 14 years. Hoffa was promised a "sit-down," but instead Provenzano and O'Brien drove him to a house in Mount Clemens, Michigan, Frankos said, charging that O'Brien was promised \$1 million for betraying Hoffa ("He's a blatant liar," O'Brien says "This was the worst yellow-dog journalism.")

Coonan and John Sullivan were waiting in the house's kitchenette and when Hoffa walked in, Coonan pumped two

explosive bullets into his forehead, using a .22 with a silencer, Frankos continued in an account so rich in sartorial observation that it's little wonder the magazine asked if he had a furlough at the time of the Hoffa disappearance. He demurely ducked the question. He described how the two hit men, wearing goggles and surgical gloves, went to the basement, where Coonan placed the body on a table under a "huge light" and dismembered it with a bucksaw and a meat cleaver. Sullivan bagged the remains, Frankos said, and slashed them in a freezer where they stayed for five months until Mad Dog was released from prison. Mad Dog and another man transported the bags to Giants Stadium, where they were buried "right in the cement." In the non-existent "cement, that is

When Frankos was freed from jail in 1981, Mad Dog showed him the site, he said. That was five years before he tried to sell *Penthouse* his Hoffa-less life story.

In the organized-crime demimonde, as law-enforcement officials point out, even the most ludicrous-sounding yarns sometimes have an element of truth. Maybe Frankos picked up some accurate jailhouse gossip about the Hoffa case and spiced it up by inverting roles for himself and Giants Stadium, the officials say. "There's no way to completely discount that the Sullivans [Mad Dog and John] had a role in Hoffa's disappearance," an official adds, "but nor is there any substantial evidence that they were involved."

Coonan's lawyer, Gerald Shargel, called Frankos's story "absurd." But what of *Playboy's* report that it had subjected the convict to voice-stress analysis, which indicated that "Frankos believed the story he was telling"? Voice-stress analysis is unreliable, cautions an F.B.I. expert.

The magazine didn't fare any better with its observation that "the government's protectiveness of Frankos is another sign of his importance as a witness, the Justice Department is going to extraordinary lengths to ensure that he survives. . . ."

Frankos was serving his murder sentence in Sandstone, a federal penitentiary in Minnesota, under the auspices of the Federal Witness Protection Program at the time that he met *Playboy's* representative. But that had nothing to do with the Hoffa case. Imprisoned for slaying the marijuana dealer, he was put in the program after he tipped federal prosecutors that he'd overheard talk of contract killings that were being planned against, among others, a federal judge. *Playboy* reported that Frankos named Jimmy Coonan as the man behind the plot. A law-enforcement official says that the man identified by Frankos was not Coonan.

The magazine went on to depict

Frankos as getting special protection within the witness program, "isolated in maximum security... the only prisoner in his cellblock," supervised by guards who "test his food before he eats."

But the Justice Department's Krozisky says that Frankos was housed in a witness-protection program unit where he mingled freely with other prisoners. In fact, he shared a double cell, recalls one of his fellow inmates there. Nor was his food tasted, adds Krozisky. Another official says that Frankos was temporarily in solitary confinement at the time of the interview with the *Playboy* representative—because he had gotten into a scuffle. Frankos had a reputation as a problem prisoner who, other male inmates alleged, hassled them sexually, the official says. "He was fighting because he wanted to sit next to a young kid in the cafeteria. He and his fighting partner went to the hole," the fellow inmate told me.

Frankos subsequently was moved to another federal prison, where he mingled with the general population of the witness-protection program, eating the same food as the other inmates and spending his days in their company.

that he issued the first of his "threats" against me, insisting that the only reason he was in the general population was that federal authorities were "pervet" that he was "taking them to court." Denying that he ever made sexual advances to other prisoners or that he was in solitary because of a scuffle, he said that throughout some 17 months at Sandstone, he spent all but a month and a half in a specially guarded isolation cell.

"Here's a good friend of mine from the Westies," he said, putting another inmate on the phone. The inmate would back up his story, he assured me.

The man said that, as a fellow inmate of Frankos's at Sandstone, he knows that Frankos spent most of his stretch there mixing with other witness-protection program prisoners. The inmate did, however, dispute that Frankos's short stay in solitary was because of a brawl. The sentence was punishment for refusing a transfer to a federal penitentiary in Michigan, the inmate said.

At press time, a law-enforcement official said that the U.S. Marshall Service was dismissing Frankos from the Witness Protection Program. The convict—who had wanted out anyway, the official said—was being transferred to a New York State prison where, non-

tion. Because his stock has risen with the Justice Department? No, said the official. "It's because he's said so many things about so many people, a lot of them would like a piece of his hide" (The Justice Department's Krozisky said that Frankos was leaving the federal program at his own request.)

Donald Frankos's Hoffa story is, if you believe almost everyone except Donald Frankos, at best, exaggerated and inconsistent, at worst, a self-serving lie.

Where does that leave his book project? Co-author William Hoffman hung up when I called him, saying, "I don't want to talk to you." Co-author Lake Headley told me that "everything *Playboy* printed is the truth, as best we could verify it." Avon Executive Editor Bob McCoy was less complacent, however, explaining that Frankos's smorgasbord of accounts of the Hoffa case was news to him. Pledging that Morrow and Avon will do their best to check the accuracy of the final manuscript, McCoy added, "We are not in the business of publishing fiction and calling it nonfiction." The editor, who has never spoken to Frankos, said Morrow and Avon had relied on statements from Hoffman and Headley "as to his credibility and [as to] what the FBI believed."

Frankos's plan to market the "correct" burial site to yet another media buyer came as another unwanted surprise, McCoy said. "That would not be in his best interests," the editor snapped. In any case, some sports bulls think the other buyer would be advised to save its corporate pennies. According to Giants Stadium's Samerjan, the playing field's drainage system was rebuilt and no Glad-bagged bones were found. *Playboy* retracted questions about the saga to Peter Moore, a Chicago-based associate editor. Moore, who identified himself as being with the "nonfiction" department of the magazine, refused to discuss the discrepancies in Frankos's story. "We verified the article," Moore said, "and we stand behind it." *Of*

Book - Mobbed Up by JAMES NEFF focused on JACKIE PRESSER. The book mentioned PRESSER's early contact with HOFFA involving the Detroit jukebox workers union in 1944 and in 1951 with the vending business; the '51 vending business venture resulted in PRESSER's federal indictment. Regardless, HOFFA supported PRESSER for a chapter in the TEAMSTERS. PRESSER continued to maintain ties with HOFFA.

HOFFA WANTS TO COMPLETE THEIR PROJECT FIRST.

It discussed the contact in 1952 when HOFFA initiated contact with JIMMY "The Weasel" to JOEY GLIMCO, a capo in the Chicago Mafia and president of a TEAMSTERS local there. The author discussed the questioning of WILLIAM J. MC CARTHY, Boston TEAMSTER Vice President, by the FBI in 1976 concerning HOFFA's mysterious disappearance. MC CARTHY did not provide an positive information (p. 431). This is the only direct mentioning of HOFFA's disappearance. It talks about HOFFA's plan to assassinate FRANK FITZSIMMONS in 1971 and makes several references to HOFFA's activities throughout his life. On 6/22/89, Detroit airtel was sent to FBIHQ, Latent Fingerprint Section, requesting [redacted] by FBIHQ as well as sufficient sets of photographs (approximately 87) of unidentified latents from captioned matter for [redacted]

[redacted] users (Vol. 215, serial 601). Subsequently, the unit treated the request as an office project due to the voluminous workload on the computer. Furthermore, FBIHQ requested Detroit place [redacted] until FBIHQ completes the aforementioned request.

The candidates are then examined manually. To date, the unit has completed over several thousand comparisons. An expected completion date for the entire project is within the next several months.

The reporting Agent has been communicating with Supervisory Specialist [redacted] FBIHQ, [redacted] ext. [redacted] for the past year regarding said request. [redacted] is the person who processed the aforementioned locations in August 1975 and is well versed in captioned investigation. Periodic requests between FBIHQ and Detroit have been maintained; minimally on a two month period. FBIHQ's position continues, that is, [redacted] until said project is completed.

CW recalled that HOFFA told CW that if CW ever needed to contact him, CW should write an attorney. CW could not presently recall the attorney's name, but recalled that the [REDACTED] SA [REDACTED] asked CW if the attorney's name might [REDACTED], and CW acknowledged that was the attorney whom HOFFA had mentioned. 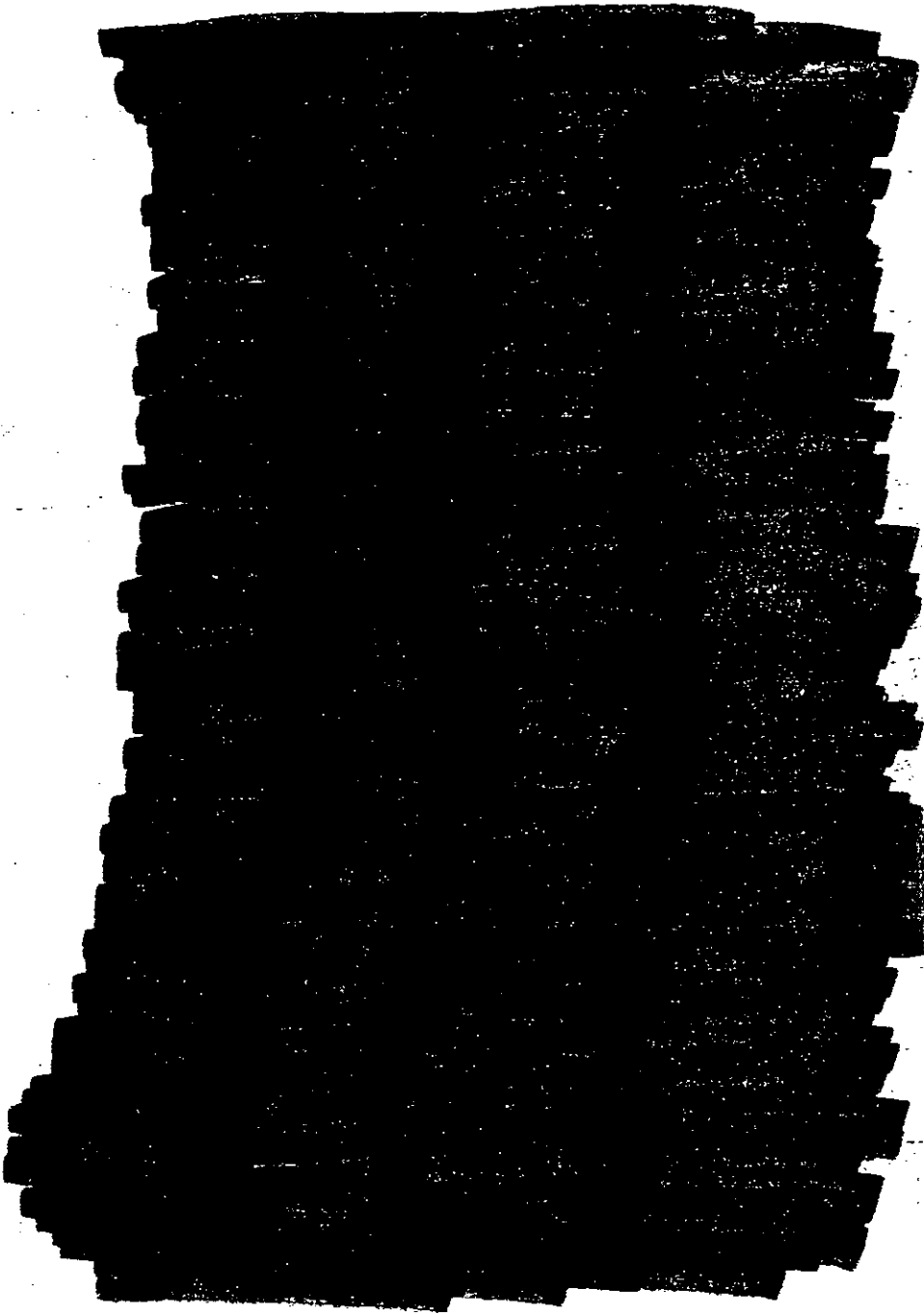
