

The following is set forth in accordance with your wishes for an update concerning the Office of Inspections' (OI's) inquiry into the alleged 1/28/92 and 1/31/92 leaks of information pertaining to the John Gotti investigation.

Pursuant to the request made of you by U.S. District Court Judge Leo Glasser on 2/7/92, an inspection team consisting of Inspector-in-Place (IIP) and six Inspector's Aides-in-Place were dispatched to New York on 2/10/92. As of the close of business Friday, 2/14/92, 75 signed, sworn statements have been obtained from the Special Agents assigned to the New York Division and employees of the U.S. Attorney's (USA's) Office, Eastern District of New York. Additionally, most of the appropriate personnel of the USA's Office, Southern District of New York (SDNY), had been interviewed.

It was determined that these two leak incidents are not unique in the New York area and that several leaks have occurred over the years. However, working closely with the Office of Professional Responsibility, Department of Justice (DOJ), the OI team not only took signed, sworn statements but also questioned each interviewee, including the USA's Office personnel, if they would be willing to take a polygraph as to their signed, sworn statements.

In addition to continued investigation of and the completion of interviews remaining in the USA's Office, SDNY, it is anticipated that approximately 2-3 weeks remain in order to conclude this inquiry. On Thursday, 2/13/92, IIP met with Judge Glasser and fully briefed him relative to the results obtained as of this date.





The Post poll, along with Gallup, Wirthlin, and others, demonstrates that a majority of the American public is opposed to abortions which are performed for social and economic reasons. These are the reasons for which most abortions are performed, according to the Alan Guttmacher Institute-the research arm of Planned Parenthood.

Madam Speaker, the Post performed a valuable public service in showing us who the proabortionists really are and that they are out of the mainstream by a wide margin.

CAMPAIGN FINANCE REFORM DESERVES MEMBERS' SUPPORT

(Mr. MAZZOLI asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute, and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. MAZZOLI. Madam Speaker, this week the House has an opportunity to take a positive step toward restoring waning public confidence in government, not just the Federal Government but all government, and that is by passing resoundingly the conference report on campaign finance reform. The bill is not a great bill, but it is a good bill and a very strong step forward in extricating the political process from the coils of big money and big special interests. It calls for limiting campaign contributions, it calls for limiting campaign expenditures, it calls for eliminating bundling, and it calls for restricting the use of soft money.

I would prefer at some point to see political action committees entirely banned and contributions severely reduced but that will be for a later day.

Madam Speaker, I understand the President has vowed to veto this bill. I hope that the President will reconsider. This is a good bill. It is a step forward. I hope the President will sign it into law.

GOTTI CONVICTION IS MAJOR STEP IN WAR AGAINST CRIME

(Mr. OXLEY asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. OXLEY. Madam Speaker, it was a decade ago that President Ronald Reagan declared war on the mob. calling it this dark, evil enemy within. In the intervening years literally hundreds of gangsters have been caught and convicted, but none bigger than Don John Gotti.

Gotti was convicted of 13 felonies. including 6 murder counts, last Thursday in New York City. Every charge stuck to the former "Teflon Don," culminating a 6-year campaign by Federal prosecutors. He now faces possible life in prison when sentenced on June 23.

The investigators and prosecutors of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Justice Department deserve enormous credit for their skill and perseverance. The judge and jurors earned equal praise for their good judgment, mettle, and courage.

The war against organized crime is far from over, but a major battle has been won. It is only appropriate to thank the soldiers who fought it.

UNTIE THE GAG RULE

(Mr. ANDERSON asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. ANDERSON. Madam Speaker. the countdown has begun. Two weeks ago the administration released a guidance memo on new abortion regulations for title 10 clinics, commonly referred to as the gag rule. Sixty days from new family planning clinics will be forced to withhold information from patients. In the memo the administration stated that doctors will have the authority to discuss medical information with their patients. I am sure the President is aware that a vast majority of counseling at title 10 clinics is handled by nurses or physician assistants, not doctors. In effect, while appearing to compromise, the administration has put family planning clinics in the cruel position of choosing between reducing services or denying information. If these clinics wish to give poor women access to all available medical information, they will be forced to hire doctors to do all of the counseling. This is a luxury they cannot afford without vastly reducing the number of women they serve. The other option is to deny poor women medical information. I cannot support either option.

The administration is trying to convince the public that it has taken the gag out of the gag rule. However, even with this recent clarification, women will be prohibited from receiving full information on all pregnancy options. It is left to Congress to correct this restrictive policy. The clock is ticking, the gag rule must be untied.

"LOVE ME TENDER" OR "HOUND DOG"

(Mr. TRAFICANT asked and was given permission to address the House for 1 minute, and to revise and extend his remarks.)

Mr. TRAFICANT. Madam Speaker. it is decision time. America is on fire. and never before have voters had to make such a crucial decision. And make no mistake, only one will be chosen, like it or not.

I am not talking about Erown or Clinton today. I am talking about Elvis. Will it be the old or the young, the clean-shaven or the sideburns? Will it be "Love Me Tender" or "Hound Dog"?

But the tragedy is, Madam Speaker, that there will be more people voting for Elvis than will vote in the Democratic primary, and they will pay 29 cents to vote for Elvis.



On the advice of Mr. Jim Moody, Chief of the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Organized Crime Section, I am writing to you to request the Bureau's cooperation in a project I am doing for the New York Times.

For the past five months, I have been reporting for a lengthy piece that will run early in May in the New York Times Magazine. The piece concerns New York City Police Detective William Peist who goes on trial next month for his role in allegedly selling confidential information to John Gotti and the Gambino Crime Family. In the course of reporting on this story, I have conducted over 100 interviews, including informative discussions with Mr. Moody and members of the Justice Department. Ms. Danita Clark of your office has also been very helpful in providing the editors of the New York Times with photographs that will run with the piece.

I mention all this because this piece has expanded into a much larger project. The Peist case is, I have come to understand, simply a sub-set of the larger government investigation that led to the conviction of John Gotti.

What my editors would like me to write next is the story of how the FBI made the case against John Gotti. This is a story of how the Bureau, despite setbacks by prosecutors in the courts, despite a tabloid press that treated Gotti with a distasteful reverence, remained steadfast in its commitment to see justice done. And after seven years of hard work, perseverance, and inventiveness, the FBI succeeded brilliantly.

It is a story that, in many ways, is a modern day Untouchables saga: How the men of the Bureau's C-16 squad, directed and supported by Organized Crime Unit in Washington, went after this generation's Al Capone -- and triumphed.

It is a story I plan to tell in The New York Times Magazine. And it is a report that will, since it will be based on the indisputable facts of the case, reflect abundant credit on the Bureau.

Also, it should be noted that besides writing for the New York Times, I am the author of three bestselling non-fiction books. One of which, my book about the Walker spy case, was the basis for the CBS-TV miniseries. The Bureau cooperated while I researched my book, and provided technical advisors during the filming of the miniseries. It was reported to me by the agents involved in the project that the Bureau was pleased with the CBS series, and with the response it provoked from the American people. I mention this because my articles for the New York Times will be excerpts for the book I plan to write about the Gotti case and which Simon & Schuster has contracted to publish. (Since my last two books have been made into films, it is also possible that my account of how the FBI made the case against John Gotti will wind up as a movie. However, at this stage it would be disingenuous for me to guarantee this.)

What I would like from the Bureau is permission to interview the members of the C-16 squad. I have already spoken with many of them and they have indicated that with official approval they would, as long as our discussions do not involve ongoing trials or investigations or surveillance techniques, be willing to be interviewed.

JERRY CAPECI and his writing partner GENE MUSTAIN are long-time reporters for <u>NEW YORK DAILY NEWS</u>. I have recently heard CAPECI identified on national television as perhaps the best crime reporter in the country. 
CAPECI is known to have many sources of information throughout New York City, in law enforcement, in prosecutors' offices and even in the LCN.


This inquiry was ordered by Director SESSIONS following a call he received from U. S. District Court Judge LEO GLASSER on 2/7/92. Judge GLASSER was the presiding judge at GOTTI's recent trial and at the time of his call to the Director was presiding over jury selection.


What caused Judge GLASSER'S ire and prompted his call were two CAPECI/MUSTAIN articles in the <u>DAILY NEWS</u>, one on 1/28/92 and the other on 1/31/92. The 1/31/92 article related that GRAVANO told the FBI he and GOTTI were together at the scene when CASTELLANO was killed (number 1 above) and the 1/28/92 article related information about the killing of FRANCESCO OLIVERI (number 2 above). Since GRAVANO had not yet testified to this (indeed trial had not yet even begun), Judge GLASSER requested an FBI investigation into these apparent leaks to CAPECI.


I and six aides-in-place conducted the inquiry, which consisted of obtaining approximately 175 signed sworn statements along with several additional interviews. Interviewed were personnel of the U. S. Attorney's office for the Southern District of New York (SDNY), the U. S. Attorney's Office for the Eastern District of New York (EDNY), FBI New York, the Manahattan District Attorney's Office and the New York City Police Department. The recently concluded trial was conducted by the EDNY, but the SDNY was involved in our inquiry because of previous cases they have had involving GOTTI and the GAMBINO Family. Indeed, the original homicide of GASTELLANO was just a murder and was originally handled by the Manhattan District Attorney's Office. It was subsequently taken over by the SDNY and, through a series of political maneuverings, was finally transferred to the EDNY.



ADDENDUM: CRIMINAL INVESTIGATIVE DIVISION (CID), 6/10/92, TVI

The Organized Crime/Drug Operations Section #2 (OC/Dos #2), CID, has reviewed the request of authors Jerry Capeci and Gene Mustain to interview Special Agents (SAs) of the New York Office (NYO) who are familiar with the John Gotti investigation.

On 4/2/92, Gotti and Frank Locascio, Boss and Consigliere, respectively, of the Gambino La Cosa Nostra (LCN) Family, were convicted of all but one count of racketeering following an 11 week jury trial in the Eastern District Of New York (EDNY). Both defendants were found guilty on five murder counts, two of which carry a mandatory sentence of life in prison without parole. Their convictions will be appealed.

During this investigation, the NYO conducted nearly two years of Title III electronic surveillance (ELSUR) coverage at Gotti's headquarters, the Ravenite Social Club in Manhattan. As a result of this ELSUR, several related investigations were initiated which are now awaiting trial in the EDNY.

Thomas Gambino, a high ranking Capo in the Gambino LCN Family, was indicted with Gotti and other members of the Gambino hierarchy but will be prosecuted separately. His trial is scheduled to commence during the summer of 1992.

On 12/10/91, a Federal Grand Jury (FGJ) in the EDNY returned a RICO indictment against Gambino LCN Family Capo, Joseph Corrao, and Gambino associates, George Helbig and William Peist. The indictment charges that Peist, a retired New York City Police Department (NYCPD) detective, sold information concerning 17 investigations to the Gambino hierarchy through Helbig and Corrao, while assigned to the NYCPD Intelligence Division in 1990. No trial date has been set.

John Gotti was a defendant with six others in a non-FBI racketeering trial in the EDNY litigated in 1986 and 1987 that resulted in Gotti's acquittal. George Pape, a juror during the trial, was indicted in the EDNY on 2/7/92 as a result of an FBI investigation. The indictment charges Pape with conspiring to obstruct justice and obstruction of justice in connection with the trial. No trial date has been set regarding this matter.


Additionally, the OC/DOS #2 notes that SAs of the NYO were granted FBIHQ authorization to be interviewed by the Fox Television Network regarding the GOTTI investigation. These interviews were broadcast nationwide by Fox on 5/9/92. The OC/DOS #2 is of the opinion that the same issues which relate to interviews by print journalists are applicable to interviews by television journalists. The OC/DOS #2 was not consulted regarding these interviews and the OC/DOS #2 would not have concurred with their authorization for the same reasons cited herein.

In light of the Fox broadcast, the OC/DOS #2 does not object to the interviews, but cautions that great care and control be given to the specificity of information to be provided to the interviewer and should not extend beyond the same information as provided in the Fox broadcast.

At the conclusion of the investigative stage of this inquiry in late March, 1992, it was decided a report would not be submitted until polygraph examinations were conducted of three suspects. However, although one remains to be conducted, delays encountered in its administration have resulted in a determination to submit the results of the inquiry at this time. By letter dated 7/6/92, the Office of Professional Responsibility, Department of Justice, requested the subject of that polygraph, to schedule its administration. ADMINISTRATIVE:

At the conclusion of the investigative stage of this inquiry in late March, 1992, it was decided a report would not be submitted until polygraph examinations were conducted of three suspects. However, although one remains to be conducted, delays encountered in its administration have resulted in a determination to submit the results of the inquiry at this time. By letter dated 7/6/92, the Office of Professional Responsibility, Department of Justice, requested the subject of that polygraph,

DETAILS:

BACKGROUND

This administrative inquiry commenced on 2/11/92, as a result of a request made of Director Sessions from U. S. District Court Judge Leo Glasser on 2/7/92. Judge Glasser at that time was the presiding judge in a case in his court in the Eastern District of New York entitled, <u>United States of America v. John Gotti and Frank Locascio</u>, which was then in the jury selection phase. This inquiry pertains only to Gotti and did not involve Locascio. Judge Glasser was prompted to contact Director Sessions because of two newspaper columns (followed some weeks later by a television news report, for a total of three media leaks, to be discussed below) which reported information which had not yet been testified to by an important witness in the trial.

At the time of this inquiry, Gotti was the head of the Gambino LCN crime family in New York City. The Gambino LCN family is comprised of approximately 400 members and is considered to be the most powerful and active of the five New York LCN families. Its criminal activities run the spectrum from traditional gambling, loansharking, extortion and gangland slayings to political corruption and sophisticated infiltration of legitimate businesses. The family's power base is the control of a number of influential union organizations.

Gotti assumed leadership of the Gambino family following the homicide of the previous boss, Paul Castellano, and his underboss, Thomas Bilotti. On 12/16/85, Castellano and Bilotti were murdered as they exited their car in front of a popular Manhattan restaurant. Following those homicides and under Gotti's leadership, the Gambino family strengthened. Although reeling from major FBI successes against the hierarchy, its tremendous resilience is due to its size, its great wealth and its ruthless leadership.

As a result of highly productive electronic surveillances from 1988 to 1992 targeted at the Ravenite Social Club, Gotti's headquarters, Gotti, his underboss Salvatore Gravano, Locascio, his consigliere, and Thomas Gambino, his Capodecina, were indicted by a Federal Grand Jury in the EDNY on 12/11/90, on a variety of Racketeer Influenced and Corrupt Organizations predicates including racketeering, murder, gambling and tax evasion. Thomas Gambino was subsequently severed from the judicial proceedings.

Early in November, 1991, while incarcerated along with Gotti, Salvatore Gravano defected from the family and became a Government witness. Although the information he could provide was extremely damming to Gotti, and for that reason required a

high degree of security,	

Perhaps the most damaging information Gravano furnished concerned the Castellano/Bilotti murders. Gravano told Agents that he and Gotti were together the night of the murders, parked in a car at the scene of the homicides. Since those homicides occurred in Manhattan, which is within the jurisdiction of the USA's Office for the Southern District of New York (SDNY) as opposed to Brooklyn, the EDNY, it was deemed appropriate for C-16 Agents to brief officials of the SDNY of aspects of information being furnished by Gravano. Also, again relating to the Castellano/Bilotti murders, the New York City Police Department (NYPD) had an official interest in the case. In addition to the murders, the NYPD had several officers either currently employed or recently retired who were working for both the SDNY and the EDNY as investigators. Finally, because Gravano's information included cases in which the Manhattan District Attorney's Office had an interest, key personnel there were briefed as well.

INITIAL MEDIA LEAKS

b6

On 1/28/92, and again three days later on 1/31/92, New York Daily News published articles by Jerry Capeci and hib7D writing partner Gene Mustain. Capeci has been identified recently on national television as possibly the best crime reporter in the Nation. In addition to regular news articles relating to crime in New York, recently almost always LCN related, he and Mustain write a regular weekly column entitled "Gangland." Capeci is known to have developed many sources of information throughout New York City over the years, in law enforcement, in prosecutor's offices and even in LCN.

As noted above, Gravano's information included placing Gotti at the Castellano/Bilotti homicide. The Capeci/Mustain article of 1/31/92 related this information. Gravano's information also included a less-explosive homicide, that of one Francesco Oliveri a few years previous. The Capeci/Mustain airtel of 1/28/92 related this information. Since the actual trial itself had not yet begun at the time these two articles were published, Judge Glasser's call to Director Sessions requested an FBI probe into these two leaks of information.

INQUIRY PROCEDURES

Inspector-in-Place (IIP) was assigned to travel to New York along with six Assistant Inspectors. They arrived there on 2/10/92. As noted above, some or all of

Gravano's information was known to the New York Division, the SDNY, the EDNY, the NYPD and the Manhattan District Attorney's Office. Personnel of each of these offices were considered therefore to represent the "universe," that is those who most logically could have leaked the information.

Pursuant to liaison established with the Office of Professional Responsibility (OPR) for the Department of Justice (DOJ), it was agreed this inquiry would be administrative in nature as opposed to criminal, that signed, sworn statements would be taken from all appropriate personnel of the FBI, the SDNY and the EDNY and that each would be queried regarding their willingness to take a polygraph examination regarding their statements. Interviews, recorded on FD-302s, were done with the non-DOJ personnel. Finally, also interviewed were Agents of the Organized Crime Section of FBI Headquarters (FBIHQ) and personnel of the Organized Crime Section of the DOJ.

The signed, sworn statements taken of DOJ personnel were preceded by a Warning and Assurance to Employee Required to Provide Information (FD-645). This was pursuant to discussions and agreement with David P. Bobzien, Assistant Counsel, OPR, DOJ, who by letter dated 3/12/92, confirmed our discussion of 2/5/92, stating as follows:

We discussed the fact that although Mr. Gravano had appeared one time before the Federal Grand Jury hearing the Gotti matter, his appearance concerned a matter not related to that which was disclosed to the press and, thus, it does not appear that a violation of Federal Rule of Criminal Procedure 6(e) and its attendant criminal contempt of court is implicated in this leak. Further, although other Federal criminal statutes may have been violated, it seems to us that attempting to find the source of the leak by compelling Government employees to cooperate with the investigation is of greater importance than preserving the ability to prosecute by permitting those employees to decline to be interviewed if they so choose. Accordingly, we believe that the investigation should be conducted on an administrative basis and that the FD-645 warning form should be used in connection with the interviews of FBI and DOJ personnel.

Each person interviewed was asked the following questions regarding the initial media leaks:

1) What is your involvement in the Gotti investigation and for how long have you been so involved?

Do you know New York Daily News Reporters Jerry Capeci and/or Gene Mustain? 3) Have you ever talked with either one of these two reporters? If so, how often? Are you aware of information printed in the New York Daily News on 1/31/92 regarding Salvatore Gravano being with John Gotti in a car parked at the scene at the time of the homicides of Paul Castellano and Thomas Bilotti? Are you aware of information printed in the 5)

- New York Daily News on 1/28/92 regarding the homicide of Francesco Oliveri?
- Were you aware of this information prior to 6) it being published in the New York Daily News? If so, how did you come about receiving it, did you provide it to anyone not entitled to receive it and do you know anyone who did?
- Are you willing to take a polygraph examination?

In addition to these interviews, every communication submitted to or received by FBIHQ was reviewed so as to identify possible information of lead value. Moreover, three volumes of newspaper clippings, from each New York City newspaper, were reviewed from December, 1990 (date of Gotti's indictment), to February, 1992, in order to determine if a pattern of apparent leaks could be detected, for lead value. b6

SUBSEQUENT MEDIA LEAK

During the course of this inquiry and during the trial which began on 2/12/92, a third media leak occurred. Gotti had been acquitted on three previous occasions, two state cases and one Federal. The Federal trial was in 1987 and after Gotti's acquittal, it was believed that a juror had been bribed by Gotti associates. Gravano verified the bribes, named the juror and related the amount of the bribe. On Sunday evening, 2/23/92, New York Channel 4 Reporter John Miller reported aspects of this bribe matter. At that time, New York Agents were preparing to arrest the juror, George Pape, for accepting the bribe, on an indictment obtained two weeks earlier. That indictment had been The following morning, a New York newspaper reported the Miller story, Judge Glasser read the account and contacted and two Assistant Inspectors returned to IIP New York and conducted additional inquiries into this third leak. In this aspect, the bribe issue was a closely held one and therefore only members of the EDNY and SDNY were interviewed.

is noted a complete transcript of Miller's news story is on the page regarding Since this inquiry detected absolutely no indication of FBI culpability in any aspect of the case, no Agents were interviewed regarding the Miller story. Those USAs' Offices personnel were again asked to provide signed, sworn statements, asked about their willingness to take a polygraph examination and were asked the following questions: Were you aware of the bribery of a juror in the 1) 1987 John Gotti trial? b6 What knowledge did you have regarding the b7C 2) amount of money involved in the bribery? b7D Did brief you on his illegal 3) activities? If so, did he advise you of the bribery of the juror and what amount was paid?

RESULTS OF INQUIRY

It was determined early in this inquiry that the media leaks involved in this matter are by no means unique in the New York City area, and that indeed Capeci and Miller, although the most prolific, are not alone in reporting information not in the public domain at the time. These types of leaks have occurred regularly over many years and very little has been done to put a stop to it. Thus the "Universe" is impossibly large and, in this instance, is limited only to those who could have had access but compounding this is the fact that, in the case of

the Castellano/Bilotti killings and the Oliveri killing, parts of each were known to some while unknown to others. Indeed, the New York Division Agents assigned to C-16, the Gambino Squad, were unaware that the Oliveri killing had even been an LCN killing until Gravano told them it was. related an amount that was not known to most of those interviewed. Additionally, he did not report that the juror was going to be arrested and there was no indication he was aware of the indictment. Thus some and perhaps most of his information logically could have been obtained from the Westies. Given the almost infinite universe, coupled with the fact that some information reported was known by various groups of people, it appears each reporter, and particularly Miller, put together pieces of information received from multiple sources, virtually impossible to identify from substantive investigation. A total of 167 interviews were conducted in this inquiry, the majority of which were considered negative in that the interviewees stated they did not, for example, know or talk to the reporters and no information was developed to contradict b6 their statements. b7C SUSPECTS DEVELOPED b7D Three suspects were identified as a result of this inguiry:

On Sunday evening, 2/23/92, while the sealing order remained in effect and prior to Pape's arrest by FBI Agents on 2/24/92, Reporter Miller broadcast his story concerning the bribe. A taped copy of the report was obtained and transcribed, and is being set forth herein in full rather than in summary form so as to project the logical progression of the inquiry:

The following is a transcript of NEWS 4 NEW YORK, WNBC-TV, February 23, 1992 news report regarding "JURY PAYOFF". Individuals participating in the broadcast are identified as: CAROL JENKINS - CJ RALPH PENZA - RP DIANE GIACALONE - DG JOHN MILLER - JM UNKNOWN FEMALE - UF CJ: Good evening. There is new and startling evidence that jury tampering involving reported mob boss John Gotti. Yes. Right now he's on trial for murder and for racketeering. Last time around though John Gotti beat the rap on racketeering charges. Was that because a juror was paid off? John Miller has this exclusive report. Law enforcement sources say John Gotti sent a \$75,000.00 payoff to a member of the anonymous jury in his last federal trial to fix the case. Gotti was acquitted in that case of

JM: Law enforcement sources say John Gotti sent a \$75,000.00 payoff to a member of the anonymous jury in his last federal trial to fix the case. Gotti was acquitted in that case of being the boss of the Gambino crime family, so were all his codefendants. Sam, Sammy the "bull" Gravano, Gotti's former number two man has been telling the FBI all he knows since November. Gravano has told agents that Bocso Radonjic, a member of the Westies gang actually knew a member of the anonymous jury. Gravono has told agents that Radonjic was sent with \$75,000.00 in cash to bribe George Pape in persuading the rest of the jury panel. The juror says he never got a penny from John Gotti. Pape has told FBI agents that Radonjic, who he knew from the west side, did try to intimidate him but never gave him \$75,000.00. Only one member of that jury was ever interviewed after the verdict. At the time, she told NEWS 4 exclusively that no one member of the jury pushed the others into an acquittal.

UF: The majority of the jury was leaning toward "not guilty". It was just that we had to go over more of the evidence again, so that we had no doubts in our mind that we could live with a "not guilty" verdict.

JM: The latest Gotti jury is anonymous, but unlike the last federal trial, the jury is sequestered. They live in a hotel and travel in caravans under the constant guard of the United States Marshals.

DG: We presented the evidence as best we could.

JM: Diane Giacalone who prosecuted the last federal trial would not comment on this story. The other prosecutor on that

case John Gleeson is now working on the new trial. There is still an unanswered question here. What happened to the money? Gravano says \$60,000.00 came from John Gotti. And Buddy Leahy of the Westies gang allegedly put up the other 15 grand as a good will gesture to the Gambino family. There is speculation that the middle man Bosco Radonjic stole the money, he is believed to be hiding in Yugoslavia now. And if he robbed the Gambino's and the Westies, he better stay there. We were unable to reach George Pape, the former Gotti juror who is allegedly threatened, and because of a court order barring the lawyers in this case from discussing things that are not in on the public record neither the prosecutors nor Gotti's defense lawyers can talk about this. We'll be back in court tomorrow. Ralph.

RP: Alright John, thank you.

As can be seen, Reporter Miller's story stated \$75,000 was the bribe offer; in fact, Gravano says it was \$60,000.
