DI MAGGIO still states that he does not know the sender and can suggest no suspects. FBI Laboratory concluded that the samples from typewriters accessible to

Oakland, California, are not identical to typing on the threatening letters. Laboratory advised that some letters to Di Maggio were prepared on Woodstock, elite style, typewriters. Investigation reveals that this typewriter is now obsolete and that most Woodstocks owned in the San Francisco area are in the possession of a rental company, which has typewriters in numerous public buildings in the San Francisco area. Officials above company have checked all their typewriters for a peculiarity in the letter "w" noted by the Laboratory with negative results.

I know that had you understood Marilyn better when you married her that you would have realized that a little more time in movies was all that Marilyn wanted. She wanted you and the movies at first and after you separated she was afraid to try marriage with you again. She wanted to be with you a lot but your temper, refusing to talk and pouting was more than she could understand.

She didn't realize that you loved her so much that you wanted her for herself alone. Stay true to her memory. Another marriage would never bring you happiness because you will never love any else - that is really love. You are smart enough to know that you can never love some one else.

Don't go to Los Angeles for a stadium or you will find out that you will receive more criticism than you have ever received in your life. You do not need money. Neither do you need to go out with girls in the movies or on T.V. programs.

Stay in San Francisco where your relatives and friends are. They all love you and would do anything to make you happy."

Mr. DI MAGGIO stated that recently in one of the newspaper columns, an item appeared indicating that he was going to Los Angeles to attempt to build or open some type of a baseball stadium. DI MAGGIO stated he has no intention of doing this but this is apparently what the letter writer is referring to. Mr. DI MAGGIO stated he has no suspects regarding the source of these letters.

on March 9; 1964, the above letters were forwarded to the FBI Laboratory.

The following investigation was conducted by SA

On March 26, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following information regarding the peculiarities of the type used in the threatening letters:

It was previously determined that specimens Q29 and Q30 were prepared with a Woodstock elite style of type. The numbers "2" and "5" are characteristic of this style of type and it was noted that the letter "W" tends to strike below the line of typing. It is also to be noted that this style of type has a high center letter "W".

As indicated in previous reports, some of the other questioned typewriting was prepared with a Remington elite style of type (except for the letter "j"). It is to be noted that a matching style of type is used on some Corona standard typewriters. In regard to this typewriting, the lower case letter "a" tends to strike high, the letter "i" tends to strike slightly to the left and the letter "W" has a high center.

The remaining questioned typewriting resembles the standard for a Remington pica style of type. In this typewriting, the letter "A" tends to strike low and the letter "W" has a high center.

Information in the Bureau files indicate that none of the above styles of type are ordinarily used on electric typewriters.

On March 26, 1964, the FBI Laboratory furnished the following report regarding the comparison of the type of type-writers used by with the type on the threatening letters:

- K6 Two pages of typewriting and one carbon taken from a Standard Royal typewriter SN FPE 13 6379060
- K7 One page of typewriting and one carbon taken from an Underwood electric Serial #36413

#### Result of examination:

It was determined that none of the questioned type-writing on the specimens submitted in this case was prepared with any of the typewriters used in the preparation of specimens K1 through K7.

On March 24, 1964, the FBI Identification Division advised that there were no fingerprint cards on file for

On March 9, 1964, the FBI Identification Division advised that no latent prints had been developed on Specimens Q29 and Q30, letters sent to DI MAGGIO, February 8, 1964.

On Warch 27, 1964, the Los Angeles Office advised that had turned over two more letters, one post-marked at San Leandro, California, January 31, 1964, addressed to her in care of CBS Television City, Hollywood, California, and a second, also postmarked 7:30 PM January 31, 1964, at San Leandro, California, addressed to Colombia Broadcasting System, Television City, Hollywood, California.

MANAGEMENT CONTRACTOR OF THE

On April 10, 1964, the FBI Laboratory, furnished the following report regarding the above letters:

Q32 One evelope bearing typewritten address % Columbia Broadcasting System, Television City, Hollywood, California." and accompanying typewritten letter beginning "Miss Fahey: We don't want you in..."

Q33 One envelope bearing typewritten address % C.B.S. T.V. Television City, Hollywood, Calif." and accompanying typewritten letter beginning Don't see are talk to..."

Result of examination:

It was determined that the same typewriters were used to prepare specimens Q32 and Q33 that were used to prepare the typewritten material on some of the other letters previously submitted for examination in this case.

Nothing of particular significance was noted during the paper examination of specimens Q32 and Q33 and no indented handwriting was found.

On April 24, 1964, General Office Equipment Company, 62 2nd Street, advised that his company was one of the few in town that handled Woodstock typewriters. He advised that the Woodstock was now obsolete and had not been made for many years. The R.C. ALLEN Company now makes the machine but it is different than the old Woodstock. Advised that he had not repaired a Woodstock in about slx months, and the peculiarity of the W on the typewriter used for the threatening letters was not significant to him. He could not recall a machine with this peculiarity, which he advised was a loosetype block for the letter W causing it to slip below the other letters. He said that should such a typewriter be brought in he would immediately notify this office

On April 24, 1964, Paul Chung Company advised that his company handles the repairs R.C. Allen Type-writers, but that the R.C. Allen Company had made Woodstocks until about 1939, when the line was discontinued. He had not repaired a Woodstock in many months and had none on hand. He suggested that the Holliday Company, 108 Pine Street, and Guarantee, 507 Market, did most of the repairs and might have repaired a Woodstock.

STATES OF THE ST

On April 24, 1964, repairman for the Cathray Company, 285 Buckingham Way, was recontacted. He advised that he services all the Woodstock typewriters operated by the company and that he works his way through the route in about two weeks and in that time would have checked every typewriter. He knew of no other outfit using or having Woodstock Typewriters. He said that they are used by his company because they are easier to adapt to rent typewriters than any other machine. The company has to go as far as Los Angeles to pick up Woodstocks since they have practically all of them in the Bay Area already. He could suggest no other outfit that might have them at this time.

He was furnished with portions of a Xerox copy of the threatening letters prepared on the Woodstock with defective "w". He advised that he had no recollection of repairing this typewriter. He advised that he would check each typewriter during the next two weeks looking for the defective "w".

On May 15, 1964, advised that he had checked every Woodstock belonging to the company during the past two weeks, and no machine had the defective "w".

He advised that he would continue to check the machines and if he developed any other information on value he would advise this office.

In view of the above information, it was felt that further efforts to obtain samples from the Woodstock Typewriters in use by the Cathray Company was not warranted, and this avenue of investigation was discontinued.

The style of type used to prepare the typewritten a material on Q34 and Q35 resembles the standard on files for a Remington elite style of type and is the same as the style of type used to prepare specimens Q3 and Q4. Due to the limited number of characteristics, it was not definitely determined whether or not Q34 and Q35 were prepared on the same typewriter used to prepare Q3 and Q4.

The style of type used to prepare the typewritten material on Q36 through Q39 most closely resembles the standard on file for a Royal elite style of type. This style of type was not used to prepare any of the previously submitted items.

DI MAGGIO stated that as far as he knows, he has no inactive or active fan club in the San Francisco Bay area, and he felt that he would know since they normally contact personalities for photographs.

In regard to his address on Beach Street to which the anonymous letters are directed, he stated that this address is common knowledge to anyone who would take the time to look it up, since it appears frequently in news items in periodicals and in newspapers, and he gets many letters from citizens at this address. It is requested that the FBI Laboratory compare the enclosed typing samples with those on the threatening letters and compare the enclosed "Hy Tone" stationery with that used for the letter to JOE DI MAGGIO, postmarked San Francisco, Calif., Apr. 23, 1964 (Q 36 and Q 37).




