Our legal services office handled a host of all of the church legal business, as well as the legal business of affiliated organizations, as in addition.

(notario publico) the legal affairs of many members. T.O.S. was on the staff and did legal work in the evenings at our office, as well as his office. We had a rotating system whereby he would give legal advice to members of the congregation 1 day a week. Each week we had a staff meeting, usually on Friday nights. During the summer, fall & winter of 1976 he regularly attended staff meetings, where all church legal affairs were discussed, as well as the legal affairs of many members. Staff procedures, policies and case methods were discussed and implemented. Church corporate business was discussed. I took regular minutes of these meetings and followed up the work assignments.

He also advised on members criminal matters, all of the legal considerations with respect to church publications, radio broadcasts and solicitation materials. I was present on one occasion, when <sup>in 1972</sup> Maria Katsoris discussed her relationship with and fears concerning her father with T.O.S., and heard him give her legal advice about it.

I was the ~~treasurer~~ financial secretary for Peoples Temple from 1965 through 1976, and routinely handled and disbursed Temple funds. I routinely got ~~for~~ legal advice from T.O.S. on how to handle bank accounts, how to keep books of account and my other duties. ③ Once T.O.S. bought a set of books and set up the church financial books for me which I then followed. He was familiar with all of the church financial affairs.

Over the years I gave him money for various purposes: travel, expenses, and so forth. These amounts often would run \$500 - \$600 per month. He received cash. Often he could not account for his disbursements but would also account account at times for money spent. I am not sure if he ever accounted for receipts.

In 1976 we sold our wash house in Mendocino county, and a lawsuit was later filed with respect to the transaction. T.O.S. assisted me in the handling and disposition of the lawsuit.

In 1975 he arranged for me to be a signatory to deposit the checks, at Bank of America, of many of the members who had gone to Guyana, and drew other legal financial documents. One day in 1975 or 1976 the check Jan 2-155A

I am a graduate of Univ of Penn and U.C. Berkeley in journalism. I became a member of P.T. since 1942, and have been T.O.S. since that time. When he first introduced himself to me it was as Church Attorney and Assistant D.A. of Mendocino County. I last saw him in Layton, Oregon in May of 1944.

In 1942 T.O.S. approached me to do the attorney for P.T. and asked me to do volunteer secretarial work for him. I did agreed and he gave me six large paper cartons of legal files (I found another 10 boxes later) all relating to legal matters of the church and various members. I acted as his secretary for about 1 year, writing on all types of legal matters for the church, 2nd members, etc his <sup>internal</sup> ~~internal~~ <sup>affairs</sup>, acquisition of real property for the church, acceptance of donations of personal & real properties on behalf of the church, writing wills for members with disposition provisions in favor of the church, letters and documents relating to the Disciples of Christ Denomination, many letters on behalf of the church.

After I ceased secretarial activity, I served as a sort of liaison between T.O.S. & Rev Jones with respect to the legal

)

affairs of the church. One of my jobs on a daily basis was to telephone him, give him a rundown of the legal affairs of the church, and get his opinions, evaluations and suggestions. This continued for 3 years from 1923 to 1927.

During this period there was nothing in the P.T. program that T.O.S. was not consulted about and which did not receive his opinion.

\* During those years, he was the principal attorney and legal advisor for the church, and all of its related ~~#~~ activities and organizations.

In Feb 1922 T.O.S. came to Guyana, S.A. to do legal work for the Church Project there. Among other ~~good~~ matters he handled the acquisition of real property in Georgetown. During that time Gene Chilie and Harry Troop came down from U.S.A. Ray force was there and a general legal conference was held.

\* Among other matters discussed by ~~too~~ was a concern for over the track of "Moorish" conversion or ship cases. T.O.S. stated that he had had several discussions with Marie Katsaris concerning her relations with her father, the ~~late~~

\* though Gene Chilie and others did legal work for the church.

1. Tim gave [REDACTED] legal advice on numerous occasions. He helped get him out of C.Y.A. in 1968 and then when [REDACTED] escaped from C.Y.A. a couple of years later, Tim knew where he was and kept in touch with him although, [REDACTED] was a fugitive. He even had [REDACTED] call him collect on several occasions--however, Tim didn't tell me where [REDACTED] was hidden at, though Tim knew. He didn't report [REDACTED] whereabouts to the authorities.
  2. When I had the "Penny Kerns Show" in Ukiah, California, I taped numerous people throughout town on a talk show basis, when Peoples Temple was under attack by the press. I did this legally and openly. One of the people that I interviewed was a member of the Sheriff's Department. When Sheriff Bartlomeau heard about it, he got angry and threatened me with arrest. Tim advised me to make a copy of the tape and to then return the tape to the T.V. station. (Tim was D.A. at this time). I took the tape to Edith Bogue and Harold Cordell and they put the contents of the tape on another tape and I returned the tape to the T.V. manager, who then fired me.
  - Also, when Tim was D.A. in Ukiah, he left his job to appear on my T.V. Show. He knew that I was a member of Peoples Temple. Sometimes I would call him at work and he told me to be careful because everyone there were "Facist bastards".
  3. When I won an insurance case against the Los Angeles Herald Examiner due to an auto accident during working hours, I was awarded over \$10,000 from them and also from State Farm. Because of this accident I was forced to go on Welfare--and had thousands of dollars worth of medical bills. When I asked Tim Stoen if I had to notify the Welfare Department about this money, he told me no--that I didn't have to tell anyone about money awarded in an accident case. I also asked him if I had to tell the IRS and he said that I didn't have to pay tax on it either. I later was told by a Social Worker friend that I was supposed to have notified the Welfare department and I had committed a felony.
  4. When I worked for a doctor in Los Angeles, I learned that this doctor was involved in Welfare Fraud and Insurance Fraud. I went to Tim about this and wanted to turn this doctor in. Tim told me to Xerox all his records, which I did. I Xeroxed every record that the doctor had--I was especially upset because he had filed a false claim on my behalf and was afraid that I would get into trouble since I worked for him. Anyway, Tim told me to not report him and had me turn in the records to him and I don't know what he did with them. He told me that we might need the doctor later for something.
  5. In Los Angeles, [REDACTED] wanted me to kill my children who had left the church. This conversation took place on a Sunday, and it greatly upset me. Later that night, I learned that Tim Stoen was in the church counselling office working on legal matters. I found [REDACTED] crazy out of his mind on drugs and threatening suicide and I went to Tim and asked him to come and help me. He refused to come to help and came only upon my insistence. He said he had a lot of legal work to do.
  6. When [REDACTED] was in jail in Santa Rosa for car theft, Tim led me to believe that he paid for [REDACTED] attorney and even said that he would sell one of his expensive couches in order to help pay for [REDACTED] defense. He also had me give the attorney who defended [REDACTED] his phone number so that he could talk to him. Also, when [REDACTED] went AWOL from the Army, Tim talked with him and advised him legally. And, while [REDACTED] was stationed at the L.A. missile base, I told Tim that [REDACTED] had showed me classified federal material that he had slipped off the base and that [REDACTED] had plans to climb the fence and get out if there was a major missile alert--Tim told me to tell [REDACTED]

to be careful". I was very upset over [REDACTED]'s taking this classified information off the base which showed pictures and instructions of how missiles are made. Also, [REDACTED] took me up to the base one night in the middle of the night and showed me how the base was laid out. He told me how the guards were on drugs and played Russian Roulette for the fun of it. (Later 17 of these guards were busted on drugs.)

7. When Tim Stoen was Assistant D.A., I told him that the Red Wood Valley Baptist Preacher Dan Duree, with whom I had worked at the T.V. station said that Dean DeVires in charge of the Ukiah Daily Journal had told him that Peoples Temple would bomb the San Francisco Herald Examiner-- he said that he was glad to have the information that maybe we could "use it later". He did nothing about this.
8. Tim Stoen was involved somehow in the situation of the court reporter who [REDACTED] had his daughter blow her brains out but I don't remember the details of this.
9. Tim Stoen had me call ministers all over Ukiah and tape them on the telephone and inquire about their beliefs. He didn't tell me this was illegal and told me that I did a good job. I called almost every minister in town. I don't remember the details of this so it probably isn't a good example.
10. When Tim Stoen was Assistant D.A. he knew that I found [REDACTED] having sex with [REDACTED] in my home. I wanted to report this to the police but Tim encouraged me not to. But, he had me go to the principle of the school where [REDACTED] taught because Tim said that the principle should know what kind of a person was teaching children and so I did this. Karen Layton was one of the people who went with me and I don't remember the other person. Tim told me to tell the principle "In detail" what I had seen [REDACTED] doing sexually with [REDACTED], and I did this. I later learned that this should have been handled legally or in some other way. I never understood why Tim would have me do something like this, when he was an attorney.
11. When Tim Stoen was D.A. I told him that [REDACTED], who was a narcotics offender carried an automatic weapon in the glove compartment of his pickup truck but Tim ignored me. Also, I told Tim that one night [REDACTED] told me that two men had come to his mothers home and threatened to kill Jim Jones but and yet when I reported this to Tim, he did nothing about this either. I never understood this.
12. Tim Stoen made up the statements and had the parents sign the statements an all people spanked publically. This included the Wertele childrens spankings and all adult spankings. I even got spanked--and he approved of all of this.
13. Concerning [REDACTED]. Shortly after I had told Tim about [REDACTED] carrying a gun, [REDACTED] defrauded the furniture store where he worked of all kinds of money and split the area. It seemed to me that if Tim had listened to me in the first place, being the D.A. that this could have been prevented.
14. When I told Tim Stoen that I knew of some drug pushers, and asked him what to do about them, he told me to warn them that the police were after them. This was the first year I came to Peoples Temple. Also, this same period of time, I had taken in a hitchhiker, who was AWOL from the Army (but I didn't know it)--I let him stay in my home for several days and then he went on. Later the C.I.A. came to ask about him and Tim Stoen told me lies to tell the C.I.A. about him. He wanted to help the young man get out of the service and he told me to tell the C.I.A. that the young man was homosexual and a child molester--I don't remember the rest that Tim had me tell the agent. Tim told me that C.I.A. agents were sick people and to not worry that I was doing the right thing as he was worried the young man would crack on his job (he was stationed in a missile in Alaska or someplace up north) and cause a nuclear war.

attorney, Sager & Chisholm, joined in

attorney and legal advisor to Charles  
Tammie till Spring of 1943 when he

Our legal services office handled almost all of the church legal business, as well as the legal business of affiliated organizations, of many members of the church and indigent members of the community, all on a pro bono basis.

Tim Stoen was a member of the staff and did legal work at our offices on evenings and weekends, ~~and~~. We had a rotating system whereby he would be available to give legal advice to members of the congregation, which he did once a week. Each week we had staff meetings, usually on ~~every~~ Friday nights.

Those who usually attended were Tim, Gene Chaikin, Harriet Tropp, myself, June Crym. During the summer, fall and winter Tim regularly attended those meetings, where all church legal affairs were discussed as well as the legal affairs of many members. Procedures, policies and case methods were discussed and implemented.

All church corporate legal affairs were discussed in full. I took regular minutes at these meetings and followed up the work assignments to see that they were completed on schedule. I particularly recall that at that time Tim was involved in church denominational and tax work. He also advised members on criminal matters, all of the legal considerations with respect to church publications, radio broadcasts and solicitation materials. He worked on auxiliary corporate organizations, read and approved minutes and other organizational materials.

Around 1975 ~~xxxxxxxxxx~~ warrant was issued for me on traffic violations in Los Angeles county. I asked Tim Stoen for legal advice, which he gave me, regarding what to say and how to conduct myself in court. Again in 1975 I was in Santa Rosa, California when a friend and I were mobbed by a group of persons. I was to appear as a witness in a criminal trial arising out of that incident. The church was very concerned about the incident, as it had racial implications and occurred during a trip on a church owned and operated bus. The church felt that this was an attack on Peoples Temple as a multi-racial organization and was very involved in assisting the prosecution. Tim Stoen spent ~~several~~ hours with me, discussing the case and preparing me to testify.

In 1976 I had an altercation with the police in Ukiah, California. I went to Tim Stoen's office in Ukiah several times and asked his advice on what I should do, so that the matter would be handled to my legal advantage, which advice he gave me.

Frequently, over the years, while in church services or meetings, I at P.T. Churches, I have heard Tim Stoen speak as the church attorney giving legal advice and opinions concerning church affairs and the legal affairs of various members.




