Section is ^{approx} 14" x 11" and has obvious impact area ~~near~~ on it.

Microscopic exam revealed no obvious bullets or bullet-like particles on the windshield. Looking for lead or lead alloy materials most likely.

Extensive Light microscopic study of area marked "inside" revealed no area of glass that was cracked in the vicinity of the obvious impact area or any foreign smears of value for possible determination of the cause of the crack on the other side.

No crack could be found on the "inside" of the glass.

Extensive light microscopic study of the impact area of the side marked "outside" revealed an obvious impact area with many obvious particles of material that seem to be quite evenly distributed over the whole area of impact. There seem to be no real concentrations of any particles. A sample of these will be evaluated by SEM/EDX for any unusual possibilities.

Specimen Prep

Each neoprene stopper is coated with an adhesive layer, followed by a mylar layer, followed by another adhesive layer. Following use the mylar layer of each specimen is removed and subjected to the following technique in order to separate and concentrate the small dense particles for an SEM/EDX ~~analysis~~ analysis for particles of gunshot residue.

The mylar layer with particles adhering is inserted into a conical, open ended centrifuge tube, to which a flat substrate compatible with the SEM is attached. Solvents, hexane/bromoform, to dissolve the adhesive and provide a density gradient are added. After sonication and centrifugation the particles are deposited on the substrate. The deposited material is evaluated for GSR.

Referenced airtel sets forth how victim Eto was shot by subject John Gattuso from behind while Eto, Gattuso, and subject Jasper Campise were sitting in Eto's automobile. 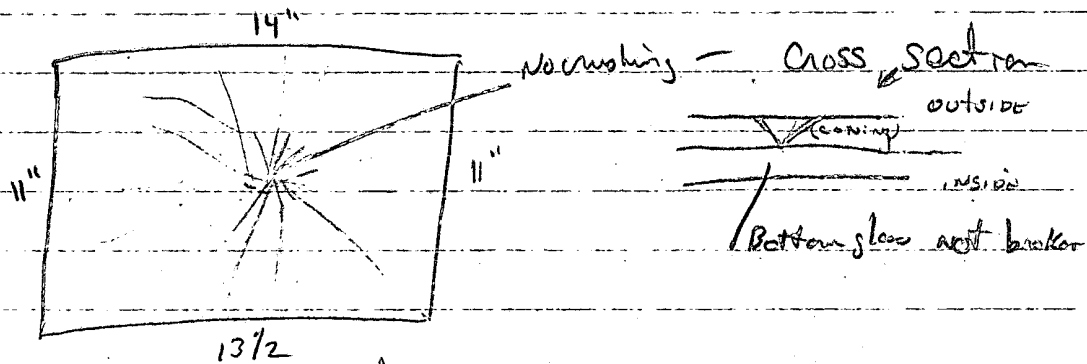


