



We are pleased to advise you that TPP Revision No. 1, submitted to our office on March 15, 1977 is approved as submitted.

We are forwarding a copy of the approved Revision to our Washington, D.C. office to assure that all changes are effective on April 1, 1977. You may consider this letter as approval to implement the revised work program effective April 1, 1977. You should be evere that the March 31, 1977 Quarterly Report, which must be received by this Office no later than April 29, 1977, should be based upon Devision No. I as approved.

I would like to take this opportunity to convent on three of our concerns regarding the administration of the Program to date.

First, as you know, we received the revision application on March 15, 1977. In order to assure that the Program would be effective at the earliest possible date, we were required to complete our review and approval process within a period of 24 hours. This was only possible because of intensive coordination which took place between our two staffs in the week preceding the submission of the Pevision. Bandbook guidelines require that revisions be submitted a minimum of 60 days prior to the end of the Quarter. We made the special effort in this case to assure that the program, which has already experienced considerable delays in its implementation, not face further delays. Further revisions will be processed strictly in accordance with the prescribed guidelines of the TPP Program.

Secondly, it is our observation that one of the rajor reasons for the late submission of the Revision (creating the necessity for convening special meetings involving tenants, staff and commissioners) is the fact that the Authority did not follow a well-thought out process in its own review and approval process. We suggest that the Authority employ a

simple procedure which generally includes 1) the presentation of a draft application, revision, etc. to the Advisory Council and Board, 2) provide adequate time to the Advisory Council to prepare written comments, 3) staff consideration of the comments prior to 4) submission of a final application or proposal to the Board (major revisions only) accompanied by written comments from the Advisory Council.

Thirdly, we would like to advise you at an early stage in the Program of our position regarding the completion date for the Program. HUD guidelines permit extensions of the completion date of the 24-month program only in those cases where it is clear that factors beyond the Authority's control are responsible for preventing the completion of the program within the originally planned time frame.

In reviewing progress during the first eleven months of the Program we fail to find that any reasons, which caused delays in the program, can be attributed to factors beyond the control of the Authority. Therefore, as of this date, we would be unable to consider any requests from the Authority for an extension of the program beyond the April 30, 1978 completion date.

We look forward to working with the Authority in a renewed effort to accomplish the objectives developed by the Authority in your TPP Program.

Certainly, such sensitivity is an important criterian in the decisions that come before the Board of Regents.

I trust that you will give every consideration possible to the appointment of Pastor Jones if and when a vacancy might occur on the Board of Regents.

While I would be normally persuaded for compassionate reasons to favour Helen's admission into Guyana without a passport, I am compelled by the legal considerations to decline such permission.

The requirement of a passport establishes the <u>citizenship</u> of the traveller and dictates the appropriate treatment which the individual or her problems receive under international law. I could conjure up several situations wherein citizenship would be important, both to Helen and to Guyana.

I did, however, call the Trinidad and Tobago Embassy. Ms. Sein, the person responsible for the issuance of passports thereat, informed me that the application was returned for completion by Helen. Further, that neither birth certificate nor the \$6.75 fee had been sent. She assures me that upon receipt of the completed form along with the birth certificate and fee, that she will expedite the issuance of the passport.

Dear Pastor Jones:

You helped raise \$106,000 in 1976 for the NAACP Legal Defense Fund!

Your generous support of the Legal Defense Fund has been a major reason for LDF's effectiveness in fight discrimination in employment, housing and education. We would like to tell you of a few of LDF's highligh during 1976, and a project we plan for 1977.

Lowell Johnston, Director Counsel of the Western Off is handling a suit for a black woman who was a sheet mechanic involved in Equal Employment Opportunity acties at the Naval Air Rework Facility (NARF). She w laid off in violation of regulations governing reducin force, and was previously denied promotions because her race and civil rights related activities. This (Ellis v. NARF) will be one of the first class action trials on behalf of federal employees under Title VI the Civil Rights Act of 1964. In 1972, the Act was to include federal employees. LDF is Co-Counsel with Alameda County Legal Aid Society and Howard Moore.

In July, William Turner argued in the Ninth Circuit of Appeals for the right of black and Chicano employ to maintain a class action against their employers a union. In Roberts v. Golden Gate Disposal Co., LDF Golden Gate Disposal, Sunset Scavenger Co., and the ters on this very important procedural issue. LDF taken the case to the Court of Appeals because class are the only effective device for rooting out discription an across-the-board attack of hiring practices, assignment wages, denial of promotions and retirement benefits.

The tremendous demand for Title VII expertise has increased due to three major factors: the 1972 amendment to the Civil Rights Act to include federal employees; the general unhealthy state of the economy; and the knowledge that relief from employment discrimination has been and will continue to be available to those oppressed.

In response to this urgent need to capably handle Title VII litigation in the Bay Area, LDF has put together a program of cooperating attorneys. This program would enable attorneys in private practive to undertake employment litigation under the guidance of LDF's experienced staff of attorneys.

Already successful in other parts of the nation, (LDF's office in New York works with over four hundred cooperating attorneys in a most successful program) the Western Office would like to initiate a similar project, complete with a teaching component that would give pertinent instruction to those attorneys wishing to involve themselves in Title VII litigation. A more equitable distribution of trained attorneys able to handle these cases would enable LDF to multiply its effectiveness by broadening its own civil rights litigation.

Although LDF has requested the San Francisco Foundation to fund this program, we still will need to supplement the grant with individual contributions.

We have enclosed a brochure describing two types of discrimination cases LDF is handling in Mobile, Alabama - employment and housing. Jessie Stevenson tells his story in his own words - how he risked his job to challenge discrimination at International Paper Company in Mobile. Warren Dillon, a computer systems engineer at IBM suffered no discrimination on the job; however, when it came to finding a home for his family, it was a different matter. Not once, but twice, LDF attorneys went to court for the Dillons.

In all sections of the country, LDF attorneys are using the courts and the legal process to secure in fact what the law promises. The black men and women seeking LDF's help risk themselves to advance us all toward the multi-racial society we seek.

Many thanks for your support in 1976. We will keep you informed as to LDF's activities throughout 1977.

There is a rainbow in the skyl Victor, Laos, Kampushea, Angola, Rosambique, Guinca-Bissau, Greece, Portugal and Guba are brilliant colors. The balance of world forces in favor of peace are big enough to make it more difficult than ever for imperialism to launch a third world war. That is the meaning of detente. The New Stockholm Feace Appeal initiated by the World Feace Council already has 400,000,000 signatures in over 100 countries of the world. Twenty-five years ago when the first Stockholm appeal was launched in the midst of the Cold Mar, five hundred million people—500,000 in the U. 3.—signed the petition to demand the banning of the atomic bomb. The World Peace Council credits the appeal with having provented the use of nuclear meapons by the U. S. in the Korean War and transforming public opinion.

But detente is in its infancy. The arms race is still a threat. The stockpiled firepower could destroy the world many times over. In the U.S. the arms race leads to the decay of our cities, devastation of social services, unemployment, inflation, repression and racism. It threatens civilization with doomsday war and drains our society of the wealth it desperately needs.

The new world situation has created new possibilities to ending the arms race and finding new solutions for the various problems facing the peoples of the world.

CARLETON GOODLETT, a member of the Presidential Committee of the World Feace Council joined by Albert Kalm call upon you to come to an urgent meeting (with a very short notice) on Londay, April 4th at his office at 1300 Turk St. at 7:30 to discuss some very concrete questions.

- 1. Plans for the up coming visit of the World Peace Council delegation to S. F. on April 17 & 18. On the delegation is a representative from the So. African Congress of Trade Unions, James Stewart and Karen Talbott, well known Bay Area peace worker, now secretary in the W.P.C. in Helsinku.
- 2. Preparations for the World Assembly of Builders of Peace in Warsaw from May 6 to 11, 1977. Two thousand delegates are expected. Discussion also on a world conference in June on South Africa and Apartheid to be held in Portugal.
- 3. Organizing the Stockholm Peace Appeal caughing into a mass movement and joining it with our own fight for the Transfer Resolution, Feed the Cities, Cut the Military Budget, etc.

YOU are getting this letter occause you can be an important force and link to reach the people of the S. F. Bay area to build a peace movement. There never was a petter time. Please consider this an extraordinary situation. COLD TO THE LEGING.

NEW RELIGIOUS SERIES CONCEPT

FUNDAY GOOD STUFF

Proposed is a weekly half hour show based on the stories, characters, activities and kid related aspects of religion.

The series would be titled "FUNDAY GOOD STUFF", as part of an overall Sunday morning umbrella title "FUNDAY".

Hosted by five children between the ages of 6 to 10 years, FUNDAY GOOD STUFF would consist of three minute segmented series.

FUNDAY GOOD STUFF SEGMENTS INCLUDE:

- Religious characters portrayed by actors would be interviewed by hosting children.
- 2. "My Church", would be a filmed tour of places of worship by the five hosts and other selected children.
- 3. Bible Stories would be told by contemporary personalities (i.e. Donny Osmond, Farah Fawcet, Lee Majors etc.) and either acted out by the costumed hosts or supported by various religious works of art supplied by children.
- 4. Newscasts manned by the hosts would report various news religious event in a "You Are There" fashion (the parting of the Red Sea, John Smith seeing the Angel Gabriel, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount etc.).
- 5. Advice to viewing children in answer to mail received would be provided on a spontaneous fashion from the hosts. Mail would be solicited from various churches for the first thirteen weeks and on the air for subsequent shows.
- 6. Outside films obtained from such organizations as Lutheran Television, Southern Baptist Films would be edited and serialized for presentation.

- 7. Music will play an important part of FUNDAY GOOD STUFF. Performances by Bay Area children, professional performers, and the hosts themselves will be presented in multiple segments on a weekly basis.
- 8. Children who have a special role within the definition of religion will be guests upon occasion. Such "guests" would include, Little Michael, the boy evangelist, an average "PK" (preachers' kid), noted gospel singers, etc.
- 9. Holidays will be described and explained according to their religious significance. These segments will not necessarily be broadcast on or near the respective holiday, but will serve to provide an orientation of several religions.
- 10. The Ten Commandments will individually be dealt with in a yet designed fashion. Perhaps, one by one, a child host will explain what it means to him.
- 11. The "New Religions" are everywhere around us; Reverend Moon, Bahai, Hari Krishna etc., are among these. Actually they are not new at all. The children will learn about not only the difference by the similarities of these faiths.

12. Bible Games will be a series of "game show parodies" in which participating hosts imitate various game shows, (Hollywood Squares, Let's Make a Deal etc.), involved in guessing names, events, and creedos involved in religion:

These are just twelve segments; there can be additional such program elements.

All segments will use musical jingles, colorful set graphics and active participants.

Many segments will involve costumes, performances, comedy and endearing candor on the part of the five children hosts.
