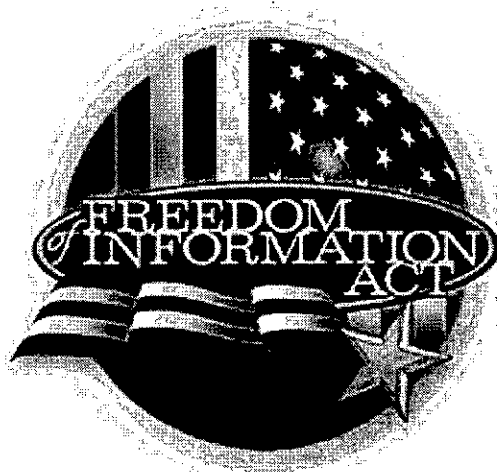

**Hoffa's daughter closer to seeing FBI files on dad's disappearance**By Lori Dodge Rose

Jimmy Hoffa's daughter is a little closer to seeing the FBI's voluminous files on her father's long-ago disappearance.

A federal appeals court in Missouri ruled this week that the government can be required to provide a detailed index of the documents related to the FBI's investigation of the disappearance of the former Teamsters Union boss from a Michigan restaurant.

An index is the first step to seeing specific documents.

The 2-1 ruling by the 8th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals was good news for Hoffa's daughter, Barbara Ann Crancer of the St. Louis suburb of Ladue. Crancer has sought for nearly four years to gain access to the information under the Freedom of Information Act.

"We are elated at this victory," said Crancer, who is an administrative law judge in St. Louis. "At the same time, we certainly feel this a very small victory in very long war."

Her father, the former president of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters, was last seen in 1975 outside a restaurant in Southfield, Mich. The FBI's investigation into his disappearance has resulted in 68 volumes containing more than 13,800 pages of records.

At issue is whether Crancer can use the Freedom of Information Act to force the FBI to produce the files. Federal investigators have said they believe Hoffa was murdered.

Crancer initially filed her request

for the records in February 1987, but the government said disclosure would interfere with the FBI's investigation.

Last year, days before the 10th anniversary of Hoffa's disappearance, a federal judge ordered the Justice Department to provide Crancer with a detailed index in the Hoffa case. In its ruling Monday, the appeals court said that the lower court has the power to order the index and did not abuse its discretion in doing so.

The opinion was written by Senior Circuit Judge Floyd R. Gibson for Theodore McMillian. Circuit Judge Roger Wollman dissented, saying the government should be allowed to provide a generic category-by-category index because government confidentiality is at stake.

Hoffa built Detroit's Local 299, a tiny Teamsters unit, into a 15,000-member local, and became president of the international union.

In 1958, he was hauled before the U.S. Senate racketeering committee and accused of running a "hoodlum empire."

Nine years later, Hoffa was convicted of jury tampering and fraud involving the Teamsters' Central Pension Fund and received a five-year federal prison term. Under a sentence commutation he received from President Nixon in 1971, Hoffa was barred from returning to office in the Teamsters until 1980.

When Hoffa vanished, he was contesting that provision in court. His son's Detroit attorney Jimmy P. Hoffa Jr. said he thinks his father was killed because he was a

MESSAGE FROM TEAMSTERS BOSS, JIMMY HOFFA, TO MAFIA GODFATHERS DEMANDING A "HIT" ON THE PRESIDENT (KENNEDY). THE PURPOSE OF THIS COMMUNICATION IS FOR INFORMATIONAL PURPOSES ONLY, ADVISING THE RECEIVING OFFICES OF THE INFORMATION DETROIT HAS REGARDING RAGANO. RAGANO HAS SURFACED NUMEROUS TIMES IN DETROIT FILES, PARTICULARLY THE HOFFEX INVESTIGATION. RAGANO WAS AN ATTORNEY FOR HOFFA. FRANK RAGANO, 1207 Druid Lane, Tampa, Florida, telephonically contacted Special Agent [REDACTED] and furnished the following information:

b7C RAGANO advised that he has been a close personal friend of JIMMY HOFFA and has been acting as one of his attorneys for the past fourteen years. He advised that he was continually contacting HOFFA telephonically because of his close personal relationship with him. He advised that just prior to HOFFA's murder, he had been contracted by HOFFA to work with some movie producers on a film about HOFFA's life. Because of this film, he was contacting HOFFA more frequently than normal. He advised the murder of HOFFA voided this contract and even though he wanted to continue the movie, HOFFA's [REDACTED] to it.

RAGANO stated that when he heard of HOFFA's death, he immediately flew to HOFFA's home and stayed with his family. He advised that through his relationship with HOFFA, he had also become close to HOFFA's family and was accepted in HOFFA's home.

RAGANO stated that he had no specific information regarding HOFFA's death, only speculation. He felt that HOFFA's murder involved union politics and it was done by someone close to HOFFA. He stated that HOFFA was not the type of individual who would be overpowered by strangers without putting up a fight.

He related a story that several years ago HOFFA used to keep a sawed off baseball bat under the seat of his automobile. He was approached by some "young punks" and they obviously were planning to mug him. HOFFA pulled out the baseball bat from under the seat of the car and according to RAGANO, used the bat on the would-be muggers.

RAGANO stated that he was as anxious as the Federal Bureau of Investigation to see the murderers of HOFFA identified and brought to justice. He stated he does not have any solid information that would be of value to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, but if he did hear anything of value he would immediately contact the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

From 8/4/75, through 8/29/75, telephone number [REDACTED], the telephone at the JAMES RIDDLE HOFFA, Lake Orion, Michigan, residence, was consensually monitored and calls tape recorded at the Oakland County Resident Agency. From 8/4/75 through 8/19/75, an additional telephone line, [REDACTED], was installed at the HOFFA, Lake Orion residence. This telephone was also monitored and calls tape recorded.

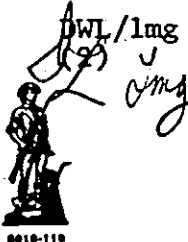
Every call has been reviewed for any information of lead value. In addition to listening to the tapes, a synopsis was made which identified the particulars of the conversations and the nature of the call. This is in addition to the logs that were made at the time of the original call. A check of indices and file reviews after the tapes were reviewed revealed that a majority of the calls where information of value had been obtained, leads had been already set out and investigation conducted.

Several individuals who may have knowledge concerning JAMES R. HOFFA's activities were callers to the Lake Orion residence, but indices checks revealed they may not have been interviewed or should be reinterviewed. These individuals include the following:

1. [REDACTED] - [REDACTED] was a frequent caller who [REDACTED] has identified as a [REDACTED] close family friend. He has never been interviewed.

2. FRANK RAGANO - RAGANO was a frequent caller and also visited the HOFFA, Lake Orion residence after the disappearance. Indices indicate he has never been

interviewed. The Miami Division has indicated that RAGANO is a hoodlum attorney who has been hostile toward the FBI in the past, however, JOSEPHINE HOFFA, when interviewed in December, 1975, stated RAGANO had told her the FBI had not contacted him regarding the HOFFA disappearance. This may or may not be an indication that RAGANO would be receptive to providing information which he may or may not possess. There is informant information in the file which indicates RAGANO has numerous Organized Crime contacts and did make contact with these individuals subsequent to the disappearance.

Several months ago, [REDACTED] of [REDACTED] came to him with the idea of doing a film about JIMMY HOFFA. [REDACTED] felt that a successful, major motion picture could be developed based on HOFFA's life and he and [REDACTED] decided to make an appointment to meet with HOFFA to discuss this idea. They subsequently contacted Mr. HOFFA's attorney, FRANK RAGANO, and through Mr. RAGANO arranged to meet with HOFFA on March 3, 1975, at Mr. HOFFA's residence in Miami. Their meeting with HOFFA lasted about one hour. Mrs. HOFFA and Mr. RAGANO also were present at this meeting.

b7C [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] presented their idea to HOFFA and obtained an option from HOFFA to develop a script and to attempt to obtain necessary studio backing for the film. [REDACTED] asked if HOFFA could obtain financial backing for the film from the Teamsters Union. HOFFA said no and recommended that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] either raise the money independently or obtain financial backing from a major motion picture studio.

[REDACTED] said HOFFA seemed to be receptive to their idea, and he and [REDACTED] were optimistic that a final agreement could be reached with him. HOFFA's only demands were that he have final script approval and that the film be produced by a major motion picture company.

Mr. RAGANO assured [REDACTED] that if the project reached the production stage that Mr. HOFFA would personally come to Hollywood for publicity purposes and would lend his support and cooperation with the film.

[REDACTED] said he and [REDACTED] were the only individuals involved in this project, and while he and [REDACTED] have talked about the project, they have conducted no research, have not started a script and have spent no money on the project. Because of Mr. HOFFA's disappearance, the



[redacted] emphatically stated that he has had no contact whatsoever with anyone from the HOFFA family since approximately 1972, with the exception of a Christmas card which was received during December, 1974, which was reportedly signed "JO and JIMMY." Further, JIMMY HOFFA has never been at the [redacted] residence, and [redacted] stated he would be "shocked" if HOFFA ever would appear at his residence. [redacted] stated it was absolutely absurd to think that JIMMY HOFFA was at his residence at the present time, or at anytime in the recent past.

[redacted] denied any personal knowledge regarding the disappearance of JAMES RIDDLE HOFFA, other than what he

Ragano, also Trafficante's attorney, said he passed the message. After the Nov. 22, 1963 assassination in Dallas, Ragano quoted Trafficante as saying: "The SOB is dead. Our problems are over. I hope that Jimmy is happy now ... we're out of trouble now. We will build hotels again. We'll get back into Cuba now."

"Jimmy owes me and he owes me big."

Hoffa, who disappeared from a Bloomfield Township restaurant parking lot in 1975, and has not been seen since, has long been an object of speculation in the Kennedy assassination. Ragano did not return a call to his office.

Barbara Hoffa Crancer described Ragano as a "hanger-on" who was "always looking to my dad to get him jobs." Several years ago, she said, he

attempted to raise money from old Hoffa friends and acquaintances for a movie based on Hoffa's life.

It's suspicious, Crancer said. Ragano said nothing then about a possible Kennedy connection.

"You'd think if he knew the story then, he would have used it to raise money." She accused Ragano of trying to take advantage of publicity generated by Oliver Stone's movie JFK.

Trafficante is dead and Marcello, now in his 80s, reportedly suffers from Alzheimer's disease. His whereabouts are unknown.

Ragano told the Post Hoffa's and

Trafficante's deaths absolved him of the requirement to maintain confidentiality.

Already, the movie JFK is re-igniting the public's longstanding obsession with the assassination and is likely to further undermine acceptance of Warren Commission findings that Lee Harvey Oswald acted alone in killing Kennedy.

Nearly 75% of those questioned in a new *Time/CNN* poll of 1,500 adults believe the truth hasn't been told about the assassination. The poll had a margin of error of 2.6 percentage points.

The idea of a mob role isn't new. But, "he's what we've been waiting

for for the last 20 years — the older guy who's gotten an attack of conscience and who knows secrets," says Jack Newfield, who interviewed Ragano for the *Post*.

But Steven Brill, author of *Teamsters*, says Ragano "was a peripheral figure. ... Hoffa didn't order those guys to do anything. ... When he forgot he was their tool is when he got killed."

Ragano says he now believes he conveyed a fatal message from Hoffa in early 1963 to Florida mob boss Santos Trafficante and New Orleans mob boss Carlos Marcello.

The story supports the conclusion in 1979 of the House Select Committee on Assassinations that Marcello, Trafficante and Hoffa had the "motive, means and opportunity" to kill the

president. The panel never questioned Ragano.

A panoply of conspiracy theories have flourished from almost the first reports of Kennedy's shooting: right-wingers in Dallas, the Mafia, Castro, the Soviet Union, the CIA and the FBI have all been "linked" to the crime.

Hoffa's daughter, Barbara Ann Crancer, 53, a Missouri administrative law judge, says that Ragano has other motives.

Now appealing a second tax-evasion conviction, he "is a desperate and very sick man" trying to sell "his books by attacking a dead president."

"Nowhere in my heart do I believe my father is capable of doing such a thing," says Crancer who is urging the Justice Department to open FBI files on Hoffa's 1976 disappearance.

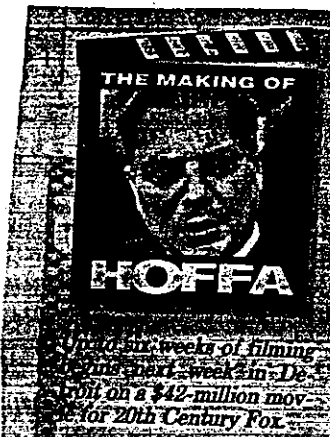

Here's an update on key players in the true-life Jimmy Hoffa story, now being adapted for a film starring Jack Nicholson as the Teamster leader and Danny DeVito as a fictional sidekick. DeVito, who's also the director, brings his crew to Detroit March 17 for four to six weeks of shooting.

■ **Anthony "Tony Pro" Provenzano** died Dec. 12, 1988, of a heart attack at a California hospital near the federal prison where he was serving a 20-year sentence for labor racketeering. He was 71.

■ **Frank Fitzsimmons**, who became Teamsters president when Hoffa was jailed and then wouldn't step aside, died of lung cancer May 6, 1981. He was 73.

■ **Hoffa's widow, Josephine**, died Sept. 12, 1980, from a combination of cancer, heart problems and the lack of a will to live. She was 62 — the same age as her husband when he disappeared.

■ **James P. Hoffa**, the Teamster leader's 50-year-old son, is a Detroit labor attorney whose bid for the union presidency was derailed last year on a bylaws technicality. He lives in Troy.

**Provenzano**

■ **Anthony Giacalone**, still dapper at 73, divides his time between a farm near Port Huron, where he raises Arabian horses, and a condo in North Miami Beach. He has been in prison twice since Hoffa's disappearance — once for tax evasion and once for gambling.

■ **Charles "Chuckie" O'Brien**, 58, was convicted of minor crimes and spent 10 months behind bars in 1979. When last heard from, he was divorced a second time, bankrupt, about to lose his \$90,000-a-year Teamster job and living in a rented room in Hallandale, Fla.

■ **Hoffa's daughter, Barbara Ann Crancer**, 54, is an administrative law judge in St. Louis, Mo. She sued in 1989 to open FBI files on her father's disappearance, and recently won a favorable U.S. Court of Appeals ruling. The Justice Department continues to fight the order to release 68 volumes containing more than 13,800 pages.

■ **Jimmy Hoffa**, to longtime friend and associate Louis Lintean in his last recorded words: "Where the hell's Giacalone? He stood me up."

## What happened to them.

Here's an update on key players in the true-life Jimmy Hoffa story, now being adapted for a film starring Jack Nicholson as the Teamster leader, and Danny DeVito as a fictional sidekick. DeVito, who's also the director, brings his crew to Detroit March 17 for four to six weeks of shooting.

■ **Anthony "Tony Pro" Provenzano** died Dec. 12, 1988, of a heart attack at a California hospital near the federal prison where he was serving a 20-year sentence for labor racketeering. He was 71.



■ **Frank Fitzsimmons**, who became Teamsters president when Hoffa was jailed and then wouldn't step aside, died of lung cancer May 6, 1981. He was 73.

■ **Hoffa's widow, Josephine**, died Sept. 12, 1980, from a combination of cancer, heart problems and the lack of a will to live. She was 62—the same age as her husband when he disappeared.

■ **James P. Hoffa**, the Teamster leader's 50-year-old son, is a Detroit labor attorney whose bid for the

Provenzano union presidency was derailed last year on a bylaws technicality. He lives in Troy, Mich.

■ **Anthony Giacalone**, still dapper at 73, divides his time between a farm near Port Huron, where he raises Arabian horses, and a condo in North Miami Beach. He has been in prison twice since Hoffa's disappearance—once for tax evasion and once for gambling.

■ **Charles "Chuckie" O'Brien**, 58, was convicted of minor crimes and spent 10 months behind bars in 1979. When last heard from, he was divorced a second time, bankrupt, about to lose his \$90,000-a-year Teamster job and living in a rented room in Hallandale, Fla.

■ **Hoffa's daughter, Barbara Ann Crancer**, 54, is an administrative law judge in St. Louis, Mo. She sued in 1989 to open FBI files on her father's disappearance, and recently won a favorable U.S. Court of Appeals ruling. The Justice Department continues to fight the order to release 68 volumes containing more than 13,800 pages.

## What they said

■ **Jimmy Hoffa**, to longtime friend and associate Louis Linteau in his last recorded words: "Where the hell's Giacalone? He stood me up."

■ **Kenneth P. Walton**, retired FBI agent who headed the Detroit office, 1985-88: "I know who did it, but it's never going to be prosecuted because . . . we would have to divulge information, confidential sources."

■ **Charles "Chuckie" O'Brien**: "If I was with the old man that day, for whatever reason, I'd be gone too. They'd-a-had to go through me to get to him."

■ **Vincente Piersante**, former organized crime chief for Michigan's attorney general: "Hoffa's disappearance did a lot of good for law enforcement. If Jimmy ever wanted to get a measure of revenge against the mob for refusing to back him (in his fight with Fitzsimmons), he certainly got it in his death."

■ **Anthony Provenzano**, to Detroit News reporters at his Florida home in 1975: "If and when I decide to have something to say to you guys, I'll call you."

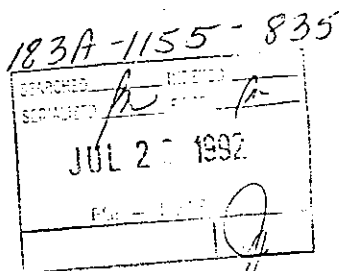

# Ex-con says he helped drown Hoffa

DETROIT NEWS STAFF

NEW YORK — A 70-year-old self-proclaimed hit man claims in a television interview to be aired today that he helped murder Teamsters boss Jimmy Hoffa in 1975.

The ex-convict, interviewed by *A Current Affair*, says he was one of four men who assassinated Hoffa.

The man, who says he is dying of emphysema and wants to set the record straight, claims three men kidnapped Hoffa from a Detroit area restaurant and delivered him to a junk yard outside Detroit.

Hoffa was then transferred to a van and driven to Chicago where he was drugged several times with a needle, the man says.

Arriving at the shores of Lake Michigan, Hoffa was transferred to a yacht where the alleged hit man and three other accomplices motored to another place near the shoreline, according to the report.

"When we anchored, Sal (a purported accomplice) said, 'Let's get on with it.' And then he came in the back and ordered us to strip the man down, bare skin naked. Under the seat were these cast leg pegs ... and they were then taped with two inch tape to the lower legs of Jimmy to be used as weights," the man says.

Hoffa reportedly was dropped over the side while he was still alive but unconscious.

"When the bubbles stopped coming up, we upped the anchor, started the motor and went back," says the man, who claims he received \$25,000 in cash from the accomplice named

Sal for the deal.

The man said Hoffa tried to bribe them with half a million dollars to call the deal off, but when that was rejected, "he never begged for his life ... he was tough ... was a man."

The shows producers say the man has passed a lie detector test.

FBI agent John Anthony, the former public relations spokesman for the Detroit FBI office, said:

"We are not making any comment on the Hoffa case. We've been asked not to comment until the lawsuit filed by Hoffa's daughter is cleared up."

Hoffa's daughter, Barbara Ann Crancer, filed a Freedom of Information lawsuit against the FBI in 1989. Crancer, who is an administrative law judge in St. Louis, won a favorable ruling in March from the U.S.

Court of Appeals.

However, the U.S. Justice Department continues to fight the court order to release 68 volumes of FBI documents containing more than 13,800 pages.

Hoffa's body has never been found and no one has ever been arrested in the case.

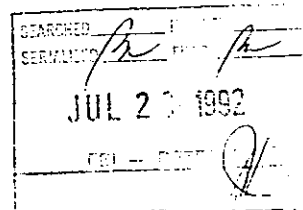
