

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

We rode on Bayshore Boulevard in my gray Mercedes-Benz, heading toward downtown alongside Tampa Bay. When I reached the northern end, I made a U-turn — a circuit we repeated as Santo spoke. -

After reviewing other memories, he said wistfully: "Marteduzzo was a good man" — referring to Team-sters union leader Jimmy Hoffa with a Sicilian code name.

Maybe_I made a mistake. ... He was a good man. It's a shame what happened to him.

For the first time in our three decades together, I asked a direct question about a Mafia mystery: Santo, there is something you have to tell me. What did happen to Marteduzzo?

He stared at the bay a few seconds before replying My friends up north had become very close with Fitz (Frank Fitzsimmons, Hoffa's successor as Team sters head) and it looked like Marteduzzo was going to win his (federal legal) case and come back to the union. My friends didn't want him back.

They got along better with Fitz. he made more (pension fund) loans than Marteduzzo did. They didn't like him stalking to that (book) writer. They thought if Martedurzo got back to the union, he was going to make trouble for them they were worried that he was talking about the loans and saying he had the goods to send people to

You remember I told you to tell ey). It was dangerous. You rememher me telling you that?

I replied: I do, and I talked to Marteduzzo about that. But Santo, the man couldn't have lived unless he got back in the union. That was his life, you know that."

My passenger said: "But Frank,

he trusted too many people and a lot of them double-crossed him. And you remember, just before he disappeared, I told you to tell him to be careful = not to do anything stuhid I fnew what was going to happen, but I couldn't tell because if word got back to my friends, I would have had a problem.

When Marteduzzo put a bomb in Fitz's son's car, Fitz thought he'd gone crazy and that the next thing he'd try to do was to kill him. Fitz got in touch with Tony Pro (Anthony Provenzano). He knew that Tony Pro hated Marteduzzo's guts. Tony Pro was a dangerous lunatic crazy, out of control

"Fitz met Tony Pro in Washington in a hotel room where Tony was staying. They talked and they decided they had to get rid of Marteduzzo before it was too late."

'His word of honor'

Santo stopped. He seemed to collect his breath before resuming.

"A few days after he saw Fitz, Santo continued, Tony Pro went to Detroit and had a meeting with Tony Jack (Anthony Giacalone). They rode around in a car and Tony Pro told Tony Jack that it looked like Marteduzzo was losing his mind and that he might try and kill Then Tony Pro told Tony Jack that he had talked to the

people in New York and it was all right with them to get rid of Marteduzzo.

Tony Pro said that Tony Jack would have to get Chuckie O'Brien, Hoffa's protege, to set Marteduzzo up because he trusted Chuckie and would go with him. That was the only way they thought they could get to Marteduzzo.

Tony Pro said, If you give me your word that Chuckie won't talk, then nothing will happen to him. Tony Jack gave his word of honor that Chuckie would keep quiet after they took care of Marteduzzo.

To get to Marteduzzo and to set up a meeting with him, they had to go through that guy with the limousine business, the guy Marteduzzo was partners with.

Louis Linteau, I thought to myself. He was a former Teamster official in Pontiac who had served a prison term for extortion. When Jimmy disappeared, he was running an airport limousine service in Pontiac and Jimmy was his silent

partner. Jimmy had been using him to set up meetings with people.

Again, Santo had trouble breathing, and from the corner of my eye I saw him brush perspiration from his face. He halted a few minutes before recovering his strength and voice.

In the meantime, Tony Jack got in touch with Chuckie and told him that he was setting up a meeting between Marteduzzo and Tony Pro to work out their problems.

Two days later - on March 17, 1987 — Santo's son-in-law Augie Paniello called me at the office. "The old man died," he said. Santo, at the age of 72, had failed to survive the bypass operation.






If you ever find out anything more of Mr. Hoffa, would you please let me know. If you find his body, perhaps you could move him from place to place to see how many people you could catch.


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

Dearborn, Michigan, was advised of the identity of the interviewing Agents and the purpose of the interview. She then provided the following information:

JIMMY HOFFA is buried in the basement of a farm house near the intersection of Pike and Kysar Roads near Ionia, Michigan. She was present in July of 1975 when a body was buried in the house's basement and another one in a mass grave. The mass grave is located in a corn field behind the house. One of the three people burying the bodies looked like JAMES P. HOFFA One of the other men was carrying a shotgun. After (Jr.). observing the burial she began to walk around the property, but she was hemmed in by a six foot barbed wire fence. At that time she was chased by a bull who kneed her in the back when they rolled down a hill together. The bull rolled off of her and then charged three small trees four times. On the fourth charge the bull collapsed and she escaped two and one half hours later by crawling under the fence where she deeply scarred her bottom, which she offered to show the interviewing Agents (the offer was declined). After escaping the bull she ran to a nearby white farmhouse (since destroyed) and saw an acquaintance, let her in the house because she had (died in 1976). (died in 1976). While in the bathroom she cleaned the blood off her face and threw the towel on the floor and ran outside. helped her drive away but mentioned during the drive that she and HOFFA would make great grave mates.

TER 29 MY HANDS WERE TIED"

The call came on a Friday morning, March 13, 1987. Over the telephone the thin, weary voice was almost unrecognizable, and it took several seconds for me to identify it as Santo's. He spoke in Sicilian, in uncustomary staccato phrases, and between long gasps I could hear him wheezing. "Frank, please come and see me today. Things are not good. I want to talk to you. It's very important."

To maintain our association on a businesslike basis, I suggested he come to my office.

"No, Frank, it's impossible. And I don't want to talk over the phone. Believe me, it's important."

Decades of association with Santo had taught me that he was a man of understatement. The formal barriers I had erected between us were steep and he would have been too proud to grovel for an urgent meeting unless the situation was grave. Seven months had passed since the RICO case, and we had not spoken after parting on the courthouse steps on the day the charges against him had been dismissed. Some two months after the trial, Nancy and I were dining at Lauro's restaurant when Santo, looking more robust than he had at the trial, walked in with several relatives and waved at us. I nodded back stiffly but Nancy refused to recognize his salutation. He sent a bottle of wine to our table that Nancy wanted me to send back. Not to cause a scene, I accepted the wine, with a curt nod to Santo.

Driving to his home on that Friday afternoon, I was unable to anticipate what new legal scrape he might be in. The labor-racketeering charges in Miami had been dropped and there had been no hint through the legal grapevine or in the newspapers that a new indictment was brewing

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against him. Regardless of his problems, I was determined to reject him as a client. The RICO trial had been my court finale with Santo.

As I pulled into the driveway of his home in Parkland Estates, I wondered if the FBI still maintained an observation post a hundred feet away, on the other side of a triangular-shaped parklet that divided the roadway. Did they still bother to check periodically on license-plate numbers to determine who visited Santo, and did they still shadow him? The Parkland Estates had been one of Tampa's ritziest neighborhoods when Santo moved in, thirty-five years earlier, but new and more affluent waterfront developments supplanted it as one of the city's upscale sections. Santo's ranch-style home, with its yellow bricks and white-tiled barrel roof, still looked comfortable, but like the rest of the area it now seemed plain, middle class, and undistinguished.

For security purposes and to prevent lawmen from easily breaking into his home in a surprise raid, Santo had long ago installed a filigreed-metal gate at the front entrance. Later he also placed vertical

metal bars on all the windows of the one-story house.

Josie opened the front door and, fiddling with keys, unlocked the gate. Ever the traditional wife, she wore a plain housedress. She looked drawn and worried, but before we could exchange greetings Santo stepped out of the shadows from the master bedroom in the rear of the foyer. Dressed in gray pajamas and a matching terry-cloth robe, he wobbled in a flat-footed gait rather than walked. He had aged radically. His cheeks were hollow, his skin wrinkled like parchment. He must have lost twenty or thirty pounds and weighed no more than 130, compared to his normal weight of 170 or 180 pounds in his prime. There was no longer any mystery about this emergency meeting. Santo was dying.

He welcomed me without a handshake or an embrace, indicating with a quick motion of his head that I should follow him into the crescent-shaped Florida or family room to the left of the foyer. The living room, decorated in French Provincial style, with brocade upholstered couches and chairs, and paintings of Paris street scenes on the wall, was on the right of the foyer. When we were cumbati, conversations in the living room dealt with banal matters that Santo considered uncompromising. The crescent-shaped room was where we discussed sensitive legal or financial affairs because Santo, for some reason, believed it was secure from electronic eavesdropping. The rattan furniture in the room could hold six or seven people comfortably, but during our private meetings, the room was off-limits to Santo's relatives. Although eight windows could provide ample light, the room was in semi-darkness with

venetian blinds and drapes drawn over each window.

"I want to talk to you privately," he said, flicking on the television. Even here, he always turned on the TV or radio to interfere with possible bugs. I sat in a chair, but Santo motioned me to sit next to him on the couch.

"Frank, there are a lot of things I have to tell you," he began. "You know I had a bypass operation about a year ago in Houston. I thought everything was going to be all right, but I've been having a lot of problems lately, a lot of chest pains. I've been taking a lot of Nitrostat. My arteries are clogged up all over again and I need another bypass surgery."

His voice was so feeble that the TV audio almost drowned him out, and I inched closer to hear more clearly as he continued talking slowly in Sicilian.

"My cardiologist tells me that if I don't have another bypass, I'll live maybe six months, a year at the most. If I have the bypass, I can have another two or three years. But my cardiologist and kidney specialist here in Tampa say my kidneys are so bad that I won't make it. I went to Houston where I had the first operation, and they tell me dialysis doesn't matter and I can have the surgery. So what it means is that if I don't have the operation, I'll live less than a year. If I have it and it's successful, I have another couple of years."

He had difficulty speaking and paused frequently to regain his breath.

"I decided to roll the dice and take my chances with the bypass. Frank, the chances are I won't be coming back. That's the reason I want to talk to you."

It was hard to believe that Santo would ever acknowledge a wrong, but I thought he was leading up to a deathbed apology for the harm he had caused me and my family. Instead he rambled on about his regrets concerning his own life.

"Looking back, I see I made a lot of mistakes. I thought we would never stop making all that money in Cuba; those were great times. But I made a mistake putting so much money into Cuba, and it wasn't fair to my brothers. Some of it was theirs. Who would have known that crazy guy, Castro, was going to take over and close the casinos?"

His thoughts turned to the Teamsters' pension-fund loans that both of us had been involved in. "We met a lot of crazy guys: Ashley, Rizzo, Steve in Las Vegas. Remember Ashley? You know, he gave me \$3,000 cash every month for the hospital loan, and he even brought it

to Tampa when I was here. He was some guy. Every Christmas he gave

me a big bonus. It was good pocket money."

I listened with dismay. For twenty years Santo collected \$3,000 every month and a "Christmas bonus" for the Hialeah hospital loan, a deal in which Ashley had cheated me out of my share. Santo had secretly worked out a separate arrangement with Ashley. Had Santo given me \$1,000 a month of that \$3,000 when I was destitute, it would have been a lifesaver. He kept it for himself as mere pocket money.

Wrapped in his own reveries Santo was oblivious to how his hospi-

tal deal with Ashley, at my expense, might have affected me.

"Another thing, if I had to do it over again, I don't think I would get married. A man is better off without a wife and children. I should never have gotten close to the wives and children of people I do business with, because you come to like their families and when they do something wrong and you have to do something to them, you start worrying about their families."

It was another revelation. Santo was indirectly admitting that he had ordered the murders of disloyal members of his organization. The first name that came to mind was Joe Bedami, who had worked for Santo and had been my client before he vanished from the face of the earth in the early 1960s.

"We need to take a ride, Frank," he commanded sharply. In the past, an automobile trip was a signal that it was a matter of utmost secrecy.

He shuffled out of the room and returned quickly, still dressed in his pajamas and bathrobe. All he had added to his attire was a cloth cap.

"Aren't you dressing?" I asked.

"I can't," he explained, unbuttoning his pajama top to point to a colostomy bag, the size of a large orange, attached to the right side of his abdomen. "It's miserable and uncomfortable," he added morosely. Until then, I had been unaware that in addition to his other medical problems, he had undergone a colonectomy.

"Josie, we're going to take a ride," he announced, in the loudest

voice he could muster, as he headed toward the door.

"You can't go out looking like that," she said, emerging from the kitchen, hesitating before she pulled out the key to the metal gate.

"I want to talk to Frank," he said in his old imperious manner.

"Look after him," Josie whispered to me in Sicilian.

The few steps down from the door to my car were difficult for him

to manage. If the FBI was watching he must have presented a strange sight: a shrunken old man, in billowing pajamas, an oversized bathrobe, and inelegant cap, tottering in slippers from his doorway. Without my help and after a slight struggle with the door, he seated himself with a sigh of fatigue in my gray Mercedes-Benz.

"Is there any particular place you want to go?" I asked.

"Wherever you feel like. I just want to talk."

The temperature was in the low eighties, a breezeless day with a velvet, azure sky. I drove toward Bayshore Boulevard, which was four or five minutes away. Curving gently around Hillsborough Bay, the boulevard was the most scenic road in Tampa. With only two traffic lights and little traffic, it would be an ideal route for our drive.

Santo began talking again about Cuba. "Remember I told you we would look back on those times, and they would seem like the good old days. You struggle all your life and then one day it's all over, Che, and you say, 'What happened to the time, where did it go?'"

For the first time since our split in 1976, he called me by the affec-

tionate nickname he had given me-"Che."

The car was well insulated against outside noise and, without competition from a TV set, his voice was clearer. Suddenly, without a logical transition, his talk shifted to the Kennedys.

"That Bobby made life miserable for me and my friends. The biggest mistake of my life was not taking pictures of the president when he was in Cuba; that was a bad mistake." His memory was of the 1950s when he and his casino partner, Evaristo Garcia, had set up Senator John Kennedy in the Commodoro Hotel with three prostitutes in a room with a two-way mirror.

"Who would have thought that someday he would be president and he would name his goddamn brother attorney general? Goddamn Bobby. I think Carlos fucked up in getting rid of Giovanni—maybe it should have been Bobby."

To my astonishment, abruptly and without warning, he was confessing that he and Carlos Marcello had conspired to kill the president. "Giovanni" was John in Italian. I considered pulling over to a side street and parking so we could discuss this fully, but I drove on as he repeated the admission.

Those electrifying words—Carlos é futtutu. Non duvevamu ammazzari a Giovanni. Duvevamu ammazzari a Bobby ("We shouldn't have killed Giovanni. We should have killed Bobby,")—struck with the force of a sledgehammer. My thoughts whirled in confusion, and suddenly I realized that I was driving in a semi-trance. I steeled myself to pay attention to the

road and the oncoming traffic. A rational element in me cried out to stop, to listen, to flesh out in a careful, lawyerly fashion the details of Santo's involvement in the conspiracy and murder. But a contradictory impulse made me want to stifle all thoughts of Kennedy's death and my possible complicity in the assassination. Now the facts and clues that I had subconsciously suppressed for more than two decades could no longer be ignored: Carlos, Santo, and Jimmy undoubtedly had roles in Kennedy's death; they had planned to murder him and they used me as an unwitting accomplice in their scheme. Most likely I had delivered the message, or signal, from Hoffa that he was desperate to proceed with the assassination. Wrestling with conflicting emotions I was too stunned to ask coherent questions about Kennedy's death. The ritual I had practiced all those years when I had been intimidated and fearful of prying into Santo's Mafia business still controlled my tongue. I remained silent, crushed with humiliation, waiting for Santo to continue, although every word he had said about Kennedy was a stake driven into my heart.

We drove in silence for several minutes. Santo stared straight ahead, his hands trembling on his knees. He made no attempt to establish eye contact with me or to ever a several minutes.

contact with me or to gauge my reaction to his revelations.

The four-and-a-half-mile drive on Bayshore Boulevard took about ten minutes. When I reached the northern end as we approached downtown Tampa, I made a U-turn. Perhaps as an escape mechanism to block out the harsh reality of Santo's disclosure, my mind flashed back to happier associations with Bayshore Boulevard. In my lifetime, almost every area of Tampa had been transformed or bulldozed by urban development. The only section that had not been inexorably altered was Bayshore Boulevard. Almost a half century ago, I bicycled along the boulevard, delivering newspapers to the stately white and pastel-colored homes that still existed—gracious houses that seemed as timeless as the bay. On the other side of the four-lane roadway, the clamoring gulls and cranes swooped over the water or rested on the railings along the promenade, the same place from which I, as a boy, gazed enviously at the full sweep of elegant homes, fantasizing that one day I also would have the wealth to live there. In high school and in my teenage years, Bayshore Boulevard had been the romantic setting for moonlight drives with girls, sentimental ballads playing on the car radio. The boulevard was a link to my innocent past, the time before I knew Santo Trafficante and before there was the slightest scar on my conscience.

Santo interrupted my musings by bringing up the subject of Jimmy

Hoffa. I was grateful that he was not talking about President Kennedy.

"Marteduzzo was a good man," Santo said. "Maybe I made a mistake there, too, Che. Maybe if I hadn't recommended you to my friends in Chicago to represent Marteduzzo you wouldn't have had all the problems you had."

For the first time in his recollections he hinted at regret for my difficulties, but he was twisting the facts. My representation of Jimmy might have added to the government's zeal to get me, but the main reason I became a target was because of my ties to Santo.

"He was a good man," Santo said wistfully of Jimmy. "It's a shame what happened to him."

Unlike the agony I felt hearing Santo admit to his part in the Kennedy assassination, I felt no guilt or self-condemnation about Jimmy's death, and for the first time in our three decades together I asked Santo a direct question about a Mafia mystery. "Santo, there is something you have to tell me," I said finally. "What did happen to Marteduzzo?"

He stared at the bay for a few seconds before replying. "My friends up North had become very close with Fitz, and it looked like Marteduzzo was going to win his case and come back to the union. My friends didn't want him back. They got along better with Fitz; he made more loans than Marteduzzo did. They didn't like him talking to that writer. They thought if Marteduzzo got back to the union he was going to make trouble for them, and they were worried that he was talking about the loans and saying he had the goods to send people to jail.

"You remember I told you to tell him not to say Fitz was making bad loans. It was dangerous. You remember me telling you that?"

"I do, and I talked to Marteduzzo about that," I said. "But Santo, the man couldn't have lived unless he got back in the union. That was his life, you know that."

"But Che, he trusted too many people and a lot of them doublecrossed him. And you remember, just before he disappeared, I told you to tell him to be careful, not to do anything stupid. I knew what was going to happen, but I couldn't tell you because if word got back to my friends, I would have had a problem.

"When Marteduzzo put a bomb in Fitz's son's car, Fitz thought he'd gone crazy and that the next thing he'd try to do was to kill him. Fitz got in touch with Tony Pro [Anthony "Tough Tony" Provenzano]. He knew that Tony Pro hated Marteduzzo's guts. Tony Pro was a dangerous lunatic, crazy, out of control. You remember that fight he had with Marteduzzo in prison?

"Fitz met Tony Pro in Washington in a hotel room where Tony was staying. They talked and they decided they had to get rid of Marteduzzo before it was too late."

Santo stopped. He seemed to be collecting his breath before resuming. I kept driving the entire north-south length of Bayshore Boulevard, making U-turns at each end.

"A few days after he saw Fitz," Santo continued, "Tony Pro went to Detroit and had a meeting with Tony Jack [Anthony Giacalone]. They rode around in a car and Tony Pro told Tony Jack that it looked like Marteduzzo was losing his fucking mind and that he might try and kill Fitz. Then Tony Pro told Tony Jack that he had talked to the people in New York and it was all right with them to get rid of Marteduzzo. Tony Pro said that Tony Jack would have to get Chuckie to set Marteduzzo up because he trusted Chuckie and would go with him. That was the only way they thought they could get to Marteduzzo.

"Tony Jack didn't want to get Chuckie involved. He told Tony Pro that Chuckie is like family to him, like his nephew. [Chuckie's mother had been Tony Jack's lover.] He couldn't let anything happen to him. Tony Pro said, 'If you give me your word that Chuckie won't talk, then nothing will happen to him.' Tony Jack gave his word of honor that Chuckie would keep quiet after they took care of Marteduzzo.

"To get to Marteduzzo and to set up a meeting with him, they had to go through that guy with the limousine business, the guy Marteduzzo was partners with; I forget the guy's name."

Louis Linteau, I thought to myself. He was a former Teamster official in Pontiac who had served a prison term for extortion. When Jimmy disappeared, he was running an airport limousine service in Pontiac and Jimmy was his silent partner. Jimmy had been using him as a gofer to set up meetings with people.

Again, Santo had trouble breathing, and from the corner of my eye I saw him brush perspiration from his face. He halted for a few minutes before recovering his strength and his voice.

"In the meantime, Tony Jack got in touch with Chuckie and told him that he was setting up a meeting between Marteduzzo and Tony Pro to work out their problems. The afternoon of the meeting, Chuckie went by the parking lot at that restaurant near Detroit. Marteduzzo was expecting Tony Jack to pick him up and, when Chuckie drove up, Marteduzzo asked what the hell he was doing there. Chuckie told him that Tony Jack wanted him to pick Marteduzzo up because he didn't think it was a good idea for them to

be seen together in public. Chuckie said he was going to drive him to

the meeting with Tony Pro and Tony Jack.

"Poor Chuckie; they used him. He didn't know what was going on, and he followed Tony Jack's orders and drove Marteduzzo to this gas station. It was empty—a closed gas station where they were supposed to meet Tony Jack. When they got to the gas station they drove to the rear. Tony Jack had picked it because the gas station was empty-and there was a large billboard in the front, on the road, that made it impossible to see anything in the back of the station.

"Chuckie pulled around to the back of the building where the rest rooms were, and these two guys were waiting in a Lincoln, the

Briguglio brothers."

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"Who?" I interrupted.

"Sal Briguglio and his brother, Gabe; they're Tony Pro's men," Santo explained. "They were in the Lincoln and Marteduzzo got out and started walking toward the car. While he was walking Tommy Andretta..."

"Who's he," I asked.

"Tommy was another of Tony Pro's men," Santo said. "He'd been hiding in the rest room and he came out and put a gun next to Chuckie's head and he told him, 'Make one move and I'll blow your fucking brains out.'

"While he was saying this to Chuckie, Sal came out of the Lincoln with a gun pointed at Marteduzzo. Marteduzzo started running toward Sal, and the other brother came out of the other side of the Lincoln and got behind Marteduzzo and hit him on the back of the head with his gun. They hit him until he was knocked out and dragged him into the backseat of the Lincoln.

"They put a rope around his neck and choked him to death. Tommy was watching Chuckie and told him if he ever said anything he would be a dead man. He told Chuckie to get the hell away from there and Chuckie took off."

"What did they do with his body?" I asked.

"I don't know that and I never asked." Santo slumped in his seat and mumbled, "He was a good man. Maybe if you had gotten ahold of him, he'd still be alive today."

We had driven back and forth on Bayshore Boulevard for an hour, and Santo seemed exhausted. We returned to his home in silence. I pulled up as close as I could to his door and, for five or ten minutes, neither of us said a word. He looked drained, too fatigued to go on.

"Che," he finally whispered, "I knew how much you liked Marteduzzo. I wish I could have stopped it, but my hands were tied."

"Tell Josie to call me after the operation and let me know how you're doing," I said to break the silence that had crept over us again.

"Josie thinks I'm going to be back, but I don't think so."

He had trouble opening the door and alighted from the car with difficulty. After taking one or two faltering steps toward his house turned back, and leaned through the open car window. "Che, I guess this is good-bye. Che, please remember, there was nothing I could do about Marteduzzo. My hands were tied. Capici? [You understand?]"

I drove away, feeling more wretched than ever before in my life. Driving randomly, I wanted to reconsider everything he had said while it was fresh in my mind. During our long relationship Santo withheld information from me, but I had never known him to lie to my face. Now, with a life-threatening operation imminent, he would certainly relate the truth.

Racing through my mind were fragments of conversations with Santo, Carlos, and Jimmy that touched upon Kennedy's assassination—a kaleidoscope of events that now made sense. In my loyalty to the three men I had ignored basic logic and obvious hints: each of them had participated actively or behind the scenes in the assassination. They had been part of a conspiracy, or knew that one had been hatched against Kennedy's life. Most probably, Carlos and Santo plotted against the president for their own selfish reasons—not just to aid Jimmy Hoffa. Jimmy could not have intimidated or given orders to these powerful Mafia bosses. His personal war with the Kennedys may have influenced them, but it was not the sole factor guiding them.

Santo's description of Hoffa's death and the reasons for his murder was undoubtedly accurate. The way he pictured Jimmy trying to hurl himself at the gunman dovetailed perfectly with the explanation Jimmy had offered after he was shot by a pellet gun in the Nashville courtroom: always charge a gunman and flee from an assailant with a knife, he had advised so confidently.

Santo knew beforehand that a hit was planned. Days before Jimmy disappeared, Santo had urged me to warn Jimmy of an imminent threat. In addition to being guilt-ridden about President Kennedy's assassination, I now bore the remorse of having failed to alert Jimmy. It was small consolation to know that even if I had contacted him, my vague warning probably would have gone unheeded. He was obsessed

with challenging Fitz, and the Northern mobsters were determined to eliminate him. Nevertheless, I had misread Santo's alarm and had

tried only halfheartedly to reach Jimmy on the telephone.

Deep in the recesses of Santo's conscience, he perhaps understood that he was responsible for the death of a president and an incalculable alteration of history. But be showed no contrition for the consequences of that act; he could only regret that the Rennedys had created problems for him. His confession was as cold-blooded, unrepentant, and selfish as the ethos that had governed his life.

It had escaped his attention that he had betrayed me and caused suffering to my family. I could never forgive him for hiding facts about Sam Rizzo's Mafia background, steering me into a tax-evasion convic-

tion, and then discarding me when I needed financial help.

No apology was forthcoming from him, no gratitude for my having helped him escape from Fidel Castro's firing squad and from prison sentences in the United States. What he had offered were unremorseful explanations for his actions and always that lame excuse, "My hands were tied." Those were the identical words he used when it was a question of standing by me in the tax-evasion investigation or protecting Rizzo, the man his Northern pals wanted to safeguard.

"My hands were tied" was his rationale for permitting the murder of

Jimmy Hoffa.

Enfeebled and ill, he had no one but me to talk to and confide in. Carlos Marcello, his most trusted Mafia ally, was in prison. Santo had always withheld his darkest secrets from his brothers and the underlings in his organization, believing they were too unreliable or unintelligent to be confidants. He still viewed me as the protégé who would be sympathetic to his egotistical musings on life, someone he could burden with his problems. That was my legacy from him.

Santo, who had always frowned on raw profanity, had uncharacteristically used it when speaking of the Kennedy assassination and Hoffa's murder. He was shedding the restraints of a lifetime. For the first time

he had spoken freely, and in crude language, of Mafia crimes.

That weekend I researched the backgrounds of the men Santo had identified as the killers of Jimmy Hoffa. There were two Briguglio brothers who had been close to Tony Pro-Salvatore, known as "Sally Bugs," and Gabriel, called "Gabe." The third man, Tommy Andretta. was another enforcer in Provenzano's family. The trio had been among a score of Provenzano's men who had been questioned and released by the FBI in the early days of the Hoffa investigation.

Three years after Jimmy's disappearance, in March 1978, Sally Bugs was gunned down by two hooded men on a street corner in New York's Little Italy section. Later that year, Tony Pro, Gabe Briguglio, and Tommy Andretta were each sentenced to long prison terms for labor racketeering. Tony Pro never completed his sentence, dying of a heart attack in prison.

On the Sunday after our meeting, Santo flew to Houston and entered the Texas Heart Institute. Two days later, on Tuesday, March 17, 1987, Santo's son-in-law Augie Paniello called me at the office. "The old man died," he said. Santo, at the age of seventy-two, had failed to survive the bypass operation.

A private funeral was held for him at the L'Unione Italiana Cemetery, a burial ground established by an Italian immigrants' fraternal association from Ybor City. More than a hundred relatives and invited mourners watched as his silver-colored coffin, blanketed with red roses, was interred in a vault in an above-ground mausoleum.

Santo's loyal followers from his organization attended. But none of the new breed of Mafioso dons from other cities came or sent a representative to show their respect, a time-honored Mafia tradition when a major Cosa Nostra figure dies a natural death. Santo's generation of godfathers—Sam Giancana from Chicago, Tommy Lucchese and Carlo Gambino from New York—were dead. His cumbate and closest ally, Carlos Marcello, was in prison.

There was no church service or requiem mass. At the cemetery, I looked on as a prayer for Santo's soul was offered by a priest, Monsignor Lawrence Higgins, who may have summarized his existence in a handful of words:

"A lot of people judged him on earth. But the final judge will be God."

During the latter part of November, source contacted me telephonically to determine whether or not the letter had been received and what the FBI's response was. Source was advised at that time that the FBI does not provide money for information "on the come" and indicated to the source that he would have to have some significant information, perhaps including physical evidence, to generate enough interest in pursuing discussion concerning any significant payment, let alone payment of \$4 million dollars.

The source stated that he is confident that he can provide information which will lead to the solution of the Hoffa case. Although he did not offer any specifics, he stated that he believes that the Bureau has conducted an exhaustive investigation and he has followed many aspects of the case. He is familiar with a number of the personalities under suspicion by the FBI and knows many details of the case as determined through discussion with him after my reviewing the case synopsis provided by the case agent. Source advised that while the Bureau's investigation to date has been thorough, we have not been looking in the right place, ie. the disappearance of Hoffa and his murder are not connected in any way with traditional organized crime or the Teamsters Union.

Beyond this information, source has not provided anything further of significance on which to base an opinion as to the worth of his information.

Shortly following this conversation, the matter was discussed with Detroit SSA ASAC John Bell, and FBIHQ SSA I was determined that it is prudent to pursue the potential information which this source potentially possesses. However, the monetary demands of the source are unrealistic.

On 12/13/95, I recontracted source and advised that the FBI is willing to meet and talk with him at any time but that until such time as some significant information is furnished there can be no agreement as to monetary compensation and that, under any circumstances, it is very unlikely that the Bureau would meet the monetary expectations in this matter which source has.

Sources monetary expectations are based on a combination of reasons. First, he states that his current personal net worth can be documented at between

dollars. He believes that if he furnishes the information in his possession that the individuals responsible for the disappearance of Hoffa will quickly determine who the source is and he will have to go in to hiding outside of the country and have to abandon his assets. Source is uninterested in any aspect of the government's witness protection program. Second, he contends that the solution of this case should be a matter of pride for the FBI and opines that the Bureau has probably spent much more than \$4 million on the investigation of this matter to date without any significant success. Source contacted me because at the time of our first series of meetings associated with the was of the opinion that because of my position as a representative of the FBI and Attorney General I would have direct access to the Directors office and/or the highest levels of the Bureau.

In our discussion, I countered with the proposal that instead of paying the source \$4 million, the FBI could work with him to ensure his property and interests are protected in the event that he had to go into hiding. I pointed out that, under his proposal, even if he had to flee he would still maintain all of his assets or be able to transfer them and his argument concerning his personal position was not realistic.

The sources final position in this discussion was that he would meet with any knowledgeable representative of the FBI and tell his complete story and continue to make himself available at any time and at any place. The FBI would have as long as it wanted to determine the veracity and accuracy of his information through discussions and investigation. If the information that he provides is not completely truthful and verifiable, the FBI owes him nothing. However, should his information prove to be accurate, reliable, and a case prosecutable he would then be entitled to \$4 million dollars, plus an additional \$1 million for each arrest and conviction.

Hoffa exults in victory

Teamsters chief calls for diminished role by overseers.

By Richard A. Ryan Senior Washington Correspondent

WASHINGTON — Top aides to James P. Hoffa moved into the Teamsters union's "Marble Palace" national head-quarters today to go over financial and personnel records as the newly elected president acted quickly to grab control of the giant union.

Hoffa also insisted it is time for the government to "move on" and relinquish its 10-year supervisory control of the union.

In a Monday press conference celebrating his victory, Hoffa said he wants to move immediately to restore the union's battered finances by cutting "a bloated payroll, bloated legal fees."

"It is going to be our role to immediately institute safeguards for the budget and make sure that \$88 million (annual revenues) is spent for the benefit of members," Hoffa said.

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

But Hoffa has to wait at least 15 days to allow for post-election protests before Michael Cherkasky, the federally appointed election officer, can formally certify his victory. The certification delay could take longer if a protest must be investigated.

Hoffa said he hopes he can officially take office no later than lan. 2.

With the federally supervised election completed, Hoffa said he thinks it is time for the government now to take "a diminished role" in its supervision of the 1.4-million member union.

The Teamsters have been under federal control since 1989 when the union entered into a consent decree with the Justice Department in settlement of a civil racketeering suit charging the union with being dominated by organized crime.

Hoffa said the consent decree is open-ended and could result in the government maintaining its supervisory role "for the next 100 years, the next 200 years."

"A lot of the work by the government has been done," Hoffa said. "They have eliminated certain pockets of corruption in the union. It is time for us to move on."

But Cherkasky said a continuing government role is warranted.

"The consent decree is the most important government effort to combat organized crime and it has made great progress,"

he said.

Hoffa promised the union would demonstrate "a new militancy" in organizing and contract negotiations.

Recognizing that the union's membership is dropping. Hoffa said it is critical for the Teamsters to come up with "new and innovative" ways of attracting people other than traditional truck drivers to join the union.

He sees new opportunities in organizing health care workers, particularly those in nursing homes, public employes, food warehousers and regional truck drivers.

"We're going to spend a lot of time on organizing because that is the only way any union can survive today," he said.

He also said he has a plan to resolve lingering disputes from the former Detroit newspapers strike, but refused to divulge what he might do. He said he and Detroit union leaders "are constantly talking about new approaches to getting that strike settled." He later confided: "We will settle that strike."

Hoffa said he intends to "reach out" to Teamsters who opposed him. "This is the time to be magnanimous," he said. "We have won a resounding victory."

Hoffa said his father, the legendary James Riddle Hoffa, who headed the union in the 1950s and 60s, "would be happy that I won. He would be excited about it."

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

Just days before his disappearance in 1975, Jimmy Hoffa granted an interview to then-WXYZ-TV (Channel 7) reporter Jerry Stanecki, which later appeared in Playboy.

In the interview, Hoffa rails against his handpicked successor Frank Fitzsimmons, both Jack and Bobby Kennedy ("creep... creep..."), John Dean and Charles Colson, but defends Richard Nixon, Jim Garrison, Teddy Kennedy and several reputed organized crime figures.

Hoffa admitted to being a millionaire, but refused to comment on whether he was a billionaire or a "zillionaire."

Hoffa was furious with Fitzsimmons, because he in effect gave Fitzsimmons leadership of the Teamsters while he was in prison on jury tampering charges, but Fitzsimmons wouldn't give it up when his sentence was commuted by President Nixon.

And he charged that Dean and Colson added the provision prohibiting him from becoming president of the Teamsters again without the president's knowledge.

Hoffa had sympathy for anyone who'd been raked over the coals by the media or the courts. While he disliked Jack and Bobby Kennedy, he liked Teddy Kennedy. He seemed convinced that Teddy would be drafted at the 1976 Democratic convention, and win. Chappaquiddick wouldn't be a problem, he said, because Teddy wasn't convicted of a serious crime.

He also professed a disbelief in the Mafia or organized crime, and insisted some reputed organized crime figures were railroaded.

And he declared he didn't need a bodyguard, not because he had no enemies, but because if you have a bodyguard you're careless.

Some highlights from Stanecki's tapes:

■ On whether he has an ego: "Man don't have an ego if he don't have any money and he doesn't have any ambition. Certainly I got an ego."

■ On what's more important — power or money: "Power. Power gets money. (then) you got both."

■ On why Jack Kennedy was killed: "Who knows what deals he had that he didn't keep." Was it Fidel Castro? "That makes sense to me. They tried to kill him."

■ On whether Jim Garrison was a kook: "Jim Garrison's a smart man."

■ On whether Richard Nixon, who was in Dallas at the time, could have been involved: "He ain't that kind of guy."

■ On why Bobby Kennedy was killed: "He made a lot of deals with a lot of people and didn't keep 'em."

■ On why Martin Luther King was killed: "That's another story Fanatics, Ku Klux (Klan) ..."

■ On Frank Fitzsimmons: "He kept telling everybody, 'Don't do anything to rock the boat. I'm taking care of it with Mitchell.' He'd been lying all along."



The FBI believes Hoffa was quickly killed by two hit men from New Jersey. Then the body was either disposed of in a vat of molten zinc at an auto bumper plating facility owned by two partners with mob connections or burned in a Detroit incinerator.

An FBI memo titled "Hoffex," an outline of what likely happened based on interviews and collected information, does state who the agency believes was behind the murder, but those names have not been made public.

"My personal opinion is, this case will never be solved in terms of a prosecution, but it is solved in law enforcement parlance: who did it and how it happened," said John Anthony, a former FBI special agent who now heads the security division of Detroit Newspapers.

Anthony and others say investigators believe Hoffa made overtures to President Nixon to trade information on union corruption. It was discovered by mob leaders who then ordered the hit. Macomb County Prosecutor Carl Marlinga, who was serving on the U.S. Justice Department's organized crime strike task force in the 1970s, said two men from Clinton Township handled the destruction of Hoffa's body. Both men are still alive, he said.

"I think Jimmy Hoffa was a dedicated labor leader who was simply too confident of his own abilities," Marlinga said. "He really believed he could deal with organized crime people when he wanted to and it wasn't that easy."

Jerry Stanecki, an author and former television news reporter, spent six months with Hoffa before the disappearance as they worked on an extensive interview.

He said despite Hoffa's tough-guy persona, he had a genuine warmth that attracted people.

"I never thought this mystery would linger this long," Stanecki said. "Sadly, whoever is responsible for his death didn't have the decency to give the family some closure.
After 25 years, perhaps the time is now."

Neither James P. Hoffa nor the Teamsters would provide a statement for this article, according to a spokesman for the union in Washington, D.C.

But there can be little doubt that the Hoffa family has mixed feelings this week as Jan 8 P. Hoffa continues to rebuild the 1.5-member union.

James P. Hoffa has withstood a bruising battle to gain the Teamsters presidency in 1999 and hopes to bring an end to the federal government's oversight of his union while solidifying his leadership position.

Like his father, James P. Hoffa could play a crucial role in this year's presidential campaign because the Teamsters have large memberships in several swing states such as Michigan, Ohio and Illinois.

Whitty, the UDM professor, said the younger Hoffa is creating a bipartisan coalition that will play a strong role in politics for years to come.

"Jimmy Hoffa is up in heaven looking down with a satisfied smile at his son's leadership and revitalization of the labor movement," Whitty said.

Gone Without a Trace



25 Years After Hoffa Vanished, the Feds Still Haven't Gotten Their Man

— First of all, if you believe Jimmy Hoffa is buried under the end zone of Giants Stadium, you're probably wrong.

"He ain't here," insists John Samerjan, vice president of public affairs for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority, which runs the stadium.

"We have never been contacted, in the history of the authority, by any law-enforcement agency or investigative authority about the possibility of this being true," Samerjan says.

Maybe not. But since Hoffa vanished 25 years ago this Sunday from a parking lot in suburban Detroit, scores of other folk legends, rumors and legitimate leads have led to few public conclusions on the disappearance of one of America's most prominent labor leaders ever.

Accounts of varying reliability place Hoffa's murdered body at the bottom of Michigan lakes or rivers. Others say he was dumped in Florida, or encased in concrete in a Los Angeles nightclub. Still others say his remains were incinerated. Nearly all say the mob was involved.

Although Hoffa disappeared in 1975 and

was declared legally dead in 1982, the FBI's official investigation remains open, and it continues to appeal to the public for help.

"The objective is to attempt to locate Jimmy Hoffa, and then engage in an investigation based upon the facts once he's located, "says Hank Glaspie, a special agent in the FBI's Detroit field office.

Past FBI statements and leaked reports on early stages of the investigation indicate the agency believes the mob was behind Hoffa's disappearance, perhaps because it was concerned about his efforts to reclaim leadership of the Teamsters.

Lately, agents on the case "don't have anything new to provide that would warrant a statement," Glaspie says.

The Teamsters and the Hoffa family will not comment on the twenty-fifth anniversary of James R. Hoffa's disappearance, according to a Teamsters spokesman. Hoffa's son, James P. Hoffa, currently holds his father's old position as head of the union.

Five years ago, however, on the twentieth anniversary of Hoffa's disappearance, about 300 people close to Hoffa attended a memorial service at the Most Holy Trinity Church in Detroit.

"There's an emptiness that we have and we're never going to resolve it," James P. Hoffa said at the time. "This is a closure today. We've lost a loved one, but we've got to go on. Today is a healing day."

The elder Hoffa "literally touched millions and millions of workers in this country ... who know a quality of life that was not possible before Jimmy Hoffa," said Ed Scribner, who was the Metropolitan Detroit AFL-CIO president.

Hoffa started out as a rank-and-file worker, but rose to the top of Detroit Teamsters Local 299, which he tranformed into a regional powerhouse with 15,000 members.

Many teamsters revere Hoffa as a legend who made their union one of the most influential America has ever seen. As president of the international organization in 1964, he negotiated the first

industry-wide contract, the National Master-Freight Agreement.

Legal troubles in the mid-1960s loosened Hoffa's grip on the union. Eventually, he served four years in jail for jury tampering and defrauding a Teamsters pension fund. President Nixon commuted his sentence in 1971, but conditions of his release barred him from union activity until 1980.

On the afternoon of July 30, 1975, Hoffa was last seen waiting in front of the Machus Red Fox restaurant in Bloomfield Township, Mich. It is uncertain whether anybody saw him leave.

Investigators have put forth the theory that he joined other men inside a maroon Mercury. The car pulled off, and the 62-year-old Hoffa was never seen again.

At the time of his disappearance, Hoffa was attempting to overturn the ban and once again lead the Teamsters. There was speculation in the media that in 1976 he would be allowed to challenge his hand-picked successor, Frank Fitzsimmons, to head the union.

According to previously secret FBI case files excerpted in 1997 by the *Detroit Sunday Journal*, members of the mafia—referred to as "La Cosa Nostra" in the files—saw Hoffa as a threat.

"Informed sources of the Detroit Division [of the FBI] are generally of the opinion that Hoffa was abducted and 'hit' with the knowledge, consent and possible participation of the Detroit LCN [La Cosa Nostra] family," read an Oct. 31, 1975 FBI report, according to an Internet archive of the Sunday Journal's two-part series on the FBI files.

"All sources believe that Hoffa's disappearance is directly connected with his attempts to regain power within the Teamsters Union, which would possibly have an effect on the LCN's control and manipulation of Teamster Pension Funds," the newspaper's excerpt continued. "The sources indicate further that even though Hoffa cooperated with them on Teamster loans, Fitzsimmons is also cooperating and,

as such, the LCN would want to maintain conditions as they are. It has been rumored among sources that Hoffa, while attempting to gain control of the Teamsters, may have provided information to the Government in exchange for a favorable decision concerning the lifting of his Union restrictions."

Glaspie said an FBI investigation into the 1,074 pages of copied 1975 investigation files cited by the Sunday Journal indicated "it appears that the [newspaper's] copies were legitemate. Beyond that we really don't have any comment."

Since Hoffa's disappearance, several theories have arisen on what became of him. The FBI apparently investigated many of them. Others apparently were deemed less likely.

Such seems to be the case with the story told by Donald Frankos. Frankos, a former prison inmate, told *Playboy* magazine in 1989 that he was involved in a plot to kill Hoffa, and that Hoffa's remains were mixed with concrete used to build Giants Stadium in East Rutherford, N.J.

"Clearly, nobody who has ever been involved in the case ever thought it was true," Samerjan says. "There has never been any indication to us from any legitemate [law-enforcement] source to go digging on the 750 or so acres here."

The early investigation files, as cited by the Sunday Journal, presented other theories about Hoffa's fate. According to the files, the newspaper said, the FBI looked into claims implying that Hoffa remained alive in the weeks after his disappearance. For instance, one man, a teamster, claimed someone who appeared to be Hoffa disguised in fake glasses had checked into his wife's hotel after 1 a.m. on Aug. 2 under the name "Jewell."

Rumors have flown ever since.

Last November, *Boating* magazine, acting on information from a tipster, failed to discover Hoffa's body in the Ausable River, 175 miles from Detroit. But the magazine has posted a \$10,000 reward to

anyone who points investigators to the remains of Hoffa's remains in the river by the end of this year. It is not a joke, says Nancy Nisselbaum, the magazine's editor.

"We seriously think that's where he is,"
Nisselbaum says. "This could be the one."

But as time goes by, like other observers, she is getting less and less optimistic about finding Hoffa.

Recent - Developments

On 02/27/2001, the funeral for ANTHONY GIACALONE, aka TONY JACK, a Capo in the Detroit LCN Family, was held in Detroit. GIACALONE, 82 years of age, died at St. John's Hospital in Detroit on Friday 02/23/2001. He suffered a long term heart and kidney illness that had prevented him from being brought to trial. GIACALONE had been charged with violating Title 18, United States Code, Section 1962, Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations (RICO) in the 1996 federal indictment of the entire hierarchy the Detroit LCN Family except one Capo.

Background

JAMES RIDDLE HOFFA disappeared on 07/30/1975 while alledgedly waiting to meet with GIACALONE and ANTHONY PROVENZANO, aka TONY PRO. It is believed that HOFFA may have been attempting to regain control of the International Brotherhood of Teamsters Union and planned to meet with PROVENZANO and GIACALONE to discuss a disagreement with them over who would control the union. PROVENZANO was an official with the New Jersey Teamsters and a member of the Genovese LCN Family. HOFFA was last seen at approximately 2:30pm in the parking lot of the Machus Red Fox Restaurant in West Bloomfield, He had alledgedly told others he was going there to meet GIACALONE and PROVENZANO. PROVENZANO claimed to have no knowledge about HOFFA's disappearance and died of a heart attack in 1988 while serving a lengthy prison sentence for labor racketeering and murder. GIACALONE also claimed not to know anything about HOFFA's disappearance, responding to one question, "Maybe he took a little trip." HOFFA is presumed to have been murdered over the disagreement and his remains have never been recovered.

On 03/13/1996, GIACALONE, most of the hierarchy, and much of the membership of the Detroit LCN Family were indicted in a twenty-five count, 17 person indictment returned by a Federal Grand Jury in the Eastern District of Michigan. This investigation, titled GAMTAX, focused on the Detroit LCN Family's collection of "street taxes" from illegal gambling operations, loansharking, extortion, and acts of violence used to support these activities.

On 01/01/1998, and one of the 16 indicted with ANTHONY GIACALONE,

The Detroit Division and the United States Attorney's office for the Eastern District of Michigan have since been pursuing appeals of extraordinarily lenient sentences and forfeiture rulings by U.S. District Judge John Corbett O'Meara against these subjects.
