T-1 stated this information was obtained from either Mrs. SOPHIE RIVERS Mrs. EDITH SIMMS or Mrs. LEOLA ADLER. The informant stated that these women, who all live at 18% Claremont Avenue, are all close friends of the subject and informant is sure that they are aware of the subject's past. T-1 also stated that a Mrs. MOLLY IRVING, same address, is one of the subject's closest friends.

T-1 stated that subject appears to be a very nervous individual and on one occasion the informant recalls subject telling SOPHIE RIVERS that she was taking interpretive dancing lessons to help overcome her nervousness.

On September 12, 1955, T-1 reported that subject had returned on that date from her vacation. T-1 also learned from Mrs. SOPHIE RIVERS that subject intends to move in the near future. Mrs. RIVERS told T-1 that subject's mother will live with her when they move. T-1 stated that subject's mother visits her quite frequently, often staying over night, and helps subject take care of the two children, BENJAMIN and EMILY.

In connection with subject's moving, T-1 reported on September 7, 1955, that subject's husband told one of the tenants in the building that he was bringing his family home from their vacation soon and "they were going to move to the country as it is good for the kids."

Investigation at Fire Island, Long Island, New York

ROY PARDEE, Assessors Office, Islip, New York, advised SA DANIEL F. O'CONNOR on September 2, 1955, that from his records there was no ownership records within the town limits for any individual named either COPLON or SOCOLOV.

WILLIAM BIRMINGHAM, Realtor, Ocean Beach, Fire Island, New York, advised SA DANIEL F. O'CONNOR on September 2, 1955, that he did not see subject nor had he seen anyone answering her description at Ocean Beach, Fire Island, New York, during the summer.

T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 2, 1955, that he did not see subject nor had he seen anyone answering her description at Ocean Bay Park, Fire Island, New York.

Information Regarding Associates of Subject

EDITH SIMMS

T-1 stated on September 21, 1955, that EDITH and HERMAN SIMMS have lived in Apartment 4H, 185 Claremont Avenue, for about five years. T-1 further stated that they have a boy about five years of age. T-1 stated that HERMAN SIMMS is a commercial artist and is apparently doing free-lance work as he uses his home for a studio.

Mrs. EDITH SIMMS, Apartment 4H, 185 Claremont Avenue, was interviewed by SA JACK L. STEMPLE on April 17, 1952, in connection with another matter. At that time Mrs. SIMMS volunteered the information that she, Mrs. SIMMS, is "definitely not anti-Soviet but in fact pro-Soviet Union."

SOPHIE RIVERS

T-1 advised that Mrs. SOPHIE RIVERS, her husband, CHARLES, and her two boys have resided in Apartment 5G, 185 Claremont Avenue, for about five years.

T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on June 30, 1955, that on June 29, 1955, SOPHIE MAY RIVERS, 185 Claremont Avenue, attended an open Communist Party (CP) meeting at 124 West 124th Street, New York, New York. The informant

stated that those in attendance comprised the regional and sectional leadership of the Harlem Region CP.

On June 8, 1955, T-3 advised that SOPHIE MAY RIVERS was chairman of one of the groups of the Parent Teachers Association, Harlem Region CP.

T-3 further advised that SOPHIE MAY RIVERS attended meetings of the Harlem Region CP on December 8, 1954, January 12, 1955, and April 19, 1955.

The CP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

LEOLA ADLER

T-l advised on September 21, 1955, that LEOLA and PAUL ADLER live in Apartment 15 at 185 Claremont Avenue, New York City. The informant stated they have resided there for approximately five years and have a boy about two years old. T-l further stated that LEOLA ADLER is employed as a seamstress in the fur industry.

MOLLY IRVING

T-1 advised on September 21, 1955, that MOLLY IRVING is one of the subject's closest friends. T-1 stated that MOLLY IRVING is a housewife and has two children about the same age as subject's children. T-1 added that subject and MOLLY IRVING are often seen together about the premises of 185 Claremont Avenue. The informant further stated that she believed MOLLY IRVING's husband is employed in some capacity in the entertainment end of the television industry.

Information Regarding Contacts of the Subject and Husband

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on April 26, 1955, that toll calls were made on July 27, 1954, to New Paltz, New York, 8369 and on March 12, 1955, to Woodridge, New York 19J1, from subject's residence.

NY 65-14932 DAVID JAFFE The 1954-1955 telephone directory for Woodridge, New York, reflects that telephone number 19J-1 is listed to DAVID JAFFE, Glen Wild, New York. T-5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on March 16, 1953, that DAVID JAFFE was section organizer of the CP in the Woodridge, New York, area. T-6, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 14, 1953, that DAVID JAFFE was born on October 4, 1911, at Glen Wild, New York. He is married to ANN SHULMAN JAFFE and is a poultry farmer, having a farm at Glen Wild, New York. Informant further stated that JAFFE served in the United States Army from March, 1942, to October, 1945. T-7, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 22, 1954, that DAVID JAFFE attended the CP Farm Commission meeting at Newburgh, New York, on July 13, 1954. CHARLES J. BAKER The 1954-1955 telephone directory for the town of New Paltz, New York, reflects that telephone number New Paltz, New York, 8369 is listed to one CHARLES J. BAKER, 44 Plattekill Avenue, New Paltz. On July 11, 1955, Mrs. VIRGINIA ELLIS, Manager of the Ulster County Credit Service, Kingston, New York, advised SA HAROLD V. CATES that she could locate no record of CHARLES J. BAKER from the files of her office. On July 11, 1955, ARTHUR BROWN, Deputy Sheriff, Ulster County, New York, advised SA HAROLD V. CATES that he could locate no record of CHARLES J. BAKER in the files of the Ulster County Sheriff's Office. T-8, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on July 14, 1955, that CHARLES J. BAKER, 44

Plattckill Avenue, is a retired individual who has resided in New Paltz, New York, for the past several years. He is the father of CHARLES E. BAKER. a professor at New Paltz State Teachers College.

Mrs. VIRGINIA ELLIS subsequently advised SA HAROLD V. CATES on July 14, 1955, that CHARLES E. BAKER is listed in a 1951 credit report as a professor at New Paltz State Teachers College. He was reportedly in his 40's, and married to one BARBARA BURGER, who was in her 20's.

On July 20, 1955, Mr. WILLIAM J. HAGGERTY, President of the New Paltz State Teachers College, advised SA HAROLD V. CATES that CHARLES J. BAKER is the father of one of his professors, CHARLES E. BAKER. He said that the elder BAKER is retired and is in his late 70's and has been in the New Paltz area since 1950. Prior to that he resided in the Bronx, New York. He stated that BAKER lived in Upstate New York prior to residing in the Bronx and he thought he possibly lived in Glen Falls, New York, but he was not certain of this.

T-9, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised that subject's husband received the following correspondence on the dates indicated:

July 8, 1955 - S. M. Coplon and Son 200 Fifth Avenue New York City

August 3, 1955 - Kingsview Homes, Inc. 345 East 46th Street New York City

August 4, 1955 - American Labor Party 320 West 80th Street New York City

September 6, 1955 - Kingsview Homes, Inc. 345 East 46th Street New York City

September 7, 1955 - National Lawyers Guild 40 Exchange Place New York City. S. M. COPLON and SON

T-10, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 29, 1955, that they have a report on S. M. COPLON and SON dated June 16, 1954. This report indicates that BERTRAM COPLON is in his late 30's. He is the son of the late SAMUEL COPLON and associated with his father in this business for over ten years prior to the latter's death in 1949.

Mrs. REBECCA COPLON is the widow of SAMUEL COPLON and is a partner along with her son but takes no active part in the management. T-10 stated that S. M. COPLON and Son is a manufacturers representative in the toy, game, and children's book line. They represent over eleven accounts throughout the

BERTRAM COPLON was interviewed on June 15, 1954, by T-10 and he declined a financial statement. He indicated a satisfactory financial condition is maintained with liabilities confined to normal operating expenses which are adequately covered by cash resources.

United States with all income derived from commission on sales.

It is noted that the firm S. M. COPLON and SON was founded by subject's father and is presently managed by her brother, BERTRAM, who is a partner along with her mother, REBECCA COPLON.

American Labor Party

T-11, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 9, 1954, that from the time of its inception in 1936, there existed within the American Labor Party a struggle for power among three groups. These were the Communist Party, the Socialist Party, and the Social Democrats. By the early 1940's, the Communist Party emerged as the controlling force within the American Labor Party in the major industrial areas in New York State. Generally these were the areas around Albany, Buffalo, Jamestown, Rochester, Schenectady, Syracuse, Troy, the Hudson River Valley, Columbia, Dutchess, Nassau and Westchester Counties, and New York City, with the exception of Brooklyn. In 1942 the Communist Party was able to capture the American Labor Party in Brooklyn. T-11 knew this situation to continue up until at least 1949. The American Labor Party never developed into an organization of any real consequence in the non-industrial areas of New York State.

T-12, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1955, that the Communist Party today, as in the past, through its members in key positions in the American Labor Party, constitutes the force that controls it.

National Lawyers Guild

Concerning the National Lawyers Guild, the following appears in the booklet "Guide to Subversive Organizations and Publications" prepared and released by the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D.C., on May 14, 1951:

- "1. Cited as a Communist front. (Special Committee on Un-American Activities, Report, March 29, 1944, p. 149.)
- "2. Cited as a Communist front which 'is the foremost legal bulwark of the Communist Party, its front organizations, and controlled unions' and which 'since its inception has never failed to rally to the legal defense of the Communist Party and individual members thereof, including known espionage agents.' (Congressional Committee on Un-American Activities, Report on the National Lawyers Guild, House Report No. 3123, September 21, 1950 (originally released September 17, 1950).)"

<u>Miscellaneous</u>

T-13, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 29, 1955, that the full name of the individual who was sharing subject's apartment with her husband during the summer was MONTY LOWELL SONTAG.

T-l advised on September 12, 1955, that MONTY SONTAG was no longer staying in subject's apartment. T-l stated that SONTAG's name had been removed from the mailbox and the informant no longer saw him about the premises. T-l stated that about a week before subject came home from her vacation, the informant observed subject's husband and SONTAG put a few personal effects into ALBERT SOCOLOV's car. Informant assumed SONTAG was being moved and has not seen him since that time.

On September 1, 1955, Assistant United States Attorney GEORGE BAILEY, Southern District of New York, advised that the subject is presently free on \$40,000.00 bail and that travel is limited to the Eastern District of New York and the Southern District of New York. Mrs. ROBERTSON stated that they discussed how hot it had been in the city during the summer and the subject remarked that she had spent her vacation at Shelter Island, Long Island, New York, and had a wonderful time. Mrs. ROBERTSON stated the subject did not elaborate on the matter so she did not pursue it any further.

MOLLIE IRVING

The records of the Board of Elections, New York City, as checked by SA FRANCIS J. VOGT on October 28, 1955, reflect that in 1954 BEN and MOLLIE IRVING, 185 Claremont Avenue, New York City, registered as supporters of the American Labor Party. There was no registration record for 1953 or 1952.

Upon registering in 1954, MOLLIE IRVING indicated she was 35 years of age, married, born in the United States, a resident of the state for 35 years and a resident of the election district for three years.

In 1954, PAUL ADLER indicated he was 38 years of age, married, born in Germany, naturalized in December, 1952 in the Southern District of New York and had resided seven years in the state and three and one-half years in the election district. The records of the Gredit Bureau of Greater New York, as checked by SE DONALD C. STRELETZKY on October 18, 1955, reflect a credit report, dated May 24, 1955, which indicated PAUL ADLER (wife LEONA), 185 Claremont Avenue, is 40 years of age. He is a purchasing agent with the Israel Corporation of America, 400 Madison Avenue, New York City, and has been so engaged for four years. They are exporters of general merchandise. ADLER's income was reported as being \$5,000 yearly. EDITH SIMMS The records of the Board of Elections, New York City, as checked by SA FRANCIS J. VOGT on October 28, 1955, failed - 3 -

NY 65-14932 to reflect any registration record for EDITH SIMMS, 185 Claremont Avenue, New York City, for 1952, 1953 or 1954. The records reflect that in 1952 HERMAN SIMMS, 185 Claremont Avenue, New York City, registered as a supporter of one of the two major political parties. In 1953, he registered as a supporter of the Liberal Party and in 1954 there was no registration record for HERMAN SIMMS. Upon registering in 1953, HERMAN SIMMS indicated he was 43 years of age, married, born in the United States, a resident of the state for 20 years and a resident of the election district for four years. The records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, as checked by SE DONALD C. STRELETZKY on October 18, 1955, reflects a credit report, dated January 9, 1951, which indicates HERMAN SIMMS (wife EDITH), 185 Claremont Avenue, was about 35 years of age. He had lived at his present address for one year and formerly resided at 306 East 82nd Street, New York City. Emergency Civil Liberties Committee

The "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist
newspaper, issue of October 8, 1951, page 1, columns 4 and
5, in an article entitled "150 Notables Form Emergency
Civil Rights Committee", reflected that the formation of
the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee had been announced
on October 7, 1951. It was shown that the purpose of the
organization would be to help mobolize public opinion in
support of the traditional American Constitutional guarantees
of civil liberties and to render aid to victims of abridgement of
these liberties in politics, education and the professions.
Pounders, according to the article, included more than 50
members of the clergy and many educators and professionals.

Writing in "Political Affairs" issue of August, 1954, ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, Communist Party functionary, referred to the Emergency Civil Liberties committee as one of the "forces carrying on the defense of the Bill of Rights today".

Concerning "Political Affairs", FLYNN, testifying in the case "US vs. ELIZABETH GURLEY FLYNN, ET AL", on October 20, 1952, stated that "Political Affairs" has been the theoretical organ of the Communist Party since the publication's beginning in 1945.

The "New York Times", a daily newspaper, issue of April 12, 1955, page 25, columns 1 and 2, contained an advertisement of the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee reflecting the address of the committee as 421 Seventh Avenue, New York City.

American Labor Party

T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on September 9, 1954, that from the time of its inception in 1936, there existed within the American Labor Party a struggle for power among three groups. These were the Communist Party, the Socialist Party and the Social Democrats. By the early 1940's, the Communist Party emerged as the controlling force within the American Labor Party in the major industrial areas in New York State. Generally, these were the areas around Albany, Buffalo, Jamestown, Rochester, Schenectady, Syracuse, Troy, the Hudson River Valley, Columbia, Dutchess, Nassau and Westchester Counties, and New York City, with the exception of Brooklyn. In 1942, the Communist Party was able to capture the American Labor Party in Brooklyn.

T-3 knew this situation to continue up until at least 1949. The American Labor Party never developed into an organization of any real consequence in the non-industrial areas of New York State.

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on May 9, 1955, that the Communist Party today, as in the past, through its members in key positions in the American Labor Party, constitutes the force that controls it.

Kings View Homes

T-5, who has furnished reliable information in the past, on October 19, 1955, advised that an incorporation card on Kings View Homes was filed on February 5, 1953, by Attorney MAXWELL H. TRETTER, 122 East 42nd Street, New York City.

T-6, who has furnished reliable information in the past, in December, 1949, advised that MAXWELL TRETTER, 122 East 42nd Street, New York City, was a member of the National Lawyers Guild.

The records of the New York County Clerk's office reflected on November 9, 1955, that a Certificate of Incorporation was granted to Kings View Homes, Inc., on February 5, 1953, pursuant to Section 4 of the Redevelopment Companies law. The purpose of said corporation is to acquire land in New York



State and to construct and sell projects, including retail stores, shops, offices, etcetera, pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Redevelopment Companies law.



JOHN PICCOZZI, owner of the Island Food Market, Shelter Island, advised SA DANIEL F. O'COMNOR on November 21, 1955, that he did not recognize photographs of the subject as a customer of his during the summer season of 1955. It is noted that many residents at Shorewood Farms patronize Mr. PICCOZZI's food market. Mrs. MAE PICCOZZI, Winthrop Road, Shelter Island, and Mrs. DOROTHY KAHLE, Hager Road, Shelter Island, who are familiar with some of the summer residents at Shelter Island, advised SA DANIEL F. O'CONNOR on November 21, 1955, that they did not recognize photographs of the subject as any person who lived on Shelter Island during the summer of 1955. T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on August 21, 1954, that the Hampton Bays "clique" of the Communist Party (CP) had a fundraising party at the residence of JUDY and LEE COOPER. The informant stated that a number of the tenants at Shorewood Farms, Shelter Island, attended this affair. According to the informant, another affair of a similar nature was to be held over Labor Day weekend by the Shorewood Farms crowd. The CP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450. Mrs. JOHN H. GARR, 73-12 35th Avenue, Jackson Heights, Queens, New York, was interviewed by SAS THOMAS • 3 •

J. DOWLING and JAMES P. MARTIN on May 12, 1955. Mrs. GARR stated that she and her husband purchased the Artemus Ward Estate on Shelter Island, Long Island, New York, in 1947, and it is now called Shorewood Farms. It is operated by Shorewood Farms, Incorporated, as a summer resort, in which corporation both Mrs. GARR and her husband are principals.

Conserning the tenants of Shorewood Farms, she advised that they became tenants either as a result of advertisements placed in metropolitan newspapers or as a result of knowing other individuals who resided at Shorewood Farms. She advised that a large number of the original tenants at Shorewood Farms, including some of the present tenants, became so as a result of the efforts of BERNARD FREEMAN, one of her original tenants, to whom she paid ten per cent in commission for obtaining new tenants.

She also advised that a number of tenants at Shorewood Farms became so as a result of being recommended by PETER GUEST and his wife.

Mrs. GARR stated she is not and has never been a member of the CP or any of its affiliates. She stated that she felt that she could make the same statement for her husband who was ill and not available for interview. She further stated she abhors Communism and all that it stands for.

At that time, Mrs. GARR furnished a list of names of individuals who would be tenants at Shorewood Farms during the summer season of 1955. It is noted that no individual with the surname of SOCOLOV or COPLON was on the list. It is also noted that Mr. and Mrs. IEONARD HOLLAND were listed as guests at Shorewood Farms for the summer season of 1955, and they had been recommended by PETER GUEST.

Because of the limited identifying information concerning the tenants of Shorewood Farms mentioned above, it is not known whether the following information is identical with those individuals.

T-4, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised in February, 1954, that BERNARD FREEMAN married MAY FRIEDLANDER on August 14, 1953, in New York City.

A pretext telephone call to LEONARD MOLLAND, 455 East 14th Street, New York City, on August 10, 1953, reflected that he is an attorney with offices at 551 Fifth Avenue, New York City, and resides at 455 East 14th Street, New York City. MOLLAND advised that he was formerly an instructor at the United States Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point, New York.

In a Personnel Security Questionnaire dated August 1, 1948, submitted to the United States Maritime Commission, Washington, B. C., LEOMARD MOLLAND indicated he was born March 4, 1922, at Brooklyn, New York, as LEOMARD M. COMEN. He indicated his name was changed by court order in August, 1946. He listed his wife as MUTH ROBBIRS, born April 10, 1924, at New York City. At that time, he was an instructor at the United States Merchant Marine Academy, Kings Point, New York.

On March 15, 1956, Mrs. JOHN H. GARR, President of Dalton-Cooper Company, 200 West 34th Street, New York City, identified a photograph of subject and her husband as Mr. and Mrs. ALBERT SOCOLOV, who were tenants at Shorewood Farms, Shelter Island, New York, during the summer of 1955.

Mrs. GARR stated that she and her husband own Shorewood Farms and rent 30 cottages to tenants during the summer.

Mrs. GARR stated that subject had been recommended by LEO HURWITZ who, along with his wife, JANE DUDLEY HURWITZ, are also summer tenants at Shorewood Farms.

Mrs. GARR stated the HURWITZES have been summer residents for the past few years and that LEO HURWITZ is connected in some way with the theatrical field, while his wife, JANE DUDLEY HURWITZ, is a former dancert. She added they have a nine year old boy and live at 43 West 93rd Street, New York City.

T-2, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on January 28, 1948, that JANE DUDLEY, wife of LEO HURWITZ, photographer and producer, was, at that time, a member of the Communist Party (CP).

The CP has been designated by the Attorney General of the United States pursuant to Executive Order 10450.

T-3, who has furnished reliable information in the past, advised on November 16, 1943, that LEO HURWITZ was a member of Branch B, Northwest Section, Los Angeles CP, which section was primarily for motion picture directors and producers.

. The informant stated HURWITZ was awaiting transfer to



Branch A2, Northwest Section, which was primarily for screen writers.

Mr. JOSEPH H. JACKSON, 485 Madison Avenue, New York City, Personnel Director, Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS), furnished the following information the SA JOHN C. WILSON in November, 1944:

He stated that LEO HURWITZ was employed as a writer and director in the Television Department for CBS, New York City, since January, 1944. HURWITZ was born Jume 22, 1909, and is a native-born citizen. He is married to JANE D. HURWITZ. He graduated from Harvard University in 1930, where he majored in psychology and philosophy, and obtained a BA degree. Prior to coming to CBS, JACKSON stated HURWITZ was employed as a writer and director by Vanguard Films, Culver City, California.

On June 30, 1953, LEO HURWITZ was approached by SAS ALEXANDER M. GANSKY and WILFRED R. SCHLARMAN, near his residence, 43 West 93rd Street, New York City, at which time they told him they would like to discuss a confidential matter with him. HURWITZ replied he had nothing to discuss with the FBI and in the event he did, he would communicate with this office. The interview was terminated at this point, as HURWITZ walked away from the agents.

At approximately 5:45 p.m., 4/11/57, the following information in substance was received from NY 1537-S*, whose identity must be protected. This is being submitted for information.

JACK MC MANUS and JIM ARONSON, both of the "National Guardian" staff, conferred with NEEDLEMAN at the latter's office. ARONSON asked NEEDLEMAN what he thought about the SOBLE case. NEEDLEMAN went into a lengthy explanation as to how he had been obtaining evidence which would discredit BORIS MORROS. He mentioned material

received from SIDNEY KAUFMAN concerning foreign films and information concerning dealings with music publishers in regard to "War and Peace." NEEDLEMAN then told MC MANUS and ARONSON about a client of his, one GEORGE ADAMOUR, who was questioned by the FEI concerning his association with JACK SOBLE. NEEDLEMAN mentioned that the questioning centered about ADAMOUR's meeting with SOBLE at an unidentified hotel. NEEDLEMAN said it was his opinion with regard to the ADAMOUR incident that the FBI had been trailing SOBLE at the time of the meeting or that the SOBLES were talking. NEEDLEMAN then told them that the "whole business in the papers" shocked him and that he could not believe that they had pleaded guilty without some deal having been made.

According to the informant, ARONSON then commented that he knows BORIS (MORROS) and that he is a "phony liar." ARONSON told NEEDLEMAN that BORIS "took" a man named BALL for \$50,000.00 on the music rights for "War and Peace," and that BALL had to make a trip to Europe in order to recover \$40,000.00 of his money. ARONSON mentioned that BORIS still has \$10,000.00 belonging to BALL. NEEDLEMAN then commented that he thought that if BORIS ever got on the stand, "We could have murdered him."

ARONSON then commented that he and MC MANUS felt there was something fishy going on and said that they did not know how to handle it. NEEDLEMAN said that while they were with him he could contact his old friend HAROLD FRANKEL who is representing ALBAM (JACOB ALBAM). ARONSON commented that "they left Albam holding the bag if he does not plead guilty." According to the informant, NEEDLEMAN then made a telephone call to HAROLD FRANKEL regarding the SOBLE case. The informant said that at the conclusion of the call, NEEDLEMAN commented to ARONSON and MC MANUS that he was told that there was not a deal and with this, they all laughed.

NEEDLEMAN then stated that in his mind, there was no question but that a deal had been made and said that it appeared to him to be a parallel situation to the ALFRED DEAN SLACK case, saying that perhaps they did get material

from a library or place like that and passed it on so they could plead guilty to one of the lesser charges. ARONSON then commented that he knew SOBLE was a good friend of BORIS (BORIS MORROS).

ARONSON then asked NEEDLEMAN if he thought that the STERNS (ALFRED and MARTHA STERN) would be indicted. NEEDLEMAN said he did not think so and then explained that VAN TASSEL (AL VAN TASSEL) had been called before the grand jury to explain his business association with STERN. MC MANUS then asked NEEDLEMAN if he had any idea as to where the present grand jury is going. NEEDLEMAN then told them that BEN RESNICK had been called before the jury and had been questioned regarding activities back as far as 1920. NEEDLE-MAN then commented "Resnick was through in 1930."

ARONSON then asked NEEDLEMAN if he thought the paper (National Guardian) should try to draw a parallel between the SOBLE and the SLACK case. NEEDLEMAN told them that they should wait a while and see how things go and suggested they not get "out on a limb" He suggested that they might look into SOBLE'S mental condition. NEEDLEMAN stated that SOBLE'S attorney probably advised him to take the plea as the lesser of two evils after seeing his mental condition. NEEDLEMAN then commented, "The best gal in this whole deal was Judy Coplon." He then went on to explain that people are under terrific pressure in a circumstance such as this.

MC MANUS told NEEDLEMAN that they "knocked this thing around all day" and thought that if they could do something to "knock the government in the head" that it would be a good thing. MC MANUS then reverted to the SLACK case and said, "The FBI got their hands on Gold, a sick guy, and their victims were the Rosenbergs (JULIUS and ETHEL ROSENBERG) and Slack." He then commented that perhaps the government has something on MORROS. ARONSON then commented that MORROS had been in and out of Russia many times. NEEDLEMAN then suggested that perhaps they would be better off to let the entire matter rest this week in order to give him time to have lunch with FRANKEL and get the whole story before making a move.

MC MANUS and ARONSON, according to the informant, then stated they were considering running a story on SOBLE pointing out his mental condition and that beside this article they were intending to run a story on SLACK, pointing out that he plead guilty to avoid the death penalty. NEEDLEMAN cautioned them that they should be careful and not discredit either SOBLES! or SLACK's attorneys and suggested that if they did decide to run anything in the paper that he first be given an opportunity to see the copy. He then suggested that perhaps the government agreed with the SOBLES to let Mrs. SOBLE off as they did in the case of RUTH GREENGLASS.

Subject and two daughters arrived from Mexico at Idlewild Airport, 5/25/57. Subject interviewed 5/31/57 and stated purpose of trip to NY was to bring her daughter to heart specialist. Subject admitted knowing JUDITH COPLON and FLORA DON WOVSCHIN but denied any knowledge of espionage activities or participation in same. She said COPLON suggested getting job at OCIAA in Summer of 1944 in Washington, D. C. In response to questions about Americans now residing in Mexico she stated that she was not aware whether any were Communists because such matters were never discussed. She checked out of Hotel Olcott June 1, 1957, and had reservations for return to Mexico un'that date.

DETAILS: On May 25, 1957, HARRY SINGER, United States Customs, Idlewild Airport, called SA THOMAS J. O'HARA, Jr., and stated that the subject had arrived from Mexico at Idlewild Airport, New York City, at 1:00 a.m. on May 25, 1957, aboard Air France Flight 070. She was accompanied by two daughters, CARLA, age 8, and SUSANA, age 9. She gave a local New York City address of Hotel Olcott, New York City.

EUGENE FISHBEIN, Manager of the Hotel Olcott, 27 West 72nd Street, New York City, was contacted by SAS THOMAS J. BARRY and FRANCIS W. ZANGLE on May 27, 28, 29, 31, and June 3, 1957. He advised that subject and her two daughters had checked into the hotel on the morning of May 25, 1957. She was assigned Room 1109 which is a suite of two rooms with accommodations for light housekeeping.

FISHBEIN stated during the course of the week he had occasion to observe the subject at various times during the day and had seen her and the children in the lobby. They did not appear to have any visitors.

On June 1, 1957, subject and her daughters checked out of the hotel and advised they were departing via United Airlines on that evening to return to Mexico.

Subject was interviewed on the evening of May 31, 1957, by SAS THOMAS J. BARRY and FRANCIS W. ZANGLE. She advised that the purpose of her trip to New York was to see a heart specialist about one of her daughters who she feared was suffering from a heart murmur.

She stated she had left the United States in 1946 after her marriage to ROBERTO GUARDIA BERDECIO and since that time had returned only twice. Once she visited her parents in the Fall of 1948 and was also here in 1953 after the death of her father, JULIUS DAVIS. 'She remained in New York City at that time for about a month in order to settle the affairs of her father's estate.

mother, Mrs. REBECCA DAVIS, and her sister, ELLEN DAVIS, gave up their residence in New York and came to Mexico where they now reside with her. The subject admitted knowing JUDITH COPLON and FLORA DON WOVSCHIN. She said FLORA DON WOVSCHIN was her best friend during their school days. They both attended Fieldston High School, Barnard College, and the University of Wisconsin. She said that WOVSCHIN had met a Russian in the United States and had married him and departed this country around 1945. She later heard that WOVSCHIN had died. She said WOVSCHIN's mother had told her that she had received a death certificate from the USSR attesting that FLORA DON WOVSCHIN had died of pneumonia in Vladivostok. Subject said that WOVSCHIN's mother now resides in Mexico City. Subject stated that she did not recall exactly how WOVSCHIN met the man she married, NIKOLAI KARPEKOV, but she supposed that it was because of her interest in Russian War Relief, an organization which WOVSCHIN, but not she, worked for even when they were still in school. Subject said that KARPEKOV was the only Russian national that she had ever met through WOVSCHIN or any other way. This meeting came about during the Spring of 1946. She said that on this occasion KARPEKOV. WOVSCHIN. BERDECIO, and she all went to Jones Beach together for a day's outing. When they saw WOVSCHIN again without KARPEKOV she and BERDECIO tried to talk WOVSCHIN out of marrying KARPEKOV. She said they did this because they felt that WOVSCHIN was not in love with KARPEKOV and that the only reason she seemed to want to marry him was in order to go to Russia. WOVSCHIN was married to KARPEKOV in a ceremony in the Russian Embassy, Washington, D. C., subject stated, but she herself was not present at the wedding. Subject recalled the wedding might have taken place in New York City at one of the Russian establishments, she was not sure which.

Shortly after they were married, WOVSCHIN and KARPEKOV left the United States and subject next heard from WOVSCHIN in a letter from Beirut. In this letter WOVSCHIN did not appear too happy with her marriage.

Shortly after that in September, 1946, subject married BERDECIO and they sent an announcement of the marriage to WOVSCHIN to an address of WOVSCHIN's uncle who resided in Russia. Subject said she got this address from WOVSCHIN's mother who, at that time, resided in New York. Subject said she received a telegram of congratulations from WOVSCHIN and that was the last she had ever heard from her.

Concerning JUDITH COPLON, subject stated she met COPLON in her sophomore year at Barnard College, New York City. She said she was never as close to COPLON as she was to WOVSCHIN. She described her friendship with COPLON as merely a casual one.

She said after she left college she went to Mexico in December of 1943, where she was employed as a messenger in the Office of Naval Intelligence at the American Embassy in Mexico City. It was during that time that she met ROBERTO GUARDIA BERDECIO.

In July of 1944 she returned to the United States and was going to look for a job which would require more of her talents than the messenger job did in Mexico. She said that she was qualified as an economist.

Shortly after her return to New York in the Summer of 1944, JUDITH COPLON called her on the phone and asked her what her plans were. She said she did not know how COPLON knew that she was back in New York, but presumed that COPLON had heard from one of their fellow alumnae from Barnard. She told COPLON that she was looking for a job and COPLON suggested to her that she file an application with the Office of Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs (OCIAA).

COPLON told her that HARRY CONOVER, a former employee in COPLON's branch of the Justice Department, had recently transferred to OCIAA. COPLON suggested that CONOVER might be able to assist subject in obtaining placement with OCIAA. She obtained the job at OCIAA as COPLON had suggested and was stationed in Washington, D. C.

There she resumed her close acquaintanceship with FLORA DON WOVSCHIN who was then an employee of the State Department, but she said she saw very little of COPLON in Washington or at anytime thereafter. She said she was very surprised to read that COPLON was arrested and that she has not corresponded with COPLON at anytime since.

Subject stated that she did not know whether WOVSCHIN or COPLON were ever Communists and she denied that she herself was ever a Communist and stated she was not now a Communist.

She continued throughout the interview to insist that she had never been approached by anyone to assist the Soviets in any way and that she had never done so. She advised that she had never turned over any documents or revealed any confidential information to the Soviets or anyone else and had never been asked to do so.

She stated that JOSE ANTONIO ARZE was a friend of her husband who looked her up in the United States after her return from Mexico. She stated she knew very little about ARZE except that he was a Bolivian and a friend of her husband. She said she saw him a few times in the United States during 1945 and on one occasion ARZE took her to a New Year's Eve party at the home of some of his Bolivian friends who resided in Brooklyn. She did not recall their names or the location of their home. She said that the New Year's Eve party was probably on December 31, 1944, or January 1, 1945.

NY 65-14984 She said that she had heard from her husband recently that ARZE died. She believed he had died somewhere in Mexico of something like a liver ailment and she thought he had died about a year and a half ago. Subject stated that she continued to retain her United States citizenship and she presently resides in Mexico with the status of "Inmigrado". She stated she does not intend to give up her American citizenship, She stated she is acquainted with many Americans who now reside in Mexico. She stated she did not know whether there were any Communists among this group of Americans because such matters as political beliefs were never discussed among the group. She said that she knew they were liberals but that was all she would say. She said she did not know why they wanted to leave the United States and reside in Mexico. She said she had flown here via Air France but could not obtain return reservations abourd Air France and therefore had obtained return reservations aboard Eastern Airlines, departing Saturday night, June 1, 1957. JUDITH COPLON In the Spring of 1953, T-1, who has furnished reliable information in the past, stated that the subject considered JUDITH COPLON to be one of her closest friends with whom she continues to correspond. The subject had invited COPLON to visit her during the Summer of 1953 and COPLON accepted the invitation. However, on July 7, 1953, T-1 advised that COPLON informed the subject that she would not be able to visit her that summer inasmuch as the Federal Bureau of Investigation was keeping a close track of her. JUDITH COPLON was found guilty on June 30, 1949, in the District of Columbia of violating Sections 793 and 2071, Title 18, United States Code. - 6 -

JUDITH COPLON was convicted in the Southern District of New York on March 7, 1950, and was sentenced on March 9, 1950, for violating Section 794, Title 18, United States Code, and conspiracy to violate 793, 794 and 2071, Title 18, United States Code, the convictions involving espionage activities for Soviet Russia.

With regard to the above convictions, the Circuit Court of Appeals for the Second Circuit, reversed the convictions on February 5, 1950, and remanded the case for a new trial.

The Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia, on June 1, 1951, remanded the case for a hearing on whether there had been an interception of telephone calls between COPLON and her attorney. This hearing has not been held.

The United States Supreme Court on January 28, 1952, refused to review either decision on writs of certiorari. JUDITH COPLON has not been retried.

FLORA DON WOVSCHIN

MARIA WICHER, mother of FLORA DON WOVSCHIN, was interviewed on January 22 and 23, 1952, in Decatur, Georgia, by SAS DALLAS MOBLEY and RICHARD A. MINIHAN.

MARIA WICHER stated that subject shared FLORA DON WJVSCHIN's pro-Russian views but was not quite as strong in these views as WOVSCHIN. She stated WOVSCHIN had worked for Russian War Relief during World War II and believed that the subject had been in this work also. MARIA WICHER stated that she too had worked for Russian War Relief.

MARIA WICHER stated that FLORA DON WOVSCHIN was married in 1946 to NIKOLAI KARPEKOV, an employee of the Amtorg Trading Corporation, New York City. WICHER stated that the marriage was performed by a Russian official, identity unknown, at the Russian Consulate in New York City. MARIA WICHER said that KARPEKOVS sailed for Russia on July 19, 1946.

By memorandum dated February 28, 1942, BENJAMIN MANDELL, Director of Research of the Committee on Un-American Activities, United States House of Representatives, Washington, D. C., described the Russian War Relief as a Communist controlled front organization.

The memo stated that the Russian War Relief was started at a rally held July 2, 1941, in New York City. This rally was sponsored by the American Council on Soviet Relations which was later changed to the National Council of American Soviet Friendship, which in turn was cited as subversive and Communistic by Attorney General TOM CLARK in letters to the Loyalty Review Board released December 24, 1947, and September 21, 1948.

JOSE ANTONIO ARZE

The February 19, 1945, issue of the "Daily Worker", an East Coast Communist newspaper, contained an article which announced that JOSE ANTONIO ARZE, head of the Bolivian Left Revolutionary Party (PIR), was to deliver a series of eight weekly lectures on Latin America beginning on February 19, 1945.

BERDECIO had invited COPLON to visit her during the summer of 1953 and COPLON accepted the invitation. However, on July 7, 1953, infrant advised that COPLON informed BERDECIO that she would not be able to visit her that summer inasmuch as the Federal Bureau of Investigation was keeping a close track on her.



COMOVER advised that he did not recall MARION DAVIS RERDECIO and he was unable to recognize a photograph of her. He stated that he was employed at the Office of Co-ordination of Inter-American Affairs (Co-ordinator's Office) from August, 1944, to February, 1945. He stated that during the approximate six months he was employed in the Co-ordinator's Office, he did not recall JUDITH COPLON having referred anyone to him in connection with employment there.

Concerning JUDITE COPICE, COMOVER advised that he recalled her as an employee of the Economic Farfare Section, Department of Justice, in New York City. He stated that he was employed in this same section, but was stationed in Washington, D. C. He said that during the course of a year, he visited New York on business three or four times and that during his visits to the Economic Farfare Section there, he became acquainted with COPICE. COMOVER further stated that in the Spring of 1944, COPICE came to Machington, D. C., on temporary masignment and for a time shared as office with MOREAN BURSLER, during which time, she and BURSLER were writing a paper on the steel industry.

CONOVER advised that he had no social contact with COPLON and spake scarcely ten words to her in his life. He said that he had not seen or heard from her since he left the Justice Department. He stated that at the time he knew COPLON, he had no reason to believe her to be in any way connected with communism or to have been unusually pro-Bussian. He stated that at the time of the newspaper publicity concerning COPLON's arrest on espionage charges in 1949, he searched his recollection inso attempt to reappraise his knowledge of her, but that the only thing that came to his mind was that she, along with ROBERT SANLYONTS, JAMES S. MARTIN, and MORMAN BURGLER, subscribed to the theory that large United States business firms were responsible for the rise of ADOLPH HITLER to power in Germany, and had assisted Germany in the hope he would some day attack Russia.

CONOVER stated that he did not agree with this thesis and his disagreement was one of the reasons he decided to leave the Justice Department in mid 1944. In this connection, CONOVER stated that WOHLFORTH, MARTIN, and BURSLER, in 1944, increasingly pointed the work of the Economic Warfare Section toward post-war planning and the "smearing" of American enterprise, for which he did not think the section was qualified. He stated that at the time, he was of the opinion that the section should have concerned itself with trying to win the war by assisting in the selection of bombing targets in Germany and Japan and should have waited until the war was won before taking up the problem of reconstruction. CONOVER indicated that he was particularly surprised at JAMES MARTIN's attitude in this regard. He mentioned that MARTIN had graduated from Saint John's College in Annapolis, Maryland, at which time, he was not much interested in contemporary events. EDNA COLEMAN discussed with NEEDLIMAN various CP matters as follows:

NEEDLE AN asked, "Are you folks out? (of the CP). I don't know whether you... I don't know... Do you still attend meetings?" EDNA replied, " I think within the last couple of weeks I made a move to be registered."
With regard to dissension in the CP, NEEDLETAN said, "I'm satisfied that the Party has just no reason for existence so long as they have these two contending, three contending groups." NEEDLENAY mentioned that HOTARD FAST is starting to name names and that LOUISE BERIAN is one of the individuals referred to indirectly by FAST. MEEDLE AN asked about EDNA's husband, SAII, and EDNA revealed that he had gotten back three-fourths of his bail. EDNA mentioned the possibility of initiating further action in SAM's case. NEEDLEHAM, however, thought it too soon after the decision to do anything and observed that they could move after a year to dismiss the indictment. MEEDLETIAN related that he had spoken to SOCOLOV, (AL SOCOLOV), about the outstanding indictment against JUDY COPLON. According to NHEDLE IAN, SOCOLOV said, "We talked to so many lawyers. Most of them are of the opinion let sleeping chosts lie".

In discussing VICKIE, (probably VICKIE LAWRENCE), EDNA said VICKIE had been a very close friend of hers but that they were not speaking due to a political disagreement over JOHN GATES. NEEDEMANN said MARTY LIFFLANDER must agree with "them", (LAURINCES), as the LAURENCES and LIFFLANDERS had recently visited with the WALLERSTEINS.

EDNA told THEDLEMAN that she is currently studying human relations and is working on or anizing a neighborhood council as part of a course she is studying. She said the project is being sponsored by the National Council of Christians and Jews, (inaudible), New York University.

MAURICE PAUL, aka MORRIS KURTZ, who was referred to NEEDLEAN by the American Committee for Protection of Foreign Born, consulted the latter about his forthcoming INS hearing on 11/26/57. In response to NEEDLEMAN'S questions, PAUL revealed that he had been a member of the

TWO until it was dissolved and had marched in the May Day Parade. With regard to CP membership, NEIDLEMAN usked, "Ever a Communist Party member?" PAUL replied, "I should tell you that?" NEEDLEMAN retorted, "All right, don't tell me. If you asked the question, then I don't want you to tell me. When we go up there, (INS), you are going to invoke the Fifth Amendment on all questions other than your name and address". NEEDLEMAN cautioned PAUL that to do otherwise would subject him to the risk of deportation.

Concerning his activities, PAUL revealed the following: Ho entered the U.S. in 1922 and is from the Ukraine. He has not had an employer since the beginning of 1953. He was separated from his first wife in 1938 and was divorced in August, 1956. His first wife is in Minneapolis. Since his separation, he has been living with another woman and has a daughter, LISA, almost 20 years old. PAUL mentioned the name ETHEL HEPBURN who informant thought could be either his first or second wife. He has a friend, MARY LESEUR (ph), who he has known since the 1920's and who used to stay at his place while visiting in MYC. PAUL said "they (FBI?) followed her every step of the way". PAUL said the FBI followed him for some time and thought it due to his trade union activities. In the late 20's he became an organizer in the Amalgamated Clothing Workers and worked with thom until 1938. In 1940, he withdrew altogether from the union. PAUL claimed the FBI followed him in Chicago and contacted hi i in 1943 "on the job" in Florida to ask whether he was ever in Tranca or had connections with Fronch people. PAUL said he was asked if he had ever been a CP member and that he had claimed there was possibly a mix-up on his name and that he was being confused with someone else. PAUL said he used the name MORRIS KURTZ when he came to the U.S. but had not changed his name legally. He claimed, however, to have notified the Alien Enemy Registration Board. PAUL claimed to have been approached, (by the FBI?), 2 or 3 times since 1913, most recently during last May or June, but said he had not talked to "them". PAUL specifically recalled that the FBI had talked to Dr. FRANK in Florida which was where he stayed.

NEEDLE IAN assured PAUL he would meet the latter at 70 Columbus Avenue (INS) at 9:30 a.m., 11/26/57. PAUL gave NEEDLE IAN his telephone number as AL5-0965. NEEDLE IAN asked if there were any stool pigeons that could identify him and PAUL said he did not think there were.



GARZA RAMOS is a very astute individual. He obtained certain lands in Ciudad Juarez, now known as Fraccionamiento Garza Ramos. No one can explain how he came into possession of these lands. He has obtained other lands and properties, the titles to which are not clear, and he has put them in the names of his wife and children. His brother acts as a collector for him and a front man in many deals. GARZA RAMOS is a member of the Union de Profesionistas and the Confederacion de Organizaciones Populares in Ciudad Juarez. He considers himself as having a taste for poetry.

On 9/4/58 former advised that he has known Lic. LUPERCIO GARZA RAMOS since 1932. He is originally from the State of Coahuila. At that time he was a minor employee of the Chihuahua state government, working in Praxedes Guerrero, Municipality of Ciudad Juarez, Chihuahua. Later, he was named Assistant District Attorney in Guadalupe in the same municipality.

GARZA RAMOS received the title of attorney from the state government without previous studies or education. Years later he became a notary, which title he still holds. As an attorney he is bad; as a notary, he is unscrupulous. GARZA RAMOS has been involved in difficulties because of considerable notarial acts and the suspicious acquisition of real estate. At the present time he has a considerable amount of capital which he allegedly acquired through real estate deals and the issuing of birth affidavits for people who did not have birth certificates. Numerous attorneys in Juarez and Chihuahua City have been quite outspoken about the complete lack of professional ethics on the part of GARZA It was learned that GARZA RAMOS was not admitted to the lawyers' association in Ciudad Juarez. As a result, he provoked a schism and formed another lawyers' association. stated that GARZA RAMOS is not to be recommended. Former

Mrs. WIDENER attended the Emergency Civil Liberties Committee (ECLC) sponsored celebration of the 167th Anniversary of the Bill of Rights held 12/15/58, at the Hotel New Yorker; New York, New York. She was accompanied by EDITH KERMIT ROOSEVELT, the grandaughter of THEODORE ROOSEVELT, and Dr. AUGUSTIN VAZQUEZ NAVARRO of Mexico City, Mexico. Dr. NAVARRO is associated with the Institute for Economic and Social Research at Mexico City. Both he and Miss ROOSEVELT are completely anti-Communist. Miss ROOSEVELT attended this function as she is preparing an article for "U.S.A." in which she will undoubtedly mention the ECLC. Dr. VAZQUEZ NAVARRO attended at the invitation of Mrs. WIDENER inasmuch as she felt it would be advisable to have a male escort at this affair:

The speakers were Judge HUBERT T. DELANY, Mrs. DOROTHY MARSHALL and HARVEY O'CONNOR as listed on the invitation to the affair.

Mrs. WIDENER stated that it was announced that \$33,000 had been pledged by the audience to support the ECLC. It was announced that CORLISS IAMONT had contributed \$12,000. Judge DELANY contributed \$1,000. PALMER WEBER contributed \$1,000. ROCKWELL KENT, \$800. Mrs. WIDENER stated that she had contributed \$5.00 under the name of ALICE BERAZOWSKY.

Mrs. WIDENER stated that an individual who identified himself as the father of LEONARD BOUDIN, sat at her table. He stated that his brother, LOUIS BOUDIN was a great radical and the author of a book called "The Class Struggle." His brotherLOUIS was congratulated by LENIN for his work in writing the book. As a result LENIN invited LOUIS BOUDIN to be a professor of law at the University of Moscow. However, this was turned down by the author BOUDIN.

This individual (the father of MUTS BOUDIN) stated that a revolution was necessary in the US in order to bring about Socialism. However, he stated that conditions here were better-much better. This individual added that LEONARD BOUDIN was planning to go to Czechoslovakia during January, 1959, for some important work. He stated conditions in Czechoslovakia were good.

This individual (the father of LT/NARD BOUDIN) added that his son had really made his reputation in the COPLON case. As a result, judges now treat LEONARD BOUDIN with great respect. He continued that his son visits JUDY COPLON occasionally and that he has advised COPLON to keep out of the public eye.

This individual (the father of LEONARD BOUDIN) commented that his other son had lost a \$10,000 a year job with an advertising agency because of Senator MC CARTHY. This son was given six month severence pay.

On 8/23/60, NY 1537-S*, a source that has furnished reliable information in the past and must be adequately protected, furnished the following information concerning a conference that took place on that date between NEEDLEMAN and Mr. and Mrs. WALTER SCHNEIR:

SCHNEIR told NEEDLEMAN that he and his wife were writing a book about HARRY GOLD and were trying to locate MIRIAM MOSKOWITZ so that they could interview her in connection with the book. NEEDLEMAN suggested that ABE BROTHMAN might have MIRIAM's address.

SCHNEIR explained that the book hinged upon the presence of other people in HARRY GOLD's life and thought that NEEDLEMAN might be able to help by telling what he knew about GOLD. NEEDLEMAN asked if SCHNBIR had read the file that referred to him (NEEDLEMAN) and when SCHNEIR replied he had, NEFDLEMAN commented that the testimony was entirely accurate. NEEDLEMAN stated that GOLD and BROTHMAN had come to see him at a time when he was house Counsel for Amtorg and his office was in Amtorg's place of business. NEEDLEMAN had told GOLD and EROTHMAN that he could not represent them because of his position with Amtorg. When GOLD had asked what he should do if the FBI came before he secured a lawyer, NEEDLEMAN had told him to "throw them out" unless they had a warrant. At this point NEEDLEMAN asked SCHNEIR what he would do if he were subposnaed by the House Committee on Un-American Activities as to his conversation with NEEDLEMAN in asking for information about GOLD. SCHNEIR replied that he would refuse to answer on First Amendment grounds and if necessary would go to jail for it.

In answer to SCHNEIR's inquiry as to when he first met GOLD, NEEDLEMAN stated that a classmate of his at Cornell University, JULES KORCHIEN, had invited him to lunch where he introduced him to two individuals, GOLD and ABE BROTHMAN. NEEDLEMAN placed this lunch early in 1946. He stated that EROTHMAN explained that he was building vitamin producing plants for various countries and indicated that he wanted to do the same for Russia. EROTHMAN had then intimated that they (GOLD and BROTHMAN) had already done some work for the Russians and had a sum of money waiting for them in Russia. NEEDLEMAN pointed out that at this stage the told EROTHMAN that he should confine himself to merely talking business since Amtorg was only a business organization. NEEDLEMAN remarked to SCHNEIR that he believed that when EROTHMAN was speaking about a sum of money in Russia, he was doing it solely to impress NEEDLEMAN and furthermore he (NEEDLEMAN) considered GOLD to be a pathological liar. NEEDLEMAN went

on to say that he finally arranged an interview for GOLD and EROTHMAN with SARIANOVICH (Phonetic) who was head of a special Russian commission dealing with vitamins. Although BROTHMAN had an opportunity to explain his proposition to SARIANOVICH, no deal was ever consummated.

NEEDLEMAN again mentioned that after having witnessed the interview between GOLD and BROTHMAN and SARIANOVICH, he obtained the impression that GOLD was "pathological," He added that what predisposed him to dislike GOLD was his talking about having done something for Russia and NEEDLEMAN remarked that if GOLD had actually performed some such duties, he should have kept him mouth shut. SCHNEID then asked NEEDLEMAN if he could remember anything else of importance that GOLD had talked to him about along that line. Although most of NEEDLEMAN's reply to SCHNEIR's question was inaudible, the informant stated that NEEDLEMAN did say that he considered GOLD so unreliable that he did not want to hear anything about his activities. NEEDLEMAN further stated that GOLD might have assumed that a person who was counsel of Amtorg must be a Communist, but that such an assumption would only be made "by a nitwit."

SCHNEIR then asked NETDLEMAN whether the story EROTHMAN had told the Grand Jury was substantially correct, namely that EROTHMAN met JACOB GOLOS about 1940 or 1941, juring the meetings between GOLOS and EROTHMAN A a woman named HELEN, who turned out to be ELIZABETH BENTLEY, was present. Later GOLD was sent along so that he could examine blueprints and arrange to explain them to GOLOS so that GOLOS could handle business with Amtorg. NEEDLEMAN said that he had no reason to doubt the foregoing story. NEEDLEMAN stated that actually he saw GOLD a total of two or three times. He added that he had the impression that BROTHMAN had believed GOLD's story about having a sum of money waiting for him in Russia in payment for "some extra-curricular activities" he had done for the Russians.

SCHNEIR remarked that it seemed queer that BROTHMAN and GOLD would have to seek out NEEDLEMAN if they had already done such good work for Russia. NEEDLEMAN explained that if BROTHMAN and GOLD had been engaged in some type of spy apparatus for the Russians in the US, Amtorg would not necessarily know anything about it and in fact GCLD's and BROTHMAN's principal would not want them to go near Amtorg since such apparatuses would be kept separate and distinct. NEEDLEMAN added that this was true of most espionage operations regardless of the nation involved.

SCHNEIR remarked that there were a couple of people who had worked in the plant for EROTHMAN. NEEDLEMAN stated that he occasionally runs into one of them, but cannot remember his name. Mrs. SCHNEIR asked if this person could be OSCAR VAGO. NEEDLEMAN replied in the affirmative.

NEEDLEMAN said that he believed BROTHMAN now had a very lucrative job in Port Jervis, which he had obtained through some man he met while in jail. SCHNEIR commented that he and his wife had interviewed BROTHMAN and had been impressed with his keen mind. He said that BROTHMAN had talked for several hours about his past, but there were one or two things he had told them which appeared to be untrue. When LCHNEIR had asked when EROTHMAN met HARRY GOLD, he had replied that it was either in 1945 or 1946, but later in his conversation EROTHMAN had indicated that he knew GOLD several years earlier.

SCHNEIR asked NEEDLEMAN if he had ever heard of ALFRED D. SLACK. NEEDLEMAN recalled the case and mentioned that BILL REUBEN had written about him. SCHNEIR stated that HARRY GOLD had apparently paid (SLACK to do certain industrial research. He asked if such we-search activities would fall within the operations of Amtorg. NEEDLEMAN replied that Amtorg would never sanction such activity or be involved in asking someone to do such research; however, NEEDLEMAN said that he

did not rule out the possibility that some individual in Amtorg, while performing his regular duties at Amtorg, might on the side be in some kind of apparatus to secure information that was not part of Amtorg's business. SCHNEIR mentioned that when GOLD and SLACK were involved in this industrial research the time was about 1938. NEEDLEMAN pointed out that he would know nothing about such activity as he did not become associated with Amtorg until 1943. He added that he was sure that people who were now with Amtorg would know nothing of any possible association that GOLD or SLACK might have had with Amtorg in 1938, as it is the policy of Amtorg to change its personnel every four or five years.

When SCHNEIR asked NEEDLEMAN whether he had known JACOB GOLOS, NEEDLEMAN replied "He didn't know me. I knew him." NEEDLEMAN did not explain or amplify this reply.

In answer to NEEDLEMAN's question as to the type of book the SCHNEIRs were planning to write and why GOLD interested them as a subject for as book, SCHNEIR replied that there had never been a book by a popular publisher on the subject except for one by REUEEN and one by WEXLEY (Fhonetic) and added that he had found certain deficiencies in both books, remarking that the book by REUBEN did not seem completely reliable in every respect. NEEDLEMAN assured SCHNEIR that BILL REUBEN would not hesitate to lie. SCHNEIR said that it was his belief that there was a whole new generation that knows nothing about HARRY GOLD and by interviewing as many people as possible who were in any way connected with GOLD, they were expecting to be able to tell the whole story as truthfully as possible. He went on to say that they were interested in writing not just a historical document, but wanted to put it in a logical context with what it means in terms of a tradition and what role GOLD filled. He said they would try to show what made GOLD important at this particular time and place whereas at another time or place he might have been in a mental institution or would have been of no importance at all.

NEEDLEMAN asked SCHNEIR when GOLD was supposed to have been involved with FUCHS. SCHNEIR replied that their first meeting was in 1944, and GOLD was supposed NEEDLEMAN remarked that to have also met FUCHS in 1945. this supported the consensus of opinion that he had been part of an apparatus. SCHNEIR said that GOLD never mentioned getting any money from the Russians and GOLD had said that he paid his expenses himself. SCHNEIR remarked that this made GOLD's story all the more incredible since it showed no motivation for GOLD's action especially since he said he was not a Communist. He said that GOLD had stated that he did industrial espionage in order to pay off a debt for a friend who got him a job in the 1930's, and this led him into other work where finally he was doing missions which could have given him the death penalty. SCHNEIR said it was difficult to understand such action on the part of GOLD since with the latter there was neither ideology nor money involved.

NEEDLEMAN suggested that the SCHNEIRs attempt to interview GOLD to which SCHNEIR replied that they would like to but did not believe it possible. SCHNEIR added that they would also like to try and see FUCHS in East Germany. When NEEDLEMAN expressed surprise that SCHNEIR could afford a trip to Germany, SCHNEIR said that he had been doing fairly well lately selling articles to various publications such as "The Nation", "Redbook", and "The Reporter." One of his articles in "The Nation" was entitled "Campaign To Make Chemical Warfare Acceptable." Another of his articles is to appear in the October or November issue of "Better Homes and Gardens." SCHNEIR said that he is willing to accept an advance on his book, but wants to wait until next year because of income tax reasons. At the present time he is a Medical Editor for "M.D. Medical News Magazine."

NEEDLEMAN remarked that he had no objection to his name being used in the book, but preferred that it not be mentioned. NEEDLEMAN related how his name became involved in the JUDY COPLON trial. He said that he had met COPLON at a conference in Washington when Amtorg was asked to register as a foreign agent and

COPLON had sat in on the conferences. At that time her name meant nothing to him. Later while JUDY COPLON's trial was in progress NEEDLEMAN read an account of it in the "New York Times" which mentioned that a decoy memorandum had been prepared and passed on to COPLON. The decoy memorandum implied that NEEDLEMAN, Counsel for Amtorg, was an FBI informant. NEEDLEMAN said that on reading this he was stunned and for a moment could not decide what to do. He finally went to the president of Amtorg and offered to resign if Amtorg had a doubt as to his loyalty. NEEDLEMAN said that the president embraced him and assured him that they knew he was not working for the FBI; however NEEDLEMAN said he was greatly upset for over a year and could not bear anyone joking about it.

In commenting on the COPLON case, NEEDLEMAN said he was convinced that she had engaged in espionage activities and did not believe her story that the material found in her purse was for the purpose of writing a book; however, he did not believe that she could have given the Russians anything of great value. He added that the COPLON family will not ask for return of the \$25,000.00 in bonds which they posted for JUDY COPLON's bail. He said that the family still get the coupons from the bonds, but do not want to do anything that would cause the Government to retry the case.

SCHNEIR then asked NEEDLEMAN's opinion as to the guilt or innocence of the ROSENBERGS. He said that in his opinion as a lawyer they did not receive a fair trial and were not adequately represented by counsel. He said that he did not feel that they stole the atom bomb, but did believe they were involved in some kind of espionage.

NEEDLEMAN concluded by saying that it was his opinion that HARRY GOLD had been some kind of Russian agent and BROTHMAN was aware of it.

The Queens Telephone Directory lists WALTER SCHNEIR, 42-34 Elbertson Ave., Elmhurst, LI, NY, telephone TW 8-1131.

The NY indices reflect that his wife, MIRIAM SCHNEIR, is a school teacher employed by the NYC Board of Education, and has attended meetings of the Queens County Committee for a Sane Nuclear Policy, since 1958.

The foregoing is for the Bureau's information and any further mention of the projected book by the SCHNEIRS will be brought promptly to the Bureau's attention.

Reference is made to the memo of SA J. J. DANAHY dated 10/21/60 concerning certain material which is maintained in your safe with respect to the captioned matter and in accordance with the instructions of A. H. Belmont (memo 2/7/50) and of T. S. Miller (memo 10/17/57).

For your information, JUDITH COPLON is presently under indictment and has been under indictment since her conviction was reversed by the Circuit Court of Appeals. At the time her conviction was reversed, the court affirmed the indictment and recommended a new trial. As a matter of fact, JUDITH COPLON has been continued on \$25,000.00 bond ever since her release on bail and no attempt has been made by her attorneys to secure release from bond or to quash the indictment. While because of circumstances which are peculiar to this particular case there appears little likelihood that the Government will move for a new trial in the immediate future, I believe that in view of the legal situation outlined above, the material referred to in the memo of reference should be maintained, as is presently the case, in your personal possession in accordance with the instructions of the trial court.

# **Heighborhood**

On March 2, 1961, Mr. and Mrs. GRECORY MIRON, 163 State Street, Brooklyn, New York, advised that they are acquainted with the subject and her family as neighbors as well as on a social basis. They advised that they frequently babysit with the subject's four children and described her and her husband as a devoted married couple. They commented that the subject, in their spinion, is a wonderful mether and an intelligent person.

The MIROW's edvised that the SOCOLOVE were fine neighbors and they could not recall either of them making any political statements which would indicate that they were disloyal to the United States. Ars. MIROW advised that she and her husband were participants in a neighborhood improvement association on State Street, as were the SOCOLOVS. The purpose of this association was strictly for the improvement and cleanup of vice and drug addiction in the neighborhood. She recalled that the SOCOLOVS were quite active in the group as they had worked hard in improving their home and convexting it into a two-family spartment building. The SOCOLOVS occupy the top three floors and the bottom floor is rented to a young married couple.

Mrs. MIROW recalled the meighborhood association discussions, at time, took political tangents, mainly concerning

pre-election discussions, and she recalled that the SOCOLOVS voiced their support of the then Presidential Candidate JOHN F. KENNEDY. Mr. MIROW advised that he recalled no statements made at any time by the SOCOLOVS which could be construed as anything but loyal to the United States. The MIROWS advised that the SOCOLOVS are known and liked in the neighborhood. They stated that they knew of no one in the neighborhood friendly with the SOCOLOVS who was employed by the United States Government or who would have, to their knowledge, access to any classified Government information.

The files of the New York Office, reviewed on February 28, 1961, failed to reflect any information regarding Nr. and Mrs. GEORGE MIROW.

The appeals court, headed by Judge Learned Hand, ruled that the conviction must be supset because Miss Copion was arrested without as warrant and that the government had falled to show conclusively that its avidance stemmed from sources other than illegal wire taps But the indictment was not ordered dismissed and the way was left open for a retrial. However, the appellate court, in the view of many lawyers, knicked the props out from any possible retrial when it also ruled that since the arrest by F.B.I. agents was made without a warrant, the incriminating Justice Department documents found on her cannot be used against her. Those papers were the crux of the case.

(Since then a law has been passed easing the way for the P.B.I to make arrests without warrants.)

#### * Hearing Not Held-

Con June 2/1951/sthe United States (Court of Appeals in Washington upheld Miss (Coplon's 1949 conviction there—but said she was entitled to a lower court hearing to determine whether her telephone conversations with her lawyer before and during the Washington trial had been tapped?

If that were the case—and this was conceded at the New York trial—the District of Columbia Appeals Court said she was entitled to a new trial in Washington. A hearing sufgested by the appellate court, was never held.

#### SEYMOUR LNU

SEYMOUR was a member of the Kensington LYL Club in Brooklyn from 1945 until he was last seen in 1950. He was also a member of the Kensington CP Youth Club from about 1943 to 1949. SEYMOUR is about 5'9" tall, 190-200 pounds, brown hair, heavy build, and would now be about 31 years old. Since SEYMOUR was last seen, HERBERT CELNICK mentioned that SEYMOUR was no longer a member of the CP. CELNICK also stated that SEYMOUR was married, worked as an electrician, and lived in the electrical workers cooperative houses on Linden Boulevard in Brownsylls.

It is noted that the divergment had been trying for years to deport SEYMOUR's jother; however, she was never deported.

#### BESS LUMPKIN

CP leader in Buffalo. BESS was a member of the Bedford-Stuyvesant CP Youth Club about 1948-1949. She was county educational director of the LYL in 1949 to at least 1950, when she was last seen. BESS has a good singing voice and was married to a white merchant seamen and lived in Bedford-Stuyvesant. She was last seen in 1950 when she was still a CP member. However, about 1955 members of her family in Buffalo mentioned that she was well. She was presumably still in the Party at this time because if she had left the Party, members of her family, who were strong Party members, would have mentioned this. BESS was what some people in the Party might call an extreme Negro Nationalist.

Guiltonev was also convicted of sepionage and loth received fifteen-year terms, here to run consecutively. Sut his sentence was suspended when he agreed to sail tech to Russia, never to return to these shores. He is presumably still alive, though he has not been heard from in years.

On Dec. 5, 1950, the United States Court of Appeals at Poley Square unemimously set aside her New York conviction even though it held that Riss Copion's guilt is plain'. (Oubstehev had agreed not to appeal).

The appeals court, headed by Judge Learned Hand, ruled that the conviction must be upont because Kiss Copien was arrested without a warrant and that the government had failed to show conclusively that its evidence stemmed from sources other than illegal wire taps.

But the indictment was not ordered dismissed and the way was left open for a retrial. However, the appellate court, in the view of many lawyers, knocked the prope out from any possible retrial when it also ruled that since the arrest by F.B.I. agents was made without a warrant, the incriminating Justice Department documents found on her cannot be used against her. These papers were the crux of the case.

(Since then a law has been passed ouning the way for the F.E.I. to make arrests without warrants.)

# Hearing Not Held

On June 2, 1951, the United States Court of Appeals in Washington upheld Miss Copien's 1949 conviction theretut said she was entitled to a lower court hearing to determine whether her telephone conversations with her lawyer before and during the Washington trial had been tapped.

If that were the case-and this was conceded at the New York trial-the District of Columbia Appeals Court said the was entitled to a new trial in Maskington. A hearing, suggested by the appellate court, was never held.

Instead, epocsing sides appealed to the United States Supreme Court in an effort to bring order out of considerable chaos. The government went in with two metions, the defense with one, hoping to untangle conflicting Court of Appeals decisions.

So what happened?

On Jan.83, 1952, the Supreme Court refused any review, leaving things completely up in the air. The next menth-on Peb.18, 1952-the defendent had her first child. She was married on May 23, 1950.

Government officials-none of whom wish to be quotedprivately concede that they have a "het petate" and den't know how to handle it. As a result of the Coplen case, they have been trying for years without success to get wire-tapping legislation passed, permitting such activity where explonage is suspected. Even if such a measure went through, many lawyers question whether it could be applied expect facts.

When asked if there is any thought of moving to dismiss the indictments against Miss Copies, the government ensures with a question:

On 5/3/61, BROWNELL telephonically contacted ASAC WINTERROWD and cancelled his appointment but did advise that a friend of his, whom he was reluctant to identify, has a daughter and son-in-law who are tenants of COPIAN at 161 State St., Brooklyn, His friend was highly concerned about tenancy and desirous of knowing whether tenancy has subversive connatations. BROWNELL stated he was not in a position to name the young couple but inquired as to whether tenancy had subversive connotations. He was informed the matter would be checked and he would be contacted on 5/4/61. Investigation previously conducted by the NYO had identified this couple as HENRY E. BOSE and wife and there was no information in the files of the NYO identifiable with BOSE and his wife.

on 5/4/61, ASAC WINTERROWD informed BROWNELL that no connotation of subversiveness could be attributed to his friend's daughter, who was allegedly a tenant of the subject. However, no assurance could be made as to the character of the daughter and son-in-law of his friend since the degree of association with the subject was not known. BROWNELL was advised that this office would be receptive of any information his friends might wish to offer.

On 5/8/61, HENRY BOSE appeared at the NYO and was interviewed by ASAC WINTERROWD. The results of this interview is set forth in the details of the report. BOSE volunteered to bring any matters concerning COPLON that he thought would be of interest to the FBI to the attention of the NYO,

Mr. BOSE asked what course of action he should take regarding to living in the apartment in COPLON's home. He was informed that this was a matter of his personal choice but that his views would be made a matter of record in the files of the FBI. He stated that the call from former Attorney General BROWNELL to the office was prompted by his father-in-law, Mr. HOWARD BUHSE, 1080 Fifth Avenue, NYC. Mr. BUHSE is a partner in Hornblower and Weeks, a well-known stock brokerage firm in NYC. Mr. BOSE said he would like to have the fact that his father-in-law asked him to come to this office also made a matter of record.

BOSE stated he has read the decisions involving the COPLON case and that she was released on procedural technicalities and he felt she was guilty.

ULLRICH that HENRY E. BOSE, 161 State Street, Brooklyn, New York, was attending New York University Law School. She stated BOSE had been attending New York University Law School since February, 1959, to present, including summers. BOSE 1s a graduate of Princeton University, having graduated in June, 1957, with a B.S.K. Degree. Miss DE BIASE further advised that BOSE was born on July 2, 1935, at Jersey City, New Jersey, In February, 1960, he gave as his local address 311 East 72nd Street, New York 21, New York. He had listed his employment as United Cork Companies, Kearney, New Jersey. His father was listed as HENRY H. BOSE, 208 Ridge Road, Rutherford, New Jersey. On June 8, 1961, HENRY EDWARD BOSE appeared at the New York Office of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and advised ASAC E. H. WINTERROWD that he wished to go on record as to his feelings concerning JUDITH COPLON and to advise that he had no sympathy whatsoever for her and her involvement in activity which, in his consideration, was tantamount to treason. ReNYtels 5/3,4/61 concerning telephone call of former AG Herbert Brownell, Jr. It is recalled that at that time an unidentified client of Mr. Brownell was concerned over his daughter and son-in-law occupying an apartment in the building owned by COPLON and her husband. Mr. Brownell was advised at the time that no connotation of subversiveness could be attributed to any tenancy in the COPLON building but that no assurances could be made as to the character of the tenants he had in mind.

Mr. Brownell subsequently identified the tenants as Mr. and Mrs. HENRY BOSE and advised Mr. BOSE would be contacting this office.

On 6/8/61, HENRY EDWARD BOSE, who has leased an apartment from COPION and her husband, appeared at NYO and stated he wished to go on record as to his feelings concerning the COPION woman andto advise that he had no sympathy whatsoever for her and her involvement in activity which, in his consideration, was tantamount to treason. Mr. BOSE is a student at NY University Law School. He advised he had read the decisions involving the COPION case and that she was released only on procedural technicalities. He said he felt she was guilty.

Mr. BOSE said he has never engaged in any conversation with COPLON or her husband concerning the case and that he had never had any discussions with them involving anything having political ramifications. As to association between Mr. Bose and his wife with COPLON and her husband, he said it has been purely a landlord-tenant relationship and there have been infrequent occasions when they have met. As a law student, he has asked some questions of COPLON's husband, ALBERT SOCOLOV concerning points he was interested in as a law student.

Mr. BOSE said they took occupancy of the apartment in December, 1960 and have a 2-year lease. At the time, they rented the premises through a real estate agent, and did not know the owner, Mrs. SOCOLOW was in fact JUDITH COPLON. It was only after the publicity in the Herald Tribune that they learned the identity of COPLON. At no time has either COPLON or her husband ever discussed her case or any publicity concerning her with Mr. BOSE.

Mr. BOSE has observed nothing unusual on the part of the SOCOLOWS. He volunteered to bring any matters that he thought would be of interest to the FBI to the attention of the NYO.

Mr. BOSE asked what course of action he should take. He was informed that this was a matter of his personal choice but that his views would be made a matter of record in the files of the FBI. He stated that the call from former AG Brownell to this office was prompted by his father-in-law, Mr. HOWARD BUHSE, 1080 Fifth Avenue, NYC. Mr. BUHSE is a partner in Hornblower and Weeks, a well-known stock brokerage firm in NYC. Mr. Bose said he would like to have the fact that his father-in-law asked him to come to this office also made a matter of record.





Judith Coplon Socolov resides at 161 State Street, Brooklyn, New York, and is a housewife with several children. She is married to Albert H. Socolov, an attorney.

She was born May 17, 1921, in Brooklyn, and is described as five feet one inch, dark brown hair, medium complexion, Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) Number 157539A.

Judith Coplon Socolov was convicted in Washington, D.C., on June 30, 1949, of stealing classified Justice Department documents, and in New York, on March 7, 1950, together with Valentine A. Gubitchev, a Soviet national, for violation of the espionage statutes. On December 5, 1950, the Circuit Court of Appeals in New York set aside her conviction in New York although noting her "guilt is plain". The Circuit Court of Appeals in Washington, D.C., on June 2, 1951, upheld her conviction there but held she was entitled to a lower court hearing regarding allegations of wiretaps. On January 28, 1952, the Supreme Court refused to review. She is presently free on bond.

Judith Coplon Socolov was employed as a Political Analyst in the Foreign Agents Registration Section of the Department of Justice, Washington, D.C., at the time of her arrest on March 4, 1949.

ALEXANDER SVENCHANSKY asked NEEDLEMAN what the status of the LEONID TANKEL case was. NEEDLEMAN said that TANKEL had been convicted and that a motion for a new trial would undoubtedly be denied. TANKEL planned to go before the judge who had sentenced him and apply for a reduction of sentence, from four months in jail to a suspended sentence. NEEDLEMAN told SVENCHANSKY that TANKEL wanted affidavits to establish that even after he had been instructed by the Soviets to cease doing business, there had been negotiations with Amtorg officials, which indicated that the Russians were still willing to work semething out. NEEDLEMAN said he had been asked for such an affidavit and would probably would give it to him. He thought TANKEL would very likely ask SVENCHANSKY for one.

O'DWYER had pointed out that the newspapers would have played up the affair with such headlines as "Attorney Spy Seeks Vindication". SIMPSON agreed that NEEDLEMAN would have gotten nowhere.

Reference is made to Washington Field teletype to New Haven dated 11/17/47 in the case entitled "ARTHUR ROBERT ROSENBAUM, W.A.A., L.G.E." requesting the New Haven office to interview a Krs. MARTIN RAFF, formerly Miss MARIAN GONE, of 559 Grange Street, New Haven, who had once been a member of the State Department branch, Local #3, U.P.W.A. Mrs. RAFF was interviewed at that time and gave information about ROSENBAUM, a MARCHILE DIANE ELINSON, and a group of U.P.W.A. members in Washington, D.C. who followed the Communist Party line, which Mrs. RAFF claimed she had opposed.

This information was forwarded to the Washington Field by letter dated April 20, 1946 entitled "STATE DEPARTMENT BRANCH, LOCAL #3, U.P.W.A.; Mrs. MORTON HAFF, Informant, SECURITY MATTER - C". This information was also set out in detail with respect to ROSENBAUM and ELINSON in the report of SA FRANK V. BATTLE dated 11/21/47 at New Haven in the case entitled "ARTHUE ROBERT ROSENBAUM, W.A.A., Washington, D. C., L.G.E.", a copy of which was forwarded to the Washington Field Office.

It is noted that in supplying information about the above individuals Mrs. MORTON RAFF furnished some background information relating to herself. Since the files of the New Haven Office contain no further information about Mrs. MORTON RAFF and the Bureau and Washington Field have this information in detail, no further action is contemplated by this office. In connection with the instant investigation which grow out of Gubitchev's meeting with Judith Coplon in New York City on the evening of January 14, 1949, a peview of the Bureau's files has been conducted and failed to reflect any information in addition to that set forth in the teletype of the New York Office dated January 15, 1949.

The meeting with Coplon would appear to indicate that Cubitchev is an agent of the N.G.B. and that he very likely maintains contacts with other individuals engaged in like activities in the United States. The New York Office should, therefore, through the technical surveillance on his residence and the services of at his business address, carefully follow his activities. This coverage should be supplemented in so fer as feasible by discreet spot surveillances. Every effort should be made to determine the extent of Cubitchev's operations in Soviet Intelligence and to determine his contacts in the United States. The Sureau should be kept fully advised of all developments in this matter.

In an effort to determine if Coplon is presently delivering documents to her Soviet Intelligence superiors, the Bureau has prepared a short summary memorandum on the Amtorg Trading Corporation on which there was placed a memorandum of transmittal to the Department in which it was stated that the Bureau is presently using as informants on a confidential basis, two highly placed officials of the Amtorg Trading Corporation. This memorandum which has been prepared from a Foreign Agents Registration angle will reach Judith Coplon's hands and it is contemplated that she will either attempt to transmit the documents for copying purposes to her contacts or in the alternative will orally pass the information concerning the two Amtorg officials. This information, is as you know, false, and has been prepared for deceptive purposes.

The Washington Field office, as previously advised, should be alert for the transmittal of any documents by Coplon.

The New York office should report any information which might be developed to the effect that an investigation of officials at Amtorg is undertaken by Soviet Intelligence. This might be indicated by numerous transfers of Amtorg officials, the calling of Amtorg officials to the Soviet United Nations Headquarters or in their being called to the Soviet Embassy in Washington, D. C.

In connection with the recent contacts between Judith Coplon and Helen Siegel in New York City, the personnel file of Helen Siegel was obtained from the Department of Justice and reflects the following information:

Helen Siegel was born September 19, 1922 in the Bronx, New York City. Her father's name is Louis, who was also born in New York City, and her mother's maiden name was Storch and she was born in New York City. In her application, dated June 28, 1943, Helen Siegel listed an uncle, Dr. H. H. Storch, who was the head of the Physicist's Laboratory, Bureau of Mines at Pittsburgh. Helen Siegel listed the following education: PS 73, 164 Anderson Avenue, New York City - 1928 - 1935; Walton High School, 1935 -1939; Hunter College, 695 Park Avenue, 1939 - 1942; Barnard College, 1942 - 1943. The application indicates that Miss Siegel obtained an AB degree at Barnard College. She listed her foreign language abilities as reading French and German and speaking French. She applied for the position of Research Assistant and entered on duty July 12, 1943. She indicated that she had previously taken a Civil Service examination for Junior Professional Assistant in July, 1943.

A memorandum in the file dated July 22, 1943 signed by Mr. Hugh B. Cox recommended her for a position in the Economic Warfare Section in New York City. An efficiency rating dated March 31, 1944 at New York City was made by Robert Wohlforth and rated Miss Siegel as "Very Good." She submitted her resignation on June 27, 1944 to take effect June 30, 1944. This resignation is actually noted in the Departmental files as taking effect on July 14, 1944. There was no reason noted for the resignation.

There are attached for possible assistance in further investigation of this girl in connection with this case three photographs obtained from her application for employment with the Department of Justice, for both the New York and Washington Field Offices.

In line with previous instructions issued by the Bureau, every attempt should be made to determine if this woman might be identical with the unknown subject Zora, concerning whom you have previously been furnished information.

Information has been received from a departmental official that Miss Thomas, Secretary to Mr. Peyton Ford, has voiced a suspicion of Judith Coplon and also of one Ulda Eldred who presently is the Secretary to Mr. Foley in the Foreign Agents Registration Section.

Miss Thomas stated that Eldred was a very close friend of one Rose Fox, formerly in Foreign Agents Registration Section, who is now deceased. This is Rose Fox whose sister, Ida Fox, was very active in picketing the National Theater in Washington, D. C. According to Miss Thomas, after Rose Fox's death, Judith Coplon attempted to take up a collection within the Foreign Agents Registration Section for flowers. Miss Thomas has stated that Ronald MacDonald, who is now in the Solicitor General's office and Mrs. Irma Kalnan, who is presently employed as a translator at the Bureau, might have additional information concerning Miss Coplon.

Mrs. Irma Kalnan was interviewed on February 1, 1948, at which time she advised that she had been employed as a political analyst and translator in the Foreign Agents Registration Section from October 12, 1942 until February 1, 1946. At that time the Foreign Agents Registration Section was in the Hutchins Building. She stated that while she did not know Judith Coplon well, she has a feeling that Miss Coplon is Communistically inclined, although she has no specific information on which to base this suspicion. She recalled that Judith Coplon had been friendly with Louis Nemzer and Bernard Morris. Mrs. Kalnan is also suspicious of these two individuals. She recalled that on one occasion in discussing with Nemzer the Mikhailovich - Tito issue, Nemzer expressed himself in favor of Tito and said, "We can only support those who are fighting on our side", indicating to Mrs. Kalnan that he thought Mikhailovich was a traitor. According to Mrs. Kalnan, Nemzer is now employed at some university which she believes is in Ohio.

Mrs. Kalnan also said that Judith Coplon was not well liked by a number of those employed in the Foreign Agents Registration Section as she was known as "a girl with a pull". Mrs. Kalnan mentioned that she had seen Coplon on the street several months ago, at which time Judith Coplon asked Mrs. Kalnan about her trip to Czechoslovakia and also commented that she, herself, had made a trip to France

in the summer of 1948. Mrs. Kalnan was also acquainted with Adele Miller and has heard her criticize Judith Coplon but she did not have any knowledge of any dispute between the two women. She felt that Adele Miller's nervous breakdown was perhaps caused by her being too religious.

You should make immediate arrangements to thoroughly interview Miss Thomas who is employed in Mr. Peyton Ford's office and following such interview, contact Ronald MacDonald for any information he may have. These interviews, of course, should be conducted in such a manner as to insure that our investigation of this woman is maintained on a discreet basis.



JUDITH COPLON ESPIONAGE - R STRICTLY CONCIDENTIAL (U)

On February 9, 1949, a surveillance was conducted on the subject by Special Agents ROBERT E. LEONARD and ROBERT L. SHELTZER, and the following activity noted.

At 12:25 P. II., she left the Department of Justice Building and proceeded to Ceres Restaurant, 1307 - E Street, N. V., where she net a man whose description will be set forth later. The meeting appeared to be pursuant to an appointment. They left the restaurant after dining, at approximately 1:20 P. II., and proceeded to the front of Garfinckel's Department Store on the F Street side, between 11th and 15th Streets, N. W., where they conversed and walked aimlessly around.

Shortly thereafter, subject entered the department store alone and the man boarded a "Riverside Stadium" bus and proceeded to Annex 1, State Department, at 23rd and E Streets, N. W., where he entered room 412, the door of which bore the lettering, "Division of Passports and Communications". Subject was not observed to pass any document or article to the man within the observation of the surveilling agents.

The subject stated that she would not be in New York before 5:00 P. M. She first suggested that PAULINE call her at home, GE 8-1048, but then said "I've just been thinking it over, I don't think I want my mother to know that I'll be in and not go right home". During the conversation, PAULINE said, "Listen, you know I have that book for you - I've had it ever since". COPLON replied, "That's okay, I have the thing for your. No definite arrangements between COPLON and SLAVIN were arrived at and it was agreed that if COPLON did not hear from SIAVIN by mail. the former will know that SLAVIN just couldn't arrange anything for that Friday. COPLON also mentioned that she intended seeing her "two married friends in Flushing" on Saturday, February 19. 1949.

Informant further advised that subject informed LORPAINE SINDER-BRAND that she was going to New York on February 18th. SINDER-BRAND then told COPLON that her sister SOPHIE PEARLBERG, nee ELKINS, in New York wants to introduce COPLON to a young man. LORRAINE described this man as a French Jew, short and rather bald, whose father is a multi-millionaire in the steel industry in Paris, France. The man's name was given as LUZAR (phonetic) and COPLON stated that she would plan on seeing LUZAR on Sunday night, February 20th. LORRAINE then said that LUZAR had a sister who married an American and is living in Pittsburgh. She said that LUZAR was planning to visit her and that it might be on the weekend of the 18th. According to LORRAINE, LUZAR is engaged in the junk business in the United States. Mrs. SOPHIE PEARLBERG is believed to be the wife of EVERETT PEARLBERG.

RedFotel dated February 15, 1949 to the Eureau and New York Office requesting New York to interview Nr. W. VAN ALLEN and Mass JEAN VALIGHT, employees of the New York Office of the Expertment of Justice.

At moon today, ir. MINOY McCAULEY, Special Assistant to the Attorney General and Administrative Officer of the Anti-Trust Division, Department of Justice, adviced the writer that he had just received a letter dated February 15, 1949, from Mr. W. VAN ALLEN, formerly in charge of the personnel in the Anti-Trust Division, U. S. Department of Justice, 30 Broad Street, New York City, in which after mentioning a previous telephone conversation with Ir. Hedauley, he stated that Jani Walleki had recently become friendly with the left-wing group in the New York Office. In this letter, VAN ALLEN expressed the opinion that "anyone who hires a gang of commice and party followers must have similar leanings himself. An examination of the personnel which stacked at least 50% of the New York Office of the War Division will emphasize this point". It is believed that Mr. WAN ALLEN is referring to RAMBET WENLFORTH as having hired these individuals.

VAN ALE: also advised of having been interviewed in 1946 by an PBI agent concerning JUDITH COPLON. He expressed concern over the fact that Miss WALICKI had referred the agent to him rather than to RIDITH UNHERCHA and expressed the possibility that WENDFORTH and WALICKI had arranged it that way in order for WENDFORTH to learn through his washington contacts what he, WIN ALEN, had to say about JUDITH COPLON.

In. McCAULEY explained that in his telephone conversation with WAN ALLEN, various employees of the New York Office of the Department of Justice were discussed and that JUNITA COPLON's name was mentioned. He McCAULEY questioned WAN ALLEN as to whether he would be willing to furnish information to a Special Agent of the FBI concerning any of these individuals. He replied that he would be glad to furnish any information that he could. In this connection, however, WAN ALLEN requested that if an FBI agent interviewed him he, the agent, first mention I'r. Nechulet's name to him.

It was ascertained that the New York Office had not as yet conducted interviews with VAH ALLEH and WALTCHI and that office was telephonically advised not to conduct such interviews unless further instructions were received.

Unless advised to the contrary, it is desired that Hr. W. WHI ALLEN be interviewed at his residence, 1403-09 Holly Avenue, Flushing, Long Island, as he has advised Mr. Hechully that if an FRI agent interviewed him at his office it would be detrimental to his position among his follow employees. The load to interview Miss JUNI WALICHI should be disregarded and she should not be interviewed.

At 11:00 A. M. today, in the absence of Mr. BELMONT, I telephonically advised Mr. GRANVILLE of the New York Division that COPLON plans to leave Washington, D. C. at either 1:00 or 2:00 P. M. today for NYC. I advised him generally of the contents of Bureau letter dated February 16, 1949, concerning the type of activity desired in this connection and informed him it was my understanding that Mr. FLETCHER of the Bureau would discuss this matter with Mr. BELMONT further. I advised him that the subject has mentioned that she is going to visit some "married friends" in Flushing on February 19, 1949, and that she recently mailed a photograph album which she purchased in Washington to KATHERINE LESSER, at 144-35 - 76th Avenue, Flushing.

With regard to the teletypes from NYC dated February 17, 1949, referring to WFO letter of February 14, 1949, referring to conversation between COPLON and SLAVIN, I advised him we had received no further information concerning this contact and with regard to the handling of this matter in New York, suggested to him that if a contact is made under suspicious circumstances that New York make efforts to ascertain through a highly confidential source what is passed to SLAVIN.

I further advised Mr. GRANVILLE that subject has had her hair cut short and it now comes just below the ears. I advised him the subject will be accompanied to New York by Agents CARL W. BUCHHOLZ and THOMAS A. MENDENHALL, and furnished him the description of these two agents together with an agent in the New York Office who knows MENDENHALL.

At 2:30 P. M. today, I advised Supervisor KENNEDY, in Mr. GRANVILLE's absence, that the subject, alone, had left on Pennsylvania train #142, at 2:00 P. M. in Coach 1633, and will arrive in NYC at 6:00 P. M. I advised him she is wearing a full length black cloth coat, black high heeled shoes with ankle straps, no had, carrying a black purse of kid leather with gold trim, wearing a blue crepe dress, and carrying a brown airplane type overnight bag which she has previously carried when surveilled by New York.

In view of the fact that Judith Coplon's present position gives her access to numerous FBI reports of a confidential nature as well as access to other restricted material, it will be necessary to bring this case to a conclusion at an early date. It is contemplated that following her trip to New York City on February 18, 1949, for the week end, consideration will be given to interviewing her at an early date. While such an interview will be aimed at gaining her cooperation in acting as a double agent, there is, of course, a strong likelihood that the interview will not be successful in this and that the espionage activities of Coplon and Gubitchev will cease. The activities of other persons active in the network, not known to us, will also probably cease at least temporarily. In order that we may be in as good a position as possible at the time of the interview, it is imperative that all possible investigative leads be completed by the date of interview. This means that our investigative coverage of the following leads must be expedited:

- 1. We must determine, in so far as is possible, the extent and nature of the espionage activities being engaged in by Valentine A. Gubitchev. This necessitates that his activities from now until the interview of Coplon should be given full coverage through technical and spot physical surveillances.
- 2. On February 18, 1949, both Coplon and Gubitchev should be under physical surveillances in order that we may have coverage of any meeting which takes place between the two persons. The physical surveillances should be extremely discreet in nature and it may be necessary to drop the surveillances for security reasons following the meeting.
- 3. We should determine additional background information concerning Seymour Nagan and check his activities by spot surveillances to determine if he is the espionage contact between Coplon and her Soviet principles.
- 4. We should determine background information concerning other contacts of Coplon in an effort to determine which of her contacts and associates may also be engaged in Soviet espionage activities.
- 5. We should determine the nature of the present activities being engaged in by Marion Davis who has been tentatively identified as the Marion Davis who was employed by the Coordinator of Inter-American Affairs. The investigation of her in New York City should be expedited.

6. We should continue to make every effort to identify the unknown subject Zora who recruited Coplon as a Soviet agent.

In addition to the foregoing, it is contemplated that if the interview with Coplon, when conducted, is unsuccessful in developing her as a double agent, the various contacts and associates of Coplon will be interviewed in an effort to determine the nature of their association with her. You should keep the Bureau fully advised of all developments in this matter as they occur.



Rebulet February 2, 1949, requesting the Washington Field Office to interview Miss THOMAS, secretary to Mr. PEYTON FORD and Mr. ROHALD MacDONALD, Solicitor Generals Office.

Hiss THOMAS, upon interview, could furnish no information concerning COPLON additional to that set out in referenced Bureau letter. She stated that inasmuch as she had left the Foreign Agents Registration Section in March, 1946, she had not had an opportunity to learn much about the subject. She stated that a Mrs. IREME LONGLEY had replaced her in this section and she thought that the latter could furnish more information concerning COPLON. It is therefore requested that the Bureau authorize the Mashington Field Office to interview Mrs. LONGLEY.

Mr. ROHALD MacDONALD advised that he had been in the Polish Section of the Foreign Agents Registration Section from May, 1942 until January, 1946. He stated that although he had been acquainted with COPION, he could furnish no information concerning her activities other than that she was, during 1945, taking courses in photography and Russian at American University. He further advised that he was aware of the fact that she had taken a pleasure trip to Europe in 1948, having flown to Paris and from there traveled to Italy, apparently on some sort of a tour. He stated that he had never heard any rumors of disloyalty or questionable activities on the part of the subject and stated that he was not in a position to have known much about the subject, having never supervised her work.

Confidential Informants and of this office have advised that the subject, SARA BECKER, presently employed by the American National Red Cross, Washington, D. C., and BERNARD S. MORRIS, employed in the International Functional Intelligence Division, Department of State, have been in contact with each other concerning an application which all three wish to file with the Civil Service Cormission for positions with the Central Intelligence Agency.

Informant advised that in a conversation with MORRIS, the subject discussed the advisability of disclosing confidential information on an application form, and stated that she didn't want anyone in her office to see this application. She then stated that the only person that she would really want to go to would be "R. P. W.". It is noted that the informant may have misunderstood the middle initial and it is possible that COPION was referring to ROBERT MARTIN WOHLFORTH. However, the possibility also exists that she was referring to a different individual. (RAY P. whearty of the Department)

According to this informant, on March 2, 1949, COPLON was contacted by a female (BECKER?) who inquired about filling cut an application blank and who was wondering how to reply to several questions as to past work experiences. COPLON advised this individual that she was going to New York over the weekend and would call her upon her return.

Later in the day, informant advised that BERNARD MORRIS of the State Department advised COPLON, "I have given that thing to a guy to look over and he was glad to look it over". He further stated that he was waiting to get it back and that he would bring it over Friday, to which COPLON replied that she was leaving at 1:00 P. M. Friday for New York and returning early Sunday. MORRIS then said that if this "guy" drafted it he could type it in. COPLON then informed him that it had to be in the 15th.

Today, informant advised that COPION indicated that she wished to leave Washington at 1:00 P. M. because she desired to get to New York early as she wanted "to pick up something downtown", explaining that downtown meant around h2nd Street.

It therefore appears likely that the subject intends seeing WOHLFORTH in connection with those applications while in New York over this weekend.



As previously recorded in surveillance log of January 13, 1949, JUDY COPLON was observed, by SA JOHN O. CAVADINE and the writer, to meet an unknown man at the corner of 14th and G Sts., N. W., in front of the Pennsylvania Railroad Ticket Office at approximately 12:50 PM, January 13, 1949. This unknown individual was described as 6' 1" in height; weight 170 lbs; age 25-30; hairbrown (cut short); wearing light brown suit, brown shoes, brown and checked tie, and eyeglasses.

Referenced surveillance log notes that COPLON and the above individual talked approximately one minute; that thereafter, the man walked across the street to the Hamilton National Bank, 619 14th St., N. W.

The log further records that after the unknown individual left the above bank, SA CAVADINE contacted teller W. L. ANDERSON, who exhibited a check deposited by the unknown man. This check, numbered 30490, dated January 7, 1949, was drawn on the Fifth Avenue Office of the Guaranty Trust Company, Fifth Avenue and 49th St., New York City, payable to SEYMOUR NAGAN and issued by the "New Republic", 40 East 49th St., New York City.

On February 25, 1949, SA HOLLIS BOWERS and the writer, through cooperation of JOE BUSCHER, brother of SA LAWRENCE E. BUSCHER, ascertained that the name of SEYMOUR P. NAGAN, was on the door of Room'll80, within a suite of rooms rented by McGraw Hill Publishing Company, National Press Building, 14 and F Sts., N. W. JOE BUSCHER is Service Manager of the above building.

Through a spot check of Room 1180, at the above location, the writer recognized an individual therein as identical with SEYMOUR NAGAN, as described in the surveillance log of January 13, 1949.

It was noted that the names of SEYMOUR P. NAGAN and DONALD LOCMIS appear on the door of Room 1180 at the above location. Further observation of NAGAN noted that he is of medium build, olive complexion, wears horned rimmed glasses, has dark brown hair (parted on right side). He was occupying the front desk in Room-hist when observed.

Another man, probably DONALD LOOMIS, occupied a desk behind NAGAN. The above office, approximately 12 x 18 feet, has a third desk against the wall away from the door.

Following the above, BOWERS and the writer, made attempts to identify NAGAN's car in the vicinity of the National Press Building and NAGAN's residence, 2000 F St., N. W., with negative results.

On February 28, 1949, a surveillance maintained by SA BOWERS and the writer at the National Press, from 8:45 AM to 11:05 AM, failed to note NAGAN entering the building. Spot checks of NAGAN's office throughout this period, failed to locate NAGAN.

On March 1, 1949, after two periodic spot checks of NAGAN's office, NAGAN was observed by the writer to be at his desk in Room 1180, National Press Building at approximately 3:55 PM.



SUBJECT: JUDITH COPLON ESPIONAGE - R

At 11:25 March 4, 1949, Mr. FLETCHER instructed the writer to detail two agents immediately to cover the room of COPION so as to make certain that no one gained entry thereto. Agents TIERNEY and BUCHHOLZ were immediately instructed to cover this assignment and to remain in such position as to keep this room within sight until they were relieved and to see to it that no one gained entrance to it.

Agents CRAIG and FUOSS were immediately advised by the writer to relieve TIERNEY and BUCHHOLZ on this assignment at 8:30 A. M., March 5, 1949 and to follow the same instructions as previously pointed out.

Special Agent OBERNDORF was instructed to report to this office at 9:00 A. M. for purpose of supervising and handling the anticipated search of COPLON's room.

At 11:30 P. M. on March 4, 1949, Agent JONES telephonically furnished Agent FIRDERKO at the Russian Plant the salient details in this case with instructions to immediately advise the writer if any pertinent telephone calls were received with regard to the arrest of GUBITCHEV.

In accordance with my instructions, JONES furnished the identical information to Special Agents LaFRANCE and MINNO, LaFRANCE being scheduled to assume duty at 12 Midnight and MINNO at 8:00 A. M.

At 11:50 P. M., Fr. FLETCHER instructed the writer to obtain specimens from all typewriters in the Foreign Agent's Registration Section of the Department and this assignment was given by the writer to Special Agent JONES to handle the first thin in the A. M. of March 5, 1949.

At approximately 12 Midnight, March 4, 1949, Mr. FLETCHER instructed the writer to be available in the office the morning of March 5 and to have agent personnel available for the purpose of conducting a search of COPLON's room. He instructed this search not be conducted until Bureau instructions to do so were received, dependent on whether a waiver of search could be obtained from COPLON or a search warrant secured.

At 6:00 A. M. On March 5, 1949, Agent MILNES, on duty in Mr. FLETCHER's office, stated that FLETCHER desired the writer to telephonically contact Mr. FAY, USA, at 8:00 A. M., and arrange to secure a search warrant for COPLON's room. In response to my question, MILNES stated that no additional authority from the Bureau would need to be requested to conduct the search after the warrant had been obtained.

In response to my request to whether the Bureau and/or the Department had decided as to the material and wording to be included in the affidavits and warrant, he advised that this apparently had not been specifically decided on but stated the affidavits should be based on the documents COPLON had in her purse at the time of her arrest and on information and belief for the purpose of securing the typewriter used by her in preparing the abstracts found in her possession. He stated that we should be certain in obtaining the affidavits not to indicate in any way any illegal action which may have been participated in during this investigation. He advised that complaints had already been filed in NewYork City against COPLON and GUBITCHEV.

At 8:00 A. M. I telephonically contacted Mr. FAY at his home. He stated he had been contacted earlier that morning by Mr. FORD, of the Department, and had received Mr. FORD's instructions to assist in any way possible in the preparation of the search warrant. At that time Mr. FAY suggested that the affidavit for the search warrant state that on information it was known that COPLON, on her arrest, had been found to possess 34 abstracts of reports on security matter and espionage cases and that end information and belief she was believed to be in the possession of, to own or to operate a typewriter used to produce these abstracts. He stated that the prayer should be broad enough to cover any other material found at COPLON's home which might assist in this case. He advised that he would be available for the purpose of consultation in the event he was needed.

Through arrangement with U. S. Commissioner LAWRENCE, the writer, accompanied by Agents MENDENHALL and PAYNE appeared in his office at 9:00 A. M., on March 5, 1949. Shortly after our arrival, the writer was advised that Assistant United States Attorney CHARLES MURRAY was being designated by Mr. FAY to assist in the preparation of the search warrant.

At 9:45 A. M., Agent MILNES furnished me the message that Assistant Director NICHOIS had specifically instructed that the agents on duty in the COPION room be warned against furnishing any information or comments to the press. Since they were not telephonically available, I instructed Agent PAYNE to contact MARY JANE CRETZMEYER, a Bureau employee who resides at Jefferson Hall, to contact the agents for this purpose.

At approximately 10:15 A. M., AUSA MURRAY appeared at Mr. LAWRENCE's office and in a preliminary discussion with Mr. LAWRENCE it was felt by Mr. MURRAY that more adequate consideration should be given this matter before the preparation of the search warrant. Mr. MURRAY, the writer and Agents MENDENHALL and PAYNE then went to Mr. FAY's office where Mr. MURRAY, after checking the law on the subject, began the preliminary preparation of the search warrant. At approximately 11:00 A. M., Mr. MURRAY was joined by USA FAY and thereafter, an affidavit was prepared for the writer and Agent PAYNE. Upon their completion and before going to the U. S. Commissioner's Office, the writer telephonically contacted Mr. LADD and read the affidavits to him and Mr. NICHOLS. Mr. LADD instructed that these affidavits not be filed in that they furnished objectionable details in the case. He instructed me to tell FAY to call. Assistant Attorney General FORD and that no affidavits were to be filed without his, LADD's approval.

During the discussion with Mr. FAY and Mr. MURRAY, it was pointed out by them that a legal search warrant cannot be obtained purely on information and belief. They stated it is necessary that the warrant be supported by actual knowledge and in support of this Mr. MURRAY cited the case of SCHENKS vs. U. S., 2 Fed. Second 185, 55 Appeals, D. C. 84.

Thereafter, as the result of several telephone calls with Mr. FORD, of the Department, the attached affidavit of Special Agent PAYNE was prepared.

Based on the decision of Mr. FAY and MURRAY, after their telephone conference with Mr. FORD, the writer telephonically informed Mr. LADD that the only affidavit involving Bureau personnel to be submitted was the attached affidavit of PAYNE, which I then proceeded to read to him. Mr. LADD indicated that this was considerably more within the desires of the Bureau in this matter. I then informed him that we had

located a colored maid employed at McLean Gardens who could testify that within a recent period while cleaning COPION's room she had observed a typewriter. I advised him that with Mr. FAY's approval she was being brought to the Commissioner's office and an affidavit to that effect would be secured from her and he approved of this procedure.

I also advised Mr. LADD that the USC, MURRAY, FAY and FORD had agreed that rather than have a New York Agent come to Washington that it would be agreeable and legal to have Agent PAYNE talk to Agent T. SCOTT MILLER, JR., of the New York Office (whom WHITSON, of the Bureau, had in the meantime identified to the writer telephonically as the New York Agent who had removed from the purse of COPLON the 34 abstracts) identify MILLER as a Bureau agent through voice recognition, so state to the Commissioner, who would then accept an oral statement for the purpose of the search warrant. Mr. LADD agreed to this also with the qualification that MILLER would testify only that he removed these documents from COPLON's purse. Mr. LADD instructed that he be advised immediately as to exactly what was stated by MILLER. diately furnished these instructions to ASAC BELMONT and Agent MILLER, of the New York Office and requested BELMONT to advise Mr. LADD as to what was said by MILLER since it was impossible for me to cover the call at the Commissioner's office. I asked BEIMONT to tell Mr. LADD that if he disagreed with any statement made by MILLER, to contact me immediately in the Commissioner's office so that I could take appropriate action.

Thereafter, as hereinbefore indicated, MILLER spoke to the Commissioner and furnished his affidavit. No contact was made of the writer by Mr. LADD.

During the hearing, GERALDINE DeVAUGHN, the colored employee at McLean Gardens, appeared before the Commissioner and furnished the attached affidavit.

Thereafter an affidavit for search warrant, supported by the affidavits of PAYNE, MILLER and DeVAUGHN, was prepared and a search warrant was issued by the Commissioner directed to Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and based on reason to believe that COPION has concealed in her room certain property, namely, "typewriter,

typewriting paper, carbon paper, erasers, documents and files belonging to the U. S. Department of Justice relating to the National Defense, which are the instrumentalities and fruits of violations of Title 18, Sections 371, 793, 794 and 2071, U. S. Code."

The writer then telephonically contacted Mr. LADD and advised him of the contents of the affidavit for search warrant and the search warrant, copies of which are attached to this memo.

At the same time I advised Mr. LADD that it was the very definite opinion of Mr. MURRAY that because of the deletion of the material considered objectionable in the previous affidavits by the Bureau and by Mr. FORD, that to remain within the legal limits of the search warrant. we would be enabled only to seize a typewriter if found in COPLON's room. When Mr. LADD asked for an explanation of this, I advised him that it was Mr. MURRAY's opinion and also the opinion of the Commissioner that the search warrant would authorize the seizure of only that material identified in the search warrant and since the affidavits were so restricted, they could of necessity apply only to the typewriter. further advised Mr. LADD that Mr. MURRAY and the Commissioner were both very dubious about the legality of extending the search beyond that necessary to locate the typewriter and that Mr. MURRAY had suggested that if in addition to the typewriter, other material was observed during the search which appeared pertinent that it not be seized but that consideration be given to the issuance of an additional search warrant on the theory that the original search warrant provided an original legal search in the execution of which evidence not specified in the search warrant was observed. I explained to Mr. LADD that MURRAY was of the opinion that even with this, it was rather questionable from a legal standpoint as to the extent to which such an exploratory search could be extended.

I told Mr. IADD I therefore, had instructed agents to institute search to seize the typewriter and no other material and that if any other material were observed, it would be taken up with the Bureau and the USA. He agreed to the procedure.

On March 5, 1949 the writer received the following information from and supplied it immediately to Mr. Whitson on the times indicated:

- 10:00 AM LEV S. TOLOKONNIKOV, Chief of the Soviet Consulate Division, made reservations to NYC, leaving Washington by airline at 11:05 AM, and arriving NYC 12:45 PM.
- 10:16 AM LEONID A. MOROZOV, 1st. Secretary of the Russian Delegation to UN, called IVAN IPPOLITOV, Secretary to the Russiam Ambassador to advise the Amb. of the arrest of a Soviet citizen. MOrozov said that V.A.GUBITCHEV had called him at 6:00 AM to tell himqof the arrest. Morozov said that Gubitchev had been arrested on the street last night, and had not been permitted to call his superiors until this morning. Morozov said that he went to the F.B.I. at 7:45 AM this date to see Gubitchev, but that they would not allow him to see Gubitchev, that they insisted on certain formalities, and that they said they didn't understand Russian. Ippolitov said he would tell the Amb. Ippolitor called Morozov back at once and wanted to know Gubitehev's exact position - Morozov said it was Third Secretary, and he was an Engineer in the planning of the new building. Morozov could not say where Gubitchev was being held, but promised to have the exact address by the time Tolokonnikov reached NY.
- 11:37 AM RUFINA B. SOLDATOVA advised Ippolitor that Gubitchev was an Officer, Grade 13, Degree 3. She stated that Morozov has not been able to see Gubitchev as yet.
- 12:05 PM Ippolitov called Mr. James Webb, Under Secretary of State, and requested an immediate appointment for Amb. Panyushkin.
- 12:10 PM Hamelsine, in Webb's office at State Dept., said Webb would see Panyushkin at 1:00 PM.
- 12:16 PM Ippolitov told Boris K. Sokolov that he would to with the Amb. to the State Dept.
- 12: 16 PM A. G. Artamonov, of the Cultural Section of the Embassy, told Alexandrov, of Tass, NYC, to collect all information about the Gubitchev case.
- 1:07 PM Soldatova told Ippolitov that Y. A. Malik, head of the Russian Delegation to UN had protested to Warren Austin, head of the U.S. Delegation regarding the arrest of Gubitchev, and Austin said he had no authority in the matter, but would take it up with the State Dept. She also said that Soldatov had just gone to see the Assn't to the Secretary General Aof the Jan.
- 2:05 PM Ippolitov told Soldatova that the Soviet Amb. has just protested to the State Dept. and had demanded the immediate release of G to pass this on to Malik.

M., March 5, 1949, Special Agent OBERNDORF advised me that the search at COPLON's room had been completed and that the only material found was a Corona portable typewriter, a box of carbon paper and some cheap stationery which did not appear to have a watermark but which appeared to be typewriter stationery. I instructed him to maintain the surveillance and to wait for a call from me.

I immediately communicated this information to Supervisor WHITSON at the Bureau and received his instructions that all of this material should be seized provided this met with the approval of AUSA MURRAY.

The writer was then advised by Agent OBERNDORF that an examination of the 1948 diary in COPLON's room contained the following entry for Friday, December 10:

"1. PETUKIN

2. BARNARD"

I telephonically contacted AUSA MURRAY and with regard to the typewriter, carbon paper and stationery, he instructed that this material be seized on the basis of the existing search warrant. With regard to the diary entry, he stated he felt this would not be covered by the existing search warrant and that if the Bureau desired to obtain this as evidence, he would recommend the obtaining of an additional search warrant. However, he did point out that a cryptic entry such as this, not supported by other notation, in an actual trial would probably not be of too great importance since undoubtedly, if it became of such importance it would be supported by stronger information pointing to COPION.

At 5:50 P. M., I communicated this information to WHITSON with the advice that the name PETUKIN is negative in our indices and means nothing to us so far as the COPLON case is concerned. WHITSON stated he desired to consider this matterfurther and also to check the Bureau indices and would advise the writer later.

At 6:30 P. M., Supervisor GODFREY advised he was calling for WHITSON and stated the Bureau files contained only one reference which did not appear to pertain to PETUKIN. He stated he had discussed this with Mr. LADD who advised if the facts concerning the diary entry con-

stituted the complete circumstances that it did not appear to be of sufficient importance to go any further. I then advised GODFREY we would not request the additional search warrant and asked for Bureau instructions as to whether the surveillance, which has been maintained since Midnight March 4, 1949, should be discontinued. At 6:40 P. M. he advised me that Mr. LADD had approved the discontinuance of this surveillance.

> On March 16, 1949, Inspector FLETCHER advised that he had discussed with Ir. FOLEY of the FARS the possibility of making an analysis of the records of that Section for the purpose of determining those cases on which COPLON had furnished or removed information. He stated that as a result of this, he desired that a detailed analysis be made of the data sheets on file in the FARS in an attempt to determine those instances were copies of the data sheets are missing.

He instructed that the analysis be made by locating the original data sheet and then checking to determine if the copies indicated on the original sheet are on file or missing. He stated it would be necessary to note only those cases where copies are missing and those instances may be ignored in which the original and all copies are accounted for. He pointed out that he felt the present position of the Bureau with respect to this case indefensible in that we are unable to show the obtaining or furnishing of any information by CCPLOH except for a very recent period of time.

I pointed out to Ir. FLETCHER that this identical project had been considered by this office when the original survey of the FARS was ordered by the Bureau and that for the time being we had decided not to attempt to conduct such an analysis because of the tremendous quantity of these data sheets, the lack of system used in filing them, and the feeling on the part of this office that such an analysis, if completed, would not be a conclusive finding that COPLON had removed the missing sheets from the FARS files.

Lr. FLETCHER instructed that it would be necessary to make such an analysis unless the WFO could show to the Dureau that such an examination would be illogical or valueless.





JUDITH COPLON, WAS ESPIONAGE - R

Reference is made to the teletype of the New York Office dated February 25, 1949. The personnel file of the Department of Justice on Shirley Gladys Aronow has been reviewed and reflects the following information.

Miss Aronow filed an application on June 10, 1945 giving her legal residence as 666 West End Avenue, New York City, telephone, Schuyler 4-3272. Her application reflects her father's name as David Aronow who was born in Russia and her mother's maiden name as Rae Kamlet who was born in the United States. Shirley Aronow was appointed on June 16, 1945 as an expert in the Anti-Trust Division at New York City. This appointment was effective on June 17, 1945 at which time she took an oath of office. She was actually employed in the Romomic Warfare Section at a salary of \$2,000 per annum. An efficiency report dated March 31, 1945 was under a rating by Robert Wohlforth.

Miss Aronow was recommended for a transfer from the Economic Warfare Section of the War Division of the Department of Justice on June 7, 1945 to employment in the Anti-Trust Division at \$2,600 per annum. The reason for the transfer, according to a communication in the personnel file, was that the New York Office of the Economic Warfare Section was being closed. The transfer was effective on July 1, 1945. Miss Aronow's position was abolished in a letter to her dated March 14, 1946 because of a reduction in personnel. The date of her termination is given as April 15, 1946.

There is no information in the Eureau's files which can be identified with David Aronow with the possible exception of the reference concerning a David Aronow who was a member of IWO Lodge of December, 1946. There are no references on Dr. Sidney Martin Samis or on Shirley Samis. The only reference on Shirley Gladys Aronow appearing in the Eureau's files is the Departmental applicant investigation.

The personnel file of the Department of Justice relative to Sarah Becker who is a contact of Coplon has been reviewed. This reflects that she was born on April 29, 1911 in Milwaukee Wisconsin. She filed an application on November 5, 1942 in which she listed her father as Abraham Becker, born in Kaunal, Lithuania, and her mother's maiden name as Anna Zak, born in Grenshek, Lithuania. She listed the following relatives in Government service:

Robert Charuseh, cousin, 3359 North Humboldt Avenue, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, United States Mailman

Sarah Becker attended the University of Misconsin from September, 1927 to June, 1934, receiving her PHD in 1955. She was appointed as an expert in the Anti-Trust Division, Department of Justice on Movember 19, 1942 at a salary of \$2400 per annua, payable from the working fund of the Board of Moonomic Marfare. Wer official headquarters at the time of her appointment was given as Chicago but was immediately enamged to Mashington, D. C. The appointment was effective on January 11, 1943. She was transferred to the Moonomic Marfare Section in New York City on September 14, 1945. Her efficiency reports as of March 31, 1944 and March 31, 1945 were under a rating by Moonet Mohlforth. She was transferred to the Anti-Trust Division of the Department of Justice on June 12, 1945 on the grounds that the New York Office of the Recommic Marfare Section was being closed. This transfer was effective on July 1, 1946. She was separated from work in the Anti-Trust Division on April 15, 1946. At that time her address was 4300 Kansas Avenue, N. W., Washington, D. C.

In connection with the above references to Sarah Beeker's two brothers when she terms as blood brothers, it is to be noted that information appearing in her personnel file reflects that her parents were naturalised in the United States in 1906. There is no indication that either of them is deceased or that she has any step-parents. Information has been received from Departmental officials to the effect that the Beonomic Warfare Section of the War Division of the Department of Justice went out of existence as of December 28, 1945. However, it is apparent from the personnel files of the two persons referred to above that the New York Office of the Beenomic Barfare Section closed furing June of 1945. This is also substantiated by the information obtained from Mr. William Van Allen of the Inti-Trust Division in New York City who advised that this section in New York City closed as of June 30, 1945.

At 9:05 A. M. this morning, I advised Mr. LAUGHLIN of the Bureau that Informant reflected that at 12:50 A. M., March 8, 1949, SOLDATOV of the New York United Nations, had tried to reach First Secretary TOLOKONNIKOV of the Consular Division of the Embassy. I reminded LAUGHLIN that TOLOKONNIKOV is the individual who was sent by the Embassy to New York on March 5, 1949 to endeavor to effect the release of GUBICHEV. This call was unsuccessful.

I advised Mr. LAUGHLIN that at 1:00 A. M., TOLOKONNIKOV called SOLDATOV, who said "they called him and said it will be possible at 11:15 A. M." and that SOLDATOV wanted to know whether it would be possible for TOLOKONNIKOV to come to New York, TOLOKONNIKOV stating he would have to consult.

I told Mr. IAUGHLIN that at 1:15 A. M., TOIKONNIKOV called and said he would come and that at 1:20 A. M., a reservation to New York via American Airlines leaving at 7:10 A. M. was made in the name of NAUMENKO. In this regard, I pointed out to Mr. IAUGHLIN that it is routine at the Embassy to make the reservation in the name of an individual different from that of the actual traveler.

I suggested to Mr. LAUGHLIN the possibility that this call had reference to the present incarceration of GUBICHEV.



M. today, I contacted Mr. LAUGHLIN of the Bureau and requested advice from him as to whether in connection with this case it is necessary for me to secure prior approval of the Bureau before requesting and examining Justice personnel files of fellow and former employees, friends, associates, etc. of JUDITH COPLON who have worked in the Justice Department.

After checking with Mr. LADD, Mr. LAUGHLIN advised me that such approval would not be necessary but stated that Mr. LADD had suggested that these requests be made of Mr. CLYDE PAINER of the Department.

On March 8, 1949, Mr. WHITSON of the Bureau called with reference to STEPHEN W. MANCHUR and advised the Bureau has received information this individual is supposed to have furnished a statement during 1946 regarding the FARS of the Justice Department to the HCUA; that also LOUIS RUSSELL of the HCUA is supposed to have given a copy of this information to the WFO, the foregoing information being per PEYTON FORD of the Department. WHITSON requested advice as to whether RUSSELL had done so.

I explained to him that on the previous day I had personally advised Mr. LADD that through information confidentially furnished by RUSSELL during which he had partially identified this individual from his recollection of this event, the WFO had set forth a teletype lead for the Detroit Division to interview discreetely MANCHUR who is now teaching at Wayne University in Detroit, Michigan, and told him that a response to this was expected in the Bureau at 12:00 noon today. I asked him if he had any objection to a discreet contact by this office with RUSSELL for the purpose of ascertaining whether he recalled having sent a copy of this information to the WFO and he replied there was no objection to this provided the inquiry was not made in too pointed a fashion.

Immediately after this, RUSSELL contacted SA RAPHAEL I. NIXON and advised him that through a review of HCUA files he had definitely determined that STEPHEN MANCHUR was the individual who furnished information in September, 1946 to HCUA regarding the situation in FARS. I advised WHITSON that RUSSELL had informed NIXON that shortly prior to September 20, 1946, he had taken a letter to LAMAR CAUDLE, Assistant Attorney General, which requested that the Department make available for review by an HCUA investigator, Departmental files pertaining to a substantial list of organizations and individuals concerning whom information had been furnished HCUA by MANCHUR. In this regard, RUSSELL stated that CAUDLE referred him to NATHAN ELIFF, who RUSSELL stated, was one of the individuals mentioned in the letter and on whom information of a derogatory nature had been furnished by MANCHUR. RUSSELL had advised that ELIFF at that time was not cooperative.

I advised WHITSON that RUSSELL stated that under date of September 20, 1946, over the signature of JOHN CARRINGTON, Clerk of the HCUA, he had written a letter to Attorney General CLARK stating that the Committee had previously asked for the files mentioned in the former letter and that the HCUA representative had been placed in contact with ELIFF who had advised he would tell CLARK concerning this matter upon the latter's return from Europe. RUSSELL advised NICON that this letter

called for a response from the Department and that HCUA presently has in possession a copy of the September 20, 1946 communication but to date has been unable to locate in its files the copy of the communication preceding this one. RUSSELL suggested to NIXON that as he recalls it, he left the letter of September 20, 1946 with ELIFF and feels that possibly ELIFF destroyed this communication since it involved him.

I further advised WHITSON that RUSSELL had stated that prior to September 20, 1946, HCUA had questioned MANCHUR, apparently in Executive Session, and thereafter had issued a report. I asked him if he desired that we endeavor to secure a copy of this report and he stated that this should not be done in the absence of a request from the Bureau. I also advised WHITSON that a check of the WFO records reflected that RUSSELL had not made available a copy of this information.

T also told Mr. WHITSON that RUSSELL had ascertained that Congressman WOOD is this afternoon to furnish a press release regarding the 1916 situation which will state the Committee received information regarding pro-Russian persons employed in FARS; that COPION was mentioned by the informant of HCUA who was a then former fellow employee; and would point out that there is no-one to blame for the present situation but would emphasize the need for a greater degree of cooperation between the Department and HCUA.

I also advised that RUSSELL stated that a newspaper man whose name is unknown to him knows that the 1946 informant of HCUA is presently employed at Wayne University at Detroit but does not know the name of this individual.

Mr. WHITSON advised the writer that Detroit is presently interviewing MANCHUR and thus far has ascertained that he is definitely the individual who informed HCUA.

This is to advise that Mr. R. C. GODFREY of the Bureau telephonically inquired at 8:30 P.M. on March 6, 1949 about the identity of the Bureau of National Affairs, wherein he had a WFO letter indicating that Miss DORA SANDERS was employed. In this connection, he mentioned that because of the Bureau's uncertainty about the identity of this organization, the Bureau would be unable to grant permission to the Field at that time to interview Miss DORA SANDERS.

He said that the Bureau was awaiting State Department clearance before authorizing the Field to interview SONIA COHEN, with United Nations.

At 9:10 P.M., this office informed Mr. GODFREY that the Field would await clearance on the above two persons from the Bureau the following day. At that time Mr. GODFREY was also apprised of the information furnished previously by the New York Office, namely, that the House of Detention in New York City had refused several requests on the part of individuals to interview JUDITH COPLON.

This information, it might be noted, was furnished by SA JAMES ADAMS of the New York Office at 8:45 P.M.

A POLITICAL ANALYST WAS NOT AT SOME OF THESE CONFERENCES HELD BY BOOKSTAVER WHICH ALSO WAS AGAINST THE POLICY. INFORMANT DURING HIS WORK IN THE FAR SECTION NOTICED THAT HE WAS NOT GETTING CERTAIN FILES AND CORRESPONDENCE HE BELIEVED WERE IN EXISTENCE FROM A MRS. THOMAS, IN CHARGE OF DOCUMENTS OF THE SECTION. HE LEARNED THAT BOOKSTAVER HAD TOLD HER TO SEND THE CORRESPONDENCE AND FILES TO HIM INSTEAD OF TO THE INFORMANT. SHARED HIS OPINIONS AS TO THE PRO SOVIET CLIQUE THEREIN. THESE ARE MISS FRANCES BUTLER AND MISS AVANZING. HE DOES NOT KNOW WHERE THEY ARE NOW EMPLOYED. ACCORDING TO THE INFORMANT, THE FEMALE EMPLOYEES IN THE FAR SECTION HATED JUDITH COPLON AND HAD NOTHING TO DO WITH HER BUT HE DOES NOT KNOW THE REASON FOR THIS HATRED. INFORMANT BELIEVES THAT JESSE MCKNIGHT. WHO WAS NEMZERS PREDECESSOR AS TOP POLITICAL ANALYST WAS NOT PRO COMMUNIST OR PRO SOVIET BUT DID GIVE NEMZER, WHO WAS WORKING UNDER HIM AT THE TIME, THE QUOTE RUN OF THE DEPARTMENT UNQUOTE. INFORMANT WAS NOT ASKED DIRECTY IF HE HAD EVER MADE A REPORT TO THE HCUA. HE PROFFERED THE INFO, COMMENTING THAT HE HAD SEEN AN ARTICLE IN THE PAPER RE A SOCIOLOGY PROFESSOR WHO HAD GIVEN INFO TO THE HCUA AND HAD CONCLUDED THEREFROM THAT HE WAS THE PERSON INVOLVED. DETROIT INDICES REFLECT THAT THE DIRECTORY OF UKRAINIAN PROFESSIONAL ASSN PUBLISHED NINETEEN THIRTYNINE INCLUDED NAME OF INFORMANT AS MEMBER OF THIS ORGANIZATION. UPA FOUNDED SUMMER NINETEEN THIRTYTHREE CHICAGO NOT INCORPORATED. PURPOSE TO HELP SOLVE PROBLEMS OF UKRAINIAN PEOPLE AND WORK TOWARD THEIR INDEPENDENCE IN UKRAINIA. DISCLAIMED ANY FOREIGN CONNECTIONS. IN NINETEEN THIRTYEIGHT SOME MEMBERS UPA ADVOCATED SUPPORT OF HITLER BELIEVING INDEPENDENT UKRAINE WOULD RESULT AND THEY WOULDBE SAVED FROM COMMUNISM. ESPIONAGE -R

Washington daily newspapers for March 5, 6 and 7, 1949 were obtained by the writer. All articles were reviewed and clippings were made of them.

The following information obtained from these articles is being submitted as possible leads, which may not have been covered up to this time:

ELIZABETH FINIEY, a secretarial worker who lived in a nearby apartment in the 2600 block of Tunlaw Road, advised newspaper reporters that subject would work until the early morning hours on her typewriter and would leave for work in the morning with great wads of newspapers under her arm and also that on Sundays. the subject used to go bicycling with a young dark-haired man.

Mr. and Mrs. ROGER GARLOCK, present address 6212 Green Pree Road, Bethesda, Maryland, said they used to live next door to Miss COPLON at 2634 Tunlaw Road, N.W. They said Miss COPLON told them she was working on "some kind of thesis" for her courses lat school, which necessitated her typing. They also said Miss COPLON went to Europe for approximately two months, starting about March 1948 and that while she was gone, she had stored her furniture under their name. When she returned, they said a dark-haired young man helped her move her things to McLean Gardens. Both recalled Miss COPLON took frequent weekend trips to New York, where she told them she visited her parents.

Manager CHARLES ALLISON of McLean Gardens told newspaper reports that Miss COPLON moved into her apartment room, 135 at Jefferson Hall on July 23, 1948. Her application there, showed she listed herself as a "Political Analyst", naming WILLIAM FOLEY as her Justice Department superior. As references in this application, she listed the City Bank and BERNARD S. MORRIS.

The Times Herald for Sunday, March 6, said it was a consensus among American University professors that subject was a brilliant student of Soviet Economic Planning and an expert Russian linguist. The only professor named in this article was Graduate Dean PITMAN POTTER, who said that the subject was "obviously uncertain about underlying assumptions." He explained this to the reporters as a waivering disposition as to what beliefs to follow.

Another teacher at the American University, nqtapamedg49

WASHINGTON, D. C

said that as far as he knew the only thing which could indicate that the subject might conspire to give away U. S. secrets was her avid interest in the Soviet Union. Another professor said that a paper submitted by Miss COPLON in the course on "Economic Planning in the Soviet Union" is considered one of the best ever presented by an American University Graduate student.

Mrs. JOHN E. FULLER, Resident Manager, 2634 Tinlaw Road, WN.W., said that she told newspaper reports that once or twice tenants at that address complained to her Miss COPLON disturbed them with her typewriter in the early morning hours.

An article in the Washington Post dated March 6, 1949 stated that the applicant had attended American University from September 1945 to January 1948 and had enrolled at the George Washington University Law School in February 1948 but quit within one month. Also that Miss COPLON had a slender, tall and dark boy friend. This article was written by JAMES F. DONOVAN, United Press Staff writer, who said he covered the Justice Department, and described the subject as a "gossipy little thing." He said she always seemed ready to exchange pleasantries and small talk with other girls in the department's internal security section, but was also known as a hard worker and sometimes was still on the job when the other workers had quit for the day. said, unlike most women employees of the security-conscious Justice Department, she gave her opinion freely of many of the Justice Department officials, and that she had a great respect for the FBI.

In an article in the Washington Post dated March 6, 1949 with a New York date line, it was reflected that Dean MILLICENT C. McINTOSH of Barnard College, Columbia University, released a two-page statement describing COPLON as being highly intelligent, talented, and with a pleasing personality. Miss McINTOSH quoted from two letters of recommendation sent to Barnard when COPLON sought part-time employment there in Research or Writing. One letter was from LAURENCE A. KNAPP, Chief of Foreign Agents, Registration of the Department of Justice and the second was from JESSE M. MacKNIGHT.

In an article in the Washington Post dated March 6, 1949, it was stated that Representative NIXON, a member of the House Committee on Un-American Activities, demanded a full scale investigation to determine whether the Justice Department is qualified to protect this country "against Communist infiltration." It was learned, according to this article, that Miss COPLON'S name figured in a confidential report to Chairman JOHN WOOD of the House Committee on Un-American activities on September 3, 1946.

The report carried highly critical statements by an informant about the Foreign Agents Registration Section. The informant is shown to be a Social Science professor in the Midwestern University. The article stated that this informant specifically criticize COPLON but said there was a definite pro-Soviet attitude in the Registration Section. He was alleged to have said that the section condemned anything that was anti-Soviet and at the same time that which was pro-Russian was considered satisfactory. He was also alleged to have said that reports on pro-Soviet foreign agents often failed to reach the desk of responsible government officials and prosecutions for failure of these agents to register were rarely pressed. NIXON admitted there was such a report in the Committee files, according to the article, and said it indicated a "shocking inexcusable laxity on the part of the Justice Department in screening its own employees for loyalty." He said that the above report showed the section to be responsible for keeping four Communists fronts from registering under the Foreign Agents Registration Act.

Re FBI laboratory report dated March L. 1949, identifying Documents Q-25 through Q-33, as having been typed on Royal Typewriter, Serial KAN-2585483, located in room 2216, Department of Justice Building. It is observed that these documents are carbon copies.

An examination of a wooden box located on the west side of room 2220, which room is the office of subject, reflects that in the roar of this box in a section of unfiled material, the originals of Q-25 through Q-29 and Q-33 were located.

It has been learned that subject as a political analyst reviewed. Bureau reports which might have a bearing on Foreign Agents Registration Act matters. If she felt the information appearing in the reports would be of some possible future use to the FARS, she underlined sentences in the synopsis and details she desired written up on a "data slip". In the upper left hand corner of the data slips, there usually appeared the name of the file or subject matter with which the Bureau report concerned itself. In the upper right hand corner of the data slips, there usually appears the names of individuals or organizations which are mentioned in the summary of information appearing on the data slips.

For an illustration, the Dureau's attention is directed to Q-25. In the upper loft hand corner there is written, "Repoli". In the upper right hand corner there is written, "Communist Party Secretary of Peru" and "Arthine". This means that the stenographer in the FARS, hiss ETTA TAYLOR, typed an original and two carbons, making a sum total of three. If the upper right hand corner contained four names or subject matters, there would have been a sum total of five made. The original of Q-25 and only one carbon were located. It is assumed that subject had the second copy in her possession when arrested.

There are being transmitted horowith the originals of Q-25 through Q-29 and Q-33, as well as the carbon cepies located with the original. It is observed that in each instance one carbon is mission.

There are also being enclosed the original data slips and carbons of Q-31 and Q-32, which were located in an unfiled portion of a paper file box which was on a file cabinet on the south side of room 2220. It is observed that one carbon is also missing from both Q-31 and Q-32.

q-30, which is also a carbon, reflects that the name it. MICHOLAS CAMBFIL in the upper right hand corner of the data slip has a line underscored beneath it.

It is also observed that it beers the initials "BSM" as the identity of the analyst. BENNARD S. MORRIS is a former analyst for the FARS. Q-30 bears the caption, "General NICOLAE RADESQU" in the upper left hand corner. In the upper right hand corner, there appears, "NICOLAE MALAZA", "M. NICHOLAS CARANFIL", and "M. BARBU NICULESCU".

In a file cabinet marked "Hiscollaneous" located on the north side of room 2220, there is a section devoted to Rumanians. Under this section, there is a name tab entitled, "General NICOLAE RADESCU". The original of Q-30 was filed behind this name tab. There is a tab bearing the caption, "NICOLAE MALAXA" and behind it there is a carbon of Q-30. There is also a name tab for "M. BARBU NICULESCU" and located behind this name tab is a carbon of Q-30. There is no name tab for "M. HICHOLAS CARANFIL", nor is there a carbon or original of Q-30 in the Rumanian file. It is presumed that subject removed the carbon for M. NICHOLAS CARANFIL and that it is the carbon found in subject's passession when she was arrested. The original of Q-30 is enclosed.

All of the above mentioned documents being submitted to the FRI Laboratory have been initialed by Special Agent COURTIAND J. JONES, who located them and also bear the initials of Mr. WILLIAM E. FOLEY, head of the FARS and Internal Security Division of the Department of Justice.

The FBI Laboratory is requested to make a typewriting comparison of the originals of Q-25 through Q-33 with the carbons taken from the person of subject when she was arrested on March h, 1949, at New York City. Upon the completion of the examination, the original and carbons transmitted herewith should be returned to the Washington Field Office.

It is observed that on March 5, 1949, the documents taken from JUDITH COPION had been broken down into four groups.

Group No. 1 consists of 15 typewritten abstracts pertaining to Internal Security - R and Security Matter - C subjects. These were prepared on Royal typewriter bearing Serial Number KMM 2562236 located in Room 2220 and directly behind subject's desk. The identification was effected by the FBI laboratory on March 5, 1949, according to teletype of this date from the Bureau. These abstracts, which are condensations of Bureau reports, are approximately 5 x 7 in size, were apparently typed by a proficient typist and were the original copy of the abstract. Results of Examination:

It has been concluded that the paper specimens, Q36, Q37 and Q38 and the paper taken from the subject's room, described above as K17, came from the same original source. This conclusion is based on evidence found that all of these sheets of paper were cut with the same knife. In addition all of the sheets of paper were found to have the same physical properties with respect to size, thickness, color, finish, transparency and fluorescence.

The other paper specimens submitted, K16, K18 and K19, were not similar to any of the other questioned paper previously submitted, Q1 through Q43. It is noted that one sheet of K18-centained a portion of a Government watermark.

Because of the common type of carbon paper used to prepare specimens Q25 through Q33, which are the only questioned carbon copies thus far submitted, it was not possible to determine whether the carbon paper used to prepare Q25 through Q33 was of the same type as K15...

Specimens Q1 through Q43 are described in the Laboratory report dated March 7, 1949 and were submitted by the New York Office with a letter dated March 4, 1949.



In connection with the various interviews being conducted by your office, the Bureau's files have been reviewed regarding Ulda Eldred. This reveiw reflects the following information:

On September 15, 1947 the Justice Department submitted a Loyalty Form on Ulda Lillian Johnson Eldred, who was born March 21, 1912 at Altoona, Kansas and who was employed by the Department of Justice as a Secretary. On this Loyalty Form she listed her husband's name as being George Donald Eldred who was born February 22, 1907 at Altoona, Pennsylvania. This form reflects that Mrs. Eldred had been employed by the Department of Justice since 1937 and had resided since 1937 at 1620 E Street, N.E., Washington, D. C. This form was returned to the Department of Justice with a notation that no disloyalty data were found in the Bureau's files.

According to CI C-544, on December 19, 1947, Ruth Rifkin, Martin Popper's Secretary, spoke to Miss Copeland (Judith Coplon) at Extension 1134 in the Justice Department, who said "they saw the film which are four reels" and she asked Rifkin to inform the New York party not to send any more film; that the film was sent by bonded messenger, but the Government "doesn't have that facility to return them and they will return the film by Railway express." She stated that she didn't know the value for the insurance. Ruth Rifkin suggested she hold the film because Martin Popper would be back in town and she would ask him about the value. Copeland (Coplon) suggested Ruth Rifkin call Mrs. Eldred on Extension 1188 concerning this.

It is to be noted that Ruth Rifkin resided at McLean Gardens, which is the same apartment development where Coplon lives. The above call would also appear to be in connection with the regular duties of Judith Coplon and Ulda Eldred.

The same informant also reflected an earlier call from Miss Copeland (Judith Coplon) on December 19, 1947 to Elaine West for Martin Popper. West suggested Popper's secretary call her. Copeland said to have Ruth Rifkin call her at the Department of Justice, Extension 1134.

FOLEY of the Department, at 6:30 PM, March 9, 1949, advised that DOROTHY FILLIUS, who is the secretary for WERHEIDE, had furnished information relating to JOSEPHINE KLIEN, a former employee of the Department, now with the Army in Japan. FILLIUS at one time handled the "Paper Clip" program, which relates to German scientists in the United States. This program was handled as a confidential matter in the Department and FILLIUS had been given instructions to keep the material confidential. FILLIUS had reported that JOSEPHINE KLIEN on several occasions had come in and tried to read material dealing with the "Paper Clip" program, and it was necessary to be very pointed with her to get her out and to leave the material alone. KLIEN is described as an associate of JUDITH COPLON.

Mr. FLETCHER instructed that Hiss FILITUS should be interviewed, and on the basis of the known information concerning KLIEN, appropriate investigation should be instituted. The ITA should also be appropriately advised of the allegations concerning KLIEN.

JUDITH COPLON, VALENTINE ALEKSEEVICH GUBITCHEV, WAS, ESP R. FROM CONFIDENTIAL SOURCE AT FEDERAL RESERVE BANK, NYC, IT WAS ASCERTAINED THAT THE TWENTY-DOLLAR BILL, SERIAL B DASH ONE THREE NINE TWO EIGHT EIGHT SEVEN SIX B, WHICH WAS FOUND IN THE ENVELOPE CONTAINING ONE HUNDRED AND TUENTYFIVE DOLLARS ON THE PERSON OF GUBITCHEV WHEN HE WAS ARRESTED ON THREE FOUR FORTYNINE, WAS INCLUDED IN A SHIPMENT OF NEU CURRENCY SENT TO JAKOB LOMAKIN, USSR, CONSUL GENERAL, NYC, ON JULY THIRTY FORTYSIX UNDER DIRECTION OF THE STATE BANK OF THE USSR. SHIPMENT OF CURRENCY WAS FOR TEN THOUSAND TWENTY-DOLLAR BILLS. CONFIDENTIAL SOURCE REQUESTED THAT THIS INFORMATION NOT BE USED WITHOUT CONSULTING HIM SO THAT HE MAY TAKE IT UP WITH HIS LEGAL DEPARTMENT. A PHYSICAL EXAMINATION OF THE TWENTY-DOLLAR BILL, NOV IN POSSESSION OF THE NYO, SHOWS THAT THE BILL HAS HAD LITTLE OR NO HANDLING, IS IN A NEW CRISP CONDITION, AND CERTAINLY DOES NOT GIVE THE APPEARANCE OF HAVING BEEN IN CIRCULATION FOR TUOSAND ON HOLLE YEARS. 

You should immediately reinterview Harold Shapiro and obtain from him a signed statement incorporating in detail his intimate relationship with Judith Coplon, including his trip with her to Baltimore and Philadelphia, where they registered as man and wife.

The signed statement is to be transmitted to the Department of Justice and you should include in your memorandum which incorporates this statement ashort summary of the results of the investigation, reflecting the relationship between Coplon and Shapiro.

Surveillances of JUDITH COPLON by agents of the Washington Field Office from about January 7, 1949, to March 4, 1949, revealed that she spent a great deal of her time with HAROLD P. SHAPIRO. The majority of her evenings were spent in his company, they often lunched together, were together over weekends, she frequently visiting in his apartment at 1906 R Street, NW.

On January 8, 1949, physical surveillance revealed that SHAPIRO and COPLON drove in SHAPIRO's 1946, black Plymouth sedan, Connecticut license BP280, to Baltimore, Maryland, where SHAPIRO registered with the subject as Mr. and Mrs. H. P. SHAPIRO, 122 Burnside Avenue, East Hartford, Connecticut. They were registered by Room Clerk C. M. CONNERS, account No. 3442, registration card G-4164, and were assigned to Room 412. Investigation by the Baltimore Division revealed that the individuals who were registered as Mr. and Mrs. H. P. SHAPIRO checked out of the Southern Hotel at 3:01 p.m. on January 8, 1949.

By teletype dated January 13, 1949, the Philadelphia Office advised that Mr. JOSEPH KELLEHER, assistant manager, Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, produced records reflecting that Mr. and Mrs. H. P. SHAPIRO of East Hartford, Connecticut, registered at the Bellevue-Stratford at 7:07 p.m. on January 8, 1949, and checked out at 4:09 p.m. on January 9, 1949. They occupied Room 1523.

Confidential Informant who is known to the Bureau, advised that the subject had returned to Washington, D.C., later in the day of January 9, 1949.

Surveillance of the subject on January 19, 1949, revealed that she and SHAPIRO took the 1:00 p.m. Pennsylvania train from Washington to New York City, arriving at 4:50 p.m. Surveillance continued by agents of the New York Division revealed that SHAPIRO registered for a single room at the Piccadilly Hotel at about 6:20 p.m. and the subject accompanied him to his room. Approximately 40 minutes later both left the hotel and after having dinner attended the Century Theatre, after which SHAPIRO accompanied the subject on the subway to her home at 178 Ocean Parkway, Brooklyn, New York.

The subject again met SHAPIRO on the evening of January 23, 1949, at Pennsylvania Station, New York City. Both boarded the 7:30 p.m. train for Washington, D. C.

On February 4, 1949, surveillance revealed that at 11:30 p.m. the subject and SHAPIRO left the Playhouse Theatre and drove to his residence at 1906 R Street, NW. This surveillance was discontinued at midnight, subject not having left. Surveillance was reinstated at 1906 R Street, NW, the following morning, February 5, 1949, at 8:00 a.m. At 1:00 p.m. the subject and SHAPIRO were observed leaving this address.

On February 11, 1949, surveillance revealed that at 8:45 p.m. the subject and SHAPIRO left Alfonso's Restaurant and drove to 1906 R Street, NW. This surveillance was discontinued at 11:40 p.m., the subject not having been observed to leave this address. On February 12, 1949, surveillance was maintained, beginning at 8:00 a.m., alternately between subject's residence at Jefferson Hall, McLean Gardens, 3685 38th Street, NW, and SHAPIRO's residence at 1906 R Street, NW. The subject's blind remained drawn in her room the entire day and she was first observed at 6:03 p.m. when she and SHAPIRO drove up in the vicinity of her residence. At 8:58 p.m. on this date subject and a girl friend, JOY GAIL RAYWID, took a cab from McLean Gardens to SHAPIRO's apartment where they attended a party given by him. At 1:40 a.m. on February 13, 1949, SHAPIRO drove COPLON and RAYWID to McLean Gardens and IAYWID went into her residence there. COPION also entered her residence, remained five minutes and then returned with SHAPIRO to 1906 R Street, MM, where both entered. This surveillance was discontinued at 2:15 a.m. on the 13th. At 8:00 a.m. on the 13th this surveillance was again undertaken at 1906 R Street and at 10:40 a.m. COPLON and SHAPIRO were observed coming from his apartment house.

On February 17, 1949, surveillance revealed that at 10:30 p.m. SHAPIRO picked up the subject at her residence and drove to 1906 R Street, NW. On this occasion she had a suitcase with her. This surveillance was discontinued at 2:30 a.m. on February 18, 1949, at which time the subject had not left. Surveillance was again taken up at 8:00 a.m. on this date and at 8:50 a.m. COPION and SHAPIRO left 1906 R Street and drove to the corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and 10th Street, NW, where the subject alighted from his car and walked to the 10th Street and Pennsylvania Avenue entrance of the Justice Building. SHAPIRO continued driving around the building and into the basement, entering at the 10th Street court entrance.

During the interview of HAROLD SHAPIRO conducted by Special Agents H. DUDLEY PAYNE and HOBERT L. SMELTZER on March 5, 1949, SHAPIRO admitted under questioning that he had indulged in immoral relations with JUDITH COPLON at his apartment at various times, as well as in the Southern Hotel, Baltimore, and Bellevue-Stratford Hotel, Philadelphia, on the occasion of their trip to these cities on the nights of January 7 and 8, 1949. He declined at this time, however, to furnish a signed statement incorporating these facts. In a subsequent interview with SHAPIRO conducted March 14, 1949, he again admitted to these agents intimacy with COPLON in Baltimore and Philadelphia and at his apartment in Washington. Before the completion of the statement, SHAPIRO said that he preferred

not to furnish or sign any further admission concerning his intimacies with JUDITH COPION. He was advised that such a statement was requested of him by the interviewing agents in their official capacities in connection with an official investigation. It is felt that this point was emphatically stressed to SHAPIRO although he was also told that he was not under compulsion to make such a statement. The partially completed statement, which was reduced to writing during the course of the latter interview with SHAPIRO, is being set forth immediately below:

"Federal Bureau of Investigation Washington, D.C. Warch 14, 1949

MI, HAROLD PAUL SHAPIRO, make the following voluntary statement to Special Agents H. DUDLEY PAINE and ROBERT L. SKELTZER who have identified themselves to me as Special Agents of the Federal Bureau of Investigation after having been told that I do not have to make any such statement and that this statement may be used against me in a court of law. On New Years Eve, December 31, 1948, I first had intercourse with JUDITH COPLON in the apartment of a friend of mine in Washington, D.C. I decline to name this friend as he does not know JUDITH and has never met her so far as I know as he was out of the city on this particular occasion. Shortly thereafter, in the early part of January, JUDITH and I drove to Baltimore, Maryland in my car after work one Friday. I don't recall definitely who suggested this trip but presume it was I. In Baltimore we stayed at the Southern Hotel, where I registered for JUDITH and myself as Mr. and Mrs. H. P. SHAPIRO of Bast Hartford, Connecticut. We spent the night together in the hotel room.

The written portion of the statement obtained up to this point was handed to SHAPIRO to read and he affirmed that it was true in substance and accurately reflected what he had said. SHAPIRO stated that he was willing to cooperate in every respect with the FBI in respect to the case of JUDITH COPLON but that he felt that in further discussing or furnishing a signed statement concerning his immoral relations with her, he was isticking his neck out and actually not giving assistance of value to the espionage investigation.

This information is being called to your attention in connection with the previous request that you interview Miss Barber.

An individual identifying herself as Miss Jean Branch, 20 Chesapeake Street, Southeast, Washington, D. C., telephonically advised on March 7, 1949, that "This Coplon case has intrigued me." She stated that at the present time there are a number of employees located in the "office proper - the white collar workers" of the Picker X-ray Corporation located, she believed, on Fourth Avenue, in New York City, with whom she has reason to believe Judith Coplon has been associated. She pointed out that in her opinion the Picker X-ray Corporation itself, which does a great deal of Government work, is a reputable concern but had "too many avid CC NY students who lean much too far to the left" working in its front office. this Corporation to be a "formidable Semitic outfit".

Miss Branch did not know of anyone in particular with whom Coplon was allegedly associated but stated that she had reason to know Coplon was connected with various employees in the office proper of this concern.

The Washington Field Office should interview Miss Branch to determine if she has any information in her possession on which further investigation might be predicated.
