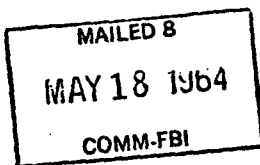

Result of examination:

The style of type used to prepare the typewritten material on Q34 and Q35 resembles the standard on file for a Remington elite style of type and is the same as the style of type used to prepare specimens Q3 and Q4. Due to the limited number of characteristics, it was not definitely determined whether or not Q34 and Q35 were prepared on the same typewriter used to prepare Q3 and Q4.

The style of type used to prepare the typewritten material on Q36 through Q39 most closely resembles the standard on file for a Royal elite style of type. This style of type was not used to prepare any of the previously submitted items.

Nothing else of particular significance was noted during the physical examination of the Q34 through Q39 papers. No indented writing was found on any of the submitted items.

Synopsis:

Victim DI MAGGIO, received two more letters, post-marked at San Francisco, 4/23/64. The letters were typewritten and included messages similar to those in previous letters in this case. DI MAGGIO still states that he does not know the sender and can suggest no suspects. FBI Laboratory concluded that the samples from typewriters accessible to [REDACTED] [REDACTED] Oakland, California, are not identical to typing on the threatening letters. Laboratory advised that some letters to Di Maggio were prepared on Woodstock, elite style, typewriters. Investigation reveals that this typewriter is now obsolete and that most Woodstocks owned in the San Francisco area are in the possession of a rental company, which has typewriters in numerous public buildings in the San Francisco area. Officials above company have checked all their typewriters for a peculiarity in the letter "w" noted by the Laboratory with negative results. [REDACTED] [REDACTED] considered as possible suspects in this case have been interviewed and deny participation. Investigation continuing.

[REDACTED] was interviewed at her residence, [REDACTED] at which time she was advised at the outset of the interview that she need not make any statement, that any statement she did make could be used against her in a court of law and that she had the right to consult with an attorney before making any statement.

[REDACTED] advised that she was born [REDACTED] at Oakland, California, and had been acquainted with [REDACTED] as fellow classmates in a French class at Oakland High School, their acquaintance beginning about five years ago. She stated that about five years ago [REDACTED] asked her to be art director for the [REDACTED] Fan Club and that she, [REDACTED] wrote two or three letters [REDACTED] at Hollywood, California about the club. [REDACTED] stated that she went to Los Angeles and met with [REDACTED] where she spent about one day touring 20th Century Fox Studios. She advised that she dropped out of the fan club about 1960 since she had moved to Burlingame, California and was then attending San Mateo College. She stated that this move also caused her friendship [REDACTED] to be dissolved but that there were no hard feelings on her part with either [REDACTED].

[REDACTED] She denied writing any threatening letters and stated that she does not know JOSEPH DI MAGGIO other than from his sports reputation and denied writing any threatening letters to Mr. DI MAGGIO. She stated that she had no idea who could be the author of such threatening letters. She produced a Royal portable typewriter, which she stated she has used over many years and that the only other typewriter she has access to would be an IBM electric typewriter at work. The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED]

On April 6, 1964, the Anonymous Letter File in the following Divisions of the San Francisco Police Department were checked without locating any letters similar to letters in captioned case: General Work Detail, General Office Correspondence Section, and Intelligence Detail.

On April 9, 1964, JOSEPH DI MAGGIO, SR., 2152 Beach Street, San Francisco, California, advised that since last contacted by SA [REDACTED] he has not received any additional anonymous letters. He stated he still has no suspects in this matter.

On April 7, 1964, [REDACTED] advised SA [REDACTED] which company places coin-operated typewriters in various public and private places throughout the San Francisco Bay Area. He stated he has a service man who services each typewriter on the average of once every two weeks but he stated this man would find it impossible to take typewriting specimens of these typewriters as it would increase his work to such an extent that it would not be feasible. All typewriters are Woodstocks and he stated none are Remingtons.

JOSEPH DI MAGGIO, 2150 Beach Street, San Francisco, advised that he had today opened his mail which had stacked up for a number of days and in his mail were three anonymous letters which he furnished. The three letters were type-written, were all addressed to him at his Beach Street address, all postmarked San Francisco, Calif., April 23, 1964, and are as follows:

1. "Joe:

b7c I am sorry that I know you and want no part of you from now on.

You are the second [REDACTED] who is going to cash in on your life with Marilyn.

The real reason that you are involved in a stadium deal is because you want to be among the the movie stars and the T.V. stars. You love to go out with them because they show too much of their breasts, wear dresses too tight and expose too much of their asses.

You had date after date and who do you think is going to believe that you didn't know that she is a prostitute. I know three different men that have given her thousands of dollars when they found out that she was pregnant. One gave her a check for \$25,000 and has the cancelled check, signed papers she signed in his attorney's office and two prominent attorneys witnessed her signature. He was smart."

She wanted to be with you a lot but your temper, refusing to talk and pouting was more than she could understand.

She didn't realize that you loved her so much that you wanted her for herself alone. Stay true to her memory. Another marriage would never bring you happiness because you will never love any else - that is really love. You are smart enough to know that you can never love some one else.

Don't go to Los Angeles for a stadium or you will find out that you will receive more criticism than you have ever received in your life. You do not need money. Neither do you need to go out with girls in the movies or on T.V. programs.

Stay in San Francisco where your relatives and friends are. They all love you and would do anything to make you happy."

Mr. DI MAGGIO stated that recently in one of the newspaper columns, an item appeared indicating that he was going to Los Angeles to attempt to build or open some type of a baseball stadium. DI MAGGIO stated he has no intention of doing this but this is apparently what the letter writer is referring to. Mr. DI MAGGIO stated he has no suspects regarding the source of these letters.

On March 9, 1964, the above letters were forwarded to the FBI Laboratory.

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED]

On March 26, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following information regarding the peculiarities of the type used in the threatening letters:

It was previously determined that specimens Q29 and Q30 were prepared with a Woodstock elite style of type. The numbers "2" and "5" are characteristic of this style of type and it was noted that the letter "W" tends to strike below the line of typing. It is also to be noted that this style of type has a high center letter "W".

As indicated in previous reports, some of the other questioned typewriting was prepared with a Remington elite style of type (except for the letter "j"). It is to be noted that a matching style of type is used on some Corona standard typewriters. In regard to this typewriting, the lower case letter "a" tends to strike high, the letter "i" tends to strike slightly to the left and the letter "W" has a high center.

The remaining questioned typewriting resembles the standard for a Remington pica style of type. In this typewriting, the letter "A" tends to strike low and the letter "W" has a high center.

Information in the Bureau files indicate that none of the above styles of type are ordinarily used on electric typewriters.

It was determined that none of the questioned typewriting on the specimens submitted in this case was prepared with any of the typewriters used in the preparation of specimens K1 through K7.

On March 24, 1964, the FBI Identification Division advised that there were no fingerprint cards on file for [REDACTED]

On March 9, 1964, the FBI Identification Division advised that no latent prints had been developed on Specimens Q29 and Q30, letters sent to DI MAGGIO, February 8, 1964.

On March 27, 1964, the Los Angeles Office advised that [REDACTED] had turned over two more letters, one postmarked at San Leandro, California, January 31, 1964, addressed to her in care of CBS Television City, Hollywood, California, and a second, also postmarked 7:30 PM January 31, 1964, at San Leandro, California, addressed to [REDACTED] c/o Columbia Broadcasting System, Television City, Hollywood, California.

67L On April 10, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following report regarding the above letters:

Q32 One envelope bearing typewritten address [REDACTED] % Columbia Broadcasting System, Television City, Hollywood, California." and accompanying typewritten letter beginning "Miss Fahey: We don't want you in..."

Q33 One envelope bearing typewritten address [REDACTED] % C.B.S. T.V. Television City, Hollywood, Calif." and accompanying typewritten letter beginning "Don't see are talk to..."

Result of examination:

It was determined that the same typewriters were used to prepare specimens Q32 and Q33 that were used to prepare the typewritten material on some of the other letters previously submitted for examination in this case.

Nothing of particular significance was noted during the paper examination of specimens Q32 and Q33 and no indented handwriting was found.

On April 24, 1964, [REDACTED] General Office Equipment Company, 62 2nd Street, advised that his company was one of the few in town that handled Woodstock typewriters. He advised that the Woodstock was now obsolete and had not been made for many years. The R.C. ALLEN Company now makes the machine but it is different than the old Woodstock. [REDACTED] advised that he had not repaired a Woodstock in about six months, and the peculiarity of the W on the typewriter used for the threatening letters was not significant to him. He could not recall a machine with this peculiarity, which he advised was a loosetype block for the letter W causing it to slip below the other letters. He said that should such a typewriter be brought in he would immediately notify this office.

On April 24, 1964, [REDACTED] Paul Chung Company, advised that his company handles the repairs R.C. Allen Typewriters, but that the R.C. Allen Company had made Woodstocks until about 1939, when the line was discontinued. He had not repaired a Woodstock in many months and had none on hand. He suggested that the Holliday Company, 108 Pine Street, and Guarantee, 507 Market, did most of the repairs and might have repaired a Woodstock.

On April 24, 1964, [redacted] repairman for the Cathray Company, 285 Buckingham Way, was recontacted. He advised that he services all the Woodstock typewriters operated by the company and that he works his way through the route in about two weeks and in that time would have checked every typewriter. He knew of no other outfit using or having Woodstock Typewriters. He said that they are used by his company because they are easier to adapt to rent typewriters than any other machine. The company has to go as far as Los Angeles to pick up Woodstocks since they have practically all of them in the Bay Area already. He could suggest no other outfit that might have them at this time.

He was furnished with portions of a Xerox copy of the threatening letters prepared on the Woodstock with defective "w". He advised that he had no recollection of repairing this typewriter. He advised that he would check each typewriter during the next two weeks looking for the defective "w".

On May 15, 1964, [redacted] advised that he had checked every Woodstock belonging to the company during the past two weeks, and no machine had the defective "w".

He advised that he would continue to check the machines and if he developed any other information on value he would advise this office.

Two different styles of type were used to prepare the typewritten material on specimens Q40 and Q41. These same styles of type have been used to prepare other envelopes and accompanying letters previously submitted in this case. Due to the limited typewritten material on Q40 and Q41, this typewritten material could not be specifically associated with any of the typewritten material on the other items.

Nothing of particular significance was noted during the paper examination of specimens Q40 and Q41 and no indented handwriting was found.

Victim FAHEY received two more typewritten letters, one postmarked at San Francisco, 4/23/64, and the second postmarked at Los Angeles, 4/28/64. Victim DI MAGGIO received handprinted letter postmarked 6/19/64, at Oakland, California, criticizing him for going out with a cocktail waitress. This letter was apparently based upon an item in a column reporting DI MAGGIO's interest in a cocktail waitress. The FBI Laboratory reported that two letters previously sent to DI MAGGIO were typed on a machine containing type resembling Royal elite type. The Laboratory advised that samples from Woodstock rent typewriters at the Oakland Library were not identical to the Woodstock typing on two of the letters in this case. Repairmen, Cathray Company, San Francisco, have no information concerning a Woodstock Typewriter with a defective "w". [REDACTED] and DI MAGGIO are unable to suggest suspects in this case. Investigation continuing.

[REDACTED] California State College, Hayward, advised that he would make inquiry from appropriate personnel at the college to determine the location of any Woodstock Typewriters in use there by the public so that suitable typing specimens may be obtained.

He later advised that he has contacted, among others, [REDACTED] who has control of all physical property in use on the campus, and was advised that there are no Woodstock Typewriters presently in use on the campus. [REDACTED] told him that the only coin-operated typewriters on the campus at the present time are IBM brand machines.

He considered it possible that there were formerly Woodstocks there, but that they had been replaced with IBM machines.

AT OAKLAND, CALIFORNIA

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED]

Through the cooperation of [REDACTED] Oakland, California Tribune, the file of letters to the Editor, which had been received by that publication during the past year, were reviewed on June 12, 1964, and none containing the type of material contained in the letters in this case were located.

On June 24, 1964, and July 6, 1964, [REDACTED] Oakland Typewriter Exchange, were contacted but they knew of no Woodstock Typewriters other than those in possession of the Cathray Company, San Francisco. They advised that they would notify this office if any Woodstock was brought in for repair or if they observed a Woodstock at any of the companies or schools where typewriters are maintained.

He advised that all the rent Woodstock Typewriters in the San Francisco area have again been serviced and none was located with the defective "w", noted in the typing on the threatening letters in this case. He said that the repair of a loose type block, which would cause the defective "w" would require resoldering of the typeblock, and he had no recollection of making this type of repair in the last year and felt that he would recall it if he had made this repair.

In view of the above information, it was felt that further efforts to obtain samples from the Woodstock Typewriters in use by the Cathray Company was not warranted, and this avenue of investigation was discontinued.

On July 12, 1964, [REDACTED] was recontacted. After examining the postmark on the envelope addressed to Mr. JOE DI MAGGIO, June 19, 1964, he advised that the postmark contained nothing that would pinpoint the time or place of mailing. He said that the fact that this and other letters were postmarked in the P.M., was not significant since most letters mailed from a Post Office box would be postmarked in the P.M.

On June 29, 1964, [REDACTED] of the Guaranteed Typewriter Company, 507 Market Street, advised that they have had no Woodstock typewriter in for repair for a number of years. He was alerted to the possibility of a Woodstock coming into his shop with a defective "W", and he stated he would contact all of his repairmen and should he have any information he would immediately advise the San Francisco Office.

[REDACTED] the Holladay Typewriter Company, 108 Pine Street, on June 29, 1964, advised that in the last year or two they have had only one Woodstock typewriter in the shop and that it is there at the present time and has been for approximately the last two months. He stated there is nothing wrong with the "W" in this typewriter nor was there anything wrong with it when it came into the shop. He stated he would alert all of his typewriter repairmen so that they would immediately advise him should anything concerning a Woodstock typewriter with a defective "W" come to their attention.

Neither [REDACTED] or her mother have any information as to the identity of the writer of these letters. She will be the guest of [REDACTED] Atherton, California, and can be reached through him until May 31, 1964.

[REDACTED] may extend San Francisco, California, visit for several days, but she has no present plans to contact Victim DI MAGGIO and no publicity has been given to her weekend plans.

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED] at San Francisco on September 8, 1964.

JOSEPH DI MAGGIO was interviewed at DiMaggio's Restaurant, Fisherman's Wharf. He stated that the word "Bill" and the number "150" mean nothing to him. DI MAGGIO stated that as far as he knows, he has no inactive or active fan club in the San Francisco Bay area, and he felt that he would know since they normally contact personalities for photographs.

In regard to his address on Beach Street to which the anonymous letters are directed, he stated that this address is common knowledge to anyone who would take the time to look it up, since it appears frequently in news items in periodicals and in newspapers, and he gets many letters from citizens at this address. He stated that the anonymous letters that he has received have always been mailed immediately after some news item concerning him has appeared in either a periodical or a newspaper, and consequently he does not feel that the writer is anyone close to him, since they would have many other items they could possibly write about rather than limiting the letters to newspaper items.

[REDACTED] located at San Jose, California, from July 22, 1949, until April 24, 1954. On the latter date, she was discharged under the Family Care Plan and presently lives with a family at Santa Clara, California, still under the supervision of Social Workers and doctors at the above hospital. At their request she has not been interviewed, pending preliminary investigation. For some reason, in interviews, DI MAGGIO failed to name [REDACTED]

Investigation among personnel of the above mental hospital has revealed that [REDACTED] has followed DI MAGGIO's activities closely in the gossip columns, continually talks about his activities and has made statements approximating those expressed in the threatening letters in this case.

Investigation has failed to show that she used a typewriter at the hospital or arranged for some other person to type for her, but it is known that she had access to the typewriters in the Typing Room and at the Central Supply Department, where she worked. Handwritten letters indicate that she was mentally capable of preparing the letters.

Several handwritten letters were in the file from [REDACTED] to officials at the hospital and others complaining of her confinement. A letter dated June 15, 1958, [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] contained the following statements of possible significance:



Remarks: It is requested that specimens Q38, Q39, and Q41 be resubmitted so that the original items can be used to make a further comparison with the typewriting on K19 and K20. As a matter of information, the typewriting on Q38, Q39, and Q41 does not appear to contain any significant defects upon which a definite identification could be made. Nevertheless, the original items, Q38, Q39, and Q41, should be resubmitted so that the original typewriting can be examined since the photographs retained do not show all the detail that would be available with the original specimens.

As indicated in the attached report, it does not appear that any of the other typewriters used in the preparation of specimens K16 through K18 and K21 were used to prepare any of the questioned typewriting.

In regard to the examination of K22, it is usually necessary that the original item be made available to make any detailed comparison of questioned and known papers. Although nothing of significance was noted during

She advised that she had not seen DI MAGGIO for years until last September, when she visited him at his restaurant in San Francisco, California.

During conversations, she mentioned DI MAGGIO's address, 2150 Beach Street, San Francisco, California. She denied that she had ever heard of [REDACTED]. She said that she had clipped items from newspapers about DI MAGGIO and has seen his name linked with women. She said that this did not upset her and she knew no one else that was upset over it.

[REDACTED] telephone [REDACTED] on February 2, 1965, advised that during the year she managed MARILYN MONROE's business affairs, the fan mail was sent to her office by 20th Century Fox Studios, and then re-shipped unopened to a woman in New York City, who had been hired several years earlier by Miss MONROE to process and answer all of her correspondence. [REDACTED] could not recall the name of this woman but said the administrator of Miss MONROE's will, [REDACTED] might remember it.

[REDACTED] on February 3, 1965, identified [REDACTED] telephone [REDACTED] as the woman responsible for handling Miss MONROE's fan mail for a period of several years before the latter's death.

On March 1, 1965, the New York Office furnished the following information:

AT NEW YORK CITY, NEW YORK

The following investigation was conducted by SA [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] on February 25, 1965, stated she handled MARILYN MONROE's fan mail for approximately one year prior to Miss MONROE's death. The film star's fan mail was sent [REDACTED] by 20th Century Fox Studios and also by Miss MONROE's personal business office. [REDACTED] answered the mail with form letters and photographs. She stated she kept statistics on the pieces of mail she answered and then destroyed the fan mail as soon as replies were sent out. [REDACTED] did not keep a copy of her replies and did not keep a list of people to whom she sent the form letters or photographs.

b7c [redacted] stated that she had between 50 and 100 unanswered fan letters on hand when Miss MONROE died and at the direction of Miss MONROE's office, she gave these letters to [redacted] of Actors Studio, New York City.

The nature of captioned investigation was explained to [redacted] but she was unable to be of any assistance. [redacted] stated she never knew anything about Miss MONROE's Fan Club and does not know if the club had a national president or regional officers. She could not furnish the names of anyone in San Francisco or elsewhere who were connected with the club. [redacted] could only suggest that such information should be available at 20th Century Fox Studios or from Miss MONROE's personal publicity agent.

[redacted] Actors Studio, New York City, on February 26, 1965, stated that they could not be of any assistance in this investigation. They do not have any information concerning Miss MONROE's Fan Club or publicity arrangements before she died.

[redacted] stated Miss MONROE left her personal property and papers to them. [redacted] received all unanswered fan mail from [redacted] but the mail was destroyed. [redacted] said only about 20 or 30 letters were received from [redacted] and these letters never were answered before they were destroyed.

The only other personal property on hand concerning MARILYN MONROE are business papers, personal documents and letters from intimate friends that would not be of any use to this investigation.

[redacted] Rogers and Cowan, Public Relations, 503 Madison Avenue, New York City, advised SA [redacted] on March 2, 1965, that she was MARILYN MONROE's [redacted] prior to Miss MONROE's death. She stated that she handled primarily Miss MONROE's personal correspondence and was not connected with her publicity projects or with Miss MONROE's fan clubs. [redacted] stated that she remembers that Miss MONROE had an active fan club at one time and several independent groups who were

collecting all of Miss MONROE's photographs and biographical data. However, [REDACTED] said she never did know the name of the national president of Miss MONROE's fan club or the names of any of the club's regional officers. She stated she never had any connection with this part of Miss MONROE's business life and is unable to suggest anyone who might be able to supply such information except 20th Century Fox Film Studios.

[REDACTED] stated that there was a slim possibility that [REDACTED] New York City, might have some information of value. [REDACTED] stated that [REDACTED] handled Miss MONROE's personal business matters while she was married to [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] on March 2, 1965, advised SA [REDACTED] that she handled some of Miss MONROE's personal and business matters during the period that Miss MONROE lived in New York City and was married to [REDACTED]. She stated, however, that she did not have any connection with Miss MONROE's fan clubs and is unable to furnish the names of the club's president or regional officers. [REDACTED] said that she has a vague recollection that there is in existence an organization known as "Fan Clubs of America". She stated she believes this organization is based in Los Angeles and keeps a running list of all fan clubs connected with the various film stars. She said with the exception of this organization and the 20th Century Fox Film Studios, she is unable to suggest the name of anyone who might be of assistance to this investigation.

AT SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA

Regular contact has been maintained with JOSEPH DI MAGGIO, SR., and he has reported no further letters in this case. He has been unable to suggest additional suspects.

It is noted that investigation of [REDACTED] to date has revealed that [REDACTED] that she was in a mental hospital at Agnew, California, from 1949 to April, 1964, when

she was released on the Family Care Plan to the home of [REDACTED] Santa Clara, California. She is still under the supervision of the State Department of Mental Hygiene and is not allowed to leave [REDACTED] home. According to [REDACTED] she will probably be returned to the hospital next month, since her condition has not improved to the extent that she is ready for a complete release.

According to employees at Agnew Hospital, [REDACTED] continually talked to other inmates about [REDACTED]. She read all the columns and sport pages for items about DI MAGGIO and discussed him constantly. She was obsessed with sex and in conversations expressed sentiments similar to those expressed in the anonymous letters in this case.

On March 10, 1965, SA [REDACTED] discussed this case with Assistant United States [REDACTED] San Francisco [REDACTED] advised that information developed to date would not warrant a prosecution of [REDACTED]. He said that a further factor for declining prosecution was the fact that [REDACTED] was a patient at Agnew State Hospital at the time the threatening communications were written and is presently under psychiatric care.

It is noted that the victims have received no letters since April, 1964. It appears that [REDACTED] is the most logical suspect in this case and her mental condition would indicate that it is highly unlikely that she could ever be prosecuted. In view of this and the fact that all other logical leads have been covered in this case, this case is being closed with the permission of the Special Agent in Charge.

Should additional letters be received by either victim in this case, it will be reopened.
