





An you know, we are a religious organisation engaged in the pursuit of agriculture in Fort Editum in the forth west Region established since December 1973 by Inster Jim Jones. Dear Commissioner Barker:

The People's Temple Project would like permission to import and licence a .357 magnum revolver to one of our members, Timothy Jones.

Due to a number of recent incidents at the farm in the North West Region we feel it necessary to secure our supplies warehouse and to maintain an on-duty guard for the protection of our children who have been threatened with kidnapping. The kidnapping threats are not mere heresay but were witnessed first-hand and because of the possibility of this occurring undetected until after the fact, runs a high risk.

Timothy Jones, whom we wish to become our security person, has been employed as a security guard in the U.S. and has proven to be of fine character and demonstrates controlled reactions to crises. We therefore feel that he would be well suited to the urgently needed appointment.

The Peoples Temple Agricultural Project has always been a peace loving group but because of the organized conspiracy and the lengths gone to harass, we feel a protection weapon of this calibre to be an urgent necessity.

Our appreciation to the fine leadership of Guyana can never be stated enough, and --- always sharing good relations with police authorities --- we hope you will consider this request expeditiously. Our regard for you and your department has always been with great respect. Thank you.

THERE ARE SEVERAL BUILDERS CO-OPS IN GEORGETOWN WHICH MIGHT QUALIFY AND WHICH WOULD HAVE ALL OF THE REQUIRED EQUIPMENT AVAILABLE. I received your most welcome letter today and am pleased and happy to hear that Jim is feeling better and to know that my coming to Jonestown, had something to do with his recovery. Hopefully, things will commence to work out better for you in the future. I will continue to do whatever I can to solve some of the remianing problems which face you, so that all of you will be able to do your thing, without interference from outside factions.

With regard to my going to London, I think that communications got somewhat fouled-up when I tried to pass information along to you. I cannot go without charging fees if, I am simply going for the Temple business. However, that is not the case as of this writing. I am going on other business and therefore, I will be able to do what I have to without charging the Temple for the trip. Also, it is my understanding that ABC in London will have a camera there to document my findings and actions so that a news story can be made from the material. So that should be helpful to you, as well as myself.

With regard to my not working for Charles, again, I think there may have been a communications problem. For the past 18 months, I have worked openly and I do not want to be placed in a position where my activities are the work product of an attorney and particularly not Charles' since credibility is important and he is the Temple attorney. As an attorney, I am sure you will understand my position. There are still several UNANSWERED questions in this mess and I must have the freedom t (find the solutions without restraints. As I said, if the Temple is clean, I will be the first to come to your side on the issue at hand.

Regarding the matter of security. I am ready and willing to train Hugh in the matter of protecting Mrs. Jones, but so far, he hasn't called me. I am more than willing to give my time for that matter.

I am also willing to give my time to setting up security at Jonestown, but you people will have to pay for the equipment and get the necessary permissions for guns, mace, etc and I think that is a fair deal. I estimate a five man security force fully equiped will cost approximately \$1,500.00, give or take \$300.00 which depends on where the weapons are purchased and how they are shipped. I estimate the training at 7 to 8 days and I am willing to donate that time for such a cause. I do feel that you should consider the security of Jonestown as a prime activity. If you can purchase weapons in Guyana and get whatever permission you need, it might save time. You will also need permission for Mace (tear gas) which is effect but not harmful.

If you decide to do the above, I would like to be able to do the training during the last part of October. Please give me sufficient notice.

Gene, as I told you all when I was there, I am not sure of many issues and there are a lot of unanswered questions, but I am impressed with what you are doing and as long as you are straight with me, I will back you 100%, even though I do not like your politics, I like you as human beings and will go to bat for you in clearing up the problems. I will even donate my time to you from here on out, but not expenses because I cannot afford to, not that I don't want to. Secretarys and investigators on staff cost money.

As of today, I have Jim's vest and will get it to San Francisco this week for shipment. Make sure he wears it immediately for a day or two so that he gets use to it. By the way, it is a gift.

I would appreciate hearing from you on the matters of security and others.






