

Teamsters official Charles "Chuckie" O'Brien, the foster son of one-time Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa, was accused at the Newark hearing of violating the union a constitution by associating with orga-nized-crime figures. O'Brien denied

the allegations.

The Detroit News reported last week that evidence at the hearing indicated former Teamsters President Jackie Presser told the FBI that a Detroit organized-crime figure, Anthony Giacalone, tried to extract a \$250,000 payment in 1978 from former Teamsters. President Frank Fitzsimmons for having Hoffa killed.

According to federal documents. Presser said that when Fitzsimmons refused. O'Brien went to Washington and tried to convince Fitzsimmons to pay Giacalone. O'Brien testified last Monday that the incident never hap-

pened.

During the Newark hearing, FBI Special Agent Samuel J. Ruffino Jr. of Detroit submitted a 14-page statement that outlined what the government called the inner workings of organized crime, referred to by the Italian name La Cosa Nostra, across the country.

Detroit has traditionally been represented in La Cosa Nostra," Hal Helterhoff, the agent in charge of the FBI in Michigan, said Friday.

"It is one family here. We have had very little violence because it is a cohesive family. They move silently out of the limelight, and gambling is the main source of illegal revenue.

Tocco and Zerilli were forced by the state attorney general's office to sever their relationship with Hazel Park Race Track amid allegations that they were involved in organized The second section is a second section of

In 1972, Zerilli was convicted of having a hidden ownership in the Frontier Casino in Las Vegas and served 21/2 years in a federal prison. He operates the Detroit Italian Bakery Co. in Roseville.

Both men were named as organized-crime family members by then-U.S. Atty. Gen. John Mitchell in a 1969 U.S. Senate hearing. In the past, both have strongly protested being labeled members of crime groups

Tocco, Zerilli and others identified by the FBI as crime figures either could not be reached for comment or refused to make a statement.

The FBI chart and accompanying records also identified the lesser leaders of the Detroit crime hierarchy, known as capes or captains, as:

- Michael Polizzi, 65. He was convicted with Zerilli in the Frontier Hotel case. He also was convicted in-1985 on charges of extortion, racketeering and loansharking in San Diego. In 1986 he pleaded guilty to gambling charges in Detroit. His last kijown address was in Grosse Pointe.
- Anthony Corrado, in his 60s, a business partner of Tocco. He never has been charged with a crime. It is not clear where he lives.
- Anthony "Tony Jack" Giacalone, 70, one of the central figures in the Hoffa mystery. Hoffa told family and friends he was going to meet Giacalone when he disappeared July 30, 1975. Hoffa's body never has been found and no one ever has been arrested in the case.

Giacalone was convicted of income-tax evasion in 1976 and sentenced to 10 years in prison. He received a 12-year sentence when he pleaded guilty to extortion charges in Saginaw in 1979. He now raises show horses on a Macomb County farm.

■ Vito "Billy" Giacalone, 74, Anthony Giacalone's brother. He was con-victed of possession of a blackjack in 1968 and sentenced to 41/2-to-5 years in prison. In 1977, he was sentenced to two years in prison for carrying a concealed gun in his car.

In 1979, Vito Giacalone received a three-year prison term for extortion. In 1987, he pleaded guilty to operating an illegal sports betting ring and was sentenced to five years in prison. He is serving that term.

■ Joseph Matranga of San Diego, Michael Polizzi's brother-in-law. He was convicted with Polizzi of extortion, racketeering and loansharking in 1985. He owns topless bars in San Diego.

■ Anthony Tocco, 59, of Grosse Pointe, Jack Tocco's brother. He never has been convicted of a crime. He works with his brother at Cadillac Overall Supply.

Ruffino said Jack and Anthony Tocco received a loan of more than \$600,000, under questionable circumstances, from a national Teamsters pension fund to build a tennis club in Warren.

Two other men not listed on the FBI chart, Vincent A. Meli and Anthony LaPiana, were identified by Ruffino as Detroit members of La Cosa Nostra.

Meli, 70, was convicted of extorting kickbacks from truckers in 1977 and was sentenced to three years in prison. A trial on income-tax evasion charges in 1974 ended in a hung jury. In 1968, counterfeiting charges against him were dismissed by the federal government in one case and a second ended in a mistrial.

Meli, whose last known address was in Grosse Pointe Woods, is distantly related to Tocco by marriage. In 1963, Meli was named as a member of organized crime in Detroit in testimony before a U.S. Senate committee.

LaPiana, 47, is a third-party insurance representative with contracts with the Teamsters.

In response to a question from retired federal Judge Frederick Lacey, who heard the civil charges against O'Brien at the Newark hearing, Ruffino said LaPiana had been added to the Cosa Nostra rolls recently by the FBI.

Ruffino said a pending investigation prevented him from explaining how the FBI had connected LaPiana

to organized crime.

"I am at a loss to explain how the FBI could say that," LaPiana said Friday. "I have no idea what they could be talking about

# 1975 allegations used against

### Teamsters official

The FBI this week used 12-year-old allegations that Charles (Chuckie) O'Brien and Anthony Giacalone sought a \$250,000 payment for orchestrating the 1975 disappearance of Jimmy Hoffa to support a government claim that O'Brien should be removed from Teamsters union office.

The allegations tend to support the FBI's long-standing suspicion that O'Brien and Giacalone played a role in the disappearance of the former Teamsters head, who is presumed dead. Even so, agency officials said Thursday that they don't consider the charges reliable enough to seek criminal indictments in Hoffa's disappearance.

One reason is that two key players are dead: Jackie Presser, the former Teamsters president and FBI informant who made the allegations to the agency and died in 1988; and Frank Fitzsimmons, the former Teamsters president whom O'Brien and Giacalone allegedly solicited for the \$250,000 and who died in 1981.

"The FBI was obviously aware of the information reportedly furnished by Presser shortly after the disappearance. But the FBI was unable to substantiate or corroborate that type of information," said Hal Helterhoff, special agent-in-charge of the FBI Detroit office. "There's quite a gap between testifying at an administrative hearing, or trying to establish probable cause" for criminal charges.

O'Brien specifically denied that he was involved in Hoffa's disappearance, or any subsequent demand for payment

Giacalone, who was unavailable for comment Thursday, also has denied any role in Hoffa's disappearance.

O'Brien is one of 38 Teamsters officials nationwide who have been charged by the government with a variety of violations of the union's constitution. Under terms of a March 1989 settlement of a federal racketeering lawsuit against the 1.6-millionmember union, those 38 officials face a variety of penalties, including removal from office.

O'Brien is charged with violating the union's constitution by associating with organized crime figures, by amassing two criminal convictions dating back to the 1970s and by using a union credit card to rent a jet in 1987.

told Frederick Lacey, a retired federal judge, that in 1978, Presser informed them that Giacalone had approached Fitzsimmons seeking a \$250,000 payment for arranging Hoffa's disappearance.

Presser told the FBI that when Fitzsimmons resisted, O'Brien flew to Washington to encourage Fitzsimmons

to pay, agents said.

In 1978 O'Brien was a business agent at Teamsters Local 299 in Detroit; today he receives \$70,000 annually as a staffer for the Teamsters southern conference in Hallandale, Fla.

Hoffa disappeared after leaving the parking lot of Machus Red Fox restaurant in Bloomfield Hills in July 1975.

In an FBI summary known as the "Hoffex" memo, the agency theorized - that Hoffa went to the restaurant that day for a meeting with Giacalone, who he thought was arranging a reconciliation with Anthony Provenzano, a New Jersey Teamsters boss with organized crime connections.

The FBI believes, according to the "Hoffex" memo, that O'Brien was in the car that drove Hoffa away from the

restaurant.

In Monday's hearing, the FBI introduced transcripts of interviews shortly

after the disappearance in which O'Brien acknowledged that he was such a close friend of Giacalone that he often called him "Uncle Tony." He also acknowledged that in the five days immediately before and after Hoffa's disappearance, he met with Giacalone four times and telephoned him five times.

At the hearing, the FBI named nine individuals, including Giacalone, as organized crime leaders in Detroit. O'Brien acknowledged Thursday that he's an acquaintance or friend with all nine men.

At the hearing and again on Thursday, however, he denied knowing whether they were connected with

organized crime.

O'Brien acknowledged two convictions in the 1970s, one for accepting a car from a dealer with Teamstersrepresented workers, and one for making false statements on a bank loan. But he said they should not be enough to bar him from holding office.

He acknowledged that in 1987, he spent \$12,000 on a Teamsters credit card to hire a plane to transport musicians to a charity event. He said he's paying the money back despite financial problems.

# Feds' corruption probe aimed at ousting 36 Teamster bosses

THEIDETROIT NEWS COME HEREIN

Federal officials targeted 36 top Teamsters around the country for removal from office in an effort to root out corruption in the union's leadership, according to documents obtained by The Detroit News.

The campaign already has resulted in the ouster or resignation of at least 16 of the 36 since the beginning of the year, the documents show.

Although some individual cases already have come to light — including charges against Michigan's top Teamster, George J. Vitale — the flocuments are the first to name the 36 and indicate the national sweep of

the investigation.

The documents show the 36 people were accused of administrative misconduct and violations of the union constitution by Charles M. Carberry of New York City, a special investigations officer appointed by a federal judge last year to rid the Teamsters of organized-crime influence.

Specific charges ranged from assault to, in some cases, membership in the organized-crime group La Cosa Nostra.

The highest-ranking Teamster forced from office is Harold Friedman, an international vice-president and president of Cleveland Local

507, according to the documents.

Earlier this year, he received a one-year suspension from any Team-

sters post.

Friedman was charged with violating the union's constitution because of prior labor racketeering convictions and continued association with organized crime.

Another international vicepresident, Theodore R. Cozza of Chicago, is awaiting a ruling on charges he associated with organized-crime figures.

Neither Friedman nor Cozza could be reached for comment.

In addition to the 36 individuals targeted, two Connecticut locals, a Cleveland local and the secretarytressurer of one of the Connecticut locals have agreed to pay back a total of \$817,632 Carberry said they embezzled from the union.

Two Teamsters from Jackson -Dennis Hand, president of Local 164, and William Bernard, secretary-treasurer of the local - have been acquitted on charges that they disrupted a union meeting and assaulted union members.

"I feel I got a fair and honest bearing," Bernard said. "I've been a Teamster for 43 years, and if you've done wrong, you don't belong in this organization.

Hand could not be reached.

In a September report obtained by The News, Carberry said his office examined the records of 69 Teamsters locals or joint councils around the country and had taken depositions from about 90 people.

The report cited "evidence of fraud schemes, embezzlement and

other improper activities.

The investigation so far has resulted in the removal of five Teamsters officials, the resignation of six others and two suspensions. Three other officials resigned after they were notified of the investigation.

Several misconduct counts have been filed against Vitale, 62, an international vice-president and head of Local 283 in Wyandotte. The charges include embezzlement and violation of union rules.

Vitale, who could be forced from office if found guilty, has denied any

wrongdoing.

"I don't think it's gonna do me any good to air this out right now, Vitale said Friday. "We gave the government some arguments, they are seriously considering my arguments, and they are trying to make a decision about what to do.

"As far as the charges go, I think after all the facts are considered, I will be cleared."

Among the charges against Vitale is that he embezzled \$10,116 from Local 283 by double-billing the local and the international union for payment of his Social Security taxes between 1987 and 1989.

Two charges relate to prior criminal convictions. One conviction, in a 1973 case, involved embezzlement of \$1,200 of union money. The other was for accepting an illegal \$500

payment from a union employer. He also is accused of unlawfully soliciting money from a Chicago mobster, Alan Dorfman, connected to the Teamsters Welfare Fund. Dorfman has since been slain.

The News reported in August that Charles L. "Chuckie" O'Brien, foster son of missing Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa, was among the union leaders charged. FBI agents have described O'Brien as a key figure in Hoffa's 1975 disappearance.

O'Brien, formerly of Detroit, lives in Hallandale, Fla., and is a union international representative.

 He is charged with embezzling union funds, associating with organized-crime figures and having two prior criminal convictions that violate the union's constitution.

O'Brien has denied the embezzlement charge and said that some of the people the government described as Detroit crime figures he knew as businessmen or neighbors.

Under the rules of the special investigation — agreed to by the Teamsters - Carberry and Frederick Lacey, a retired federal judge hearing the cases, have extraordinary power to remove Teamsters officials.

Those found guilty by Lacey can appeal to a federal court in New York supervising the investigation. No verdicts have been overturned. Charges brought by Carberry are civil, but some of the complaints could lead to criminal prosecution.




