The above captioned individual is Minister of Information for the Black Panther Party and has been residing in the Bay area of California. Cleaver failed to appear on November 27, 1968, in a response to orders of the California state authorities revolking his parole. His present whereabouts are unknown.

Cleaver is also at liberty on a \$50,000.00 bail bond, due to appear December 23, 1968, to answer Assault With Deadly Weapon charges resulting from a shoot out with Cakland, California police in April of this year. He has stated he would not return to prison and hoped that the black community and white sympathizers would hide him. Cleaver is described as follows:

When requesting copies of the flyer from our Chief she advised that unusualty in requests for the above wanted flyers have been received from the University Branch of the U. S. Post Office and that she had sent on three occasions approximately ten copies of the above wanted flyers. She said on the last occasion she inquired as to why this many posters was needed and an unidentified female in the Postal Inspector's Office who was requesting the posters advised that it was not for the post office but was to satisfy remeats from students at the at this time told the University of Hawaii. unidentified female that she did not have supplies in sufficient quantity to give to the general public and that if anybody wented copies they should commicate with this office.

Efforts by to pin down the source of this information were to no swall. dutifully brought this information to the attention or the SAC.

While it is not known whether the action being initiated at the University of Hawaii will develop into a nationwide trend, nevertheless it is possible this will be a new "college fad" in the ensuing weeks, and the Bureau might desire to alert field offices to this possibility wherein they receive unusually heavy demands for IOs or wanted flyers on the above captioned individuals that would not be consistent with normal distribution. The Bureau might also consider the possibility at the same time of instructing field offices to alert their postmasters within their districts to a similar situation so that the appropriate FBI Office can be alerted to unusually heavy requests.

The Buremi can be assured that further inquirles received similar to will be answered in a like manner. Honolulu's Postumeter and Postal Inspector are being appropriately alerted. If there is any additional pertinent information in this matter the Bureau will be appropriately advised.



The Bureau is not aware of any other instances wherein field offices have received unusual requests for identification orders or wanted flyers, therefore, it would appear unnecessary to alert other field offices at this time. These wanted posters, of course, are furnished to postmasters for appropriate display in the various post offices and not for distribution. You should insure that the postmaster at the University Branch is made sware of this fact and request that his employees at the post office are similarly advised.

These wanted posters are printed to afford maximum publicity to the fugitive status of an individual. It is, therefore, desirable to distribute the posters to logical sources to achieve maximum results but at the same time it is not possible to completely control the distribution so that certain groups, such as college students, are prevented from possession or display of same. As a matter of fact, it is not a violation of Federal law to reproduce or alter an FBI identification order or wanted flyer.

You should, however, in light of the information in realistel, examine your procedures as to distribution to insure the best possible use is being made of the wanted posters.

Cleaver's Wife Arrives in U.S.

BOSTON (AP)—Mrs. Eldridge Cleaver, wife of the self-exiled Black Panther leader, has arrived in the United States to begin a national speaking tour in support of urban guerrilla struggle.

Cleaver said in an interview in Algiers yesterday that he too, will return to the United States and will devote himself to such a struggle for "oppressed peoples."

Mrs. Cleaver said on arriving at Logan Airport here last night that her husband would follow "very soon."

Her journey from Alglers was interrupted when FBI agents detained a traveling companion.

ATTORNEY William Homans It of the American Civil Libertles Union said however, that the companion was Jessica Scott Weinrich and that the detainment was caused by mistaken identity.

Mrs. Weinrich was released after several hours and joined Mrs. Cleaver, her two children and Elaine Klein, formerly of Ridgeiteld, Conn.

Subject, who was paroled from California State Prison, December, 1966, where serving sentence for ADW, Assault With Intent to Commit Murder, and Assault with Intent to Commit Rape, failed to report to State Parole Authorities, San Francisco, California, on November 27, 1968, as ordered following revocation of parole. warrant issued for subject as a parole violator that date. On 12/10/68, following request for Federal assistance, an authorized complaint was filed before USC, San Francisco, California, charging subject with violation Title 18, Section 1073, U. S. Code. Warrant issued that date. Subject last seen San Francisco, California, November 23-24, 1968. Subject failed to appear in Superior Court, Oakland, California, 12/23/68 on other charges, \$50,000 bail forfeited. Present whereabouts of subject unknown. Subject is Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party and his wife, KATHLEEN CLEAVER is National Captain of Women in this organization. Subject was also nominated as the Peace and Freedom Party candidate for President of the U.S. in the 1968 general election. Subject, the author of a book entitled "Soul on Ice". Subject allegedly has engaged police officers in gun battle in the past. CONSIDER ARMED AND EXTREMELY DANGEROUS.

DETAILS:

FACTS OF OFFENSE

On December 10, 1968, PATRICK M. SMYTHE, Special Agent, California Department of Corrections, Special Service Unit, Room 240, Ferry Building, San Francisco, California, advised as follows:

On November 3, 1957, subject was arrested by California authorities for Assault with a Deadly Weapon and Assault with Intent to Commit Murder and Assault with Intent to Commit Rape. According to the files of the California Adult Authority, the arrest was made by the Los Angeles Police Department. The subject reported open the car door of a Mr. tied attempted to rapeT girlfriend, and witnesses pursued the subject by automobile with the subject firing shots at the pursuing witnesses. On March 11, 1958, the subject was sentenced to California State Prison for six months to fourteen years on the above charges. He was paroled in December, 1966, at which time he immediately proceeded to the San Francisco, California, area where he obtained employment with "Rampart's Magazine." He was employed as a writer with this magazine and later became an editor and subsequently senior editor, which position he held until his disappearance in November, 1968.

Since his release from prison, the subject had aligned himself with the Black Panther Party (BPP) and currently serves as Minister of Information of this organization.

On May 2, 1967, a group of 24 Negro males who identified themselves as members of the BPP, made a protest march and appearance at the California State Capitol in Sacramento, California, armed with rifles and handguns. As a result of the ensuing confrontation with authorities, the subject was arrested and charged with violation of parole. Representatives of his employer, "Rampart's Magazine" interceded on the subject's behalf claiming the subject had been assigned as a reporter for "Rampart's" to cover the State Capitol confrontation and that he had not appeared there as part of the raiding party and consequently should not have been arrested as a result of the confrontation. The subject was thereafter released by the authorities and no further action was taken to revoke his parole at that time.

The subject continued on parole until April 6, 1968, at which time he and several other members of the BPP became involved in a shootout with officers of the Oakland, California, Police Department, which resulted in the death of BOBBY HUTTON, Treasurer of the BPP, and the wounding of the subject in his left foot and ankle by a shotgun blast.

As a result of this shootout, the subject's parole was revoked and he was returned to prison. In a legal action brought by his attorney, CHARLES GARRY, in the Superior Court in Solano County, California, the revocation of subject's parole was declared illegal by Superior Court Judge RAYMOND SHERMAN who ruled that the subject's parole had been revoked because of "his political activities."

The subject was continued on parole until the last part of September, 1968, when the California Court of Appeals reversed the Superior Court ruling and stated that the California Department of Corrections action in revoking subject's parole was not illegal. The Court of Appeals ordered CLEAVER to be returned to prison and his parole revoked as of November 27, 1968. The California Department of Corrections wrote the subject a letter on approximately November 20, 1968, advising the subject that he should turn himself in to parole authorities at the State Building, San Francisco, California, at 9:00 AM, on November 27, 1968. The subject failed to appear and a warrant was issued for his arrest as a parole violator on that date.

The subject was last seen at a Cleaver Defense Fund Rally at the California Hall, San Francisco, California, on November 21, 1968, according to SMYTHE. SMYTHE advised, however, that in an interview by the press on November 27, 1968, at the State Building, San Francisco, the subject's wife, KATHLEEN CLEAVER, and the subject's attorney, CHARLES GARRY, both advised that they last saw the subject on November 24, 1968. SMYTHE also advised that the subject was interviewed by the press at "Rampart's Magazine" on November 23, 1968. SMYTHE stated that attempts to locate the subject at his last known addresses of 2500 Filbert and 2777 Pine Street, San Francisco, California, had been unsuccessful. He advised that the subject's whereabouts are unknown.

DETAILS OF FEDERAL PROCESS

On November 29, 1968, Deputy Attorney General for the State of California, JOHN P. OAKES, State Building, San Francisco, California, submitted a letter to Mr. CECIL POOLE, U. S. Attorney, San Francisco, California, requesting Federal assistance in the apprehension of the subject, who according to OAKES, is a paroled California prisoner who was serving sentence for several felony convictions. The letter indicated that a warrant for CLEAVER's arrest was issued on November 27, 1968. The letter stated that in the event subject is apprehended outside the State of California, the State would take all steps necessary to return him to California.

On December 10, 1968, U. S. Attorney CECIL POOLE, San Francisco, California, authorized a complaint charging subject with violation Title 18, Section 1073, U. S. Code (Unlawful Flight to Avoid Confinement). POOLE recommended bond at \$100,000, either cash or surety bond.

On December 10 1968, an authorized complaint was filed by SA before U. S. Commissioner RICHARD S. GOLDSMITH, San Francisco, California, charging the subject with the above violation following conviction of felonies under the laws of the State of California for the crimes of Assault with a Deadly Weapon, Assault with Intent to Commit Murder, and Assault with Intent to Commit Rape, and Parole Violation. A warrant for the subject's arrest was issued on December 10, 1968.

PERSONAL HISTORY

The subject was born to LEROY and THELMA ROBINSON CLEAVER at Little Rock, Arkansas, on August 31, 1935. He was one of six children born to this couple. He lived in Arkansas until the age of 7 (1943) when his parents moved to California. He resided in the area until he was sent to prison in 1958. He dropped out of school at the age of 17 after having reached the eleventh grade. Background

information developed by the California Department of Corrections revealed that the subject was a user of marijuana and had been known to sell marijuana as early as the age of 17.

Subject was arrested for burglary and petty theft and served time until he was paroled in May, 1951. He was arrested again on November 5, 1952, for possession of narcotics. On January 16, 1953, he was rearrested as a parole violator and in December, 1953, he was paroled. On February 13, 1954, he was arrested by the Los Angeles Police Department for suspicion of possession of narcotics and was sentenced to the State Prison on July 9, 1954. He was paroled on December 3, 1956.



During the subject's confinement in the California State Prison he affiliated himself while at San Quentin with the Nation of Islam - Black Muslim phylosophy. was also able to complete his studies and gain the equivalent of a high school education in 1952. addition to completing high school, he took courses in baking, welding (which he failed) and offset printing. indicated his religious preference as Catholic. When first incarcerated, however, he showed no interest in religious services and in subsequent interviews indicated he had no religion. The subject had no other affiliations prior to his release from prison. During his imprisonment he developed a close relationship with San Francisco Attorney BEVERLY AXELROD. She assisted him in obtaining his release on parole. When he was paroled in December, 1966, the subject told the parole officer that he and

Miss Axelrod intended to become married. This relationship subsequently cooled and the engagement was broken.

The subject was nominated as the Peace and Freedom Party candidate in the 1968 general election.

Shortly after the subject's release from prison, his manuscript, which is reportedly an autobiography, was published. The book is entitled "Soul on Ice" and is published by McGraw Hill, New York City. The subject has reportedly received in excess of \$40,000 in royalty from his book.

On December 23, 1968, in the Court of Judge FOLGER EMERSON, Department 5, Superior Court, Alameda County, Oakland, California, the subject failed to appear for arraignment on charges stemming from his being involved in a shootout with the Oakland Police Department. The judge ordered CLEAVER's \$50,000 bond forfeited.

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby George Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

CLEAVER was paroled from the California State Prison 12/66, where he was serving a sentence for assault with a deadly weapon, assault with intent to commit murder, and assault with intent to commit rape. He failed to report to State parole authorities, San Francisco, California, on 11/27/68, as ordered, following revocation of parole. A State warrant was issued, and on 12/10/68, following a request for Federal assistance, an authorized complaint was filed before USC, San Francisco, charging CLEAVER with violation T. 18, S. 1073, USC.

CLEAVER was last seen in San Francisco 11/23-24/68. He failed to appear in Superior Court, Oakland, California, 12/23/68 on other charges, and his \$50,000 bail was forfeited.

CLEAVER is Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party, and his wife KATHLEEN CLEAVER is National Captain of Women in this organization. He was also nominated as the Peace and Freedom Party candidate for President of the United States in the 1968 general election. He is the author of a book entitled "Soul on Ice".

The Bureau has advised that the New York Office has developed information indicating the possibility of a campaign or program being initiated by supporters of Subject CLEAVER to call FBI offices throughout the country to inform that they have seen CLEAVER at various locations in an effort to







She is acquainted with the father of LEROY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, LEROY CLEAVER, who resides in Chicago, Ill.; however, she has never met the subject. Mrs. LOCKETT has known the CLEAVER family for a number of years and, in fact, became acquainted with the family during her childhood in Arkansas. The CLEAVER family lived in a farming community about 6 miles from Camden, Arkansas.

Mrs. LOCKETT would go to an aunt's farm located in the same general area during the Summer months, and she became acquainted with the CLEAVERS. This aunt died in about 1912 or 1913. After this, Mrs. LOCKETT did not go visit this area and lost contact with the CLEAVER family for a long period of time. The father of the family which lived near Camden was HENRY CLEAVER, who was the grandfather of subject. There were about _______ in the HENRY CLEAVER family. OAKES, Deputy Attorney General, Office of the Attorney General, State Building, San Francisco, advised that he was going to request a UFAC investigation by the FBI and would submit request to USA CECIL F. POOLE. advised that the basis for this request for assistance was unconfirmed reports which he had received that CLEAVER had flown by either commercial airline or chartered airplane to Montreal, OAKES stated he had been in telephonic contact with POOLE who had advised him as to the material which should be included in a letter requesting UFAC assistance.

On 11/29/68, OAKLES furnished SA and the writer with a letter to USA POOLE. This letter was hand delivered by Agents to Mr. POOLE. Upon reading the letter, USA POOLE stated that based on the contents of the letter and the information furnished orally by Agents and Deputy OAKES regarding the basis for the belief that the subject may have fled the state, he at this time would not authorize a UFAC warrant. USA POOLE stated that he frankly believes the subject is probably still at his residence in San Francisco.

On 12/2/68, Inspector General Works Detail, SFPD, advised that the PD was conducting no investigation in an effort to apprehend subject CLEAVER. He stated that he has conducted no investigation to ascertain if the subject is residing in his usual residence in San Francisco or may be residing with friends and acquaintances.



called from the Bureau, requesting to speak to the SAC, however, talked to the writer. He inquired as to what was doing on the CLEAVER matter. I told him that nothing had occurred since our teletype of last night to change the status of the situation at all. He wanted to know if we were doing anything on the case. I told him that we had handled the checking of several out-of-State leads or rumors concerning his whereabouts, however, they had proved negative. He wanted to know if we had received any further request for UFAC process. I told him we had not. He inquired as to whether another letter was to be written by the State to Mr. POOLE. I told him that as the matter now stood they would not write another letter unless they received additional information which they could incorporate.

He then stated that Assistant to the Director DE LOACH thinks we whould put some pressure on. He believes Mr. DE LOACH has a feeling we should be in the case. I told him that I had some reservations about whether it would be advantageous for us to enter the case at this time. I also reminded him about the December 23rd appearance for CLEAVER, with the possibility of a \$50,000 bond forfeiture. He stated that he was aware of this and it appeared that he possibly agrees that it is doubtful if we should get into this case at this time.

I then told him that I might ask Mr. BATES to personally talk to Mr. DE LOACH and find out just what he wanted us to do as far as entering the case. He feels that first Mr. BATES should call and talk to Assistant Director GALE since Mr. DE LOACH's observations had come through Mr. GALE. I told him then that I would ask Mr. BATES to call as soon as he returned to the office.







On 12/10/68 a Federal complaint was filed and warrant issued at San Francisco charging the subject with UFAC - PV in violation of T. 18, USC, S. 1073.

CLEAVER was in the California State Prison from 3/20/58 until paroled 12/12/66 following conviction for assault with intent to commit murder and assault with a deadly weapon. On 4/6/68, CLEAVER, Minister of Information for the Black Panther Party (BPP), and several other Black Panthers were involved in a shoot-out with the Oakland Police Department resulting in the death of BOBBY HUTTON, BPP Treasurer, and wounding of CLEAVER in the left foot. As a result of this shoot-out, CLEAVER's parole was revoked and subsequent court action resulted in his release. An appeal of this decision resulted in a reversal calling for revocation of parole on 11/27/68, when he failed to appear and a parole violator's warrant was issued the same day. The Federal process is based on this warrant. He is also under indictment on assault charges arising out of this gun battle, with his trial date scheduled for 12/23/68.

EBI Joins Hunt for Cleaver

Nationwide Search Is On

The search for Eldridge Cleaver, Black Panther leader who is a fugitive parole violater, today spread nation-wide with the FBI officially in the hunt.

It is probably the first time in history that a former predidential acandidate was the subject of a federal fugitive warrant with \$100,000 ball set if captured.

Cleaver, Peace and Freedom Party can did ate for President in the November election, failed to surrender Nov. 27 on a state parole re-

vocation.

EVIDENCE

U. S. Attorney Cecil Poole at first balked at asking a fugitive complaint because the State of California failed to produce evidence that Cleaver; author of "Soul on Ice," had fled the state.

But yesterday he approved such a complaint on an affidavit of FBI agent Fred ligarde. It also was enough for U. S. Commissioner Richard Goldsmith, who set the ball

Ligarde said Cleaver's wife, Kathleen, had withdrawn \$33,000 from their local bank account and last Sunday flew on a one-way ticket to New York paid for "by a third party."

He also recalled that last Oct. 13 at a Brooklyn rall; Cleaver said he was not gling to surrender to the Alfult Authority and that the Black Panther's and the black community would "hide him out."

CAUSE

These facts, Ligarde said, establish probable cause to believe Cleaver has fled the state.

Cleaver, 33, was ordered back into prison as a parole violator after his arrest April 6 in a Black Panther gunfight with Oakland police.

Cleaver and two police officers were wounded in the exchange. Bobby Hutton, 17, party treasurer, was killed.







This memorandum is being submitted for the purpose of furnishing background information on the Subject in order to familiarize each case agent with the Subject, his activities, close associates and relatives so that logical leads can be developed therefrom.

The Subject was born to LEROY and THELMA ROBINSON CLEAVER in Little Rock, Arkansas on August 31, 1935. He is one of six children born to this couple. He was raised in Arkansas until the age of 7 (1943) when his parents moved to California. He resided in the area until he was imprisoned in 1958. He dropped out of school at the age of 17 after having reached the eleventh grade. Background information developed by the California Department of Corrections that the Subject was a user of marijuana and sold same since the age of 17. According to the California Department of Correction's records, the Subject's brothers and sisters are as follows:

On January 13, 1950, Subject was arrested for burglary and petty theft and served time until paroled in May of 1951. He was arrested again on November 5, 1952 for possession of narcotics. On January 16, 1953 he was remarked as a parole violator and in December, 1953, he was paroled. On February 13, 1954, he was arrested by the Los Angeles Police Department for suspect of possession of narcotics and was sentenced to State prison on July 9, 1954. He was paroled on December 3, 1956.

On November 3, 1957 he was arrest for assault with intent to commit murder and rape and on 3/11/58 he was sentenced to State prison for six months to fourteen years. He was paroled in December of 1966 at which time he immediately proceeded to the San Francisco, Calif., area where he obtained employment with "Ramparts Magazine".

Prior to this extended period of imprisonment, Subject held numerous jobs, none for any extended length of time. These jobs are as follows:

During Subject's confinement on the assault with intent to commit murder conviction, he affiliated himself while at San Quentin with the NOI - Black Moslem philosophy, and also was able to complete his studies and gained the In addition equivalent of a high school education in 1962. to completing high school, he took vocational courses in baking, welding (which he failed) and offset printing. He indicated his religious preference as Catholic. When first incarcerated, however, he never showed interest in religious services and in subsequent interviews indicated he had no religion. The Subject had no union affiliations prior to his release from prison. During his imprisonment, he developed a close relationship, apparently through correst pondence, with San Francisco Attorney BEVERLY AXELROD. 150 Carm Miss AXELROD assisted the Subject in preparing legal papers to obtain his release on parole and on his manuscript to which & he had devoted much writing time while in prison. Since his release he has aligned himself with the Black Panther Party and currently serve as Minister of Information of that organization. was also nominated as the Peace and Freedom Party candidate for president in the last national election. Shortly after his release his manuscript which is considered to be an autobiography was published and has become a best seller. The book is entitled "Soul on Ice" and is published by McGraw Hill, New York City.]has been in contact with the Subject according to the Department of Corrections and is apparently the Subject Subject has reportedly received in excess or \$40,000 in royalties from his book. On May 2, 1967, a group of 24 Negro males, who identified themselves as members of the Black Panther Party made a protest march and appearance at the California State Capitol in Sacramento armed with rifles and handguns. As a result of the ensuing confrontation, the Subject was arrested and charged with violation of parole. His employers, the "Ramparts Magazine" interceded claiming he had been assigned as a reporter for "Ramparts" to cover the State Capitol confrontation and that he had not appeared there as part of the rading party and subsequently should not have been arrested as a result of the confrontation. was released and no further action was taken to revoke his parole at that time. He continued on bail until April 6, 1968 at which time he and several other members of the BPP became involved in a shoot-out with the Oakland PD resulting in the death of BOBBY HUTTON, Treasurer of the BPP and the wounding of the Subject in his left foot and ankle by a shotgun blast.

His parole was revoked as a result of this shoot out and he was returned to prisonl. In a legal action brought by his attorney, CHARLES GARRY in the Superior Court in Solano County, California, the revocation of his parole was declared illegal by Superior Court Judge RAYMOND SHERMAN ruling that the Subject's parole had been revoked because of "His political activities". The Subject was then continued on parole until the last part of September when the California Court of Appeals reversed the Superior Court ruling and stated that the California Department of Correction's action in revoking Subject's parole was not illegal. The Court of

Appeals ordered CLEAVER to be returned to prison and his parole revoked as of November 27, 1968. The California Department of Corrections wrote the Subject a letter on approximately November 20, 1968 advising the Subject that he should turn himself in to parole authorities at the State Building at 9:00 a.m. on November 27, 1968. The Subject failed to appear and a warrant was issued for his arrest as a parole violator on that date.

With Subject's close association with the BPP and the Peace and Freedom Party, he traveled extensively throughout the United States speaking at many colleges and before many groups. The extent of his actions and associates is undoubtedly extensive as a result of this far reaching activity. It is believed unlikely, however, that Subject would rely on any of the acquaintances he made on these speaking engagements to hide him. Therefore, the following list of close associates will be limited, developed in the Bay Area in his association with the BPP, PFP and "Ramparts Magazine". 

Cleaver's Wife Stirs Up The FB

Federal agents here were studying the possibility that Kathleen Cleaver might have said enough in New York to warrant charging her with harboring a fugitive. On Tuesday night Mrs. Cleaver, in talking about

her missing Black Panther scoffed at these charges, husband, Eldridge, told a rejlecter

"Dfficially, the last time Issay him was November 24".
but unofficially, I saw him last night."

Federal agents here, who have been searching for her husband ever since he failed to show up as a parole violator, said the maximum penalty for harboring a fugitive is five years in prison and a \$5000 fine.

They wouldn't, however, say they intended to charge Mrs. Cleaver with his offense, when she returned to San Francisco. Friends, said she was due here late yesterday.

"We are interested, how ver, in interviewing her as to the whereabouts of Eldridge Cleaver;" said FBI Agent Charles Bates.

Federal officials also stood behind an FBI affadayit which said Mrs. Cleaver left town with some \$33,000 she withdrew from a bank account.

Nrs. Cleaver, in her New York television interview, scolled at these charges,







CHARLES R. GARRY, San Francisco, attorney for subject, advised he last saw subject night of 11/21/68 at CLEAVER's defence fund meeting at California Hall, San Francisco. He had had no contact with subject or information regarding him since that date. GARRY advised he has no knowledge as to subject's location and prefers not to be placed in the position of knowing. He admitted, however, that it would be his duty to advise the FRI should he learn of CLEAVER's whereabouts. He opined that if CLEAVER is still in the United States, he will appear at Alameda County, Calif., on 12/23/68 to face pending charges as both he and GARRY feel that subject can beat pending charges. CARRY states he, GARRY, instructed KATHLEEN CLEAVER to withdraw the sum in excess of \$30,000 from their bank account to prevent attachments.

He believed he might have the newspapers containing the article at an apartment where he stays in the area; however, he was not sure they had not been thrown away.

He advised if he were called to the witness stand he would testify to the length of his subscription to "The Black Panther" newspaper and to the facts he received the issues of March 21 and May 2, 1970, via U.S. Mails and recalled reading CLEAVER's article.

He advised he would be in the United States Air Force until sometime in 1972 and if he were not shipped overseas he would be available to testify.

He mid as far as any testimony was concerned, he would be hesitant to testify, but he would tell the truth if placed under oath on the witness stand. He did express concern if called to testify that his or his family's safety might be in jeopardy, and he did not want to cause any trouble for his family.


Subsequent to making this statement, he was transported to a residence where he admitted staying at _______ and he looked for the issues of "The Black Panther" dated March 21 and May 2, 1970; however, he advised after looking for them he could not find those particular issues. He assumed they had been thrown away, as he does not maintain any permanent file or place where he keeps all issues of the newspaper.

He advised he had never received any pamplet form of the CLEAVER article.



He doubts if he received more than a dozen copies and is unable to recall when he received his final copy. He claimed he had received no copies of the paper since his return to civilian life in January, 1970 and has no recollection concerning the Cleaver article.

On July 7, 1970, Naval Investigative Service Office, 12th Naval District, reported that commanding officers in that district had been requested to appropriately canvass personnel to ascertain the extent of the circulation of "The Black Panther" containing Cleaver's article and the results of checks to date were negative.





BLACK PANTHER PARTY, aka Black Panther Party for Self Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December, 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by Bobby George Seale, BPP Chairman, and Huey P. Newton, BPP Minister of Defense. Newton is presently serving a sentence of 2 to 15 years on a conviction of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther," which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service," states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, George Mason Murray, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement, "...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.





SOVIET INFLUENCE IN THE BLACK EXTREMIST MOVEMENT

William L. Patterson, CPUSA National Committee member, authored an article entitled "The Black Panther Party" which appeared in the November, 1969, issue of "Political Affairs" which is self-described as the theoretical journal of the CPUSA. Patterson, in this article, stated in part as follows: "The membership of the Communist Party should stand in the forefront in defense of the Black Panthers. While conducting a dialogue with the Panthers on the differences that exist between us, this must not stand in the way of solidly supporting the efforts of the Panthers to defeat racism and bring about unity of the black and white working class. For we know that racism feeds fascism. The destruction of racism leads to a decisive defeat of fascism."

During an emergency meeting of the CPUSA National Committee held in May, 1970, Claude Lightfoot, a member of that committee, stressed the importance of obtaining over one million signatures on a "genocide petition" which the Party planned to submit to the United Nations. The Party's objective in circulating this petition was to link millions of blacks with the peace movement by convincing them that the Party is paying proper attention to their day-to-day demands and requirements. The petition charged that Federal, state and city officials in the United States are guilty of genocide because of their treatment of black America, particularly the BPP. The petition was prepared under the auspices of the Continuations Committee, established during March, 1970, at the communist initiated emergency conference to defend the rights of the BPP to exist.

Eldridge Cleaver, BPP Minister of Information, in an article appearing in "The Black Panther" issue of March 15, 1970, reprimanded white radicals for not doing enough for the BPP and threatened a race war. In the article

he stated: "If the so-called freedom loving white people of America do not stand up now ... and put an end to the persecution ..., the black people will have to go it alone ... and step forward alone. This will mean the end of our dreams for a Class war which America needs and a beginning of a Race war which America cannot endure."


Articles have appeared in the "Daily World" and "People's World," both of which are communist newspapers, criticizing Cleaver and advocating unity between blacks and whites. For example the June 6, 1970, issue of "People's World" contained a feature article in which the writer said Cleaver "succumbed to petty-bourgeois despair" when he issued "his panicky cally for suicidal adventurism."

The CPUSA is oriented with the Soviets who are basically white Europeans. The BPP wants to orient itself with guerrilla-type nonwhite Marxists.

BLACK PANTHER PARTY,
Also Known As
Black Panther Party for Self-Defense

According to its official newspaper, the Black Panther Party (BPP) was started during December 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, BPP Minister of Defense. NEWTON was sentenced in 1968 to serve 2 to 15 years after being convicted of manslaughter in connection with the killing of an Oakland police officer.

The official newspaper, "The Black Panther", which further describes itself as the "Black Community News Service", states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to in the publication as "pigs" who should be killed.

"The Black Panther" issue of September 7, 1968, contains an editorial by BPP Minister of Education, GEORGE MASON MURRAY, which ends with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is a revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere." Dynamite! Black Power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

Included in the introduction to an article appearing in the October 5, 1968, edition of "The Black Panther" is the statement"...we will not dissent from American Government. We will overthrow it."

Issues of "The Black Panther" regularly contain quotations from the writings of Chairman MAO Tse-tung of the People's Republic of China and feature MAO's statement that "political power grows out of the barrel of a gun."

The national headquarters of the BPP is located at 3106 Shattuck Avenue, Berkeley, California. Branches have been established at various locations throughout the United States.

"US" was chartered by the State of California as a non-profit corporation in September 1966, with offices at 8211 South Broadway, Los Angeles, California. The corporation charter alleges that "US" is primarily an Afro-American cultural organization.

During the spring of 1968, however, a source advised that MAULANA RON KARENGA, true name Ronie McKinley Everett, Founder-Chairman of "US", published a booklet entitled, "The Quotable Karenga", in which he talked of revolution, black power and condemned Christianity for the plight of the black man.

In this booklet, KARENGA stated: "...You must have a cultural revolution before the violent revolution. The cultural revolution gives identity, purpose and direction.
...The revolution being fought now is a revolution to win the minds of our people. If we fail to win this we cannot wage the violent one. ...When the word is given we'll see how tough you are. When it's 'burn', let's see how much you burn. When it's 'blow up', let's see how much you blow up. And when it's 'take that white girl's head too', we'll really see how tough you are. ...

The above source advised that "US" members are required to study and memorize this booklet. "US" members are also assigned Swahili names which they use in lieu of their given names.

A second source advised that KARENGA had spoken at various meetings in Los Angeles at which time he talked of creating an "US" army of 1,000 men, obtaining weapons and ammunition, guerrila warfare tactics and revolution. KARENGA also stated, "The only way to get life is to take a life and as we get stronger, we will take what we want from the white man's United States." He also stated that if the police killed any "US" members, the "US" organization would kill some of them.

The first source above advised that KARENGA also stated that race riots throughout the country were not riots but were actually revolts or revolutions and that the black people were going to win their freedom by violence if necessary.

A third source advised that KARENGA stated that a revolution would take place in the future and that no one can believe in black revolution without believing in armed conflict because the two go hand in hand.

The first source above advised that the "US" organization has approximately 20 militant, hard-core members, a number of whom have been arrested for possession of incendiary devices, attempted arson, armed robbery and burglary. "US" members are known to carry firearms. There are an estimated additional 75 to 100 individuals, ranging in age from 4 to 40, who attend meetings and social activities sponsored by "US" which are closed to anyone not of the Negro race.

A fourth source advised that in addition to the offices at 8211 South Broadway, Los Angeles, "US" also maintains an office at 7228 South Broadway, wherein they hold most of their meetings and social activities.

The "US" organization opened an affiliate office in San Diego, California.

The word "US" refers to the personal pronoun and is not an abbreviation.



With regard to the legality or propriety of duplicating FBI wanted notices, the Legal Research Unit of the Training Division has advised that the Government has no right involving copyrights where its material is concerned and, therefore, there is no infringement of a copyright involved in the duplicating of a FBI wanted notice.* It should be noted that since our primary purpose in putting out wanted notice such as a wanted flyer or identification order is to generate publicity concerning an individual's wanted status, we would have difficulty in establishing a sound basis for objecting to action by somebody else in duplicating and giving further distribution to one of our wanted notices. With specific reference to Eldridge Cleaver, the subject of the attached wanted flyer, it is noted that we have developed information that he is in Algeria from where he cannot be extradited.

While we could conduct inquiries to determine the identities of the actual individual or company responsible for reproducing an enlarged version of the Cleaver wanted flyer, it is recommended no action be taken to do so since there is no legal basis on which to object to the reproduction, even though the enlarged reproduction is being sold commercially.



Such decisions concerning violations of Federal law are within the province of the Attorney General. Voluminous data regarding Cleaver have been furnished to him. Our assistance in effectinghis apprehension under the Fugitive Felon Act has been requested and he will be arrested upon his return to the United States.

Responsibility for protection of the President rests with the United States Secret Service. I have forwarded a copy of your letter to the Director of that organization in Washington for any assistance he may be able to render.

During this administration and the past administration, have read of the arrest and conviction of people who have threatened the President of the United States, under an appropriate law.

Last night, on nationally televised T.V., on a program called 60 Minutes, conducted by Harry Reasoner and Mike Wallace, a black panther leader, I think, Eldridge Cleaver, used language which to me, seemed to be a clear threat on the life of the President of the United States. So far as I know, no action has yet been taken and it may be that Cleaver's remarks were legally worded in such a way that they did not constitute a threat. From what he said, however, if the threat was not made, it was certainly intended. He mentioned the President's name and said that he would shoot his way into the Senate and ' blow Senator McClellan's head off and then mentioned President Nixon, you and others.

Perhaps your office intends to investigate this matter. If not, and I am incorrect in my position, please let me know. threat was made and he is not being prosecuted, I would like to know why.

A confidential source, who has furnished reliable information in the past, recently advised that individuals working in the Office of the Committee to Defend the Panthers, Washington, D.C., Chapter, were in possession of a letter, hand written, which bore the signature of Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party (BPP).

The Committee to Defend the Panthers has been publicly identified as an organization formed to raise funds for legal expenses and to inform the public about the BPP and their treatment by Government, courts and media. The Committee to Defend the Panthers is the only Defense Committee authorized by the BPP. The Washington branch of the Committee opened an office in July, 1970, in Room 1021 of the Dupont Circle Building, 1346 Connecticut Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C.

The BPP is characterized in the appendix.

Source advised that the above mentioned letter indicated Cleaver did not like Algeria, did not like the language of the Algerians, and felt the people were "cold." The letter indicated Cleaver desired to return to the United States, but Charles Garry had told him to stay there until the United States Government is overthrown. In the letter Cleaver mentioned that he haded to stay away from his wife

The Bureau is not aware of any other instances wherein field offices have received unusual requests for identification orders or wanted flyers, therefore, it would appear unnecessary to alert other field offices at this time. These wanted posters, of course, are furnished to postmasters for appropriate display in the various post offices and not for distribution. You should insure that the postmaster at the University Branch is made aware of this fact and request that his employees at the post office are similarly advised.

These wanted posters are printed to afford maximum publicity to the fugitive status of an individual. It is, therefore, desirable to distribute the posters to logical sources to achieve maximum results but at the same time it is not possible to completely control the distribution so that certain groups, such as college students, are prevented from possession or display of same. As a matter of fact, it is not a violation of Federal law to reproduce or alter an FEI identification order or wanted flyer.

You should, however, in light of the information in resirtel, examine your procedures as to distribution to insure the best possible use is being made of the wanted posters.

It is time told the unidentified female that she did not have supplies in sufficient quantity to give to the general public and that if anybody wanted copies they should communicate with this office.

At this time the unidentified female stated that she had heard from an unidentified Narcotics agent who happened to be in the Postal Inspector's Office at that time that he had heard rumors at the University of Hawaii that Political Science students were trying to obtain copies of these posters to post on their dormitory walls in a form of "hero worship." Efforts by opin down the source of this information were to no avail. dutifully brought this information to the attention of the SAC.

While it is not known whether the action being initiated at the University of Hawaii will develop into a nationwide trend, nevertheless it is possible this will be a new "college fad" in the ensuing weeks, and the Bureau might desire to alert field offices to this possibility wherein they receive unusually heavy demands for IOs or wanted flyers on the above captioned individuals that would not be consistent with normal distribution. The Bureau might also consider the possibility at the same time of instructing field offices to alert their postmasters within their districts to a similar situation so that the appropriate FBI Office can be alerted to unusually heavy requests.

The Bureau can be assured that further inquiries received similar to vill be answered in a like manner. Honolulu's Postmaster and Postal Inspector are being appropriately alerted. If there is any additional pertinent information in this matter the Bureau will be appropriately advised.

- 1. I am an attorney of record for the defendant in this action which is set for jury trial on February 24, 1978 in the Alameda County Superior Court .

- 2. On information and belief, the witness subpoenaed, or his duly authorized representative, has in his possession or under his control the documents described in Exhibit "A", which is attached to the accompanying subpoena duces tecum.

The information requested is material and essential to the proper and fair presentation of the defense of the Defendant, and will facilitate the ascertainment of the facts in this case, for the following reasons which I set forth on information and belief, based on my examination of documents available to me.

Eldridge Cleaver was indicted on April 24, 1968, on three charges of attempted murder and three charges of assault with a deadly weapon. All charges stem from an incident on April 6, 1968, involving members of the Oakland and Emeryville Police Departments members of the Black Panther Party. Other Black Panther members rticipating in the incident are Bobby Hutton, Warren Wells, orles Bursey, David Hilliard, Terry Cotton, John Scott, Wendell

Wide, Donnell Lankford. Each of the persons allegedly assaulted by

Eldridge Cleaver -- Nolan Darnell, Richard Jensen, and John Schlim --

were at the time members of the Oakland Police Department.

Each of the officers who has testified has explained his at the location of the incident occurred as a result of police practices and procedures. However, on April 6, 1968, the Cleaver and other members of the Black Panther Party and they were the objects of a police vendetta. On and before date of the incident, Eldridge Cleaver received numerous telescales from unnamed sources, such calls coming not only to his to whatever house he visited. The pattern of the calls,

and the fact that the anonymous callers somehow knew both Cleaver's travel plans and his whereabouts, strongly suggests electronic surveillance of Eldridge Cleaver's phone, of the phones in the Black Panther Party office, and of the phones of Eldridge Cleaver's friends, acquaintances and fellow party members.

Emory Douglas, the Minister of Culture of the Black Panther
Party at the time of the incident, has testified that on April 5,
1968, he received anonymous telephone calls at Black Panther
Party Headquarters, which calls threatened the lives of Black Panther
Party members, and specifically threatened the life of Eldridge
Cleaver. Such calls are believed to result from intelligence
activity of some governmental agency.

On April 6, 1968, the date of the incident, a person claiming to be associated with the San Francisco Police Department came to Black Panther Party Headquarters in Oakland, California to say he would be a pipeline for the Black Panthers, and stating further that the police were going to try to trick the Panthers so that the police could kill them. The officer further warned that the Oakland Police Department was planning to raid Black Panther Headquarters and advised that any weapons be removed therefrom. This alleged policeman has not been identified, and it is believed that he was an operative of a government law enforcement agency, acting in an undercover capacity to infiltrate, spy upon or provoke the Black Panthers.

The Federal Bureau of Investigation maintained surveillance on Black Panther Party Headquarters and upon party-related locations beginning no later than February 26, 1968, and continuing up to and including the date of the incident. In addition, the long distance numbers called from Cleaver's home phone were investigated as early

as December, 1967, by the Federal Bureau of Investigation; some persons to whom Cleaver placed calls were also investigated. Cleaver was listed on the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Security Index; a separate listing on the FBI's "Rabble Rouser Index" was reserved for the Black Panther Party and identified members thereof, including Eldridge and Kathleen Cleaver. By the date of the incident one or more informants reporting to the FBI [and/or to other governmental agencies] had infiltrated the Black Panther Party and were in positions whence they could both report on the planned activities of the Black Panther and also effectuate disruptive tactics directed by their employer agency. The FBI regularly transmitted to local law enforcement agencies information gathered from such informants and surveillance, and notified such agencies of the plans and activities of Eldridge Cleaver and the Black Panther Party.

As early as 1961, the California Department of Corrections had targeted Eldridge Cleaver as a black activist and follower of the Black Muslim Movement. Prior to the release of Cleaver from incarceration in December, 1966, the FBI requested the Department of Corrections to identify and closely watch such "Malcolm X types" and to notify the FBI upon their release so the FBI could continue surveillance. Cleaver was so identified.

Public documents [see e.g., Church Committee report]
have established that on or about the date of the incident domestic
intelligence activities were conducted by various government law
enforcement and intelligence agencies against so-called black
extremist groups, activities designed to spy upon such groups, to
disrupt their activities, to assassinate or cause the assassination
of their leaders, to spread lies and untruths about such groups, to

cause internal dispute and dissension, in short, to eradicate such groups, including the Black Panther Party. Much of this activity was illegal. Eldridge Cleaver, the Black Panther Party, and its members, Cleaver's friends, and with organizations which he associated, were targets of such surveillance and activities conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation.

The FBI has recently released a voluminous amount of heavily censored documents concerning the COINTELPRO operation against Cleaver and the Black Panther Party. These documents show a concerted intelligence of the type described above. However, according to news reports over 16,000 pages of documents have been held back. Defendant seeks such of these documents as come within the purview of this subpoena.

The just described intelligence activities evidence the interest on and about April 6, 1968, of domestic law enforcement and intelligence agencies in the activities of Eldridge Cleaver and the Black Panther Party. Further, the killing of Bobby Hutton during the incident and the attendant violations of State and Federal law spurred the interest of said agencies. The FBI conducted an investigation of the incident, and has taken statements from witnesses in addition to those heretofore produced at trial or provided to the Oakland Police Department or to the Alameda County District Attorney.

On information and belief, defendant Cleaver was a target of surveillance, conducted by this agency, including illegal surveillance, and was a victim of activities, including illegal activities, of this agency designed to destroy or discredit Cleaver and/or the Black Panther Party and its leaders and members; the events of April 6, 1968, are partially attributable to such

activities conducted by this agency; this agency was a party of the law enforcement conspiracy to discredit and destroy Cleaver, the Black Panther Party, and its leadership; further, this agency participated in an investigation of the April 6, 1968 incident and has information relating thereto.

Defendant needs the subpoenaed materials on surveillance of himself and of the parties described in Exhibit "A" to the Subpoena in order to prepare his defense, for the following reasons:

- 1. The evidence relates directly to the truth of police officers' assertions that their presence at the scene of the arrest was the result of normal police procedures, rather than the result of a purposeful and concerted conspiracy among various law enforcement agencies to harass, intimidate or even assassinate Eldridge Cleaver and/or other Black Panthers.
- 2. The evidence also directly bears upon whether the officers' firing upon Eldridge Cleaver and the other Black Panther Party members present at the scene of the incident was an attempt to effectuate an arrest, was in self-defense or was unprovoked and/or excessive force intended to kill Eldridge Cleaver and/or other Black Panthers without legal cause or justification.
- 3. The material also relates to Cleaver's state of mind on April 6, 1968, and to whether the officers were acting in the course of official duty during that incident.
- 4. The records will also relate to the truthfulness of witnesses' statements and testimony concerning the incident, an issue particularly important here where the likelihood that Bobby Hutton was murdered by police officers immediately following his arrest provides motive, bias and interest for the police

officers to have distorted their public testimony about the preceding conduct of Hutton and Cleaver.

5. The material subpoenaed is not available for inspection by the general public, and the defendant cannot obtain such material through his own efforts. Defendant has prosecuted an F.O.I.A. suit to obtain such materials, but such materials to a great extent, have not been obtained.

At the time of the incident which gave rise to the charges filed against the defendant in this matter, and for the past months since the defendant's return to this jurisdiction, there has been a great deal of publicity concerning this case in the various news media.

Inasmuch as the time of trial is now approaching and it has been indicated that motions will soon be before the Court in which evidence will be produced, in order that further hearings and the trial be conducted in a fair and objective manner, without being influenced by comments and discussions outside the courtroom, the Court makes the following order:

IT IS THE ORDER OF THIS COURT that no party to this action, nor any attorney connected with this case as defense counsel or as prosecutor, nor any other attorney, nor any judicial officer or employee, nor any public official, including but not limited to any chief of police, nor any sheriff, nor any agent, deputy or

employee of any such persons, nor any grand juror, nor any witness having appeared before the Grand Jury in this matter, nor any person subpoenaed to testify at the trial or any pre-trial hearing of this matter, shall release or authorize the release for public dissemination of any purported extrajudicial statement of the defendant relating to this case, nor shall any such persons release or authorize the release of any documents, exhibits, or any evidence which such person believes or alleges to be relevant to this case, nor shall any such person make any statement for public dissemination as to the existence or possible existence of any document, exhibit, or any other evidence, including but not limited to any statements or evidence produced at the Grand Jury hearing in this matter, or any other evidence which such person believes or alleges to be relevant to this case.

Nor shall any such persons express outside of court an opinion or make any comment for public dissemination as to the weight, value or effect of any evidence as tending to establish guilt or innocence.

Nor shall any such persons issue any statement as to the identity of any prospective witness or his probable testimony or the effect thereof.

Nor shall any person make any out-of-court statement as to the nature, source, or effect of any purported evidence alleged to have been accumulated as a result of the investigation of this matter.

Nor shall any such person or any witness, whether or not under subpoena, make any statements as to the content, nature, substance, or effect of any testimony which may be given in any proceeding related to this matter, except that a witness may discuss any matter with any attorney of record or agent thereof.

This order does not include any of the following:

(1) Factual statements of any of the defendant's name, age,

residence, occupation, and family status.

- (2) The circumstances of the arrest, namely, the time and place of the arrest, the identity of the arresting and investigating officers and agencies, and the length of the investigation.
- (3) The nature, substance, and text of the charge, including a brief description of the offenses charged.
- (4) The scheduling and result of any stage of the judicial proceedings held in open court in an open or public session.
 - (5) A request for assistance in obtaining evidence.
- (6) Any information as to any person not in custody who is sought as a possible suspect or witness, nor any statement aimed at warning the public of any possible danger as to such person not in custody.
- (7) A request for assistance in the obtaining of evidence or the names of possible witnesses.

Further, this Order is not intended to preclude any witness from discussing any matter in connection with the case with any of the attorneys representing the defendant or the People, or any representatives of such attorneys.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a copy of this Order shall be attached to any subpoena served on any witness in this matter, and that the return of service of the subpoena shall also include the fact of service of a copy of this Order.

This Order shall be in force until this matter has been disposed of or until further order of court.

The attached copy of an article appearing in the New York Times of this date reflects that Eldridge Cleaver, a fugitive from justice from the State of California, is currently heading a ten-person delegation to North Vietnam. Included in the delegation are Elaine Brown, the vice minister of information of the Black Panthers, and Jan Austin of Ramparts magazine. This is to request that an investigation of any potential violations of Federal statutes be conducted.

In the event Cleaver, or the other Americans traveling with him in North Vietnam, should commit any overt act giving aid and comfort to North Vietnam, it is our opinion that a violation of the treason statute, 18 U.S.C. 2381, could result. Such overt activity might consist, for example, of radio broadcasts by Cleaver or the others on behalf of the North Vietnamese or the making speeches reflecting adherence to their cause.

In addition, we have been advised by the Department of State that Cleaver does not currently hold a valid United States passport. Consequently, his departure from the United States would appear to be in violation of 8 U.S.C. 1185(b). If any of the other persons traveling with Cleaver possess valid United States passports and use them for travel in North Vietnam, or any other restricted area, they would be in violation of 18 U.S.C.

Moreover, should/Cleaver or the others engage in any financial transactions of whatever nature during their sojourn in North Vietnam, they would be in violation of the Foreign Assecs

The September 26, 1970 issue of "The Black Panther", the official BPP newspaper, contains an article captioned "Statement by Eldridge Cleaver to GI's in South Vietnam". . According to this article the contents were a speech delivered by Cleaver over the Voice of Vietnam Radio Fanoi in August of In it Cleaver calls for U.S. soldiers in Vietnam to "desert--if you don't want to do anything else. If you can get up the courage to do it, you should start ripping off those Uncle Toms and those pigs who're giving you orders to kill Vietnamese people. You should start blowing them away. Throw those hand grenades at them. And put the dynamite up under their houses, up under their jeeps. And rip off General Abrams."

STATEMENT BY ELDRIDGE CLEAVER TO

GI'S IN SOUTH VIET NAM

This is Eldridge Cleaver. I'm in Hanoi right lnow, traveling with the U.S. Anti-Imperialist Delegation. We've been in Asia now for two months. We've visited North Korea and China, and we're now in the Democratic Republic of Vietnam. Our delegation is made up of a cross-section of the anti-war movement; and this includes two members of the Black Panther Party. We came to Asia to check out the situation as a result of the change in the government's policy under Richard Pig Nixon. Particularly, we wanted to find out what was the situation in Asia after the invasion of Cambodia. And we had this opportunity to talk to you cats over the Voice of Vietnam Radio. And this is a rare opportunity. So we're taking full advantage of it. We'd never get this opportunity over the Voice of America, or over the Armed Forces Radio Service, because those pigs keep you cats jacked up to where you don't know what's going on in the world. Probably the only thing you can read is the crap in Time Magazine or Life Magazine or the Stars and Stripes, which is not going to tell it like it is.

I want to say something in particular to the Black GI's — brothers who've gotten tricked off into Vietnam by racist pigs, who have you over here committing murder and genocide, all kinds of atrocious acts against the Vietnamese People. We've been talking to representatives of the VietCong, talking to people in North Vietnam, and we've been told about what's been going on and what you're doing down there. And I find it fdifficult to understand what's going on inside you leats' heads, because I know that you know about Richard Nixon. You know that he's a racist pig, and that he doesn't care anything about Black People. You know that a pig like Spiro Agnew is the enemy of Black People; and, that they're

nothing but a bunch of cheap politicians, power-hungry politicians who're running a game, and who're fronting you off - have you over here at the risk of your life, and at the risk of many deeper interests, which I want to talk about in a minute. But they have you going through all these changes, supposedly in defense of America. They tell the people in America that it's necessary to invade Cambodia in order to protect "our boys" in Vietnam. And then they tell you that you have to stay in Vietnam in order to protect the American People and to stop communism. But this is nothing but a bunch of words, a bunch of rhetoric that has been worked out by the would-be world conquerors to justify what they're doing. What they want to do is to dominate the world and control the world so that their big corporations can exploit the natural resources of the people and enslave the people, just so they can have power and control the world. That's all that's involved. There's no such thing as having a right to be over here. There's no such thing as the Vietnamese people wanting them over here. They've got a few bootlickers over here, like the Thieu-Ky clique in Saigon, and all those other bootlicking puppets they've had in the past--chumps like Chiang Kai-shek, sitting off in the middle of the water, talking about he's the rightful ruler of China. This is nothing but a bunch of power politics, and they're using your cats as cannon-fodder to carry this out.

I live in the state of California myself. And I know Richard Nixon. I been checking this chump out over the years. And I wouldn't risk the life of a fly, of a dead fly for anything that lying chump would say. And you should know it, if you don't know, that there's a war going inside of Babylon, inside the United States of America. Not a day goes by now that you can't hear about

brother or sister getting offed by a brother, or some brother or sister getting offed by a pig. Because Black people have risen up throughout the U.S. and they're moving for their liberation, and we're trying to put together a Black Army so that we can take our freedom from these pigs who are fully determined to keep it from us. And we find

that the bulk of our troops are either in prison or over in Vietnam.

It is the duty of the young warriors to secure the tribe, to secure the people, to fight and to die for the security of their people. I mean, that's the duty of young warriors, that has been the duty of young warriors all down through history. But it's definitely not the duty of young warriors to be way over here in Vietnam, carrying out atrocious, vicious murder and genocide against these people, while these same racist pigs who have you over here are carrying out genocide and vicious oppression against your people back home. I know that you know about this. You're probably saying to yourself that you're just going to stick it out' and if you live, you'll go back and join in the struggle and do something about it. But there's no reason why you have to wait until you get back before you start moving. As a matter of fact, if you try to do that, some of you are not going to make it back, a lot of you are not going to make it back.

And in talking to the representatives of the Viet Cong, some of the cats and some of the chicks who've actually been down there shooting at you chumps, they tell us that it seems to be more and more Black G.I.'s on the front lines these days. And from the amount of casualties, the amount of dead bodies coming back to the U.S., we know, and we know historically, that these White racist pigs are fronting the brothers off and sticking them out front, so that they get ripped off.

Now the reason for this is that in the first place they didn't want you running around in the streets of the U.S., because of the struggle that's

going on there. They didn't want you there because you would have participated in the struggle. So you were faced with either going to jail or going to Vietnam. And now that you're in Vietnam, they'll train you to be murderers and to use guns and to use hand grenades and all other forms of weapons. So you know that they don't want you to go back to Babylon now, with all the things that are going on there. So what they're doing is programming this thing so that you cats are getting phased out on the battlefield. They're sticking you out front so that you'll get offed. And that way they'll solve two problems with one little move: they solve the problem of keeping a large number of troops in Vietnam; and they solve the problem of keeping young warriors off the streets of Babylon. And that's a dirty, vicious game that's being run on you. And I don't see how you can go for it.

There's a large anti-war movement in the U.S. The Congress and the Senate is divided over whether or not the troops should be withdrawn now or later. People no longer argue about whether or not the war is justified. Even that foul, perverted pig Nixon doesn't do it in the U.S. He may be saying that to you cats over here, because they have you isolated from the main current of events, and the main current of news and the thinking of the people. But everybody now is talking about when can the troops be withdrawn, and all of that. And while they go through all these jive changes, all this verbal bull, you're out there on the line. And everyday you're getting ripped off. And you don't know whether you're going to live two more days or one more day. But I say that it's necessary, and it's your duty to take action now, or to put an end to this. Because your life is too valuable, and your people need you.

So instead of just walking around on a trip, hoping that you survive, why don't you do something to insure your survival. Demand. You can get together, draw up a petition and send it to

the lawyer of the Black Panther Party, Attorney Charles R. Garry. He's a Black Panther lawyer, and, he'll deal with this case, if you cats ask him to do this. His address is 341 Market Street, San Francisco, California. And you can figure out some way to get in touch with this cat, and

express your opposition to the war.

Another thing I want to let you know about is Brother Huey P. Newton is out of jail. You probably have heard about this. He's back on the streets giving leadership to the Black Panther Party again. And the struggle is really speeding up. And we need you brothers there to join us in the struggle for the freedom and the liberation of our people. And this is necessary. And it's your duty. Our Chairman, Bobby Seale, is in jail right now, and they're trying to put him on trial for his life in the state of Connecticut, in New Haven. They want to execute the brother. And you brothers can create an issue that would be very helpful. If you would get a petition together and get all the brothers-not only the brothers, but the White cats there too, anybody that can relate to reality-get them to sign this petition. And send copies of it to Charles R. Garry, our attorney. And send it to the NAACP. It doesn't matter who you send it to, but just make some noise about this. And let the people know and let the world know that you don't appreciate being over here in Vietnam, fighting for so-called freedom, while your brothers and sisters are being railroaded through these jimcrow, racist courts back in Babylon. You should do some of these things.

Also, if you have enough soul and if you have yourself together, instead of stumbling around down there until you get ripped off-and these cats will rip you off-you should desert-if you don't want to do anything else. If you can get up the courage to do it, you should start ripping off those uncle toms and those pigs who're giving you-

orders to kill the Vietnamese people. You should start blowing them away. Throw those hand grenades at them. And put that dynamite up under their houses, up under their jeeps. And rip off General Abrams. Do something to let the people know that the revolutionaries in the armed forces want this war brought to an end. And later for them. Because they're killing you anyway. And they got the stockades all over the U.S., all the stockades are full of people, a whole lot of brothers who've been trying to protest against the war and express themselves. They're just driving them through these courtmartials and giving them a whole lot of time trying to fight and die for democracy, when they know that democracy doesn't exist. Our struggle in the U.S. is to create democracy for the people, because it doesn't exist. It has never existed. It just exists on paper. And these pigs have thrown the paper away today.

So you cats should either just in mass stand up and say that you're not going to fight no more and you want to go back to Babylon and deal with the real issues and deal with the pigs who have sent you over there and have got so many of, your friends ripped off for nothing. Demand an end to the war; or, desert; or, begin to carry out revolutionary activity, such as sabotage and offing these racist pigs, so that they don't come back to Babylon so we have to deal with them too. Because one of the important things that we're confronted with these days is: they take these cats to Vietnam, turn them into cold-blooded, vicious murderers, and then take them back to the U.S. and put them on the police forces. And turn them loose on the Black community. And we have to contend with that. And they're treating us the same way they want to treat the Viet Cong. But the news is that the brothers and sisters in Babylon have gotten hip to the situation.

They've picked up some techniques and they're treating those pigs the same way the Viet Cong are treating you fools down there right now.

So we want you to know that we recognize the trick that's been run on you, and that we're on your side, because we recognize you to be the potential revolutionaries who could bring about a lasting change in the U.S. And this is what we need. So we want you to come out of that trick bag in Vietnam, and come on back to Babylon, so

we can do it in the road where it need to be done.

So I'm going to take every opportunity I can to say a few words to you cats on the Voice of Vietnam Radio. And we're going to see to it that a lot of other people will say things to you so that you can see what's going on. Because I know that these pigs are not telling it to you like it is. And we will be interested to know what you're thinking, and to know whether or not you heard this message. And you can do that by sending us word to the Black Panther Party. And find out some way to do that. Get you sister or your mama or a friend, somebody, to get word to us. So why don't you start thinking, brothers, and all you other cats. And wake up to what's happening. And do something about it before it's too late.

ALL POWER TO THE PEOPLE REVOLUTIONARY POWER TO THE SOLDIERS IN VIETNAM--Who should be in the United States killing pigs like Richard Nixon, Spiro Agnew, and all those other war-mongering dogs who're getting our brothers killed in Vietnam.



Legat, Bonn, telephonically contacted the Domestic Intelligence Division this date requesting information concerning the background of local charges against identification order fugitive Eldridge Cleaver. This stems from the possible travel of Cleaver from Algeria to West Germany at the request of a radical organization in Germany for the purpose of making certain speeches. The West Germans apparently are concerned about whether the charges against Cleaver which may be the basis of a possible extradition request are of a crimhal nature. As indicated to Legat, Bonn, this same type of situation has previously been considered by the State Department in relation to other countries where Cleaver has considered traveling. To date, it appears Cleaver will not travel to those countries that have pro-U. S. leanings since he fears arrest and possible extradition back to the U. S.

Reference is made to your letter of September 24, 1970, captioned "Dadridge Gleaver, Sedition" relative to two recent broadcasts allegedly made by Cleaver from Renoi, Morth Vietnam, to American servicemen in South Vietnam.

By letter of September 21, 1970, contioned "black Panther Party, Racial Matters, Smith Act of 1940" directed to the Assistant Chief of Staff for Intelligence, Department of the Army, this Bureau requested that service along with the Commander, Naval Intelligence Command, and the Office of Special Investigations, Air Force, to obtain tape recordings of the alleged broadcasts and identify witnesses who could testify that the broadcasts were heard by American servicemen in South Vietnam. Copies of our letter of Saptember 21, 1970, were furnished to you and the Assistant Attorney General.

Since some of the statements appearing in that transcript are possibly in violation of 18 U.S.C. 2387 (attempting to cause insubordination, disloyalty, mutiny or refusal of duty by members of the Armed Forces), we would appreciate your obtaining copies of the tape recordings of these broadcasts. We would also appreciate your contacting the appropriate individuals to ascertain whether any of them can make a positive identification of the voice on the tape recordings as being that of Eldridge Cleaver.


We would also like you to ascertain whether either of these broadcasts was, in fact, beamed to our troops in South Vietnam and whether any of them actually heard the broadcasts.



"Pamparts" in a letter to subscribers dated May 1, 1968, announced that beginning June 1, 1968, it would be published biweekly at a yearly subscription price of \$15. In this letter "Ramparts" described itself as follows: "...the first national publication to consistently reveal the ribbon of lies supporting America's involvement in Vietnam; we stripped the curtain from America's 'invisible government' by exposing CIA's unlicensed intrusion into our domestic lives; we dared to write about the applications of the Catholic Church's political power; we warned, years before the Kerner report, that white racism was the base of America's racial problems; we blasted away at the corroded institutions of Cold War liberalism.

" 'Ramparts' is now the largest left-of-center commercial magazine in the history of the United States..."


Subject was in recent contact with the leadership of the BPP in Oakland, California, and reportedly told RAYMOND HEWITT, the Minister of Education of the BPP, to tell ELBERT HOWARD, the Editor of the BPP newspaper, that "The Black Panther" newspaper should have an international page and this international page should contain an article or a weekly commentary on Vietnam, Palestine, Portuguese South Africa, and/or Ethiopia. Subject went on to suggest that magazines devoted to Africa would provide a good source of information for insert material for the BPP newspaper.

The February 2, 1970 issue of "The Black Panther", the official BPP newspaper, contained an article captioned, "To My Black Brothers in Vietnam", written by the Subject. In this article he stated, "I am the Minister of Information of the Black Panther Party and I speak to you now for the Party". (Further excerpts from this article appear under section III of this report).

III. STATEMENTS AND ARTICLES ATTRIBUTED TO SUBJECT

On September 29, 1969, television station WETA, Channel 26, Washington, D.C., broadcast a program entitled,

"Black Journal". The program was described as exclusive interviews with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and STOKELY CARMICHAEL, and a visit to the first Pan African Cultural Festival (PACF) in Algeria.

STOKELY CARMICHAEL is former Chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee (SNCC).


A characterization of SNCC is contained in the appendix.

Concerning this program, the announcer made introductory remarks indicating that on July 24, 1969, approximately 4,000 participants from 24 African countries, and representatives of the black and Third World organizations, met in Algiers for the PACF. The announcer stated that it was designed to promote greater cooperation in the struggle for economic and political freedom of the many African nations still under the pressures of colonialism.

As to the interview with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, and the policy of the BPP, the announcer stated that the Afro-American Center at the Festival was established by the BPP to serve as an information center and as a gathering place for Festival participants interested in the BPP movement. He stated that ELDRIDGE CLEAVER was at the Festival as a guest of the Algerian Government. He further stated that CLEAVER answered questions from Algerians and black African activists. ELDRIDGE CLEAVER stated, "Black people have been growing tired of the tactics and strategy that was practiced by the nonviolent movement....to oppress....and no amount of demonstrations would make him (the oppressor) change his mind. The BPP was organized to have liberation and our security to fight for it and to address ourselves to that need; and to fill the vacuum, the vacuum that was left when the nonviolent movement died."

The October 12, 1969 issue of "The New Journal" contained an article entitled, "Black Panthers in Algeria".

"The New Journal" is a semi-weekly publication of Yale, Inc., New Haven, Connecticut, printed





at the Carl Purington Rollins Printing Office of Yale University.

The article reads in part as follows:


"On Tuesday afternoon, July 22, the day after the opening of the first Pan African Cultural Festival (in Algiers)...., Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information of the BPP, had only recently flown to Algeria from Havana where he had been in secret self exile....Eldridge Cleaver was first asked what he thought of the moon landing the day before....'If the moon shot was calculated to help humanity, it was a dismal failure'". The article continues, "In fact, he wished that 'tricky Dick' had been one of the astronauts and that the space capsule had remained on the moon...."

The opening press conference left a direct discussion of the U. S. and turned to the crisis in the Middle East. CLEAVER said that the BPP understood the Jews' long tradition of suffering, but it distinguished between their suffering and the problems they now cause for other people. Thus, CLEAVER expressed the solidarity of his Party with Al Fatah, the Palestinian liberation movement.

The July 13, 1970 edition of the "San Francisco Examiner", a daily newspaper published at San Francisco, California, contained an article datelined Moscow which stated in part as follows:

"Eldridge Cleaver and a candidate for the U. S. Senate from California, Robert Scheer, led an 11 man delegation to North Korea today to try to make the American military presence in South Korea a new target of the anti-war movement...'I want to see to it', said Cleaver, the fugitive Black Panther leader and author, 'that wider and wider circles of American people become familiar with a part of their history that has been lost and still exists in Korea - a history of U. S. imperialism in Korea'. They were leaving for Pyong Yang, the North Korean capital, on the weekly Moscow - Pyong Yang flight and plan to stay about a month at the invitation of the Committee of Reunification of Korea."





The June 28, 1969 issue of "The Black Panther" on pages 12, 13 and 14 contained an article authored by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER which was captioned "Revolution and Education". This article read in part as follows:

"In order to transform the American social order, we have to destroy the present structure of power in the U.S. We have to overthrow the government. For too long we have been intimidated into not speaking out clearly what our task is, our task is the overthrow of the government and has to be understood as being nothing but the instrument of the ruling class. The courts, the congress, the legislature and the executive branches of the state and federal government are nothing but instruments in the hands of the ruling class, to see after the affairs of the ruling class, and to continue the life of society in the interest of the ruling class. So, we're out to destroy this, to smash this machinery and to erect new machinery, but new machinery cannot be erected until the present machinery is destroyed."

The August 11, 1969 issue of the German language weekly "Konkret", published in West Germany, contained an article captioned, "A Konkret Interview with Eldridge Cleaver", which quotes Subject in part as follows:

"We are at a point where politics means only war and this means that now we must fight. Very simply put, we must not delude ourselves anymore into believing that reforms can still change some things. We have only one chance left. The chance to fight. Many think that an armed battle can be waged only in the mountains of Cuba or in Vietnam and not in the USA, but the U.S. has more mountains than Cuba and Vietnam put together....My wife, Kathleen, has given birth to a baby on this very day. So, regardless of what happens, I intend to spend some time with her. In addition, I shall continue to discharge my office of Education Minister for the BPP. Ramparts magazine has offered me the position of correspondent. I will try to report on various political events to bring about international contacts for the BPP. I will finish the book on which I am working now".





The article continues, and in response to the question, "What is the role of the radical left in West Europe? What can they do?, Cleaver responded, "The left radicals should do everything possible to cause the U. S. to step up its pressure. They can stage protest demonstrations and other actions in order to react to the oppression in the U. S. They can send us guns. They can send us every kind of technical equipment which they can whip up. If they know how to produce a really nice little bomb, they can send it to any revolutionary organization in the USA or they can send it to me. I know people to whom I can forward it, or they can bring it themselves to the USA and blow up something there.

"The American Revolution is the most important revolution in the world. In other words, if we get done with the situation there, it will be a lot easier for the rest of the world."

The August 23, 1969 issue of "The Black Panther" contained an article captioned, "Eldridge on Black Capitalism". This article read in part as follows:

"Capitalism in the U. S. was constructed out of the slave labor of black people; out of genocide of Indians; out of the forced labor of Chinese and exploitation of poor whites. The world now has the possibility of creating a new system that will give justice to people in the economic, political and social realm. We have the techniques to make this a reality, but this cannot become a reality until the vicious system of capitalism is rooted out of the planet Earth and the problems of capitalism routed out of the minds of men...The interest of black people and the interest of all oppressed people lies in continuing the struggle against capitalism, imperialism and racism to the bitter end."



On December 8, 1969, the Los Angeles Police Department, acting under search warrants, raided the Los Angeles office of the BPP. During a search of the premises, a number of tape recordings were seized as evidence. One of the tapes seized contained a report by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER. Minister of Education of the BPP, which read in part as follows:

"This is Eldridge Cleaver, Minister of Information of the BPP. This is a report to the Central Committee of the BPP and to the membership of the BPP. I am sitting in my hotel suite in Pyong Yang International Hotel, the capital of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, it is known as North Korea. I came here on September 11; today is September 30 and am accompanied by brother Byron Booth, a brother who was in prison with me in the State of California and who, along with another brother, escaped from prison and hijacked a plane to Cuba, and they are working with me now in Algeria, helping to set up the information center there.

"I received an invitation to come to Pyong Yang to participate in the International Conference of Journalists. The official title of the conference was 'The International Conference of Journalists of the Whole World who are Fighting Against the Aggression of U. S. Imperialism'. The conference lasted seven days.....

"I am waiting to hear the congratulatory speech that Comrade Kim Il Sung made at the conference. Comrade Kim II Sung is a leader of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea and truly the leader of the whole Korean people, and I have more to say about him a little later on....





(CLEAVER goes on to report on this conference, his impressions of North Korea and Premier KIM IL SUNG).

The November 22, 1969 issue of "The Black Panther" contained an article captioned, "Eldridge on Weatherman". This article reads in part as follows:


"Stop and think. Did we ever pay attention to white radicals when they told us to keep our shootouts nice and clean and middle class orderly? We call for a second Boston Tea Party in the streets of Babylon. We call for the violent overthrow of the fascist, imperialist U. S. Government ringleaders of oppression and international liberation." (The word Babylon is frequently used by CLEAVER in speaking of the U. S.).

The December 21, 1969 issue of "El Moudjahid", an Algiers, Algeria French language daily newspaper, contained an article reporting that a demonstration of support by the BPP for the struggle of the Vietnamese people took place on Saturday afternoon, December 20, 1969, at the Algiers Embassy of the Provisional Government of the Republic of South Vietnam. According to this article, CLEAVER, while surrounded by several other militants, made the following declaration:

"On the occasion of the ninth anniversary of the founding of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam, in the name of all progressives and revolutionaries of the United States, the Black Panther Party salutes the heroic struggle of the Vietnamese people and holds out to it the hand of solidarity in its struggle against U. S. imperialism.

"We recognize the Provisional Revolutionary Government as being the only legal government of South Vietnam and support totally the ten points put forward by the National Liberation Front representing the aspirations and claims of the Vietnamese people, as being the only means of returning peace to Vietnam.

"We demand the complete and unconditional withdrawal from Vietnamese soil of U. S. troops of aggression and those





of the lackeys and barking dogs of American imperialism. We condemn the barbarous war of aggression carried on against the sovereign Vietnamese people by U. S. agressors and imperialists. The government of United States is the most hypocritical government in the history of world. On one hand it camouflages its diabolic plans for aggression and imperialist exploitation behind the facade of a crumbling democracy. On the other, it perpetuates its fascist oppression against black people, Mexican-Americans, Puerto-Ricans, poor whites, progressive and liberal whites, Indians and Eskimos.

"We salute the defeat inflicted on U. S. aggressors by the Vietnamese people who are carrying out a just war against U. S. imperialism on the sacred soil of Vietnam."


The December 31, 1969 issue of "El Moudjahid", an Algiers French language daily, contained an article purported to be an interview with ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, which reads in part as follows:

"Before we get on with this interview with Eldridge Cleaver, we would refer to the International Congress of Committees in Support of the Palestinian People which was recently held in Algiers. The Minister for Information of the Black Panther Party spoke at that Congress to affirm his party's support for the Palestinian resistance movement and the solidarity that unites black people and the struggling Palestinian people. On this point, he told us:

"'Israel is a creature of American imperialism. It is a police station in the Middle East, set up for the safeguarding and protection of American imperialist interests. The Americans have always worked in the Middle East to undermine the revolutionary drive of the Arab peoples. Israel is one means by which international capitalism and imperialism hope to continue their domination of the Arab peoples, primarily so as to go on exploiting their oil wealth, which they need for their industry...."

On January 6, 1970, Columbia Broadcasting System (CBS) correspondent MIKE WALLACE presented a profile of the BPP, which included an exclusive interview with ELDRIDGE





CLEAVER, who was then in Algeria. The following are some portions which were extracted from the interview with MIKE WALLACE:

WALLACE:

"In his comfortable flat overlooking the Algiers waterfront Cleaver was quite direct when I asked about Panther threats against this nation's leaders.

"What purpose is served? I'm talking of shooting your way into the Senate of the United States, taking off the head of Senator McClellan and shooting your way back out. What purpose is really served by that kind of talk and what would be accomplished....

CLEAVER:

"The goal is take Senator McClellan's head. Now the process of getting his head has to rely on a strategic technique, I mean I can't just walk in and take his head and walk out. You see. I have to get past the guards and get past those who might try to protect his pig head. So to me I think that would mean shooting my way in and shooting my way out because I wouldn't want to go in, take his head and just sit there.

WALLACE:


"But right now we are at the point of trying to understand. When the American people hear that you want to shoot your way into the United States Senate, take off the head of a Senator....

CLEAVER:

"White House, take off the head of Richard Nixon.

WALLACE:

"What does that mean? This is rhetoric?







CLEAVER:

"This is not rhetoric. I'm telling you that Richard Nixon, J. Edgar Hoover, Senator John McClellan et al. Not just them, but all of the pigs of the power structure have to be apprehended and I feel myself, you see, that the fate that they receive will depend upon the resistance they put up. I feel that they are criminals. That they are the decision makers who are programing oppression and destruction, not only in the United States, but around the world...."

An El Fatah conference was held in Algiers, Algeria, in early January, 1970. Subject gave at least vocal support to the El Fatah concept of permanent war against what he described as an alliance of capitalists and Zionists. Subject's comments against the white American society were vituperous in the extreme. He could not say anything without mentioning "the Zionist pigs" who were behind efforts to maintain American blacks in a state of oppression. He used this epitaph repeatedly when referring to certain judicial actions in connection with the arrest order pending against him in the U. S.

The March 4, 1970 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle" contained an article captioned, "Cleaver quoted on 'Race War'". This article reads in part as follows:

"Eldridge Cleaver said black people must unleash race war in a statement released yesterday in Berkeley."

"The 'unleashing' would follow the electrocution of Bobby Seale, the Black Panther Chairman accused of murder in Connecticut, according to Elbert 'Big Man' Howard, who read Cleaver's statement in a press conference at Panther headquarters in Berkeley. ... (Cleaver stated) It is nothing but an attempt to sabotage the 400 year struggle of our people for liberation. We black people must unleash the ultimate political consequences on this last -- race war."





The February 2, 1970 issue of "The Black Panther" contained an article captioned, "To My Black Brothers in Vietnam", which article reflected that it had been written by the Subject. This article reads in part as follows:

"I am writing this on January 4, 1970. We are starting out a new year. On August 31 I'll be 35 years old. I am married and I have one child, with another one on the way....and I would like to ask you brothers: Are you living the life that you want to live.... I don't believe that you actually prefer to be way over there fighting against our Vietnamese brothers and sisters who are fighting for their freedom. Because your own people, when you are left behind in Babylon, are also fighting for their freedom against the very same pigs who have you over there doing their dirty work for you....

"The Black Panther Party has picked up the gun too, but not to fight against the heroic Vietnamese people, but rather to wage a war of liberation against the very same pigs whom you are helping to run their vicious game on the entire world, including upon your own people....

"While you are over there in Vietnam, the pigs are murdering our people, oppressing them, and the jails and prisons of America are filling up with political prisoners. These political prisoners are your own black brothers and sisters. We have a desperate life and death struggle on our hands and if we, a people, are going to survive, then we must save ourselves. We need your help, desperately, before its too late.

"We appeal to you brothers to come to the aid of your people. Either quit the Army now or start destroying it from the inside. Anything else is a compromise and a form of treason against your own people. Stop killing the Vietnamese people. You need to start killing the racist pigs who are over there with you giving you orders. Kill General Abrams and his staff, all his officers. Sabotage supplies and equipment, or turn them over to the Vietnamese people. Talk to the other brothers and wake them up. You



should start now weeding out the traitors amongst you. It is better to do it now than to allow them to return home to help the pigs wipe us out....When you can no longer take care of business inside the Army, then turn yourself over to the Vietnamese people and tell them you want to join the Black Panther Party to fight for the freedom and liberation of your own people. If you do cross over, you don't have to worry about the Vietnamese people abusing you. They will be glad to see you drop out of the Army because what they want most in life is to stop the fighting in their land. You have a duty to humanity, as well as to your own people not to be used as murderous tools of racist pigs to oppress the people."

The Danish sensational tabloid, "Ekstra Bladet", issue of March 30, 1970, contained an interview with the Subject. According to this article, at the conclusion of the interview, when asked what the average Dane could do to help, the Subject advocated that he (the average Dane) "blow up the American Embassy, shoot the American Ambassador... or shoot the Danish Prime Minister." According to the article, CLEAVER had been named the Aarhus Student Association honorary poet of the year, and he intended to travel up there if he could get a guarantee that he would not be delivered to the U. S.

According to the article, CLEAVER wanted to know the obligations Denmark had to the U. S. and NATO. The article indicated that if it were up to CLEAVER, there would be none and that, in fact, it was the Danish revolutionary duty to destroy NATO. The article quoted CLEAVER as having said, "I think Scandinavians are idiots if they sit on their asses and accept what is happening in Vietnam, Korea, South Africa and the USA when they have ways of helping, and I will accept the award in Aarhus, or whatever it is, strictly so that I can curse them and get the hell out of there. I believe there are some people in Denmark who understand the seriously dangerous situation."

On May 13, 1970, the BPP had printed, through a commercial printer, a 16 page pamphlet entitled, "On the Ideology of the Black Panther Party" (Part I), reportedly written by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER. Five thousand copies of the pamphlet were printed. A copy of the pamphlet was provided.

The above-described pamphlet reads in part as follows:

"When we say that we (the BPP) are Marxist-Leninist, we mean that we have studied and understood the classic principle of scientific socialism and that we have adapted these principles to our own situation for ourselves. However, we do not move with a closed mind to any ideas or information. At the same time, we know that we must rely upon our own brains in solving ideological problems as they relate to us."

The October 25, 1969 issue of "The Black Panther" contained a quotation attributed to ELDRIDGE CLEAVER, which reads as follows:

"The American flag and the American eagle are true examples of fascism and they should elicit from the people the same outraged repugnance elicited by the swastica of Nazi Germany and the flag of the rising sun of the Japanese imperialist."

The June 20, 1970 issue of "The Black Panther" contains an article captioned, "On Chairman MAO Tse-tung's Declaration of 20 May 1970". This article indicates it was authored by ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and reads in part as follows:

"Speaking specifically for the Black Panther Party, but reflecting the sentiments of millions of oppressed people inside the United States, it has become crystal clear to us that rampant imperialist aggression on the international scale and vicious fascist repression on the domestic scale are the two faces of the criminal government of the United States and the calculated policy of the American ruling circles. For 400 years now, Black people inside the United States have been the long-suffering victims of fascist violence and repression. But under the Nixon-Pentagon clique, this reactionary violence and repression has been escalated to new heights of barbaric cruelty. At the same time, in order to put down the already gigantic and still growing mass movement among White Americans against the wreckless and sanguinary policies and imperialist adventures



of the U. S. government, the cowardly Nixon-Pentagon clique has unleashed a bloodbath against the American people as a whole, creating for itself new enemies who have joined hands with those who were already determined to carry out a struggle to the bitter end against an economic, political, and social system that is dominated by the madmen in the Pentagon and that is responsible for the misery and bloodshed all over the world today."



On June 19, 1970, ELDRIDGE CLEAVER was interviewed by HILLY ROSE of KABC radio in Los Angeles, California. The results of this interview were recorded and are set out in part as follows:

ROSE:

"Eldridge, today in Washington, D.C. on the steps of Lincoln Memorial, David Hilliard made a speech saying they (BPP) were going to have a new constitutional convention on Labor Day in Philadelphia. I understand that's your basic idea. Can you tell me something about it?

> (DAVID HILLIARD is Chief of Staff of the BPP.)

CLEAVER:


"Well, we take the position that given the history of our people and the struggling and suffering we've done, it is very clear that there is nothing available inside of the American system to give us the type of security and protection that we want and need, and it is absolutely clear that the Constitution of the U.S., which is supposed to be the basic law of the land, it well may be the basic law of the land, but it doesn't help us out. It doesn't subscribe to our best interest against the things that have come up.

ROSE:

"What do you expect to happen from this convention? What will happen after the new constitution is written?

CLEAVER:

"Well, you see, it is my opinion that the convention will be held after the victory of the people over the pigs, who have usurped the power of government in Babylon."



The October 13, 1969 edition of the "Independent Journal", a daily newspaper of San Rafael, California, contained a photograph supplied by UPA of two Negro males in Moscow. This article identified the persons in the picture as ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and BYRON BOOTH, and stated that the pair were at Red Square in Moscow during a recent visit to that city on a trip from North Korea to Algeria.

"ELDRIDGE CLEAVER departed Algiers, Algeria, on July 10, 1970, for Moscow where he planned to remain until about August 1, 1970. This is the second trip which CLEAVER has made to Moscow, the first having been in October, 1969, which was en route to North Korea."

The July 13, 1970 issue of the "San Francisco Chronicle", a daily newspaper published in San Francisco, California, contained an article captioned, "Cleaver and Scheer Stop in Moscow". The article was datelined Moscow. It reads in part as follows:





"Eldridge Cleaver and Robert Scheer, a California candidate for the U. S. Senate, arrived in Moscow yesterday en route to North Korea with the aim of expanding the American anti-war movement to include U. S. involvement in Korea.

"Accompanying them were nine other American men and women representing Cleaver's Black Panthers, student strike groups, women's liberation and GI protest groups.

"They leave today for Pyong Yang, the North Korean capital, where they will spend about a month as a guest of the Committee of Reunification of Korea."

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER is reportedly said to be intending to go to North Vietnam after his visit to North Korea. The purpose of this trip is not known.

ELDRIDGE CLEAVER and his party, who are presently touring communist countries, will return to Algeria on Monday or Tuesday, September 8 or September 9, 1970.

CLEAVER was reportedly in contact with BPP leader-ship in New Haven, Connecticut, advising he had just returned to Algiers from a conference where he had pledged international cooperation in Asia. He stated that he had been able to travel to Vietnam where he had talked with the Viet Cong.

9/12/70

V. MISCELLANEOUS

CLEAVER has been negotiating with representatives of the North Vietnam Government for the release of American prisoners of war in exchange for the release of BOBBY SEALE, national Chairman of the BPP who was then on trial in Chicago, Illinois, on Federal Anti-Riot - Conspiracy charges, and HUEY P. NEWTON, national BPP Minister of Defense, who was then incarcerated in California.

The Subject was identified as one of several individuals participating in an anti-U. S. demonstration in the joint security area of Pangmungjong, Republic of Korea, on September 15 and 16, 1969. The demonstrators had been escorted to the joint security area by members of the North Korean Army prior to taking part in this anti-U. S. demonstration.

Report of Headquarters Company B, 502nd Military Intelligence Battalion, APO, San Francisco

It has been reported that CLEAVER was, at the time, directing his main efforts in trying to persuade the Consulate of the U. S. in Algiers, Algeria, to issue him a U. S. passport. CLEAVER had claimed that he was entitled to this document which would let him travel wherever he wished to go. He reportedly stated that the Consulate had offered him a piece of paper which would permit him to return to the U. S. where he would be arrested upon arrival. They rejected this offer.

An article appearing in the "San Francisco Chronicle", a daily newspaper published at San Francisco, California, issue of October 23, 1969, captioned, "Panthers Offer to Free Yank POWs", reads in part as follows:

"The Black Panther Party yesterday offered to arrange the release of 'some of the Yankees detained by the courageous people of Vietnam' to exchange for freedom for their two top leaders.

"Panther Chief of Staff David Hilliard said here that an unspecified number of captured Americans would be released if all charges are dropped against Panther Party co-founders HUEY NEWTON and BOBBY SEALE.

"According to the Panthers, both Cleaver and Seale have been in contact with spokesmen for the Viet Cong National Liberation Front and the North Vietnamese Government."

RICHARD HOTTELET of CBS News wired two short items for radio dissemination in the U. S. on January 30, 1970. One news item reported an interview with a Fatah Lieutenant in Algiers who told him that within two weeks ELDRIDGE CLEAVER would be leaving for front line Fatah camps where he would witness training of Fadayeen. Fatah contact told HOTTELET that agreement had been reached for Panthers to receive training with Fadayeen so that they could ultimately return to the U. S. to make use of techniques acquired in guerrilla warfare, sabotage and assassinations.

The BPP newspaper, issue of August 16, 1969, contained an article captioned, "The Revolutionary Spirit of Antonio Maceo Lives on Today in the People's Revolutionary Vanguard, the BPP and in Our New Revolutionary Warrior Named After Him". This article reads in part as follows:



"A new revolutionary warrior has been brought into our midst. Our new little brother's name is Antonio Maceo Cleaver. He is the son of our Minister of Information, Eldridge Cleaver, and our Communications Secretary, Kathleen Cleaver. He is named after the black Cuban revolutionary, Antonio Maceo (1848-96) who played a vital role in the struggle of the Cuban people for independence from Spain."



According to the official newspaper of the BPP, the BPP was started during December 1966, in Oakland, California, to organize black people so they can take control of the life, politics, and the destiny of the black community. It was organized by BOBBY G. SEALE, BPP Chairman, and HUEY P. NEWTON, Minister of Defense, BPP.

The official newspaper, called "The Black Panther," regularly states that the BPP advocates the use of guns and guerrilla tactics in its revolutionary program to end oppression of the black people. Residents of the black community are urged to arm themselves against the police who are consistently referred to as "pigs" who should be killed.

The newspaper, in its issue of September 7, 1968, had an article by the then Minister of Education, GEORGE MURRAY. This article ended with the following:

"Black men. Black people, colored persons of America, revolt everywhere! Arm yourselves. The only culture worth keeping is revolutionary culture. Change. Freedom everywhere. Dynamite! Black power. Use the gun. Kill the pigs everywhere."

The BPP newspaper, issue of October 5, 1968, had an article introduced with the following statement: "We will not dissent from American government. We will overthrow it."

DAVID HILLIARD, Chief of Staff, BPP, in a speech at the San Francisco Polo Field on November 15, 1969, said "We will kill Richard Nixon."

DAVID HILLIARD, in the "New York Times," issue of December 13, 1969, was quoted as follows: "We advocate the very direct overthrow of the government by way of force and violence."

In the issue of April 25, 1970, the BPP newspaper had an article by Minister of Culture EMORY DOUGLAS as follows:

"The only way to make this racist US government administer justice to the people it is oppressing, is...by taking up arms against this government, killing the officials, until the reactionary forces...are dead, and those that are left turn their weapons on their superiors, thereby passing revolutionary judgement against the number one enemy of all mankind, the racist U.S. government."

The BPP Headquarters is located at 1046 Peralta Street, Oakland, California. Branches of the BPP, and Committees to Combat Fascism, under control of the BPP, have been established in various locations in the USA.

APPENDIX





STUDENT NATIONAL COORDINATING COMMITTEE

A source advised the Student National Coordinating Committee (SNCC), formerly known as the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee, is a nonmembership organization founded in 1960, during the civil rights movement in the South.

Under the leadership of STOKELY CARMICHAEL, who served as National Chairman during the period 1966-67, SNCC evolved from a civil rights oriented group into a full-blown black revolutionary organization.

A publication entitled "1967 High Tide of Black Resistance" indicates the year 1967 was considered by SNCC as a historic milestone for the liberation of black people in the United States and the year that revolutionaries throughout the world began to understand more fully the impact of the black movement. The publication declared that "liberation will come only when there is final destruction of this mad octopusthe capitalistic system of the United States with all its lifesucking tentacles of exploitation and racism that choke the people of Africa, Asia, and Latin America. The realities of black life, together with the recognition instilled in SNCC workers, forced its members to further popularize the legitimacy of self-defense and rebellions when oppression became too great."

A second source advised that H. Rap Brown succeeded Carmichael as National Chairman of SNCC in May, 1968, and served in that capacity until June, 1968, at which time SNCC reorganized, creating ten deputy chairmen in an effort to relieve pressure by law enforcement.

In April, 1969, SNCC moved its national headquarters from Atlanta, Georgia, to New York City, where it is presently located.

H. Rap Brown announced at a press conference in New York City on July 22, 1969, that he had been elected Chairman of the Student Nonviolent Coordinating Committee. He announced the organization was dropping the word "Nonviolent" from its title and will be known as the Student National Coordinating Committee, with a Revolutionary Political Council functioning as its governing body. Brown, at that time, stated the use of force is necessary in obtaining revolutionary goals.
