

By attached teletype, Chicago Div has advised Chicago hoodlum KEN ETO shot six times in head on 2/10/83 as he sat in his parked car in Chicago, Ill. ETO survived and taken to nearby hospital where his medical condition is critical.	X

ETO advised on 2/10/83 he met with Chicago LCN figure Joey Divarco who instructed ETO to see Joe Arnold, a criminal associate of Divarco's. Arnold told ETO to contact Chicago LCN figure Jasper Campise and Chicago hoodlum Johnny Gatuso. Later in the day ETO met with Campise and Gatuso and, while sitting in a parked automobile with them, Gatuso shot ETO.

Details of interview shared with Chicago PD who advised they would seek arrest warrants for Conspiracy and Attempted Murder charges against DiVarco, Arnold, Gatuso and Campise.

ETO was recently indicted by Chicago Division and entered a plea of guilty. ETO had been scheduled to appear before USDJ George Leighton for sentencing in the next two weeks. Debriefing of ETO by CG SA's to commence 2/11/83.

By attached teletype dated 2/13/83 from Chicago, FBIHQ was advised that Campise and Gatuso were released on 10 percent of their bond (which was set at \$500,000 each).

After learning of their release, AUSA Margolis authorized the arrest of both Campise and Gatuso for Civil Rights and National Firearms Violations.

Bail will be recommended at \$1,000,000 each.

For information, Chicago Division is conducting investigation under captioned case into LCN controlled illegal gambling and extortion. Attached communication advises that on 8/5/82 a FGJ in the Northern District of Illinois returned a 14 count indictment charging subjects Ken Eto and with violations relative to conspiracy, conducting an illegal gambling business, and interstate transportation in aid of racketeering to facilitate the conduct of an illegal gambling operation. 



On approximately January 28, 1983, (the exact date is unknown) Joseph Arnold telephoned "Joe" Ken Eto at Eto's residence in Bolingbrook, Illinois. The substance of this telephone message was a directive from Arnold to Eto to meet with Joseph DiVarco at Poor Vic's Car Lot located at 4800 West North Avenue, Chicago, Illinois. Eto followed these instructions and approximately a day later met with DiVarco at the car lot. Eto was instructed by DiVarco at this time to meet with Vincent Solano, Eto's direct superior in Chicago Organized Crime.

Eto proceeded to call Solano and then meet with him at the International House of Pancakes (IHOP) located at 6501 West North Avenue, Oak Park, Illinois. During this meeting, Solano indicated his concern about Eto's pending hearing concerning Eto's gambling business. Solano further sought information as to Eto's desire to plead to a stipulated bench trial and the consequencs of such an action. Solano appeared very nervous and "paranoid" during the entire conversation, actually making several accusations to Eto indicating his distrust of Eto. Finally, Solano directed Eto to allow John Gattuso and Jasper Campise to look at Eto's restaurant which was for sale at the time. This was in spite of the indication by Eto to Solano that Eto had a prospective client for his restaurant. Solano insisted and told Eto that DiVarco would arrange a time for Eto to see Gattuso and Campise.

Eto returned to Poor Vic's Car Lot in an effort to contact DiVarco so that Eto's meeting with Gattuso and Campise could be arranged. Although DiVarco was not at the car lot, Eto met him shortly thereafter at Campise's social club located at 4818 West North Avenue, adjacent to the car lot. DiVarco told Eto he would arrange the meeting with Campise and Gattuso.

On February 1, 1983 Arnold called Eto, again at Eto's residence, and told him to meet Gattuso and Campise the next day. It was agreed that Eto would first meet with Gattuso and Campise at the Cozy Town Restaurant, 8000 Ogden Avenue, Lyons, Illinois and proceed from there to Eto's Restaurant, which was empty at the time. Although Eto did meet with Gattuso and Campise, Gattuso requested another meeting to show the property to an individual Gattuso described as his "backer."

On February 9, 1983 Arnold again called Eto at his residence, this time telling Eto to meet DiVarco at Oldsters for Youngsters, a social club at 847 Wabash Avenue, Chicago, Illinois, at 11:00 A.M. on Thursday, February 10, 1983. Eto did meet with DiVarco and Arnold at Oldsters for Youngsters (OY) on February 10, 1983 at about 11:00 A.M., receiving a parking ticket issued by the Chicago Police Department for illegal parking at that location. At this meeting DiVarco told Eto to meet Campise and Gattuso at the American Legion Post (ALP) located at 3603 North Narragansett, Chicago, at 7:30 P.M. on Thursday, February 10. Eto, Campise and Gattuso were then to meet with Solano and have dinner.

Eto arrived at the American Legion Post at approximately 7:30 P.M. on February 10 and saw Gattuso waiting near the door to the post. By the time Eto parked his car, Gattuso and Campise were walking toward him and it was decided to travel in Eto's car to meet Solano. Gattuso sat in the rear seat while Campise sat in the front passenger seat. Both Campise and Gattuso wore gloves.

Eto was given directions by Campise and drove to a parking lot behind a building at 7129 West Grand Avenue, Chicago. Eto had been told by Campise that they were to meet Solano in a small restaurant nearby and instructed where to park.

Before Eto could exit the car he was shot three times in the back of the head. Eto acted as if he were mortally wounded while Gattuso and Campise fled his auto. Eto allowed several minutes to pass before he rose from the seat into which he had fallen to look around. Seeing no one, Eto walked from his vehicle to the Terminal Pharmacy at 7029 West Grand Avenue and obtained police and ambulance assistance, being transported to Northwestern Hospital.



Eto stated that following his discussion with DiVarco at Poor Vic's Car Lot, he telephoned Vince Solano at the "Union Hall" which Eto stated had a telephone number of 237-7535. Eto went on to state that he called Solano the day after meeting with DiVarco at Poor Vic's Car Lot and that this was approximately eight or nine days before the shooting. Eto further described this telephone call as being made from a pay phone to Solano's office at the Union Hall.

Eto stated that after contacting Solano at the Union Hall, he went to meet Solano at approximately 11:00 or 12:00 that same day. Eto stated that he met Solano at the International House of Pancakes (IHOP) located at Belmont and slightly west of Central Avenue in Chicago. Eto stated that when he met Solano, Solano was alone and Eto also was alone. Eto stated that as he got out of his automobile he saw Solano and walked with him on the sidewalk for some distance. Eto stated that Solano was walking differently then he often had, that is, Eto stated that Solano was walking with his face down and not with an erect posture which was his normal stance. Eto stated that the topics of conversation included a discussion between Solano and Eto concerning his current Federal case and that Eto was going to plead guilty to a stipulated bench and that he believed the sentencing was going to be on February 25, 1983. Eto stated that Solano's comment to this discussion was "I thought I told you to take a trial". Eto stated that he did not ever recall Solano ever suggesting that he should take a trial, but that Eto would if Solano asked him to do so. Eto stated that Solano also asked during the conversation what the definition of a stipulated bench (stip bench) was and Eto stated to him that that indicated neither guilty or innocence but would preserve Eto's rights to appeal any motions made during the trial.

Lto stated that Solano then said that he had three choices: Solano told Lto that he could either "do your time", appeal the case or "run away". Eto stated that he explained to Solano that he was being held for two counts and that each count was penalized by a maximum of five years. Eto told Solano that he was not going to run away and Solano's response was "appeal it". Lto stated that he indicated to Solano that that would be satisfactory to him. At this point in the conversation and in the walk on the sidewalk Eto stated that Solano made a movement as if he was to turn around and return toward the ILOP and Eto's vehicle. Eto stated that he Lelieved that when Solano began to make a move indicating his return to the ILOP, that he began to turn and return toward the INCP. Solano stated at this point "what are you looking back for". Eto stated "I thought we were going Lack" and Solano stated that they were not doing so and continued to walk on.

Lto stated that Solano wanted to know more about Lto's club located in Lyons, Illinois. Eto stated that he told Solano that he had a very good offer from a good prospect from La Grange whom Eto described as Jimmy LNU. Eto further one of these individuals owns two stated that other restaurants known as "Gee Wilikers" and "In Cahoots". Eto stated that he explained to Solano that these individuals had backgrounds in the restaurant business and it would do well in that location. Solano replied by stating that Johnny Gattuso had a backer who could provide money and would back him in the pizza business in that location of Eto's and that Gattuso was interested in renting the building. Eto stated that Solano also indicated that Jay Campise would be the partner of Gattuso and that he (Eto) should get in touch with Joe DiVarco in an effort to see Johnny Gattuso concerning this Lusiness.

At this point in the conversation Eto indicated that the restaurant and the property was actually to further stated that he interpreted Solano's discussion as a request that Eto do a favor by allowing Gattuso to view the property. Eto further stated that although he had owned the property since 1974, he had only had the restaurant there since August of 1982 and that this restaurant had been a night club

Eto stated that at this point in the conversation he and Solano returned to Eto's car and that while so doing Eto had his hands in his coat pockets the entire time. Eto stated that when they reached the approximate area of his vehicle, Solano asked him what he had in his pockets and Eto stated that he withdrew one of his hands and showed Solano his cigarettes. Solano stated to him at this time that "I thought I saw something". Eto stated that Solano's behavior during this entire conversation was very unusual and that he seemed "nervous and paranoid" and very suspicious. Eto stated that the entire conversation lasted approximately ten minutes but that it was not unusual for conversations of this type to occur and that walks with Solano and conversations were fairly routine between himself and Solano.

Description of the stated that he went to see Joe Divarco at Poor Vic's Car Lot in an effort to get in touch with John Gattuso. Eto stated that when he arrived there he saw one of Divarco's salesman who told him that Divarco would return to Poor Vic's Car Lot at approximately 1:30 p.m. in the afternoon and that Divarco was currently at the "baths". Eto stated that rather than staying at Divarco's car lot he went to Jay Campise's club which was located just around the corner to wait for Divarco. Lto stated that when he arrived at Campise's club, Campise was there and that he (Eto) said hello to him and that he had coffee and began waiting to return to Poor Vic's Car Lot and meet Divarco. However, Eto stated, shortly after sitting down for his coffee at Campise's club, Divarco came into the same club and stated that he had skipped the "baths".

Eto stated that he told DiVarco that he had seen Solano and that he understood that John Gattuso wanted to see his club in Lyons. Eto asked DiVarco to set up an appointment with John Gattuso so that he might see the club. Eto stated that DiVarco then told him that he had been told by Solano that Jay Campise would be Gattuso's partner in this venture and that he would set up the meeting.

Eto stated that either that evening or the next evening he was called at home by Joe Arnold and Arnold informed him that John Gattuso was going to meet with him along with Jay Campise the next morning at "Cozy Town". Eto explained that Cozy Town was a restaurant near his Lyons property approximately a half a block away on Ogden Avenue.

Eto stated that the next day he went to Cozy Towm and awaited the arrival of Gattuso and Campise. Eto stated that Gattuso and Campise came to the restaurant together and that they sat down at the same table with Eto. Eto stated that he explained to Gattuso and Campise that he already had a good leasee for the place and questioned why Johnny Gattuso would want to have a pizza parlor in that area. Eto stated that Gattuso pulled his vehicle past the Eto's car and parked it in the parking lot. Eto stated that he got out of his car as did Gattuso and that they both entered the small vestibule area of the club in Lyons

further stated that he could not get in touch with his backer and that these were the reasons that he was late. He further stated to be that he would contact be later. It stated that he then told Gattuso that Gattuso should take his telephone number and get in touch with be over the weekend, since the other deal for the property was pending. Eto informed Gattuso that if he did not hear from Gattuso over the weekend he would consummate the deal with the other individuals. It stated that Gattuso took out his wallet and from it produced a piece of paper upon which he wrote be to telephone number. Eto stated that at this point he noticed a badge in Gattuso's wallet and Gattuso told him that it was nothing to worry about.

On February 7, 1983, Monday evening, Eto stated that he had not received any contact with Gattuso so he leased the club to the other individuals. Eto explained that he utilized the services of an attorney for this transaction

Explained that the lease was sent to the attorney for the leasee and would be picked up signed from the leasee's attorney. Eto stated that he would then receive indication that the lease needed to be signed. Eto explained that his would then have to be notified to come to Chicago to sign the lease,

Eto stated that on Wednesday night, February 9, 1983, between the hours of approximately 5:00 and 8:00 p.m., Joe Arnold called him and informed him to meet Joe DiVarco at the club called Oldsters For Youngsters at approximately 11:30 a.m. on Thursday, the following day. Eto was informed that possibly John Gattuso would be in attendance as well.

Eto stated that on Thursday, February 10, 1983, he proceeded from his home and stopped in Lyons at a coffee shop for coffee since he was early for the appointment. Eto stated that after leaving the coffee shop in Lyons, he arrived at approximately 10:30 to 11:00 in the area of Oldsters For Youngsters and parked his car. Eto stated that he received a Chicago Police Department parking ticket because of an illegal parking of his car at that time.

Eto stated that when he entered Oldsters For Youngsters he saw Joe DiVarco, Joe Arnold and an individual who "hung around" that area named "Pete". Eto described Pete as a Greek who was a bartender

that Arnold informed them that he was going to Michigan Avenue to run an errand and he placed his coat on and left the area. Eto stated that he then sat with Joe DiVarco and talked about the deal on the club in Lyons. Eto stated that he informed DiVarco that he had already signed the deal with the other party since he had not heard from John Gattuso. Eto stated that DiVarco told him at this point that he was to meet John Gattuso and Jay Campise at the American Legion Hall located at Addison and Narragansett Streets in Chicago at approximately 7:30 p.m. this evening. Eto was further informed that the reason for this meeting was for Gattuso and Campise to take Eto to have dinner with Vince Solano.

Eto stated that following his conversation with DiVarco that he left the Oldsters For Youngsters Club believing that he was going to be killed. Eto stated that he believed this based on the fact that Solano's actions had been very strange, that to place a pizza restaurant at his club in Lyons made no sense and that it would be unusual for him to have dinner with Vince Solano and particularly unusual to be taken to have dinner with Vince Solano.

Eto stated that after leaving Oldsters For Youngsters he drove in his car for some time trying to resolve what he was going to do and determined that he would follow through with the meeeting as planned for that evening. Eto stated that he arrived at home at about 3:00 in the afternoon in Bolingbrook

Eto stated that he left his home in Bolingbrook and arrived at the American Legion Hall as instructed at 7:30 p.m. Eto stated that when he arrived at the American Legion Hall he noticed that John Gattuso was standing in the doorway of that hall and that when Gattuso saw him driving in his vehicle he went into the doorway. Eto explained that he parked his car approximately 30 feet from the American Legion Hall and that he got out of his car. As he got to the sidewalk both Gattuso and Campise were already heading toward him on the same sidewalk. Eto stated that Gattuso took off his glove on his right hand as did Campise and shook Eto's hand. Eto stated that all three men then began walking towards Eto's car at which time Eto asked whose car they would drive in to the restaurant and Campise suggested "why not yours".

Eto stated that he opened the passenger side door and Gattuso got in the back seat on the passenger side and that Campise occupied the passenger seat in the front of the vehicle. After Eto got in the car in the driving position he asked where the restaurant was and Campise indicated that it was a small Italian restaurant near Harlem and Grand Avenues in Chicago. Campise further instructed Eto to take Narragansett Street to Grand, turn right and go toward Harlem. Eto stated that during this time Gattuso did not say anything. Eto said that while he was driving toward the Italian restaurant he looked into the back seat to ask John Gattuso why he had not called Eto concerning the property in Lyons over the weekend and Gattuso apparently indicated to him that he had been busy during that time.

Lto stated when they arrived in the area of Harlem and Grand Avenues Campise located the approximate area of the restaurant and Gattuso stated that there was a small parking lot entered by an alleyway that would be convenient to the restaurant. Eto stated that he drove into the parking lot and there saw what he called "a beater". Eto stated that this beater was a vehicle that he thought was an old, possibly beige, large, two door vehicle parked in the middle of the parking lot possibly against a fence. Eto stated that he did not see any individuals in that vehicle as he glanced at it momentarily. Eto stated that he was driving in the parking lot and Campise stated that he should park at a specific point so that they would not have to walk so far to get to the restaurant. Eto stated that he complied, stopped the car and put it in park. Eto stated that he then heard a gunshot and felt an impact after hearing the loud noise. Lto stated that he heard a second and third gunshots and felt the second and third impacts as well. Eto stated that he remembers thinking at this time that he was not unconscious and decided to fall towards the passenger side of the car, shake and appear as if he was dying and then dead. Lto stated that after doing so he heard the passenger side door slam and heard the sound of feet running away from the vehicle. Eto stated that he remained in this position for one or two minutes but that he did not hear any other vehicles start or move away from the area during this time.

Lto stated that after remaining for one or two minutes lying on the seat of his car he got up and looked around and noticed that no one was either in his car or in the parking lot. Lto stated that he got out of his vehicle and walked in the direction of the other vehicle but that vehicle was gone. Lto stated that he went toward Grand Avenue and located a pharmacy where he asked the individuals in the pharmacy to call for help. Lto stated that shortly thereafter an ambulance arrived as did the Chicago Police Department and he was taken to the hospital.





#### 1. ENCLOSED PHOTOGRAPHIC WORK RELATES TO:

All photographic work submitted should be checked as Current Investigation, Mug Shot Program, or OTHER in appropriate block. If "OTHER" is checked a short description of what it is should be stated under item #4 (Remarks).

#### 2. ENCLOSURE(S):

Film To Be Processed - Check appropriate column for Color, Black and White film, alongside the size of the film. Also, indicate the number of sheets or rolls or cassettes in the quantity column. Slides refers to EXTACHROME ONLY, DO NOT SEND KODACHROME.






