
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
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
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



















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Dear Charles,

Jim came on the radio very late late last night and asked that the following be conveyed to you in confidence in order to give you his inner feelings and the total background.

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First of all, the political situation is very complicated. Russia recently let Guyana down, at least Burnham and the PNC. He had asked Russia to censure the PPP's (Jagan's) political prejudice in view of the up-coming election (July 9). The PPP slogan is "VOTE YOUR OWN" -- implying East Indian vs. Black. And Russia knows that putting strictures on this kind of race division would be the only way the PNC could win. Because by numbers they are the minority party. Russia did not want to get involved. She (Guyana) was not asking Russia for arms like Cuba, and Russia is still quite friendly -- but Russia did not come through with the kind of support Burnham needed. This has vexed the PNC. Also it is going around in the Caribbean and Guyana that Cuba is only sending black soldiers to Arfica to fight. Guyana is very objective and supportive of Cuba except for that one point.

It is difficult for us to state publicly our fondness for Cuba and Russia. And watching the world scene, Jim has been very impressed with Russia's commitment to Africa. Since Russia refused to get involved in Guyana, it appears that China and North Korea are getting more involved on a support basis.

One time when Jim was projecting what would happen should his health fail, that all his people might go to Russia. Russia was not sure she could help in that situation. The thought was comunicated to Moscow that PT might help in any way we could -- and the response was 'Why don't you give your help to the United Nations." And that disturbed a lot of our people. But Russia is still very friendly and helpful, but appears to be so dogmatic and inflexible.

Russia said she could not help -- but CUBA WAS willing to talk further with us. Some could not understand why Russia, being so powerful, could not halp, when Cuba, despite her own hardship and precarious position, was willing to be of help.

Herein lies the substance of our conflict. Mingo, who is a very wise and good person in Jim's opinion, siad that JJ should not take sides or indicate. his persuasion publicly. He is not inclined to do that anyway. But the press will force the issue and their interest in getting into things in Guyana is to determine the extent of Russia's involvement -- or any communist country or line. Mingo is worried also about the problem with Venezuela. Venezuela still had old prejudices against Communism as represented in the U.S. by Angela and Huey. They seemed to be more pre-occupied with the CIA. There was onece lies told on Guyana that Cuba gave them arms. Venezuela was very upset by this, because of continued border disputes with Guyana. But Venezuela has always been very friendly to P.T. It is sensitive thoug, because we are actually located in the disputed border area. When the Venezuelan government came to the project, they said that DR. REID (2nd to Burnham) had spoked very highly of Jim and PTxwxx and was very impressed with what they say at Jonestown.

All these variables make our own position very sensitive, including anything we say to the press. Jim is convinced that socialism is the answer and believes that we are pursuing it in the truest sense. But right now the whole socialist world is divided and very sectarian. If we let the press come and see our own preference --which is resolutely the USSR and Cuba -- we throw surselves and Guyana into the midst of a much broader and significant controversy with political ramifications for Burhham, the future course of Guyana and all of us. And they cannot mistake, with murals, political classes, library etc. our political leaning. Even the Inquireer guy had to see the murals from the air -- just tree-top level.

And if press do come, JJ wil not be the only one to speak. The press would be ableto go around and talk to anyone. And everyone knows about the Bibles. There could be no control over the mouths of everyone, even those who mikgh make a mistake of saying something with the best of intentions.

Though the U.S. focus right now is on Africa, as you said, project also how it will be for Guyana when it comes to public attention that P.T. and Guyana and are soliciting help and aid from USSR -- right in their own back yard. You see, whatever position Jim takes initially will make a vast difference permamently. Jim wants you to see his personal inner conflict. He sees himself not as any sectarian line, but as meeting total world needs.

You cannot put people into catagories. Some of his best friends, like you, do not belong to any particular sectarian position, but are concerned for humanity. Dymally is hardly in any awareness of Communist philosophy at all, but did understand the black problem, has been a consistent supporter. Willie Brown and Enola Maxwell == and those like Harvey Milk -- all these have struck their necks out. And even people like the Moores' who are horrified at the word "Communism" but tame and said that evene if all that were tru in the press, it would have been more than justified to bring people to this. And then there are people like Angela. Shewas the first one Jim hehlped of that political persuasion; and just a few days after helping her is when he got hit in ther press -- when it came to standing up for anything, he was always called on by her and others. And now we cannot even get a letter of xxxxxxx support from her or the party. You cannot catagorize people. Sectarianism is a real problem. Going public with our views will cause us to be confronted with the sectarian divisions in the socialist world.

Jim never counted on anyone understanding him or emulating his example. He just does what he knows is right. You lose all sense of historical perspective. Debbie reserved the final blow. Jim knes that people related to being around him by the fact that they needed him. And after that, after his usefulness ran out, they would discard him. That is OK. But it is awesome that people could be so close to decency and not emulate it. But emulate the reverse. One thing you know for sure, Debbie was one person he never let down. Except not to respond to her advances. He was a symbolic father figure to her. It pains him, but he knows you understand, that people take out of your life whatever maxim suits them. Jim is not bitter, but very my much at peace by doing what he knows is right.

The Russian people were wasteful of food- he would order some food and then not eat the whole thing- our cooks thought something was wrong with their cooking.. they drank and smoked.. they said they had not reached the place that J was at. they had not faced up to the perils of living... they were not prepared

- J is convinced of the ideals of the church to take the denominational position.. what ever Pete thinks is good for people left in U.S. J has a conflict because he would like to see the appreciable difference to the good people in U.S. when the press gets done. the denominational position he takes could make a difference to all of PT// know how U.S. feels about Africa// imagine how U.S. would feel about Guyana- practically in their backyard

### UPDATE ON WARSAW CONFERENCE

- 1. Kahn's idea was for you to fly to New York to catch Soviet
  Airflot plane to Moscow. Originally he suggested you go with
  him and others on May 1st. But he said that you could come
  later, as first days of conference are bullshit. Conference
  lasts from May 5-11. If you were there for last 2-3 days, that
  would be fine. He suggests that you come to MY later, catch
  a later plane to Moscow, then fly to Warsaw.
  - Z. However, he is insistent on the preparations being made carefully, and besides, Chaikin is opposed to your coming to New York. In this regard, it might be best for you to fly to London, then Marsaw, from Georgetown. Leave on May 6-7, arrive Warsaw the 8th or so, and be met by Kahn, who will take you to conference. I will call Kahn to ask him about making the arrangements, Sell him it's tentative, but we can go shead and plan it out. Make sure about hotel, airport pickup, vigs.
  - 3. Kahn suggests that you go to Moscow from Warsaw after the cenference, and stay in Russia for a while for a vacation. If no time for that, you can spend a brief time in Moscow, and Kahn would introduce you around. Maybe a day or two. Than you can return. This seems to be a good plan. You would be gone around 8-9 days.
  - 4. Kahn suggests strongly that you have at least a half-day lay ever in London before the 3 hour flight to Warsaw. Jet lag is dangerous.
  - 5. I will call Kahn (he is in Vermont -- I have his number) and tell him of your tentative desire to go, and also speak to him in terms of above plans (flight to Warsaw to arrive for last 2-3 days of conference). I'll see what he says, and send reply down with Chaikin.
  - o I don't know the flight plans from George form-London-Wingay. Wend to know your arrival time in Maxes to arrange lickup. Also do you need any special visa marangements?

- 2. Romesh Chandra suggested that Jim go to Warsaw with the Guyanese delegation. (HE IS SECRETARY-GENERAL OF MOLLO ANALE CANCE)
- 3. Albert Kahn felt that he should NOT go with the Guyanese delegation; but should come to New York to fly out with the US deligation. He stresses that if Jim went with American delegates, he would be much more comfortable, would get to meet "top" people, and would in general get decent treatment. Kahn mentioned that often at these kinds of conferences, there is danger of people having to go through a lot of hassles. Kahn would want to shepherd Jim through he would want to insure that his visa were appropriately cursily? cleared with Russian embassies in San Prancisco and Sashington (Dobrynin). He would also make it possible for Jim to wisit in the USSR. The plan will be for them to fly on May Ist to Moscow direct. Spend a day in Moscow, then fly to Warsaw (one hour). The conference begins on May 5th. When it is over, Kahn suggests that Jim go to Moscow and he will be able to arrange for him to travel wherever he wants in the USSR with a car, driver, interpreter. the works. This he can arrange. (Kahn)

In speaking earlier with Marceiline, Albert said he would speak forthrightly about Jim's work in Warsaw to the assembled delegation, and that his work would thereby get international recognition.

5. Kahn thought it would be critical for Jim to be identified with. U S delegation, so world would hear of his work in USA - his contribution in American peace movement would be crucial for the international community to hear about. This would be obscured if he were to come with another nation's delegation. Note: Officially. Jim would be coming as a "guest" invited appealably by Romesh Cflandra. However, Kahn has a LOT of influence at this meeting - he is one of most principle dignitaries there. .:

Mode: Even though there are strong arguments against Jim going now (the movement of our people; the attention it would draw to him by the international intelligence agencies; the fact that he is pulling out of his work in the USA but going as a USA personality), these might be outweighed by the possibility of the international recongnition Jim can very well get for his work, the contacts he could make with so many other nations (if we needed to go to another country, this conference could be where doors might be opened), physicianical delegations there. If he goes, I suggest that he travel with Prokes. Kahn will no doubt want to spend a lot of time with Jim, and he can be both a help and a hindrance, but the guy evidently knows a lot of people.

I am not sure of this, but I can check it out: Kahn seemed to be saying that if Jim went with the US group from MYC the he would not have to pay, since he is going as a guest. The planes he would be flying on, also are Soviety planes, and Polish planes. The one that goes to Moscow would be a Soviet plane (from NYC).

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USSR Embass meeting of Timofeyev with Marcie, Tony Walker, Sharon and Terry Jones -Fedor (timofeyev) said that in regard to J'shealth, they could send a the Embassy Dr. to Jonestonn but he would have to come as if he were a guest and not as if he were a doctor (in terms of the govt. of Guyana thinking he was coming and guest) -he'll be back shortly from Russia (where he went with the Russian Ambassador) -he is a specialist in reviving people when they appear tobe dead -he's fully trained as a dr. tho he's not a lung specialist plus having thas specialty in reviving people -he wouldn't be able to stay too lung because they need him to be available to the Embassy and they have missed their monthly check-ups with him since he's been gome -they need the diagnosis andall the details/ he will bring equipment that he does have thushus and medicine thus the thushus and medicine will be available for JJ also -he said they are sending their doctor because they feel what JJ has to offer is very important and that the work is now known about in the USSR a because of Alex doing them story on JT regarding the questions we sent to the USSR. -he said they need more specifics and he had told us in the past that they would want specific answers. and -when they don't get the answers they would feel that the Embassy wasn't getting proper answers and that the Embassy should have communicated better -for instance they would want to know how many the delegation would consist of and how long they would stay -if we said 10 in the delegation, they might say they would rather we send only 3 as it might be too threatening to Guyana (I don't know then whay they just couldn't g tell us what they wanted in terms of numbers instead of us submitting a number and then they correcting it but I guess they prefer it that way) -they want a one page succinct paper which gave the details as they prefers to have it summarized in the USSR as they have so many issues to work on and a pages and pages (like we sent at first) doesn't give them a 1 page thing that they can discuss and vote on easily. -they want to know hom much money we want sent there, what system we had - it under previously, shy it man't satisfactory and why we k now want to Charge -they ment toknow in terms of exodus, how many children would be coming, what ages, what grown ups would be with them, how long they would expect to stay in theUSR -in regards to the delegation, who would they want to see (he later said he could tell us this), how many days would they stay (if it is 15 days, it would be intensive negotaiation), if more than they could have mome cultural presentations they g could go to -hs Marcie said we would be there for the negotiations, so that would be the main thing -that is the stated purpose of the delegation (explain briefly) -what is the approximate date, the delegation would want to come -the Russians were interested in what we did have to present (in what we sent) but 10 pages was too much to deal with and they want a synopsis -they have waited for an answer for months and monts -he said that he would try his best to help us on this PR SOOK LIST -MCrubbs submitted a list of russian books we wanted -Fedor said he would run them down but most of them are 20 or more years old and they would be hard tofind the suggested that me he get a catalogue of more resent books for us to choose from, and wesaid thiat sounded perforable ANTI-MACIST MOVIE -we asked if we could see this movie and we wouldn't tell anyone where it came from or would tell them it came from Yugoslavia or england and we wouldn't show it to a sould must outside of us -he said it wasn't worth the risk as someone might deflect from our group

-he said it wasn't worth the risk as someone might deflect from our group as Debbie Blakey had and might mention it and it was obvious where the film came from

### DOCTORS

-when we asked if the Russians could bring a team of doctors to check JJ, they said this was quite a problem as they had wanted to a work out an arrangement with Guyana to bring doctors in but that was not worked out the said that the Cubans have doctors and they are paid \$100 a month by the Guyanese govt.

-The Americans and Canadians are paid \$5000 a month by Guyana and the hospital staffs treat the Cubans like nurses because they figure if they are only

paid \$100 a month, they mass mustn't be worth very much—
the Russians were prepared to subsidize totally their doctors but figured
that if they weren't going to be treated with respect, it wouldn't be
acceptable to them because they feel they have an image to maintain of
their country and it wouldn't heplp them to accept this treatment—
so they told Guyana that either something would have to change, the
treatment or the money

(in general he was more critical of Guyana than I have ever heard him speak, in the past he was a maybe subtlely critical or would mention one thing but not be committed on other things, but he was openly and outrightly critical this time? / I think ever since time Guyana has refused to give MUSSR credit for the donation of polic moram serum when they gam give the US credit in the paper for a book donated, they have been furious)—also the ficultowing experiences made them furious PROTECOL

-he said that the Guyana govt. seems to be inconsistant in their policy and it is f very hard for them to understand it

-they'll give their ambassador protocol treatment but then one time when they requested it, km they didn't give an answer and made them wait on the phone for a long period of time, and just when he was ready to leave on the plane they said "OK, it's all OK" and gave a big apology but it was too late by then.

-we mentioned that they had done the same thing with Goodlett

### RE RUSSIAN METEROLOGICAL SHIP

-this ship had just gone thru a hurricane in the seas to study atmospheric

conditions and that was quite a trip

-they came in to rest and they were given very bad treatment/ they weren't allowed off the ship and he said that even in the US they would have been treated as guests

-a Guyanmese Research group came to look at the ship at the invitation of the Embassy and they refused entry by the Guyanese govt. and he said even in the US, scientists were allowed to look at the ship and of course were very executious about the work being done

-he said that the sailors and research people were very desirous of having a chance to get off the boat and relax and play volleyball (at the russian property) and they couldn't

-Fedor spent each day at theboat a trying to meet their needs

Fedor is acting ambassador because the ambasador is in Russia and the Next in line is in Russia also

### Radio problem

-we told him about the attempt of the US to cut off our radio and how it was here the medical traffic that they were objecting to the we were cleared initially to do medical traffic (medical equipment) because we were a non-propit group

-MEXIMPLEMENT told him that we had sent a petition of support to the govt (he misunderstood and thought this was to the Guyana govt and said he didn't think it was a good idea to send protest to the Guyana govt) but when I clarified it was to the US govt, he said that was good and wondred if we mention human rights tot the US govt) and I said yes that was mentioned because the people who signed it were concerned about the human rights of their relatives who they wanted to keep in contact with as well as others being concerned about our human rights, and he said that was very good

### TONY WALKER'S REPORT OF THE SAME THING

-Mother told him of our doctor's findingsms of cancerlike cells in JJ's lungs -he knew this/ m she wanted to know of his findings on the possibility of JJ going to the USSR for treatment

-he commented that the Embassy doctor graingoists g was coming back from the USSR in 5 days. He had accompanied the Ambassador in the USSR due to an illness -the ambassador is in the hospital there and will stgy there

whe said the Soviet doctor will come to Jonatown when he gets back and bring all necessary instruments for his examination

-he said that the doctor is a specialist in returning people back to life and is not a Ca specialist but could check JJ out because all Soviet drs. are general drs. besids being specialists

-he told us the Dr. will make an unofficial vist (in other words fon't tell anyone he is coming to JT just to check JJ)

-he commented that Cuyans has not signed an agreement that the Soviets send some doctors here mainly because they want their doctors to get the same provisions that the Guyanese have given to the capitalist counties like the US

the talked of how the Russian Ambassador was held up for 2 hours just because the Guyanese aid they weren't informed early enough

-when a Soviet ship came here, the Soviets welcomed Guyanse to come aboard (it was a scientific meterolgocial ship that is designed to ttravel thru hurricanes)

and nobody came

to told how some of those Soviets on the ship were trying to go to a place on land afte being on the water so long, and they also were in the Ambassador's car and were stopped and not allowed to go by Guyansese. He called this a breach of diplomatic immunity.

-Sharon asked him what was the answer about theexodus and he said they had received no answer because we gave no specifics like when, how many, ages etc. He remarked that he had mentioned it when he was in Möscow and they asked him the questions and the same situation would be the question about JJ traveling

-he will have to know facts like tests and diagnossis because their's is a system or a whell of motion that deals with the decision making and a lot of time and thought put into ever problem that is why they like to know specifics

(aDDITION FROM SHARON AMOS) - he told us that they had set up a trip for a
Guyanese Trade unionist namped Semple and he said he would be able to travel
to Russia in July

-they felt it was very important that he come analyzemax and he said in June he would was kind of busy

-the USSR govt said they weren't interested in his coming because they had planned his whole agends and gone to a lot of trouble to arrange it

### BACK TO TONY WALKER'S REPORT

-he said that they regard Comrade Jim Jones and our movement vary highly and like what we are doing and he will do what he can

-to me it seemed like if JJ had to travel they would permit him to do so/ we thanked him

-Sharon asked about the Maoism film and who she maid we wouldn't show it to another soul. He replied that what if another purson like the woman (debbie) told of films we gave you like this one. It would put us in an international situation. We told him we understood. Meeting with Timofeyev/Russain Embassy Marcy Tony Sharon and Terry

Marcy starteds off with asking about the Dr. he explained that as soon as he returned from Russia he would be allowed to come up to J/town. He said he realized our need was great as soon as he got there he could come up. He made it a point that their Dr. was not a specialist in the field of Lungs or CA but his speciality was reviving people from Cardiac arrests after they didd. He was saying this I felt as for us not to have our hopes up to high as that he would have all the answers. Sharon asked if he would have unlimited amount of time and he said he could stay as long as he needed to check out the situation but he did have to get back to treat differnt ones at the Embassy. He said something to the effect kkkm "like you have in J/town we too get monthly check ups by our Dr. " He explained that he had traveled with the Ambassador back to Russia because he has some Medical Proview and he was in the hospital. He said he would come as a guest an unofficial visit not to disturb or ruffle Guyana. He said he expected him back by Friday and to gets the details from our Dr. as to what equipment he would need to bring, he couldn't gaurantee that he had everything that was needed but would bring everything he could. We told him how much ix we appreclated it, and he said He felt you were very important, what you were doing not only from the standpoint that you were from the U.S. but for the total cause of Socialism. We then asked him about exouds and he said ask he had been questioned by some officials when he was in Russai for specifics. Such as how much money, how many children we have and what ages how many adults did we plan just to send ours children etc. But Marcy did make Bim say it again esidently someone got our letter in Russai and he was questioned about it. Also for the delegation he said he needed more specifics how many deketation We wanted to send in our delegation for how long what specifically we wanted to talk about what was our problem etc. He said for us to look at our letter and re do it, It was just to unspecific he said they gas expect he as the 6-1-a-8d

representative to the embassy to do as much of the detail work as . . possible. We asked him about the book list and he is going to give us a purrent list of books written in English the list we gave him were old and it would be easier to give us the catalogue that is current and go from there. We asked him about the movee the Chinese one, and he said no wonder if someone left and went back to the states and said somethin. about the Embassy speaking appartively about China. Sharon asked if we could say it was from England or somewhere and he said you could definizely

tell where it came from. He didnt wanst to budge - 10 s the Tax

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on this point. He mentioned about the Russian wanting to send Drs. to helpk here and Guyana manking not wanting to negoitate this, he didnt want to get intox it but then he explained, that their Drs wouldnt be treated as nurses, that the Govt was paying US Canada and Sweden \$5,000 a year as well as their own Govt. giving the money. And China was giving them a grant and giving them Drs. worked towards some of that grant, but when it came to paying the cuban Drs. they gave them only \$100.00

and one house to live in. They wanted to do the same fro the Russian Drs. and they were disturbed because of the level of consicusness here in Gugana also the standard of living was differnt and it made him mad that there was still this conditioning that the US had the good Specialists and Socialist countries would be substandard. He also methioned that the Russain Ambassador was made to wait 2 hrs. once and not given protocol because they failed to contact the foreign ministry in time. (He told us this after we mentioned we souldn't get protocol fro Goodlet) He also told us about this Russian boat thats came in to dock and becasue it was a boat having to do with Scientific Research that you wild expert Guyana to allow thier scientists to go on the boat for the benefit of their own profession and also perhaps give members of the boat some kind of entertainwift - went? But hex no one was allowed on and the members of the crew were not 5 3 allowed eff. He said evern the US would have done if this if they had okayed it to come into the dock in the first place not suspecting anything. Ho was very foundly & worm . TERRY.

USSR -Timofeyeve w/Jim, Terri, Tim, Deb.

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Deborah Touchette September 25, 1978

-I came a little late, because I was still typing a message we got at the last munite before the appt.

-He said it was a honour and a pleasure to here Cde. jim jones' voice for the first time. I've never herd him before.

-I know he must speak strongly because of you, (menaing we have carried strong messages from you)

when the tape first began to play, he chuckled because it started off in Russian.

-He listened intently, throughout, and took notes.
-I guess before I came he had agreed that he and the doctor would go up on Thurs and return on Mon. providing it wouked out between the Home Affairs & the Foreign Affairs.

-he said they would rather go by boat them plane, or speed boat if our boat was not possible.

-we told him we would try, but we wern't sure.

-I excused myself for being late and told him I had just received a message from J/town.

-I told him about the incident when the Minister had said you could not give food sway to people in the north and you had told him to go to hell, not just in those harsh words, but in a diplocatic way, and you had tried to get him off to the side, but there was a flunky that told you you couldn't speak to a Minister in that way. (I had the message in front of me so this isn't exactly how it was said), and we did not feel that Guyana was on the road to a socialist course.

-he said this is where we disagree with Cde Jones, there are 'couple of things we don't agree on, but basically we have the same ideas, he motined towards the tape.

-he said they felt that Guyana's future was promising, they had a long way to go, but they were had hopes for them going socialist, whereas you seem to feel that there is no hope for Guyana to go Socialist.

-I told of Cde Jones' feelings about Guyana's policy with China, that it was disgusting, middle of the fence type policy that Guyana has, and China while talking about hedgmony, was as hedmonistic and the U.S. could ever be. -he shook hos head in agreement.

-he said but you've got to be abise to see Guyana's view, as a non-alined nation, now if I were the Foreign Affairs Minister of Guyana, I'm not sure how I would handle the situation, to be non-alined means to hot be aliy of any nation but to maintain friendship w/all, that's hard to do. (he was trying to be diplomatic), but I did think I herd him say that it would seem that being on the road to socialism, they would have to aline themselves with a socialist country at some point.

-In ref. to China -Nuclear warfare-and the Doctrin of three worlds,..
-he said, "for your own information, and to relieve your minds", China does not have the nuclear machinery to-for massive, or long-range bombs-nuclear war heads, but she has so many people, if she killed of two thirds of her population she would still have seven million people?, several million any way to re-develop the destroyed lands and accoupy them with Chinese, thats their way of looking at it.

-they have so many people they are willing to have people die, and hide a few million safely away to take over when it's all over.

-they have a policy which is different then ours, he said. They feel if everyone has a radio, a bowl of rice and a bicycle to get wround-shelter from the rain, he has enough.

-we feel that is good, but that is not enough., were trying to raise everyones

The services conducted by Jones resembled the sermons preached by Jesus Christ during his short stay on Earth. The sermons offered to the masses by Christ so angered the rich and powerful that they conspired to have him put to



Her Request for a delegation from the USSR to visit the Feoples Temple Agricultural/hedical Cooperative at Jonestonn, N.V.R., Guyana

#### Dear Comrades:

Fursuant to our discussions concerning relocation of the reoples Temple Agricultural/medical Cooperative (Jonestown) in the USBA, we are requesting a delegation from the USBA come to Jonestown.

The delegation ( of perhaps 3 to 5 persons) during their stay at our community, would be able to get a first-hand view of our cooperative, and ascertain just how our group would best be located in the Soviet Union. The delegation would also be able to discuss the manner and means of our proposed re-settlement at length with (de. Jim Jones and our administrative staff, as well as with our residents. Although we are on a very restricted budget ( we will lose some of our upcoming harvest because of the heavy rains) we will certainly help defray the costs of such a delegation. Naturally there will be no cost at all while you are our guests.

Our desire to resettle in the Soviet Union remains as firm as ever, and we hope for the realization of this desire in the near future. We live a simple, communist lifestyle. We have experienced the bourgeois life and it does not appeal to wa. Of course, we intend that all our funds—savings, checks and pensions etc—be channelled into the Soviet Union. Cde Jones himself cares nothing for money, he only has one pair of slacks and one pair of shoes. On the other hand, we provide free medical care to anyone and everyone who meeks our help, on a totally equal basis. Just this week we took in several more children who were saffering from tuberculosis. These infants were alfaleasifeless, and are now on the road to recovery. They will be with us until they are well enough to return to their parents. We test everyone's eyes that come to see us, and we have found several dozen who need catarast surgery. We are not capable of favoritism and to date we have turned away no one. Often, families stay for weeks at our Georgetown headquarters while receiving treatment—without charge.

If we went to the Soviet Union the burden of providing this extensive medical and dental care would be lifted. Now we are overwhelmed by the need, and it seems that although the Linister of health, hamilton Green, seems quite friendly and concemmed, nevertheless we cannot seem to get any of the medical supplies that people send to us. For example, one man, Dr. Thain, a somewhat conservative person who visited our cooperative and was so impressed by what he saw, and by what Cde Jones told him about socialism and the Soviet Union that he sent us some expensive medical equipment, has unsuccessfully tried to trace the shipment of those supplies for several months. The equipment never got to us. Lergaps the United States is sabotaging this and other shipments; we do not know.

We hope that you can arrange for a delegation at the earliest possible date.

My messian is not particularly good, but our children are a wife and you would be impressed greatly. They are fantastic in limital ability. We have a breakdwin in communications, Commades. The of course suffering with a health problem and it's now, I believe, gone into the fourth month with an elevated temperature which seems to be getting higher. The last couple of days it's nearly been 105° and it exceeded 105° at one point and I had to have a series of cold showers and alcohol sponges. I need medical attention greatly. But I understand that we have now incommended the Soviet Union someway by using your telephone and that there is some disturbance over this. Frankly, comrades, we have a very fine collective. He are not perfect. This is a collective that would be a model to any nation. We have broken ageism, sexism, and elitism, and racism.

There is a harmony and joy observed by Mark Lane (internationally famous author, investigator of American conspiracies). He just left and said, "After being here a few days I noticed that no-one raised their voice to another, that there's no hiding, that everything's done by logic, and the love and warmth between people. Children reading to seniors, seniors teaching children arts that | would be lost when the seniors pass on to the finality of death.

My major concern is that we are in a commery that is not socialist. There are socialists at heart in the Cabinet, but in sommany areas, in so many echolous, there are not socialists. Through the brainwashing of Hollywood films, (One Cabinet Minister tried to stop the incoming of Hollywood films but he's been unsuccessful), and as long as this imput of false ideals and materialistic values are put before the people, there well be no change. There's not enough structure for a real socialist society in this country. We have structure but much joy, much entertainment, all sorts of fascinating experiences in theatre, art and dence.

I can let some of the comrades discuss that with you. But I hear now that there may be no possibility of this. We'd like to know. We are not a people who believe in dilusions or illusions. If we are to die, then we wish to know that we are to die. For six days and seven nights, we thought we literally we were about to die. As you perhaps heard, one of the conspirators came forward and said rockets were simed at our radio room and our generators where many of our lives would have been taken, and the said that if the mission had gone off, they knew that many would have died, children and women (innocents), but the old American image of being the conquerer was more important than anything having te do with mercy and regard for what our people wanted to do with their lives. 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pulled back. He said this is a lie. These people are happy. He could see that there are no barbed wire fences and there are no patrols.

Then, if the Soviet Union is out, I don't think that I can write it. I'm a man who believes in Communism. I believe in speaking out against evil when I see it, the CIA it's manipulations and machinations in Africa, the Soviet policies in Ethiopia and Angola. If firm, believe in the Soviet Union's domestic policies as well as her foreign policies. I am probably more Soviet than some, in fact I know I am. I met two Soviets some years ago and I am far more prosoviet than they were. And that's true too of all this community. If you find that hard to believe, that's why I'm anxious for you to come. But I'd really like to know. I don't want any games between us. If it's not possible, or if it's going to take a long time, my community still needs me because I've been of been a helper in every time of storm. I've got them out of troubles, people of color are always framed, hounded by this agency or that agency, police, and even many whites in our midst have are professional people have gone through great harasment. Temples (our headquarters) have been burnt down, our senior citizen's hones. There's an incredible amount of things that have been done to us.

We were nearly lynched two years ago as two of our busses traveled through Northern California in a place called Santa Rosa near Sonoma when a mob surrounded the black busdrivers and were going to hang them on the spot. And what did the court do, slapped them on the wrist and gave them a suspended sentence.

U.S.A is not the place for us to go. It is not the time for revolution there. There is not a strong communist party in the U.S.A. It is not strong yot. The ones that are very dedicated know that there are many infiltrators. There is no strong socialist movement; BB. Carlton Goodlett has often made that observation, and the trade union movement is not free. That makes the difficulty of overcoming fascism most difficult indeed. So we are in the precarious situation of being very very activist, well-known communist.
Enrxist-Leninist Socialist oriented. So we cannot go back, according to all of our counsellers, our Soviet friends there. who would be jailed, framed. And we would not mind that but it would be hard on children and seniors. But we have to make a decision. We don't like living in a vacuum. We don't like talking to people who don't even understand the Alrst ADC's of Marxist-Leninism, who don't understand the concepts of detante and peace. We were speaking with someone high up in the PNC the other day who was giving such a sulegy of Chim. I explained the doctrine of the Three Worlds to him, and I said "of course you know that the doctrine of Three Worlds says that the USSR is the greatest enemy and that the facts that they base that arguement upon are C.I.A. misinformation, that the Soviet Union has the largest standing army, whereas half the Soviet Army or a good proportion of it is involved in human service work, and the pay scale is different. And all the facts are miscontrued. It is obvious that thett. S. is the greatest threat to peace in the world.

If this is cancer, as one slide has revealed, then I may have five or seven years—that would be more than adequate for me to build a community so that it can continue.

I would like from you just a direct response. Are we or are we not welcome in the Soviet Union? Can it be or what is the proceedings of the possibility of it being so?

The Mirror has been a puzzlement to me. We have been friendly when it endangered us with the PNC. We invited the Mirror to a Press Conference with Mark Lane and the Mirror said very little of the beauty had told them (Mark Lane, the famous author), of all the beauties he had seen here. They didn't say much about that at all. It seems a very, very strange situation we find ourselves in. And the PNC's newsorgans are extremely careful about us. In fact until I really got irate, they were going to tell us I could not talk about socialism on the radio at all.

Well, I shall close by saying "I want Peace." (in Russian) and I hope we will be friends and be able to build together in years to come.

How she had to call on us to bring peopleclear across the country to No. Carolina to protest political prisoners such as Ben Charis. How we were the masses behind every political activity. The was quite impressed with the fact Angela had visited our center in SF. Mention Ben Chavis and othercases we worked for.

-Names sometimes seem to impress him. Even that you met with Mrs. Carter and talked to her about your views on Cuba etc. He seemed surprised to see Richard Janero with us at the bank. A couple of dignified older people would be good to include at least once in awhile in the people who talk to them. (strangely enough Russians are conservative in some ways)

-of course important to balance praise of JJ and JT (or descriptions of them) with the more inclusive mentions of our committment to USSR and to world communism - as they will be watching for hero worship (personality cultism). However, they seem less critical of this than the Cubans. (I think the Russians are more realistic about the difficulty one has in the US of keeping any group together and would understand better the need of a strong leader to make the transition, but I think you should explain the strategy of this anyway to them to show you see it as only a means to an end and not a ego need on your part.) It might help for them to see your house (or have one of the cottages made up to be your house so they can say they saw & how you live when they went on tour. You wouldn't have to stay at the cottage, just have it pointed out as your house. Mark Lane asked where you lived and Mike Prokes wisely said "one of the cottages" which I think is a good idea to say. The your house is actually very modest for a leaderm and not even any socialist anyplace in the wax more developed nations would live as simply, and maybe many even in underdeveloped countries live more prestigiously.

Fedor has asked what our goals are - so he'll want that stated. In person we have promised that you would really lay it out for them, so you can go into our hopes, some of us, to participate in liberation struggles (you might even want to mention your participation in something significant in the anti-war movement without going into the exact detail of what you did). However, I'm not sure they are prepared for this/ you'd have to feel him out first as they are a very cautious people and don't always let you know how they feel.

-he was impressed that we didn't use work as a punishment/ but said they haven't reached that state yet. They send someone to work with the soil if it is a person who hammen is from a well-off family/ but since everyone gets a chance to work with the soil you can explain that this isn't necessary.

-we had w quite a dialogue about whether we would ever be more specialized / as we told him everyone has some time in the fields. In Russia they have specialists. We said we have them too but

-he wondered if people would ever miss their "motherland"- said some had come back to Russia because it was their mother land even the they had left at some time. We should stress if the question comes up, the hardships were ourpeople have endured (the I think we have gone over that many times.)

-one thing I found them idealistic about is opposition papers in the US. He said there were such papers. I told him people hardly read them, or don't react if they do as people are bombarded by TV and the sensational news in major papers.

-in the past he has been very concerned with no ruffling the Guyanaese in anything they do withus. So that should be addressed. They said at one time that they might even have to stop seeing us if it would aggrevate the Guyanese govt. However they seem more pissed in it he last few mos. against the Guyanese because of the treatment they have received so they don't mention that much anymore, but it is something to keep in mind.

-things have changed also with exodus because at first he had said it might be difficult to come from Guyana to USSR being US citizens which is complicated. Since their relations have worseded with both the US and Guyana, this hasn't been mentioned

-my view is a that he wants you to come to USSR with a delegation because they don't make decisions mg independently and the few people at the Embassy can't make the decision. The delegation meeting with the decision makers in USSR as well as their visit here - both probably would be necessary for a final decision.

-he probably won't give you many answers. He is not allowed to give independent answers. They don't work that way. He is a fact finder and unless he's received answers to prior communications he won't hage that power. However, he might have answers to our pier prior communications. We told him we understood about this as we work that way too.

NOTE OF INTEREST: on his vacation, or after his 2 mos. in Moscow (Jume, July), he went to NY and had something to do with the US spy case.. So that is something you might want to show your knowledge of. He is an international lawyer as well as a press representative for the Embassy and acting Ambassador while the Ambassador is getting medical care. He has a young child about 3 years old who is very spoiled (or maybe just obstrepersus). He is very permissive with the child but admits the child is very destructive (this is Pedor Timofeyev the Acting Ambassador). The doctor I've never met. Fedor's wife is very friendly and warm to us and both came to ourcultural show and liked it. 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With the Guyanese attitude of not wanting to give Jim Jones written assurance on travel and with Guyana saying that Jim Jones would have to play a hide and seek game while in Georgetown—if worse came to worse would there be some way that Jim and John could go to the Soviet Union. This is important to us because if Jim demanded that the majority of people go to the Soviet Union without him, it would be like we were dead (if he didc't go also). However, if the issue comes up, Jim wants his family (Somestown) to go even if he and John cannot go. We know we don't yet have a formal invitation so we want to know, and people asked me to ask you, if Jim and John could go to the USSR.

We have heard that they are daugling Jim's court situation to hold Jim in the Interior because they know of his influence. They see him organizing more people to be Marxist-Leninists -- in the way that he does -- using the church, and working through religion etc. Peoples Temple was told this by Wills and also by one of his Secretaries and even Minister Mingo said it would be possible. This was some time ago but Minister Mingo did say it was possible. We think that Jim has concluded that the U.S.A and Guyana my put too much pressure on Peoples Temple and that Jim will have to remain and die before he'll be able to go to the USSR. Jim won't sacrifice John as a political pawn when he knows Grace and Tim Stoen never showed any real concern for John. It's not something that Jim talks about much but Jim always tells us that we will be happy in the Soviet Union. Jim has often expressed the desire to have that opportunity of going to the USSR and once or twice he has cried and asked if there wasn't some way that John could be carefully taken to the WSSR even if Jim Jones had to remain here. Jim doesn't like people to cry and he stops the tears. One member said he had never seen him cry before in all the years.

Jim would go into the jungle if he can't go to the USSR. He is no idealist and knows about that type of environment. He knows he wouldn't live very long. But at least John would be better off going to the USSR than back to Grace if Jim Jones died. You don't know how evil Grace Stoen is—devious and diabolical.

John was made by Grace to listen to her having sex and also she made him kiss her on different parts of her body, the child remembers it vividly.

We don't know if people would go to the USSR without Jim. It makes a very difficult situation, not because of any personality cult but merely because of his character and a sense of loyalty. He has sacrificed in physical ways to help all the ones he loves financially.

When Peoples Temple members were being framed in the courts, Jim would see that the courtrooms were filled. We wouldn't do anything threatening—just git there and look at the jury and the'd know which side Peoples Temple was be. Many people were freed from jail and false charges. Jim would stand behind anyone who was being framed in the courts no matter who they were—even if they were a total stranger. And as far as his own'life—when Salvadore Allende was killed and Chilean refugees came—Jim stood by them when they were being framed and harassed. Jim doesn't expect to sajoy life in the USSR—he would love to but he doesn't count on it. It's too painful

to count on but it's important to him that his people be gotten to the USSR.

Minister Mingo had not been friendly and it correlated with the time you visited Jonestown. But the next time we saw him he was warmer and friendlier but he still wouldn't give us any assurances. And he said that although we have the word of Dr. Reid, he still can't put anything on paper. We have seen other people in the PMC who seem friendly so maybe it was just coincidental. It doesn't make any sense to us unless as we said it is coincidental.

We have seen Minister Mingo get awfully upset when he has beein in the office with other people. We have never seen him talk roughly to us like he did at the time of your visit. It is almost as if he was trying to force us into bringing Jim into Georgetown and he put the blame on us for telling him about the problem. He thinks it would be easier to to talk to the Russia directly rather than writing which would take pages to explain the situation with Grace. The USSR is pretty Victorian and doesn't always understand and he thinks it would be better conveyed in person. Feople in extra-marital relations were often not allowed in decision-making roles in the USSR (those in politics). Sharon mentioned Lenin had a mistress and he said he had never heard that before. She said it was common knowledge and it was not a negative reference. He said anything US said may havet truthful things and maybe one lie-that is how the US tries to discredit . He said he studied Lenin for many years and had never heard that. He said he certainly would be interested in hearing that information. Sharon said she hoped the the USSR would understand that people in crases are in a different situation. The USSR has it easier since all are Communists and life is not in conflict, family like is not interfered with by political strife, etc. Even the USSR may have problems Lenin was in a different historical situation as was Jim. (with adversaries, etc.) He (Fedor) says he understands but still thinks it is important to get a general decision and then go on with ways to handle this situation and that certainly Jim would be the first to get acceptance. Jim could maybe see Russia first using medical care as a basis and then could stay there longer. Sharon said Jim would want the entire group with him too. Fedor suggested Jim going first. Fedor said lets iron out this situation in the general question first. In the meantime do as much legally as we can. Sharon told him that was a long process. and whati if its not finished. He feels it is better to ask one thing at a time. He hoped that Jim could visit first-hand to tell the story himself. Sharon that USSR would visit here. He said Yes, but after that maybe Russia will invite Jim there to talk directly. Sharon asked about the money. He said as he understood there was no hurry-he had mentioned it but had not yet gotten an answer. He did convey the notes we wrote up -- the amount of money. That came as a surprise to him-Swiss banking-so he had conveyed that but had not more specific answers at this time. 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STUDY OUTLINE OF THE CONSTITUTION (FUNDAMENTAL LAW) OF THE UNION OF SOCIALIST REPUBLICS

LESSON 2: CHAPTER 2 "THE ECONOMIC SYSTEM"

INTRODUCTION: AN "ECONOMIC SYSTEM" IS THAT PART OF SOCIETY WHICH IS CONCERNED WITH THE PRODUCTION AND DISTRIBUTION OF GOODS AND SERVICES. IT CONTROLS CONCEPTS OF PROPERTY, WHICH CAN GENERALLY BE DESCRIBED AS "OWNERSHIP" WITH EMPHASIS ON THE OWNERSHIP OF THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION. THE SOVIET SYSTEM IS A SOCIALIST SYSTEM WHERE MOST PROPERTY IS PUBLIC PROPERTY, EXCEPT FOR PERSONAL GOODS, PERSONAL SAVINGS FROM EARNED INCOME, AND PERSONAL RESIDENCE, WHICH IS PRIVATE PROPERTY - SUBJECT ONLY TO THE CONTROL OF THE PERSON WHO OWNS IT. ALL OTHER PROPERTY IS COLLECTIVE OR PUBLIC PROPERTY OWNED BY ALL THE PEOPLE, AND ADMINISTERED BY GOVERNMENT FOR THE BENEFIT OF ALL THE PEOPLE. THIS CHAPTER DESCRIBES THE SOVIET SYSTEM IN GENERAL TERMS.

Socialist Ownership ARTICLE 10. THE MASIS OF THE SOVIET ECONOMIC SYSTEM IS THE PUBLIC OWNERSHIP OF THE MEANS OF PRODUCTION. THE PEOPLE OWN IT IN THE FORM OF STATE PROPERTY, COLLECTIVE FARMS, AND CO-OPERATIVE PROPERTY. IT ALSO INCLUDES THE PROPERTY OF TRADE UNIONS AND OTHER PUBLIC ORGANIZATIONS. THE GOVERNMENT PROTECTS SOCIALIST PROPERTY. NO ONE HAS THE RIGHT TO USE IT FOR PERSONAL GAINS OR OTHER SELFISH ENDS.

ARTICLE 11. STATE PROPERTY IS THE COMMON PROPERTY OF THE SOVIET

State property PEOPLE. IT IS THE PRINCIPLE FORM OF SOCIALIST PROPERTY. LAND, MINERALS, WATERS AND FORESTS ARE THE EXCLUSIVE PROPERTY OF THE STATE. NO PUBLIC ORGANIZATION, LIKE A TRADE UNION, OR PRIVATE PERSON CAN OWN THEM. THE STATE OWNS THE BASIC MEANS OF PRODUCTION IN INDUSTRY, CONSTRUCTION AND AGRICULTURE, TRANSPORTATION AND COMMUNICATION, THE BANKS, TRADE ORGANIZATIONS AND PUBLIC UTILITIES; MOST URBAN HOUSING, AND OTHER PROPERTY NECESSARY FOR STATE PURPOSES. ARTICLE 12. COLLECTIVE FARMS AND CO-OPERATIVE ORGANIZATIONS OWN

THEIR MEANS OF PRODUCTION AND THE OTHER THINGS THAT THEY NEED TO

Property of collective farms and co-operative organtions

FULFILL ALL OF THE PURPOSES LAID DOWN BY THEIR RULES. COLLECTIVE FARMS DO NOT OWN THEIR LAND, BUT THEY ARE GIVEN THE RIGHT TO USE IT FREE, BY THE STATE, FOREVER. THE POLICY OF THE STATE IS TO ENCOURAGE COLLECTIVE FARMS AND CO-OPERATIVE FARMS AND CO-OPERATIVE PROPERTY, AS BEING SIMILAR TO STATE PROPERTY. COLLECTIVE FARMS, LIKE ALL LAND USERS, ARE OBLIGED TO MAKE EFFECTIVE AND THRIFTY USE OF THE LAND AND TO INCREASE ITS FERTILITY.

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- ARTICLE 13. EARNED INCOME FORMS THE HASIS OF THE PERSONAL PROPERTY OF SOVIET CITIZENS. THIS MEANS THAT INCOME CANNOT BE GOT BY INVEST-MENT - COLLECTING RENTS, INCOME FROM STOCKS AND SO FORTH. THAT IS CAPITALISM. THE PRINCIPLE IS THAT ALL PERSONAL PROPERTY MUST BE EARNED BY THE INDIVIDUAL BY HIS OWN LABOR - NOT THE LABOR OF ANOTHER. SUCH PROPERTY INCLUDES ARTICLES OF EVERY DAY USE AND CONSUMPTION, TOOLS REQUIRED TO WORK A SMALL PRIVATE FARM WHICH IS PERMITTED; PRO-VIDED THAT IT DOES NOT EXCEED ONE ACRE, THAT IS WORKED ONLY BY THE "OWNER", AND THAT IT IS DONE IN SPARE TIME AFTER A REGULAR JOB. THIS IS DONE BY MANY PEOPLE WHO WORK ON STATE FARMS AND ON COLLECTIVE FARMS. OTHER APPROVED PERSONAL PROPERTY - A HOUSE AND EARNED SAVINGS. THE STATE PROVIDES ASSISTANCE TO PEOPLE WHO FARM SMALL PAR-CELS. WHICH THEY REFER TO AS "SMALL HOLDINGS". PROPERTY OWNED OR USED BY CITIZENS MAY NOT BE USED TO DERIVE UNEARNED INCOME OR BE EM-PLOYED TO THE DETRIMENT OF SOCIETY. FOR EXAMPLE, ONE MAY HAVE MONEY IN A SAVINGS ACCOUNT BUT IT IS AGAINST THE LAW TO LEND IT TO A FRIEND OR NEIGHBOR AT INTEREST BECAUSE THE INTEREST WOULD BE "UN-EARNED INCOME".

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ARTICLE 14. THE LABOR OF THE SOVIET PEOPLE, FREE OF EXPLOITATION the source (THAT IS, CAPITALISTS RAKING OFF A PROFIT), IS THE SOURCE OF THE GROWTH OF SOCIAL WEALTH AND WELL BEING OF THE SOVIET PEOPLE. THE STATE CONTROLS THE AMOUNT OF LABOR REQUIRED, AND THE AMOUNT OF CON-\* SUMPTION ALLOWED (GIVEN THERE IN TERMS OF MONEY OR WAGES) IN ACCOR-- DANCE WITH THE PRINCIPLE OF SOCIALISM: "FROM EACH ACCORDING TO HIS ABILITA, TO EACH ACCORDING TO HIS WORK." IT FIXES THE RATE OF TAXA-TION ON TASABLE INCOME.

BY THE INTENTION AND PLAN OF ELIMINATING THE DISTINC-TION BETWEEN URBAN AND RURAL WORK AND SOCIETY.



### STUDY OFFILINE OF THE CONSTITUTION (FUNDAMENTAL LAW) OF THE UNION OF SOCIALIST REPUBLICS

INTRODUCTION: A CONSTITUTION IS THE HIGHEST LAW OF A COUNTRY. IT IS
THE BASIC FRAMEWORK UPON WHICH ALL OTHER LAWS ARE MADE. IT IS THE
HIGHEST LAW AND NO OTHER LAWS OR REGULATIONS CAN BE IN CONFLICT WITH
IT. IT TELLS ABOUT THE BASIC ORGANIZATION OF THE GOVERNMENT, WHICH
AFFECTS ALL PARTS OF LIFE, POLITICAL, ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL.

:...

THIS CONSTITUTION WAS ADOPTED OCTOBER 7, 1977. THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL CONSTITUTIONS BEFORE IT. IT IS THE SUMMARY OF THE EXPERIENCE OF THE SOVIET PEOPLE IN GOVERNING THEMSELVES AND IN BUILDING A SOCIALIST STATE WORKING TOWARD COMMUNISM, BEGINNING WITH THE OCTOBER 1917 REVOLUTION. IT IS THE FRUIT OF SIXTY YEARS OF THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE SOVIET STATE. IT SPEAKS NOT ONLY TO THE FORM AND STRUCTURE OF THEIR OWN GOVERNMENT, BUT ALSO TO THEIR GOALS, AMBITIONS AND DREAMS FOR THE PROGRESS OF ALL OF MANKIND ALONG THE PATH OF MARXISM-LENINISM.

THIS CONSTITUTION IS DIVIDED INTO 21 CHAPTERS. EACH CHAPTER SETS FORTH A PARTICULAR ASPECT OF THE SOVIET SYSTEM. WE SHALL STUDY THE CHAPTERS ONE AT A TIME. THESE CHAPTERS ARE FITTED INTO NINE BASIC SECTIONS, WHICH ARE IN TURN DIVIDED INTO ONE OR MORE CHAPTERS WHICH ARE IN TURN DIVIDED INTO A TOTAL OF 172 ARTICLES. SO THE CONSTITUTION HAS NINE SECTIONS, 21 CHAPTERS AND 172 ARTICLES.

NOTE: I DON'T KNOW WHAT THEY CALL THE NINE BASIC DIVISIONS - THEY DO NOT SAY. I GAVE THEM THE NAME OF "SECTIONS" FOR CONVENIENCE OF REFERENCE."

TEACHING NOTE: I AM GOING TO DIVIDE THE CONSTITUTION INTO 21 "LESSONS" - ONE FOR EACH CHAPTER. ONE OR MORE LESSONS OR FEWER, CAN BE GIVEN, OF COURSE, AT THE INSTRUCTOR'S CONVENIENCE. I HAVE INCLUDED EXPLANATION WHERE I FELT IT MIGHT BE OF VALUE.

Dear Comrades.

Jim Jones has always had the greatest respect for the Soviet Union, not only as the avant-garde of socialist progress in the world, but as the most important force for peace, social justice, and liberation of oppressed peoples in the world. He has been forthright in his praise of the achievements of the Soviet Union in providing a high standard of living for all of its people, insuring the basic necessities of decent housing, food, medical care, recreation, culture, and of course, full employment, even in spite of the great obstacles to progress, such as the ravages of the Great Patriotic War, which took a tremendous tell. Jim Jones has consistently praised the USSR and the Soviet People as having made the difference in that war, saving the world from fascism. (It was as a teenager that Jim Jones developed a high regard for the Soviet Union, in hearing of the valiant defense of Stalingrad: it was a major turning point in his life).

Henry in the U.S., such as Dr. Carlton Goodlett, president of the National Newspaper Publishers Association (black press of America) can attest to Cde. Jones strong pro-Soviet outlook. So can, for example, author-journalists Albert Kahn, and Mike Davidow, both good friends of Jim Jones. Peoples Temple, which was founded by Jim Jones during the McCarthy Era in apeniod of intense anti-communica in American life, is well known for its involvement and support of peace and activism and liberation struggles. Supporters include the American-Russian Institute (whose San Francisco director recently praised Jim Jones in New Times magazine), the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom, and the World Peace Council. People's Temple in San Francisco has hosted delegations of artists, writers, and scientists from the USSR, and has sponsored Soviet-American cultural events. Peoples Temple has also shown me my films of the USSR graciously loaned to us here in Guyana. Members of the Peoples Temple Agricultural Project have been studying Russian language and culture, and also world news as presented from the Soviet perspective. Several months ago, Ode. Alexander Voropasv, TASS correspondent from the Soviet Embassy in Georgetown, came to visit Jonestown and wrote a glowing article for the Soviet News Agency TASS pressing the socialist achievement and progressive community that has been established here, and the dynamic leadership of Ode. Jones.

Ode. Jones has stressed that all members of the community should strive for an internationalist consciousness of world events and liberation struggles from a working class perspective. He has consistently presented news events to the community from all over the world, with informed commentaries from an absolutely pro-Soviet perspective.

Ode. Jones has been openly and sharply critical of China's betrayal of Marxist-Leninism, socialism, and proletarism internationalism, and the revolutionary and national liberation movements of Asia, Africa, Latin America, and her alignment with Western imperialism. He has said that China has sold out Marxist-Leninism for nationalism, chauvenism, and blatantly aggressive expansionism, which is having the effect of mullifying the gains they have made for the Chinese people domestically. Ode. Jones strongly disapproves of elements of elitism and personality cultism: in Jonestown, every person can have a voice. He refuses any special titles of honor, or any special conveniences or privileges above the rest of the people. Self-criticism is practiced daily, and all in the community are urged to give Jim Jones constructive criticism at least once a month. He has clearly shown that Maolsts do not practice what they preach about self-criticism - as is evidenced by their arrogant, manipulative foreign policy directions, which are en open provocation of nuclear war. China is guilty of the very hegemony they claim to despise and cannot be justified by any humane communist (nor could any Marxist-Leminist carry the means apartify the ends to the degree they base their foreign policy on: the inflexible certainty of nuclear holocaust). Though many people in the Jonestown community cannot vocalise their views as well as Cde. Jones, everybody here feels much the same way. Jim Jones agrees that the Chinese are, without a doubt, a great people, and one way or another, sooner or later, they will sweep away the sous and overcome their profound ideological and political errors.

We all are grateful for the possibility of resettling someday in our spiritual motherland, the Soviet Union, should events make that necessary. It is almost impossible to practice a pure form of collectivism in a surrounding environment not only ignorant but frequently hostile to such a lifestyle that is based purely on Marxist-Isminist principles. As a thousand Americans, we would, were a to relocate in the Soviet Union, continue as we are presently to learn the Russian quage and assimilate and contribute our many skills towards the building of

socialism. Indeed our entire community is undertaking to learn Russian, and have enthusiastically exposed ourselves to much cultural material about the USSR. We would also be a thousand living witnesses to human rights violations in the Uhited States, in our own lives and in the lives of many of our friends and loved ones, that would make the world understand the full measure of hypocrisy in the U.S. bellyhoo about so-called "human rights" violations of a handful of criminal, reactionary elements in the Soviet Union. We would be proud to be a part of a nation that is backing all genuine people's liberation struggles, as in Ethiopia and Angola, and that has the most humane domestic policies and constitution of any nation on earth, and which shows more restraint in the interests of maintaining world peace than any other nation on earth. We firmly believe that the only reason that a third world war has not broken out is because of the moral force of the Soviet Union. The United States has not had war on its soil for over a hundred years, and the abominable opiate of religion has led the nation into a terrible arrogance of power and moral self-righteousness that imperils world peace.

The people of this community are sickened, again, at US hypocrisy on the issue of human rights, and this ridiculous concern about reactionary criminal-type elements and even proven felons in Soviet society (the so-called "dissidente") whose 'rights' are sanctimoniously defended in US ruling circles (and their mass-media), while tens of thousands (perhaps into the millions) of political prisoners of all reces are languishing in US jails, or are suffering and dying in ghettoe, Native American reservations, and in pockets of great poverty and degradation in the US, as a result of capitalist greed, to say nothing of the victims of US and NATO imperialism and criminal dictators propped up by US dollars abroad.

At the Jonestown community, residents are keenly aware of latest developments in world events, as we have mentioned. The liberation struggles in Africa all are carefully reviewed and supported. We are expecially appreciative of the USSR and Cuba's consistent support for the genuine liberation struggles on that strategic continent. We are appalled by the persistence of US aid to the racist Smith and Vorster regimes. Ode. Jones has pointed to the Kampuchean/Vietnam hostilities, discussing the nationalistic and retrograde nationalistic policies of the Kampuchean government, while extelling the internationalist and progressive outlook of Vietnem and the firm alliance with the Warsaw pact nations. Residents In Jonestown are kept up-to-date on events in places such as Iran, where active resistance is now threatening the victors, oppressive government of the Shah, and similar events in Mosragus, where the Senosacregime, after the bloody that of WS-banked repressive rule, is about to be ousted. Moreover, we were gratified that China had so little effect following her ethnocentric so-called "Doctrine of Three Worlds" philosophy while in Iran. We study daily the achievements of the USSR and Cuba (where Ode. Jones visited last year), etc., the achievements of emerging Marxist-Leminist nations (like Embiopia), and various past class struggles for liberation, such as in Algeria. We use audio/visual aids to make this study a community event. Films such as Pontecorvo's Battle of Algiers, Eisenstein's Potenkin, documentaries on the USSR, the Rosenbergs, on Hitlerian fascism, the Vietnam War, and many films on the ravages of US capitalism at home and imperialismaabroad, have helped to enhance our understanding appreciation of world events, and to put all in a comprehensive perspective. Jim Jones also points out the true reason the USA dropped the atomic bombs on Japan was primarily to keep the Soviet Union from genuinely liberating Japan. The entire community also has the firm history that originally the servents of imperialism, such as Churchill and US monopoly interests, made Hitler's Germany possible in the first place with the hope that Hitler's military might would destroy the great October 1917 Soviet Revolution. Western imperialist interests did not count on the contradictions of power and competition that ultimately will destroy the outmoded and consistently cruel finance monopoly capitalist system. We are now involved as a community in the study of political assassination as it has been used in the US to instill in the people an acceptance of neo-fascist, police-state policies and to whip wp cold war frenzies, such as a new, repressive crime bill that would further entrench and legitimise reactionary power in the hands of the US ruling elite. It would indeed take many pages to catalogue the entire range of world events and issues that we daily discuss in our study groups and classes in Jonestown, as the people many of whom had been deprived of a decent education under conditions of racism and economic oppression in the US -- develop an informed, socialist consciousness. have also devoted time to teaching and discussing basic principles of Marxistteniniam in our community here. Incidentally, we have nearly wiped out illiteracy in less than one year (over 50% of our people were absolutely illiterate as of last December, and now we have only two).

In conclusion, we are endeavoring in Jonestown, under the compassionate tership and wisdom of our vast US and Guyana projects administrator, Cde. Jim 3, to not only develop as a model of communistic co-operation and production, at to understand our collective as part of the international movement for human

liberation which our 'spiritual motherland,' the USSR, has pioneered in this century. Our heartfelt, profound fraternal greetings go out to our comrades in the Soviet Union, along with the greetings of Cde. Jones, and his desire, even though we today stand in the ominous shadow of nuclear war, that under the banner of Marxist-Lenimist co-operation and internationalism, a great future will be realised for all mankind.

(Meaning the part where we said we would be kicked out) He said this is why he suggested this in the first place because of this, He said Jagan did ask one thing that he couldnt' answer and that was about the Parlimentary Bill that granted our lease of land. He asked if ah could have a copy of that to understand exactly what our status was here. Marcy mentioned that Jagan had asked the same thinng to her but she really didn't know shexuarks she mentioned we would ask. He asked how we did communicate if it was by radio, because he had freind w he said that told him that US Embassy monitors the radio. He asked us to please be careful and not say anything. He said not that we have anything to hide but they could use something. We assured him that we didn't discuss those kind of thinks over the radio.

We mentioned as we were leaving that our children were learning Russian and that Jim was hhe teacher, he said that he had about 6 tapes that he could lend us be said for not more than about a month because the Govt might want to use them and they would have some priority. He said if when we brought in that part about Roberts political interpretation he could give us the tapes, it would only take him one day. He was very friendly and said he looked froward to being able to meetxkinx Jim in person.

green again at all, we spoke with him. He was friendly to us, but he told us not to be disturbed by the article. He does not seem to realize the situation with this and the attack on Jim. The implication is that the clothes selling is illegal. He wouldn't talk about Carlton Goodlett or Don Freed with us, and when we offered him statements from people who are supportive of the Soviet Union, and who also support our work, he didn't say a word. (One of these people wasn't even supportive of the Soviet Union until they met us and saw the way we lived and our character.)

Although Jagan told us not to be disturbed by the article there is no use to fool with him if he can't see what it does - it's too much risk on our part. Jim has said it takes courage for us to keep talking with him. A PNC man who is very friendly to us and who is more Marxist than any other of the Marxists we've met in the government said that if we don't stop being friendly to Jagan we could get thrown out of Guyana overnight. But Jim wouldn't sell out his friends even if it meant dying - even though this seems to be a one-way friendship.

We don't understand why Jagan won't use his press to quote Goodlett and Freed and what they've said about our project. Everybody knows how Goodlett feels about Jagan. Goodlett spoke praiseworthy of him to the press. It would be a show of good faith for Jagan to do this because the blurb about our selling clothes up-river played right into the hands of the CIA. Maybe you could get him to do something along these lines and explain to him that we did invite somebody from the Mirror. The other press that was there just happened to hear about it and asked if they could come. We invited the only two that knew about it.

We showed our devotion to the Soviet Union during the press' visit. Admittedly, we praised the Soviet Union more than we did Jagan, but at the same time we didn't counter any of the things Goodlett was saying about him. What we did say sounds like what Jagan recommends in a national front/unified government. We feel that all the Marxists in Guyana ought to get together, because division plays right into the hands of the imperialists. Because of this posture we may not be talked about much in the press, or perhaps not at all.

You might also pass on to Jagan that we know there are friends of the PNC involved in the CIA conspiracy against us. Freed told us this even before Jagan did, but we don't want to go into it. We don't want it talked about by the press either because Freed is still looking into it and it would interfere with what he is doing. G-I-e-IE

Freed is a very prominent and powerful man, and is very favorable to the Soviet Union. He had a liberal attitude towards China before we talked to him, but Jim pointed out what China was doing in Africa and other countries. He told of their helping the fascists get established in Chile by giving them aid and at the same time not even giving asylum to the Chilean left refugees trying to escape the fascist's terror. He explained that China has been on the wrong side in Angola, Zaire, Somalia and Kampuchea (even Sen. McGovern recognizes that in Kampuchea 1/3csf the population - including socialists and communists - has been murdered

by cionalistic government). The his Japan friendship treaty is a threat to world peace; China is manethering in Yugoslavia; and it seems China is ready to come out in an open alliance with imperialists. Jim made it clear that China's agressive expansionist policies are threatening World War III.

You might be interested to know that Carlton Goodlett has been on Radio Moscow twice in the last few days. He was talking about the investigations of U.S. Congressmen and their financial holdings in South Africa. Over half of them have gold shares or some other type of investment in the fascist apartheid dictatorship. You know that he is very supportive of the Soviet Union. It is unfortunate he could not have spent more time in Guyana. He had a commitment to speak at a convention, so had time only to go straight to Jonestown and then return. He wanted to see Jim for at least one day. - they have been life-long friends and he calls Jim his "adopted brother." By the way, Goodlett told us - and this is very confidential - that Jagan always has to be right. Whatever is meant by this, we don't know.

To work together with certain elements of the PNC is rough sledding. You don't realize that every time we come in to talk to you we hear about it from the U.S. Embassy. No doubt it will be the same about us seeing Jagan.

Clifford was helpful in that he said they would try to get an investment maich would beild a higher interest, because of our humanitarian nature they bould not be treating us as capitalists. However, he stressed the dollar is Im bad shape and that is one reason why interest on it is not that great. He The surprised at the high interest rates we are getting on it right now. He waid really can't change it into reuples because there is a problem in getting Maples back into dollars if we ever wanted to. He said if we put in in oliars, we can always get it back out in dollars. We can have any signatory we want. He did say Soviet bankers are doing business and are not going to do any changes (like we do things) because of politicial changes. For example if we break a fixed time depoist we forfeit most all the interest. I said we understand that. He kind of said our crying or pleading would not relie a difference in such things. He said something like bankers are bankers wherever --- just that the money is used to better purposes. (this was after our pushing for better rates-tho he understood and said they would try to do so, etc. not treating us like they would capitalists.

-He has to know the exact, when, where, and how much of the situation before he gets any definitive answers and that means we have to just about get things precisely ready before we can get the answers we need. He said he must telex exact information in order to get exact answers, but he did not imply that it would take months to get answers if we could get exact information. He said they were acting more slowly since we had given the date of May as when we wanted to make the change and that they act accordingly. But if we wanted things sooner and provided the exact details I got the impression they would act faster.

-An interesting things he found out from us is that we get interest here on ever external savings and they don't because they only have an external checking. They like to just write checks so don't have any internal accounts and thus they are losing mohay. In a way I think he respects us for our getting the most we can. They obviously have not looked into the avenues of saving manay that we have, which was obvious to him. Also, about a month and a half ago the Soviets pulled money out of Guyana—I think due to impending inflation, or devaluation but they never told us. However, when we mentioned pulling the \$1,000,000 out and investing there, he said "what have you heard" as if he thought we might know something they do not know. He does this fairly often as if we may know more about things than they do and apparently we did as far as how external accounts work. It was when we mentioned pulling our money that he mentioned they had pulled some of theirs.

-on Guyanese immigrating. I am sorry as I thought at 6 am you gave me an instruction to mention guardianships and ask them if they had any ideas. We did not get into any long debates or into any arguments but I think you should know the following:

The USSR has no immigration system—for Africans or Guyanese or just about appone. In other words they have very very restricted immigration. They wont allow students to stay. He mentioned things like brain drain and all, but I still got the strong impression that they feel they cannot take a let of foreigners in and provide the comprehensive care that they do to every citizen because of expense. In other words their commitment to the individual is so great that they cannot affored to allow for lots and lots of immigrants.

-he said you (your group) would be coming for political asylum and that is totally different than taking in Guyanese, because Guyana is a socialist country with which they have fairly good relations. But he basically wants to get our

general issue (us) coming before getting to side issues. The he did say on a case by case base something may be worked out but that they could not classify Guyanese immigrants as coming for political asylum for obvious reasons. On children—he wants all documents in order first. He was dephatic on that and we did not argue—just discussed in general. We did not seem favorable to guardianship, but rather felt adoption would be far better.

The said naturally there would be no problem for little John in coming in the matter what papers we did or did not have for him. We assured him that we had papers for all our/American children. I think he may have thought we did not have for some of them.

He listened to the part shout our internal security system and a person associating with people in the conspiracy. He didn't comment much, but just listened. I explained that you have to act quickly sometimes when you live if fascism—especially if you have any indication the axe could fall. That it is not like living under the sceurity of socialism, etc. He said year facility before you act quartly. We asked about Americans receiving Social Security checks in the USSR. He does not know but will ask. We mentioned the the US brochure does not know the USSR as having people who receive them, but that they also were not on the prohibited list and we named the countries which were to him. He was interested in this (not in the money angle) just in which countries were prohibited for more political interests.

-the things he questioned us about most besiedes the exact specifics of what we wanted to do were: how did we get interest on our external accounts which MK explained? He that they might be being descriminated against but then it turned out that they were using a system of convenience which was costing them more because they were not getting interest. We said don't quote us---I am sure he won't anyway for his own reasons. The other question was what I said on what we had heard on devaluation.

-his views on Guyana. The USSR wants to get along with Guyana and wants to have good realtions, doesn't want to jeaopardize their relations.

-he aslo asked us the rationale we would use to get the money out of our external account which we explained as wur continued policy of buying equipment and things for the project in various countries. He said fine, just don't say its because we all plan to move to the USSR. We said of course not. He said this kind of half serious.

-he did ask if we would be willing to send a courrier to carry or bring the money to wherever. I said we would. He then said something about a revolutionary momen doing this—and joked about the robberies in Gtown, how you could not mear a watch. It is obvious to us and maybe to him also that we are much more adventuresome than their conservative ways. I did not specify who would go exactly just implied someone would be tit willing to go—obviously someone who is trusted in the small group in finances. But eventually he will have to know who in order to arrange a visa or letters of introduction or all that would pracede such a trip. It might not be to the USSR, but rather to a bank in some other country. (a soviet owned bank)

-he kind of teased us about how we could not persuade a Soviet banker by tears or emotion—that they are very strict on their procedures. We know that you have to negotiate on interest rates and I will tell Sharon to keep pushing on that when we meet on Monday. He is not unrecative to that, but just wants us to know wh can't change our minds mm quickly once we have made a commitment of funds to a fixed time, etc.

We were told by officials in the U.S. Embassy that they are very fond of Hoyte and they trust him because he has a liking and a concern for the U.S.

Our only contacts with the U.S. Embassy are on business, and frequently they put up a lot of smoke but there is no fire. Quite frankly, we don't give a damn what the U.S. thinks about you visiting us. Everybody is visiting these days, and for years we have been open friends with the Soviet Union while we were in America. If we were worried about the U.S. getting angry, we would not have displayed our friendship and solidarity so openly over there — so why would we worry now that we are 6000 miles away? Our support and friendship was well known: we did much legwork for the Soviet-American Friendship Society; we helped prepare various functions; we had group after group from the Soviet Union visit us; we sang "United Forever" in front of both Chinese and American officials (and have been singing this song for years), and have made no secret of our support for the Chilean refugees, including even giving one group their "bread and butter."

If there is some other reason you can not visit us - (in the future) such as that it were better for relations between Guyana and the Soviet Union - then please let us know or give us some sort of indication. We'd also like to know if Jagan is getting cooler to the USSR - as we are loyal to you. The USSR has been our "spiritual mother" for years.

We know that the Soviet Union is on a consistent path of principle. After the years of struggle and all the hell you went through in WWII with 22 million people dead and the homeland ravaged, the Soviet Union continued to consistently be on the right side of black and other liberation movements around the world. She has extended her support and shown solidarity, remaining true to the principles of proletarian internationalism. This is unlike China who has done much to improve its domestic situation but whose foreign policy is very backwards and even reactionary. In some ways she is worse than the United States because China is supposed to have socialist beliefs. Their whole posture makes us very suspicious of them.

Because members of the U.S. Congress are very supportive of us, the larget tactic the media is using is that we are friendly with the Soviet Union, and this is reflecting unfavorably on the United States. But we have always endured injustices— for 28 long years now—and we will endure this also. It was our defense and support for a black activist civil rights leader, Unita Blackwell Wright, that got us involved with the reactionary element in the first place. Then we took on Senator Stennis from Mississippi for harassing this progressive leader, and soon after that our problems began. This can be verified with the editor of a large daily newspaper that told us this is where the conspiracy begant looking back, we can see that this is indeed true that our problems began with Senator Stennia, but even though we were warned, Jim Jones will never compromise principle.

In case you can not sense the urgency of our appeal, we'd like to give you some examples of the day to day realities we live with. We had a man come to Jondatown recently and tell us there was a kidnapping planned for one of our members. He had been approached and asked to participate in the deal but had refused. We also recently had someone walk onto our property and wave a gun at some of our people. We have not made any complaints about these situations because nobody does anything anyway. But any one of these kinds of things could spark our having to take a stance to the death.

Farms, electricity station, club, dinner rooms, schools, kindergarden and the pride of the Jonestown citizens, the polyclinic. (phlyclinic in Russia is a clinic of many types of outpatient services). It's doctom not only keeps under medical control all the population of Jonestown but gives free of charge treatment to citizens nearby, not members. Every day 50-60 people from nearby villages, while receive treatment. The special subject of medical treatment of the doctor are children, more than 10% in the settlement besides the many that are adopted.

A big attention is also given to senior citizens, of which there are a large group in Jonestown. It is one more proof that the defenders of human rights can't give their citizens when they reach old age after working for a long time, a piece of breach so they receive all this in Jonestown.

There are 20,000 people in the organization. How there are 1000 in Guyana. This summer, JJ said, they expect the arrival of some more members an citizens of Jonestown. They are marked by a large love of life. They have an exceptional love of work, good will, hospitality, attention to the kids and respect for the seniors. There is a lot of popularity among citizens there of literature and films showing respect for the USSR and life there as well as that of other Socialist countries.

The situation in Covana is obviously very unstable right things seem to be a hodge-mode with no lines clearly drawn, no real government, and no alliances, holicits or otherwise, in the community. (Unless of course, you see some lines clearly drawn or know of an imminent revolutional which case we will hold out some way until something hits the fan). However, we do not see this hardly as even a likely possibility.

We want our children to be safe and grow up in a socialist environment, with socialist education and along socialist lines. Some of our children before they came here were destroyed on drugs, but they have found a new lease on life. We came here trying to save them from anarchistic behavior, and now none of them would even think of touching a drug even if they had to that is the kind of progress we've made. But we're asking for the opportunity for our children to grow up in a socialist country.

We want to follow Marxist-Leninist creed. We are not concerned for ourselves but in providing safety and security for our people. If we were to come to the USSR to live, we would not expect to stay together as a family group, or make it a criteria to stay together in the same place. We would not be taking any stands for principles because your principles are our principles. We would be contributing in whatever small way we could to the benefit of Soviet society. Certainly we would not be demanding any material comforts either. If our people could at least stay in the USSR until a time came when they could do something to help the USS. Even Jagan recently showed great concern about Guyana when he walked out of Parliament. We find that there just aren't that many people like Jim Jones in government. And we feel that such an important group like ours in terms of discipline, sensitivity and humanitarian concern, and with the medical knowledge we have, could be a benefit to the USSR. We feel here like a few healthy cells on the top of a cancer.

If there were not room forn to stay in the USSR for all our people than some of our abled hodied comrades would be happy to go to Mozamhique to contribute to the liberation struggles in Africa in whatever ways we could. Wherever we would go we would do an excellent job and rebuild, because we are tireless workers. If we can't be taken in and be useful someplace in a real socialist type of situation, then we would simply rather die. Why can't we be allowed to live principle lives in peace (here in Guyana)? What are we dealing with - technocrats?

We are a very pragmatic people and you can be atraightforward and blunt with us. We understand there is a problem verbalizing some things and so any indication at all - evan a nod of the head - to the following question would be deeply appreciated. Have Burnham and Jagan come to some sort of agreement, or is there something in the wind in that respect? Of course this will be kept in absolute confidence. It is very important for us to know this - and if you don't want to talk to us or give us some sort of indication, then please an directly to Jim Jones and let him know personally. We know that the PPP, and the PNC show strong interest in their own parties, but if there is a move to the right, and we are told to stay away from Jagan, then that situation is totally unacceptable to us (because Jagan is a friend of the Soviet Union and we are loyal to the Soviet Union). Then again, if Guyana is becoming more friendly with the Soviet Union and is trying to keep us from precipitating any problems, then we understand: But it is vitally important to the wellbeing of our entire family that we know this.

CDE. TIMOFEYEN: Visited us March the thirty-first at over home with Marceline J. Lew, Jim, Johnny B., Paula A, Sharon A, Deb T., In ref. to answering to alligations, Timofeyev said his country may receive neg news about us, and they should be able to contradict the accuations with the positive aspects. He asked what our goals were. Marceline told him that Jim would best be able to answer that. He maid everyone should be able to answer that in your group. It is important that all people know what there working for Marceline explained that overall, all people knew what they were working for, but (in so many words) our future depended on our surroundings, and made ref. to the letter we had shown him about luminda. Johnny said we did not use work as punishment. (implication was that we were self motivated) Timofeyev siad they had not reached that state, because in his country they use work as punishment eg. If someone came from a faimly that was well off and had a tendency to not work at all but try to sit back and live off of what was made by their families, they would send him/her to work with the soil. He asked us what we planned to do when we developed to ten thousand people, did we still plan to have everyone involved in decission making? Would all people work in the feilds? He said in his country, they had to have some people specialise in differnet areas of planning and reasearch. explained they had people highly developed in the feild af astronomical reasearch, as wall as the medical feild. They have a doctor here who specializes in bringing people back from the dead after the period of ten munites where it should be impossible. I mentioned that a schedule could be worked out so that each person could work perhaps six months in the feild they specialized and three no in the feild. Larry said he felt as a doctor that he would be abla to work along in both areas. Timofeyev siad, o.k., that's fine for a thousand people, but when you hav a whole country to worsy about. He said for a thousand people, you may make one mistake in agriculture and it would not be so serious. but for a whole country like Russia, or mistake we cant afford to make production wise. He said although they were highly advanced in area as of technoligy, they were far behind the U.S. govt. in the area of Agriculture. He said production was improtant for them and they could not afford to release people from their various areas of study. How would we then keep people from elitism? During the course fo the evening, we asked him why he was asking us to abswer to alligations; (ref. to Angela Davis being persucuted and receiving bad press) He said Angels Davis was popular, well known, her struggles Were well known, there was a campagine for her in Russia at the time and elogans fo free Angela. (The ref. was that she was a popular communist), but he was supprised to here about us, mentioned again that he had read our newspaper and was amazed at the way we boildly spoke of Soc principles. wasked us if we still printed our news paper and what was the circulation Johnny explained her character assanations are doen in the press (ref. to Lt. This could happen with you, in that people that have left take a good situation and add lies to it, take it out of context and youre mis repusented. The situation of the New west article was explained to him, in that none of that was true. It was just a situation set up to shine the lights on P.T. so that we could be used as a target for scrutiney and persucation.

We are showing you this letter because we have heard from prominant people in government that you are bugged. We are very displeased that the present government is bowing to US pressure more and more every day and we don't want to be part of a sell-out government.

We are willing to follow your advice on how to deal with this situation. We'd like your opinion on this issue. We will do whatever you say and will endure whatever is necessary for the good of the Socialist International Movement. We are open to any directions, as you read in the New Times, USSR is our "spiritual mother." We don't want to see Guyana go Capitalist and we don't want to find ourselves again in the middle of a Capitalist country, as we just stepped out of capitalism. If you think we would better serve socialism to take our people to another country (USSR, CUBA, ETHIOPIA), we will do so.

We would rather die than to have to live in this kind of situation (capitalism).

We will endure however and stay here if you think that is better. Whatever

you say we will follow your advice because we have a great deal of respect for

you.

Two governmental Ministers told us that Minister Hoyte was more for the US and not only that, but he is very right wing. We have made contacts with Cheddi Jagan but he has not followed up on our contacts. We wondered if that is one reason why you haven't come around us.

Because things aren't secure with the US and Guyana, we also wanted to ask you if there was some way we could switch our funds to the Russian Orthodox Church. In order to be non-profit we have to have church connection so we'd have to switch our membership to them and function under their auspices. But that way if anything happened to us, we'd be secure that the money could go to the USSR. Our Socialist friends in the US have told us that's where they would attack us next. We will be getting a latter soon on our boat that can explain the situation better. Jin Jones and his staff are very realistic about the

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money situation, and in fact the world situation in general, so we want to prepare ahead. We know we won't win every case, just like just now the Huey Newton case is totally irreversable. It's quite clear what's taking place with him and the same thing has happened to other people and organizations like Synanon and Delancy Street, who are now being attacked because they are cooperatives. They aren't even socialists but the fascist conspiracy once it strikes leaves you cornered.

We were told we were going to meet the charge d'affairs because of what happened on Saturday we missed our appt. We met with the 1st and 2nd secretaries, they said the Ambassador was back in town and when he is the charge d'affairs does not hold those responsibilities. He said the Ambassador would be busy for at least a month pince he just got back in to town.

They told us they had read the letter to v sent them, but they must not have read carefully because they were not familiar with your name as being the leader and to discuss Mendleson we had to go all the way back and start with John and the whole conspiracy. We did most of the talking we explained it sketchly and we were not prepared for having to go into the whole background angway I did not feel they understood the total context or the seriousness. They at first thought it was a personal vendetta of TimeS. against you then we started to explain the conspiracy and they wanted more specifics, Marie mentioned Interpol as one of them. We should have had articles and PR materials with us, which we had none. Finally they asked us what we wanted them to do as the Embassy, that they were here in Guyana dealing with primarily Guyanese He said the subject we were discussing should be discussed with higher levels. They said they would dend our request for a delegation to travel to Russia.

We told them about the situation of the merceneries, and that where was no question that we were under great danger.

We mentioned taht we were concerned that the country is going to go to the right. The second secretary asked that we give examples

Deb T. told him that we were aware of right wing elements in the govt.

Some who were pro-U.S. even and perfered the IMF loan or any loans

from the U.S. as opposed to other socialist countries. He juffere
talking in a very dim manner. If you go to the Soviet Union, there
are no secrets. Deb T. told him that we had written them earlies
and given all background materials pertaining to us and our situation

now. Not until then did the second secretary admit that they were
not really familiar with our background and had not read the materials
and letters pertaining to us.

I might add that this was a bad presentation, it was totally unexpected hab a Terri J. felt we should go on ander the circumstances-they claimed that they had read our letters and the Ambassador had instructed them to speak in his place. Terri B. a Maria did not know what to do in that they had never met the people before, and did not know how much had been said to them.

# How FBI Harassed Bay Area

reports to Washington on the strike were based on daily newspaper reports of the trouble.

FBI director J. Edgar Hoover himself vetoed a suggestion by the San Francisco office to print and distribute 40,000 leaflets to sow anger and confusion between the New Moblization Committee to End. the War and the Socialist Workers party, sponsors of the huge anti-war rally and march from downtown San Francisco to Golden Gate Park.

In turning down the proposal, Hoover expressed fear that the pamphlets might be traced to the PBI. Washington did not give approval to a scaled-down plan that called for mailing anonymous letters to local activists claiming the Bocialist Workers were frozen out of the planning for the raily and march.

Another letter, aimed at dividing white and black activists, was drafted by FBI agents and sent to the Black Panther party newspaper. In part, the letter read:

"What's this builshit SDS outfit? I'll tell you what they has finally showed there true color WHITE (sic). They are just like the comies and all the other white radical groups that suck up to the blacks and use us."

A covering note from Bates to Washington said, "This letter contains numerous errors, both grammatical as well'as typographical it is felt the editors of this newspaper will accept this letter as being legitimate and from one of their own kind."

The documents, which cover the period 1968 to 1971, say the FBI fed anti-left material to a source at the Examiner on a regular basis. The name of that person was deleted from the files by the FBI.

"It is recommended that a copy of the enclosed be furnished to feame deleted) for the San Francisco 'Examiner' who is an established source of the San Francisco Office and has been used on prior occasions under COINTELPRO," Bates wrote in a memo to Hoover on June 15, 1970.

The subject of the memo was the Institute for Policy Studies, a liberal think tank in Washington, and its San Francisco affiliate, the Bay Area Institute, which has offices at 604 Mission street in San Francisco.

Hoover approved providing the material, which linked the institutes to left wing organizations, but it appears a story was not published. Explained Bates in a later memo:

They felt that it would be more proper to wait until they engaged in some activity which would make this article newsworthy. It would also make it easier for them to ask more direct and embarrassing questions. They are interested, will retain the material and advise when it is used."

Bates indicated he had better luck a year earlier, reporting that he provided the information that led to an Examiner story linking former Stanford professor H. BruceFranklin with a Maoist group at Stanford.

Before the article appeared in March, 1969, the professor's connections with the group had been secret. Bates said the story "sent scheck waves through the group's executive board."

Ed Montgomery, a retired investigative reporter for the Examiner, filed a \$750,000 libel suit against the weekly Bay Guardian in May in connection with an article it published entitled "How the FBI Nailed H. Bruce Franklin."

The suit claimed that the article characterized Montgomery as a "conduit for the FBI to plant stories in the Examiner." Montgomery

denied yesterday that the FBI supplied him with any inside dopeabout Franklin.

According to FBI records in Washington, the San Francisco FBI office paid \$390 to an employee of the Express Times, who was also a member of SDS, to attend and report on a meeting of the underground press held in Madison, Wia, from Nov. 28 to Dec. 1, 1968.

According to FBI records, the informant chose to fly to the conference because he feared his colleagues planning to drive would be "smoking marijuana and frequently have accidents or are arrested en route over long distances."

In October, 1968, the FBI became aware of a radical plan to hijack a truck delivering military munitions in the Bay Area, according to the bureau's internal documents.


The agents knew who was behind the plot, but instead of taking action aginst the conspirators, the FBI suggested to Washington that the Army plant a slory in area newspapers to let the radicals know authorities were on to them.

Such a story, the FBI surmised, "would help delay these hijacking plans or possibly convince these individuals that such a hijacking would be foolish."

The San Francisco office heraided the success Young Republicans and the Young Americans for Freedom were having in countering left-wing activity at Stanford and recommended that Washington try to encourage similar activities around the nation. Hoover did m.

Hoover's high regard for COIN-TELPRO was demonstrated by an incident involving Yippie Jerry Rubin. Rubin was flying from Chicago to San Francisco an a student airline ticket even though be was not a student at the time.

Dear Friend,

In the past several months, Peoples Temple and Bishop Jim Jones have been the target of a concerted, well-coordinated effort to discredit and destroy the effectiveness and reputation of our organization. The enclosed material will detail what kind of activity is behind the barrage of negative publicity which is full of distortions and outragious lies. The sources of these 'allegations' are racists, law violators and common terrorists who were upset with the church when we did not follow their advocated course of violence. We are certain that these people are being paid for their scurrilous actions in recent months.

We have anticipated for some time that anti-progressive forces would attempt to use whatever means they could to paralyze the dynamic ministry of social and economic equality that Jim Jones has led for some twenty-five years. We also believe that the current campaign to discredit us is just the latest episode in a kind of neo-McCarthyism that has been resurgent of late in various quarters, and which has targeted black elected officials, progressive causes, and experimental communities in the United States. We know that just recently Rep. Clay of Missouri was exonerated of a series of totally baseless charges leveled at him by a hostile press, as was Lt. Governor Dymally of California (who has been strongly supportive of Bishop Jim Jones and the Peoples Temple). A book recently put together by Mary Warner of the Lt. Governor's office very aptly cites numerous examples of this type of planned harassment that black and minority elected officials in the United States have been subjected to.

On a national level, the same thing is being done to Andrew Young, United States Ambassador to the United Nations. One wonders if he will be able to maintain his position with the type of unwarranted criticism that he is getting, even from members of the black community. This singling out of an official who may be catagorized as having a progressive viewpoint is not uncommon. We witnessed it with the sensationalistic, slanted press that both Martin Luther King and John of F. Kennedy received, even years after their deaths.

Three who are a part of a conspiracy against Peoples Temple have reached Guyana. Obviously an attempt to discredit the church and pastor in the eyes of the public, their efforts have had little effect, using the same old trash, lies and smears—a whole library of it. People the States know and esteem the character and commitment of Bishop

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

Peoples Temple was ready to assist in that and to participate most activaly in that. By the decision of the Guyanese government, the members of Peoples Temple received the piece of land of 26,000 some wiles from Kaituma NorthWest. The first group of immigrants arrive: étober 1974. Step by step a new group arrived. They were workers, farmers, teachers, lawyers (he used the word jurists which means all branches of law), clarks and unemployed. Sloyly the features. of the new settlement became more clear. When one stays in Jonastown, it is: hard that everything was created in 1 1/2 years.

Today you see the small clean houses, vary tip top made, you hardly see anything of that type in Guyana. Farms, electricity station, club, dinner rooms, schools, kindergarden and the pride of the Jonestown citizens, the polyclinic. (phlyclinic in bassia is a clinic of many types of outpatient services). It's doctor not only keeps under medical control all the population of Jonestown but gives free of charge treatment to citizens nearby, not members. Every day 50-60 people from mearby villages, while receive treatment. The special subject of medical treatment of the doctor are children, more than 100 in the settlement besides the many that are adapted.

A big attention is also given to senior citizens, of which there are a large group in Jonestown. It is one more proof that the defenders of human rights can't give their citizens when they reach old age after working for a long time, a piece of break so they receive all this in Jonestown.

There are 20,000 people in the erganization. Now there are 1000 in Cuyana. This summer, JJ said, they expect the arrival of some more members as citizens of Jonestown. They are marked by a large love of life. They have an exceptional love of work, good will, hospitality, attention to the kids and respect for the seniors. There is a lot of popularity among citizens there of literature and films showing respect for the USSR and life there as well as that of other continues.

Ambargado sember to the DSSR; set by Theron Amos, Tim Certer, Deborah T, at a luncheon held at the Palm Court ... we showed him the article in the World Council of Churches megazine and told him of the article in the New Times. He didn't seem overly impressed. He asked Tim if the article as written by one of our members? Tim said no, it was not, just someone that worked closely along with us and was familure with our work. Sharon and Tim basically gave him some background of p.t., told him of our support of leftest movements & people including the Chillian refugees. When asked if he knew much about our group, he said he did not, but had read the article about the delivery of twins over radio in the North West. He said normally in the type of work he does he would only here the major problems that come up, he declared he had not herd anything about us though. Ambassador said he knew something of P.T. because he had met the woman who knows Bonnie Mann.. Paula Adams. Sharon asked him about Guyana's relationship with Korea, He daid Korea was probably the most beautiful country he had been in scenicaly, they were highly industerlised. Deb asked about Guyanas relationship with China, He said it wass good. China was the only country that gave loans with out strings attached. He said you have to understand the chinese though. They den't like Russia so there foreign policy includes everyon anti Russian eg., Russia is supportive of the PPP, therefore China gave something like 54 willion dollars to Guyanas PNO+non alined. Sharon mentioned we had good support from slot of people and Minister, but we had one not so good article , a letter from Hoyte in response to the article we had written in the chronified about our clinic and that we were assisting all people in the North West Region. Howevery He said Hoyte was a good man, very direct. Sharon said she thought he could have come to us first and confronted us on the issue, because we do give free medical facilities to all ect. and evidently he took it wrong, we weren't trying to say we were the only medical facilities there. She asked him what he thought of the article ? He shifted uncomfortably, shurgged his sholders and said it was hard for him to say because he had not been there. He asked us the type of crops we were grow ing, said guyans was concerned about doing things for export and asked if we were looking into cannery. He had herd that canneries were not expensive, something like (30,000), thirty thousand dollars. He mentioned parboilling okra and packing it or canning pineapple, he said he had no real knolledge of cannery but knew they needed one. Sharon asked it there would be any problem in goating it into the country, He said no, he felt the Govt. would welcome it. I mentioned ther might be a problem of getting it through customs and the told his some of the difficulties we'd had with customs He agreed that customs was even difficut even for him. He said the only way to change the economic situation in Guyana would be to educate the people to produce. Sharon told him that perhaps changing the medium would be a way of accomplishing this, she had noticed the moviespotray the Hollywood side of life only. I mentioned perhaps it would be good to get a documentry on Watts or Harles to let the peole see situations as they are. He acknoledged that the medium could be used. 100 человек, йричем многие из имх — приемине. Большой внимение уделиется престарелым, которых в Джонстауне также довольно много /еще однодоказательство безиалостности и лицемерия защитников прав человека, 
отказавших в куску жлеба в отарости людям, проработавшим всю жизнь/.

Организация "Пипла темпя" насчитывает 20 тыс. человек. В Гайане их сейчас более тысячи. Летом этого года, сообщил Ди.Джонс, ожидается прибытие эще жиной болькой трунии.

Двордитаун, апрели /ТАСС/. Далеко на север востоке Гайани, од в районе, где парит вечнозеленая пучина двунглей, за последние полторадва года вырос сравнительно крупный поселок Двонстаун. Вокруг него расзеление — канулись полоски плантаций кассави, бананов, ананасов, цитрусовых и
других сельскохозяйственных культур. А дальне все это окружено плотной 
стеной непроходимых киновмериканских джунитей.

И поселок, и плантации создани руками небольной — немногим более тисячи человек — коммуни из числа американцев, вернее, выходцев из Соединенных Штатов, в разное время покинувших свою родину из—за преследо ваний, угроз, безработици, или в протеста против несправедливости царящих там порядков.

Все жители Джонстауна — члены организации "Пипла темпл", сезданной несколько лет назад в Калифорнии /СПА/. Задуманная как религисаная организация, "Пипла темпл" объединяет инпланизациящий применений белих, негров, индейцев — всех изгоев американского общества, которое, выпланизациящий громогласно заявляя о защете прав человека; отказало этим лидим в элементарных правах. Его создатель, священиих Джим жо дконс, проповедований вначале каноми христивнской религии как способ защити от неуправедливостей социального строя СПА, на себе испитал все "прелести" американского "свободного мира".
